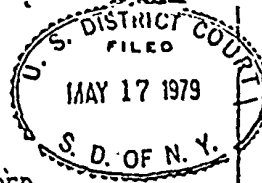

5. All documents compiled in the course of the prosecution or defense of United States v. Gray and United States v. Felt and Miller, 78-000179 (Bryant, C.J.), excluding attorneys' work products, shall be subject to the provisions of paragraphs 1 and 2 of this order. At the conclusion of the prosecutions, all documents covered by this order shall be maintained in the custody of attorneys, or their successors in control of such documents pending final determination of this action.

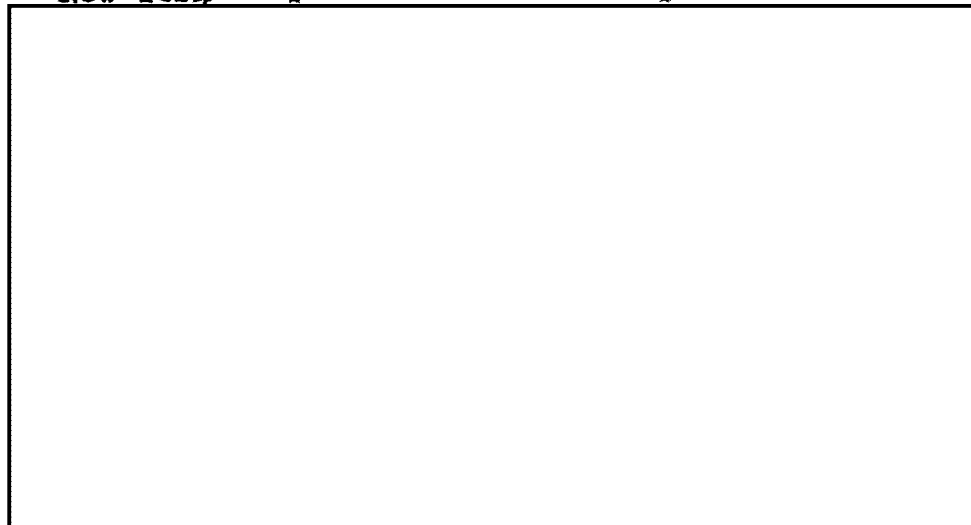

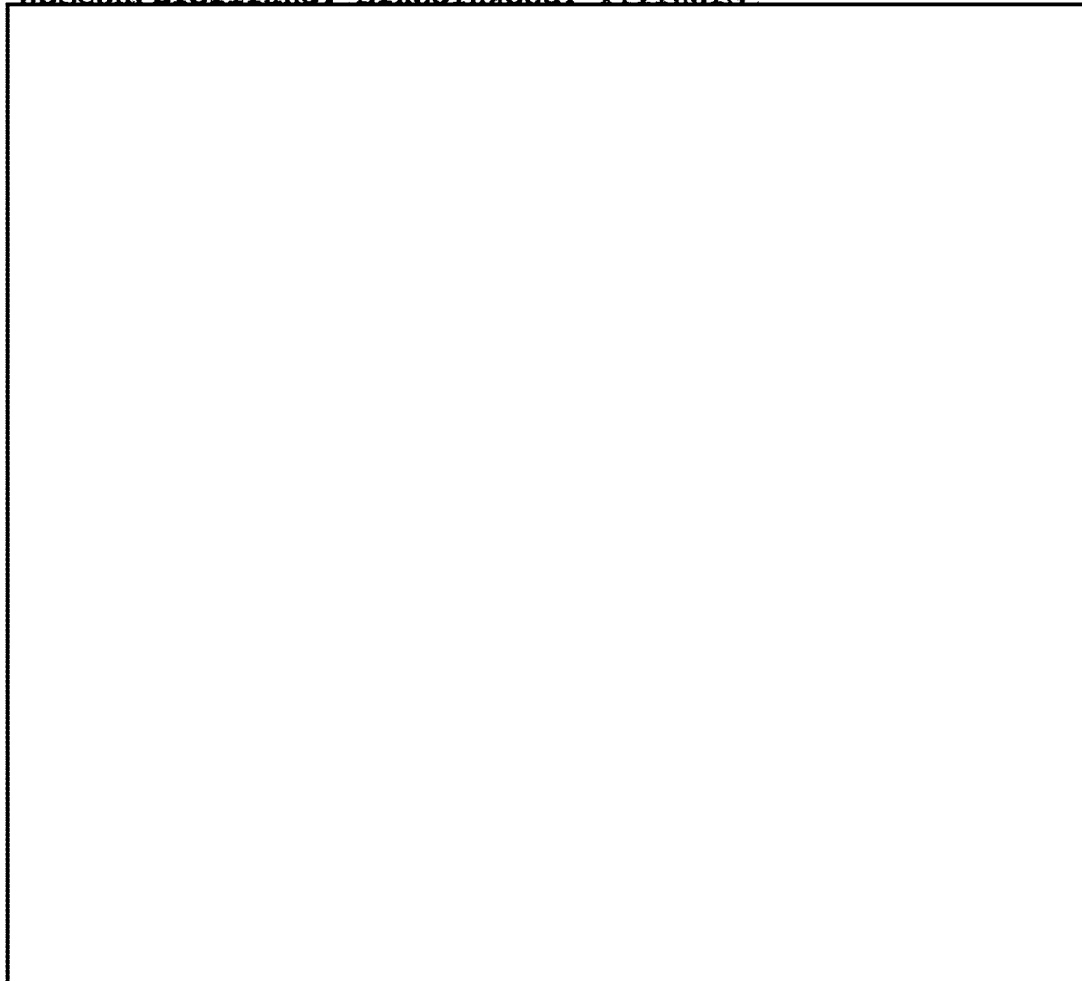

As has been discussed with Mr. DeLoach, we are anxious to obtain information regarding the possibility that tainted evidence has inadvertently been used by us in the prosecution of criminal tax cases, or exists in cases currently being considered by us for prosecution. Under the assumption that if this exists at all, Organized Crime and Racketeering cases are the most likely source, the attached list relates to criminal cases pending in the Tax Division which appear to be Organized Crime Drive matters. Some of these matters are currently under consideration as to whether prosecution should be undertaken; some have been referred to the United States Attorneys for prosecutive action; some are the subjects of indictments, and a few are pending on appeal.

It is requested that the names on the attached list be checked against the indices which you have set up in relation to electronic listening devices and you advise this office as soon as possible whether any name on this list appears on your indices.

I. We wish to know:

a) whether the named defendant shows up in your indices;

b) whether he was the direct subject of electronic surveillance; and

c) whether he appears on any recordings, transcripts, logs, notes, memoranda, or other records as a participant in conversations overheard or as a person mentioned or discussed.

We are in receipt of a memorandum dated October 1966, from Mitchell Rogovin, Assistant Attorney General, Tax Division, regarding possible FBI electronic surveillance coverage of individuals currently of prosecutive interest the Tax Division. This memorandum, which was personally approved by Acting Attorney General Ramsey Clark, includes a list of 151 individuals, either currently being prosecuted or under consideration for prosecution, considered by the Tax Division to be in the organized crime category.

The Department wishes to know if (1) whether each listed individual was the subject of direct electronic surveillance coverage; if so, whether such an individual's remarks appear on any recording, transcript, log, note, memorandum or other record as a participant in monitored conversations or as a person mentioned or discussed in such conversations. (2) If a record exists, the nature of the surveillance involved, duration of such surveillance, and if any records are in existence which can be made available to the Department. (3) If any information was developed from electronic surveillance coverage, was such information communicated to the Internal Revenue Service, and if so, in what manner.

Following the receipt of this memorandum, Rogovin advised that in those instances where a listed individual is mentioned or discussed during electronic coverage, but is not himself a participant, the Tax Division is interested only in information received that would be relevant to a tax case.

Rogovin also noted that the Tax Division is not desirous of receiving gossip, rumor, inconsequential hearsay or references to unidentified names.

Our review of records to date at the Seat of Government and in the various field offices involved has determined that of the 151 listed, 93 are entirely negative, that is, such

individuals were not covered directly, were not monitored by other coverage, nor were they mentioned or discussed during such coverage. Of the remaining 58 listed, we either have some form of positive information of possible pertinence to the Tax Division's inquiry, or additional checks are necessary to resolve possible questions of identity. This latter group includes a number of individuals on whom previous communications have been furnished to the Department regarding our past electronic coverage of their activities, and the Tax Division's attention is being directed to the fact that the Department already has been furnished material pertinent to their inquiry on such individuals.

ACTION:

Attached for your approval is a letter to Acting Attorney General Clark listing the 93 individuals on whom our review is completely negative, and advising that we will forward additional material on the remainder, setting forth any data in our possession of possible pertinence to the Department's inquiry in this matter. In those instances in which we have determined that some form of electronic coverage existed, we are obtaining logs and other pertinent material from the field for review at the Seat of Government.

Reference is made to my memorandum to you dated October 18, 1966 (copy attached) which reflected that both Rogovin and Vinson of the Tax and Criminal Divisions of the Department had indicated as of that date they had run off a list of cases in which the subjects were either currently under indictment or consideration was being given to indicting such individuals and that this list would be forwarded to the FBI in the near future.

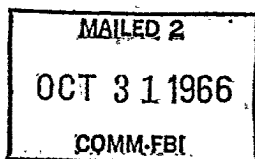

Electronic Surveillance Checks 9-10-66

In our response to the Department's inquiry regarding our possible electronic coverage of 151 individuals of prosecutive interest in the Tax Division, we advised the Department that we would furnish any information of pertinence to their inquiry with regard to those listed on whom we had some sort of positive data. The Department was told that 93 of the 151 listed had checked out entirely negative.

Attached are three letters to the Acting Attorney General providing information on our microphone coverage of [redacted] Louis Michael DeFilippo and [redacted] all of New York City. None of these was the subject of direct microphone coverage of this Bureau. Their names do appear, however, in microphone logs either as participants or as individuals mentioned or discussed by others whose conversations were monitored. DeFilippo and [redacted] were covered by a microphone installation on the First Discount Corporation, 424 Madison Avenue, New York City, which was in effect from October 9, 1961, to November 8, 1963. This firm was a front [redacted] and other important La Cosa Nostra figures, primarily for their shylocking activities. [redacted] was covered by a microphone installation [redacted]

[redacted] in space occupied by [redacted] who was also friendly with the Gallo mob from Brooklyn, New York. Joseph Gallo and his associates often used [redacted] as a meeting place to discuss their criminal activities. This coverage was in effect from July 7, 1961, to August 31, 1961. 62-318-6 REC 13-62-9-10-66

None of the information obtained as a result of our microphone coverage of these three individuals was disseminated to the Internal Revenue Service. The logs and other pertinent records regarding these monitored conversations are being forwarded to the Bureau where this material can be reviewed prior to making it available to Departmental attorneys.

In connection with problems arising out of past electronic surveillance coverage of individuals now under prosecution, or against whom prosecution is being contemplated, the Department made a general request that we establish a means of quickly enabling a check to determine if we have monitored the voices of an individual in question by electronic surveillance. In line with the Department's requirements, appropriate instructions were issued in referenced communications.

Since the issuance of the original instructions, the Department has broadened its request for a review of this index and now desires to know also if the individual of prosecutive interest in question appears in our records as a person mentioned or discussed in monitored conversations, though not himself necessarily a participant in such conversations. Therefore, it

will be necessary that you submit cards also on all individuals in this latter category, that is, those individuals who are mentioned or discussed in monitored conversations, though such individuals may never have appeared personally before any of our electronic surveillances.

In completing this phase of the project, offices must use a certain amount of common sense in recording names in this category inasmuch as there are literally thousands of instances in which a subject covered engages in completely inconsequential conversations in which he may mention the name of a third party. Examples of this would be a subject engaging in conversations in which he mentions the name of a merchant or a serviceman with regard to handling his dry cleaning, running an errand, or getting his car washed. Where a name is mentioned in this way, no purpose is served by including it in this index. Where any doubt arises, it should be resolved in favor of including the name in question in the index.

This additional phase of the project should be completed by 12/15/66.

In connection with problems arising out of past electronic surveillance coverage of individuals now under prosecution, or against whom prosecution is being contemplated, the Department, as you know, made a general request that we establish an "early warning system" in the form of an index or other administrative device to enable a check to be made to determine if we have so monitored the voices of such individuals. The Department was advised that we had such a system in operation.

In line with the Department's requirements, this index, which is now in operation, is made up of names of individuals whose voices were monitored by microphone-surveillances, technical surveillances, or other similar electronic listening devices since January, 1960.

As you know, the Department has recently forwarded a list of 151 names of individuals currently of prosecutive interest in the Tax Division, with a request that these names be checked through our index to determine if they were the subjects of direct electronic surveillance coverage; whether an individual in question appears on any records, logs, notes, memoranda, et cetera, either as a participant in conversations overheard, or as a person mentioned or discussed.

DEC
This new and belated category introduced by the Tax Division will require additional work on the part of the field in order that references in this category can be added to the names already included in the index so as to answer any future inquiries from the Tax Division. It should be noted that the Criminal Division has never required any information concerning the names of persons mentioned in microphone logs and has always satisfied themselves with information concerning those whose conversations were actually recorded. be an additional example of the Tax Division going far beyond what is required by the courts or even by another division of the Department. Nevertheless, in order to answer any inquiries along this line with the dispatch desired, it will be necessary to include in our index the names of persons mentioned in microphone logs.

Attached is a communication to the field divisions involved, alerting those offices to this additional requirement on the part of the Tax Division and instructing those offices to prepare index cards on individuals who are mentioned in monitored conversations.

The field is being instructed to use a certain amount of common sense in recording names in this category inasmuch as there are literally thousands of instances in which a subject covered engages in completely inconsequential conversations in which he may mention the name of a third party. Examples of this would be instructions to a maid or servant to get in touch with a particular merchant or serviceman to handle menial errands such as handling dry cleaning, getting a car washed and like situations. Where a name is mentioned in this way, no purpose is served by including it in this index. We are, of course, following the Director's instructions in connection with furnishing everything of possible pertinence to the Department and allowing Department personnel, not FBI personnel, determine if it is relevant.

ACTION:

Attached for your approval is an airtel to offices involved in the compilation of this index, instructing that cards also be prepared on all individuals who are mentioned or discussed in monitored conversations, except those in the completely inconsequential category cited above, in addition to names of individuals already being included as those whose voices have been monitored.

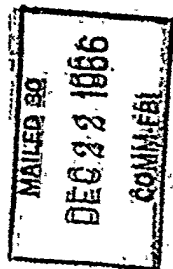

Reference is made to my letter dated November 23, 1966.

Information received from our electronic coverage of Hyman E. Martin in Miami, Florida, regarding [redacted] and [redacted] was set forth in reports of Special Agent [redacted] entitled "Hyman E. Martin, Anti-Racketeering," dated May 4, 1962, August 2, 1962, and May 23, 1963.

These reports were furnished to the Criminal Division of the Department and to the United States Attorney in Miami.

The Internal Revenue Service headquarters in Washington, D. C., was furnished copies of the reports dated May 4, 1962, and August 2, 1962, on January 28, 1963.

On February 12, 1963, our Miami Office furnished information orally to [redacted] the Internal Revenue Service in Miami concerning Hyman Martin's over-all holistic activity, including the operation of [redacted] location of [redacted] automobiles and clerical personnel involved; and identity of Hyman Martin's representative [redacted]

Information [redacted] was originally obtained from the electronic coverage of Hyman Martin on April 3, 1962.

It will be appreciated if you will advise us in advance of any legal action contemplated by the Department which might be of interest to this Bureau in this connection.

NOTE: An undated letter from the Department received on 11/21/66 requested information as to whether the FBI had ever had electronic coverage of 7 individuals who were convicted of gambling violations in the Florida courts based upon evidence furnished by IRS and testimony of special agents of IRS. The defendants have petitioned the Supreme Court for a hearing in this matter.

Two of the 7 individuals referred to in the Department's request were monitored by our coverage of Hyman E. Martin, a prominent Florida gambling figure. The Department was so advised in Bulet 11/23/66. The Department has also requested to be informed if information obtained from electronic devices concerning any of these individuals was set forth in reports or disseminated to the IRS. Information from the technical coverage of Martin was contained in three reports prepared by the Miami Office, which were disseminated to the Department. Two of the reports were also furnished to IRS. In addition, IRS in Miami was furnished information orally regarding Martin's over-all gambling operation which included information relating to [redacted] two of the 7 individuals currently appealing their conviction.

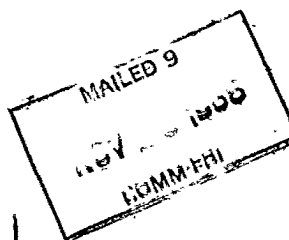
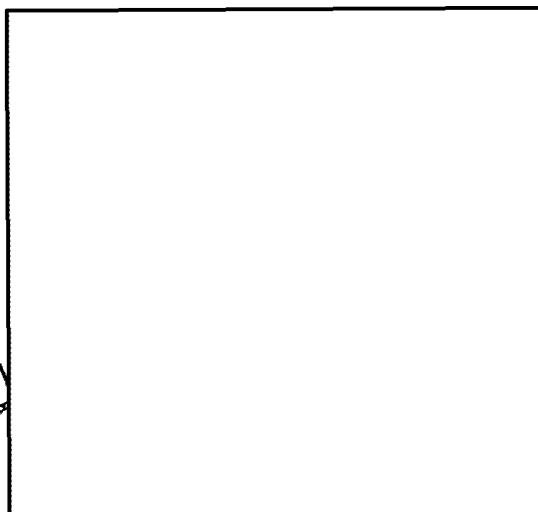

The above subjects were convicted of gambling violations in the Florida courts based upon evidence furnished by Internal Revenue Service and the testimony of Special Agents of the Service. These subjects have filed a petition for certiorari which is now pending before the United States Supreme Court. The Supreme Court has requested the Solicitor General to express the views of the United States on this case. The memorandum of the Solicitor General is due to be filed on November 29, 1966. While the Supreme Court's request to the Solicitor is with respect to the merits of the case, we nonetheless feel that it would be appropriate at this time in view of the Court's interest in the matter to inquire as to whether there might have been electronic surveillance by the Bureau of any of the individuals involved in this case. Therefore, would you please advise us:

- (a) Whether the above-named individuals were subject to electronic surveillance by your agency.
- (b) If they were, did the electronic surveillance consist of wiretapping or an electronic eavesdropping device.
- (c) If the latter, please advise us of the method of entry utilized in the placement of the device.
- (d) When, by date did the electronic eavesdropping take place and where did it occur, that is, at their homes, offices or other locations.
- (e) Whether the named individuals appear to have been present at, or participants in, conversations overheard by any electronic device which are reflected in any recordings, transcripts, logs, notes, memoranda or other records of any such device.
- (f) If so, and if such recordings, transcripts, logs, notes, memoranda or other records still exist, would you please make them available to us.
- (g) Did the information from any such device appear directly or indirectly in reports made in reference to the above individuals by your agency. If so, would you please advise us of the reports in which such information appeared and furnish us with copies of these reports if you have not already done so.

- (h) If any information was obtained from electronic surveillance, to your knowledge was such information communicated in any manner to the Internal Revenue Service.
- (i) If so, to whom was the communication made, when was it made, and what is the nature of the information communicated.

Mr. Hundley was aware of the fact that this case against Dalitz and [redacted] was developed by Internal Revenue Service agents checking bank accounts and records of the defendants.

As you are aware, Departmental attorneys were thoroughly conversant with our microphone coverage at the Desert Inn as early as March of 1965, when a review of this coverage was undertaken in connection with the trial of Ruby Kolod in Denver, Colorado. This Departmental review was conducted prior to the indictment of Dalitz and [redacted] in the tax matter.

On 2/22/63, BA 1227-C* furnished the following information:

Informant learned the following information from a conversation involving [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] (LNU). (Not [REDACTED])

The conversation dealt with several matters. First they discussed the affairs and recent developments of FRANKIE CARBO's appeal. [REDACTED] claims that someone made him believe that after FRANKIE got out that [REDACTED] would get out also but the appeal failed. It was learned that [REDACTED] has been complaining that no one wants anything to do with her and that just recently [REDACTED] approved another \$10,000 for her use. She has already gone through \$150,000 in her fight to get FRANKIE out.

A man named [REDACTED] has contacted [REDACTED] about getting more money for FRANKIE's wife and now [REDACTED] has to figure a way to get it. This [REDACTED] is expected in Baltimore the week of February 25 to pick up some money.

The group also discussed the affairs of [REDACTED]. It seems [REDACTED] is quite upset about the [REDACTED] for some unknown reason. [REDACTED] claims that he has done a lot for [REDACTED] in the past and that now [REDACTED] is working for [REDACTED]. [] stated that he had just talked to [] and that [] is going to get his old customers back that [] had taken from him a while back. It is believed that [] is going back in the numbers business again. [] used to make a little money with [] in some type of shakedown on the numbers many months ago but [] had to quit because he got sick.

[] discussed the connections he had in the various counties, namely Howard, Baltimore and Anne Arundel. He claims to have them sewed up for open numbers operations at any time. He further stated that his man in Baltimore County is in with [].

[] went to comment that he also had connections but that in the past they have not been of a benefit to him as he has been accused of being a racketeer and a gangster.

[] further stated that he has just recently straightened out the old man and [] (possibly [] []).

[] statement is as follows:

[]: "I just straightened out the old man and [] he didn't know what they were doing and what they were going to do. They were going to take over 50% of his (probably [] numbers operation plus the fact that they had already taken 25% of [] (local numbers writer)".

[] also claims he straightened out matters between him and [] and that now everything is just fine between them. [] comment is as follows:

[]: "They had me in partners with []. I got a little foreign money - remember. He [] told them that I was his partner."

[] went to NYC to talk to the higher ups about his recent shakedown and told them he was in a partnership with [] so as to get them to lay off him.)

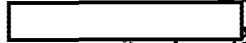

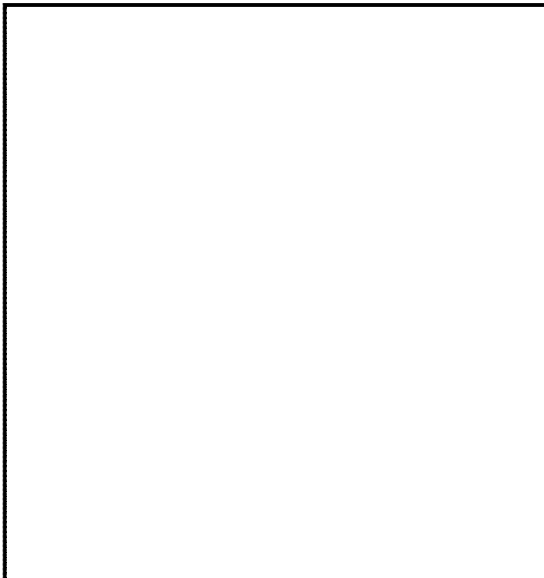

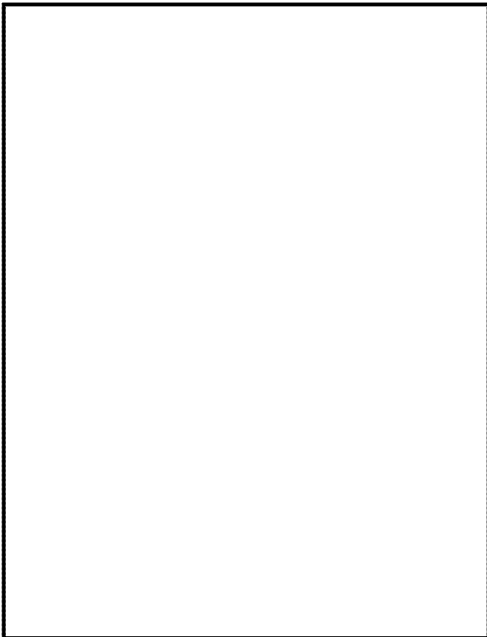

Special Agent in Charge Handley, Boston, has advised that he has received confidential information [redacted]

[redacted] that Fred Folsom, Chief of the Criminal Section of the Department's Tax Division, intends to take legal action which will cause the remanding back to the District Court of the tax conviction of Louis J. Taglianetti which is presently under appeal to the United States Circuit Court of Appeals in Boston. This action is contemplated by Folsom because of alleged tainted evidence utilized in the investigation and conviction which was obtained by the FBI through use of "wiretaps." Folsom made reference to recordings of conversations in April, 1962.

Taglianetti was indicted February 26, 1963 and convicted in United States District Court, April 28, 1966, on three counts of Federal income tax violations. He appealed the conviction upon denial of a motion for a new trial. Pursuant to request of Assistant Attorney General Rogovin, we furnished considerable material in the form of logs and supporting memoranda containing information of conversations between Taglianetti and his La Cosa Nostra superior, New England "boss," Raymond L. S. Patriarca in whose office we had microphone coverage from March 1, 1962, to July 12, 1965. A review of this material in the Tax Division is obviously the grounds for the contemplated legal action.

By memorandum of May 17, 1965, Attorney General Katzenbach had been advised that the Patriarca microphone coverage had been in operation since March 6, 1962, and the Attorney General authorized its continuance.

[redacted] conviction of Taglianetti was based strictly on Internal Revenue Service (IRS) investigation, and this was confirmed by IRS Agents [redacted]

[redacted] the Government was taking ridiculous action in this matter [redacted] Folsom, was receiving pressure from above in this particular case. [redacted]

[redacted] also confidentially advised [redacted] of the contemplated Government action.

Folsom's reported reference to recordings in April, 1962, may have reference to a monitored conversation in Raymond Patriarca's office on 4-17-63. On that occasion Taglianetti related in some detail his anticipated legal defense with regard to the income tax violation indictment. He related that [redacted] had taken him to a conference with United States District Court Judge Sidney Sugarman in New York City, and Sugarman's advice after reportedly reviewing the case was to stand trial rather than plead guilty. Taglianetti claimed that he had been offered a deal by then United States Attorney Pettine that he would only receive a fine rather than a jail sentence if he would plead guilty. Because of Sugarman's status as a United States District Court Judge in the Southern District of New York, Attorney General Kennedy was advised of this situation by letter of April 26, 1963, the information being attributed to a "source familiar with hoodlum activities in the New England area."

The original of the letter was returned to [redacted] with Attorney General Kennedy's handwritten notation on its face, "Status-Anything further. RPK." This letter was not returned to Kennedy and still in our files. In response Kennedy was told by letter of May 14, 1963, there was nothing new with reference to meeting with Judge Sugarman, but he was given the details of Taglianetti's indictment and arraignment. Copies of both letters to Attorney General Kennedy were designated for the Assistant Attorneys General of the Tax and Criminal Divisions.

Enclosed for your review are a copy of the log dated October 2, 1964, of the mentioned microphone surveillance consisting of three pages and a copy of a memorandum consisting of two pages prepared by our Newark, New Jersey, Office under the date November 4, 1964, concerning a portion of the mentioned log noted as reel number 119, cuts 26-38.

It is noted in this log that after Dioguardi departed the meeting with Catena, information is set forth concerning conversations between Catena and unidentified persons which apparently relates to Hills Korvette. Inasmuch as Hills Korvette is one of the customers of the victim company allegedly taken away by Dioguardi, a determination by the Department appears necessary as to whether this circumstance will have an effect on the investigation of captioned case as requested by the Department. In response to our memorandum 11/29/66, advising John Dioguardi appeared before microphone surveillance at Newark, New Jersey, Department has requested by memorandum 12/2/66 logs of surveillance be made available for review. Log (NK 2319-C*) obtained from Newark shows unknown person (with notation "Dr. Philip Noto?") met with Eugene Catena, member of La Cosa Nostra, in office of Best Sales Company at Newark on 10/2/64. Tape of log was thoroughly and carefully reviewed and unknown person meeting Catena on 10/2/64 was identified as Dioguardi (not Dr. Philip Noto), according to Newark memorandum 11/4/64.

Such memorandum stated Dioguardi discussed a problem concerning representation of employees of the Consolidated Cigar Corporation in New Jersey by Dioguardi's union, to which Catena agreed. Dioguardi also mentioned contacting Thomas Eboli, member of La Cosa Nostra, and asked Catena about a gambling venture which Catena declined.

Log stated after Dioguardi departed meeting with Catena conversations had between Catena and unidentified persons relating to Hills Korvette, which is name of company to be contacted in captioned case. Newark advised conversations about Hills Korvette related to purchases of meat and soap sold by Best Sales (food brokerage business of Catena) and unknown person was possibly [redacted] Meat Cutters union at Korvette, but no other amplifying data available.

While the conversations of Dioguardi would not seem to taint the anti-racketeering investigation requested by the Department or the pending bankruptcy prosecution against Dioguardi in New York, we plan to point out the

BACKGROUND:

Subject Dioguardi, reported member of La Cosa Nostra, allegedly has been taking away customers of Kosher meats from victim company by threats or coercion in violation of the Anti-Racketeering Statute which prohibits extortion through fear of economic loss. Dioguardi is under indictment in the Southern District of New York for violation of the National Bankruptcy Act concerning fraudulent bankruptcy with respect to Consumer Kosher Provisions and trial of the bankruptcy case is scheduled in January, 1967.

RECOMMENDATION:

That the attached memorandum to the Criminal Division of the Department be approved, wherein we enclose a copy of the log dated 10/2/64 of the microphone surveillance involving Dioguardi and a memorandum dated 11/4/64 pertaining to the appearance of Dioguardi. The memorandum also points out the microphone was installed under general authority of the Department and its continuance was approved by the Attorney General according to Bureau memorandum 6/23/65, trespass was involved in its installation 3/26/62, and it was terminated 7/12/65. We suggest the Department check other agencies to determine whether any electronic devices were maintained by such agencies relative to this matter.

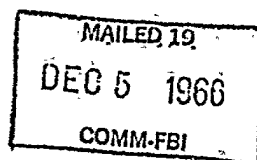

All other names on the Department's list were negative according to Buffalo files.

With regard to the Bureau's request for the assemblage of the pertinent logs, supporting transcripts and memoranda, as indicated in my telephone conversation today, the following should be considered immediately by the Bureau.

Buffalo has 187 volumes containing an estimated 55,100 pages of handwritten material. According to instructions, this material would have to be reproduced in two copies, or in excess of 110,000 pages would have to be reproduced for transmittal to the Bureau relative to just the three main subjects. If the Bureau desires a complete package of logs and supporting material on each of the 124 individuals there could conceivably be a multiple duplication of the logs thereby greatly increasing the reproduction beyond the 110,000 pages, the minimum amount to be reproduced. I am unable to estimate the total amount of reproduction but it would be extremely extensive. Buffalo Office does not have the equipment to handle this reproduction of material and additional clerical personnel would quite probably be necessary if, in fact, the Bureau would supply the equipment necessary for the reproduction. The Bureau may want to consider reproduction of the material at SOG.

I would recommend as an alternate procedure to reproduction of the logs and other supporting data that the Department be informed that the logs and supporting data is available at Buffalo for review if necessary by the Department Study Group designated to begin a six-month study of the MAGADDINO "FAMILY" at Buffalo.

The Bureau is requested to expeditiously advise concerning action desired relative to the reproduction and preparation of the supporting logs, memoranda, transcripts, etc. All offices concerned should be advised of the Bureau's decision in this matter in order that the work can be prepared expeditiously for forwarding to the Bureau.

Relative to the Department's request to be advised of the dates of misur coverage on certain individuals, information to be supplied by the Bureau will enumerate the over-all dates, beginning and end, of the misur coverage. In other words, inclusive dates of coverage on the main subjects. Where appropriate with regard to some of the subjects who may have only occasionally been monitored by the informants, the particular dates will be utilized.

2. The information to be supplied to the Bureau for referral to the Department will pertain only to the "T" symbol information in the details of the report. No action will be taken by Buffalo to itemize misur information which was reported to the Bureau on the administrative pages of any reports or in the form of letterhead memoranda submitted as enclosures to Bureau reports.

3. The form in which the material requested is to be furnished to the Bureau will be by separate letterhead memorandum on each individual listed in the Department's list. Cover airtels will be utilized to transmit the LHM to the Bureau.

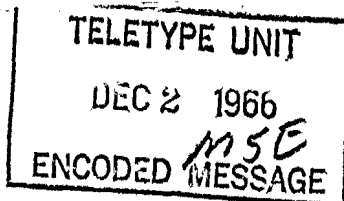

The tapes collected by JN 96-C* were furnished to the Kansas City Division for appropriate review inasmuch as personnel of the Kansas City Office were more familiar with the voices of the subjects in question.

In answer to the Departmental memo furnished with referenced airtel, the following information is set forth:

All names contained in the Departmental memo from Assistant Attorney General FRED M. VINCENT, JR., to the Director of the FBI and dated 11/23/66, were searched through the Jackson Office indices. The only individual in this list on whom an electronic surveillance has been conducted was [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] was subject of an electronic surveillance which consisted of an electronic eavesdropping device. This surveillance did not consist of any "wire tapping."

The method of entry utilized in the placement of this electronic device was by "legal" means in that the individuals placing this device gained entry to the premises where the surveillance was to be conducted at a time when the premises were not under the care, custody, control, or occupancy of the subject.

A review of your records will reveal that on June 23, 1965, the Department approved the continuance of an electronic surveillance in which trespass was involved on Samuel Rizzo DeCavalcante at 21 North Michigan Avenue, Kenilworth, New Jersey. This electronic surveillance revealed both subjects DeCavalcante and [redacted]

[redacted] were participants in recorded conversations from this installation. No electronic surveillance was ever placed on [redacted] nor was he a participant in recorded conversations from an electronic surveillance placed by the FBI.

On February 11, 1962, DeCavalcante was believed to be a participant in a recorded conversation from an electronic surveillance placed on Angelo Bruno at 775 South 8th Street, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. The continuance of a surveillance at the above address, which involved trespass, was approved by the Department on May 17, 1965.

It should be noted both of the above-mentioned electronic surveillances were discontinued on July 12, 1965, which action long preceded the first notice of this violation. This Bureau, therefore, strongly protests any action which

Reference is made to memoranda from the Criminal Division of the Department dated November 21 and 22, 1966, (Department file 123-52-139) which requested investigation be extended to determine whether the activities of subject Dioguardi involve a violation of the Anti-Racketeering Statute.

It is noted Dioguardi had been indicted by a Federal grand jury in the Southern District of New York on April 21, 1966, for violation of the National Bankruptcy Act. Reports containing the results of our investigation concerning this bankruptcy matter have been previously furnished to the Department. The trial of the bankruptcy case is expected to commence in January, 1967.

For your information logs of a microphone surveillance at Newark, New Jersey, reveal a person identified as John Dioguardi met with Eugene Catena, New Jersey hoodlum, at the office of Best Sales Company in Newark on October 2, 1964, when a problem concerning representation of employees of the Consolidated Cigar Corporation of New Jersey by Dioguardi's union was resolved by Catena. Dioguardi also asked Catena about a gambling venture, which Catena declined to consider.

The logs which reveal a person identified as John Dioguardi appeared before the mentioned microphone surveillance will be made available for review by the Department if you desire. It is requested the Department advise whether investigation of Dioguardi concerning a possible Anti-Racketeering violation should proceed in view of the foregoing.

Reference is made to the Bureau report of interview dated November 10, 1966 regarding the captioned matter. Having reviewed the material therein provided, it is our opinion that further investigation is warranted toward establishing violations of 18 U.S.C. 1951, the Hobbs Act. Section 1951 prohibits extortion or attempted extortion which in any way reasonably could be regarded as affecting interstate commerce. The Act defines "extortion" to mean the "obtaining of property from another . . . induced by wrongful use of actual or threatened force, violence, or fear . . ." With reference to the facts of the instant case, it is particularly noted that the statute contemplates that fear in the victim may be caused by fear of injury to one's business, and that it is sufficient for extortion under the Act if the victim is induced to pay a demand solely by threats of economic harm.

According to [redacted] American Kosher Provisions and one source of information appearing in the Bureau report, John Dioguardi was angered by the refusal of American to consummate a merger agreement between that corporation and Consumer Kosher Provisions. The latter corporation was reported by [redacted] to be a Dioguardi controlled enterprise. Terms of the proposed merger would involve 20,000 shares of the stock of American being given to the Consumer principals as well as the employment of Dioguardi by American at a weekly salary of \$500. [redacted] expected that an alliance with Dioguardi interests would be attended

by increased sales, but he also understood that a failure to reach accord on terms favorable to Dio would result in reprisals damaging to his business. Dio had made it evident to [redacted] that retention of American Sales accounts was contingent on implementing the merger agreement with the Dioguardi controlled company. The negotiations were, therefore, instinct with the elements of a demand for certain properties and threats of economic harm if such properties were not obtained pursuant to the merger agreement. That is, the transaction contemplated an employment contract providing substantial salary for Dioguardi, and he attempted to reach an accord on this merger agreement by threatening American with financial distress if it did not come to terms. The extortion of "property" as construed by the Hobbs Act would include exaction of such a merger and the attending enrichment of Dio.

According to [redacted] American has experienced the loss of nine major accounts to Mizerach Kosher Provisions. [redacted] indicated that Mizerach is associated with Dioguardi, and he further stated that Dioguardi had possibly implemented the loss of American accounts by threatening to precipitate labor problems for the various customers. [redacted] has identified the following accounts as having been terminated as a result of pressures effected by Dio:

Waldbaum, Inc. - account discontinued May 24, 1965
Bohacks - account discontinued November 19, 1965
Daitch Shop-well - account discontinued April 4, 1966
Times Square Stores - account discontinued May, 1966
Packers Supermarket - account discontinued June 13, 1966
Spinners Quickway Markets - account discontinued
June 15, 1966
Hills Korvette - account discontinued August 15, 1966
Sloan's Supermarket - account discontinued October 10, 1966
Food City - account discontinued October 10, 1966

It is suggested, at this juncture, that the scope of the Bureau's investigation be extended toward determining the involvement of Dio in the loss of the above accounts and whether any threats or coercion precipitated this loss of business. Maintenance of successful prosecution would, in part, depend on whether Dio had instrumented the loss of these accounts and whether threats of labor unrest or other unlawful coercion was used to influence the decisions of the above cited customers to change their supplier from American to Dio controlled sources. It is requested that the Bureau interview the meat buyers and/or other management agents of each of the retail market concerns listed above to determine if the transfer of their accounts was motivated by any external coercion or induced by threats on the part of Dioguardi and his associates. [redacted] has indicated certain of the retail market agents who might be knowledgeable as to the reasons for switching the accounts of their respective stores. These persons include [redacted] the former meat buyer for Bohacks; [redacted] an assistant to [redacted] at Bohacks; [redacted] the meat buyer for Waldbaum, Inc.; [redacted] an employee of Daitch Shop-Well; [redacted] of Times Square Stores; [redacted] of Packers; [redacted] of Korvette; [redacted] the buyer at Sloan's Supermarkets; and [redacted] the buyer at Food City.

Electronic surveillance checks

Set out below is an analysis of a proposed supplemental memorandum for the United States received from Acting Attorney General Clark on the late evening of November 28, 1966. In the new version of the proposed memorandum, the Department has recognized, in part, some of the objections we raised with the Department in our letter of November 28, 1966, concerning a proposed draft submitted by the Department to us late on the evening of November 25, 1966.

Specifically, the Department has indicated that the authorization for this installation is the same as that in the Black case. When pressed by you on November 28, 1966, they agreed orally to spell out that the Bureau was acting on the Department's authorization in approving this installation, just as was done in the Black case. In this connection, we are, in the attached letter to the Acting Attorney General, suggesting specific language for inclusion at the bottom of page two of the proposed supplemental memorandum.

The Department has also followed our suggestion and deleted from the new document the identification of the place where the microphone was located as a "travel bureau" which would, of course, have alerted the underworld to the fact of our coverage at this place if it would have remained unchanged.

In the new document, the Department, while still indicating to the Supreme Court their intention of advising the court of any and all instances of cases involving past or future prosecution where electronic devices have been utilized, has softened the document to the point where they have dropped some of their inflammatory language. For example, in the original document sent to the Bureau, they utilized phraseology such as "abuses" in referring to our electronic coverage, whereas in this document this term has been deleted.

We are also referring the Department to a memorandum from [redacted] dated October 20, 1961 (attached), wherein he transmitted two reports of Alcohol and Tobacco Tax investigators, which indicate that those investigators were planning to install an electronic surveillance in connection with [redacted]. We are pointing out to the Department that this memorandum contradicts the statement in the proposed supplemental memorandum to the effect that the Department first became aware of the use of electronic equipment in 1966, whereas, [redacted] memorandum clearly indicates that the Department was on notice in this connection as early as 1961.

We are asking the Department to advise us whether their inquiries have indicated any other agencies employed this technique and we are urging the Department to furnish the Supreme Court full particulars in this connection.

SYNOPSIS

By memoranda November 21 and 22, 1966, the Department requested investigation be extended to determine whether the activities of Dioguardi involve violation of Anti-Racketeering (AR) Statute which prohibits extortionate demands through fear of economic loss. Allegedly Dioguardi has been taking away customers of victim company by coercion. Dioguardi had been indicted 4/21/66 at New York under the National Bankruptcy Act (NBA) regarding fraudulent bankruptcy involving Consumer Kosher Provisions. Trial of bankruptcy case expected in January, 1967. (49-17307-24) *(for information 11/28/66)*

Special indices at Bureau revealed person identified as John Dioguardi met with Eugene Catena at Newark, New Jersey, on 10/2/64, according to microphone surveillance (NK 2319-C*). Discussion concerned control of unidentified union and mention made of gambling venture. Dioguardi did not appear before any New York microphone surveillance, but his name was mentioned 3/10/64 in conversation between two other individuals before microphone surveillance (NY 4120-C*). Although such information would not appear to taint AR or NBA matters involving Dioguardi, it is believed the Department should be apprised of microphone surveillance. The logs should be offered for review by the Department and advice of Department should be requested as to whether requested AR investigation of Dioguardi should go forward.

BACKGROUND: Dioguardi, reputedly member of La.Cosa Nostra, was previously involved in investigation of acid blinding of Victor Riesel, news labor columnist. Dioguardi released from Federal prison in 1963 where he served jail sentence of four years after conviction in New York for Federal income tax evasion. (92-8606-2)

Department received information from [Redacted] of the Tax Division of Department, who is the [Redacted] of the victim company, to the effect nine major customers had been lost to Dioguardi

(now operator of Mizerach Kosher Provisions). Bureau index of microphone surveillances maintained in Special Investigative Division revealed Dioguardi's name appeared on two devices, one in Newark and one in New York.

DEVELOPMENTS: Newark teletype 11/26/66 stated logs of microphone surveillance NK 2319-C* revealed person identified as John Dioguardi met with Eugene Catena (member of La Cosa Nostra in Vito Genovese family) at office of Best Sales Company in Newark on 10/2/64 when a problem concerning representation of employees of Consolidated Cigar Corporation by Dioguardi's union was resolved by Catena. Dioguardi also asked Catena about a gambling venture which Catena declined.

New York teletype 11/26/66 stated Dioguardi did not appear before any New York microphone surveillance; however, the log of microphone NY 4120-C* revealed conversation between two individuals wherein the name Johnny Dio (alias of Dioguardi) was mentioned among other New York hoodlums.

OBSERVATIONS: Considering the above circumstances and in view of imminent trial of Dioguardi under NBA in January, 1967, it is believed advisable to apprise the Department of the appearance of Dioguardi before the microphone surveillance in Newark, even though this instance would not taint the NBA prosecution or the current AR investigation. Since Dioguardi did not appear before microphone at New York, there is no necessity to advise the Department the name Johnny Dio was mentioned before a microphone in New York because the rights of Dioguardi would not be affected in any event.

RECOMMENDATIONS: That attached memorandum to the Acting Attorney General, with copy to Criminal Division, be approved wherein the Department is apprised of the appearance of Dioguardi before microphone surveillance at Newark, the logs of that instance are offered for review by the Department, and the advice of the Department requested as to whether AR investigation of Dioguardi should proceed in light of the foregoing.

Reference is made to the letter of Assistant Attorney General Fred M. Vinson, Jr., dated November 23, 1966, captioned "Electronic Surveillance in Organized Crime Cases" furnishing the names of 244 individuals and requesting that this Bureau's records be searched to determine if any of these individuals were the subjects of an electronic surveillance. Reference is also made to my reply thereto dated December 12, 1966, under the same caption, which identified certain individuals who were subject to, or monitored by, an electronic surveillance by this Bureau.

One individual so identified in referenced reply is Samuel Joseph Giordano, who was never a direct subject of an electronic surveillance conducted by this Bureau, but on February 10, 1964, was a participant in a conversation overheard by this Bureau's microphone surveillance at the office of Home Juice Company, 6431 East Palmer, Detroit, Michigan. This installation which was in effect from January 21, 1963, to July 27, 1964, was made in connection with criminal intelligence coverage in the Detroit, Michigan, area. Trespass was involved in this installation. During the period of this installation, the office of Home Juice Company was frequented by well-known Detroit, Michigan, hoodlums. Giordano was a visitor at this company when the aforementioned conversation was overheard.

This installation was established and operated pursuant to the authorization for such coverage which was in effect during the tenure of the then Attorney General Robert F. Kennedy. No information from this source concerning Giordano has appeared in any reports, nor has any information from this source concerning Giordano been furnished to the Internal Revenue Service.

For your information this is the planned bankruptcy case in which [] and Giordano defrauded innocent creditors of approximately \$20,000 in merchandise through the operation and disposition of assets of Palm Furniture Company, Detroit, Michigan, during 1960. Based on the results of our investigation, [] and Giordano were indicted on October 3, 1962, by a Detroit, Michigan, Federal grand jury on charges of violation of the National Bankruptcy Act and Conspiracy Statutes. Both subjects were convicted as charged in U. S. District Court, Detroit, Michigan, on March 25, 1964. It should be pointed out that all investigation in this case was completed and the indictment against subjects was returned prior to the date of Giordano's appearance before this installation on February 10, 1964.

Copies of the original logs pertaining to the conversation involving Giordano have been obtained and will be made available to the Criminal Division.

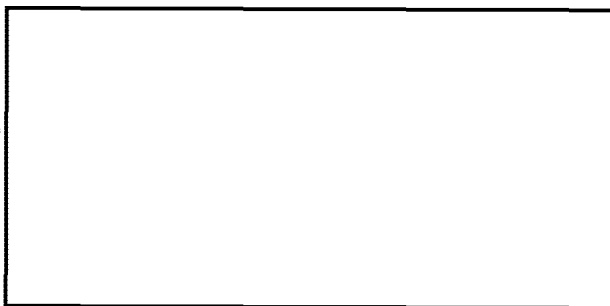

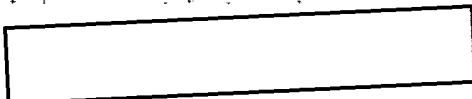

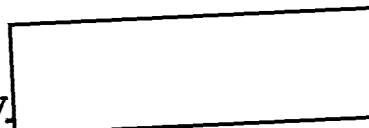

By memorandum A. Rosen to Mr. DeLoach dated 12/28/66 (attached), information was set forth as to any appearances before electronic devices, whether connected in any manner with the Hoffa substantive case or not, by James Riddle Hoffa. [redacted]

[redacted] the five individuals who have been convicted in the criminal trials which arose from our intensive investigations of Hoffa and his associates.

The Director instructed that we insure the Department is advised of these appearances, including (1) appearances of Hoffa and [redacted] before a radio monitoring device of our Detroit office which did not require trespass and (2) the appearance of [redacted] before a tape recording device attached to [redacted]

[redacted] which likewise did not require trespass.

Although the monitoring of Hoffa and [redacted] on the radio device in our Detroit office produced no information of significance in developing evidence against them (nor did certain other appearances by Hoffa before monitoring devices), we nevertheless included full details of all appearances by Hoffa and/or his named associates, including the two situations cited above, in our letter to the Acting Attorney General dated 12/29/66 (copy attached). *62-310*

ACTION:

In accordance with advice in our letter to the Acting Attorney General (attached) we are obtaining the transcripts of the recording made involving [redacted] the logs relating to the monitoring of Hoffa and [redacted] by our Detroit office as well as the logs of other instances cited in this letter and will make this material available to the Criminal Division promptly.

SYNOPSIS

By letter dated 12/5/66, Assistant Attorney General (AAG) Fred M. Vinson, Jr., requested advice as to whether Hoffa and four of his associates [redacted]

who have been convicted of obstruction of justice, were subject to electronic surveillance by the FBI and, if so, details thereof; also whether these persons appear to have been present at or participated in conversations overheard electronically.

We wrote the Acting Attorney General on 12/15/66 that he would be advised of results of these checks. Letter to the Acting Attorney General (with copies for Deputy Attorney General and AAG Vinson) furnishing pertinent information in our files is attached for approval. Logs and other material not furnished to the Department previously will be delivered to the Criminal Division and receipt obtained.

Hoffa and [redacted] were never prime targets of electronic surveillance. Between 7/31/61 and 4/2/65, our Detroit office had in operation a commercial-type FM radio-receiver capable of receiving conversations broadcast to and received from radio-telephones in automobiles operated by Teamsters Union personnel in the Detroit area. This radio monitoring did not require trespass. Conversations of Hoffa and [redacted] which were overheard thereby do not appear to be of any significance to this case.

Hoffa appears also to have participated in four telephone conversations with two Las Vegas figures who were covered by electronic eavesdropping devices (trespass- [redacted])

[redacted] was recorded with [redacted] knowledge and concurrence. This was done through prior installation of a concealed recording system [redacted] No trespass was involved in this installation which was made at the Department's request. This has been the subject of prior communications to the Department.

new installation Dept of Justice
[redacted] was not subject to electronic surveillance.

[redacted] was subject of electronic surveillance on 11/11/63 when his attempt to "fix" a juror for Hoffa was recorded by a miniature recorder concealed on the person of a cooperative Government witness. No trespass was involved in this installation with which the Department is fully conversant. This was brought out fully at [redacted] trial and in connection with the appeal of his conviction which the Supreme Court affirmed on 12/12/66.

James E. Haggerty (deceased Detroit lawyer and former attorney for Hoffa). While Vinson's letter of 12/5/66 does not request information concerning electronic coverage of Haggerty, we are referring to this in our letter to the Acting Attorney General since we had microphone coverage of Haggerty's hotel room, Washington, D. C., in early August, 1961.

This microphone surveillance, which required trespass and which has been the subject matter of prior memoranda, was established pursuant to Bobby Kennedy's oral request to [redacted] for "appropriate surveillance" of Haggerty while he was in Washington, D. C. The purpose of this surveillance was to identify any contact Haggerty had with a Department employee, Kennedy being of the opinion such contact would be surreptitious with one of Hoffa's reported sources in the Department. There has been prior correspondence with the Department concerning this installation and Mr. DeLoach discussed it with Acting Attorney General Clark on 12/16/66.

RECOMMENDATION

Attached for approval is a letter to the Acting Attorney General (with copies for the Deputy Attorney General and AAG Vinson) setting out information requested in Vinson's 12/5/66 letter, and advising that logs and other pertinent material not furnished to the Department previously will be delivered to the Criminal Division. Appropriate mention also is being made of our microphone surveillance of Haggerty's Washington, D. C., hotel room in August, 1961.

DETAILS

DEPARTMENTAL REQUEST

By memorandum dated 12/5/66, Assistant Attorney General Fred M. Vinson, Jr., Criminal Division, requested advice as to whether James Riddle Hoffa and four of his associates who have been convicted of obstruction of justice were subject to electronic surveillance; if so, the nature of each surveillance (wire tap or electronic eavesdropping device); method of entry used in the placement of the latter; when and where it occurred; whether the named subjects appear to have been present at or participants in conversations overheard by any electronic device which are reflected in recordings, logs, memoranda, etc., and, if so, that this material be made available to the Department; whether there was a direct or indirect reference in reports to the information obtained; and data as to whether the information obtained was communicated to any other agency and, if so, the manner in which this was done.

CASES INVOLVED

1. James Riddle Hoffa, Et al. - Four of the persons covered by the request are James Riddle Hoffa (President of the Teamsters Union): [REDACTED]

[REDACTED]

These individuals were convicted in U. S. District Court, Chattanooga, Tennessee, on 3/4/64 of obstruction of justice related to their efforts to tamper with certain members of the jury which tried Hoffa in Nashville in late 1962 for violating the Labor Management Relations Act (which ended with a hung jury). The Sixth Circuit Court of Appeals affirmed these convictions on 7/29/65 and the Supreme Court affirmed them on 12/12/66.

2. [REDACTED] - The fifth person covered by Vinson's request is [REDACTED] a [REDACTED] who was one of the [REDACTED] during the 1962 Labor Management Relations Act trial mentioned above and who also was [REDACTED] in the subsequent obstruction of justice trial. [REDACTED] was convicted in U. S. District Court, Nashville, on 5/29/64 of obstruction of justice related to his efforts during November, 1963, to

"fix" a potential juror in the then-forthcoming obstruction of justice trial of Hoffa. The Sixth Circuit Court of Appeals affirmed this conviction of [] on 8/27/65 and it also was affirmed by the Supreme Court on 12/12/66.

INFORMATION PERTINENT TO THE DEPARTMENT'S REQUEST

From a review of the special indices maintained at the Bureau and additional checks made of appropriate files by all of our 57 field divisions, information pertinent to the Department's request has been obtained. A summary of the salient data, broken down according to each individual, follows:

1. James Riddle Hoffa - Hoffa has never been the prime target of electronic surveillance by the FBI. There have been instances, however, in which he participated in conversations which were overheard on the dates and under the conditions described below:

a.) Between 7/31/61 and 4/2/65, our Detroit office had in operation a tunable commercial-type FM radio-receiver which was capable of receiving conversations that were broadcast to and received from radio-telephones in automobiles operated by Teamsters Union personnel. This radio monitoring did not require trespass.

Hoffa was a participant in three conversations overheard through this means and logs concerning these conversations, which occurred on 12/22/61, 1/19/62, and 10/26/62, are available and will be furnished to the Criminal Division. This information did not appear in any reports and was not communicated to any other agency. The first two conversations concern Teamsters Union or personal matters which appear to be of no significance. The third conversation refers to a meeting planned the following day at which various persons would be present.

The above-mentioned conversations of Hoffa's were innocuous, and no use was made of the information thus obtained.

b.) Between 2/1/63 and 8/12/63, Hoffa appears to have participated in four telephone conversations, one

with top hoodlum Morris Barney Dalitz (2/6/63) and three with Las Vegas casino operator Major Riddle (2/1, 2/27, and 8/12/63). Hoffa's part of these conversations was not overheard. Three conversations relate to an insurance company and a \$4½ million loan to buy same, and the other relates to a hotel reservation. These conversations were innocuous and valueless.

The conversation of Dalitz was overheard on LV 69-C*. This was an electronic eavesdropping device installed in the executive offices of the Desert Inn Hotel, Las Vegas, Nevada, utilized by Dalitz and other hotel executives. The installation of this device required trespass and was active from 3/22/62 (92-3068-232), to 8/15/63 (62-9-65-515).

The conversations of Riddle were overheard on LV 70-C*. This was an electronic eavesdropping device installed in the executive office of the Dunes Hotel, Las Vegas. The installation of this device required trespass and was active from 5/18/62 (92-6296-X1), to 8/15/63, (62-9-65-515).

The foregoing information did not appear in any reports nor was it communicated to any other agency. Logs including these conversations are available and will be furnished to the Department. The 2/1 and 8/12/63 conversations also are mentioned in Las Vegas airtels to the Bureau dated 2/5 and 8/15/63 in the Dunes Hotel Anti-Racketeering case. Since this information is not any more specific than that in the logs for 2/1 and 8/12/63 and these airtels contain extraneous data not covered by the Department's request, these airtels will not be furnished to the Department.

The 2/27/63 conversation also is mentioned in Las Vegas airtel to the Bureau dated 3/16/63 in the Dunes Hotel case. This is a lengthy airtel which also contains other data not covered by the Department's request. However, the conversation with Hoffa reported therein is more detailed than that shown on the log of the 2/27 conversation. Consequently, this airtel will be made available to the Department.

The foregoing represent the only instances in which we can identify Hoffa as having been present at or participating in conversations overheard electronically.

2. [] - [] also has never been the prime target of an electronic surveillance by the FBI. In connection with the monitoring done by our Detroit office, as stated previously herein, of radio-telephone conversations to and from radio-telephones in automobiles operated by Teamsters Union personnel in the Detroit area (no trespass involved), conversations [] had with various persons (none with Hoffa) were overheard on numerous occasions between 7/31/61 and 3/30/65. These conversations concerned various matters, such as personal and Teamsters Union matters, appointments for meetings, and the comings and goings of [] and others. None of this information appears to be of any significance to the case in which [] was convicted. Logs concerning these conversations are available and will be furnished to the Department.

Information obtained from one of [] conversations concerning the whereabouts and proposed travel of two Detroit Teamsters Union officials (Frank Fitzsimmons and [] was sent to the Criminal Division of the Department by Detroit letterhead memorandum dated 11/21/63 (72-1459-1500). Information concerning the whereabouts of [] in early January, 1964, was sent to the Criminal Division by Detroit letterhead memorandum dated 1/20/64 (72-1459-1806). It is noted this information was attributed in these memoranda to a confidential source, the nature of which was not described therein. Information arising out of [] conversations did not appear in any other reports or communications and none of this information was communicated to any other agency.

These are the only instances in which it appears [] was present at or participated in conversations overheard electronically.

3. [] - [] was the subject of electronic surveillance on only one occasion (5/8/63) and the facts concerning this are as follows:

On 5/2/63, Assistant Attorney General Herbert J. Miller, Jr., requested that []

[] be equipped with a device that would record damaging statements which [] might make during a proposed meeting of these individuals.

that was to take place in [] Nashville on 5/6/63. Miller stated that this had been explored with [] and he was perfectly willing to cooperate (63-5327-3213). Miller subsequently advised that the meeting of [] and [] had been deferred until 5/8/63.

Accordingly, a concealed recording system was installed [] made available by [] at Birmingham, Alabama, on 5/7/63. There was no trespass involved in this installation as it was done with [] knowledge and consent. [] thereafter, proceeded to Nashville where he met [] with [] on 5/8/63, and a recording of a 93-minute conversation between the two was made. Wiring associated with this installation was removed [] on 5/10/63 at Birmingham, Alabama.

Department representatives on the scene at Nashville were kept currently informed with respect to this installation. The use of this recording device was reported in the report of SA [] dated 5/20/63 at Memphis, Tennessee, a copy of which was sent to the Criminal Division on 5/27/63 (72-1446-137). The tape recording of this conversation has been destroyed. However, a typewritten transcript of this recording was forwarded to the Criminal Division on 6/12/63 as an enclosure to our memorandum dated 6/10/63 at Memphis (72-1446-143).

In addition, we wrote a letter to the Attorney General on 2/10/64 relating certain investigative steps that had been taken with respect to our obstruction of justice investigation of Hoffa, including the above-mentioned use of the recording device during [] meeting with []. Specific mention was made therein of Assistant Attorney General Miller's approval of the use of the recording equipment (72-1459-1996). None of this information has been communicated to any other agency.

[] does not appear to have been present at or a participant in any other conversation overheard by an electronic device.

4. [] - This individual was not subject to electronic surveillance by the FBI nor does he appear to have been present at or a participant in conversations overheard by any electronic device.

5. [] - [] was the subject of an electronic surveillance on only one occasion, 11/11/63, on which date a tape recording of a conversation between

[redacted] was obtained. This conversation related to [redacted] request that [redacted] "fix" a potential juror in a then-forthcoming trial of Hoffa.

At the Department's request, and with the concurrence of the two Federal Judges in Nashville, a miniature recorder was concealed under [redacted] clothing prior to his meeting with [redacted] on 11/11/63. This recording was introduced into evidence at [redacted] trial and transcripts thereof were included in the briefs filed in connection with [redacted] appeal of his conviction. The Supreme Court affirmed this conviction in a seven to one decision returned on 12/12/66.

Since the Department is thoroughly conversant with the facts concerning this recording and, in fact, defended its use during the Supreme Court proceedings in the [redacted] case, in our letter to the Attorney General (attached) we are not going into detail concerning this incident, but merely stating that the Department is thoroughly familiar with same.

[redacted] does not appear to have been present at or a participant in any other conversations overheard by an electronic device.

6. James E. Haggerty - Haggerty was a Detroit lawyer who, before his death on November 10, 1966, acted as legal counsel for Hoffa. While Vinson's letter of December 5, 1966, does not request information concerning electronic coverage of Haggerty, it is felt this should be included in the attached letter to the Acting Attorney General in order to present a complete picture since we did have microphone coverage of Haggerty's hotel room in Washington, D. C., in early August, 1961. This coverage has been the subject matter of prior memoranda and prior correspondence with the Department.

As background, it is pointed out that on 8/1/61 Kennedy advised Evans that he, Kennedy, had received information indicating that Haggerty was planning to come to Washington, D. C., on 8/7/61 to meet his "contact" (unidentified) in the Justice Department. Since Haggerty would have no legitimate business with the Justice Department, Kennedy felt this contact would be surreptitious with one of Hoffa's reported sources in the Department. Accordingly, Kennedy asked that the Bureau conduct "appropriate

surveillance" of Haggerty while he was in Washington, D. C., for the purpose of identifying any contact with a Department employee. Pursuant thereto, a microphone surveillance (trespass required) on Haggerty's hotel room (401) at the Sheraton-Carlton Hotel was established on 8/7/61 upon Haggerty's arrival in the District of Columbia.

This microphone surveillance and a physical surveillance of Haggerty, which also was instituted on his arrival in Washington, D. C., were maintained until 8/11/61 when they were terminated upon Haggerty's departure from Washington, D. C. It is noted that this microphone coverage of Haggerty did not succeed in establishing its intended purpose - Hoffa's contact in the Department was not identified and no other information of value was obtained.

Evans wrote another memorandum dated 3/13/62 which expanded on his 8/1/61 conversation with Kennedy. Although our files do not show what motivated the preparation of this memorandum, it provides clear documentation that the microphone surveillance was established pursuant to Kennedy's request.

In this memorandum, Evans stated that while the language in his prior memorandum reporting Kennedy's request for "appropriate surveillance" did not explicitly describe the surveillance requested by Kennedy, "There is no question that his request covered both a physical surveillance and a microphone surveillance of Haggerty's hotel room The fact that the Attorney General had asked for both a physical and microphone surveillance was clearly understood Nevertheless, my memorandum at the time should have more explicitly described the nature of the Attorney General's request."

During our controversy with the Department concerning the proposed documents to be filed with the Supreme Court in the [] case, we wrote a 6/21/66 memorandum in that case to then-Attorney General Katzenbach citing therein the microphone surveillance of Haggerty as an example to show that as early as 1961 Kennedy had requested a microphone surveillance on an attorney (Haggerty) who was representing a person (Hoffa) who, at the time, was the subject of Federal legal proceedings.

On December 16, 1966, Mr. DeLoach conferred with Acting Attorney General Clark in the latter's office concerning the Louis J. Taglianetti case. On this occasion Mr. DeLoach showed Mr. Clark a copy of Evans' 3/13/62 memorandum which clearly states that the Attorney General's request for appropriate surveillance of Haggerty covered both a physical surveillance and a microphone surveillance of Haggerty's hotel room.

ELECTRONIC SURVEILLANCE CHECKS

Reference is made to your memorandum of November 1, 1966, regarding Abraham Sarkis, wherein you advised his name, or references thereto, appeared on microphone transcripts resulting from electronic coverages of the premises of Coin-O-Matic Distributing Company, 168 Atwells Avenue, Providence, Rhode Island, from March 6, 1962, to July 12, 1965. You also advised that none of the information so obtained was disseminated to the Internal Revenue Service.

Under receipt of November 18, 1966, this Division received from your Bureau various selected logs and memoranda dated within the mentioned period of coverage.

In the course of our review it has come to our attention that on March 6, 1962, and again on March 29, 1962, agents of the Internal Revenue Service conferred with Special Agent [redacted] F.B.I., Boston, for the purpose of interchanging information. The Internal Revenue Service agents were at that time conducting the investigation in respect to Sarkis which resulted in his eventual indictment. Of the logs and memoranda which you made available, only one document falls within the March 6 to March 29, 1962 period. We note, however, that certain logs supplied in connection with a similar inquiry as to one [redacted] contained references to Sarkis and that these particular logs were inadvertently omitted in respect to the Sarkis request.

Sarkis is scheduled to stand trial on March 1, 1967, on charges of tax evasion. In anticipation of various pre-trial motions and in order for the Department to be completely informed it is necessary for a designated attorney from this office to interview and confer with the mentioned IRS personnel as well as your Special Agent [redacted]. Also it is necessary that our attorney review all logs and memoranda relating to the mentioned surveillance and falling within the March 6 to March 29, 1966 period (both dates included).

Reference is made to your letter of November 23, 1966, captioned "Electronic Surveillances in Organized Crime Cases" and my reply thereto dated December 12, 1966, under the same caption, which identifies certain individuals who were subject to, or monitored by, an electronic surveillance by this Bureau.

One individual so identified in referenced reply is [redacted] also known as [redacted] who was never a direct subject of an electronic surveillance conducted by this Bureau, but was a participant in numerous conversations overheard by this Bureau's microphone surveillance on the office of [redacted] First National Mortgage Company, 645 North Michigan Avenue, Chicago, Illinois. [redacted] has been identified as a close associate of Felix Anthony Alderisio, a well-known Chicago, Illinois, hoodlum. This installation, which was in effect from October 2, 1964, to April 7, 1965, was made in connection with criminal intelligence coverage in the Chicago, Illinois, area. Trespass was involved in this installation. No information from this source has appeared in any reports, nor has any information from this source concerning Rosenberg been furnished to the Internal Revenue Service.

For your information, this is the planned bankruptcy case in which [redacted] and [redacted] Sterling-Harris Ford, Incorporated, a Chicago, Illinois, Ford agency, in 1961, disposed of three hundred new and used cars in contemplation of bankruptcy in order to pay off heavy gambling debts to Chicago, Illinois, hoodlums. Our investigation established a cash concealment approximating \$300,000 and

On the basis of a request received from the Criminal Division concerning coverage of certain individuals by electronic surveillances, it has been determined through a review of the special indices of the Special Investigative Division that one of the captioned subjects, [REDACTED] was a participant in numerous conversations overheard by our microphone surveillance on the office of [REDACTED] First National Mortgage Company, 645 North Michigan Avenue, Chicago, Illinois. [REDACTED] has been identified as a close associate of Felix Anthony Alderisio, a well-known Chicago, Illinois, hoodlum.

This installation which was in effect from 10/2/64, to 4/7/65, was made in connection with criminal intelligence coverage in the Chicago area. Trespass was involved in the installation. According to the Chicago office no information from this source concerning [REDACTED] has appeared in any reports nor has any information from this source concerning [REDACTED] been furnished to the Internal Revenue Service.

Captioned matter is the planned bankruptcy case in which [REDACTED] and three other individuals were involved in the disposition of 300 new and used cars approximating \$300,000 in value, which were a part of the assets of Sterling-Harris Ford, Incorporated, a Chicago, Illinois, Ford agency. Our investigation which was initiated 3/8/61, and completed 10/3/61, resulted in an indictment being returned on 7/10/64, by a Chicago, Illinois, Federal grand jury charging captioned subjects with violations of the National Bankruptcy Act and Conspiracy Statutes. All subjects were convicted as charged in U. S. District Court, Chicago, Illinois, on 6/8/66. It should be noted that our investigation was completed and the indictment against subjects returned prior to the period of installation of this microphone surveillance.

The indictment concerned 4 thefts of valuable shipments which occurred between August, 1964, and October, 1965. One of the shipments was of polaroid cameras and the three others were loads of silver. 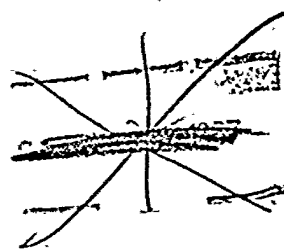
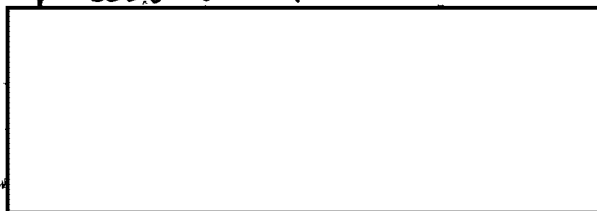

PURPOSE

One of the subjects in this case was among the individuals concerning whom the Criminal Division of the Department has requested specific information and logs of any electronic surveillances. While no electronic surveillances were used in this investigation 3 of the subjects took part in conversations which were recorded through electronic surveillances in connection with other matters. This is to furnish the Department with the requested information.

BACKGROUND

This investigation concerns 4 separate thefts from interstate shipment which occurred from August, 1964, through October, 1965. Involved were one shipment of polaroid cameras valued at over \$100,000 and 3 separate shipments of silver together valued at over \$900,000.

As a result of our investigation 18 individuals have been indicted by a Federal Grand Jury, Chicago, for violations and/or conspiracy to violate the Federal laws concerning Kidnaping, Theft from Interstate Shipment, Interstate Transportation of Stolen Property and/or Interstate Transportation of Stolen Motor Vehicle.

Among the subjects are several individuals who are well-known Chicago hoodlum figures and also Michael D'Alessio, a New York hoodlum.

MURPHY commented that the FBI was putting a lot of heat on him (unexplained). They discussed a libel suit filed on [redacted] behalf and also an indictment against STONER in the Northern District of Alabama.

Atlanta advised that the essence of the foregoing information was set forth in Atlanta airtel to the Bureau 11/22/63, captioned BAPBOMB, BuFile 157-1025. Atlanta advised that the above coverage was not set forth in any communication prepared for dissemination. AT 1377-S* furnished no subsequent information concerning contacts between STONER and MURPHY. Atlanta noted that in the fall of 1963, STONER was attorney for the National States Rights Party and [redacted] was a leading official of the group. Both at that time were under Federal indictment for interference with desegregation of Birmingham schools.

Birmingham airtel to Mobile, 12/23/66, reported that MAT MURPHY, telephone 324-4506, Birmingham, is the MATT MURPHY connected with this case who was defendants' attorney and is now deceased. MATT MURPHY had an office in the Frank Nelson Building, Birmingham, and the above-mentioned telephone was listed to MURPHY's office.

Birmingham airtel to Mobile, 12/12/66, reported that information concerning attorney MATT MURPHY of Birmingham was received by Birmingham from confidential source BH 304-C* (RAC) which was technical coverage provided over a two-day Ku Klux Klan National Klonvocation at the Tutwiler Hotel, 2/8-9/64. Birmingham log for 2/8-9/64 reflected that MATT MURPHY was the principal speaker at the session held on 2/8/64, with the speech being monitored.

Birmingham log for 11/8/63 reflected information from BH 292-C* (RAC) reflected that [redacted] NSRP, had called [redacted] at Birmingham, an official of NSRP and mentioned that their legal counsel was MATT MURPHY of Birmingham. Birmingham log for 11/9/63 also reflected information from BH 292-C*(RAC) reflected that [redacted] [redacted] tried to phone MURPHY to inquire about filing papers in Federal Court but MURPHY was not in and the call was not accepted.

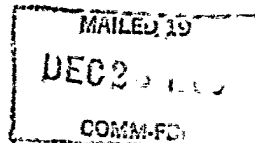
Attached hereto is an undated memorandum from the Department requesting information as to the type of installation involved in this case.

PURPOSE:

To respond to the Department with information concerning electronic devices producing information concerning subject [redacted] in captioned case. Letter to Department is attached.

BACKGROUND:

This is the case where [redacted] (Chicago hoodlum associated with top figures in the Chicago criminal element) and four others, were taken into Federal custody as the result of an indictment handed down 7/28/66, by a Chicago Federal grand jury, charging them with violation of the ITSP, FBW, and Conspiracy Statutes. The charges on which the action against the above-mentioned individuals were based arise from their activity in perpetrating a scheme to defraud an Indiana lumber dealer to whom they had made available counterfeit stock of the Consolidated Edison Company, Chicago, Illinois, which stock was used as collateral for a loan of more than \$150,000 in an Indiana bank. In carrying out this scheme, interstate phone calls were made and the spurious stock was transported interstate, all in violation of the Federal statutes. Trial date not yet set.

ELECTRONIC COVERAGE:

SURVEILLANCE CHECKS

Our master indices of microphone and telephone surveillances maintained by the Special Investigative Division and the Domestic Intelligence Division were searched and it was determined that [redacted] was not the direct subject of any electronic surveillance; however, his voice was monitored by the Chicago and Las Vegas Offices in connection with an electronic surveillance in organized crime matters. None of the four other subjects arrested in this

SURVEILLANCE CHECKS

The Department of Justice yesterday (12-27-66) filed a motion in the First Circuit Court of Appeals at Boston to remand the income tax case involving subject to the U. S. District Court to determine if a new trial is warranted because certain of Taglianetti's conversations were monitored by the FBI over a microphone. This motion failed to disclose certain pertinent information regarding this microphone surveillance in spite of our insistence that it disclose a complete and accurate story. The wording of the motion implies the Department of Justice knew nothing of the microphone over which Taglianetti's conversations were heard until November 1, 1966. This is completely erroneous since the Department had this information long before Taglianetti was brought to trial for attempted income tax evasion. He was sentenced to seven months in prison and a \$3,000 fine on 9-16-66 and filed an appeal the same day.

News services yesterday picked up the filing of the motion, and it was reported by radio and television last night and appears in this morning's newspapers. A clipping from "The Washington Post" of 12-28-66 is attached.

RECOMMENDATION:

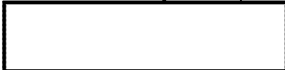

I have discussed with Mr. Rogovin, Assistant Attorney General (Tax Division) the two memoranda dated December 20, and December 23, 1966, and material which your Mr. DeLoach presented to him for inclusion in the Government's Motion for Remand in the above-entitled case.

The interests of justice are best served in situations like that of the Taglianetti case by the Government filing a concise motion touching upon the basic reasons for the required disclosure. A factual development, if necessary, is properly the function of a judicial hearing. To do otherwise--to expand or develop the facts in the Government's motion--could adversely affect the Government on the defendant.

In this regard, when our initial memorandum was filed in the Black case, it was our considered opinion that the question of authorization was irrelevant to the disclosure. The Court specifically asked for information on this question and we responded.

CHECKS

I understand from Mr. Rogovin that the motion in DeNiro was expanded at your request to show that your disclosure in November of the electronic surveillances in that case was the result of a request from the Tax Division and to include the authorization language as used in the Black case. I agreed these two statements of fact should be included.

To attempt to be more specific with respect to authorization for the installation of the electronic device

could lead to unfortunate results in that our basic memorandum would vary from case to case. This memorandum serves one basic function. That is, to inform the Court that there was a possible invasion of the defendant's constitutional rights and, therefore, the Government is obligated to allow the defendant to have a judicial determination of whether his trial was fair.

For this purpose, I feel it necessary to include in each memorandum the dates of the surveillance, a general statement as to where the surveillance took place, and whether the Department believes the trial was free from taint. Of course, if we believe there was any taint in the trial as a result of the surveillance, then we are obligated to ask the Court to grant a new trial. See Schipani v. United States. Because the prosecutor is an officer of the Court and the Court will immediately want to know whether he was aware of the electronic surveillance, the memorandum should contain a statement as to whether those officers of the Government responsible for the actual prosecution of the case knowingly used any tainted evidence.

In light of the above, I have authorized and directed the filing of this motion. A copy is attached.

This microphone surveillance was installed under general authorization of Attorney General Robert F. Kennedy.

The logs pertaining to monitored conversations of [redacted] are being forwarded to FBI Headquarters and will be made available to you upon receipt.

None of the material in question was incorporated in any report or disseminated to the Internal Revenue Service.

It is suggested that you determine whether any other Federal investigative agency has conducted any electronic surveillance of the subject.

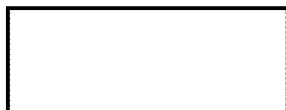

Reference is made to letter of Fred M. Vinson, Jr., Assistant Attorney General, Criminal Division, of November 23, 1966, captioned, "Electronic Surveillance in Organized Crime Cases," and my letter to you under the same caption dated December 12, 1966.

[redacted] and [redacted] were participants in conversations monitored by the FBI on an electronic eavesdropping device. The monitoring of [redacted] conversations occurred on December 8, 1963, and November 18, 1964. Conversations of [redacted] were monitored on ten occasions between October 27, 1963, and April 20, 1965. The monitoring occurred on an electronic eavesdropping device which had been placed by entry into a place of business, Jay's Lounge, 255 Tremont Street, Boston, Massachusetts, on January 9, 1963. The person who was subject to this electronic surveillance was [redacted] who was the [redacted]. Trespass was involved in the entry.

The logs and supporting memoranda pertaining to the monitoring of [redacted] and [redacted] are being forwarded to FBI Headquarters and will be made available for review by the Department as soon as they are received.

The installation of the eavesdropping device placed in Jay's Lounge was made under the general authority of Attorney General Robert F. Kennedy. By memorandum of May 12, 1965, Attorney General Katzenbach was advised that the device had been in operation since January 9, 1963, and he authorized its continuance. It was discontinued on July 12, 1965.

None of the information received from monitoring of conversations of either [redacted] has appeared directly or indirectly in FBI investigative reports nor was any of it communicated in any way to the Internal Revenue Service.

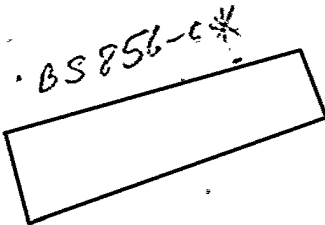

PURPOSE:

Electronic Surveillance Check

In line with the Director's request, there is set out herein information concerning our microphone coverage of the hotel room of James E. Haggerty, Detroit, Michigan, (former attorney for James Riddle Hoffa) in Washington, D. C., in early August, 1961, together with copies of communications in our files which are pertinent thereto.

Coincidental with the Director's request, we received, on the afternoon of December 21, 1966, a memorandum from Assistant Attorney General Fred M. Vinson, Jr., dated December 20, 1966, asking for any information in our files pertaining to electronic surveillance of James E. Haggerty. Although he offers no identifying information with respect to this individual, Vinson undoubtedly is referring to Hoffa's former attorney and the incident of Haggerty's visit to Washington, D. C., in August, 1961, when Bobby Kennedy requested a surveillance of Haggerty in an effort to identify Hoffa's reported contact in the Department. We cited this as an example of Department-authorized electronic coverage in a letter to the Attorney General dated June 21, 1966, relating to the Fred B. Black affair and Mr. DeLoach briefed Acting Attorney General Clark on this incident on the night of December 16, 1966.

Haggerty died on 11/10/66; consequently, the Department could have no pending prosecutive considerations concerning him. It appears, therefore, that Vinson's request may be a sly effort to obtain all data in Bureau files concerning this incident.

It is proposed that we reply to Vinson, pointing out that he has not identified the Haggerty in whom he is interested; that if this is the Haggerty who has represented Hoffa, there have been prior communications to the Department in this case and in the Black case; and it

would appear appropriate for Vinson to consult the Acting Attorney General concerning his recent discussion with a Bureau official of the microphone surveillance of Haggerty. Letter to Vinson (together with his request of December 20, 1966) is attached for approval.

BACKGROUND CONCERNING MICROPHONE COVERAGE OF JAMES E. HAGGERTY:

On 8/1/61, Kennedy advised Evans that he, Kennedy, had received information indicating that Haggerty was planning to come to Washington, D. C., on 8/7/61 to meet his "contact" (unidentified) in the Justice Department. Since Haggerty would have no legitimate business with the Justice Department, Kennedy felt this contact would be surreptitious with one of Hoffa's reported sources in the Department. Accordingly, Kennedy asked that the Bureau conduct "appropriate surveillance" of Haggerty while he was in Washington, D. C., for the purpose of identifying any contact with a Department employee. Copy of Evans to Belmont memorandum dated 8/2/61 recording Evans' conversation with Kennedy on 8/1/61 is attached as Exhibit #1.

Pursuant thereto, a microphone surveillance (trespass required) on Haggerty's hotel room (401) at the Sheraton-Carlton Hotel was established on 8/7/61 upon Haggerty's arrival in the District of Columbia. Copy of Evans to Belmont memorandum dated 8/4/61, which records Bureau authorization of this installation by Evans, is attached as Exhibit #2.

This microphone surveillance and a physical surveillance of Haggerty, which also was instituted on his arrival in Washington, D. C., were maintained until 8/11/61 when they were terminated upon Haggerty's departure from Washington, D. C. Memoranda to Kennedy were written daily between 8/8 and 8/12/61 (copies attached as Exhibits #3 through #7) reporting the results of our coverage of Haggerty. Microphone surveillance coverage was attributed in three of these memoranda (8/9, 10, and 11/61) to a highly confidential source. It is noted that this microphone coverage of Haggerty did not succeed in establishing its intended purpose - Hoffa's contact in the Department was not identified and no other information of value was obtained.

Memorandum to Mr. DeLoach
RE: JAMES E. HAGGERTY

Evans wrote another memorandum dated 3/13/62 which expanded on his 8/1/61 conversation with Kennedy. Although our files do not show what motivated the preparation of this memorandum, it provides clear documentation that the microphone surveillance was established pursuant to Kennedy's request.

In this memorandum, Evans stated that while the language in his prior memorandum reporting Kennedy's request for "appropriate surveillance" did not explicitly describe the surveillance requested by Kennedy, "There is no question that his request covered both a physical surveillance and a microphone surveillance of Haggerty's hotel room The fact that the Attorney General had asked for both a physical and microphone surveillance was clearly understood Nevertheless, my memorandum at the time should have more explicitly described the nature of the Attorney General's request." A copy of this Evans to Belmont memorandum dated 3/13/62 is attached as Exhibit #8.

RECENT COMMUNICATIONS WITH THE DEPARTMENT CONCERNING
MICROPHONE SURVEILLANCE OF HAGGERTY:

The Haggerty surveillance was brought into focus during our controversy with the Department concerning the proposed documents to be filed with the Supreme Court in the Fred B. Black case. A memorandum in that case dated June 21, 1966, was written to then Attorney General Katzenbach with copies for the Deputy Attorney General, the Solicitor General, and Assistant Attorneys General Rogovin and Vinson. Microphone surveillance on Haggerty was cited therein as an example to show that as early as 1961 Kennedy had requested a microphone surveillance on an attorney (Haggerty) who was representing a person (Hoffa) who, at the time, was the subject of Federal legal proceedings. This, of course, had a direct bearing on Kennedy's position on the maintenance of microphone coverage affecting the attorney-client relationship. A copy of our June 21, 1966, memorandum, referred to above, is attached as Exhibit #9.

On the night of December 16, 1966, Mr. DeLoach conferred with Acting Attorney General Clark in the latter's office concerning the Louis J. Taglianetti case. On this occasion Mr. DeLoach showed Mr. Clark a copy of Evans'

3/13/62 memorandum (Exhibit #8) which clearly states that the Attorney General's request for appropriate surveillance of Haggerty covered both a physical surveillance and a microphone surveillance of Haggerty's hotel room. A copy of Mr. DeLoach's memorandum to Mr. Tolson dated 12/20/66 is attached hereto as Exhibit #10.

OBSERVATIONS:

As stated above, on the afternoon of 12/21/66, we received a letter from Vinson dated 12/20/66 which requests information in our files pertaining to electronic surveillance of James E. Haggerty, whom Vinson does not further identify. Undoubtedly, this refers to the Haggerty who was Hoffa's attorney. Vinson does not state his purpose in requesting this information. Since Haggerty died on November 10, 1966, it is apparent that the Department does not have any prosecutive considerations concerning him. It appears, therefore, that this may be a sly effort on Vinson's part to obtain copies of our internal memoranda concerning the microphone surveillance of Haggerty and, in particular, the Evans to Belmont memoranda dated 8/2/61, and 3/13/62 (Exhibits #1 and #8). It is observed that Vinson may desire to furnish copies of these memoranda to Kennedy and Evans for their use, in connection with their preparation for possible testimony before the Long Committee, in endeavoring to fabricate some story to exculpate Kennedy as to his request for the microphone surveillance of Haggerty.

RECOMMENDATION:

Attached for approval is a letter to Vinson pointing out that he has not identified the Haggerty in whom he is interested; that if this is the Haggerty who has represented Hoffa, there have been prior communications to the Department in this case and the Fred B. Black affair; and it would appear appropriate for Vinson to consult the Acting Attorney General concerning his recent discussion with a Bureau official of the microphone surveillance of Haggerty.

Reference is made to the memorandum of Assistant Attorney General Mitchell Rogovin dated December 20, 1966.

By letter dated August 5, 1966, you were furnished the details concerning microphone surveillances conducted on Drew. This letter identified the investigative reports submitted on Drew which contained information from these microphone surveillances. On August 25, 1966, and August 31, 1966, [redacted] Tax Division, was furnished copies of the logs from these microphone surveillances together with extensive supporting airtels which pertained to Drew and the information from these sources. On December 12, 1966, in response to a new request, Mr. Richard M. Roberts, Tax Division, was furnished logs from an additional microphone surveillance in Las Vegas wherein mention was made of John Drew.

This material is highly sensitive in nature and personnel assigned to review it should be alerted to the absolute necessity to restrict the dissemination of the information contained therein. All available security safeguards should be afforded this material. Every effort must be taken to prevent highly sensitive information from microphone surveillances coming into the possession of members of the press and other unauthorized persons.

The logs and supporting airtels previously furnished represent all material containing information derived from electronic surveillances of Drew by this Bureau. All investigative reports on Drew containing information from these microphone surveillances were identified in my letter of August 5, 1966.

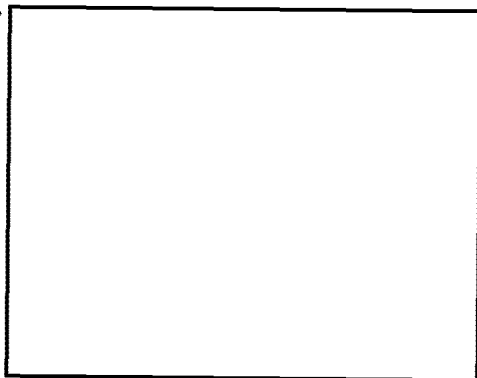

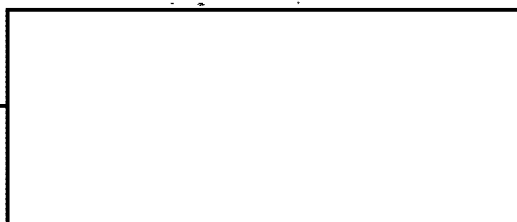

On the basis of identifying data provided regarding the other individuals mentioned in referenced memorandum, a review has been made of appropriate records. None of these persons were subject to electronic surveillance or were monitored by an electronic device of the FBI, with the exception of [REDACTED]

Transmitted herewith is one copy each of logs dated February 10, 1965, and April 2 and 3, 1965, together with one copy of a communication from our Miami Office to our Los Angeles Office dated April 16, 1965, [REDACTED]

These documents contain information received from an electronic eavesdropping device which was located in the residence of Frank Lang Rosenthal, North Miami, Florida. In accordance with the policy of then Attorney General Katzenbach, he was advised concerning the usage of this device on April 12, 1965, and he approved its continuance. The installation of this device required trespass and was effective from July 7, 1964, to July 13, 1965. The information [REDACTED] has not been furnished in any manner to any other agency.

Yesterday we learned from [redacted] the Criminal Division, that he had been designated by the Criminal Division to handle all requests of the Bureau for information from our special indices relating to microphone surveillances.

According to [redacted] his assignment [redacted] of this project for the Criminal Division has not yet been definitely established but it appears that he will receive this assignment in the immediate future. If it materializes, all requests for checks of our special indices by the Criminal Division will emanate from him and all Bureau replies will be routed to him. The special indices relating to the microphone coverage on criminal matters is presently maintained in the Criminal Intelligence and Organized Crime Section of the Special Investigative Division. This Section is currently handling indices checks for all the investigative divisions. Where the Department requests information from these indices relating to the cases handled by the other divisions the initial check is made by the Special Investigative Division. Those other divisions handle the rest of the work entailed in obtaining from the field pertinent logs and the correspondence which transfers those logs to the Department in these matters. The great bulk of the requests from the Department however relate to matters of interest to other Federal agencies and all work in this connection is currently being handled by the Criminal Intelligence and Organized Crime Section of the Special Investigative Division. This has placed an additional burden on this Section which has been handling these matters with its current personnel.

In the light of the impending receipt of a minimum of 1,500 requests from the Department, it is requested that this Section be assigned one clerk and one Agent to handle exclusively the Department's requests in this regard. This assignment could be temporary in nature for an estimated period of some 90 days at which time an evaluation could be made as to the necessity for continuing these additional personnel on a permanent basis.

ACTION

It is recommended that one Agent and one clerk be assigned to the Criminal Intelligence and Organized Crime Section for a temporary period of 90 days to handle all matters relating to the special indices on microphones currently maintained in the Criminal Intelligence and Organized Crime Section.

[redacted] who has been designated by Vinson as the Criminal Division's liaison man in matters pertaining to microphone surveillance coverage of individuals of interest to the Department, called [redacted] indicating he desired to confer on matters pertaining to future requests in regard to captioned matter.

[redacted] who is thoroughly conversant with matters presently being handled in this regard, checked with your office and it was concluded that he should meet with [redacted] and determine the nature of his problems but to make no commitments.

[redacted] indicated at the outset that the Department is studying the whole problem relating to a search of Federal investigative agencies indices on names of persons who are presently being considered for prosecution. He indicated that recently they had sent 1500 names to Narcotics Bureau and 1200 names to Alcohol and Tobacco Tax Unit. A substantial list had also been sent to Internal Revenue Service. These lists pertain only to subjects who had been under investigation by these respective agencies.

In reviewing this matter [redacted] indicated that a substantial number was to be sent over to the Bureau for a check of our indices. When pressed for an indication of what was meant by a substantial number, he finally indicated this to be between 15,000 and 25,000 names. He arrived at this figure by stating that there are approximately 12,000 cases now pending in the Department, there are approximately 2,000 matters pending appeal, and in addition, there are what they call jail cases, that is, persons who have been convicted and are now serving a sentence.

It was pointed out [] that the amount of work involved in such an undertaking was tremendous and that it would appear that on closer analysis it would be unnecessary to submit the names of each and every individual. It was called to his attention for example that the Department is aware of the fact that the Bureau has not had any microphone surveillances for approximately 18 months. It would therefore appear unnecessary to submit the names of subjects in the general stolen motor vehicle cases, crime on Government reservation cases, check cases and many other cases which would enter this same category. It was specifically pointed out that the Department in preparing these cases and knowing the source of the evidence could readily determine that microphone surveillances did not in any way play a part in the pending prosecution.

It was learned [] that at the present time the Department was making extensive use of Automatic Data Processing (ADP) equipment and as soon as a case has been presented to the United States Attorney and reported by the United States Attorney to the Department, such is recorded on ADP equipment. As a result, the Department is in a position to furnish "print outs" from the ADP equipment reflecting the identity of all persons under Departmental consideration for prosecution. It was copies of such "print outs" which were sent by the Department to the Bureau of Narcotics, Alcohol and Tobacco Tax Unit and Internal Revenue Service. It is similar such "print outs" which the Department presently envisions having checked through the Bureau's microphone surveillance indices.

It is noted that [] consideration of the problem pertains only to the Department's Criminal Division and that the Tax Division with its separate list of cases and its own Liaison man would probably materially enlarge the volume of cases which the Department might ultimately ask to be searched through our microphone surveillance indices.

ACTION

It was pointed out [] that in presently considering the volume of names to be sent over to the Bureau for search, that a determination should be made by the Department

as to whether a name check is necessary in the general type of auto theft, check cases, and similar type cases since it would appear to be readily apparent to the prosecutor in preparing his case that microphones did not enter into the obtaining of evidence. It was further pointed out [] that because of the magnitude of the Department's contemplated action, it was believed that the Department should arrive at its decision with respect to how extensive their request for searches would be and that the matter should then be presented to Bureau officials by Departmental officials.

Electronic Surveillance Checks

By memorandum dated December 12, 1966, Mr. Fred M. Vinson, Jr., requested that a check be made to determine if any of thirty-one individuals were the subject of an electronic surveillance by the FBI, or whether any of these individuals were present at or participated in conversations overheard by any electronic device.

A check of our records has disclosed that the names of twenty-eight of these individuals do not appear in our records either as subjects of an electronic surveillance or as participants in or individuals present at any conversations monitored by an electronic device.

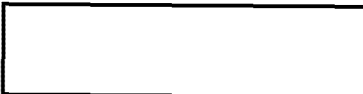

This is in response to the letter of Assistant Attorney General Fred M. Vinson, Jr., dated December 5, 1966, captioned as above, and its enclosure, which inquired as to whether there was any electronic coverage by the FBI of James Riddle Hoffa [redacted]

[redacted] and [redacted] A review has been made of appropriate records of this Bureau and the following information, which appears to be pertinent to Mr. Vinson's request, is being brought to your attention:

Hoffa and [redacted] were never the prime targets of electronic surveillance by the FBI. Between July 31, 1961, and April 2, 1965, our Detroit office had in operation a tunable commercial-type FM radio-receiver which was capable of receiving conversations that were broadcast to and received from radio-telephones [redacted]

[redacted] This radio monitoring did not require trespass.

Hoffa was a participant in three conversations overheard through this means and logs concerning these conversations, which occurred on December 22, 1961, January 19, 1962, and October 26, 1962, will be furnished to the Criminal Division. This information did not appear in any reports and was not communicated to any other agency.

[redacted] was a participant in numerous conversations overheard through this means on various dates between July 31, 1961 and March 30, 1965. Logs concerning these conversations also will be furnished to the Criminal Division. Information obtained from two of these conversations was furnished to the Criminal Division previously by memoranda dated November 21, 1963, and January 20, 1964, at Detroit. Other information arising out of [redacted] conversations did not appear in any other communications and none of this information was communicated to any other agency.

In addition, between February 1, 1963, and August 12, 1963, Hoffa appears to have participated in four telephone conversations, one with Morris Barney Dalitz, Las Vegas, Nevada, on February 6, 1963, and three with [redacted] Las Vegas, on February 1, February 27, and August 12, 1963. Hoffa's part of these conversations was not overheard.

The conversation of Dalitz was overheard on an electronic eavesdropping device installed in the executive offices of the Desert Inn Hotel, Las Vegas, utilized by Dalitz and other hotel executives. The installation of this device required trespass and was active from March 22, 1962, to August 15, 1963. The conversations of [redacted] were overheard on an electronic eavesdropping device installed in the executive office of the Dunes Hotel, Las Vegas. The installation of this device required trespass and was active from May 18, 1962, to August 15, 1963.

Information concerning the above-mentioned conversations of Dalitz and [redacted] did not appear in any reports nor was it communicated to any other agency. Logs including these conversations will be furnished to the Criminal Division together with a communication from our Las Vegas office dated March 16, 1963, which contains further data relating to the February 27, 1963, conversation of [redacted]

[redacted] was the subject of electronic surveillance on May 8, 1963, on which date a conversation between [redacted] which took place in [redacted] Nashville, Tennessee, was recorded. This was accomplished through use of a concealed recording system which, at the request of Assistant Attorney General Herbert J. Miller, Jr., previously had been installed [redacted] with his knowledge and concurrence. No trespass was involved in this installation, which was made at Birmingham, Alabama, on May 7, 1963. Wiring associated with this installation was removed [redacted] on May 10, 1963, at Birmingham.

Department representatives on the scene at Nashville were kept currently informed with respect to the installation. The use of this recording device was reported in the report of Special Agent [redacted]

dated May 20, 1963, at Memphis, Tennessee, a copy of which was sent to the Criminal Division on May 27, 1963. The tape recording of this conversation has been destroyed. However, a typewritten transcript of this recording was forwarded to the Criminal Division on June 12, 1963, as an enclosure to this Bureau's memorandum dated June 10, 1963, at Memphis. Further mention of this installation, and its approval by Assistant Attorney General Miller, was made in my letter to the Attorney General dated February 10, 1964. Information concerning this installation has not been communicated to any other agency.

[redacted] was not subject to electronic surveillance by the FBI nor does he appear to have been present at or a participant in conversations overheard by an electronic device.

[redacted] was subject to electronic surveillance on November 11, 1963, on which date a tape recording of a conversation between [redacted] and [redacted] was obtained. This was accomplished through use of a miniature recorder concealed under [redacted] clothing prior to his meeting with [redacted] that day. This installation did not involve trespass. It was made at the request of the Department and with the concurrence of the two Federal Judges in Nashville. The Department is thoroughly familiar with the facts concerning this recording which was introduced into evidence during the [redacted] trial.

The foregoing represent the only instances in which the mentioned individuals can be identified as having been subject to electronic surveillance by the FBI or in which they appear to have been present at or participants in conversations overheard by an electronic device. However, it is suggested that if this has not yet been done, the Department contact other Federal investigative agencies to determine whether any had electronic coverage of the above-named persons.

Logs and other material mentioned above which have not been furnished to the Department previously will be delivered to the Criminal Division.

Although Mr. Vinson's letter of December 5, 1966, did not specifically request information concerning

electronic coverage of Attorney James E. Haggerty who, before his death on November 10, 1966, acted as legal counsel for Hoffa, the following is being brought to your attention:

My letter to the Attorney General dated June 21, 1966, captioned, [redacted] pointed out that Haggerty was subject to microphone coverage in Washington, D. C., in early August, 1961, based on a request from former Attorney General Kennedy to former Assistant Director Evans of the FBI. Memoranda relating to the surveillance of Haggerty, which included the results of coverage of Haggerty's hotel room, were sent to the Attorney General daily between August 8 and August 12, 1961. This coverage, which was accomplished through an electronic eavesdropping device whose installation required trespass, also was discussed with you by Mr. DeLoach of this Bureau on December 16, 1966.

The above case is in the Supreme Court on petition for a writ of certiorari. The Court has requested the Department to comment upon the case.

Because electronic surveillance by the FBI monitored conversations of the above-named defendants and these conversations were relevant to the ultimate prosecution, we have determined that disclosure must be made to the Court. This is the case where certain information was given to the Internal Revenue Service, which in turn conducted additional investigation before turning over results to the state authorities. However, because it is a state case and the supervisory power of the federal courts is not involved, it is our feeling that we need not be as specific as some disclosures in the past.

I would appreciate your comments by 5:00 p.m. today, due to the fact that the Solicitor General wishes to file the Government's memorandum in the very near future. A copy of the proposed memorandum is attached.

MEMORANDUM FOR THE UNITED STATES

1. On November 14, 1966, the Court requested the Solicitor General to express the views of the United States in the above-entitled case. In light of the matters noted in paragraph 2 below, we do not consider at length the legal issues presented in this case. We do point out that, if in Marchetti v. United States, No. 38, this Term, and Grosso v. United States, No. 181, this Term, the Court's Kahriger and Lewis decisions are followed, petitioners' State convictions would appear to involve no violation of Fifth Amendment rights. Should the Court, however, adopt a use-restriction rule, as alternatively suggested in the government's briefs in Nos. 41 and 181, this may be an appropriate case in which to apply such a rule to exclude the use of evidence and other information obtained as a result of petitioner Rainwater's compliance with the federal wagering tax laws. Cf. Boynton v. State, 75 So. 2d 211 (Fla.).

✓ We assume that the Court will hear No. 38 in light of the abatement of Costello v. United States, No. 41, this Term.

✓ Rainwater, we note, was the only one of petitioners who had registered under the provisions of the federal wagering tax laws.

2. Subsequent to November 14, 1966, and pursuant to the review policy described in our Supplemental Memorandum in Schipani v. United States, No. 504, this Term (pp. 4-5), the Department of Justice has ascertained that electronic surveillance indirectly involving two of petitioners was conducted by agents of the federal government during 1962. None of petitioners here was the subject of direct electronic surveillance, but petitioners Rainwater and Alter were participants in conversations which were electronically monitored. This monitoring was done by means of a microphone, installed by trespass, at a business establishment where petitioner Rainwater and others frequently met, and provided investigatory leads to petitioners and to the location of petitioner Rainwater's place of business. Subsequently, physical (not electronic) surveillance by other federal agents of this place of business and of several of petitioners' ensued. On the basis of all of the information obtained, a search warrant was procured for petitioner Rainwater's place of business. Pursuant to a search of said premises, evidence was obtained which was subsequently turned over to authorities of the State of Florida. All petitioners here were present when and at the place where the search warrant was executed. There is no reason to believe that State authorities knew of the possible taint.

3. We have notified appropriate Florida officials of the matters here discussed, and have served copies of this memorandum on such officials and on petitioners' counsel. Since this case involves State, not federal, convictions, we regard it ^{as} inappropriate to suggest a disposition, leaving that to the parties directly involved.

As we advised the Court in the Schipani case, the government will notify the appropriate court in any instance in which electronic surveillance of the kind here involved resulted in a "material discovery." It is clear in the instant case that the matter overheard had a direct relation to the State criminal prosecution.

By memorandum dated January 3, 1967, the Department requested comments by 5:00 p.m., January 3, 1967, concerning memorandum to be filed by the Solicitor General with the Supreme Court concerning [redacted] and other subjects. The extremely limited time allowed by the Department to reply to its memorandum is being brought to the Department's attention.

[redacted] conducted a large-scale numbers operation in the Miami Division. We conducted investigation [redacted] however, when no prosecutable case could be developed, information developed was furnished to Internal Revenue Service. This included identity of persons working for him in his operation and location of his counting house. Internal Revenue Service conducted a raid and all evidence seized was subsequently turned over to local authorities. On July 20, 1965, [redacted] was convicted in state court and sentenced to a five-year term. Neither [redacted] nor any other subject in this case were subjects of a direct electronic surveillance; however, [redacted] and [redacted] were participants in conversations monitored by a microphone surveillance.

The state case is now in the Supreme Court on a petition for a writ of certiorari and the court has requested the Department to comment upon this case. The Department's memorandum to be filed with the Supreme Court suggests that the evidence developed against [redacted] and [redacted] is tainted inasmuch as the microphone surveillance involved trespass. It is to be further noted that in this memorandum, the Department does not specifically mention the FBI relative to electronic surveillance. Inasmuch as we previously furnished to the Department information relative to our coverage of [redacted] and other subjects in this case by memoranda dated November 23, 1966, and November 25, 1966, and there are no objections to the statements contained in the Department's memorandum to be filed with the court, it is believed that no further comments are necessary.
