

The National Council of Churches is now under the domination of a small group of professional one-world, idealist clergy, who may be termed liberal, or left wing, depending upon your own political philosophy. This group has taken it upon themselves to speak in the name of 40,000,000 Protestants and have, as a consequence, made the National Council one of the most potent political organizations in the country. Either directly or indirectly, through one of their many subdivisions, including denominational affiliated Social Action groups, they have taken actions such as those listed below, plus many more:

- 1. That the United States recognize Red China and admit Red China to the United Nations;
- 2. That the United States suspend atomic bomb testing, even on a unilaterial basis;
- 3. That the United States show greater willingness to let World Courts settle disputes;
- 4. That a purely national concept of security is wrong;

The control of the National/Council of Churches rests in two boards, the General Board and the General
Assembly, each composed of approximately two-thirds Clergy and one-third Laymen. At the time of organization in 1950, lay persons were represented by the National Lay Committee. The National Lay Committee
opposed the National Council pronouncements on political, social and economic matters but the General
Board refused to publish or publicize the Lay opposition. Finally, in order to atlence Lay opposition, the
General Board, on March 17, 1954, took action to dissolve the National Lay Committee as of June 30, 1955.
Since that date, with no effective opposition, the National Council, or affiliates listed, have taken the position
listed above on political matters. It is interesting to note that Dr. Eugene Carson Blake was President of the
National Council of Churches when the National Lay Committee headed by Mr. J. Howard Pew was refused an

Any Lay person who now dares to speak out against actions of N.C.C. is accused of making scurrilous attacks and being from the Ultra-Right (Communist term for one who opposes Communist Party plans - See Red Manifesto of December 5, 1960 (The New Drive Against the Anti-Communist Program" - July 11, 1961 U. S. Government printing office).

The Communist Party under the direction of Frank Wilkinson organized a nation-wide drive to abolish the House Committee on UnAmerican Activities. This drive reached its peak in January, 1963. One of the propaganda pieces that the Communist Party used was the full-page advertisement in the New York Times of February 22, 1962 urging that H.C.U.A. be abolished. This advertisement carries 610 signatures including many prominent Church leaders. While N.C.C. may take no official board action supporting this Communist objective, the fact remains that top N.C.C. leaders are themselves personally supporting the Communist objective. There is no likelihood that the National Council of Churches or the affiliated denominations will do anything to counter this drive on the part of the Communist Party. This indicates tacit approval.

Dr. Eugene Carson Blake led the demonstration in Baltimore directed against a privately-owned amuse-ment park in July 1963. He knew that he was breaking the law, yet he, a leading clergyman, encouraged this mass demonstration. Socialism requires the breakdown of property rights of the individual, as does Communism. Here is an example of the lengths to which N.C.C. leaders will go in order to bring about a socialistic, one-world, one church society.

Socialism and Communism have much in common. The leaders of the National Council of Churches have actively campaigned for every piece of Socialistic legislation that has passed the Congress since 1950 when N.C.C. came into being. They have in fact been the instigators of much of it.

The Church, as an organization, does not belong in politics. Only a lay revolt can get them out since the clergy has perfected an organization as stated above which assures the clergy complete control.







Perhaps you can assist me with a problem that I am deeply concerned with. I am f the Church Council of the of St. Louis, Missouri, which is a member of Missouri Synod of the United Church of Christ, which is, as I understand it, a member of the distional Council of Churches.

Our minister has approached us with a radical idea that seems wery questionable. He is peoposing that several of our young people discontinue attending church, although they would contimme to render financial support to the church, and meet in groups of six to twelve in the homes of members of these groups, without the direction of the ordained ministry of the church for the purpose of "trying to find our relationship to Christianity".


I have not with a number of accusations of this organization which I know is not true. It is to the effect that the National Council of Churches is a communistic organization.

Some press accounts have indicated that the National Council of Churches has recommended that China be admitted to the United Nations. These press accounts are false. On talking to Reverend James C. Moore today, he advised me that recently a conference of delegates of various Protestant churches affiliated with the National Council of Churches met in St. Louis. They discussed and considered many, many different religious and social issues and set forth a list of their findings and suggestions. Among them was:

"The Unlited States without prejudice to its own policy of diplomatic recognition sees its opposition to the secting of the Reoples Republic of China in the United Nations under conditions which take into account the Welfare, security, and future political status of Taiwan. Careful study should be given to recognizing diplomatic communications with Red China (Peoples Republic of China) and conditions under which diplomatic recognition might be appropriately extended."

Reverend Moore pointed out that all these findings and suggestions will be sent to the National Council of Churches for consideration. He said he sees no likelihood that the Board of the National Council of Churches would vote in favor of admitting Red China to the United Nations. He pointed out that the last time that such a suggestion was sent to the National Council of Churches as a result of a conference held it was voted down strongly. Another one of the findings of this recent conference was that the Christian churches of the United States should take every opportunity to establish contact with Christians in China. Still another finding was that every effort should be made to involve Red China in discrepance talks and to control nuclear weapons in the China area.

It is the wish of some in the church to withdraw from the American Baptist Convention in order to sever relations with the N.C.C. A vote will be taken in the near future. The main issue is the accusation of Communism in the N.C.C.

The booklet Hes The Methodist Church Gone Med?, by A. H. HeGregor, attributes the following statement to you: "Protestants everywhere should demand that their churches get out of the National Council, thus shutting off their money supply."

Ky question is, did you make the above statement? If so, do you still at this time recommend withdrawal from the Council, and upon what do you base your stand?

As Christians and loyal Americans we wish to make the proper decision. We would greatly value your advice in the matter.





Your letter of September 12nd, with enclosures, has been received.

The Communist Party in this country has attempted to infiltrate and subvert every segment of our society. The Party's efforts, however, are being thwarfed by the FBI's internal security programs, by investigation, arrest and prosecution of Party functionaries, and by wide-spread, intelligent public opposition to the communist philosophy. It is important that our citizens educate themselves concerning the true nature of this insidious philosophy in order that they will be able to resist its eroding influence. We should exhibit in positive ways the superiority of our form of government over any foreign ideology.



The Need for Understanding

PAUL encouraged his friends in Philippi to settle their arguments peacefully, to be understanding, patient, and loving. People in our time would see a big difference in human relations if they took Paul's advice seriously.

The high divorce rate illustrates one crucial area in which communication between persons seems to have broken down. When marriage partners let little problems go unsolved, they finally become big prob-

Misunderstanding also results when there is lack of communication between parents and children. Husband and wife, parents and children have to work at this matter of understanding.

Attle Leases for Adobs

Self-understanding is also important. Many of the anxieties and frustrations which come to us could be avoided, or lessened, if we could understand ourselves. Every Christian must earnestly seek to understand himself, his motives, and his reason for being.

The Need for Harmony

Philippiers 4:1-4

1 Therefore, my brethren dearly beloved and longed for, my joy and crown, so stand fast in the Lord, my dearly beloved.

2 I beseech Eu-o'-di-as [you-O-dee-us], and beseech Syn'-tyche [SIN-ti-kee], that they be of the same mind in the Lord.

3 And I entreat thee also, true yoke-fellow, help those women which laboured with me in the gospel, with Clement also, and with other my fellow-labourers, whose names are in the book of life.

4 Rejoice in the Lord alway: and again I say, Rejoice.

THE CHRISTIANS at Philippi, under Nero's rule, faced a situation that was much like the German Christians faced under Hitler.

Only those who "stand fast in the Lord" can bear up under the pressure of such dictators. We are called to stand fast today. The church's witness is weakened when the people in the church fail to cooperate and work together. United effort is a source of strength.

One such cooperative opportunity comes to Christian people through the National Council of Churches of

September 17—21

Christ in America. Thirty-one denominations work together through the council to carry the Christian witness around the world.

The preamble to the constitution of the National Council of Churches states the need for harmonious cooperation: "In the Providence of God, the time has come when it seems fitting more fully to manifest oneness in Jesus Christ as Divine Lord and Savior, by the creation of an inclusive cooperative agency of the Christian Churches of the United States..."

Christians in one church can cooperate more fully with Christians of other churches if they understand other Christian groups.

Many people are criticizing the church. Some of these critics are outside; others are inside the church. Let us examine some of their criticisms.

"You Christians sing, 'we are not divided, all one body we,' and yet there are over 250 denominations in America."

"I work for better social conditions in our community, but most of the opposition I face comes from church people."

"The churches in our town spend most of their time fighting each other. How can people say they worship the same God when they are not even willing to take communion together?"

Have you heard such criticisms? How can we bridge the gap that exists between what we profess to believe and what we do?

"Be of the same mind in the Lord" is the admonition that we find in Paul's Letter. What does this statement mean to you? Being "of the same mind in the Lord" means that we can disagree without being disagreeable, and we can have different ideas and still work together.

Do Not Be Anxions

Philippiane 4:5-7

5 Let your moderation be known unto all men. The Lord is at hand.

6 Be careful for nothing; but in every thing by prayer and supplication with thankagiving let your requests be made known unto God.

7 And the peace of God, which pesseth all understanding, shall keep your hearts and sainds through Christ Jesus.

THE REVISED STANDARD Version translates the phrase, "Be careful for nothing" as "have no anxiety about anything."

Some persons try to live in the past, present, and future all at the same time; and in so doing they make a great mistake. The sins and failures of yesterday crowd in upon our lives unless we seek and accept God's forgiveness.

We cannot live tomorrow any more than we can relive yesterday. Today is the only day we have. Learn to live well each today, and you will take care of both the past and future.

Paul felt that "the Lord is at hand."

Anxiety should not be confused with fear. Anxiety results when we are threatened by conscious or unconscious factors that produce a situation which we cannot solve.

How can a person avoid anxiety? It is easy to say, "Don't worry," but it is not always easy to keep from worrying. Paul said, "In everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known unto God" (Philippians 4:6). Why don't you substitute prayer for worry?

A Christian should not worry, but he should be concerned. Concern is a sign of love. The anxious spirits of men could be healed if they would accept Paul's counsel, "Let your requests be made known unto God." We are to ask in the spirit and attitude of Jesus. He prayed, "Not my will but thine be done."

God mas called us through the church to Christian witness and redemptive action in society. We are called to work at reconciliation.

Where there are wounds—we will seek to be the healing balm. We will try to bring understanding among persons. We do not build fences to separate men from men, and men from God. We are bridge builders, engaged in the task of bringing individuals and groups closer to each other in genuine understanding.

Mercy, kindness, humbleness of mind, meekness, and longsuffering are important Christian virtues. The goodness of the Christian life is not reflected in those who are hard and unkind.

The love of God in our hearts places upon us the demand to do good and seek the well-being of others. Persons grow in forbearance and patience as they learn to live with those who do not think just as they think.

How do you respond when your ideas and viewpoints are in conflict with another's ideas and viewpoints? As long as there can be dialogue (two-way communication) between those who have differences of opinion, there is hope.

The disciples came to Jesus with a question. "Lord, how often shall we forgive those who sin against us? Shall we forgive them seven times?"

They thought they were being unusually generous, but Jesus saw what his disciples were thinking. He told them there was no limit to forgiveness.

Men and women who harbor ill will and hatred in their hearts can never be free to grasp the greater realities of God. Only he who forgives is capable of receiving God's forgiveness. We learn to forgive by forgiving.

The Peace of God

Colossiens 3:15

15 And let the peace of God rule in your hearts, to the which also ye are called in one body; and be ye thankful.

Peace comes to those who love God. This is an inward peace which the world cannot give nor take away.

There are hate peddlers all over our nation today. Some of them even operate under the guise of religion. Dr. Tom Shipp, pastor of Lovers Lane Methodist Church in Dallas, tells of being in another part of the nation on a preaching mission. After the service, a man came by and invited him to dinner. The man said that he had made \$150,000 the previous year by producing and distributing pamphlets attacking the federal government, the United Nations, and the National Council of Churches.

Dr. Shipp felt that he had met the man before. Later he realized that it was in the Dallas jail that he had first seen the man.

Do not let yourself be taken in by those who peddle hate and suspicion. How much better it is to work for understanding.

Check for the Truth

All that glitters is not gold. All that you bear is not so. All that you read is not truth. Don't be afraid to check.

Printed, bound volume published years ago and purporting to set the date for the end of the world shortly after its publication. The writer quoted the Bible copiously and claimed that certain acts of Congress, the president, and the Roman Catholic Church proved we were in the last days.

It way have sounded plausible to some readers twenty-present ago when it was written—especially it one was against the political party and candidate the writer was identifying with anti-Carist. But fortunately the world did not accommodate the writer by coming to an abrupt end.

And the book today shows what it really was—the work of either a misguided zealot or a political charlatan. He was willing to smear a church, a president, and Congress to justify his prejudice and advance his candidate, party, and church. Unfortunately there have been many such mistaken zealots throughout history.

We are now witnessing attacks on great American leaders, on the government, on churches, and councils of churches. These attacks come in radio programs, magazines, and other printed material.

Sincere Christians have special need today to study their own Bibles—seeking the help and guidance of their church and pastor so they may know for themselves what the Bible especially the New Testament, really teaches and what the gospel really is.

Methodist Christians should never claim that their truth and that the tire minulible truth and that the Christians are beyond the pale! But they need to keep their eyes spen and search for the truth and all the propaganda of our day.

Here's a Check List to Hat?

All that glitters is not gold. All that you bear is not so. All that you read is not truth. In these days of cross fire between propaganda on the radical left and the radical right, don't be afraid to ask the following questions:

1. Who said it? Did he actually say it? Who published it? Missing name, address, or clear identification may mean the author is hiding. Ask yourself why.

2. Where is the proof? If a sensational charge is not documented by a known and respected authority, insist on seeing the evidence for yourself. The printing of an item in the Congressional Record is ROT

proof of its truth. Much that is in the Congressional Record is personal opinion, as anyone can see by examining a few issues.

3. Read "the fine print"; don't depend on headlines. Headlines are designed to get the attention of the reader, but they may also convey a totally misleading understanding of

what happened.

4. Note the data of a statement. Don't base your opinion on an out-of-date quotation. Great Americans have been maligned as communist dupes because during World War II they, along with President Rossevelt and General Eisenhower, supported cooperation with Russia, with whom we were allied against Germany.

5. Does it mean what it seems to

say? A key word or phrase left out at the beginning or end of a sentence or paragraph can reverse the whole meaning. By itself a single sentence or even an entire paragraph is often misleading. A quotation out of context can make anyone seem to say what he doesn't mean.

6. Watch for trick photography and misleading captions which can make a picture seem to be what it


7. Watch the organizations that you join, sign petitions for, or accept optnions from. Some organizations and publications are as phony as a three-dollar bill. The name that sound respectable and reputable; but it may cloak misguided heigh malicious slander, or propagailla for subversion of the left or the right.

On June 3, 1965 I wrote to you asking if you had written a letter of apology to the National National Council of Churches for some statements you had made about some of their literature. I received a letter from youdated June 10, 1965 stating very emphatically that you had never written such a letter.

Now, just last week a minister who recently moved to see old me that he received a photostatic copy of a letter written by you praising the National Council of Churches for the good work they were doing. Judging from your flat denial of the first letter, I certainly question your writing this second letter.

Since you did not write the first letter or make any statement, the only conclusion I can come to is that this letter over your signature was forgery.

This second letter that was mentioned to me, in my opinion could be forgery also. So I am asking you the straight question, did you write a letter to the National Council of Churches praising them for the good work they were doing?

They Council branded the book written by John Stormer, "None Dare Call It Treason" as deliberate misrepresentation; and Bishop Mueler president of the Council accused the Ind Indianapolis Star of misrepresentation in an editorial, Thursday, April 22, 1965 "Tax Exemption For Lobbyist" which really placed the Council of Churches on the side of the Communist and pushing for the same things the Communist and Daily worker stand for. The Star never made any retraction and stated that the Bishop had left several questions unanswered and given additiona' information about the Council.

If you care to check in to this nefarious scheme of sending out forged letters over your forged signature I will give you the names of the three ministers who gave me the information.

Dear Sir:-

I have been wanting to write this long while, and after much thought took this time to do so.

First of all the National Council of Churches. They blame them for being Communist inspired and I beleive it. As one of our Minister's said, -- "They are the James' brothers in disguise".

My husband and I are very sincere Christians. We read our Bible, live a prayer-ful life, and no one can fool us about Christianity. The reason I tell you this is that I belonged to a United Presbyterian Church, (old denomination that merged with the Presbyterians--, now called Presbyterian U. S. A.) for 17 years and my husband about 25 years. We noticed their leniency in letting members join. A good Christian Church has a stiff list of Bible questions to ask and Answer before joining Church. First of all, all the leaders should be Christians, and not everyone is a Christian, - then they can tell who they are taking in as members.

Most of the older denominations have become apostate, and liberal (gone to the world instead of spiritual), and individuals can come to their Church, one Sunday, and join the next Sunday, and don't tell me that news of this looseness don't get around. One of our ministers said it it is his belief that Communists have infiltrated many of our Nation's Churches, Seminaries and Divinity schools. In fact he told of a Communist defector's testimony before a Congressional Committee that the party felt the best way to destory religion in America is to infiltrate religion itself.

Has this not happened? Did they not get one thing accomplished by getting Bible reading and prayer out of Government schools? The National Council of Churche's endorsed this - and why would you think they would? Churches who profess Christianity? What's back of this? Well - back of it all, the leniency of allowing people to join their Churches. Anyone can join. They don't know really who they take in as members. All they boast of is how many members they have - not that they are Christians. Getting anyone in as members entitles the members to vote at their Congregational meetings. That way these people get at the head of the Church and if they are intelligent enough they can go to Presbyteries (their district meeting) get voted in, then to Synods, the National organization. This way they get to send recommendations to Congress, vote on all issues etc.

You can tell the trend of voting especially of the . Presbyterian Church U. S. A. The voting these days is everything, but Christian. Who gets at the head of these Churches? My husband and I as well as over 100 members left the U. P. Church. Good Christians, Mr. Hoover, are slowly going out.

Dr. Charles S. Poling, a strong bulwark of the United Presbyterian Church wrote a letter to the State clerk, Presbytry of Phoenix, and said, "Ia'm instructing you to erase my name from the roster of the Ministers of the Presbytry of Phoenix, of the United Presbyterian Church of U. S. A.

"I cannot he said give loyal support to a church that, through official action and pronouncements unites with the forces of evil and goes on record as opposing historic beliefs and doctrines that made us great and lent dignity and meaning to our preaching. I refer to the General Assembly's action relating to "public prayers, religious observances, religious holidays, Christian scenes, Bible reading in schools, and on school property; opposition to Sunday Closing laws." and other deliverances one would expect Atheistic groups to take, but never such action from a Church bearing the name and banner of our Lord and Saviour. I cannot longer find fellowship in a Church that blindly submits to the rule of Dr Eugene Carson Blake who seems dominated by an omnipotent complex, associates with listed known Communists, deliberately breaks the laws of a sovereign state, and leads marches that can inspire hate, and provoke violence. And I yield to no man in desire to see minority groups enjoying full and restricted blessings and opportunities my own race enjoys. When my Church becomes the captive to the ultra liberal and Apostate National Council of Churches, and the World Council and yields obedience to socialistic, political heirarchy, my Church' can no longer

claim my support and respect. I will not sin by remaining silent while my Presbytery considers becoming a member of the NAACP, a militant political organization. Our denomination's new media, all papers and magazines have been captured by the ultra liberals, and serve notice that there is no place in the U. P. Church U. S. A. for Conservatives.

Mr. Hoover you can tell now what the National Council of Churches is, but yet they can get anywhere in the Government under the guise of Christianity. A cloak - Wolves in sheeps clothing.

This good Christian man, Dr. Poling served that denomination nearly <u>fifty</u> years. He said that all those years they were "giants in the land, proud of their Church because they were accredited Ministers. They thundered God's truths. Today when we need the church at it's best, it is lost. He said that today there is a crushing hand of shame for his beloved Church, and great sadness in his heart.

Dr. Poling comes from a long line of Ministers.

What then, is in back of these Churches? And they are using the good Christians still in their denominations, who haven't left yet, for a front to do their dirty work.

A good Christian would never be for that Civil Rights Legislation. Our Saviour said, "Thou shalt love the Lord with all thy heart, and with all they soul etc." Love is something from the heart of man that expresses itself in deeds and words. The Civil Rights bill doesn't produce love, but hate, and bitterness. The idea that everyone in this Nation is a child of God, and there should be brotherhood of men is completely in error. It's not found in the Holy scriptures. A person has to accept Jesus Christ, and be born again to be a child of God, and if everyone in our Nation was, there wouldn't have to be Civil Rights Legislation. Everyone would treat others right. I can't see private property that God gives us, and that we are responsible for should be subject to federal regulation and intervention. giving the Government a responsibility over private property. The law of God as set forth by the Ten Commandments says we must seek to protect the individual and his encroachment attack, and destruction by Federal authority.

The true Church cannot help to restrict the liberty of all our people.

A spirit of lawlessness and even riot was stimulated in order to obtain Civil rights legislation, and true Christians waited in vain for President Johnson to discourage and denounce this fundamental assault upon Civil order itself. It should have merited his

stern repudiation. When lawlessness and mob action are used to induce legislation and intimidate legislators, the integrity of this Republic is under assault. Such acts of law violation are sin before God. As Christians we should respect the laws of the land. The Civil rights activity has not done this. And then he calls on the National Council of Churches for help. The President of the United States should have no authority inside the religious life of the Churches of this Nation.

We do not need federal legislation. What we all need is to be brought face to face with Almighty God.

Just recently columnist Doris O. Sanders of the Newberry S. C. Sun, reported on March 4, 1965, a controversy in which her Column has become involved with the National Council of Churches of Christ in the U. S. A.

The column she said brought reactions pro and con, but happily most of them "pro" the Column, not the NCC. People, she said is wakening up; and are beginning to ask their Ministers about this organization which claims to represent 40,000,000 Protestants.

"They can't explain the NCC study group, with the approval of the NCC president, urging recognition by this Country of Red China." The President is Bishop Reuben H Mueller.

"They can't explain the NCC issuing a document approving premarital sexual relations."

Mr. Hoover I have read pamphlets you have written to warn our young people, and just to think a church promotes this kind of thing. Don't Communist's try to break down moral?





Dear Mr. Hoover:

The new leisure and its implications challenges all thoughtful people in America. It is developing so fast it is difficult to assess the total impact on our life and culture even in specialized fields of interest and concern. In 1961 the National Council of Churches began a series of studies on the implications of leisure and the church. The first phase of this study produced the book entitled Religion and Leisure in America by Robert Lee, Director of the Center for Christian Social Ethics at San Francisco Theological Seminary.

One of the important conclusions of this study was the need for a task force to guide the churches in their response to the challenge of the new leisure. In this rapid social change there has been little interdisciplinary exchange on the nature of the situation in this new leisure in which man finds himself. There is need for a free interchange between laymen in several secular disciplines with church leaders who are also concerned with this opportunity. There has been almost no sharing of effective approaches to the new leisure. The church can serve a reconciling function as she brings together in conversation and action the leisure creators, leisure users and those who provide leisure services.

To assist the churches in this process the National Council of Churches has decided to create a Task Force on Leisure. This task force will be a small group of representatives from the secular community and the church to help the church plan a strategy for policy and action to meet the new challenge. Professor Paul Douglass, Director of the Center for Practical Politics at Rollins College and former President of American University in Washington, D.C., will be the chairman for this task force. Will you be a member of this special Task Force on Leisure?

The first meeting of the task force will be at the Center for Continuing Education at Princeton Theological Seminary, Princeton, New Jersey to begin at 4:00 p.m. on Sunday, October 24th and continue through the evening of Monday, October 25th. Prior to the meeting you will receive study materials produced thus far by the Mational Council of Churches and a brief survey of the present programs of the churches dealing with leisure.

Among the tasks within the broad concern of leisure the task force will guide the present program of the National Council of Churches and direct the 15 regional conferences on leisure now in process in the United States and Canada. It will consider the possibility of a national consultation on the church and leisure early in 1967. This task force will also give considerable impetus to an international consultation on leisure under the World Council of Churches in the fall of 1967 or early 1968.

Will you let me know if you will serve on this task force? The churches need to hear strong voices like yours to assess and plan their effective ministry and action in the new world of leisure.

I am an Elder in the First Presbyterian Church of and in our recent Elder's meetings, there has developed some rather bitter controversy over the possibility of our withdrawing our financial support of the National Council of Churches.

If the majority of the Elders take the attitude that this support should be withdrawn, because of some of the activities of the Mational Council of Churches are not approved of by the majority of the Elders, and since it is only a slight majority, there is going to be left among us some rather bitter feelings. This is very unfortunate in a religious organization.

Dear Mr. Hoover,

Recently, I have had an increasingly amount of concern with Communist activities in the United States. Of greatest concern is the part they may be playing in our church activities. Even though I have always respected our clergy, I cease to be amazed at their views concerning foreign policy and their approach to domest policies. Inasmuch as they are applying pressure on our government, I think its up to the laymen to find out if their feelings are based on moral issues alone or are being influence by outsiders and are being used for a cause. I resent the National Council of Churches saying they represent 40,000 000 Americans when they dont - the main reason being is of their views. I have read their resolutions and have studied their approch to the civil rights cause and their beliefs concerning our foreign policy. I detest the part they are making it a virtue to go to jail, avocate breaking laws when there is a lawful way of obtaining their goals. This is not of the true tradition of the church in bygone years. Is it not conceivable that someone is using our rich religious heritage as a cover to cause riots, discontent and resentment? Is it not possible that they are playing on the feelings of the average American to create bitterness and to cause a breakdown in the American spirit. Young ministers are obessed with the civil rights movement and nothing more - strange as it may seem, they have very little to offer.

Is it possible for you to advise me on the "status" of the National Council of Church, the old Federal Council of churches and their activities today. Your efforts would be highly appreciated. I have written to the National Council of Churches to obtain more information concerning their views; however, your office may have more detailed and unbias information.

The above-captioned clergynan has been known to me for a few years. He is a very serious young man, formerly with the United States Marines, and I have found him to be quite reliable. While in Washington, he dropped by to tell me that five times within the past few months, the Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King has tried to persuade the Mational Council of the Churches to sponsor some of his activities. Each time Reverend Moore told me the National Council refused arsolutely to give sponsorship to Dr. King. He said this would continue to be the policy of the Council.

I asked Reverend Moore about some of the press accounts referring to a resolution on Vietnam adopted by the National Council of Churches recommending that warfare cease in Vietnam. Reverend Moore said that he had a copy with him and would pass it on to me. He added that the extreme right-ring critics of the National Council had been making false charges concerning this resolution saying that the National Council was opposed to war against the communists and were advocating giving in to communist demands in Vietnam. Reverend Moore said this is completely false land pointed to the resolution given to me wherein it stated "the concern of the United States for the freedom and independence of all peoples." He also pointed to a key paragraph which reads to the effect that the National Council urged the United States Covernment "to negotiate a cease fire and a settlement of the war which will attempt to achieve the independence, freedom and selfdetermination of the people of South Victnam."

Adopted by the General Board February 25, 1965

Recognizing the concern of the United States for the freedom and independence or all peoples;

Admowledging our responsibility to the people of South Vietnam who have been depending upon our aid;

Expressing our distress at the continued violence, war, and loss of life of all the peoples involved;

Believing that mankind must learn to settle its disputes around the conference table rather than on the battlefield;

Welcoming the initiative taken by the Secretary General of the United Eations in the present crisis and sharing his conviction that, "only political and diplomatic methods of negotiation and discussion may find a peaceful solution" to the problem;

Conscious that there are many difficulties and dilemmas facing our country in negotiations for political settlement, but miniful also of the serious-news of prolonged military conflict, the danger of escalation of hostilities, and the possibility of a third World War.

The General Board of the Mational Council of Churches urges the United States Government:

To engage in persistent efforts to negotiate a cease fire and a settlement of the war which will attempt to achieve the independence, freedem and self- determination of the people of South Vietnam;

To utilize United Mations assistance in achieving a solution and in seeking to reduce the area of conflict by effective border control and insernal policing; and

To give told and creative leadership to a broad international development program for the MEKONG Region and to continue full scale U. S. economic and technical assistance where necessary.

The General Board pledges support and cooperation in the urgent tasks of reconciliation and reconstruction in Vietnam.

Your letter of March 31st has been received, and I want to thank you very much for your kind sentiments and expressions of confidence in this Bureau.

While I would certainly like to be of service to you, information contained in the files of the FEI must be meintained as confidential in accordance with regulations of the Department of Justice and is available for official use only. Therefore, I trust you will understand why I cannot furnish specific data along the lines you have mentioned. However, you might be interested in the estimates made by the communists themselves. In Fabruary, 1762, Party leader Gis Pall made a public statement to the effect that the "sinte-of-mind" membership of the Party might run as high as 100,000. During a press interview at St. Leuis, Massouri, in early 1964, he stated that the frequently published figure of 10,000 for total Communist Party membership in the United States was "quite accurate." According to Hall, there are in addition to this total number another 20,000 or 30,000 people who believe in communist leadership in certain areas of the political straggle. It is our estimate that for every hard-core communist, there are at least 10 sympathizers ready and willing to do the Party's work.

The Communist Party in this country has attempted to infiltrate and subvert every segment of our society. Its efforts are being threated by the FEL's internal security programs, by inventigation, alrest and presentation of Party Inneticopries and by widespread, intelligent public opposition to the communist philosophy. These achievements are being accomplished through orderly, legal procedures. In this respect I am enclosing some material outlining the Federal Government's action. Additional proceedings have taken place against the Communist Party under the Internal Security Act of 1950. On February 21, 1934, the Covernment's cetition was denied by the U.S. Court of Appeals and the Department of Justice then politioned the Supreme Court to review the lower court's prior decision. On June 8, 1884, the Supreme Court denied the Government's



- Has there ever been an investigation of Communist infiltration the National Council of Churches?
- 2. If there has, is there a figure available as to the number who may be members of this party, or of their fellow travelers?
- 3. Why have we not been able to enforce the Internal Security Act of 1950, which was to register Communists, their finances, etc., as other political organizations of this nation do?
- 4. A statement in the Pittsburgh Press, Saturday, March 27, mentioned the latter statement in regard to the future investigation of the KKK.
- 5. where can we secure information concerning the Reuther Memoranda to Mr. Kennedy, and has this ever been denied that he Mr. Reuther of his affiliation with the Communist party as has been publicised by some anti-Communist broadcasters?

I write this letter today following discussion with my pastor, the firmly defends the National Council of Churches. We had John Noble speak at our church last Tuesday, the 23rd, and this man's message, and seminar the following day have left some points to be cleared. Mr. Noble did not mention the NCC, but questions were asked, and he tactfully answered each of them.

It was a real privilege to have him with us. He spoke to more than 1500 high school students that day, in addition to about 450 at night.

will you also tell me what his (Noble's) affiliation is with the FBI? He mentioned some committee, but I have forgotten. I firmly believe all he related, and yet it is difficult to convince others. Education is the answer!



I have been the active head of a business for 30 years, and during that time have been before tax courts, bargained with labor unions, experienced strikes, dealt with customers, bankers, and had all the standard experiences of business managers. In addition, I am a veteran of World War II and served in the Pacific on an aircraft carrier. I have also been an active church member ail my life, and each of my grandfathers was a minister in the Christian Church.

"Out of this background, I can state to you without any qualification whatsoever that the leadership of the National Council of Churches understands in a very profound manner the fundamental conflict between Christianity and communism, and is one of the strongest contructive forces at work in this country against communism. If I thought that this statement was not in all respect true, I would certainly never have consented to serve as its president or be active in its work. I feel that the National Council of Churches is offering one of the most significant and constructive witness. es for Christianity in our society, and I am delighted to devote my time to its work, for I know of no better place to make my own Christian contribution."

The report concerns four or five young men who "went into action in March, 1933, when some people in Greenfield circulated misstatements about the National Council and the World Council of Churches." According to the article these men circulated factual statements to counter the misstatements. Quoting again; "Their efforts brought communications from J. Edgar Hoover and J. Irwin Miller, former president of the National Council, whose home and place of business is in Columbus." (Ind.).

A letter is printed concerning Mr. Miller's views but nothing concerning what your communication said was presented.

I would like to know what your communication said. I really feel that it is none of my business but there is the possibility that your prestige and honourable name has been "dropped" to cover for some propaganda.

I am just a bit curious about what your communication contained. The fact that your name was mentioned and absolutly nothing was presented as to your comments makes me wonder.
