This is a final response to your 21 April 2013 Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request for **“OIG records such as invoices or bills or budget documents that indicate the sum of monies paid to CIGIE from the OIG for CIGIE annual dues/assessments for each of the last five years.”** We processed your request in accordance with the FOIA, 5 U.S.C. § 552, as amended, and the CIA Information Act, 50 U.S.C. § 3141, as amended.

We completed a thorough search for records responsive to your request and located five documents, consisting of 15 pages, which we can release in segregable form with deletions made on the basis of FOIA exemption (b)(3). Copies of the documents and an explanation of exemptions are enclosed. Exemption (b)(3) pertains to information exempt from disclosure by statute. The relevant statutes are Section 6 of the Central Intelligence Agency Act of 1949, as amended, and Section 102A(i)(1) of the National Security Act of 1947, as amended. As the CIA Information and Privacy Coordinator, I am the CIA official responsible for this determination. You have the right to appeal this response to the Agency Release Panel, in my care, within 90 days from the date of this letter. Please include the basis of your appeal.

During our searches, we located material that was not originated by the CIA. This material appears to be relevant to your request and has been referred to the originating agency for review and direct response to you.

The mission of CIGIE is to address integrity, economy, and effectiveness issues that transcend individual Government agencies; and increase the professionalism and effectiveness of personnel by developing policies, standards, and approaches to aid in the establishment of a well trained and highly skilled workforce in the offices of Inspectors General. The Act provides that the Chair of CIGIE will carry out the functions and duties of CIGIE and make payments from funds available to CIGIE necessary for this purpose.

In May 2009, CIGIE membership approved the assessment of each IG member for fiscal years (FY) 2009 and 2010 to cover the planned costs associated with carrying out the functions and duties of the CIGIE.

IV. COUNCIL FUNCTIONS AND OPERATIONS

The Executive Director of CIGIE, in consultation with the Chair of CIGIE, will manage the continued support operations of CIGIE. The activities to be performed include, but are not limited to establishing and maintaining training academies, submitting annual progress reports to Congress and the President, planning and coordinating the CIGIE Awards Program, planning and coordinating the annual Inspector General Conference, coordinating administration of the IGSNet, publishing the Journal of Public Inquiry, planning and coordinating Executive Council and CIGIE meetings, and coordinating activities for the Inspector General community.

V. INSPECTOR GENERAL ASSESSMENT
