BIRTH

At Philadelphia, Pa.

On December 6, 1960, a search of the files of the Bureau of Vital Statistics, Department of Health, reflected a certificate of birth was filed on July 8, 1914, for a white, male child born to ISREAL FELDMAN, age 22, address, 727 Winton Street, Philadelphia, Pa., occupation tailor, born Russia, and BECKIE KURLAND FELDMAN, age 22, same address, occupation housewife, born Russia, on June 22, 1914. The registration number of this certificate is 60712 or 69712. The birth took place at the Jewish Maternity Hospital, Philadelphia. The records also contain an amendment to this birth certificate, dated November 30, 1920, which certifies that the above-mentioned male, white child born to the above-mentioned parents on June 22, 1914, had been named MYER FELDMAN.

EDUCATION

University of Pennsylvania

On December 5, 1960, Miss MAUD TRACY, Alumni Records Section, made available the appointee's file which indicated that MYER FELDMAN was born at Philadelphia on June 22, 1914. His father, ISRAEL FELDMAN, was deceased, and his mother, BELLA FELDMAN, was residing with the appointee at 617 South Street. He attended the Wharton School from 1931 until 1935 and the Law School from 1935 to 1938. He graduated from Girard College in June 1930. While at Girard College he was on the tennis and basketball squads. He was captain of the debating team. He was first honors and won the Wagner prize. He was valedictorian of his class.

During his years at the Wharton School he was active as the assistant editor of the Wharton News. He was treasurer of the Zelo Sophic Society. He was a member of the soccer squad, a member of the Franklin Society, and was on the Dean's list. He indicated for previous employment: Girard College Library from July 1928 until June 1930; Thomas S. Gassner Company from August 1930 until September 1931; and secretary for HARVEY HARNAW, Football Coach, March 1, 1934. (It is to be noted that Mr. HARNAW has not been associated with the University for many years.)

He listed a brother, JACK, and a sister, ETHEL, addresses not noted. He saved in the Army Air Force from December 7, 1942, until February 2, 1946.

On December 5, 1960, Mrs. MARY E. CAMERON, Secretary to the Registrar, Wharton School of Finance and Commerce, made available the appointee's file which indicated that MYER FELDMAN, who was born on June 22, 1914, and resided at 617 South Street, matriculated there on September 28, 1931, and received his B.S. Degree in Economics on June 19, 1935. His major was Pre-Law. He received honors for all four years.

He was rated by his professors at that time as excellent in industry and above average in cooperation, reliability, initiative, and personality.

Nothing which would reflect unfavorably upon FELDMAN was noted in the above files.

On December 5, 1960, Mr. THEODORE H. HUSTED, JR., Vice Dean of the University of Pennsylvania Law School, advised that files of his office reflect that MYER FELDMAN entered that school in September 1935 and received his L.L.B. Degree on June 15, 1938. He received a Gowen Fellowship for 1938-1939 and in which he did research work and from March 1942 until September 1942 when he taught Pennsylvania practice. After his first year he was third out of a class of 140 with a grade of 85.28. After his second year he was second in his class with a grade of 83.076. After his third year he was 19th out of a class of 99 with a grade of 78.41. He was a member of the Mitchell Law Club and a member of the Class Luncheon Committee. He also was a member of the Order of the Coif which is the law honor society which includes members only from the top ten of his class. He also was an officer of the Law Review.

Mr. HUSTED after reviewing his folder advised that the appointee has a very good record in that school. He said that he was not there during the time of the appointee's association with the school, but has met FELDMAN, who is quite active in the Washington, D.C., Alumni group. He advised that FELDMAN has been helpful in assisting graduates of the Law School at Washington.

He knows that FELDMAN has an excellent record in government work and knows that he can recommend him as to character, loyalty, and ability.

On December 5, 1960, JEFFERSON B. FORDHAM, Dean of the law School, advised that he was not there during the appointee's academic or teaching career, but knows FELDMAN as the head of the Washington Alumni Committee and knows that he has been very active and helpful to graduates of the University. He said he has met FELDMAN on a few occasions and knew that he wanted to return to teaching.

He knows that FELDMAN is extremely capable and a person of high reputation in the government in Washington, D.C. Everything he knows about FELDMAN personally is favorable and he said he would recommend him for a responsible position with the government.

On December 5, 1960, Mr. W. FOSTER REEVE, III, Chairman of the Admissions Committee and Professor of Law, advised that he recalls MYER FELDMAN quite well as a former student and teacher and who has had a successful career on the outside. Mr. REEVE advised that he has met the appointee on a few occasions since he left that school and has every confidence in his character and loyalty. He knows him to be extremely talented and feels certain that if there were anything wrong with the appointee's reputation, he certainly would have heard of it years ago. He would recommend FELDMAN for a responsible position with the government.

EMPLOYMENT

Thomas S. Gassner Company 152 West Apsley Street (NR)

On December 5, 1960, Mr. JOSEPH BROOKS, Personnel Officer, advised the files of his office failed to reflect the name of the appointee. According to Mr. BROOKS, records for employment dated back to 1937. He could furnish no information concerning the appointee.

Mr. S.C. DUCKWORTH, Vice President, advised on December 5, 1960, it is possible FELDMAN was employed by the H.D.Dougherty Company, 17th Street and Indiana Avenue, a subsidiary of the Gassner Company. This company merged with the Gassner Company in March 1960 and all personnel and other records are not existent. He added he did not know the appointee.

Mr. VERN J. LEAVELL, Salesman, advised on December 5, 1960, that he has been with the above firm for over 35 years. He, too, stated appointee was probably employed by the Dougherty Company as he vaguely recalled the name. He stated at the present time he knows of no one currently with the Gassner Company who would recall FELDMAN because all employees of the Dougherty Company are retired.

American Law Institute
133 South 36th Street

On December 5, 1960, Mr. PAUL A. WOLKIN, Assistant Director, advised records of the American Law Institute do not reflect any information concerning MYER FELDMAN's association with this institute during 1937.

Mr. WOLKIN thereafter advised he had contacted Judge HERBERT F. GOODRICH, U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals, Philadelphia, Pa., who is the present Director of the American Law Institute, and was associated with this institute during 1937. Mr. WOLKIN stated Judge GOODRICH was unable to recall MYER FELDMAN.

Self-employment, Land Title Building, Broad and Chestnut Streets

On December 5, 1960, Miss H. BROWN, Building Management Office, advised the appointee does not maintain office space in that building at this time and all records of former tenants are maintained at the offices of the leasing agent of the building, the Albert M. Greenfield and Company, Bankers Security Building. She could not recall the appointee as a former tenant.

On December 5, 1960, Mr. ANDERSON MEADOWS, Supervisor, Leasing Department, Albert M. Greenfield and Company, Bankers Security Building Juniper and Walnut Street, advised a search of his records reflected no record of the appointee leasing an office in the Land Title Building. He said, however, that prior to 1947 the leasing of office space in that building was handled by the Land Title Building Corporation, which corporation was acquired by the Albert M. Greenfield and Company in 1947. He said that the records of the Land Title Building Corporation have been destroyed.

He stated he could not recall the appointee, but the accounting firm of Haskin and Sills, which handles the audit for the Land Title Building, may have some record reflecting the appointee's lease.

On December 5, 1960, JOHN F. WEST, partner, Haskin and Sills Accounting Firm, 1132 Land Title Building, advised his records reflect no information which would substantiate the time during which the appointee leased space in that building. He stated that his company has been conducting audits for that building since 1936 but all records prior to October 1954 have been destroyed. He could not recall the appointee.

On December 5, 1960, Mr. JEROME A. O'NEILL, Attorney, 1107 Land Title Building, advised he has conducted his practice from offices within that building since 1936, but he cannot recall the appointee. He said there are a great many attorneys located within the building whom he has never become acquainted with and he could suggest no one who might recall the appointee.

On December 5, 1960, Mr. MAURICE FREEDMAN, 1136 Commerical Trust Building, Attorney, advised he has been acquainted with the appointee since 1936. He stated that he, FREEDMAN, is the author of a legal textbook entitled "The Law of Marriage and Divorce in Pennsylvania" and the appointee helped him do research for this book while the appointee was attending the University of Pennsylvania Law School. He said the appointee was a tireless worker and an extremely competent attorney. He advised he is a person of far above average intelligence whom he would recommend for a highly responsible government position, without reservations. He stated there is not the slightest doubt in his mind regarding the loyalty of the appointee to this country or his character or reputation.

He said the appointee opened his own law office in the Land Title Building in Philadelphia after he passed the Pennsylvania Bar Examination) and he maintained his office until the early 1940s. He advised he did not believe he was associated with any other attorney, nor could he recall the location of the appointee's office in the Land Title Building. He stated the appointee also taught at the University of Pennsylvania Law School for a short period while he was conducting his own legal practice.

FREEDMAN advised the appointee was living at 5344 Gainer Road, Wynnfield, Pa., during his acquaintance with him. He said the appointee has a brother who is a dentist, but he does not know the brother's name. He said the appointee's sister, ETHEL, has married and he does not know of her whereabouts.

Self-employment, 701 Morris Building, 1421 Chestnut Street

On December 5, 1960, Miss E. M. STOUCH, 2310 Girard Trust Building, Company Buildings Department, advised her office leased all office space available in the Morris Building. She said that in 1950 the Girard Trust Exchange Bank moved into the Morris Building and took over the first ten floors. She advised all records of the tenants prior to 1950 have been destroyed and she could suggest no one who might recall the appointee renting space at 701 Morris Building.

SOCIAL ACQUAINTANCE

On December 6, 1960, Mr. MORTON S. FREEMAN, Attorney, 1616 Two Penn Center Building, advised he was a close acquaintance of the appointee from 1935 until 1942 when the appointee went to work for the Securities Exchange Commission. He said he became acquainted with the appointee's entire family and has maintained this relationship with the family up to the present time. He stated the appointee was an outstanding student at the University of Pennsylvania Law School where both were classmates. He said during the time he attended law school the appointee also worked on research for the American Law Institute on the subject of contracts. After he was admitted to the Bar, the appointee practiced law for a short time in Philadelphia until 1942. FREEMAN stated he was not associated with any partner during that period and he could not recall the exact location of his office in the center city section of Philadelphia.

FREEMAN advised the appointee has an unquestionable character and reputation and he is completely loyal to this country. He said he associated with refined type persons and would recommend him highly for a position involving trust and confidence. He advised there is no question regarding his ability as an attorney.

On December 6, 1960, Miss BESSE FOSTER, State Board of Law Examiners, 20 South 15th Street, advised MYER FELDMAN, also known as JAY MYER FELDMAN, born June 22, 1914, took the Pennsylvania Bar examinations in July 1938 and passed. A Certificate of Admission to the Pennsylvania Bar was issued September 12, 1939, to MYER FELDMAN. His mother was listed as BELLA FELDMAN, and his address as 617 South Street, Philadelphia. The records also showed appointee received a B.S. in Economics at the University of Pennsylvania on June 19, 1935, and an L.L.B. at the University of Pennsylvania.

On December 6, 1960, Miss HELEN DOUGHERTY, Philadelphia Bar Association, 601 City Hall, advised MYER FELDMAN was a member of the Philadelphia Bar Association from 1940 through 1947. He was in military service in 1942. He rejoined the association in 1954 and still is a paid-up member. His present address is 1418 Sheridan Street, Washington 11, D.C.

On December 6, 1960, Miss MAY REESE, Prothonotary's Office, Supreme and Superior Courts, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, 456 City Hall, made available the admissions book which shows that MYER FELDMAN of Philadelphia County, was admitted to practice before these courts on November 27, 1939, on the motion of F. GILMAN SPENCER.

On December 6, 1960, Miss MARY E. GROFF, Board of Censors, Philadelphia Bar Association, 377 City Hall, advised she had no record of MYER FELDMAN in the files of that office.

Mr. DONALD C. COOK, Executive Vice President, American Electric Power Company, Incorporated, 2 Broadway, New York, New York, advised on December 6, 1960, that the appointee had been a long-time employee of the Security Exchange Commission, and for the last several years has been on the staff of Senator JOHN F. KENNEDY. He advised that he first met the appointee prior to 1949 when they were both on the staff of the Security Exchange Commission (SEC). In 1949, Mr. COOK became a Commissioner, and as a result of this, his relationship with the appointee was broadened, and he (COOK) became acquainted with the operations of the commission and the individuals on the commission. From 1949 to the present time Mr. COOK has solidified his friendship with the appointee.

Mr. COOK stated that ne became Chairman of the SEC in 1952 and left the commission in June, 1953. He stated that the appointee had been a member of the staff of the SEC since 1937. He stated that over a period of eleven years, he became greatly acquainted with the type of work the appointee was doing, his personal habits, his relationship with his fellow employees and his general character. He stated he has never visited the appointee's home and the latter has never visited his residence. He described the appointee as an extremely able lawyer and a man of quite remarkable ability. He advised that during one stage of the appointee's career with the SEC, he served with Senator LYNDON B. JOHNSON, in connection with the Senate Armed Services Committee.

Mr. COOK advised that he saw the results of the appointee's competent work on an almost daily basis from 1949 to 1953. He stated that he has had enough personal contact with the appointee to see the kind of people he has associated with and he [COOK] would recommend both the appointee and his associates as thoroughly loyal Americans. He stated that he knew of nothing in any way whatsoever that could be regarded as detracting from the character, reputation, personal and moral habits of the appointee. He stated that the spointee has always associated with competent and responsible individuals. He advised that if he (COOK) were again head of a governmental agency, he would not hesitate, regardless of the standards involved, of placing the appointee in a position of trust and confidence in that agency.

COOK who is now Executive Vice President of the American Electric Power Company, 2 Broadway, New York City; that he continued FELDMAN in the position of Executive Assistant to the Chairman for approximately two weeks until his personally chosen appointment to this position assumed the duties of Executive Assistant at which time FELDMAN was returned to the General Counsel's Office of the SEC where he worked until the early part of 1955 when DEMMLER loaned FELDMAN to the Senate Banking and Currency Committee which was conducting a study of the stock market. DEMMLER stated that he was not intimately acquainted with FELDMAN; that their association was only a business relationship and not social; that he was closely associated with FELDMAN only during the two week period when FEDDMAN was Acting Executive Assistant to him.

DEMMLER stated that he considered FELDMAN to be a capable attorney whose character was above reproach; that there was no question in his mind regarding FELDMAN's loyalty to the U. S.; that he was not acquainted with FELDMAN's personal associates other than the people connected with the SEC whom he considered to be high type loyal individuals of excellent character and reputation; that he knew of nothing derogatory regarding FELDMAN and that he would recommend him for a position of trust with the government.

On December 7, 1960, ROGER S. FOSTER, Attorney, Westinghouse Air Brake Company, Gateway Building #3, 13th Floor, Pittsburgh, Pa., advised that he was the Solicitor and later the General Counsel for the SEC during the period from 1944 to 1953; that

FELDMAN was on his staff and under his supervision from 1944 to 1953: that he first became acquainted with FELDMAN in 1944 at the SEC; that FELDMAN was one of approximately 15 attorneys on his staff under his supervision; and that he associated daily with FELDMAN in connection with their work, had lunch with him about twice a week and attended two or three social functions each year of the SEC at which FELDMAN would be present. FOSTER stated that he respected FELDMAN's work and considered him to be a capable attorney; that his character was above reproach and he held an excellent reputation; that he had never at any time indicated any subversive leanings and there was no question in his opinion regarding FELDMAN's loyalty to the U. S.; that the only associates of FELDMAN whom he knew were other people employed by the SEC and he considered these individuals to be persons of excellent character and reputation; that he had never heard anything of a derogatory nature regarding FELDMAN; and that he would not hesitate to recommend FELDMAN for any position of trust with the U.S. Government.



Mr. SORENSON stated that the appointee was employed for many years by the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) and during approximately 1955, he was on loan from SEC to the Senate Banking Committee which was investigating the stock market under the chairmanship of United States Senator FULBRIGHT. He highly recommended the appointee for a position of trust and confidence.

He described the appointee as capable, competent, and dependable. He commented favorably regarding the appointee's character, associates, reputation and loyalty and recommended him favorably for a position of trust and confidence.

On December 6, 1960, Mr. BENTON J. STONG, Professional Staff Member, United States Senate Interior and Insular Affairs Committee, advised SA ERTZINGER that he has known the appointee nearly four years as they were coworkers doing campaign research work for Senator KENNEDY. He advised that the appointee is competent, capable and a "superior person". He stated the appointee's character, associates, reputation and loyalty are above any question and he highly recommended the appointee.

On December 6, 1960, Mr. FRANK A. SIEVERTS, Legislative Assistant to United States Senator WILLIAM PROXMIRE, advised SAERZINGR he has known the appointee both socially and professionally for slightly over one year. He stated that from August to November, 1960, he worked under the appointee's supervision on a team doing basic research and writing for the KENNEDY campaign. He described the appointee as capable, intelligent and industrious. He commented favorably regarding the appointee's character, associates, reputation and loyalty and recommended him favorably for a position of trust and confidence.

On December 6, 1960, Mr. JOHN H. YINGLING, Chief of Staff, United States Senate Banking and Currency Committee advised SA ERTZINGER that he was the appointee's immediate supervisor for two years, during 1955 and 1956 when the appointee was Counsel for that committee on loan from the SEC. He stated that he also knows the appointee and his family socially and still maintains contact with them. He stated the appointee's services were most satisfactory and he further described him as competent and capable. He commented favorably regarding the appointee's character, jassociates, reputation and loyalty and recommended him favorably.

On December 6, 1960, Mr. MATHEW HALE, Chief Counsel, United States Senate Banking and Currency Committee, advised SA ERTZINGER that he worked closely with the appointee for about two years when the appointee was employed by that committee on loan from SEC. On December 5, 1960. Mr. HARRY POLLACK, Personnel Officer, SEC, advised SA that his files do not contain a record for the appointee. He stated that the appointee's record has been sent to St. Louis.

On December 5, 1960, Mr. JOSEPH B. LEVIN, Assistant General Counsel, SEC, advised SA he has known the appointee since the middl940's as they were coworkers and until the appointee joined the KENNEDY campaign staff. He advised he also knows him socially. He commented favorably regarding the appointee's character, associates, reputation and loyalty and recommended him for a position of trust and confidence.

On December 5, 1960, Mr. DAVID FERBER, Assistant General Counsel, SEC, advised SA he knew the appointee on a professional basis only for slightly over ten years. He stated that he was the appointee's supervisor for several months at SEC. He described the appointee as an excellent worker who was dependable, reliable and well liked. He commented favorably regarding his character, associates, reputation and loyalty, and recommended him for a position of trust and confidence.

On December 6, 1960, Mr. LEONARD HELFENSTEIN, Director, Office of Opinion Writing, SEC, advised SA he has known the appointee since the early 1930's as they were classmates at the University of Pennsylvania. It is reported Mr. Feldman, from 1930 to 1931, was employed by Thomas S. Gassner Company, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. The records concerning this employment were not available to be reviewed.

During the period when Mr. Feldman was attending law school, it was reported that he was employed by the American Law Institute, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. The records concerning this employment were unavailable.

Mr. Feldman, as Jay Myer Feldman, in July, 1938, took the Pennsylvania Bar examinations and on September 12, 1939, was admitted to practice law in Pennsylvania. After Mr. Feldman was admitted to practice law, he maintained a law office in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, until the early 1940's.

On September 10, 1942, Mr. Feldman obtained a position as attorney with the Securities and Exchange Commission at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, and Washington, D. C., which position he held until May 5, 1958. During his employment with the Securities and Exchange Commission, Washington, D. C., Mr. Feldman was loaned by that agency for employment with the United States Senate Committee on Banking and Currency.

On May 6, 1958, Mr. Feldman received an appointment as Assistant Clerk in the office of President-elect John F. Kennedy. Mr. Feldman is still employed in this capacity.

Military Service

Mr. Feldman was inducted into the United States Army Air Corps on December 7, 1942, entered on active duty December 14, 1942, and was honorably discharged February 2, 1946, as a sergeant. His service record is clear.

Marital Status

Mr. Feldman is married to the former he maintains a residence in Washington, D. C., where he resides with his wife and two minor children.

II. RESULTS OF INVESTIGATION

Interviews

Roger S. Foster, Attorney, Westinghouse Air Brake Company at Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, stated that

during the time he was the Solicitor and General Counsel with the Securities and Exchange Commission in Washington, D. C., Mr. Feldman was a member of his staff. He said that from 1944 to 1953 he was closely associated with Mr. Feldman in connection with their work and had the occasion to attend social functions of the Securities and Exchange Commission at which Mr. Feldman was present.

Mr. Foster stated he considered Mr. Feldman to be a capable attorney whose character was above reproach and concerning whom he had no question as to his loyalty to the United States. He stated that he would not hesitate to recommend Mr. Feldman for a position of trust with the Government.

William H. Timbers, United States District Judge at New Haven, Connecticut, stated he was well acquainted with Mr. Feldman and regards him very highly. Judge Timbers said he was former General Counsel of the Securities and Exchange Commission, and Mr. Feldman was a member of his staff from 1953 to 1955. He said Mr. Feldman is a person of high moral character and principles and is an excellent lawyer. Judge Timbers stated from his association with Mr. Feldman, he believes he is one of the finest men he knows and has never known anyone to question Mr. Feldman's loyalty to the United States. He said he would recommend Mr. Feldman, without reservation, for a position of high trust and responsibility.

Donald C. Cook, Executive Vice-President,
American Electric Power Company, New York, New York, said
he became the Chairman of the Securities and Exchange
Commission in 1952. Mr. Cook said prior to 1952, he was
a commissioner with the Securities and Exchange Commission,
and from the period 1949 to 1953, he became acquainted
with Mr. Feldman during their employment at the Securities
and Exchange Commission and described Mr. Feldman as an
extremely able lawyer and a man of remarkable ability.
He said he would recommend Mr. Feldman and would not hesitate
to place him in a position of trust and confidence.

Theodore C. Sorensen, Assistant to President-elect Kennedy, Washington, D. C., said he has known Mr. Feldman since 1956. He described Mr. Feldman's character and reputation as being excellent. He said Mr. Feldman is loyal to the United States Government, is of excellent character and well qualified for a position of trust.

Matthew Hale, Chief Counsel, United States Senate, Banking and Currency Committee, Washington, D. C., stated he has worked closely with Mr. Feldman for two years when Mr. Feldman was employed by the committee on loan from the Securities and Exchange Commission. He said Mr. Feldman is dependable, and capable and he recommended him for a position of trust and confidence.

Twenty-seven other persons, consisting of professional and business associates, acquaintances and neighbors, stated that Mr. Feldman is very capable and of excellent character. They all stated his associations are with individuals who are loyalto the United States Government, and there was no question in their minds as to the legalty of Mr. Feldman. He was recommended by them for any position of trust and confidence.

Acquaintances of Mr. Feldman said he is known to his close friends as "Mike."

Immediate Relatives

In addition to the relatives mentioned elsewhere in this summary memorandum, Mr. Feldman has a brother, Jacob I. Feldman, who is a dentist residing in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

Credit and Arrest Checks

The credit records at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, indicate that Mr. Feldman's sister and her husband, and Ethel had "slow" accounts which were paid and a delinquent account as of November 3, 1960, in the amount of \$60.

Kennedy Aide Sued by Head Of Child Camp

A Pennsylvania children's camp operator is suing Myer' Feldman, deputy special counsel to President Kennedy for \$1,024 in camp tuition charges he says Mr. Feldman owes him.

In papers filed in Municipal Court. Earle Weinberg of the Pocono Highlands Camp. Marshalls Creek: Pa. alleges that Mr. Feldman withdrew his daughter Jane, then 12, and son James, then 10, from the camp in the summer of 1960 without paying the full summer tuition as provided in a written agreement.

Mr. Weinberg claims he has been paid only \$50 for James and \$315 for Jane.

Left After Month

The children left the camp, after a month, court papers, show.

Through his attorney, William C. Wise, Mr. Feldman answered that he had made only an oral agreement to pay for one month at the camp. In a counter-suit in District Court here, Mr. Feldman claims Mr. Weinberg failed to take proper care of the children at the camp.

The District Court papers, not yet served on Mr. Weinberg, claim that Jane was injured by a horse and that a camp employe struck James in the face. When Mrs. Silva Feldman came to take the childen home, the claim continues Mr. Weinberg falsely imprisoned her and the children for three hours. Mr. Feldman is asking for \$12,800 damages.

Two Suits Combined

The Municipal Court suit has been combined for trial with a similar one by Mr. Weinberg of Philadelphia against another Washington man Abraham Rothbaum 704 Peabody street N.W. Yesterday Judge Catherine B. Kelly ordered Mr. Weinberg to come here tomorrow to give depositions in the

SUBJECT: HOBART TAYLOR MYER (MIKE) FÉLDMAN

The "Washington Post and Times Herald" on 4/5/64 contained an article indicating that the captioned individuals had received appointments on the Presidential staff. Taylor is to be an White House legal associate special counsel. Feldman the No. officer and The Director inquired what our files showed on these three individuals.

HOBART TAYLOR JR

Taylor was the subject of a Security of Government Employees investigation in 1961 at which time he was employed as an attorney with the Department of Labor. He was born in 1919 in Texarkana, Texas, graduated from the University of Michigan with a law degree and following his graduation in 1943 he was an attorney in Detroit, Michigan. Generally the investigation was favorable of Taylor. However, it did develop information indicating that Taylor had attended a Michigan Civil Rights Congress banquet in 1951. This organization is an affiliate of the Civil Rights Congress (cited as within the purview of Executive Order 10450).

In 1957 Taylor had contact with the Polish Ambassador (purpose of this visit not known). In 1949 Taylor was reported to be a sponsor of the Michigan Committee to Defend the Bill of Rights, which organization was organized in the Detroit area and supported by various front groups of the Communist Party.

In his application for employment, Taylor indicated membership in the National Lawyers Guild from 1949 to 1951. 1959 he was listed as a member of the executive committee of the Detroit area Friends of the Southern Conference Educational Fund (cited as a communist front by the House Committee on Un-American Activities).

The results of our investigation concerning Taylor have been furnished the Civil Service Commission who made a favorable determination on loyalty in October, 1961. A summary of this information was also furnished to the White House in September,

Both advised they had no additional information to add to their interviews in December, 1960, regarding FELDMAN and both reiterated they would recommend FELDMAN for a position of trust with the Government.

DETAILS:

ACQUAINTANCES

On November 10, 1964, RALPH H. DEMMLER. partner. law firm of Reed, Smith, Shaw and Mc Clay, Seventh Floor, Union Trust Building, Pittsburgh, Pa., was reinterviewed regarding MYER FELDMAN. DEMMLER advised that as he recalled he had been in contact with FEIDMAN on only two occasions subsequent to the last interview with him (DEMMLER) in December, 1960; that one contact was merely an exchange of correspondence in which he (DEMMLER) had congratulated FELDMAN on his new position as Counsel to the President; that the second contact was on July 23, 1964, when he (DEMMLER) and 264 other businessmen throughout the United States were invited to the White House in Washington, D.C., by the President of the United States; that on this occasion and at the conclusion of their meeting with the President, he had an opportunity to talk briefly with FELDMAN as they were preparing to leave the White House.

DEMMLER stated that he had no additional information to add to the interview in December, 1960, regarding FELDMAN; that he still considered FELDMAN to be a man of the highest character and moral standards; that he knew of nothing derogatory regarding him; and that he would again recommend FELDMAN for a position of trust with the Government.

On November 10, 1964, ROGER S. FOSTER, attorney, Westinghouse Air Brake Company, Gateway Building No. 3, 13th Floor, Pittsburgh, Pa., was re-interviewed regarding MYER FELDMAN. FOSTER advised that since he was last interviewed in December, 1960, regarding FELDMAN he believed that he had seen FELDMAN on only one occasion, when he (FOSTER) was in Washington, D.C., at a business conference; that his association with FELDMAN at the conference was very limited and consisted of the passing of pleasantries; that he had no additional information to add to his interview of December, 1960, regarding FELDMAN and that he would again recommend FELDMAN for a position of trust with the Government.

AT LOS ANGELES, CALIFORNIA:

On December 10, 1962, LA T-1 advised that several letters bearing the Constitutional Liberties Information Center (CLIC) letterhead on the envelope were mailed from the Los Angeles Office on December 5, 1962. This source advised that among these letters was one addressed to "Myer Feldman, Esq., The White House, Washington, D. C." The source could furnish no information concerning the contents of this letter. A characterization of CLIC is set forth in the appendix of this report.

LA 161-726

On November 13, 1964, LA T-1 was recontacted and advised that he was not acquainted with FELDMAN and could furnish no further information concerning him. LA T-1 is not available for testimony.

On November 13, 1964, other confidential informants in the Los Angeles area who are familiar with certain aspects of the Communist Party and related matters, advised they were not acquainted with FELDMAN and had no information concerning him.

APPENDIX

CONSTITUTIONAL LIBERTIES INFORMATION CENTER (CLIC)

A source advised on April 25, 1962, that Constitutional Liberties Information Center (CLIC) was formed in July, 1961, in Los Angeles, California, as a Communist Party (CP) defense committee to combat the U.S. Supreme Court decisions of June 5, 1961, upholding the Internal Security Act of 1950 and the membership provisions of the Smith Act. Formation of a committee was announced at a CP meeting of the District Committee, Southern California District CP (SCDCP) on July 8, 1961, by DOROTHY HEALEY, Chairman, SCDCP. Officers of CLIC include REUBEN W. BOROUGH, Chairman, and HUGH DE LACY, Vice Chairman.

Another source advised on August 8, 1961, that REUBEN W. BOROUGH and HUGH DE LACY were then current members of the Professional-Cultural Section, SCDCP.

A third source advised on March 23, 1964, that CLIC is a non-membership organization which continues to function as an information distributing center opposing the application of the 1950 Internal Security (McCarran) Act. It issues a newsletter on an irregular basis. It is under the complete control of the SCDCP.

She stated their files contain no unfavorable information concerning MYER FELDMAN.

On November 18, 1964, OGDEN KNAPP, Klamath Falls, Oregon, telephonically contacted Medford, Oregon Resident Agency and advised that he has known MIKE FELDMAN since 1960. OGDEN KNAPP, OWNER, KLAD BROADCASTING COMPANY, KLAMATH FALLS, OREGON, ADVISED TODAY THAT HIS RECOLLECTION WAS WRONG CONCERNING FELDMAN'S TRIP TO KLAMATH FALLS. HE NOW RECALLS THAT FELDMAN WAS LAST IN KLAMATH FALLS IN 1960 RATHER THAN 1961 AS IN REREP, PAGE TWO.

FELDMAN not known to have any other financial interest in Oklahoma City area. Record reviews at Dun and Bradstreet, Credit Bureau, Corporation Commission, State and County Tax Offices, and Police Department negative as to FELDMAN.

The following investigation was conducted in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, on November 20, 1964:

NORMAN BAGWELL, Manager, WKY Television and Radio Station, advised that he was not acquainted with MYER FELDMAN, and to the extent of his knowledge FELDMAN has had no connection with radio station KOMA in the Oklahoma City area during the past six or seven years. BAGWELL stated that KOMA has been sold on two or three occasions during the past several years and he was not acquainted with the present organization which owns this station. BAGWELL suggested that Mr. EDGAR BELL be contacted at television station KWTV as it was believed BELL would be familiar with the ownership of KOMA radio station.

EDGAR BELL, Manager, KWTV, 7501 North Kelly, advised that KOMA was previously owned by the company which presently owns KWTV and in approximately 1957 radio station KOMA was sold to a group of individuals from the Washington, D.C. area which it was believed MYER FELDMAN was one of these individuals. BELL stated that as he recalled there were three individuals connected with the company which purchased KOMA. BELL stated that KOMA has since been sold on several occasions and as he recalled the group from Washington D.C. only operated this station for approximately two years.

BELL stated that he believes that KOMA is presently owned by the Storz Organization, which has its main offices in Florida.

JUDY CAMERON, Dun and Bradstreet, Inc., 1500
Linwood, reviewed her records and advised they contained no
listing for MYER FELDMAN. CAMERON further advised, however,
that Dun and Bradstreet files are maintained on a current
basis and would only go back to 1963. She further advised
that in most instances the files are maintained in the name
of the organization but there would be no reference maintained
in Oklahoma City as to ownership of KOMA as this station reportedly
is owned by an organization from Miami, Florida, and all
detailed information concerning present ownership would be
maintained by Dun and Bradstreet in Miami. In regard to
files of the company concerning businesses operated in
1957 and 1958 CAMERON advised that these files would have
been destroyed.

The following individuals advised that their files are maintained in the names of companies or corporations only and that they normally do not keep their records filed under the names of individuals associated with the

OC 161-137 company. In each instance the persons contacted reviewed their files for the name MYER FELDMAN but were unable to locate any record. JACK WETTENGEL, Assistant Secretary of State, Secretary of State's Office, State of Oklahoma - corporation records; Mrs. DEONA RAY, Corporation Commission; VERNA JENKINS, Franchise Tax Division, Oklahoma State Tax Commission. Assistant Secretary of State JACK WETTENGEL caused a detailed review of his records to be made pertaining to radio station KOMA and advised that this station was originally incorporated in 1951 as KOMA, Inc., in 1957 the corporation name was changed to Video Investment Company, and in 1961 this company merged with the Central-South Sales Company, an Arkansas corporation, which later changed its name to KATV, INC. WETTENGEL advised that in all of these connections, indications in his records are that the corporation name changes were still all connected with the same individuals who had originally incorporated this organization in 1951. VERNA JENKINS, Franchise Division, Oklahoma State Tax Commission, advised that her files under the Video Investment Company, show that officers associated with this corporation were JAMES C. LEAK, President; MARJORIE GRIFFIN LEAK, Vice President; and RAYMOND MATHIS as Secretary - Treasurer. There was no record indicating that MYER FELDMAN had any connection with this corporation. The following individuals reviewed their records and advised they could locate no file identifiable with MYER FELDMAN: CLETA CONNELY, License Division, City Clerk's Office, City of Oklahoma City; DEE MC CULLAR, Chattel Mortgage Division, Clerk's Office, Oklahoma County; KIT CARSON. Treasurer's Office, Oklahoma County; - 3 -

S. D. HOWELL, Personal Income Tax Division, Oklahoma State Tax Commission;

It was ascertained by IC at the Bar Admissions, United States Supreme Court, that the appointee was admitted to practice before the United States Supreme Court on January 1, 1949 and was currently in good standing.

On November 20, 1964, IC reviewed the indices of the United States District Court, District of Columbia, Civil Actions Section and the District of Columbia Court of General Sessions, Civil Division and no record was found of any tax lien against the appointee for the years 1961 to the present.

Civil Action Number 1465-61 at the United States District Court for the District of Columbia reviewed on November 20, 1964, by IC reflected the following information:

Complaint (for personal injuries) dated May 12, 1961, indicated that GIZILLA MOSKOVITZ, 5344 Gainor Road.

Philadelphia, Pennsylvania (plaintiff) sued MYER and 2828 Ellicott, N.W., Washington, D.C. (defendants) for \$25,000.

The plaintiff alleged she fell in the defendant's home on September 16, 1960 and suffered severe injuries. The plaintiff alleged negligence on the part of the defendant and demanded trial by jury.

On October 13, 1964, attorneys for both the plaintiff and the defendant advised the court to dismiss the action. The file indicated the plaintiff is the mother-in-law of MEYER FELDMAN.

Case Number M 114 99-61, maintained in the District of Columbia Court of General Sessions, Civil Division, was reviewed on November 20, 1964 by IC and reflected the following:

Complaint dated April 14, 1961 was filed by trading as Pocono Highland Camps, 6528 Castor Avenue, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania (plaintiff), sueday MYER FELDMAN, 2828 Ellicott Street, N.W., Washington, D.C., (defendant) for \$1024.56.

The plaintiff alleged that the defendant entered into a written agreement to pay Pocono Highland Camps tuition of \$695 each for and for the camp season July 1, 1960 to August 28, 1960. The defendant paid \$50 each as downpayment and after one month the defendant took his children from the camp. The plaintiff received a partial tuition refund of \$265.44 from an insurance company. The plaintiff claims the defendant violated the contract and therefore owes the balance of \$1024.56. The defendant claims the plaintiff conducted the affairs of the camp improperly and negligently. He claimed his daughter was injured and his son was struck and abused and injured by an employee of the plaintiff. (The defendant sued the plaintiff in the United States District Court for the District of Columbia in the amount of \$11,100, CA1389-61)

A practipe was filed on October 11, 1961 by the attorney's for both the plaintiff and the defendant advising the court to dismiss this case. CA 1389-61 in the United States District Court for the District of Columbia also dismissed on October 11, 1961.

It should be noted that the October 10, 1961 issue of the Washington "Evening Star" carried an item captioned "KENNEDY aide Sued by Head of Child Camp", which reads as follows:

"The Federal Communications Commission has authorized MEYER FELDMAN of Philadelphia, who is to become a White House aide in the KENNEDY administration, to dispose of his interest in Radio Station KLAD at Klamath Falls, Oregon.

"Mr. FELDMAN and associates will transfer KLAD to OGDEN KNAPP for \$175,000.

"Mr. FELDMAN will serve after January 20 as assistant to THEODORE SORENSEN, White House special counsel. He has been an aide to Mr. KENNEDY in the Senate."

In August, 1962 SA CARL L. BENNETT reviewed the ownership and license files for radio station KOMA at the Federal Communications Commission which reflected an application for assignment of the license of radio station KOMA, dated November 13, 1956, was filed with the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) requesting authority to assign the license from KOMA, Incorporated, to Radio Oklahoma, a partnership. The partners of Radio Oklahoma were listed as MYER FELDMAN, and The purchase price paid for this station in the amount of \$342,500, was to be made as follows:

The remainder of the purchase price \$180,000 will be obtained from the Miami National Bank of Miami Beach, Florida.

There was a letter in the file dated November 9, 1956, from Vice Chairman of the Board. Miami National Bank, to Mr. MYER FELDMAN, et al, c/o Pennsylvania Building, Washington, D.C.

This letter advised the group that the bank had taken up the matter of a loan in the amount of \$180,000, for the group at the time of purchase of the radio station in Oklahoma City. The committee examined the group's financial statements and approved the loan.

The purchase of radio station KOMA by the partnership Radio Oklahoma was consummated December 29, 1956. On January 23, 1957, an assignment of the license was filed by the four partners of Radio Oklahoma to a new partnership of the same name, Radio Oklahoma, which now consisted of six partners. The two additional partners were and On May 31, 1957, withdrew from the partnership and the partners! interest was restated as follows: MYER FELDMAN On April 30, 1958, an application for assignment showed a further change in the partnership Radio Oklahoma, no longer appeared as a partner; however, were added to the and partnership. AT WASHINGTON, D. C DETAILS:

On November 20, 1964, SA GEORGE E. SAUNDERS reviewed the appointee's official personnel file at the White House Office, which was made available by Mrs. JEAN ROBB, Personnel Officer, White House Office, which indicated that on January 21, 1961, the appointee received a Presidential appointment as Deputy Special Counsel to the President, Office of Mr. THEODORE SORENSEN. The file contained no additional pertinent information.

Mrs. ROBB advised that on February 29, 1964, the appointee assumed the title and duties of Counsel to the President, but no official designation was made in his official personnel file.

On November 24, 1964, Ir. LEE C. WHITE, Associate Counsel to the President, advised SA SAUNDERS that he has known the appointee from 1958 to present at the United States Senate and at the White House. He advised that he did not know the identity of any of these stations. He said he is positive that the appointee had severed relations with these companies so as not to cause any question in connection with his duties at the White House. Mr. WHITE further advised that the appointee resides at 2828 Ellicott Street.

On November 24, 1964, CLAUDE J. DESAUTELS, Administrative Assistant to LAWRENCE F. O'BRIEN, Special Assistant to the President, advised SA SAUNDERS that he has known the appointee from 1960 to present. He said he first met the appointee during the 1960 Presidential campaign and said he has had close professional contact with the appointee as well as social contact from 1961 to present. He stated that he recalls that the appointee had an interest in a radio station, but sold the interest when he came to the White House. He stated that he knew of no other outside interests of the appointee. He said there is no reason whatever to question his character, associates, reputation, and loyalty, and said he would recommend him for a position of trust and responsibility.

On November 24, 1964, Miss MARY DURKIN, Secretary to the appointee, advised SA SAUNDERS that she has known the appointee for approximately 8 years on a close professional basis. She said she has also had limited social contact with him at office functions. She said there is no reason to question his character, associates, reputation, and loyalty, and said the appointee is a highly respected individual whom she would recommend for a position of trust and responsibility.

On November 24, 1964, Miss LORENE BAIER, Secretary to the Associate Counsel to the President, LEE C. WHITE, advised SA SAUNDERS that she has known the appointee since 1961 on a professional basis only. She said he is well respected by the White House staff and said she would know of no reason whatever to question his character, associates, reputation and loyalty. She said she would recommend the appointee for a position of trust and responsibility.

On November 24, 1964, Mr. WILLIAM J. HOPKINS, Executive Clerk at the White House Office, advised SA SAUNDERS that he has known the appointee on a professional

basis only from 1961 to present. He said he has never heard of anything unfavorable concerning the appointee and said he would know of no reason to question his character, associates, reputation, and loyalty. He said he would recommend the appointee for a position of trust and responsibility.

On November 24, 1964, Nr. He said he considers the appointee to be a fine man and said there is cortainly no question concerning his character, associates, reputation, and loyalty. He said he would highly recommend him for a position of trust and responsibility.

On November 24, 1964, Mr. HENRY HALL WILSON, JR., Administrative Assistant to the President, advised SA SAUNDERS that he has known the appointee from 1961 to present on a professional basis only at the White House. He said the appointee is a competent individual. He said he knows of no reason whatever to question his character, associates, reputation, and loyalty. He said he would recommend the appointee for a position of trust and responsibility.

On November 24, 1964, Mrs. JEAN LEWIS, Assistant to LAWRENCE F. Miss JANET REES, Secretary, the Dean's Office, made available the official personnel file which reflected as follows:

MYER FELDMAN, no birth information, whose position was reflected in 1956 as Counsel to the Senate Bank and Currency Committee, United States Senate, was appointed by letter February 1, 1956, to the position of Professorial Lecturer for the Spring semester, February, 1956 to June, 1956, to teach Contracts II in both the day and evening division. 

Purpose of travel was in connection with official business in Israel, England, and Japan. No additional pertinent information was noted.

Records of the United States Secret Service disclose that Mr. Feldman was issued a White House pass in November, 1961. No additional pertinent information was located in the records.

Bar Affiliations

Mr. Feldman is a member of the American Bar Association in good standing. There is no record of any grievances against him.

The central files of the FBI, including the records of the Identification Division, contain no additional pertinent information concerning Mr. Feldman.
