ATF just reported that he had been contacted this morning by Sen. Grassley's Chief Counsel for Investigations who related the following:
Our employee who came in to speak with them advised that he/she had advised his/her chain of command that he/s was coming in to speak to Sen. Grassley's staff as required by orders. Upon return, the employee was "called to the carpet," caused to participate in two meetings, was accused of lying in the first meeting, and was ordered to write a memorandum disclosing everything that he/she had told the Senator's staff.
San Grasslav's counsel expressed concern that this may be a direct violation of the Whistleblower statute

Sen. Grassley's counsel expressed concern that this may be a direct violation of the Whistleblower statute (retaliation) and that this could be perceived as an attempt to obstruct a congressional investigation. Sen. Grassley's counsel indicated that the Senator was having a private lunch with the Attorney General today and this would be the first topic on his agenda when they meet.
