It is anticipated that at the next meeting of the general Board February 19-22 in San Diego a policy statement on Police will be introduced. This will in all likelihood reflect the irresponsible emotional hysteria characteristic of NCCC's customary posture.

I should like to attend to mitigate the possible adverse effects on police morale, but find/am unable to budget for a cross-country trip.

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# A POLICY STATEMENT of the National Council of the Churches of Christ in the United States of America

#### FIREARMS CONTROL

## Adopted by the Ceneral Board September 15, 1967

Every year an appalling number of citizens of the United States are victims of gun murders, suicides and accidents. In comparison with other Western nations, it appears that too many of these casualties reflect overly permissive firearms policies. The nation has seen an alarming tendency for externists of all kinds to depend upon the ownership and use of firearms to determine the success of their respective causes.

The National Council of Churches realfirms its belief in the God-given "right to life" as fundamental and sacred. In an increasingly complex and urbanized society, it is not possible to protect life and maintain public order when indeviduals have unregulated access to firearms.

Therefore, the General Board of the National Council of Churches records its support for strong and adequate legislation regulating the sale, transportation, ownership and use of firearms. Such legislation at the federal level should sestrect the slipment and sale of firearms so as to eliminate anail-order sales to individual purchasers. It should also prohibit individual importation of all finearms with the exception of antique collectors items. In addition, federal statutes aimid limit purchases of pistols to those persons over 21 years of age and of rifles to those over 18. Firearms manufacturers and dealers should be required to pay adequate federal license fees and be of reputable character and without out or the sales of the sales

Both federal and state governments should enact measures or broader existing legislation which outlaw private possession and transportation of destructive devices such as inombs, fire bombs, baznokas, mortars, and auditark guns.

States should require a permit for the purchase, ownership, possession and use of firearms in order to complement federal action. Permit requirements ought to incorporate proper identification of applicant (by the fingerprint method if possible), and a waiting period prior to issuance so that an adequate check can be made of the prospective purchaser to verify such matters as age, absence of mental illness, and lack of a felony record.

The states should institute appropriate procedures for the registration of all firearms and their owners. Failing action on these matters by the states, the federal government should take suitable action.

Fetheral, state and local legislation should incorporate finearms policies which protect and sustain the public interest rather than the special interest of any private group or sector of society.

We are fully aware that firearms control legislation does not take the place of constructive measures to eliminate the causes of crime and social dis-organization. It does, however, represent a long overdue measure which might have prevented much tragic loss of life.

The June 1967 issue of "Four Lights" published by the United States Section, Women's International League for Peace and Freedom (WILPF), contains an article captioned "'Vietnam Summer' Is Plan to Reach Grass Roots, MARTIN LUTHER KING Heads Drive to Put 10,000 Workers into Field," which states in part as follows:

"Vietnam Summer is a call for 10.600 volunteers to spend the summer in 500 communities organizing and educating against the war. HALLINAN, Rabbi ABRAHAM HESCHEL and many others. The recommendation is to set up ad hoc committees in every community to 1) conduct draft education. 2) carry on a door to door educational campaign 3) call congressmen home for hearings on the Vietnam war 4) set up discussion groups in public places. Each community is to decide on plans adaptable to their specific areas.

"Teams of representatives of peace organizations visited key cities during the week of May 8 where they met with peace and other leaders to initiate ad hoc committees. JO GRAHAM participated in the Baltimore meeting and MILDRED SCOTT OLMSTED attended the meetings in Columbus, Ohio and Chicago. There will be training sessions for major leaders. There will be leaflets and other material. Also, we can and should use WILPE literature such as Peace in Vietnam and our latest flyer We Are Heading Toward World Destruction. 





A book I recently read was the report of the Vestry Countitee of St. Marks Episcopal Church in Shreveport, Louisiana. Their finding, in summation, state that it is an aid to the communist conspiracy because of their stands against right to work laws—in favor of seating Red China in the U.N.—for Medicare—increase foreign aid to Communist countrys, and abolition of the House Committee of Unamerican Activities. They also state the Board of the MCC speaks for 39 million protestants, who they do not truly represent.





Pages H5346-H5348. Congressman Rarick, (D) Louisiana, shoke concerning the involvement of ministers in various activities. He requeried to have printed in the Record an editorial from the April 29, 1967, Baton Rouge State Times entitled "Not The Voice of America" and an article entitled 'Is the NCC Really Soft on Communism?" written by David A. Nosbel and published in the Christian Crusader for January 1957. The article in the Crusader comments on the operation of the National Council of Churches (NCC) pointing out it is really two organizations in one. The General Board and Ceneral Assembly are composed of denominational representatives. The article states "It is, in fact, the full-time professional staff that comprises the 'hidden' NCC. These individuals form the bureaucratic and policy-making structure of the organization - - - . " This article makes reference to a pamphlet issued by "NCC Number Two" in connection with the motion picture "Operation Abolition The article points out that one is left with the impression that this pamphlet was actually endorsed by the General Board. "However, one page later we are tersely advised, 'The following material is not to be construed as reflecting the attitudes or position of the National Council of Churches of Christ in the U.S.A. " The pamphlet was distributed by "NCC Number Two." Mr. Noebel goes on to state "The actual disposition of the professional staff was revealed more fully when this writer wrote the NCC Office of Information and asked for material concerning Operation Aboliton. What should return but a malevolent article sent out by the National Council from the pro-Communist New York Post referring to the FBI Director as follows: 'The highest secular authority on matters of faith and morals in the U. S. is J. Edgar Hoover, horse player and

wrestling fan. '(New Yor!: Post, May 4, 1961)" Air. Noebel also stated 'Herbert A. Philbrick, former Fish agent within the Communist Party and still a top authority on the subject, related in a recent article how the Communists planned to make the World Council of Churches toe the Communist line." He quoted from an article by hir. Philbrick which appeared in the funchester Union Leader, May 18, 1965.

Dear Mr Hoover:

In reading some of your public expressions of concern I conclude that you are in the forefront of those in this country who are deeply concerned with the spiraling crime rate that is presently in progress. I feel that you are also vitally interested in doing what you can to slow down or stop this trend and are in a position to lend aid to others who are interested in such an effort and this is why I am writingou.

I am a member of the General Board of the National Council of Churches and am disturbed that this organization has not spoken out in this are: I am also disturbed that so much of the effort at correction of the problem seems to be concerned with more laws, more law enforcement, etc. and although these are all very well, it seems to me that somethin should be said about each individual's resposibility in this and how much of this crime can be stopped only by each individual's re-evaluation of his own moral posture and coming to a decision that sometimes "getting by" or "getting away with" something is an immoral, criminal act. I think that there are others who are better able to make decision about law enforcement but I think that it is certainly a duty and responsibility of the churches to speak out loud and clear on the moral side of the issue, especially to individuals.

Could you help me? I need any type of information that you feel would be helpful but most especially, I would think, information about the number of people who are convicted of income tax evasion, embezzlement, fraud, and those types of crime where the individual deliberately makes false statements for his own gain and does not usually consider this a criminal act in the more widely used sense of this term as armed robbery, for example. These acts are usually, I would think, of a solitary nature and involve only one person. The victim is a large institution or even our government and makes the act even more solitary because in this case the victim is not even an identifiable personality. I feel very strongly that this type of crime is doing much to speed the moral decay of this country.

I have not made any type of formal statement yet as I am still very much in the formulative stage. I would appreciate very much information such as I have mentioned or any that you feel would be helpful. If you have other ideas on this subject, I would be delighted to hear the stage.

My dear Mr. Hoover:

May I take a few moments of your valuable time to ask you some questions which are of great concern to me?

This area of concern to me is the National Council of Churches and what appears to me to be subversive Influences in Methodism and other denominations of the Protestant faith. There are many in my Church who would question the actions of the National Council in true Christian spirit, but so many others who would laugh about "witch hunting" and fanaticism have certainly detered them. What is most disturbing has been the public "Smearing" of any individual who will not be silenced without some reasonable explanation.

Recently the General Director of the Cleveland Council of Churches unleashed an attact on the American Council of Churches and a local Baptist Minister which was a far cry from Christian brotherhood and charity. Also, his views were published as "news" in the largest Cleveland newspaper. This method of smearing the people who question and not giving the answers lead one to suppose that the answers cannot be given. And in my opinion there are far to many Ministers who have been using this technique who are executive board members in the N.C.C.

I have read your excellant book "Masters of Deceit" and consider it to have been a fine credit to my knowledge. It was the Chapter on how to spot the Communist line that got me to wondering seriously about the N.C.C. Could you tell me if you, too, feel that there is a definate pattern developing? The part that is so terribly shocking to me is the consistency of all the recent pronouncements the N.C.C. has been issuing to the Press which I think are the current communist line.

Methodist Church of Shreveport, "Louisiana compiled a booklet entitled Chings fou Should know about Subversive Influences in Lethodism" According to this book let the Esthodist Church campaigned actively for 9 of 15 Communist Goals the Cardinal Mindssenty Foundation stated in 1961. This panel listed publications of the Methodist Church and other forms of activity the Church took supporting these nine Communist goals.


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

now describes Communism as a faith. <u>Dr. John C. Bennett, President of Union Theological Seminary in New York, the largest protestant theological seminary in the United States, in his book "Christianity and Communism Today" on page 185 states:</u>

"There is no other faith which can compare with Communism except Christianity."

This is in line with the teaching of <u>Dr. Harry F. Ward</u>, the Methodist minister and an identified communi who taught so many years at this same seminary and may explain <u>Dr. Bennett's</u> actions at the <u>Warld Council of Churches Canference</u> in Geneva, Switzerland in July, 1966.

The Communist publication The Worker, of July 31, 1966 gave front page coverage to resolutions passed at the meeting of The World Council of Churches condemning the policy of the United States Government in Vietnam. We are advised by those in attendance that <u>Dr. John C. Bennett</u> along with the <u>Communist Metropolitan Nikedim</u> assisted in writing the resolution of condemnation which has been used for propaganda purposes by the Communist Party on a world wide basis.

Triennial Convention of the National Council of Churches
Once again resolutions were passed at Miami, Florida by the church leaders condemning the policy of the own government and The Worker, the publication of the Communist Party U.S., gave it front page average with these headlines (issue of Dec. 13, 1966) - "National Church Body Rejects Johnson's Vietnam War Line".
Vice President Hubert Humphrey spoke at the convention only to hear the administration soundly condemned. Here pleaded for their support.

Communist Evaluation of Propaganda

"As Soviet power grows, there will be greater aversion to Communist parties everywhere. So we must practice the technique of withdrawal. Never appear in the foreground; let aur friends do the work. We must always remember that the sympathizer is generally worth more than a dozen militant communists. A university professor, who without being a Party member lends himself to the interests of the Soviet Union, is worth more than a hundred men with party cards." — Georgi Dimitrov, Lenin School of Political Warfare. See Congressional Record page 17719.

### Marxista es Have A Fertile Field From The National Council of Churches of Christ

Dr. Franklin H. Littell Speaks at N.C.C. Triennial Convention (Dec. 1-7, 1963)

Dr. Prenklis H. Littell has gone to considerable trouble to develope the theme that our founding fathers did not fe this country as a Christian nation. Dr. Littell is professor of history of Christianity at Chicago Theological Seminary when arcaident. Dr. Howard Schomer, is listed as a contributing editor of Christian Century magnaine. Dr. Schomer & group of prominent clergymen who sought the release from prison for Carl Braden and Frank Wilkinson. Both have been identified as communists yet Dr. Schomer in his appeal referred to them as: "Two distinguished protestant political prisoners."

The petition, for the release of these identified Communists, which Dr. Schomer presented to Attorney General Robert Kennedy carried 3000 signatures including many prominent N. C.C. affiliated elergymen — (See Christian Century 12/6/61)

Dr. Franklin H. Littell, a principal speaker at the Triennial Convention of the National Council of Churches of Christ, was one of the prominent N.C.C. clergymen whose activities came to light when the House Committee on Un-American Activities investigated communist activities in the New York area. The information reported below will be found on pages 2120 and 2121 "Investigation of Communist Activities in The New York City Area" released July 6, 1953.

While serving as a member of the executive committee of the Methodist Federation for Social Action in 1944 and 1945

Dr. Littell wrote an article for the official publication of this organization. (listed as subversive) entitled:

"A Cell In Every Church"

Dr. Littell was not referring to a prison cell in case N.G.C. defenders come up with the statement that this is taken out of context as will be noted from the following excerpts:

"The ethical concern grows out of the group. It is not the center which brought the group tagether in the first place. — The cell is a face-to-face group without turnover is membership. — This working unit in our time is usually called 'the cell', a term describing a living thing which subdivides and becomes a whole body.

"There are some progressive movements today which have rediscovered the importance of keeping the basic unit small if much is to happen. — Action is undertaken with a sense of discipline which can never be attained by one meeting called in enthusiasm for carrying out of some program. For social action, like the missionary outstretch of the group, is conceived as the carefully worked out plan of community purpose — a plan whose carrying power rests in the life of cell, rather than the scattered individual efforts of many well meaning people."

The following is the analysis from page 2121 of the report: "Mr. Littell, it is plain to see, is a strong advocate of secrecy, on the part of the cell, in the adoption of program leading to action. Why? Because the real motives behind the program is hidden. The tactic of secrecy is followed by Communist Cells in all movements infiltrated and in all front organizations. The Communist not only hide their identity but they never disclose the real reasons and objectives behind the movements they initiate on specific issues and the measures they support and the

"The Cell form of organization, made up of small disciplined group, bound by a common ideology, meeting in secret behind closed doors, is what Mr. Littell favors and which the leadership of the Methodist Federation for Social Action on dorses. What is the purpose? Their purpose is to seize control of the Church."

On October 15, 1963 a birthday party was held at Carnegie Hall to honor Dr. Harry P. Wayl, an identified Con munist, who wrote the "Social Creed" first used by both the Methodist Church and by the Federal Council of Churches, predecessor to the National Council of Churches. According to Tocsia - leading west coast Anti-Communist weekly, such notalles as Dr. John Bennett, Buhop James Baker, Bukop John Wetley Lord, Dr. John A. MacKay, Bishop Walter Mitchell, Bishop Edger A. Love, Rev. Henry Hitt Creve, Rev. Edward L. Peet, Dr. Ralph Sochmen and many, many others were among the sponsors. The Worker, Communist publication, of October 15, 1963, states:

"Dr. Ward is a link between the Christian Socialist preachers of the late 19th century, who sought to end the Churches neutrality in the class struggle (or subservience to the capitalists) and the pastors of the 20th century, who have joined in humanity's struggle for peace and a decest life of brotherhood. Many Christian ministers who cast their lat with mankind were impired and taught by Dr. Ward. He mobilized the Churches in support of the Unionists. He helped set up the American Civil Liberties Union in 1928, becoming its first chairman. He became a firm advocate of friendship with the Soviet Union. We are going to be at Carnegie Hall this Tuesday evening, October 15 to wish this grand man many more hirthdays. We (the Communists) are sere we will see you there." (Senere our Pub. 76 for a complete report on Dr. Harry F. Ward).

The National Council of Churches is indebted to this, identified Communist, for its Social Guspel according to testimony by Joseph Z. Kornseder. (See our Pub. No. 70). on October 15, 1963 honored a man described by an agency of our government as one of America's outstanding Communists. This fact was reported in the official publication of the Communist Party exactly as stated in;

### The Worker, Issue of July 23, 1963

"Seventy of the Nation's outstanding ministers and rabbis and lay religious leaders, and civil libertarian are sponsoring a meeting Oct. 15 to honor Dr. Harry F. Ward on his 90th birthday anniversary.

The meeting will be held in Carnegie Hall. Dr. Ward, a Methodist minister and teacher, first came to prominence in the early years of this century, as the exponent of what has become known as the Social Gospel' or the need to bring the ethical concepts of religion to bear in the everyday affairs of men and Namons.

The sponsor's list brings together many who have known and worked with Dr. Ward over the years, including the 100 year old Bishop Herbert Welch, who with Dr. Ward, was one of the founders of the Methodist Federation for Social Services in 1907. Besides Bishop Welch, 14 other Protestant bishops are sponsors; the heads or former heads of a number of the country's leading seminaries, together with a representation from their faculties; heads of religious organizations; editors of religious publications; ministers and rabbis; and others who have worked with Dr. Ward."

### Dr. Harry F. Ward

Born in Britain, Ward came to the U. S. at 17. He was a crony of Eugene Debs, founder of the U. S. Socialist Party and Wm. Z. Foster former head of the U. S. Communist Party. Word traveled to Russia in 1924 and 1931 where he studied Marx and Lenin. Teaming up with Wm. Z. Foster in a radio broadcast in Feb. 1946 he declared that Russia's slave labor camps were in reality nothing more than rehabilitation programs.

Former New York Communist leader, Joseph Z. Kornfeder, testified to the key role assigned to Dr. Word and the

Methodist Federation for Social Action which he founded, in spreading Communist doctrine in the United States.

Kerl Prussion, former F.B.I. counterspy reports that the Communist Party in Michigan tried to recruit him for the Protestant ministry while Prusnon was a student at Wayne University. The Communist Party advised that Dr. Harry F. Ward, a professor at Union Theological Seminary, would make all necessary entrance arrangements at the Seminary.

Joseph Kornfeder stated that he had reason to believe that Dr. Ward in 1924 conferred with Joseph Stalin who was very much interested in the living church approach better known as the "Social Gospel" of today as preached by most ministers affiliated with the National Council of Churches. Kornfeder further stated that there is a question as to whether Stalin learned from Dr. Ward or the other way around.

Joseph Kornfeder testified that the international representative of the Communist Party told him "to use Ward's

preachers" in an attempt to win control over workers in large industrial plants in Ohio.

Benjamin Gillow, former Communist vice presidential candidate testified that: The Comintern leaders were of the opinion that clergymen with Dr. Ward's point of view, using the clock of religion, could render service of inestimable value to the Communist Cause in China and to Soviet

interests." This man, Dr. Harry F. Werd, with a record of over 200 Communist front affiliations and citations listed by the House Committee on Un-American Activities, for over 30 years served as Chairman of the American Covil Laborties Union the same organization which has brought the legal action resulting in the Supreme Court decisions responsible for taking the Bible and prayer out of our public schools.

Dr. Harry F. Ward wrote the origional "Social Creed" of the Methodist Church. He undoubtedly has done more to subvert the Protestant Churches of America than any other individual. He is responsible for that apostasy known as the "Social Gaspel" in which Stalin himself took a personal interest because it offered a means of using the churches to further the Communist conspiracy. Dr. Harry F. Ward is listed in U.S. Senate Document 117 on page 95 as one of the most typical sponsors of Communist front organizations in the United States, yet on October 15, 1963 this man was honored by prominent clergymen and Seminary faculty members.

We unhesitantly state that the denominations affiliated with the National Council of Churches are well along the read to being servants of the Anti-Christ. I rank you first among the columnists I read,"

I carry that accolade as a service stripe, for it came from a commanding officer in the long battle for man's liberation. And beed his final injunction, his hest words to me: "Well. Joe, the biggest battles are still beore us so more power and goo ealth to you and yours. As always. . .

We predict that the year 1967 will be a year of secision. The rapid growth of the conservative and inti-communist movement has caused concern to the darxist-Socialist-atheist coalition with its network organizations and agents. The continued increase a the number of Americans learning the truth about ubversion in government, education and religion has esulted in a concentrated effort to halt this trend y an all-out assault on anti-communist organizaions and individuals. A stepped-up program is being arried out in every city and town to remove all opposition and the outcome of this drive will deternine the future policies of our government and, ndeed, the type of country in which we will live. These organizations and individuals dedicate themsolves to "fighting 'extremism' of the right and left," out actually they are only interested in fighting the right as they themselves are on the left.

A new organization dedicated to this highsounding ideal is the Institute for American Democracy, Inc. It was formed on November 18, 1966 and
represents a defacto coalition of anti-anti-communist
leaders, communist-fronters and some of the usual
lo-gooders. The national headquarters of this new
organization is at 1330 Massachussetts Ave., N.W.,
Washington, D.C. (telephone 202, 737-1226). At
their initial press interview, which was reported in
the N.Y. TIMES of November 19, 1966, their purpose
was described as follows: "A new organization took
but today after the radical right and the radical left
and said it intended to keep after them full time."

However, the chairman of the organization, Dr. Franklin H. Littell, was quoted as stating that the institute "grows out of the concern of informed Americans over extremist activity, particularly by organizations in the John Birch Society orbit." A check of the names of the forty-eight persons listed as members of the committee fails to reveal anyone who has ever shown any signs of "taking out after" extremists of the left. So it is not likely that the activities of this new group of "concerned" Americans will cause the communists and left-wingers any loss of sleep. We can also expect that the "orbit" of the John Birch Society will turn out to be a rather large one in the eyes of these "informed Americans."

Dr. Littell, according to the N.Y. TMES article, said the institute will produce educational materials "that would make clear the meaning of

democratic processes and the falsity of charges often made by extremists," and that the organization will demand "equal time" to answer broadcasts. Dr. Littell refused to name financial contributors because, he said, he did not want to subject them to abuse. However, he made it clear that the extent of the work of the organization will depend upon their budget which he evidently expects will be substantial since the organization has big plans for this "full time" job. Noting that Dr. Littell failed to mention any organizations "on the left," the TIMES article stated: "The emphasis in his remarks and in the literature released was on the John Birch Society and its associations."

The chairman of this new organization, whose purpose is really to destroy anti-communist and conservative organizations, is Dr. Franklin Hamlin Littell, a Methodist clergyman affiliated with the National Council of Churches. He is a graduate of Union Theological Seminary, an institution which has produced many of the leftist and social gospel clergymen ranging the theological wasteland today. Identified communist, Dr. Harry F. Ward (now deceased) taught at Union Theological Seminary for many years and his influence is very much in evidence.

Dr. Littell originally came from Syracuse, N.Y. where he was born in 1917. He has had a long career as an educator, working with young people. He wrote for the publication, "Social Questions," of the Methodist Federation for Social Action, a cited communist front. His writings were so radical that they received attention from the House Committee on Un-American Activities in their Investigation of Communist Activities in the New York City Area (July 7, 1953). In these hearings three articles by Franklin H. Littell, shown as the director of the Student Religious Association, Lane Hall, University of Michigan, were analyzed. The three articles form a series and are entitled "A Cell in Every Church," "Protestantism is a "Success," and "Formation of the Grosp."

"Mr. Littell's organizational proposals on the infiltration of religion follow closely the cell techniques on infiltration described in the thesis on organization of both the Communist Party and the Communist International.....In his second article.... his views put him in favor of planned economy and in the camp of the Communists who like to call themselves liberals....

.y a program "To carry out aggressively and For a system of to win support among church people planned economy and to build up opposition to the American economic system, Littell strongly advocates the cell concept of organization, developed by the Communists, as the most important element in the formation of the group...The driving force in the Methodist Federation for Social Action is the small cell that knows where it is going, that is disciplined and the driving force in the organization. The record will show that the cell in the federation consistently follows the Communist Party Line.....That Mr. Littell knows he is writing about the Communist concept of organization is clear from the following words of his article, A Cell in Every Church:

There are some progressive movements today which have rediscovered the importance of keeping

the basic unit small if much is to happen."

"The only so-called progressive movements that are consciously built on the cell concept of organization is the Communist Party, the Communist-front organizations and the trade unions and other organizations in which the Communist cells have gained control.....

"Mr. Littell, it is plain to see, is a strong advocate of secrecy, on the part of the cell, in the adoption of program leading to action. Why? Because the real motives behind the program can be hidden. The tactic of secrecy is followed by Communist cells in all movements infiltrated and in all front organizations. The Communists not only hide their identity but they never disclose the real reasons and objectives behind the movements they initiate on specific issues....

disciplined group, bound by a common ideology, meeting in secret behind closed doors, is what Mr. Littell favors and which the leadership of the Methodist Federation for Social Action endorses. What is their purpose? Their purpose is to seize control of the church."

This analysis of Dr. Littell's writings does not reveal him to be an enemy of "extremists of the left." Dr. Littell has been senior Protestant adviser to the United States High Commissioner in Germany, and is at present president of lows Wesleyan College.

Heading the list of committee members described as "Organization Leaders," we find <u>Dore Schary</u>. chairman of the Anti-Defamation League of B'nai B'rith, who has a published record of affiliation with communist-fronts. Another committee member with A.D.L. connections is <u>Samuel Dalsimer</u>, listed as vice chairman of Grey Advertising, Inc., New York. He is a member of the A.D.L. Executive Committee. The A.D.L. has been attacking and undermining conservatives and anti-communists for many years so these two men will undoubtedly be quite an asset to this new organization in its fight against "extremists of the right."

Immediately following Mr. Schary we find Morris
Abram, president of the American Jewish Committee.

Wf. Abram is also connected with the A.D.L. and is

on the staff of Jnited Nations. Abrams is the man who introded the draft resolution at the U.N. which could put discrimination complaints under the jurisdiction of a U.N. World Court. Also with the American Jewish Committee is Jacob Blaustein who is listed with the committee members from Business and Industry. He is shown as a director of Standard Oil Company of Indiana and a former member of the United States delegation to the United Nations. Mr. Blaustein is active in numerous international Jewish agencies and was a consultant at the formation of the U.N. in 1945.

From the National Council of Churches comes their deputy general secretary, Dr. David Hunter. Others active in the N.C.C. who are listed on the Institute for American Democracy committee are Bishop A. Raymond Grant, Dr. John H. Burt, Rev. Ray Gibbons and Dr. John Coleman Bennett.

Bishop Grant, president of the Methodist Board of Social Concerns, has been active in the Methodist Federation for Social Action (a cited communist-front) and was reported as signing a protest against the deportation of identified communist, Harry Bridges. Bishop Grant has several other communist-front affiliations according to published reports. Dr. Burt, Episcopal Bishop-elect of Ohio, is reported to have signed a legal brief filed with the U.S. Supreme Court on behalf of Rev. William Howard Melish, an identified communist.

Rev. Ray Gibbons, executive director of the United Church of Christ's Council for Christian Social Action, was reported as the signer of a letter to President Roosevelt in defense of the Communist Party. He was also the signer of a petition to Congress to eliminate the House Committee on Un-American Activities. It is understandable that he would want them eliminated as they have a record of his communist-front activities, including a DAILY WORK-ER (communist) article showing him as the signer of an appeal on behalf of an organization cited as communist and subversive in which they urge a militant foreign policy.

Rev. John C. Bennett, president of the Union Theological Seminary, is a member of the Council on Foreign Relations and has a long list of communist-front affiliations, according to published reports. Among these communist-front activities are the signing of petitions on behalf of convicted communists and atom spies, and attempts to eliminate the House Committee on Un-American Activities. Dr. Bennett has been vice chairman of the Liberal Parly and on the Executive Committee of the Fellowship of Socialist Christians.

From the Catholic Left we find Dr. George N. Shuster, assistant to the president of the University of Notre Dame; Rev. John B. Sheerin, C.S.P., editor of THE CATHOLIC WORLD; and Magr. Salvatore J. Adamo, executive editor of THE CATHOLIC STAR HERALD. Dr. Shuster is shown as a member of the Council on Foreign Relations and has four listings

of communist-front affiliations rep . by the Special Committee on Un-American Activities of the U.S. Congress. These had particular reference to organizations dealing with youth and which have been cited as communist and subversive.

Rev. John B. Sheerin is well known for his "liberal" viewpoint. He attacked the film "Operation Abolition" in his syndicated column without ever having seen it and is a strong supporter of the A.D.L. Msgr. Adamo has surfaced as a "liberal" Catholic and is aiding the campaign to smear the John Birch Society. In an editorial in his diocesan paper the society was called "a refuge for both hate and distortion."

Another "Organization Leader" listed on the committee of the Institute for American Democracy. Inc. is RoyWilkins, executive director of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People. Wilkins has long been active in the Fabian Socialist League for Industrial Democracy and has been shown to have affiliations with cited communist fronts, including one cited as the legal arm of the Communist Party. He has five listings in the Dies Committee Appendix IX alone. Another committee member who has long been associated with the NAACP is former U.S. Attorney General Francis Biddle. He has a long left-wing record, having been National Chairman of the Americans for Democratic Action (ADA) and a trustee of the 20th Century Fund of Boston and New York which finances Fabian Socialist activities.

From the Council on Foreign Relations, a sinister organization which promotes world government and influences U.S. government policy so strongly that it is called by many the "Invisible Government of the United States," and which has numbered among its members communists, Socialists, Soviet espionage agents, U.S. State Department officials. U.S. Presidents and top industrialists, we have Sen. Clifford P. Case of New Jersey, former President of the left-wing Fund for the Republic. Also from the CFR are Sen. Gale W. McGee, of Wyoming who has close ties with the A.D.L. and supports its policy of anti-anti-communism; George Cabot Lodge of Harvard University School of Business and Oscar De Lima, president of the Roger Smith Hotel Corporation.

From the left-wing labor hierarchy we have Walter P. Reuther, president of the United Auto Workers and vice president of the American Federation of Labor and Congress of Industrial Organizations, who has been using union funds to halt anticommunist and conservative activity and who was trained in the Soviet Union; James Patton, president emeritus of the Farmers Union, who has been active over the years in a variety of left-wing causes; and Jacob Potofsky, president of the Amalgamated Clothing Workers Union, who is a former Bolshevik and friend of many past Soviet leaders. He has been an official of the Pabian Socialist League for Industrial Democracy, a sponsor of the Socialist Rand School and the communistic Brookwood Labor College. To

sen fighting extremists of the picture any of the left is really quite amusing.

From the field of business, industry and finance the following have been recruited: C. E. Israel, vice president of Fashion Frocks; Edwin G. Halperin. chairman of the Blackstone Manufacturing Company. Chicago; Edward A. Ring, president of Circle P. Industries, Trenton, N.J.; E. A. Hayes, president of the Hawkeye National Investment Company; Asa Spauling, chairman of the board of the North Carolina Life Insurance Company.

Committee members with backgrounds in aducation are Dr. Irvamae Applegate, president of the National Education Association; Rev. Colman J. Barry, president of St. John's University, Collegeville, Minn., a strong advocate of ecumenism; Dr. William Haber, dean of the College of Literature, University of Michigan, Rumanian-born professor who held a number of government posts under the New Deal and who is on the Executive Committee of the American Jewish Committee; Dr. Kimball Wiles, dean of the College of Education, University of Florida; and Prof. Vernon Mickelson, department of organizational sciences. Case Institute of Technology. Cleveland.

Also on the committee of this new extremistfighting organization is Daniel Bell, professor of sociology at Columbia University. Bell (born Bolotsky) was a writer for the Socialist NEW LEADER, has been a consultant and board member of the Jewish Labor Committee, was on the board of the American Civil Liberties Union, and is the author of an antianti-communist book entitled, "The Radical Right."

Listed with those persons from the field of "Public Affairs" is Dr. Arthur Larson, former director of the United States Information Agency. He is a former professor and was Director of the World Rule of Law Center at Duke University Law School. He was formerly head of an organization with similar objectives and with some of the same personnel as the Institute for American Democracy, Inc., which was called the National Council for Civic Responsibility. Among those who have lent their names to both organizations are:

Dore Schary, Morris Abram, Bishop Grant, Leon Reyserling, Ralph McGill, Jacob Potofsky, Marion Folsom, Dr. John C. Bennett, Dr. William Haber, ames G. Patton and Roy Wilkins. The Council for Civic Responsibility was supposedly "non-political" but it just happened to be formed before the 1964 presidential elections and just happened to fold up

shortly after they were over.

From the writing and publishing field the Institute has secured Ralph McGill as did the Council for Civic Responsibility. McGill is publisher of The ATLANTA CONSTITUTION and is an ultra liberal who has usually been found in the ranks of the antianti-communists. Also on the committee of the Institute are Hodding Carter, publisher of the DELTA DEMOCRAT-TIMES, and Dr. Martin E. Marty, literary aditor of the CHRISTIAN CENTURY outher member of the committee is John Cogley. Teligious news aditor of the N.Y. TIMES, who is reportedly resigning that position to go with the Center for the Study of Democratic Institutions. He is a well known "liberal" Catholic and former editor of the left-wing magazine, COMMONWEAL. Harry Ashmore, director of the Center for the Study of Democratic Institutions, is a member of the committee of the Institute for American Democracy, Inc. and was also connected with the Council for Civic Responsibility.

Also from "Publishing and Arts" we find Louis Untermeyer, a poet and former poetry consultant to the Library of Congress. He was a review writer for the Socialist NEW REPUBLIC and is shown as saving signed a protest on behalf of the John Reed Tlubs, communist clubs named after John Reed who is now buried in a place of honor beneath the Kremlin wall. Many persons since identified as communists signed this protest which appeared in the N.Y. TIMES of May 19, 1930.

Other individuals associated with this new group are William B. Cate, executive secretary of the Greater Portland (Ore.) Council of Churches; Sen. Frank E. Moss of Utah; Marion B. Folsom, former Secretary of Health, Education and Welfare; Oscar Ewing, former Federal Security Administrator; Mrs. Norma Morrison, co-chairman of the Committee on Advancing the Democratic Process, Glenview, Ill.; Leon Keyserling, former chairman of the President's Council of Economic Advisers; Dr. Joseph F. Kerrins, consultant, New England Birch Watchers, Attleboro, Mass.; and Thurmond Arnold, Washington lawyer and former United States circuit judge. Executive secretary of the group is Charles R. Baker, a public relations man.

Thurmond Arnold has been affiliated with communist-fronts according to the official records of the Dies Committee. For several years he was assistant attorney general of the United States in the antitrust division which group was headed for a time by John Abt who has been identified as a communist and member of a Soviet intelligence group, according to sworn testimony. Leon Keyserling has been reported as stating that he agrees with all the principles of the Communist Party except that he would not agree on the necessity for a so-called "black belt" or Negro republic in the South. His wife, Mary Dublin Keyserling, was described as follows: "The evidence presented to the Board (Commerce Department's Loyalty Board) shows that Mrs. Mary Dublin Keyserling had been a member of the Communist Party and that she belonged to an unlimited number of Communist fronts." (Congressional Record, April 21, 1952, p. 4153.) Mrs. Keyserling is now a high official in the U.S. Government; she is Director of the Women's Bureau, U.S. Department of Labor.

In this complete list of the individuals comprising the committee of the Institute for American Democracy, Inc., supposedly formed to fight extremists on the right and on the left, there is not one single

person who has the open known to fight extremists of the left. There are many who are well known for their smears and harassment of patriotic Americans, known to left-wing liberals such as the persons comprising this group, as "right-wing extremists." The only extreme thing the John Birch Society and most organizations in its "ophit" do is to place loyalty to country over a one-world government. By exposing the activities of those who would betray their country's sovereignty to the power-seeking U.N. clique, they are upsetting some very well laid plans and this must be stopped before the American public becomes aware of where they are being led.

The conservative trend in the last elections has frightened the left-wingers and this new group, which is a coalition of leaders in many different fields (religious, industrial, civic) vows an "all-out drive" which can be aimed only at the conservatives as there is no one associated with it who has ever been a known conservative or anti-communist. There are, however, many who have supported communists and communist-fronts. In the usual manner of the liberal do-gooders, they have tried to cloak their organization with a semblance of respectability and moderation, with an avowed high purpose, but behind its respectable front this organization is just another well organized, well financed attack on conservative Americans who do not like what is taking place in their country and who are trying to do something about it.

Since 1967 will be a year of decision, conservatives must work harder to spread the truth about the plans and personnel of the World Conspiracy. The HERALD OF FREEDOM will be found in the ranks of the so-called radical right, taking out full time after the radicals of the left. 
#### Gentlemen:

Would it be within your province to send as information on the possible panetration of the Communist conspirusy with the churches and within the Rational Council of Churches in America?

Our reall local parish has some people who are concerned in this area and have and are eithdrawing church pledges because some of their support in going to the National Council of Churches. Since this will crushe budgetary problems and I feel should areate budgetary problems if true, we must have some factual information. I have read some of Nr. Hoover's factual information in books but I need it in a direct letter if you will.

I am sure you will understand the reason for this policy. I hope you will not infer either that we do or do not have material in our files relating to the National Council of Churches. You may be assured that I have never made any statement concerning this organization.




I would greatly appreciate any information you can give me on the following subject:
