RE: Wilson, Dagmar

For your information the Woman's Strike For Peace Committee met on 21 September 1967 at which was present the Subject supra. During the meeting WILSON received many long distance calls. At one point WILSON was excused from the conference in order to speak with a negro hippie in the hall. During the conversation with the negro, WILSON became angry to the point where she was observed in tears. During this conversation the name of H. Rap BROWN was overheard. She and the negro then retired to an office and closed the door behind them.

It was also reported that on the previous day, at the demonstration at the White House, WILSON lectured on her recent trip to North Vietnam. Members of the audience were overheard expressing dissatisfaction with the WILSON talk of the previous day, and accused WILSON of giving the wrong impression. Attempts are in progress to determine the nature of the alleged discrepancy.
