**Correction: BC-US--Border Agent Killed**

Summary: Printed correction in response to an Associated Press report that the Department of Justice denied that two rifles sold in purchases tracked by federal firearms agents were later used in the shooting of Border Patrol Agent Brian Terry. Robbie Sherwood, spokesman for the U.S. Attorney's Office in Arizona, said the denial applied only to an allegation that firearms agents had foreknowledge of sales of weapons to buyers who smuggled them into Mexico. Sherwood said the Justice Department never denied that the rifles were used in the shooting. Firearms records show the rifles found at the shootout were the same rifles being monitored by federal firearms agents as part of a gun trafficking investigation.

**Feds to free three of four men arrested in aftermath of Brian Terry shooting**

Summary: Three of the four men arrested following the fatal shooting of Border Patrol Agent Brian Terry near Rio Rico have been cleared of wrongdoing and are awaiting deportation, the U.S. Attorney's Office said Tuesday.

Quotes: "Based upon an extensive investigation conducted to date, there is no evidence tying these three individuals to the shooting of Border Patrol Agent Brian Terry," the statement said.

“The goal of the ongoing FBI-lead joint investigation into that shooting is to achieve justice for BP Agent Terry, and bring criminal charges against those responsible for this murder,” his statement said. “We continue to devote significant resources and manpower to this investigation. This investigation is extremely active and progressing.”
