





Thank you for your letter of September 30, regarding my request for information regarding possible communistic affiliation in connection with those documents I enclosed. I can readily understand why information contained in the files of the PBI must be kept confidential.

Is there any organization in the United States where one could obtain this information? I am particularly interested in possible communistic affiliation with Fact Magazine and the Methodist Council of Churches. I have a letter from my cousin who is a Free Methodist Evangelist who says that the National Council of Churches has had a communistic background for the last eight years, that she knows of. Following are the first and second paragraphs of her letter:

"I received your disturbed letter and was glad for it. I wish more of the layety in the Prest. and Meth. Churches would get disturbed. We are asleep at the switch and preachers haven't got the guts anymore to stand on their own two feet for Cod and the right-they would rather go with the crowd and mumble God is dead and the bible a mythe and let it go at that."



Dear Mr. Hoover:

Numerous members of our church are quite upset with regard to the National Council of Churches of which the Methodist Church is a denominational member. This feeling has been brought about by accurations being made against the National Council of Churches that its programs and policies are dominated by communists.

Many of our people have read such books as "None Dare Call It Treason" by John Stormer and "Collectivism In The Churches" by Edgar C. Bundy. Also I am enclosing, for your information, a copy of "The Truth About The National Council of Churches" by Peter R. Branton, First Presbyterian Church, Chattanooga, Tennessee. This publication is a reply to the one by the same title prepared by the Presbyterian Church U.S., 341 Ponce de Leon Ave., N.E., Atlanta, Georgia.

This situation is so tense in our church that several families have already pulled out to join another church not affiliated with the Matienal Council. Others are upset but yet need to have their minds put at ease by someone who knows.

Any statement you can give us with reference to the charge that the National Council of Churches is dominated by the Communists would be greatly appreciated.

Under this promising title, Probyection Survey. official positication of the Presbyterian Church, U.S., devoted fifteen pages of its December, 1964, issue to a one-sided defense of the National Council of Churches hereafter identified as NCC). Five of these pages hore the title, "The Charges and the Answers," The questions and answers were prepared by the Sub-committee on the National Council of the General Assembly's Commarine on Inter-Church Relations -- a committee dominated by those who favor our continued involvemeer with the NCC. It is apparent that many of the questions were adroitly phrased in a way that would enable them to be answered with a minimum of harm to the NCC. We have been informed that our Committee on Inter-Church Relations paid the Survey \$2,400, for publishing this "report."

The 1961 General Assembly adopted the recommendation of the Standing Committee on Presbyterian Survey --- "that the Board of Directors of Presbyterian Sizzes be requested, in case of controversial subjects, to give opportunity for the presentation of both sides. as is done in our church courts." (Page 69 Assembly Misores,) In line with this action we asked Dr. Felix B. Gear, Chairman of the Survey Board, to grant space for articles presenting our views. This request was denied. It is apparent that the Survey Board intends to ignore the expressed wish of the General Assembly and plans to use this official church publication to promote only their point of view which we sincerely believe does not reflect the opinion of the vast majority

of the members of our Church.

Therefore it becomes necessary for us to answer the questions raised, presenting the true facts as we see them. We quote each question, summarize briefly the answer given in the Survey "Special Report," followed by our answer. To avoid any feeling that we are quoting out of context we recommend that you send 10¢ to Presbyterion Survey, 341 Ponce de Leon Avenue, N.E., Atlanta, Georgia, for the reprint of their complete tejmet.

QUESTION: "What is the actual monetary support provided the National Council by the Presbyterian Church U.S.?

QUESTION: "Is the National Council of SURVEY ANSWER: No. It is not and never

OUR CONTENTION: The Surrey report attempted to prove its point by quoting a pronouncement of the NCC's General Board stating that the NCC "is and always has been unalterably opposed to Communism," by quoting a letter from J. Edgar Hoover saying that he had never made any datement criticizing the NCC, and by quoting a report of the Joint Committee on Ecomenical Relations of the Episcopal Church stating that they were not able to discover any fact or record that would support the charge that the NCC harbors Communist sympathizers.

The Subcommittee failed to report that Mr. Richard Arens, Staff Director of the House Committee on Un-American Activities, during a hearing on evidence of Communist activity in the religious field, testified as follows: "Thus far, of the leadership of the National Council of Churches of Christ in America we have found over 100 persons in leadership capacity with either Communist-from records or records of service to

Communist causes.

Many of the pronouncements of the NCC in recent years, placed side by side with the aunumeet objectives of the Communist Party in the U.S., leave little doubt in the minds of thinking persons that some NCC leaders who shape its policies and programs are sympathetic to the causes which the Communists advocate - recognition of Red China, unitatered di remament, abolishment of universal military training, suspending atomic testing, abandoning of military allian ex repeal of the McCarran Act restricting harnigrants, replacing the co-stalistic system with Socialism, agitation on behalf of convicted spies such as Morton Sobell, opposition to anti-commanist efforts as he as the tiba "Operation Lindition"

to mention only a few.

Rev. Edwin T. Dahlberg, president of NCC in 1959, was identified with the Citizens Committee for Harry Bridges a Communist front which sought to prevent Bridge ' deporation and his name was linked with "National Committee to Repeal the McCarran Act" (cited as a Communist front by both the House Committee on Un-American Activities and the Senate Sul-Committee on Internal Security. He signed the

infamous "Pacifist Pledge":

The NCC, unintentionally or not, has associated itself with persons who have not been above suspicion as far as Communist influence is concerned. If having its President identified with subversive organizations, and engaging in activities and making offerances that closely parallel those of the Communica conspiracy can be termed "being soft on Communism," then there is ample evidence to support the belief that Communist symmathizers have infilirated the NCC.

QUESTION: "Does the National Council of Churches maintain a Jobbying' office in Wash-

ington, D. C.?'

SURVEY ANSWER: (No "Yes" or "No" answer is given. The reply does state that I. A Washington Office of NCC does exist. 2. The purpose of that office being to "keep chur hes informed of pendiar brislation, etc."

We see nothing wrong in such lobbying if it is limited to legislation involving moral and spiritual issues. On such issues see think church organizations should make their voices heard. But we think it is wrong for the NCC to lobby for or against legislation which deals with national defence, disarmament, right-to-work laws and other purely political and economic matters. QUESTION: "Does the National Council of Churches claim to speak for forty million Chris-

tinas?"

SURVEY ANSWER: "It does not and it never has

OUR CONTENTION: This answer is a true answer to the question as it was phrased in the NGC has always denied that it speaks for its membership. If the question had been asked, "Does the NCC give the impression that it speaks for forty million Christians?" an honest answer would be an impulified. Yes, its pronouncements do teal the reader to believe that they represent the thinking of the members of its constituency!" When spokesmen of the NCC appear before Congressional committees in support of or opposition against legislation, they appear in their capacity as officials of a body representing a large segment of the Protestant community of America.

The Vestry Committee of St Mark's Episcopal Church of Shrevepout, Louisiana, which devoted ten months to a careful study of the NCC, says: "We have proved beyond a reasonable doubt that it (the NCC) has made a practice of speaking on behalf of all members of the 34 denominations comprising the NCC, when it is in fact not specifically authorized to do so. In this regard it has been descitful in that it actually did desire the impression to be made on the public that it spoke officially for the '39 million'.

The preaemeenents of the General Board of the NCC are presented to the churches and the public in a manner that often gives the impression that they represent the thinking of the 34 constituent communions and their 39 million members. Examples of this are so numerous and obvious that it seems superfluous to repeat even a few. H. wever,

NCC News Release No. 22 GA 3/14/61 "New York, March 11, 1961. The National Council of Churches today released the full text of an official policy statement on the question of Federal aid to education; issued as a pronouncement adopted by the Council's General Board, representative of the 34 Protestant and Eastern Orthodox Communions in the Council.

We find it interesting that the official Presbyterian U.S. representation to the General Board of the NCC the very people who "answered" these "charges" and say "It does not and it never has," felt called upon to request the NCC to "make clear its public statements" We refer to page 171. Minutes of the General Assembly. April 1961:

"The official representatives also recommended that the General Board, insetar as possible, make clear in its public statetments that the General Board was not speaking or acting in behalf of all Protestant denominations unless the demandration ease specific authorization."

QUESTI.. "Did the National Council of Churches sponsor an 'invasion' of Alis-issippi last summer by northern student valunteer;?

SURVEY ANSWER: "It did not."

OUR CONTENTION. The Survey report says, "The NCC did not sponsor COFO's Mississippi Sommer Project, did not recruit the student volunteers and had no control over COFO's pelicy strategy, rationale, or personnel." Then in the next paragraph it is stated, "The NCC undertook to provide training and runselling for the volunteers in an effort to safeguard their lives, prepare them for their clauserous tasks, offer spiritual guidance and provide legal assistance when needed.

The NCC spinished two-week-long orientation courses at Western College for Women, Oxford, Ohio, last June and recruited minister connecllors and lawyers to be with the students in Mississippi. The fact that the NCC may not have initiated the project seems beside the point. The NCC certainly aided and abetted the project. Moreover, the NCC continued its support of COFO after Martin Luther King's Southern Christian Leadership Conference and NAACP had withdrawn their support of some of COFO's local activities,

The question was, "Did the NCC sponsor an 'inva-sion' of Missicippi." The word "q-suror" is defined to mean "one who is responsible for a person or thing." It seems that the NCC took considerable responsibility when it recruited volunteers, conducted voter registration projects, provided training for volunteers, etc. It also seems a strange policy for the NCC to become so involved in a project which it "had no authority to encourage or restrait," and when it had "no control over COFO's policy, strategy, rationale, or personnel."

As we read the Surrey answer we wondered if the Sub-Committee raised and answered this question about the "summer project" to divert attention from the far more important "Missisippi Delto Project" that they dismissed with a brief statement in the last paragraph. This Delta Project for which the NGC and World Conneil seek to raise \$100,000, per year is a continuing project. It has the potential of causing far more trouble than last summer's limited effort. We have in our fit's a letter from the NCC which says, "The idea of a Mississippi Delta Project originated with the Division of Home Missions of the NCC." There is no question therefore that the NCC did originate this project, that the NCE beard approved it and that the NCC staff is doing its a most to promote it.

An interesting sidelight to this question is that one of the instructors at the NCC "spensored two-weeklong orientation courses for Summer Project volunteers at Western College for Women in Oxford, Okio, June 13-27, 1961" was Mr. Myles Horton, head of the mototions Highlander Folk School formerly of Menteagle, Tennesser.

. QUESTION: "Does the MCC advocate recognition of Red China?

SURVEY ANSWER: "No. . . . In its finding this conference spoke for itself only, not for the council."

OUR CONTENTION: An official body of the NCC, the "Fifth World Order Study Conference" beki in Cleveland, Ohio, Nevember 18-21, 1958, was called by the General Board of NCC; work papers for the Conference were prepared by the NGC's Department of International Affance and the results of the conference were published by the NCC. Page 13 of this report States, "The Fifth World Order Scade Contenue was planned by the National Council of Churches with the ----

Of the 8,000 ministers who responded to the poll, 87% opposed both admission of Red China to the United Nations and recognition by the United States.

It is disappointing to note that those who supplied the "answers" to these "charges" have, in stating "this conference spoke for itself only, not for the Council" followed the "escape clause" so often used by the NCC as it has failed to accept responsibility for actions and statements of its official bedies and personnel.

QUESTION: "Did the National Council of Churches copyright the Revised Standard Version of the Bible?"

SURVEY ANSWER: "Yes, it did . . . ."

OTR CONTENTION: This answer requires no comment.

QUESTION: "Is it true that the National Council is a clergy and church-agency dominated organization?"

SURVEY ANSWER: "So in terms of actual numbers of people involved, there are more clergymen and clunch agency people than laying it."

OUR CONTENTION: A study of the composition of the General Board of the NCC revealed that in 1966, 74.1% of the members of the General Board were ordained persons. The action of June 30, 1955, of the General Board of the NCC disbanding the National Lay Committee laid the foundation for the feeling that the General Board was determined to shut off the "lay voice."

QUESTION: "Has the National Council advocated 'free love' for young people?"

SURVEY ANSWER: "Emphatically, it has not."

OUR CONTENTION: This question was very adroitly phrased. If the question had been put "Has the National Council of Churches published a booklet in which young people were told that there is nothing actually wrong about extransarital sex relations" the answer would be "Emphatically it has."

Among the materials prepared by the NCC's Department of Youth Work for Youth Week in 1962 was a booklet entitled "Called to Responsible Freedom: The Meaning of Sex in the Christian Life." Its text was in the form of a heart-to-heart talk between a church leader and a teen-ager. At one point the church leader

says to the youth,

"Our culture declares that all sexual activity within marriage is leval, propert and good while any such activity outside marriage is illicit, sinful and wrong. This is to ignore the personal dimension of life, to seek to force exercise under one massive legal umbrella. You and I know perfectly well that there are many marriages that are simply matters of convenience, that such sex as new on in them is selfish, exploitative and evil. We know further that there is a small contact between unmarried couples that is motivated by love and which is pure and on measions beautiful." (The italies are outs.)

In another paragraph the youth is told:

"The crucial question to be asked about any sexual contact." Iron holding hands to complete intercourse

"In all individual sense, then, what justifies and soutities sexuality is not the external marital status of the higher before the law but rather what they feel toward each other in their hearts. Measured in such a way, holding hands can be very wrong indeed while intimate sex-play can be right and good."

It seems inconceivable that any responsible church organization should condene this brooklet encouraging young people to disobey the Commandment "Thou shalt not commit adultery," but the pamphlet hore on its cover the statement that it was published for the United Christian Youth Movement, National Council of Churches of Christ in the USA and it was enjoyighted by the NCC. It caused such a furor that it was withdrawn from circulation but the learn had been done.

We feel that the NCC must accept full responsibility for any publication that it (1) has written; (2) publishes; (3) holds the copyright; and (1) sells. We find it almost unbelievable that this Sub-Committee in answering these "charges" could defend this publication.

QUESTION: "Did the National Council publish a reading list which recommended obscene books?"

SURVEY ANSWER: "No. This false charge is frequently made with regard to a hibliography on The Negro American' prepared in 1957 by the council's Department of Racial and Cultural Relations. It was intended solely for the information of church leaders and students of Negro history. The list was a cross-section of available reading on the subject, presented without comment." (The underscoring is outs.)

Apparently, the person who wrote that answer has never seen the list. The list was classified. Books for Primary Children (pre-school and grades 1-3), Intermediates (grades 4-6), Juniors (grades 7-9), Seniors (grades 10-12) and Adults. The introduction to the list urges:

"Read for enjoyment and information. Read aloud to your children or put the books where they will be picked up. Make recommendations to your children's teachers and to librarians. Share your copy of this list with friends. Urge church, PTA and other organizations to circulate copies."

The "answer" also states that there are "no books on this list that have been declared obscene by any duly constituted and competent agency," and points out that the book Without Magnolius by Bucklin Moon was not banned from the mail. This is a poor define in that many publications that have not been banned from the mail or efficially "declared obscene" are in fact by most standards of common deemey, elected. The book that is defended in this "answer" contains some of the vilest language ever put in print and depicts an act of adultery between a Negro woman and a white man in such a manner that the act was actually condoned.

Affect S. Kramer, associate executive director of the Department of Racial and Cultural Relations of the NCC, states in the foreword that its compilers "have done an admirable piece of work." It says the list contains the names of books "about Newtons which are safe to recommend for children—safe hermer they quality at literature."

Thirty-four broks on this recommended list were written by Communists or authors identified with Communist-front organizations. Nine broks were written by Langston Hughes, identified as an active Communist a member of approximately 50 Communist-front organizations. He is the author of the puren "Goodbye Christ" which states in part;

Goodbye, Cari t Jesus, L. 1 Jehova Beat it on away from her Make was for a new at all A real guy named Marx, Communist, Lenin, Peasant, Stalin, Worker, Mo I said, ME.

The "answer" in the Narrey defends this poem by stating, "Moreover, Mr. Hughes binnelf contends that the poem is not intended to be sacrilegious." We would consider this a normal reaction for Langston Hughes and con't attempt to stone the point.

Another author was Victor Perlo. His Book "The Negro in Southern Agriculture" was published by the Communist Party's major printing firm. The Sonate Internal Security Sub-Comminee described Perlo as "an open propoganeist to: Soviet World compilacy." Perlo has been a fentified as a member of the first Communist cell established within the F.S. Government.

Herbert April Les who wrote one of the recommended books admiss that he is a Communist. He has I Communist for Communist activity. He was editor of "Political Attaics"—the Communist Party's official theoretical organ.

Wi E. B. Dullois, who authored several books on the list, was cited in 1949 for 29 Communist affiliations, and his name made to we as recently as January 4, 1965, as Mr. J. Edgar Hoover identified the "W. E. B. Dullois Clubs of America" as a "new national Marxist youth aganization" initiated by the Communist Party with accently of universal hapters on several of our college cumpuses. Dulloi had repeatedly attacked churches and alreyment and delibered the United States.

QUESTION: If charges levelled against the Patienal Council or Mone Date Call It Treason are false, why have they not been refuted?"


Last night at the Atlanta Biltmore Hotel Mrs. Julia Brown addressed 400 or 500 people. She says that for 9 months she was a member of the Communist party and for 9 years an under cover agent for the F.B.I.

She slurred upon Martin Luther King, claiming that she knows he is using Communist methods; she called the Supreme Court of the U. S. a "phoney Supreme Court." She says that the National Council of Churches is rotten to the core and that there are, in her judgment, more communists in the National Council of Churches than there are non-Communists. She says that she is a member of the John Birch Society. Have you not, Mr. Hoover, at sometime made a statement, or perhaps several statements, in which you have said that the National Council of Churches is not Communistic? Please send me a statement in which you say what the truth is about Communism being in the National Council of Churches. I am for the Methodist Church and I have difficulty in dealing with some of the people of my district who insist that The National Council of Churches is filled with Communists. You could help greatly with our church people if you could, and would, give us the facts.

Mrs. Brown says that there are many preachers who are Communists. Do you know of any Methodist preacher who has ever been proved to be a Communist? I know Bishop Oxnam was accused, and that other Methodist ministers have been accused, but I have never known of a minister of The Methodist Church being proved a Communist; I have never heard of a Minister of The Methodist Church being convicted of any Communistic activities. Please give me a statement about Methodist preachers and their membership in the Communist Party.

One great evil in our land is the tendency of some suspicious Americans to call a Communist any one who disagrees with them.

I shall greatly appreciate hearing from you, Sir, regarding these matters.

Dear Mr. Hoover.

Would you be kind enough to confirm or deny that you gave a communist clearance for Milton Mayer, of the National Council of Churches, to Dr. Kermit Long, formerly of Central Methodist Church in Phoenix?

In discussing a Dan Smoot report with a fellow member of a Methodist church here, in which Dan Smoot quoted Mayer as having said he was a communist, as were all members of society... this friend told me that at one time, when Milton Mayor was to speak at Central Methodist here, that Dr. Long had inquired of you about him.

You are reported to have sent a telegram saying: "Milton Mayer is not and has never been a communist, nor is he a fellow-traveler." Perhaps I don't understand the problem, but if you were willing to make that statement about me, I'd certainly call someone to task if they publicly accused me of being even a sympathizer, and my public stature is not that of Milton Mayor, regardless of his associations good, bad, or indifferent.

If you did in fact send such a report on him, I suppose I must LI then believe he chose to ignore what Dan Smoot said. I am however interested as well as plain curious to know if you really did send

such a report.

Much confusion reigns in the minds of Americans, as is, and it seems almost impossible to believe or disbelieve anyone anymore, on anything, which might smack of cynicism were it not for the fact that people of trust have betrayed the trust, and created so much of this feeling.

It seems to me, in the absence of real proof to the contrary, that if John Birchers are indeed "radical" and extreme" that at least the cause is one of dedication to fighting the evils of communism, whose ideas would certainly have the same label for wrong-doing.


If in fact, the National Council of Churches and its affiliates support communist front organizations, it would seem to me that as a member of a church who is a member of that Council, I should withdraw support, as one individual, at least.

# The Radical Right True Conservatism?

#### **Making History**

The "Radical Right" does not represent true conservatism. FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover has noted that Hitler and Mussolini were ardent opponents of Communism.

"However," titts well-known Presbyterian elder has observed, "it was by what they stood for-not against-that history has judged them."

Hoover's words were specifically directed against that group of militant anti-Communists which has been described as the "Radical Right." He asserted:~

"They are merely against Communism without being for any positive measures to eliminate the social, political, and economic frictions which the Communists are so advoit at exploiting."

#### Seeds of Suspicion

In the name of anti-Communism, the "Radical Right" continues to work dili-

gently to spread the seeds of suspicion against the most cherished institutions in our democratic society. That includes the church.

And the Communists appear to be delighted. One Soviet journal, for example, had this to say:

"Lenin said that the most ardent foes of Communism will eventually become frightened and suspicious of anybody who does not agree with them.

"In this manner these extremely nationalistic capitalists will actually work for the cause of Communism by eliminating some of the largest obstacles on the road toward a worldwide Communist way of life."

#### The "Radical Right" Advances

Yet the strength of the "Radical Right" continues to grow,

The United Presbyterian General Council has recognized that Presbyterian church members can be attracted to this movement. In 1962, it made this grave observation:

"With pseudoevangelistic fervor and misguided zeal, some church members seek to convert Christians—
not to a firmer allegiance
to Jesus Christ, but to a campaign
of anti-Communism based on
a distrust of our free
American institutions."

The observation continues, "In the name of preserving American freedom, they subvert it more effectively by their reckless attacks on the churches, and press and constitutional government, than the Communist conspiracy has been able to do."

What, then, is the attraction of the "Radical Right"?

#### **Our Festering Frustrations**

We live in an age of great frustration. On the international scene, there is the constant threat of Communist intrigue, the lingering cold war, and the ever-present danger of nuclear attack. And, here at home, we are faced with unemployment, spiraling taxes, a grave racial crisis, and scores of other complex domestic problems.

We Americans want simple, direct, quick solutions for such perplexing ques-

5

tions. But they simply do not exist and can't be produced.

Not so with the "Radical Right."

It assumes that there are always solutions at hand capable of forcing international victories and of resolving our social
problems. When such solutions are not
found, it attributes the failure to conspiracies led by evil men and their dupes.

Those who dare to disagree with the "Radical Right" are branded as liberals, pinks, eggheads, and fellow travelers—if not downright Communists.

Sincere Christians will not be deceived by such emotional condemnations if they are mindful of the true situation in which we live.

#### Negative Attack of the "Radical Right"

ONE—The "Radical Right" is always negative in its outlook. One Republican Senator, for example, has noted that this movement has no confidence in the inner strength of America, since it has no courage of its own. Moreover, he added, the "Radical Right" preaches a doctrine of hate, since it is shot through by its own fears.

The rampageous right sees Communist

intrigue at work in some of the strongest institutions dedicated to world peace and democracy—the United Nations, the United States Supreme Court, the Federal Reserve System, the traditionally conservative American press, and America's Foreign Aid program.~

Even the majority of the American people cannot be trusted because they elect the President and Congress, respect the courts, support the churches and schools, buy newspapers, and belong to labor unions.

No wonder that one Congressional leader has remarked that the "Radical Right" makes "common cause with anarchy."

It would be well for Christians who are attracted to this movement to remember that "God did not give us a spirit of timidity but a spirit of power and love and self-control." 1

#### Name-Calling

Two-Many right-wing leaders have hurled the charge of Communist sympathy at such men as Chief Justice Earl Warren of the U.S. Supreme Court; Allen Dulles, former director of the U.S. Central Intelligence Agency; and the late UN Secretary-General Dag Hammarskjöld.

One New England rightist has gone so far as to accuse President Eisenhower of being "a dedicated, conscious agent of the communist conspiracy." There is little wonder that many of his disciples dissociated themselves from so reckless a charge.

At the same time, it is useless for distinguished leaders to answer such patent lies because the "Radical Right" has little or no concern for the truth.

Notice, however, that most of these extremists are careful not to accuse a person categorically of being a Communist. They merely imply that he might be, thereby sidestepping charges of libel.

Happily, the majority of Americans are not deceived by such tactics. When, for example, a Bible-quoting rightist charged that a Colorado clergyman was "unfit to hold a pulpit" because he was a "fellow traveler," the highly respected Denver Post sprang to the minister's defense.

Attacking the "vileness" of the charge, The Post noted that the agitator "can hop a plane . . . and leave town," while the clergyman "must stay and attempt to live down the sparks of suspicion" that the unfounded allegation kindled.

It is incredible for a man who professes loyalty to the gospel of Jesus Christ to traffic in such slander. For Christians are called upon to put away falsehood and to speak the truth with their neighbors.

#### Action in Reverse

THREE—The "Radical Right" does irreparable damage to the conservative cause. Or, as Episcopal Bishop Horace Donegan once remarked:

"To call such programs which sow ill will and suspicion conservative is a misnomer. They endeavor to reverse our American tradition of democratic action to promote the general welfare, and in other ways to turn back the clock in defiance of our national history and experience."

Unlike the radical rightist, a true conservative seeks to promote national self-confidence, orderly growth, and the abolition of social tensions.

۵

Above all, he considers it his duty to spring to the defense of the Constitution and the Bill of Rights.

~"The church is for the conservative who would preserve the best of the ancient values. This means that the church will resist the radical left as much as it must resist the radical right," the Stated Clerk of the General Assembly of The United Presbyterian Church U.S.A. has observed. He goes on to say, "But it must resist every conservative who prates about ancient values as a smoke screen to protect his own selfish advantages."

#### Antidemocratic

FOUR—The "Radical Right" is also guilty of being antidemocratic, if not dictatorial, in structure and program. Its leaders believe that they alone have the wisdom to determine what is right. In fact, one self-appointed vigilante has gone so far as to declare: ~

"Democracy . . . in government or organization . . . is merely a deceptive phrase, a weapon of demagoguery and a perennial fraud." So it is that most right-wing groups are, controlled by one individual, or, at most, by a handful of power-hungry men. In many instances, there is no accounting of dues or contributions, and members have no voice in determining programs or in defining positions.

One of the great strengths of America lies in the fact that both liberals and conservatives are forced to defend their view-points on any given issue in the market-place of ideas. But the "Radical Right" insists that any deviation from its position is not only wrong but treasonous.

It would be well for those who clothe their bigotry in pious phrases to remember the injunction of Paul:

"I bid every one among you not to think of himself more highly than he ought to think, but to think with soler judgment, each according to the measure of faith which God has assigned him."

#### Communistic Techniques

FIVE—It is somewhat ironical that the "Radical Right" has even adopted many of the methods employed by the Communists themselves.

To show that it "means business," the

"Radical Right," like the Communists, often advocates formation of cell groups, infiltration of community and religious organizations, creation of local "front" groups, and implication of guilt by association.

In some cases, the "Radical Right" may actually aid the Communist conspiracy. For example, the Soviet Union seeks to control the United Nations by use of the veto. The "Radical Right," on the other hand, insist that the United States should withdraw from membership in the United Nations.~

If this happened, the Soviets could conceivably gain complete control of this international body.

Those who give more than lip service to their belief in the Bible will think twice before resorting to tactics that are less than Christian. For the most powerful forces are defeated "not by might, nor by power, but by my Spirit, says the Lord of hosts."

#### Tampering with the Gospel

six-However, one of the most disturbing aspects of the "Radical Right" in-

wolves its exploitation of the gospel to promote its own political, economic, and social schemes. Yet it would deny responsible church bodies the right to apply Christian principles to these same areas of human concern.

A classic example of this exploitation involves a Bible-quoting right-wing leader who once declared: "The business of the clergy is to preach the gospel and to change the inner life of man rather than to go off on economic, diplomatic, and political tangents."

Yet this same individual has charged that the State Department is Communist-ridden, that the Girl Scouts of America has published subversive propaganda, that the late John Foster Dulles was pro-Communist, and that even the United Church Women has been "collectivized."

All this from a man who insists the "business of the clergy is to preach the gospel and change the inner life of man"!

Countless other rightists pretend to "go back to the Bible" to promote dissension and find support for their own pet political theories.

For example, one "apostle of discord" cites Biblical "evidence" to support his

contention that there is a "solemn responsibility" resting upon the free world to strike the first nuclear attack.

Charles C. Parlin, a prominent Wall Street lawyer and a president of the World Council of Churches, has deplored such distortion and exploitation of the Scriptures. He has pointed out that these attacks are sometimes made under the misapprehension that the word "Protestant" stems from the English verb "protest."

"A little more research," says the well-known Methodist layman, "... would have produced the fact that the term 'Protestant' stems from the Latin pro testare—to testify for or be for something." Thus, in a true sense Jew and Christian—Roman Catholic, Orthodox, and Protestant—stand together. We are all for justice, truth, and freedom, "under God."

It has been in just such a positive spirit that the major church bodies have sought to apply the gospel to the social evils of the day.

"If voicing such a concern brings the church under attack, that is to be expected," says J. Irwin Miller, president of the National Council of Churches. "Jesus was sent to the cross because he persisted

in saying things that offended the custor a

This does not mean that Christians will always be in agreement regarding social, economic, and political matters. But it does mean that their common loyalty to Jesus Christ and to one another as members within his body will be more binding than their loyalties to party, class, or race. Christians are not followers of the "left" or the "right"—they are followers of "the way, and the truth, and the life." 5



The Mational Council of Churches, 475 Riverside Dr. New York 27, N.Y. is composed of some 80 Denominations, embracing over 40,000,000 church members. This Council, is reported to have a managerial personnel in excess of 600 persons, whose duties it is, to supervise and direct most, if not all, phases of church activities, both home and a broad. It reportedly, has gone afield of church deligated authority, and is actively injecting, money, prestige and influence into State and Mational affairs, and perhaps is engaged in other unwarranted activities, some of which, allegedly, has been secretive or possibly underhanded.

The foregoing assumptions, has aroused suspicion, in the minds of many church members in this area and perhaps throughout this Country, that some of the Councils activities, may have been motivated by communistic leaning by or in Council's personnel.

Recently, at an open meeting in this City, a representative of the Council, said that your distinguished service, had made a thorough check and investigation of Council's personnel and found no present nor past members of the MAY 27 1966 communist party.


Dear Hr. Hoover:

# Air Policemen Oust Negroes From Base

GREENVILLE. Miss. (UPI)—Air police have dragged a group of kicking, screaming, biting civil rights workers from a deactivated Air Force barracks where they were staging a "live-in."

The demonstration was for the purpose of oramatizing a plea for more federal aid for Negroes.

A force of 150 air policemen evicted the squatters and marched them outside the gate of Greenville Air Force Base after the demonstrators refused to leave.

The demonstrators then marched eight miles to the city of Greenville, where they said they would meet to decide future plans.

Maj. Gen. R. W. Puryear told the squatters he sympathized with their problems and would see that the correct authorities received their pleas for more food and aid for Mississippi Negroes.

But he said they could not remain in the empty building they took over after forcing their way onto the hase Monday. When they refused to leave, he sent in air police flown into the inactive base earlier in the day.

"Send the children out, at least," he asked. The demonstrators refused, and locked the door of the building where they had camped out for more than a day.

About 40 unarmed military policemen then left the detachment, crashed through the coor, and began to physically carry out the demonstrators.

Most were dragged out, kicking, cursing, screaming and spitting at the helmeted military policemen. Mure than a dozen men were bitten.

The air policemen were under strict orders to use only what force was necessary to evict the demonstrators.

The demonstrators called to Negro airmen to help them. The children with the group walked quietly out another door and joined the adults.

The airmen had carbines and bitly clubs nearby, but did not use them.

One of the demonstrators carried out was Art Thomas, director of the Delta Ministry Project of the National Council of Churches, who accused the pirmen of brutality.

Puryear, still and formal, told the demtenstrators they had to leave "for your own safety." He said the building had no toilet facilities and the stoves the demonstrators had brought were a fire hazard.

Isaac Foster, a worker for the Freedom Latur Union which has worked to organize Negro plantation workers, told Puryear he would have his answer later as to when the demonstrators would leave.

"I will give you 20 minutes," Puryear replied. He took a list of grievances from the demonstrators, and noted they gave their address as Greenville Air Force Base.

"This means you are not going to vacate?" he asked. Foster and this was true, Puryear then ordered the military policemen into action.

Greenville AFB, a 2,800-acre installation, was in the process of heing deactivated under the military's economy pengram. Only a small housekeeping force was on duty Monday when the demonstrators drave onto the base, disregarding orders to halt.
