



I naively looked under Newtown, CT in Table 8, expecting to see data that would include the school shootings there, but zero murders were reported. I called FBI HQ, who referred me to CJIS/UCR in Virginia, who told me that those shootings were handled by the State Police, and so were not included in the UCR tables, but could be found under "State Police". Continuing to search, I found Table 11, where (I guess) the 20 victims of Newtown were included in the 36 murders (state-wide, I guess) reported by the State Police.

Table 8 is being circulated on the Web with the Newtown, CT line highlighted to claim that the Newtown shootings are a hoax -- after all, here are the official FBI statistics for "Crime in the United States", and Newtown comes up with zero murders. You need to state prominently that "Crime in the United States" really means "Some Crime in the United States", not "All Crime in the United States" to avoid misuse of what should be a credible source. Or, better yet, do a better job of aggregating crime from all sources into one table (or set of tables) which could correctly be called "Crime in the United States". Even then, a disclaimer that the FBI might not know of ALL crimes should be given, but there's no excuse for not knowing about infamous crimes such as Newtown and tabulating them where a casual reader might expect. The FBI UCR Program has two collection systems the Summary Reporting System (SRS) and the National Incident-Based Reporting System (NIBRS). The SRS divides offenses into two groups, Part I and Part II crimes. The SRS reporting is also governed by the Hierarchy Rule. In cases where more than one offense occurs in an incident, only the highest ranking Part I offense is counted. Three offenses, Arson, Human Trafficking—Commercial Sex Acts, and Human Trafficking—Involuntary Servitude, ignore the Hierarchy Rule and are always counted even in cases when multiple offenses occur in an incident. The Hierarchy Rule requires counting only the highest offense and ignoring all others. The Hierarchy Rule applies only to crime reporting and does not affect the number of charges. Therefore, in SRS, an incident involving both a murder and an assault only the murder would be reported.

The NIBRS is an incident-based reporting system in which agencies collect data on each single crime occurrence. The NIBRS collects data on each single incident and arrest within 23 offense categories made up of 49 specific crimes called Group A offenses. By design, LEAs generate NIBRS data as a by-product of their respective records management systems (RMS). The hierarchy rule does not apply in NIBRS.

The FBI UCR Program does not delineate active shooter, mass murder, etc. Aggregate homicide data are captured on the Monthly Return of Offenses Known to Police form in the SRS, which is required to participate in the FBI UCR Program. To report data regarding the circumstances during a homicide in the SRS, agencies submit the Supplementary Homicide Report (SHR). The SHR provides additional details surrounding the homicide such as victim and offender age, sex, and race and type of weapon and is not required for participation in the program.

If a victim is shot but does not die, those cases would be reported as aggravated assault with a firearm in both the SRS and NIBRS.

I'm following up on a question I asked a few months ago about why Sandy Hook and the Aurora Theater shootings were missing from the 2012 SHR data - you responded at that time that SHR is voluntary and the localities/police departments that handled those cases likely did not provide the information to the FBI.

I've checked in with both the Aurora police department and the Connecticut State Police, and the CSP is saying it did send in the supplemental information to the FBI in a six-page report. The UCR numbers bear this out - according to the UCR, the CSP handled 36 homicides in 2012. However, when you open the SHR file, it shows the CSP only handling 9 single-victim cases.

Because the SHR database has trouble dealing with incidents with more than 11 victims: is there a chance the computer system knocked these cases out? Is that possibly what occurred here? I'm trying to figure out why the two largest homicide events in 2012 aren't reflected in the SHR data, and both had more than 11 victims.

The FBI's UCR Program is a nationwide, cooperative statistical effort of more than 18,000 city, university and college, county, state, tribal, and federal law enforcement agencies voluntarily reporting data on crimes brought to their attention. The FBI UCR Program relies on the good faith reporting of the law

enforcement agency and the state. Agency may not report data to the FBI UCR Program or may be reported by another agency such as the state police or county sheriff.

Law enforcement agency participants must classify and score offenses from the records of calls for service, complaints, and/or investigations. Since these crime statistics are intended to assist law enforcement in identifying the crime problem, participants must record offense counts, not the findings of a court, coroner, or jury or the decision of a prosecutor. To ensure these data are uniformly reported, the FBI provides contributing law enforcement agencies with guidelines that explain how to classify and score offenses and provide uniform crime offense definitions. Acknowledging that offense definitions may vary from state to state, the FBI UCR Program cautions agencies to report offenses not according to local or state statutes but according to the guidelines provided.

Agencies have until December of the following year to report missing and corrected data. The data contained in data reports and the program's master files may include updates and/or late submissions from participating agencies that are not reflected in the program's various published reports; therefore, the figures in the two may not match. A discrepancy between published data and data contained in the master files does not necessarily indicate an error.

Supplemental homicide data reported in Crime in the United States expanded homicide does not include manslaughter by negligence or justifiable homicide. (Separate tables reflect the justifiable homicide data.)
