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

He has been continually employed as a writer and lecturer, and often donates his time and talents to students and civic groups throughout the country.

In conclusion, I feel he is a wonderful, loyal, productive American who has risen above any past mistakes and I categorically recommend favorable consideration for a full pardon and the restoration of his rights. Our country will be well served by this man's talents.

A Pardon for Howard Hunt

Washington.

Under the Constitution, as President Ford well knows, the president has power to grant reprieves and pardons for offenses against the United States. This month the President will receive a petition for commutation in the case of E. Howard Hunt, Jr. In the name of mercy and justice, the petition should be granted.

Except for G. Gordon Liddy, who also merits relief but whose case is quite different. Hunt is the only Watergate defendant still in prison. No useful purpose whatever is being served by keeping him there.

We are concerned here with elementary questions of crime and punishment. Hunt's crime was conspiracy to commit burglary. His punishment is a prospective eight years in prison and a fine of \$10,000. Except for the brutal 20-year sentence imposed on Liddy, the punishment given Hunt is the most severe of them all.

The crime itself, of course, was the breaking and entering of Democratic National Headquarters in the Watergate in June, 1972. Beyond question, Hunt was deeply involved in that sordid and stupid affair. He pleaded guilty. It is no defense to his crime, though it is a valid consideration in a plea for commutation, that he acted under the aegis of a former attorney general in what he supposed was the service of the then President of the United States.

The imposing of just sentences is the hardest task of criminal jurisprudence. Judges themselves cannot readily explain why Defendant A-gets 1 year, Defendant B gets 5 years and Defendant C gets 10 years, when the defendants have similar personal records and are convicted of substantially identical offenses. Unnappily, there disparities turn up all the time, and as often as not they reflect little more than the passions and prejudices of the presiding judge.

This was the case in the matter of the Watergate defendants. They ran up against Judge John J. Sirica—"Hanging John," as harsh a judge as ever sat on the federal bench. His thought was to terrify the Watergate defendants by imposing sentences of a severity unheard of in simple breaking-and-entering cases. He hit them originally with sentences to shock the conscience and to extort their "co-operation."

Eventually, after letting them twist slowly, slowly, in the wind, Hanging John had mercy on five of the seven defendants. Frank Sturgis, Virgilio Gonzalez, Eugenio Martinez, James W. McCord, Jr., and Bernard Barker, who had been hit with four to six years, were released after 4 to 15 months. Judge Sirica had no mercy in his soul for Hunt or Liddy. Their pleas for reduction of sentence were flatly denied.

Liddy has stonewalled from the beginning; his circumstances, to repeat, are different. Hunt, by contrast, has co-operated fully since his conviction. In the past two years, he has testified repeatedly buth in Congress and in the trials of such defendants

as John N. Mitchell and John D. Ehrlichman. His prison record is exemplary.

Why do we sentence men to prison? Three reasons usually are advanced. The first is simple incarceration: The object is to keep dangerous criminals behind bars, where they cannot endanger society. The second is rehabilitation: The thought is to train men for useful roles in society. The third is retribution: The idea is to exact punishment for an offense against the state.

Surely it is pointless to incarcerate Howard Hunt; it is inconceivable that he would take up a burglar's career. He needs no "rehabilitation"; he is an accomplished writer, fully capable of supporting himself. He has now spent almost two years in prison; as punishment for a political escapade, in which no one was that and nothing of value was stolen, this seems more than sufficient.

SEASON TO BE JOLLY

New York, Dec. 26-This being the season for cheer and forgiveness, I am moved to

meditate that Chile may be showing greater concern for its political prisoners than the United States, it now being obvious that Howard Hunt really is just that—a political prisoner.

A year ago Professor James Q. Wilson of Harvard, whose book on crime and punishment is a contemporary classic, made a reference to the extraordinary prison terms given out by Judge John Sirica. As for Howard Hunt's term-two and one-half to eight years -Professor Wilson, who is a penological hawk, said that with Hunt's record (i.e., -no previous convictions, zero probability of a repeated offense), anyone else convicted of the identical offense-conspiracy to break and enterwould have been fined, and given a "thirty-day suspended sentence."

Judge Sirica, as everybody knows, was endeavoring to put special pressure on his prisoners to cooperate with the prosecution. Well, that pressure worked. Hunt testified before every committee and every grand jury impaneled to investigate. As practically everyone knows, his wife was killed in an airplane accident in the fall of 1972, and he was left with four children to look after; and the months went by.

Now, there is a procedure for persons convicted of a federal offense who believe that their sentences were inordinate, or that for special reasons those sentences should be mitigated. In the office of the Attorney General of the United States is someone called the Pardon Attorney. His job is to prepare recommendations for the President of the United States. Hunt's attorney approached the Pardon Attorney in October 1975 and asked how long it would require to weigh the evidence, in the case of Hunt, in order to prepare a recommendation for the President. The answer: "Three or four months." The papers were completed instantly, and recommendations for leniency filed, including copies of public statements made by such as Eric Sevareid. James Jackson Kilpatrick, and Howard K. Smith.

Eight months went by. I am a friend of Hunt's, and godfather to three of his children, and accordingly telephoned the Pardon Attorney and asked if he could account for the extraordinary delay. Were there political considerations standing in the way of a commutation of sentence? He replied that I would have to draw my own conclusions, that he believed the recommendation would be made shortly.

A long while later-in July 1976-I addressed the Attorney General directly to ask whether, in fact, political considerations were vitiating due process. A month after that, I received a reply from the acting Attorney General advising me that the Pardon Attorney "expects to receive shortly the last report which he views as necessary to developing his recommendation to the At-

torney General."

On the whole, I like to believe Attorneys General, but it is difficult to do so in this case. If there is an American this side of the fever swamps who believes that Howard Hunt should still be in jail for the foolishness he committed in June 1972, after spending thirty months in jail, I doubt that that person would have taken ten months to forward his recommendation to the Pardon Attorney. What obviously the whole gang did not want is to pardon Hunt during the election campaign, on the grounds that doing so would revive talk about the pardon of Richard Nixon. Well, let us be grand about it and accept it that Hunt's remaining in iail must be considered a trivial sacrifice to pay for the prospective re-election of a President of the United States.

But the election was weeks ago. Hunt rots in jail, for no purpose, and there is no explanation for it other than the sadistic neglect of uncommunicative bureaucrats who give speeches about justice and apparently think nothing of taking more than one year to process a simple application for justice and for mercy. If the Pardon Attorney concludes that Hunt should not be let out of jail, then why not develop the guts to say so? Perhaps the services of John Sirica as a ghost-writer could be made available? Or will Hunt have to wait for a Democratic President to exercise rudimentary clemency for a minor participant in that sordid affair who has been redundantly punished?

Barry For Valienzate Pardona

WASHINGTON (AP) — Convicted Watergate conspirators who are seeking pardons have an advocate in Sen. Barry Goldwater.

"If he (President Ford) pardoned Nixon, I see no reason why he shouldn't pardon the others. I think all these men received sentences way, way out of line with what they did ... We even now don't know what went on and won't know until ex-President Nixon tells the truth," Goldwater said Monday in an interview with CBS.

Ford, in an October press conference, said there was "no credence" to rumors that he intended to give more Watergate pardens. But over the last weekend, in an interview with the Washington Post, Ford declined to say whether he planned to grant more pardons.

Four of the individuals convicted in the Watergate burglary, Bernard Barker. Eugenio Martinez, James McCord and Frank Sturges, have asked the Justice Department for pardons. Two others, E. Howard Hunt and Gordon Liddy, have asked for commutations of sentences they are now serving.

H.R. Haldeman, John Mitchell and John Ehrlichman are appealing convictions; Ehrlichman has begun his sentence even as his appeal continues.

The Arizona Republican said Ford's pardon of Nixon hurt his re-election campaign. "But I don't think going ahead and pardoning those who are left would cause any trouble."

A political silence?

Let President speak on Hunt amnesty bid

Relatives of E. Howard Hunt make a good case when they say that he has been more harshly penalized than others found guilty of participation in the Watergate conspiracy.

Hunt, a career espionage agent with the CIA, ran out of money to appeal his sentence of eight years in jail and a \$10,000 fine. His appeals effort and his family both disintegrated when Mrs. Hunt was killed in a plane crash during a trip to secure money for legal fees.

Hunt has now served two years of his sentence and claims that he's been shuttled from jail to jail, denied privileges and subjected to "reverse discrimination" because his case is politically sensitive. He is bitter because Richard Nixon was pardoned after lying about Watergate, while he was jailed after telling the truth. Hunt says that he disapproved of the Watergate break-in from the beginning.

Hunt's only hope is executive elemency from President Gerald Ford. A elemency application was filed with the Justice Department last October, but in the nine months since then, Hunt's attorney has heard nothing. The Justice Department has no explanation for this long delay. The White House, pressed by Senator James L. Buckley and others, has been similarly silent.

This lack of attentiveness to what may be a serious miscarriage of justice must end. President Ford must direct the Justice Department to present the full facts on the Hint case to him at once, and must make a prompt decision on whether or not elemency as justified.

Otherwise, suspicions will continue to exist that Hunt is languishing in jail because the Nixon pardon is highly unpopular and the White House is avoiding the elemency issue for

Synopsis:

Applicant appeared at the Miami Office of the FBI on December 17, 1981. He is a retired CIA Agent and is presently self-employed as an author. He desires a pardon to restore his civil rights for personal and family reasons. When confronted with preforming an illegal act, he entered a plea of guilty and also cooperated with the authorities and testified in other trials.

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DETAILS:

This investigation is based upon a petition for pardon after completion of sentence, filed by Everette Howard Hunt, Jr., Miami, Florida, dated October 9, 1981.

The applicant appeared in the Miami Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), on December 17, 1981, at which time he was interviewed.

Interview of Applicant

A. Employment History

Applicant advised that he served for 26 years as an Agent for the Central Intelligence Agency (CIA) and retired on May 1, 1970. He was then employed by R.E. Mullen and Company, 1700 Pennsylvania Avenue, Washington, D.C., as Vice President from May, 1970, until June, 1972. He was also employed as a consultant by the Executive Office of the President, Washington, D.C., from July, 1971, until June, 1972. C. Applicant's Version of Circumstances Under Which He Was Convicted.

Applicant advised that he met G. Gordon Liddy at the White House and believed that Liddy worked directly for Attorney General Mitchell, who was President Nixon's Campaign Manager. Liddy instructed him to orgainize a team to enter the Democratic National Committee Headquarters (DNCH) and to look for evidence that money was coming from a foreign source. He believed that executive authority was given for this venture. After working for the CIA for 26 years, he did not question his instruction and entered the DNCH.

Applicant entered a plea of guilty, in the United States District Court in the District of Columbia, Washington, D.C., to the charge of Conspiracy, 18 United States Code 371; Burglary, 22 District of Columbia 1801(b); and Illegal Interception of Communication, 18 United States Code 2511. He was sentenced to be imprisoned for $2\frac{1}{2}$ to 8 years and to pay a fine of \$10,000.00. Time was served and the fine was paid.

Poummitt stated that he also became acquainted with the Hunt family at that time and was very favorably impressed. Everette H. Hunt, Sr., according to Poummitt, was a well-respected lawyer in the Hamburg, New York community.

Poummitt advised that Everette Howard Hunt, Jr., was musically talented and played a major role as a singer and trumpet player in a school production directed by him at Hamburg High

School. Poummitt further advised that he admired Hunt inasmuch as he utilized his musical talent as a means to work his way through Brown University.

Poummitt stated that although he did not maintain contact with Hunt beyond Hunt's days at Brown University, he (Poummitt) again met Hunt in 1979 in Miami, Florida. Poummitt advised that he and Hunt renewed their friendship at that time and have met on numerous occasions since.

Poummitt advised Hunt, in his opinion, is a real gentleman. He further described him as an extraordinarily talented, personable, and honest man. Poummitt explained that Hunt feels no bitterness toward the Government and his country and believes Hunt to be loyal without question to the United States. Poummitt stated he has no reason to question Hunt's character or reputation and could provide no derogatory information regarding him. Poummitt further stated, in his opinion, Hunt's only failing would have been his blind loyalty which led to his legal problems. Poummitt is aware of applicant's petition for pardon and as such, highly recommends that a pardon be granted. Poummitt advised that Hunt desires a pardon for family reasons inasmuch as he feels his son and family have paid a great price for his (Hunt's) legal problems.

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

Dunn advised that he became an FBI Agent and worked in that capacity until his retire-After applicant was released from prison and moved to Miami, ment. he renewed his acquaintanceship with applicant and attended applicant's wedding when he married his current wife and they have been friends ever since. Applicant has an excellent character and never had any problems with the law until he became involved in the Watergate situation. He considers the Watergate break-in to be a stupid thing for applicant to do and believes applicant feels the same way about it now. He recalled that applicant started to work for the Robert E. Mullen Company in May, 1970, and worked there until about June, 1972, but did not recall applicant's exact position and could not say whether applicant ever served that company as Vice President. Kapstein advised he may not agree with Hunt's political motivation for the Watergate incident but does feel that Hunt has paid his debt to society and should be granted a pardon so he may erase a "blot" from his otherwise impeccable record as an individual. According to Dr. Kapstein, the applicant is a loyal American citizen with impeccable integrity, reputation and character. Kapstein stated he personally believes that Hunt felt he was following direct orders from the Commander-in-Chief of the United States when he committed the Watergate break-in. Kapstein stated Hunt "took his medicine like a man" and therefore his past transgressions should be forgiven and forgotten.

Mrs. Stella Kapstein, advised she has known the applicant since 1936 when he was a student of her husband, Dr. I. J. Kapstein, supra. Mrs. Kapstein characterized Hunt as an intelligent individual who has suffered greatly because of his conviction in the Watergate break-in. During the trial Hunt lost his wife in an airplane crash and suffered deep bouts of depression while in prison. Since his release from prison he has resumed writing, remarried, and fathered a young son. During a recent visit with the Hunts in Miami, Florida, Stella Kapstein was greatly impressed by Hunt's recovery from the stigma associated with his conviction in the Watergate affair.

Stella Kapstein stated she concurred with her husband's opinion that Hunt had served his debt to society and should be granted a Presidential pardon. Mrs. Kapstein stated she has always maintained a close relationship with E. Howard Hunt and has always found him to be trustworthy with unquestionable loyalty to the United States.

On January 20, 1982, Mr. Frederick P. Goodrich, Ledyard, Connecticut, was Interviewed in the presence of his wife, who concurred with everything her husband said. Mr. Goodrich furnished the following information:

He became acquainted with applicant and his wife, Barbara, in the late 1950s as they were both employed at that time by the Central Intelligence Agency (CIA). He and his wife have maintained a close and friendly relationship with applicant since that time in spite of the troubles he had with the Watergate hearings. In fact, applicant talked with him on the phone a couple of days ago. Applicant graduated from Brown University in Rhode Island, and is a very intelligent, capable, and loyal person. He is very patriotic, although his loyalty to the Former President Nixon turned out to be an error in judgment. Applicant's wife was killed in an airplane crash several years ago, and applicant just recently remarried a former school teacher from Athens, Georgia. He has a baby boy, 2½ years old, from the second marriage. He had four children from the first marriage, who were friendly with Goodrich's children.

Mr. James Rogers, Personnel Officer, White House, advised SA that official records of his office contain no information concerning EVERETT HOWARD HUNT. Rogers believes that official records concerning Hunt are probably contained in the material gathered during the Watergate investigation and their present location is unknown.

However, Rogers recalled that Hunt worked under contract to the White House as a Consultant for a period of six months to one year during the period 1970 - 1972. He could not recall any more specific dates.

It was adjudged that the foregoing sentences be served concurrently. The Judgement-Committment further stated that Hunt was to stand committed until the fine was paid or he was otherwise released in accordance with law. Hunt was incarcerated at the Federal Prison Camp in Eglin, Florida, and paid the \$10,000 fine in its entirety on February 16, 1977.

A review of the applicant's Navy Officer record, serial number 97532, reflected that he was born October 9, 1918, at Hamburg, New York, and was appointed a Midshipman on February 14, 1941. He was appointed an Ensign on May 15, 1941, and was called to active duty on June 2, 1941.

A Medical Survey dated February 9, 1942, at the U.S. Naval Hospital, Chelsea, Massachusetts, reflected that the applicant was admitted on December 24, 1941, with a diagnosis of Astigmatism, mixed #670. Applicant was found "unfit for duty", and was ordered to appear before a Navy Retiring Board. The Navy Retiring Board met on May 28, 1942, and found the applicant incapacitated for duty. On October 13, 1942, the applicant was Honorably Discharged from the Navy Reserve as an Ensign.

On October 20, 1942, applicant requested to be reinstated in his Navy Commission. In reconsidering his case, the following penciled notation was found on a memo form: "Forwarded for decision. Wants Commission as DVS discharged for physical defect. Attention invited to report from Medical Survey Board which would seem to me to indicate man was doing all he could to get out of Sea Duty. Note he requested two physical exams - one by a psychiatrist."

Applicant's Navy Officer record reflected he had prior enlisted service, serial number 403-64-91. His record contained no derogatory information.


