Dear Mr. Greenewald:

This is in response to your e-mail dated 15 September 2012, received in the Information Management Services Center of the National Reconnaissance Office (NRO) on 17 September 2012.

Your request email states, "In FOIA Case 2012-0064-C, you sent me a Memorandum of Understand (sic) (MOU) between the NRO and the USAF/WPAFB/for Anomaly Resolution Support." Pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA), you are requesting:

"...all documents, videos, photos, memos, etc., that fall into the scope of the MOU, and analysis therein, limited to the calendar year 2012."

The case number you provided is not an NRO FOIA case number. However, we believe that the MOU to which you are making reference is the Memorandum of Understanding Between Deputy Director for Mission Support, National Reconnaissance Office and Commander, National Air and Space Intelligence Center for Anomaly Resolution Support. As part of our processing of your request in NRO FOIA Case F09-0095, the NRO treated this document for our equities, and forwarded it to the other signatory agency for their direct response to you.

Your request was processed in accordance with the FOIA, 5 U.S.C. § 552, as amended. Responsive records, should any exist, would be contained in operational files. Please note that FOIA exemption (b)(3), by virtue of 50 USC § 432a, exempts operational files of the NRO from the publication, disclosure, search, and review provisions of the FOIA. As such, the files that would contain responsive records, should any exist, are not subject to search in response to your request.


