

On 8/17/60, RODNEY BABER, owner of Rodney Baber & Co., on interview advised his company printed the circular, "This is a reprint of photographs appearing in The Nashville Banner" on a contract basis for DON WIENER, president of Denruss, Inc., Memphis, a large candy manufacturing company of Memphis; that the circular, "This is a reprint of photographs appearing in the Nashville Banner," is actually the second page of a two page item which WIENER contracted with BABER to pring. BABER furnished copy of the first page of this item which is a printed letter bearing the signature of DON WIENER. BABER said 20,000 copies of each page were printed and that WIENER told him he would staple the two pages together before distributing them. BABER said the order was received 7/28/60, printed the same date and delivered to WIENER on 7/29/60. BABER states he had consulted with his attorney and, considers this item to be fully labeled according to law.





Synopsis: CARLOCK MYERS, LaFollette, Tennessee, co-manager of Judge ANDREW TAYLOR's campaign in Campbell County, Tennessee, declined to discuss matter of unlabeled mimeographed political literature beginning "Ask yourself this question . . . " FBI Laboratory concluded that the typed word "South" on printed anti-Keffauver card headed "ARE YOU STUPID?" was not typed on the typewriter of ARTHUR BRUCE COLE, Chairman, National States Rights Party. The Laboratory did conclude that the capital letters comprising the caption of card "ARE YOU STUPID?" are similar in size and style to capital letters used on the return address of business envelopes of National States Rights Party. ARTHUR BRUCE COLE, National Chairman, NSRP, advised he does not know who printed above and similar cards nor who printed NSRP business envelopes. Typing on post cards, postmarked at Chattanooga, bearing typewritten message entitled "Knowing you to be a Patroit" ascertained by FBI Laboratory not to have been typed on Tower typewriter, SN 4AT50842, in possession of JOSEPH EARL SCOTT, Chattanooga, Tennessee; no conclusion reached by Laboratory whether these cards typed on Underwood typewriter, SN 11-6149579, admittedly used for this purpose by LARIMORE BRITTON HOLLAND, Chattanooga, Tennessee. No latent fingerprint empressions found on cards or under stamp on cards.

DETAILS:

AT LA FOLLETTE, TENNESSEE:

Date August 19, 1960

Mr. CARLOCK MYERS, 309 Fleet Building, an employee of Gay Service Company, LaFollette, Tennessee, was interviewed at his office on August 18, 1960, and was advised that he was not required to make any statement, that anything he said could be used against him in court and that he was entitled to consult an attorney.

It was explained to Mr. MYERS that this investigation was being conducted under provisions of Section 612, Title 18, United States Code, the substance of which was related to him and that same had been directed by the Assistant Attorney General in charge of the Civil Rights Division.

Mr. MYERS agknowledged that from July 14, 1960, through Election Bay, August 4, 1960, he had served as Co-Manager in Campbell County, Tennessee, of the campaign of Judge ANDERY "TIP" TAYLOR, a candidate for the Democratic memination for United States Senator from Tennessee. He advised that the other Co-Manager for Campbell County was MAURIE REEVES, Jellico, Tennessee. Mr. MYERS said that he received his appointment to above position from a Mr. BRYSON, Judge TAYLOR's State Campaign Manager.

Mr. MYERS was shown a white mimeographed sheet, measuring $8\frac{1}{2}$ x 11 inches in size, reading:

"Ask Yourself This Question When you go to vote

U. S. Senator to vote against the bill to outlaw the Communist Party in this country

VOKE AMERICAN

and vote for

ANDREW "TIP" TAYLOR for U. S. SENATOR"

Mr. MYERS was informed that the above-quoted sheet of political literature had been handed to a member of Senator RETES EXFAUVER's party, at LaFollette, Tennessee, on July 21, 1960, by an individual subsequently identified as GLENN HATMAKER and that information had been received to the effect that a quantity of above-quoted circulars had been obtained by HATMAKER from MYERS.

At this point in the interview, Mr. MYERS courtesly stated that, upon advice of counsel, he did not desire to discuss the matter of the political literature with Agents. He said he woul meither deny or affirm that the literature in question had originated with him and that he would simply answer all further questions by replying "No comment".

Mr. MYERS stated that the attorney whom he had consulted concerning this matter was Mr. BOYCE GRIFFITH, Fleet Building, LaFellette, Tennessee. Mr. MYERS stated that he would, of course, honor supcens from a Federal Grand Jury should same be served upon him at sometime in the future.

Date August 19, 1960

Mr. ARTHUR BRUCE COLE, Insurance Agent, Fleet Oil Building, residence 200 Elm Street, LaFollette, who is National Chairman of the National States Rights Party, was recontacted on August 18, 1960, at his request.

Making reference to the subject matter of prior interview with him conducted by these Agents on July 26, 1960, Mr. COLE advised that he had discussed the printed cards, admittedly distributed by him at LaFollette, with NED DUPES, Knoxville, Tennessee, who is the National Secretary of the National States Rights Party, and DUPES denied having sent these cards to COLE anonymously or otherwise.

Mr. COLE acknowledged that the capital letters used in printing the cards passed out by him, including the card captioned "ARE YOU STUPID?" which was of an anti-Kefauver nature, appeared to be the same size and style of type face as type used to print the capital letters "NSRP" on the return address of business envelopes used by the National States Rights Party. Mr. COLE stated, however, that he did not know what printing company had printed the NSRP envelopes and, therefore, did not know what printing company might have printed the abovementioned cards.

Mr. COLE again stated that he had knew information as to the source or origin of these printed cards which he had distributed.

By report dated August 4, 1960, the FBI Laboratory advised that the mineographed flier beginning "Ask yourself this question . . . ", sample of which was furnished the FBI Laboratory by Knoxville following its receipt from Senator ESTES KEFAUVER, was not identical with any of the material previously submitted in connection with this case.

The flier submitted by Knoxville was the same one received by _______ a member of Senator ESTES KEFAUVER's campaign party, to whom it had been handed on the streets of LaFollette, Tennessee, on July 21, 1960, by a man subsequently identified as GLENN HATMAKER.

By letter dated July 20, 1960, Knoxville furnished to the FBI Laboratory three white printed cards captioned "COMMUNISM IN THE PULPIT!", "WHITE MAN AWAKEN!", and "ARE YOUR STUPID?", the last of which expressed opposition to Senator KEFAUVER's re-election, none of which cards were labeled as to source or origin, which cards reportedly were placed in an automobile on the streets of Knoxville. Subsequently, Mr. NED DUPES, Knoxville, Tennessee, National Secretary of the National States Rights Party, admitted that he had distributed such cards at Knoxville and had placed some of them in automobiles.

On July 28, 1960, Knoxville also forwarded to the FBI Laboratory additional samples of the above-described cards plus fourth card, "COMMUNIST IN THE PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH!", turned over to Agents on July 26, 1960, by Mr. ARTHUR BRUCE COLE, LaFollette, Tennessee, National Chairman of the National States Rights Party, who said he had received a number of these four kinds of cards anonymously in the mail and admitted that he had distributed them to persons at LaFollette, Tennessee, but denied knowing their source or origin.

It was noted that, on the cards captioned "ARE YOU STUPID?", which bore wording opposing the re-election of Senator ESTES KEFAUVER, the words "State of Tennessee" had been scratched out and the word "South" written above them on the cards. On the cards traced to NED DUPES, this alteration had been made with a typewriter. On the cards traced to ARTHUR BRUCE COLE the same alteration had been made in pen and ink, and COLE admitted making such alteration himself. COLE denied that he had altered any of the cards on a typewriter and voluntarily permitted specimens to be taken from his Royal typewriter, serial number HHE135049711.

NED DUPES denied that he had typed above alteration on the cards which he had distributed. DUPES voluntarily made available one of the business envelopes used by the National States Rights Party bearing the return address "NSRP, P. O. Box 2161, Knoxville 1, Tennessee", printed in the upper left corner. This envelope was requested because it was noted during the investigation that the capital letters "NSRP" as printed on the National States Rights envelope appeared to be the same style and size of type face as that used in printing the capital letters constituting the caption above-mentioned cards, including the card headed "ARE YOU STUPID?".

By report dated August 2, 1960, the FBI Laboratory concluded that the typewritten word "South" on the printed card captioned "ARE YOU STUPID?" was not typed on any of the typewriters used to type the previously known and questioned typed material in this case. The Laboratory advised that the typewritten word "South" on this card was prepared on a typewriter which types 10 characters to the inch, but the make and model of the typewriter used could not be determined. Subsequently, on August 5, 1960, the FBI Laboratory reported that the word "South" on above cards was not prepared on the typewriter of ARTHUR BRUCE COLE, which is a Royal typewriter, serial number HHE13504971, specimens from which were submitted to the Laboratory by Knoxville.

Concerning the above white printed cards the Laboratory stated that they were printed by "Letterpress Method, that is, from raised type on plates". Subsequently, on August 5, 1960, the FBI Laboratory reported that the white printed cards voluntarily furnished by ARTHUR BRUCE COLE, LaFollette, were printed from the same printing plates as similar cards distributed in automobiles in Knoxville, admittedly by NED DUPES. Further, the Laboratory concluded that the letters "NSRP" on the business envelope of the National States Rights Party, as appearing in the return address in the upper left hand corner on this envelope, are similar in style and size to the corresponding letter in the printed captions of the afore-mentioned white cards. The Laboratory said the same printing method (Letterpress) was used in preparing all cards submitted, but it was not possible to determine if the same press was used.

By letter dated July 28, 1960, Knoxville furnished to the FBI Laboratory seven postal cards addressed to various persons at Chattanooga, Tennessee, which bore the message

"KNOWING YOU TO BE A PATROIT, it is not understandable how you can support one who casted the only decending vote not to outlaw the Communist Party in the United States of America. GOD HELP US," which cards LARIMORE BRITTON HOBLAND, Chattanooga, Tennessee, admitted typing at the direction of JOSEPH EARL SCOTT, an official of the "Defenders of the Constitution of the United States", who furnished HOLLAND with a penciled sketch of wording to be typed on the post cards. HOLLAND voluntarily furnished specimens from his Stannard Underwood Typewriter, serial number 11-6149579, which he admitted had been used by him in typing the above-quoted post cards. Specimens were also obtained and submitted to the Laboratory of the Tower typewriter, serial number 4AT50842.

By report dated August 4, 1960, the FBI Laboratory advised that the typing on the above seven post cards mailed at Chattanooga was not prepared on SCOTT's portable Tower typewriter, serial number 4AT50482. The Laboratory said that no conclusion could be reached as to whether the above cards were typed on HOLLAND's Underwood typewriter, serial number 11-6149579, due to the limited number of specific typewriting defects in the questioned typewriting. The Laboratory did note, however, that the post cards were prepared on a machine equipped with the same style and size of type as that of HOLLAND's Underwood typewriter. As noted above, HOLLAND admitted typing these cards on above Underwood typewriter.

By report dated August 9, 1960, the FBI Identification Division advised that no latent fingerprint impressions were found on the above seven post cards, nor under the stamp of the card addressed to Mr. JACK MAYFIELD.

RODNEY BABER, owner of Rodney Baber and Company, advised on interview 8/17/60, that his company performed printing of the circular captioned "This is a reprint of photographs appearing in the Nashville Banner" on a contract basis for DON WIENER; that so far as he knew, no one but WIENER had anything to do with the ordering of this item. BABER stated WIENER also contracted for the printing of a letter dated 7/30/60, which bears WIENER's signature, which WIENER contended to be a cover page for the other circular and which was to be stapled thereto to make it one single document. understood in this manner the item was fully labeled. stated DON WIENER ordered 20,000 copies of each item which were printed and delivered to him at the same time. BABER stated one of his employees without authority took one copy of the second page of this circular and furnished it to KEFAUVER Headquarters in Memphis, apparently indicating it to be the entire circular. DON WIENER on interview stated he personally, without the cooperation of any other person or organization, ordered on contractual basis from RODNEY BABER 20,000 copies each of the letter dated 7/30/60 and signed "DON WIENER" and the circular entitled "This is a reprint of photographs appearing in the Nashville Banner" intending they would comprise a a two page circular to be stapled together by him. WIENER stated he received delivery of this material but

By letter to the Bureau dated August 11, 1960, HAROLD R. TYLER, JR., Assistant Attorney General, Civil Rights Division, U. S. Department of Justice, requested that the circular headed "This is a reprint of photographs appearing in the Nashville Banner" be included in the full investigation being conducted in this matter.

Date August 18, 1960

RODNEY BABER, Owner of Rodney Baber and Company, 21 South Second Street, Memphis, a printing and lithography concern, was interviewed at his office. At the outset, he was advised of the identity of the agents, of the nature of the investigation being conducted, and that he did not have to discuss this matter with the agents. Mr. BABER was further advised that he had the right to consult an attorney, that anything he said might be used against him in a court of law.

Mr. BABER advised it was his wish to fully discuss the matter in question with the agents since he felt the full facts involving the political literature in question were not known and that a disclosure of the full facts would, in his opinion, reveal that there was absolutely no wrong doing on his part or on anyone else's part in connection with the preparation of the item in question.

Mr. BABER advised that Mr. DON WIENER. Owner of Donruss and Company, 119 West Colorado, Memphis, a candy manufacturing company, is a client of his. He said on Thursday, July 28, 1960, Mr. WIENER placed an order with him for the reproduction of 20,000 each of two pages of what is obviously political literature. He said as far as he knew, and he felt he would know any information to the contrary, that Mr. WIENER was solely responsible for ordering this material. He stated he is certain the TAYLOR Campaign Headquarters had no connection whatsoever with this order. Mr. BABER advised that these two items were first the circular which is captioned "This is a reprint of photographs appearing in the Nashville Banner. Below this caption appears the caption "At Kefauver Fund Party," below which are two copies of photographs. Beneath the two photographs and the accompanying text appears additional text as follows: "Mr. Kefauver brags about his support by Northern Liberals but we haven't heard him mention these supporters pictured above or the support of the N.A.A.C.P."

Mr. BABER said the typing in the top caption and the typing in the bottom text as recorded above was placed by his company on the circular at the request of Mr. WIENER. When he received this order from Mr. WIENER, Mr. BABER advised him that it was necessary for all such political literature to be labeled as to its source. In this regard, Mr. WIENER explained to him that the above described circular was to be distributed in connection with a letter which he furnished Mr. BABER for reproduction which was dated July 30, 1960, and which bore the signature of DON WIENER. Mr. WIENER told Mr. BABER it was his intention after this matter had been printed to staple the two items together with the letter being the cover page and that in this manner the literature would, without question, be clearly labeled as to its source, Mr. WIENER. Mr. BABER furnished a copy of the letter in question as well as a copy of the circular "This is a reprint of photographs ..." This letter recites as follows:

Mr. BABER said he consulted with his lawyer concerning this matter and has been advised that beyond any doubt the item in question is appropriately and legally labeled. Mr. BABER said it was his clear understanding during the entire transaction that neither of these pages was a single item, but that what Mr. WIENER intended to secure was one two-page item with the above described letter as the cover page. He

said Mr. WIEN

said Mr. WIENER told him it would not be necessary to staple these items since he had his own office force to do so and could therefore save some money. Mr. BABER further pointed to the second paragraph of the letter which recites: "If each one of you will use the enclosed literature and facts,.." and clearly indicates that an attachment was contemplated for this letter. Mr. BABER said after the order had been received by him on July 28, 1960, 20,000 copies of each page were printed as ordered on the same date and the entire order delivered on the following day, Friday, July 29, 1960.

Mr. BABER said on the same day these items were printed, a person who was then an employee but who is no longer in his employment without authority took one of the copies of the circular captioned "This is a reprint of photographs " and gave this item alone to someone from the Kefauver Headquarters. Mr. BABER said it clearly appears to him that this was an effort to make it appear that unlabeled literature was being printed at his company. Mr. BABER said he understands this individual did not furnish Kefauver Headquarters with a copy of the letter which was designed to serve as the cover page for the other item. Mr. BABER said as a result, he and his company were quite unfairly subjected to criticism and accused of printing unlabeled political literature. He said for a while there were threats that the matter would be investigated by the Shelby County, Tennessee Grand Jury, and that in fact

appeared at his office, made various accusations against him and his company, and threatened to have the matter investigated by the Shelby County, Tennessee Grand Jury. Mr. BABER said this individual was very rude, arrogant, demanding, and exhibited no apparent interest in developing the true facts involved. DON WIENER, Donruss Incorporated, 119 West Colorado Street, was interviewed at his office. He was advised at the outset of the identity of the agents and the purpose of this investigation. He was further advised that he did not have to discuss this matter with the agents, that anything he did say might possibly be used against him in court and that he had a right to consult an attorney concerning this matter.

Mr. WIENER advised that he alone is responsible for the preparation and ordering of a two page political item which he devised as a personal means of opposing the efforts for renomination as United States Senator of ESTES KEFAUVER. WIENER stated that he holds Senator KEFAUVER in very low opinion and that he personally bitterly opposed his re-nomination to the United States Senate as Senator from Tennessee. He stated that he secured copies of two photographs from the Nashville Banner newspaper and brought them to Rodney Baber and Company, 21 South Second Street, Memphis and requested that Mr. RODNEY BABER, the owner of that company, have these two news items reproduced for him in circular form, requesting that the printing "This is a reprint of photographs appearing in the Nashville Banner" which appears at the very top of the circular and that which appears at the bottom thereof "Mr. KEFAUVER Brags About His Support By Northern Liberals But We Haven't Heard Him Mention These Supporters Pictured Above Or The Support Of the NAACP, " be added to this circular. Mr. WIENER said he then furnished Mr. BABER a copy of a letter which he had prepared which letter is dated July 30, 1960 and bears Mr. WIENER'S signature and requested that this letter be reproduced. Mr. WIENER advised that he intended to use these two items as a two page circular with the letter serving as a cover page. The letter in question is described as follows:

Mr. WIENER said that he ordered 20,000 copies of each of these two pages from RODNEY BABER. He said he advised Mr. BABER that he intended to staple these two pages together thereby making it a single document, but that he would personally have the stapling performed at his own plant by his own office force. Mr. WIENER

pointed out that paragraph 2 of this letter contains the words "If each one of you will use the enclosed literature and facts..." which fully indicates he said that an attachment accompanies the letter. Mr. WIENER said he has consulted legal authorities concerning this matter and feels that the item is beyond any doubt fully labeled. He commented that a person would not sign each separate page of a letter nor would it be necessary for the author of a book to have his name printed on each page of the book in order to show the person responsible for the production.

Mr. WIENER said no one beside himself had anything to do with this project. He said as far as Rodney Baber and Company is concerned, it was strictly a business transaction wherein he, Mr. WIENER, placed an order with the printing company and, as far as he knew, Mr. BABER kept no copies of the item in question. He emphasized that the TAYLOR Campaign Headquarters in Shelby County, Tennessee, and elsewhere had absocutely no knowledge concerning his plans to prepare or distribute this circular.

Mr. WIENER said that he took this project upon himself in view of his very strong feelings against Senator KEFAUVER. He said he realized when he undertook this venture that he would gain no friends in doing so, would realize no additional business to his company and would, in fact, possibly lose some friends and undoubtedly some business as a result of his action. He pointed out that he had no favors to ask of any candidate who might have been elected and that he took no official part whatever in the campaign for nomination as U. S. Senator of Judge ANDREW TAYLOR.

Mr. WIENER said he understands that an employee of Rodney Baber and Company who is a strong KEFAUVER supporter stole at least one copy of that page of the item captioned "This is a reprint of photographs..." and gave this to the KEFAUVER Headquarters. He said he understands the KEFAUVER Headquarters thereupon made a complaint through Dr. ROSS PRITCHARD claiming that, in connection with the preparation of this circular, laws were violated since the circular was not properly labeled. Mr. WIENER said as far as he knew the Rodney Baber and Company employee took only the second page of the item and did not furnish the KEFAUVER Headquarters with the cover latter that accompanied the item. Mr. WIENER said before the finished products were even delivered to him by Rodney Baber and Company, he received a telephone call from ROSS PRITCHARD, KEFAUVER's Shelby County Campaign Manager, who questioned him concerning the preparation of this particular circular. He said he understood from Dr. PRITCHARD that PRITCHARD

did not have the cover letter that is supposed to accompany the other circular. He said that PRITCHARD told him that he underestood that a half million copies of this item had been ordered. Mr. WIENER said that by virtue of his conversation with Dr. PRITCHARD he realized that PRITCHARD very obviously knew that he, WIENER, had been the person who placed the order for this circular with Rodney Baber and Company.

Mr. WIENER stated that as far as he knows his name did not appear in the newspaper in connection with the publicity attending the allegations of this particular circular constituting unlabeled political literature against Senator KEFAUVER. He stated that in his opinion the sole desire of the KEFAUVER Head-quarters in this matter was to have as much press coverage as possible indicating the possibility of a smear campaign against Senator KEFAUVER and the fact that the FBI was conducting investigations in this matter. He said he did not feel the KEFAUVER Headquarters was interested in having an investigation conducted or in determining the true facts involved in the matter. Mr. WIENER commented that he personally resented the fact that the KEFAUVER faction took it upon itself to "use" an organization like the FBI in an effort to gain publicity in behalf of Senator KEFAUVER'S re-election.

Mr. WIENER declined to state whether or not he still had the 20,000 of each of these items in his possession but he did say if necessary he could produce them. He declined to do so during the interview. He stated that actually there was no distribution of this item by him. He said he knew at least one copy of the second page of the circular was stolen by the Rodney Baber and Company employee and distributed at least in the sense that it reached the KEFAUVER Headquarters. He said after the copies of this item were delivered to him by Rodney Baber and Company he decided against any distribution of the item since by that time he had realized that TAYLOR cause was completely lost and that nothing he could do would in any way prevent the re-nomination of Senator KEFAUVER. With respect to the distribution of this item. Mr. WIENER said that he definitely made no distribution whatever of the item. He said he could not positively say that no one made distribution of the item in view of the fact that the printer or employee at Rodney Baber and Company had surreptiously secured at least one copy thereof and that he could not positively say that no one at his plant had not taken at least a few of the items from the place where he had stored them.

Mr. WIENER stated that he did not desire to furnish a written statement in this matter.

search conducted by the above-mentioned agents.
furnished Miss WOOLFOLK a statement quoted as follows:
"Five Agents of the FBI, including Mr. NORMAN CASEY and Mr. HERMAN E. TICKEL, came to my house on July 23rd with guns and searched my print shop and

"Five Agents of the FBI, including Mr. NORMAN CASEY and Mr. HERMAN E. TICKEL, came to my house on July 23rd with guns and searched my print shop and home. These men had in their possession a search warrant calling for the seizure of 'unsigned political literature pertaining to ESTES KEFAUVER'S campaign

"'for senator'. These five men searched at length our premises, opened personal mail that had not been opened, and questioned me at length as to who my customers were. Upon my refusal to give them the names of my customers I was informed that I could go to court and take the blame for my printing.

"They (the FBI) confiscated 32 items of printing, all of which pertaining to segregation and questioned me repeatedly as to who I had done this printing for.

"As to the statements by the FBI that I have printed any unsigned literature for circulation during ESTES KEFAUVER's campaign for senator, that is a bare-faced lie and further, their insinuation that I have printed any segregationist literature which is either illegal, immoral, or wrong is likewise a bald lie. This is further conduct of the FBI directed toward harassing and embarrassing segregationists. Further, their statements that my husband, had anything to do with any printing done in my shop is only another of the FBI's 'assumptions'. It is a well established fact that my husband nor any other member of my family in any way operates the printing shop."

On July 23, 1960, an authorized search warrant was issued by United States Commissioner JOHN E. COATES, Little Rock, Arkansas, authorizing the search of the residence of West Memphis, Arkansas.

Because of the knowledge that

The search was immediately started and was confined mainly to a room in the residence which is used as a print shop. It was extremely warm in this room; therefore, after the search began, I removed my coat. After the search was completed and prior to leaving the room at 3:58 FM, I put my coat on. As previously indicated, no other agent carried firearms during this search and I did not observe any of the agents with firearms at the residence. indicated the five agents mearched her premises "at length." It is to be noted that the search was completed after two hours and 37 minutes which was not regarded as a lengthy search in view of the material found and which was examined. also indicated she was questioned at length concerning whoher customers were. This is emphatically denied inasmuch as she was not questioned at length at any time during the search by any of the agents participating in same. was questioned concerning the printed material recovered in the search, especially the printed sheets beginning

"Dear Comrade" and ending "International Committee of Ruman b7C Brotherhood" and the negative bearing the printing "Estes Greeted" etc. She stated that any material printed was for customers; however, did not wish to give their names for fear they would get into trouble. She was not advised or informed that she could go to court and take the blame for the printing by any of the agents; however, upon refusing to name the persons the material was printed for, made a statement that she would take the blame for the printing and would go to court and take the blame for same. specifically furnished the following information during the search of her residence: freely admitted the printing of material

showing U. S. Senator ESTES KEFAUVEE being greeted by two male Negroes and she located a negative for use on her printing press relating to the photo reading "Estes Greeted" and she pointed out this photograph had appeared in the Memphis, Tennessee, Commercial Appeal and she could not understand why the U. S. Government was investigating the matter when newspapers all over the country had originally printed the photograph.

On questioning concerning any letters which she had printed which began "Dear Comrade" and which were

b6 hood," she originally denied any knowledge concerning the printing of letters of this nature, but after the finding of approximately 220 copies of this letter in the attic by Special Agents NORMAN L. CASEY and WALTER W. SMART. Jr., she protested she had not understood the Special Agents were looking for letters of that nature. She also pointed out the copies of these letters which she had at her home were signed by "International Committee of Human Brotherhood" but she declined to identify any members of this committee saying she had no membership list available. She then admitted printing this letter as well as copies of all material for which the plates were found at her residence. She stated this particular letter had been printed for some other person and it was not printed from a stencil cut from her typewriter. She at first maintained the letter was printed on a cash basis for some person whose identity she could not recall and then subsequently stated she would not reveal the identity of this person because she did not want to get other people involved. She would not reveal the identity of people ordering other pertinent printed material. She advised she had printed the material for which the plates were found and also the "Dear Comrade" letter but denied that she

had mailed any of the material from these printings through the U. S. Mails. She stated her husband, did not assist her in operating the press. During this search I emphatically did not open any personal mail that had not been opened and did not observe any other agent present open any mail. 

Newspaper articles disclose that Shelby Co., Tenn., Grand Jury would "take up" consideration on 8/26/60 of unsigned political literature, including literature showing Sen. KEFAUVER standing beside or shaking hands with Negroes. News article, Memphis Commercial Appeal, 9/7/60 issue, discloses Shelby Co. Grand Jury "unable to find probable cause" by "any person, committee or organization or association."

DETAILS:

The Memphis Press-Scimitar, issue of August 25, 1900, contained a news article captioned, "Grand Jury Will Probe Political Literature - Special Session Called for Tommorrow in Case Involving Unsigned Material." This article related that Grand Jury Foreman W. F. BOWLD, of the Shelby County, Tennessee, Grand Jury, had stated that the Grand Jury would take up the unsigned political literature case in a special session beginning at 9:00 AM on August 26, 1960, and that a number of witnesses had been subpoenaed. In this article Mr. BOWLD was quoted as saying that the Grand Jury had handed this matter over to the Shelby County Election Commission about two weeks previously, that the matter actually remained in the Grand Jury's hands and it had been considering it for about a month.

The Foreman was quoted further as saying, "We consulted with the Election Commission and they refused to come in on the investigation. They didn't feel like they should." The article relates that this matter had originally been brought to the Grand Jury's attention by one

of the Grand Jurors, a EUGENE BERNERO, a proofreader for the Memphis Publishing Company, who had also lodged a complaint in the matter with Shelby County, Tennessee, Attorney General PHIL CANALE. It was reported in this article that two attorneys, THOMAS L. ROBINSON and JAMES E. IRWIN, had also complained to Attorney General CANALE about the literature which was directed against Senator ESTES KEFAUVER, the literature reportedly showing the Senator shaking hands or standing beside a Negro.

A news article in the Memphis Press-Scimitar of August 26, 1960, beneath the by-line of reporter ELTON WISENHUNT reports that the Shelby County Grand Jury took up the unsigned political literature case at its special session on August 26, 1960, and heard witnesses in the matter. This news article dislosed that witnesses were called before the Grand Jury to testify about the unsigned political literature in this matter. It reported THOMAS L. ROBINSON, Attorney, was first to appear, followed by EDWARD J. MEEMAN, Editor, Memphis Press-Scimitar, and Dr. ROSS PRITCHARD, Southwestern Professor and Memphis campaign manager for Senator ESTES KEFAUVER, was described as a final witness.

A news article appears in the Memphis Commercial Appeal, issue of September 7, 1960, which is captioned, "Campaign Case Allowed to Die: Grand Jury Shuns Action on Use of Picture in Kefauver Election." This article relates that on September 6, 1960, the Shelby County, Tennessee, Grand Jury reported to Shelby County Criminal Court Judge PERRY SELLERS; that the Grand Jury report indicated it was "unable to find probable cause" that the law had been violated by "any person, committee, or organization or association." The article further relates that this Grand Jury report pointed out that the Grand Jury "has fully considered this complaint on two prior regular sessions, and in special session on today, August 26, 1960." The article discloses that the report was withheld until September 6, 1960, due to the illness of Criminal Court Judge SAM CAMPBELL, who was to have received the report. Judge CAMPBELL was reported to have not yet returned to the bench. The article relates that this Grand Jury report contained "an unexplained comment" comprising the last paragraph of the report as follows: "...this Grand Jury states unequivocally, that it will not permit itself to.

Also Included are two pages of political material which is favorable to to Kefauver, however, on page 2 of the material typewritten inserts have been made which are unfavorable to Kefauver. Photostat of a shipping label apparently used in connection with this material has what it appears to be a return address of 921 O Wage Street, Nashville, Tennessee. CRD memorandum indicates this may be violation of Section 612, Title 18, and requests an investigation to determine who printed and distributed the material, and if one Jim Fields actually lives at such an address and is responsible for the publication and/or distribution of these materials. Memphis being reminded that this portion of the investigation should be initially handled since if such a Jim Fields does exist and was responsible for the mailing of this material, there is no apparent violation of the law end No need to identify the printer and all the distributors involved.

This refers to your transmittal memorandum of August 18, 1960, enclosing six (6) items relating to the case involving the publication and distribution of unsigned campaign material concerning Senator Estes Kefauver.

The unlabeled cartoon and the letter dated June 30, 1960, at Chattanooga, and signed, "Jim Rields, Reporter," may constitute violations of 18 U.S.C. 612.



Investigation in this matter to date tends to indicate that the name "Jim Fields, Reporter," signed to the mimeographed sheet dated 6-30-60 at Chattanooga, and which the Department of Justice advises may constitute a violation of Section 612, Title 18, USC, is probably a fictitious name.

On 11-18-59, the Nashville Police Department furnished the Memphis Office with two mimeographed sheets, one dated at Nashville, Tennessee 7-20-59, and signed "Jim Field, Reporter," and the other dated 2-25-59 at Washington, D. C., signed "Bobby Sherrill, Reporter." Both of these mimeographed sheets are attacks on Negroes and were sent to a Nashville businessman, both being contained in the same envelope and mailed at Nashville. Due to the similarity of the context of the two mimeographed sheets and the similarity of the names of the authors thereof with the mimeographed letter dated 6-30-60 involved in this case, it is felt they may have been prepared by the same person.

It is requested that the Laboratory compare the typing contained on the mimeographed sheet dated 6-30-60 at Chattanooga, Tennessee, which was referred to the Bureau by the Postal Inspection Service at Washington, D. 

Synopsis:

Further investigation conducted this matter based on referral by Senator ESTES KEFAUVER of additional political campaign literature, unlabeled as to source, distributed at Waverly, Tenn., in late June, 1960, during Democratic Primary. Item in question is Mimeographed letter dated 6/30/60 at Chattanooga, Tenn., and signed "JIM FIELDS, Reporter." Context designed to give reader impression that author was a reporter covering Senator KEFAUVER's political campaign and that latter was unfavorably received by reporters at places where he campaigned. Material mailed from nonexistent address on Osage Street, Nashville, Tenn. JIM FIELDS, Reporter, not identified as real person at Nashville. Similar racist-type material constituting attacks on Negro race distributed in Nashville area in November, 1959, signed "JIM FIELD, Reporter," and "BOBBY SHERRILL, Reporter." GRACE DAWSON, close associate of JOHN KASPER, and public stenographer at Nashville, denies knowledge of campaign literature in question but admits having seen Mimeographed letters signed "JIM FIELD, Reporter," containing attack on Negro race. DAWSON furnished related handwriting specimens; declined to furnish typewriting specimens.

ME 56-82 DETAILS: AT NASHVILLE. TENNESSEE The following additional investigation has been conducted in this matter: By letter dated August 10, 1960, D. H. STEPHENS, Chief Postal Inspector, Washington, D. C., referred to the FBI certain documents which had been received from Senator ESTES KEFAUVER of Tennessee which were said to constitute a possible violation of Section 612, Title 18, U. S. Code. These documents and other material are as follows: (1) A letter dated at Chattanooga, Tennessee, June 30, 1960, which is addressed to no particular person, the message of which is as follows: "After covering Senator Kefauver's race from Memphis to here in the past ten days, from town to town, never before have I ever seen or heard of such small crowds, and most every one is mad at him for voting against the SQUTH, and the small crowds shouted at him, 'Go back to Washington, the Black City, the N.A.A.C.P. Boy, A.D.A. you're a disgrace to the South.' Some wanted to know how much Paul Butler and Walter Reuther give to buy him out. "On opening day at his Memphis office, Senator Kefauver was awfully upset, because the 100 well wishers from Firestone Rubber Co. weren't at the hotel to greet him. The Senator stayed at the hotel for five hours, only 357 registered and most of them were N.A.A.C.P. Negro Leaders, Big Fat Slickheaded Negroes, some of their cars were from Arkansas, Missouri, and Mississippi. "The people at Hornbeak ripped the Kefauver signs off the big bus. A lady at Milan shook her umbrella in his face and told him, you voted to force me to send my children to school with Negroes, and now my grandchildren will also have to go with Negroes, and crime now in the school is twenty times worse than it was five years ago, so Senator answered he was voting to help all the nation. "All across the State here is how Senator Kefauver crowds show up very small, sometimes 25 to 30 people. At Henry, only 57 people and most of them stood across the street, and when he goes across the street to shake hands with them, they leave.

ME 56-82 All along the route the only people that seemed to be pleased with Mr. Kefauver, were Negroes, a few Lawyers, Doctors and a handful of Jews here and there. "You can sure bet that Senator Kefauver hasn't any votes in West Tennessee, and they ll be short in all sections except Knox and Montgomery Counties. I have never known of any office holder being so disliked. "Jim Fields, Reporter." (2) A cartoon or reproduction of a cartoon purporting to depict Mr. ADLAI STEVENSON and Senator ESTES KEFAUVER in caricature and showing Mr. KEFAUVER telling Mr. STEVENSON, "SHH!! Remeber '56? We LOST Tennessee!" Mr. STEVENSON is pictured as holding a megaphone bearing the quote, "Adlai likes Estes." (3) A political circular entitled, "Facts You Should Know About Estes Kefauver," which sets forth background data concerning Mr. KEFAUVER. (4) A political circular entitled, "Re-Election ---Meet the Family," which photography depicts Senator KEFAUVER and member of his family. This material is labeled as having emanated from CHARLOTTE WILLIAMS ALLEN, Chairman, Women's Division, KEFAUVER for Senate Campaign, 240 Andrew Jackson Hotel, Nashville, Tennessee. Certain typing appears on this item which tends to contradict the printed message on this material and which appears not to have been a part of the material as originally printed. (5) A fragment of a shipping label which is addressed to "Powers Florist, Waverly, Tennessee," which bears a return address which reads "921 Osage Street, Nashville, Tennessee." It is noted, however, that a portion of the house number of the Osage Street address may have been obliterated as a portion of the shipping label is torn. Therefore, it is

ME 56-82 possible that a digit or digits may have appeared in front of the digits 921. From a review of the current Nashville City Directory and by personal observation of SA's EDWARD T. STEELE and WILLIAM L. SHEETS, it was ascertained on September 22, 1960, that Osage Street in Nashville, Tennessee, extends from 1715 18th Avenue North, west beyond 25th Avenue North to a dead end. The numbered residences and/or establishments on Osage Street begin at 1811 Osage Street and end at 2601 Osage Street. It was noted and observed that there is no such number as 921 Osage and further there is no residence or other building which has a numerical digit that ends in the digits "21." The name JAMES or JIM-FIELDS is not listed in the City Directory as a resident of that street. L. E. SMITH, a grocer at 23rd and Osage Streets, Nashville, advised SA's EDWARD T. STEELE and WILLIAM L. SHEETS on September 22, 1960, that he has resided and conducted a grocery business at this address for the past five years and has never heard of any person in that community and particularly on Osage Street named FIELDS. JAMES SMITHSON, who operates the By-Ryt Grocery at 23rd and Osage Streets, Nashville, advised SA's STEELE and SHEETS on September 22, 1960, that he has conducted his business at that address for the past fifteen years and has never heard of anyone in that community, and particularly on Osage Street, named JIM FIELDS. A further examination of the Nashville City Directory fails to reveal any other street or avenue at Nashville and suburban Nashville which is designated to have a name similar to Osage and has a numbered address ending in the digits 21. On September 22, 1960, Miss ROBBIE HUGHES, Clerk, Credit Bureau of Nashville, advised she was unable to identify a JAMES FIELDS or JIM FIELDS, Reporter, or a JAMES or JIM FIELD, from the records of that agency who was connected in any way with the newspaper or reporting field.

FRANK GRAY, Jr., Mayor, Franklin, Tennessee, who identified himself as having been State Campaign Manager for the political campaign of Senator ESTES KEFAUVER in the August 1960 primary elections in Tennessee, was interviewed, at which time he was shown a photostat of material and documents involved in this case.

Mr. GRAY stated that he was acquainted with some of the material and documents. He said that the letter dated June 30, 1960, at Chattaneoga, Tennessee, which is signed "JIM FIELDS, Reporter," which begins, "After covering Senator KEFAUVER's race..." and ends, "I have never known of any office holder being so disliked," was in fact a copy of a mimeographed letter which apparently had been received by Miss FRANCES POWERS, proprieter of Powers Florist, Waverly, Tennessee, during the latter weeks of July 1960 and immediately prior to the Democratic primary elections in August 1960. Mr. GRAY stated that at his request this letter and a shipping label used to mail a group of this mimeographed letter was sent to him at KEFAUVER campaign headquarters at Nashville by Dr. JAMES M. POWERS, the brother of Miss FRANCES POWERS and Chairman of the KEFAUVER for Senate Campaign Committee in Humphreys County, Tennessee, in 1960. Mr. GRAY stated that he in turn had caused the mimeographed letter to be sent to Mr. KEFAUVER's office in Washington, D.C.

Mr. GRAY stated that the cartoon depicting Senator KEFAW ER and Mr. ADLAI STEVENSON in caricature was not a part of the material sent to him by Dr. POWERS as having been received by Miss FRANCES POWERS. He also advised that the KEFAUVER campaign literature which was labeled as having emanated from CHARLOTTE WILLIAMS ALLEN, Chairman of the Manut an's Division of the KEFAUVER for Senate Campaign, was likewise not a part of the material forwarded to him by Dr. POWERS as having been received by his sister, Miss FRANCES POWERS.

Mr. GRAY advised that when he received the letter signed "JIM FIELDS, Reporter," he endeavored to ascertain if

JIM FIELDS was a real or fictitious person by contacting the major newspaper in the area and checking city and telephone directories, and came to the conclusion that "JIM FIELDS, Reporter," was not a real person but was the pseudonynm or alias of someone who was the author of the material. He said that he had no idea as to who might have been responsible for the preparation and/or distribution of the letter and stated he knew of no other similar material which had been distributed.

Miss FRANCES POWERS, Proprietor, Powers Florist,
Main Street, Waverly, Tennessee, advised that during the latter
part of July 1960 she received at her florist shop a package
of mimeographed letters which were dated at Chattanooga, Tennessee, on June 30, 1960, and signed, "JIM FIELDS, Reporter,"
which were designed to give the reader thereof the impression
that the author of the letter had covered, as a reporter, the
political campaign of Senator ESTES KEFAUVER from Memphis,
Tennessee, to Chattanooga, and that Senator KEFAUVER had not
been well received at places where he campaigned. She advised
that there were from 50 to 75 such mimeographed letters which
were rolled up in a manner similar to that in which newspapers
are mailed and were contained in a brown wrapper which bore a
shipping label addressed to "Powers Florist, Waverly, Tennessee," and which bore a return address of Osage Street, Nashville,
Tennessee.

Miss POWERS stated that she, as a supporter of Senator KEFAUVER and a former co-chairman of the KEFAUVER committee in Humphreys County, Tennessee, in 1956, was indignant over having received the above material and therefore threw it in a wastebasket and thereafter related the matter to her brother, Dr. J. M. POWERS, who thereafter retrieved one copy of the letter, together with the brown paper wrapper and shipping label, and sent it to Mr. KEFAUVER's campaign headquarters in Nashville.

Miss POWERS stated that she did not know who sent the letters to her or why the mimeographed material was sent to her. She said that the shipping label bearing the address and return address was in bad condition by virtue of bad handling through the mails when she received it. She recalled that a corner of the shipping label had already been torn off when it was received and that therefore it may be possible the residence address on Osage Street in Nashville was not complete. She stated that she had not received other similar material and stated the only other person she knew who had received similar material was CLAUD CHILTON of Waverly. She stated that she knew of no one who resided on Osage Street in Nashville and had never heard of JIM FIELDS.

Miss POWERS advised that the only material she had

Dr. JAMES M. POWERS, DDS, Waverly, Tennessee, who identified himself as having served as Chairman of the Kefauver for Senate Committee in Humphreys County, Tennessee, during the Democratic primary in Tennessee in 1960, was interviewed. Dr. POWERS stated that during the latter part of July 1960, his sister, Miss FRANCES POWERS, proprietor of Powers Florist Shop, advised him that she had received approximately 75 mimeographed letters which were dated June 30, 1960, at Chattanooga, Tennessee, and which were signed "JIM FIELDS, Reporter." These letters were opposed to the candidacy of Senator ESTES KEFAUVER. Dr. POWERS stated that at the request of Mr. FRANK GRAY, State Campaign Manager for Senator KEFAUVER, he retrieved one copy of this material from the trash at his sister's florist shop, as well as the shipping label used to transmit the material to his sister and sent it to Mr. GRAY at Senator KEFAUVER's headquarters at Nashville.

Dr. POWERS stated that the only material received by his sister was the mimeographed letter which was dated June 30, 1960, at Chattanooga, Tennessee, and that a carteon or other material was apparently not received by his sister. He stated that he did not know who was responsible for the preparation and/or distribution of this letter and that he did not know of anyone else in that community other than Mr. CLAUDE CHILTON who had received similar material. Dr. POWERS identified CHILTON as being a "strong segregationist."

CLAUDE CHILTON, owner of the Chili Grill, Main Street, Waverly, Tennessee, was interviewed. He was shown a photostat of a letter dated at Chattanooga, Tennessee, June 30, 1960, and signed "JIM FIELDS, Reporter," which begins, "After covering Senator KEFAUVER's race..." and ends "I have never known of any office holder being so disliked." CHILTON immediately identified this photostat of the above mentioned letter as a copy of a mimeographed letter, approximately 75 copies of which he received sometime during the latter part of July 1960." He advised that these copies of the letter were addressed to him at Waverly, Tennessee, and were relled up in a manner similar to the manner in which newspapers are mailed and were contained in a brown paper wrapper.

He said that he had not retained the copies of the letter or the containing wrapper, but discarded them in the trash. He advised that he did not distribute any of the letters to anyone else. He said that he thought that the package containing the letters bore a return address on Osage Street in Nashville, Tennessee; however, he could not recall the house number on Osage Street.

Mr. CHILTON stated that he could assign no reason why the material had been sent to him except that he was a "strong supporter" of Senator KEFAUVER's opponent in the senatorial race in the Democratic primary on August 4, 1960 in Tennessee, and that it may have been thought by someone that he would distribute the letters. He advised that he had heard that Miss FRANCES POWERS of Waverly had also received similar material but that he had not talked to her about it.

NORWOOD that he had received two mimeographed sheets from Mr. FRANK ZEIGLER of the Nashville Chamber of Commerce which had been turned over to Mr. ZEIGLER by a Nashville businessman. Lieutenant WHITE stated he did not know the original source from which the mimeographed sheets had emanated. He stated one of these sheets was signed "JIM FIELD, Reporter," and one was signed "BOBBY SHERRILL, Reporter." Lieutenant WHITE stated he did not know who was distributing the sheets, but that apparently they had been mailed at Nashville in one envelope. This material is as follows: "Washington, D.C. February 25, 1959 "This, Ladies and Gentlemen, is a <u>True</u> report on the 1958 <u>Birth Reports of our nation</u>. There is a law, you know, that each city, county and state must keep an accurate report of all births, ending each year at midnight, December 31st. Fifteen days later all reports must be in the Nation Capitol, or \$500.00 fine, and up, two years in prison, if the law is not carried out. "The reports show in 1958 there were 11,000 babies born each day. Among this group there are whites, Indians, Jews, Spicks, Mexicans, and Negroes. Of the 11,000 births 2,189 are Negroes, and each day it shows after a whole year, day by day that 1,166 of these Negroes are born bastards. Some Negro women have four and five babies and never have been married. "The Negro birth rate has increased each year since 1950 through 1959, and the past four years it has increased over eight million and over half of these Negroes go on the State Welfare across the nation, and it shows that the White People pay 81% of this welfare. "This, Mr. and Mrs. Employer, is to ask you now, take stock of all your employees and see how many Negroes you can possibly cut from your payroll. There are now in Nashville and Davidson County 66,812 white people out of work. These people run in age from 16 to 70 against 4,511 Negroes. Last year the Negroes reported to the NAACP that they earned sixty million dollars in salary in Nashville in 1958. Also reported that they begged over seven million dollars worth used clothes and three million dollars worth of left over food. The NAACP has praised them for their mooching.

"In the sixty million dollars they were paid, eleven million of it went to gamble on the Numbers Rackets. They paid \$69,512 in city, state and national taxes. They spent \$117,000.00 for dog food; they spent little over \$69,000.00 for housing; they spent \$400,000.00 for bread and milk.

"I was in Oklahoma City when the Negroes tried to take over Katz Drug Co. and Brown Department Store. I saw them march 600 strong to the State Capitol, singing America and Liberty. This lost them over 8,000 jobs. In September, 1958, I went to Little Rock in the private school drive, 8,512 lost their jobs there, 5,681 lost out in Memphis, 12,489 lost in Atlanta, 589 lost in Nashville. So it is up to all Employers, housewives, etc. The Negroes say now that Nashville is the only Negroes Heaven in the South. There were 89 cases of rape in Davidson County and Nashville last year and 86 of them committed by Negroes, 59 of them were white ladies.

Mr. FRANK ZEIGLER, Chairman of the Civic and Government Affairs Committee, Nashville Chamber of Commerce, Nashville Chamber of Commerce Building, Union Street, Nashville, Tennessee, advised that in November 1959 he was contacted by Mr. ROBERT L. HERBERT, Secretary of the T. L. Herbert & Sons Company, concerning some mimeographed material which he had received in the mail and which constituted a violent attack on the Negro race. Mr. ZEIGLER stated that he turned the material over to Lieutenant REX WHITE of the Nashville Police Department. He said that he did not receive information from Mr. HERBERT as to the manner in which he came into possession of the material and that he knew nothing concerning one JIM FIELD or BOBBY SHERRILL.

He stated that he attempted to identify the author of the material by contacting the Southern Educational Reporting Service, an organization made up of representatives of newspapers throughout the South which collects and disseminates data regarding school integration questions in the Southern area and stated he was unable to identify FIELD or SHERRILL as any person known to that organization.

ROBERT D. HERBERT, Secretary, T. L. Herbert & Sons Company, Second Avenue North, Nashville, Tennessee, advised that in approximately November 1959 he received through the U. S. Mails two mimeographed sheets, one dated in February 1959 at Washington, D.C., signed "BOBBY SHERRILL, Reporter," and one dated July 20, 1959 at Nashville, Tennessee, signed "JIM FIELD, Reporter." Both of these mimeographed sheets, which constituted a violent attack on the Negro race, were contained in the same envelope. Mr. HERBERT stated that he is of the present impression that the material was mailed to him from Nashville, Tennessee; however, he could not make a def-inite statement in this regard. He said that he could ascribe no specific reason as to why he should receive this type of racist material but could only speculate as to the reason. He then speculated that the T. L. Herbert & Sons Company employs more than 100 Negro laborers and truck drivers and has followed this policy for over a hundred years. He stated it is probable that someone in the Nashville area who felt strongly on the race question was attempting to dissuade him from that policy.

Miss GRACE DAWSON, 4010 Brush Hill Road, Nashville, Tennessee, was interviewed at her offices located in Room 304, Baxter Building, Nashville, where she operates a stenographic and court reporting service.

At the outset of the interview, Miss DAWSON, who said she was 86 years of age, was advised of her right to consult with an attorney and her right to decline to furnish information regarding the subject matter of the interview.

She was shown a photostat of a letter dated at Washington, D.C., February 25, 1959, signed "BOBBY SHERRILL, Reporter," the first paragraph of which begins, "This, Ladies and Gentlemen, is a True report on the 1958 Birth Reports of our nation," and ends, "No church, nor any living soul, can deny this report." She stated that she had never seen this letter or a copy thereof.

Miss DAWSON was then shown a photostat of a letter dated at Nashville, July 20, 1959, signed "JIM FIELD, Reporter," the first paragraph of which begins, "This, Mr. and Mrs. Employer, is to ask you now, take stock on all your employees..." and ends in the last paragraph, "There were 89 cases of rape in Davidson County and Nashville last year and 86 of them committed by Negroes, 59 of them were white ladies."

Mr. GRAY stated that he was acquainted with some of the material and documents. He said that the letter dated June 30, 1960, at Chattanooga, Tennessee, which is signed "JIM FIELDS, Reporter," which begins, "After covering Senator KEFAUVER's race... and ends, "I have never known of any office holder being so disliked."

Mr. CRAY stated that this was in fact a copy of a mimeographed latter which apparently had been received by Miss FRANCES POWERS, proprietor of Powers Florist, Waverly, Tennessee, during the latter weeks of July 1960 and immediately prior to the Democratic primary elections in August 1960. Mr. GRAY stated that at his request this letter and a shipping label used to mail a group of this mimeographed letter was sent to him at KEFAUVER campaign headquarters at Nashville by Dr. JAMES M. POWERS, brother of Miss FRANCES POWERS and Chairman of the KEFAUVER for Senate Campaign Committee in Humphreys Conty, Tennessee, in 1960. Mr. GRAY stated that he in turn caused the mimeographed letter to be sent to Mr. KEFAUVER's office in Washington, B.C.

Mr. GRAY stated that the cartoon depicting Senator KEFAUVER and Mr. ADLAZ STEVENSON in caricature was not a part of the material sent to him by Dr. POWERS as having been received by Miss FRANCES POWERS. Enclosed herewith are three ruled sheets of white tablet paper bearing the known handwriting specimens of VANCE STEPHENSON, 211 Bowling Avenue, Nashville, Tennessee, who has been developed as a strong and logical suspect as being the person who allegedly distributed certain political campaign literature, which is unlabeled as to its source and involved in this case.

It is requested that STRPHENSON's known handwriting be compared with that appearing on a fragment of a shipping label used to distribute the political campaign material. The shipping label is in the possession of the Bureau, having been referred directly there by the Postal Inspection Service, Washington, D. C., which agency received the material from Senator ESTES KEFAUVER. It is noted that the Photostat copy of the shipping label furnished the Memphis Office indicated that it is addressed to: "Powers Florist, Waverly, Tennessee," and bears the return address "921 Osage Street, Nashville, Tenn."

For the information of the Laboratory, STEPHENSON denies that he distributed the material in question or wrote the address and return address on the shipping label. The known handwriting specimens were obtained on two different days. 10-4 and 5-60.

The handwriting specimens obtained on 10-4-60. and dated on that date on the sheet containing the specimens, were written by STEPHENSON while seated in an awkward position at a telephone table. He declined to furnish specimens under more favorable writing conditions. The specimens obtained on 10-5-60, were obtained at the Nashville RA and under conditions

more favorable to normal writing. The latter specimens were prepared with his own pen equipped with a point other than a ball point. He dipped it in an ink well from time to time for the ink supply rather than fill the pen with ink. He was requested to furnish the specimens on blank gummed shipping or parcel post labels, similar to that used by the person who shipped the political campaign material involved in this case; however, he declined to furnish the specimens on the label blanks without being shown the original label. It is noted that the preamble on the specimens is written by STEPHENSON.

DUFF said it was possible that if FIELDS had been employed there during the period between 1925 and 1949 for a period of less than 30 days, the personnel records might not reflect same. If he had been employed for any period of time subsequent to 1949 the records would reflect it. DUFF had no personal recollection of any employee named JIM FIELDS.

J. N. HEISKELL, Editor; A. R. NELSON, Managing Editor; and WILLIAM SHELTON, City Editor, all of the Arkansas Gazette, advised they had no knowledge that JIM FIELDS had ever been employed by that newspaper.





- (2) Will, if Bureau authority received, re-interview VANCE MAXIE STEPHENSON, although it may be in the presence of his attorney, noting that STEPHENSON when interviewed on October 5, 1960, stated that he would not consent to being interviewed, except in the presence of his attorney or another witness. A separate letter is being directed to the Bureau in this regard.
- (3) Will report the result of examination by the FBI Laboratory as to handwriting comparison of the handwriting of STEPHENSON with that appearing on the shipping label used to distribute the political campaign literature involved in this case.

Will exhibit the original of the typewritten mimeograph letter of June 30, 1960, at Chattanooga, Tennessee, involved in this case and the outer wrapper containing the shipping label addressed to Power's Florist to LOUISE POWERS, a recipient of the material involved in this case, for the purpose of having her identify this material for evidentiary purposes.

ADMINISTRATIVE:

The Bureau's attention is invited to the fact that VANCE MAXIE STEPHENSON, who has been developed as an additional subject in this case, was designated on October 31, 1958, by the Memphis Division as a potential suspect in bombing cases having apparent racial or religious basis. It is noted that STEPHENSON was mentioned in a news story appearing in the Nashville Banner, a daily newspaper in Mashville, Tennessee, on July 6, 1957, in which he is quoted as saying a rally of the Ku Klux Klan would be held at Nashville and stating that the reason for the rally was to protest integration program in Nashville City Schools. The name of VANCE MAXIE STEPHENSON was deleted from the list of bombing suspects in the Memphis Division on September 14, 1960, in view of a lack of indication that he was involved in any of the bombings that had occurred.

By teletype dated October 5, 1960, the Memphis Office was advised by the FBI Laboratory that the postmark on the mimeographed letter involved in this case appeared to be Nashville, Tennessee. However, the postmark was incomplete. This data has not been included in the body of this report and will not be included until such time as the formal report of the Laboratory is received in the Memphis Office.

Because of the information received in an initial interview with VANCE MAXIE STEPHENSON to the effect that JIM FIELDS was a real person who he understood was formerly a reporter with the Little Rock, Arkansas Gazette, whom he had met through one FOSTER of Knoxville, Tennessee, and further because of the information received from STEPHENSON to the effect that material similar to that involved in this case had been received by him from Jeffersonville, Indiana, the Little Rock Office was requested by Memphis teletype of October 3, 1960, to ascertain through established sources if JIM FIELDS was ever employed by the Little Rock, Arkansas Gazette. The Knoxville Office was requested to endeavor to identify one (FNU) FOSTER who may be connected with a racist type group and interview him, if identified, regarding his knowledge of FIELDS. The Indianapolis Office was requested to contact logical informants at Jeffersonville, Indiana, in an effort to ascertain if one JIM FIELDS was associated with the National States Right Party, and if so, determine his present whereabouts.

With regard to the requests made of the Little Rock, Knoxville, and Indianapolis Offices, the Little Rock Office advised by teletype on October 4, 1960, that on that date SA LEANDER J. MUNCY contacted J. N. HEISKELL, Editor, Arkansas Cazette, and other officials of that newspaper and was advised that JIM FIELDS had not been employed as a reporter. It was further indicated that officials of the Arkansas Democrat, the other Little Rock, Arkansas daily newspaper, furnished the same information.

The Knoxville Office advised by teletype on October 4, 1960, that the following informants who have furnished reliable information in the past were contacted on that date and they advised that they had no knowledge of JIM FIELDS or an individual (FNU) FOSTER who might be connected with a racist type group or groups and acquainted with FIELDS:

While talking to Miss DAWSON, she informed |that the FBI had interviewed her about some political campaign literature signed JIM FIELDS, which was supposed to have been distributed in violation of the law. She told the informant that she had prepared the material in her office. She did not tell informant who the individual was who was distributing the material. She did not identify JIM FIELDS.

STEPHENSON, an admitted former member of Tennessee White Citizens Council, the Pro-Southerners, and a "strong segregationist", and a close associate of JOHN KASPER, in interview on 10/3 and 10/4/60 stated he has received printed material authored by "JIM FIELDS, Reporter" and by "BOBBY SHERRILL, Reporter," including the mimeographed typewritten letter dated 6/30/60 at Chattanooga, Tennessee, which was distributed during Democratic primary election in Tennessee, 1960, and involved in this case. VANCE MAXIE STEPHENSON, 211 Bowling Avenue, was interviewed briefly at his place of employment, Wendell Smith's Cafe, Mashville, Tennessee. The interview was limited because of STEPHENSON's statement that he did not have much time to devote to the interview inasmuch as it was necessary for him to report for work in a few minutes. At the outset of the interview, STEPHENSON was advised of his right to an attorney, and of his right not to make any statement, oral or written, concerning the subject matter of the interview.

At the outset of the interview, after being advised as to the nature of the subject matter, STEPHENSON volunteered that he was a "strong segregationist," a former member of the Tennessee White Citizens Council, the Pro Southerners, and a close friend of JOHN MASPER, who has been closely identified as the head of the Tennessee White Citizens Council when that organization was active.

STEPHENSON said that he had seen printed material authored by JIM FIELDS, a reporter, and by BOBBY SHERRILL. a reporter. He said that he had received thousands of mimeographed leaflets distributed from all parts of the United States bearing on the segregation issue and that among these leaflets were some which were supposedly written by JIM FIELDS and BOBBY SHERRILL. He said that he did not recall that any of this material ever bore a return address. However, he indicated that the material itself indicated on its face that it had been prepared in numerous places, including Little Rock, Arkansas; Knoxville, Tennessee; Terre Haute, Indiana; Indianapolis, Indiana; Los Angeles, Galifornia; and Miami, Florida. STEPHENSON at this point indicated that he was of the personal belief that a great portion may be prepared at Jeffersonville, Indiana, and was carried by a GMC truck to other parts of the country where it was mailed to the various recipients of the material in bulk form.

STEPHENSON said that he had met a person named JIM FIRLDS who was a reporter and that this individual had been at Mashville, Tennessee on several occasions at segregationist rallies consisted and sponsored by JOHN WASPER and/or the Tennessee White Citizens Council. He said that he had been introduced to FIELDS by an individual whose last name was FOSTER of Knoxville. Tennessee. emphasised at this point that this individual was not identical with one LEE FOSTER. However, he was unable to farnish further identifying information concerning the man named FOSTER to whom he referred. STEPHENSON described FIRIDS as being a white male, age about 38, 6'3" in height, 220 to 235 pounds, with blonde hair and a crew cut. He described him further as giving the appearance of being a football player and further described him as a rather educated person. STEPHENSON further said that he was of the impression that FIELDS formerly was employed as a reporter for the Little Rock Gazette or the Arkansas Gazette, a daily newspaper at Little Rock, Arkansas. STEPHENSON also said he had met a person named BOBBY.
SHERRILL who was a reporter. STEPHENSON advised that
SHERRILL likewise had been at Nashville, fennessee, and stated that his appearance at Mashville coincided with "sit-in demonstrations" which occurred in Nashville during the past year. At this point STEPHENSON volunteered that he had seen material prepared for or on behalf of person interested in the "segregationist" movement by persons who described themselves as being "reporter." The only other person that he could recall at that time who mad this title in disseminating or preparing information was one. JOE MC CORMICK, whom he could not describe further.

VANCE MAXIE STEPHENSON, 211 Bowling Avenue, Mashville, Tennessee, was interviewed at his residence. At this time STEPHENSON was again advised of his right to an attorney and his right to decline to furnish information, either oral or written concerning the subject matter of the interview.

At this time STEPHENSON was shown a photostat copy of a typewritten mimeographed sheet, dated June 30, 1960, at Chattanooga, Tennessee, bearing the typewritten signature, "JIN FIELDS, Reporter", which begins, "After covering Senator KEFAUVER's race from Memphis to here in the past ten days...", and ending, "I have never known of any office holder being so disliked.", which letter is involved in the investigation of this case. After looking at the photostat copies of this letter, he immediately stated that he had seen the letter before and as a matter of fact had received three copies of it through the mail which had been received in a plain white envelope addressed to him at the above address and which letter he believed bore the return postmark of Jackson, Tennessee.

STEPHENSON said that he threw this material in the wastebasket as he bad done in the case of literally thousands of other similar material which he had received in the past. He volunteered that apparently his name was on the mailing list of numerous persons and organizations interested in preventing members of the colored face from attending school with members of the white race in the South. At this point, he again volunteered that he was personally opposed to members of the colored race attending schools with members of the white rase but indicated at this point that he received such literature in such volume that he did not have time to read all of it or to maintain it. At this time, STEPHENSON again indicated that he had met a person named JIM FIELDS, who described himself as being a reporter and whomestarking believed had been a reporter with a newspaper at Little Rock. Arkansas. He reiterated that he had met this individual at rallies sponsored by the Tennessee White Citizens' Council at Mashville, Tennessee. He agains reiterated the information furnished by him on the previous day to the effect that he was introduced to FIELDS by a man named FOSTER who was from Knozville, Tennessee.

STEPHENSON was asked if he knew the identity of the person who had distributed the above-mentioned material during the senatorial campaign conducted in the Democratic primary elections in Tennessee in August, 1960, and he stated that he did not.

At this time STEPHENSON voluntarily submitted a limited amount of his handwriting specimens.

STEPHENSON said that he did not desire to execute a signed statement concerning the information he had furnished on that day or the proceeding day, October 3, 1960.

Mrs. CLARENCE HINKLE, who is also known as MARY JONES, and who resides at 502 Drake Avenue, Nashville, Tennessee, was interviewed. Courthouse Building, Nashville, Tennessee, at which time he was accompanied by an individual whom he introduced as Rev. STAUROS C. VANIS, his landlord who resided at 211 Bowling Avenue, Nashville, Tennessee, and whom he identified as a Greek Orthodox minister.

At this point, Mr. STEPHENSON indicated that he had contacted his attorney, J. ALFRED SMITH, Stahlman Building, Nashville, Tennessee, and had advised his attorney of the desire of the interviewing agents to interview him at which time he was advised by Mr. SMITH that he should not consent to being interviewed except in his, the attorney's presence, or in the presence of some other witness. STEPHENSON indicated it was for this reason that he had brought the Rev. ZANIS with him to witness and hear the interview. At this point, STEPHENSON was advised that the Agents did not desire to interview him under the conditions set by him and further that his declination to be interviewed, except under such conditions, would be called to the attention of the Attorney General of the United States.

At this time STEPHENSON said that under the circumstances he felt he should follow the advice of his attorney and would not consent to be interviewed. He indicated, however, that he would willingly submit specimens of his handwriting which specimens were obtained from him at that time and in the presence of Rev. ZANIS.





FACTS YOU SHOULD KNOW ABOUT ESTES KEFAUVER

BACKGROUND AND EDUCATION

Estes Kefauver was born in rural Monroe County, Tennessee, and is descended from generations of Tennesseans. His father, the son of a Baptist minister, was of a well known East Tennessee family. His mother was Phredonia Estes of a prominent West Tennessee family. His boyhood and education in the public schools of Madisonville paralleled those of the average small town Tennessee boy. His sister Nancy, now Mrs. Leroy Fooshee, lives in Knoxville and his sister Nora at Madisonville. As a student at the University of Tennessee, his leadership abilities first became apparent. He served as president of the student body and editor of the campus weekly. And he was a mainstay of the football team, as well. After graduation from the University he taught a year . . . then entered Yale Law School, where he worked his way through school, and took his law degree there.

EARLY CAREER

As a young lawyer in Chattanooga, Kefauver soon become a leader in the organizations of his profession. He was elected vice president of the Tennessee Bar Association and served for several years as a member of the Central Council of the American Bar Association. It was during these years as a struggling young attorney that he won the greatest of all his personal victories by persuading beautiful Nancy Piggott to become Mrs. Estes Kefauver. In 1937 he was honored by being chosen "Young Man of the Year" by the Chattanooga Junior Chamber of Commerce, and he served as an officer both in Chattanooga and statewide in the Jaycees and in the Young Democratic Club.

ELECTED TO CONGRESS IN 1939

In 1939, Kefauver began his long career of government service by becoming Tennessee Commissioner of Finance and Taxation. Later that year, upon the death of Congressman Sam D. McReynolds of the Third Congressional District, a special election was called to fill the vacancy and he entered this race. He was elected and re-elected four times. It was not long before his outstanding ability began to be recognized. In 1944 Collier's Magazine singled him out as one of the ten best Congressmen. His record as a great practical humanitarian had its solid beginnings in the House of Representatives.

ELECTED TO SENATE IN 1948

In 1948, after having served nearly ten years in Congress, the people of Tennessee sent Estes Kefauver to the United States Senate where he rapidly rose to national acclaim. Only two years after his election Time Magazine named him as one of the ten best Senators.

His investigation of interstate organized crime in 1951 and the revealing publicity which his committee turned upon this shameful situation earned him the gratitude and respect of millions of decent Americans who were shocked into action by his exposures. In a poll of 128 newspaper correspondents assigned to cover the Senate, Kefauver was chosen as one of the two most outstanding Senators.

His work for World Peace, against organized crime, for the farmer, the veteran, the small business man, the working man and for TVA and REA, all this, and much more, have earned for him the honest respect and sincere admiration of thousands, not only in Tennessee, but throughout the nation. In 1952 Senator Kefauver reflected much credit on Tennessee when he won Democratic presidential primaries in 16 out of 17 states and led on the first two ballots at the Democratic National Convention.

RE-ELECTED TO SENATE IN 1954 BY A LANDSLIDE

In 1954, Senator Kefauver was re-elected to the United States Senate, carrying 91 out of 95 counties in the state in a great outpouring of appreciation for the high quality of his leadership, and for his devotion to the welfare of the people of Tennessee.

He has continued to prove himself the stalwart-friend of the average person. His record shows strong and consistent concern for the farmer, the small business man, the working man, older people and the veteran. No one has fought more valiantly to protect the consumer against rising prices. His recent investigation of the practices of some pharmaceutical manufacturers, the lack of price competition between them and of the exorbitant price they charge for many prescription drugs and medicines, has earned him the gratitude of thousands—particularly that of countless elderly people living on small fixed incomes.

Memphis Office has submitted known handwriting of one Vance Stephenson, a former member of Tennessee White Citizens Council, pro-Southern, and other racist groups for comparison with an address label contained on one of the anti-Kefauver mimeographed sheets widely circulated during Senator Kefauver's recent primary election campaign. We have identified Stephenson's handwriting with the handwriting on the label affixed to the political campaign literature.

The campaign literature bearing the shipping label was referred to us by the Postal Inspection Service in Washington, D. C., which agency received the material from Senator Estes Kefauver. This political campaign literature bears a handwritten label to "Powers Florist, Waverly, Tennessee," and bears the handwritten return address "921 Osage Street, Nashville, Tenn." It is this handwriting that we have identified as being that of Vance Stephenson.

The Memphis Office had obtained information investigatively which strongly suggested Stephenson as a suspect in this case. He has been interviewed previously but to date denies implication in this matter.

RECOMMENDATION: That the attached teletype advising of the identification of Stephenson be sent to Memphis.

It is requested that the Bureau make the following corrections to Bureau copies of rerep:

Page 9, Paragraph 4, Line 3: Towers Florist should be Powers Florist

Page 11, Paragraph 2, Line 7, and Page 13, Line #1, the words "offered" should be "authored," to read, on Page #11 as "which was authored; or supposedly authored, by one JIM FIELDS..." and on Page 13 to read "which was supposedly authored by JIM FIELDS..."

Page 18, Paragraph 2, Line 5, Paragraph 3, Line 8, and Paragraph 4, Line 6, in each instance the name "VANIS" should be "ZANIS."

No administrative action is being recommended concerning the above erross inasmuch as the dictating Agent noted these errors upon his first review of rerep and the FD-302s involved. The dictating Agent, who is a resident agent, dictated both the FD-302s involved and rerep on Dictabelts. The errors involved in theuse of the word "offered" for the word "authored," "Towers" for "Powers", and "VANIS" for "ZANIS" would not have been readily apparent either to the stenographer in typing or reading, or to the Supervisor in reading and approving this report.

Memphis copies of rerep have been corrected; however, inasmuch as the above errors do not affect the substances or the meaning of the information set forth in rerep, UACB, copies of rerep which have been forwarded to the USA, Memphis, and the USA, Nashville, will not be corrected

This is to confirm the conversation between Attorney Irwin E. Blum of your Division and Special Agent James L. Startzell on October 27, 1960.

Your memorandum of October 26, 1960, your file 72-70-63, IEB, requested that subject Vance Maxie Stephenson be interviewed although he has requested that such interview be in the presence of his attorney or another witness. Mr. Blum was advised that the FBI Laboratory has recently identified Stephenson's known handwriting with the handwriting on the label affixed to the political campaign literature involved, and that a communication including this Laboratory report is forthcoming. Mr. Blum advised that under the circumstances the interview with subject Stephenson should not be conducted at this time and the Bureau will comply with these instructions. NOTE:

Subject Stephenson refused to be interviewed except in the presence of his attorney or a third witness and the Department was so advised. He did, however, willingly furnish handwriting specimens which were subsequently identified with the unknown handwriting involved in this campaign literature.

Mr. Blum agreed that there was no need, therefore, that he be reinterviewed under undesirable circumstances at this time. Results of the Lab examination furnished to Memphis on 10/19/60 and their report is forthcoming. This is the case involving the printing and dissemination of unlabeled anti-Kefauver campaign literature JLS: aeo prior to the August Primary in Tennessee.



The words "State of Tennessee" had been scratched out of the above text with a pen and the word "South" printed above them.

With regard to the card, Mr. Arthur Bruce Cole, LaFollette, Tennessee, Chairman of the National States Rights Party, admitted on 7-25-50, that he had distributed a number of the cards in LaFollette, but claimed that the cards were received anonymously through the mail and he had no information as to their source or origin.

On 7-27-00, Ned Dupes, Secretary of the National States Rights Party, Knoxville, Tennessee, admitted that he had distributed approximately 10 of these cards but claimed that he found them on his front porch in a package and did not know their source or origin. Dupes voluntarily furnished to agents a business envelope of the National States Rights Party for typewriter comparison. The Laboratory concluded that some of the letters on this envelope (K-10) were similar in style and size to the corresponding letters in the printed caption on the anonymous card, but it was not possible to determine if the same press was used. SA PARKER and myself left immediately. This departure was at 9:14 AM.

Neither SA PARKER or myself entered the house or even touched the door, except to press the bell button. I took no part in the conversation. SA PARKER by word and manner was completely and uniformly courteous throughout the incident. Both this woman and man were notably hostile and rude.

In accordance with your instructions, on this date, I accompanied SA JOHN A. PARKER to 808 North Third Avenue, Knoxville, Tennessee to interview one NED DUPES.

The following is a chronological account of the events that transpired, prepared from notes made by me immediately following the termination of the attempt to interview NED DUPES:

We arrived at 808 North Third Avenue at 9:10 AM, November 29, 1960 and walked up on the porch. SA PARKER rang the dorbell and an elderly woman came to the door and said "Yes?". SA PARKER said "I am John Parker of the FBI. We would like to see Mr. Ned Dupes." The woman said "What do you want with him?" SA PARKER said "We want to talk with him in connection with an official investigation." She said "Well you are not coming in this house. You don't have a search warrant." SA PARKER said "We have no warrant. We just want to see Mr. DUPES. Will you tell him that we are here?"

At this point the woman went back in the house and returned almost immediately. She said "He won't see you. Why don't you stop bothering him. What has he done?" SA PARKER said "We just want to talk to him as a citizen". She said "It's about the National States Right Party. There is nothing wrong with it. I am a member myself. I have a heart condition, and you coming out her upsets me. You go away and don't come back."

As we turned to leave, this woman appeared to sit down on the floor and SA PARKER called "Mr. Dupes, come here quickly. This lady has fainted." A man came to the door and was assisting the woman to rise. SA PARKER asked "Can we help you." The man said "No, you can't." SA PARKER said "can we call help or go for help." The man said "No, you can't. You go away and don't come back here." I heard the woman talking.

At approximately 9:20 AM, Mrs. DUPES called the office. I was operating the switchboard at that time. She asked if I knew Mr. PARKER that worked at this office. I said that I did. She said that he had come out to her house this morning and caused her to faint. She told me that she had a very bad heart and didn't want those "damned bastards" coming out to her house again. She said that she had not done anything wrong and she was not going to let them inside the house, because they did not have a search warrant. She then told me not to ever send any more of those FBI men out to her house again and hung up.

I advised the SAC of the conversation and he advised me to write a memo for the file.

At this point, the woman placed her hand on her chest, sat down on the floor, and laid back on the living room rug with her feet toward the front door, giving the impression that she had collapsed or semi-fainted. SA PARKER asked if he could help her, to which she replied, from her prone position, "No. Just go away and leave us alone".

SA PARKER, at that mement, observed a man whom he recognized as NED DUPES, peering from a lighted room at the end of the hall toward the rear of the house, and called out "Mr. Dupes, Ned, come here quickly. This lady appears to have fainted". Mr. DUPES then came to the woman's side, knelt down beside her and began to lift her. SA PARKER, still outside on the porch, asked Mr. DUPES if he could help him, or if we could go for help or call a doctor, to which Mr. DUPES replied "No, you cannot. Just go away and don't come back". It was observed that the woman was not unconscious. The agents left immediately without further conversation, returned to the field office and reported above incident to the SAC.

It should be noted that, through above conversation, which lasted from approximately 9:10 AM to 9:14 AM, the agents stood on DUPES' front porch, with their hats removed; did not touch the door or the house other than to ring the door-bell initially, and the screen-door remained closed at all times. SA PARKER, who did all of the talking, was courteous, soft spoken and guardedly polite in speech, manner, and bearing. There was no indication that neighbors or other persons observed or overheard the above incident or conversations.

At approximately 9:20 AM on 11/29/60, a woman who identified herself as Mrs. DUPES telephoned the Knoxville Office, asked the switchboard operator, Mrs. CHARLOTTE HENRY, if Mr. PARKER was connected with this office and, upon being assured that he was, Mrs. DUPES launched into a tirade saying that he had been to her house, had caused her to faint, said she had a bad heart and that she did not want "those damned bastards" coming to her house again. She said she had not done anything wrong and that she was not going to let them

inside the house because they did not have a search warrant. She then told Mrs. HENRY not to ever send any more of those FBI men to her house again, and hung up.

The possibility suggests itself that NED DUPES learned that he had been identified as the person who had printed the cards captioned "ARE YOU STUPID?" distributed in opposition to the renomination of Senator ESTES KEFAUVER,

On 11/29/60, Agents of the Knoxville Office visited the residence of NED DUPES, 808 North Third Avenue, at which time a woman answered the door. Agents advised they would like to talk to Mr. DUPES and the woman remarked to the effect that Agents could not enter the house without a search warrant and inquired if the Agents had a search warrant. The Agents explained that they had no intention or desire to search the house but wished to speak to Mr. DUPES. The woman was requested to tell Mr. DUPES that Agents wished to talk to him whereupon the woman closed the door, then returned and said that Mr. DUPES did not want to see the Agents and did not desire to talk to them. She then asked why Agents did not quit bothering DUPES and also stated that if it was about the National States Rights Party it was a fine organization and she belonged.

This woman, apparently Mrs. DUPES, stated that she had a heart condition and Agents' presence upset her and at this point she sat down on the floor and gave the impression that she had collapsed or semi-fainted. Agents called Mr. DUPES who came and refused an offer to help by the Agents and advised Agents they could not help and to go away and not to come back.

A woman who identified herself as Mrs. DUPES, telephoned the Knoxville Office shortly after the Agents had departed from the residence of DUPES and launched into a tirade advising that Agents had caused her to faint and did not want those "damn bastards" coming to her house again. This information is more fully set forth in Knoxville memoranda enclosed for the Bureau in Knoxville airtel to Director dated 11/29/60.



UNKNOWN SUBJECTS ELECTION LAWS

In conversation with Departmental Attorney fawin E. Blum on this date, Mr. Blum commented that he still has the file on this matter on his desk. He explained that he has recommended to three U. S. Attorneys that four different indictments be presented to grand juries on subjects involved. He also commented that he is waiting for new U. S. Attorneys to be appointed in the districts involved after which he will recommend that indictments again be discussed with them. He further pointed out that although a Federal grand jury in Jackson, Tennessee, declined to indict three of the subjects, he Blum is not satisfied and is going to recommend that the facts be re-presented.

Mr. Blum did not indicate that he contemplates requesting any additional investigation by this Bureau.

You will recall that we handled in this one matter numerous pieces of unlabeled political literature which were disseminated throughout Tennessee during the Summer and Fall of 1960. They were of an anti-Kefauver nature. The investigation did not disclose that all of this literature could be traced to any one individual or group. It now appears that before all prosecution is resolved it will be necessary to present facts to Federal grand juries in three different districts. We have considerable evidence which must be returned to the contributors when the matter is entirely resolved.

For your information, a Departmental Attorney, upon being contacted on another matter on 4-12-61, commented that this matter was still under consideration. He mentioned that possibly four different indictments are under consideration and the comment was made that these indictments would be discussed with the new U. S. Attorneys. It was also stated that although a Federal Grand Jury in Jackson, Tennessee, had declined to indict three of the subjects, the Department is not certain that it will not recommend that the facts with regard to these three be re-presented.

In view of the above, the evidence obtained in your investigation of this matter must be retained. No further contact is contemplated with the Department by the Bureau at this time. You should continue to forward to the Bureau any local developments brought to your attention.

Re FD 192 submitted to the Bureau by the Memphis Division dated 2/9/61. This form indicated that 4 items of evidence secured for evidentiary praposes in captioned investigation are being maintained as bulky exhibits by the Memphis Office. This case is currently in a closed status in this office.

On 5/17/61, USA WARNER HODGES, Memphis, Tenn., advised SA JOSEPH A. CANALE that the possibility of prosecutive action against certain subjects of this investigation still exists. Mr. HODGES said in view of this he would suggest that the matter of disposal of the 4 items of evidence in question be taken up with the Department of Justice since question of whether additional prosecutive action will be taken will be made by the Department. It is noted that Mr. HODGES term as USA, WDT, will terminate on or about 6/1/61.

It is suggested the Bureau may desire to contact the Department as to the desired disposition of these 4 items of evidence. It will be noted that these 4 items relate to subjects LELAND CONNALLY DERRICK and VERNEY W. SEEBODE.
