The other statement is a quote from the Executive Secretary's desk of the Indiana Council of Churches. Dr. Grover L. Hartman; whose office is at lloo #. 42nd St. Indianapolis 46208. He quotes you as saying, "I want you to know that I have never made any statement criticising the Fedral Council of Churches or the National Council of Churches," He goes on to say that the F.B.I. has asserted, "These allegations have served to createthe impression among many Americans that the Protistant denominations in particular have been subjected to alarming infiltration and influence, but this is a patent falsehood. The truth is that the Communist party has not achieved any substantial success in exerting, domination, influence or control over America's Clergyment or religious institutions on a national scale."

Although they receive special raining for their work, when aving more education than is equired of an engineer or an countant, their wages do not measure up even to those of he high school dropout who seels as a mechanic.

Clergymen work long hours and take infrequent virations and, because their incomes have not kept pace with inflation, they have had to go into debt to keep going.

Because most ministers live n homes provided by their churches, they must think shoul finding a place to which to retire. They have children to educate, emergencies to worry shoul and retirement before them, but there is little or no hope of saving for any of those.

THE WIVES of many ministers work to help make ends meet. Quite a few ministers themselves take moonlighting jobs so they can afford to conlinue serving the church.

These are some of the facts uncovered in a survey of clergy incomes in 20 Protestant deanminations, ranging from the largest to some of the smallest The survey was conducted by i the Department of Ministry of The National Council of Churches under a grant from the Min-Islers Life and Cosually Union of Minneapolis Il covered salaries paid ministers in 1968 and provided figures to compare gith a similar study of 14 of the same church bodies made in 1967

Andrew Hobert, president of Ministers Life and Casualty ind chairman of the survey advisory committee, said the denominations are expected t use the data in efforts to encourage higher ministerial sal-

We are U.S. citizens, conservatives, and active locally in community affairs, but we can't get an evaluation of the two groups in question. Please help us if you can. Thank you.



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

My question is: is it even safe to sign anything by name to the N.C.C. under these circumstances? Will it do any good?



The Individual, the Family, the Church

No other foundation can anyone by than that which is laid, which is Jesus Christ. Let each man take care how he builds upon it.—I Corinthians 3:11, 10

No one can responsibly deny the crucial nature of our times. There are several systems of atomic annihilation already at hand. We are manufacturing pilotless planes to carry destruction by means of germ or chemical warfare. The small nations may soon possess atomic weapons with a high probability of their early use. In the meantime we suffer internal paralysis of will to cope effectively with our situation while all the time moral rot is eating away the foundations of our civilization.

We need the church to lead us toward spiritual renewal, but first the church must itself experience a new Pentecost. As early as Paul's time, as shown by First Corinthians 16, Pentecost was a day on the church calendar. Today we need to put it once more

at a foremost place not only in our church calendar but in our total lives. Pentecost transforms all of life. Emphasis on the Spirit in salvation and sanctification apart from man's total life in society and nature becomes false pietism. We can use our heritage to make holy history for today if we take with full seriousness God's invitation to spiritual renewal.

I

Through the Individual

Our text affirms that the foundation for such renewal is laid once for all in Jesus Christ, but that each person must continually take care how he builds on it. Spiritual renewal can come only as individual members of the church become renewed.

In our home where my wife is a Yankee and I am Swedish born there is a saying, "Don't be a Swede!" My wife, generalizing, I am sure, on too small a basis for judgment, has the idea that Swedes take things personally. Be that as it may, I want each of you to take your religion personally. You can join me in the blessed privilege, not of being Swedish, but of taking your Christian faith personally.

Augustine spoke of God as caring for all as though they were each one and as caring for each one as though 'he were all. Whitehead defined religion as what each individual does with his own solitariness. The Negro spiritual we all know: "It's me, it's me, O Lord, standing in the need of prayer." There is no divided responsibility in faith. Each person must take care how he builds on the one and only foundation; for spiritual renewal comes through him.

Will you, then, take trust personally? Will you stop trying to become good and let God remake you? Will you give the Holy Spirit a chance? Moralism kills the church. It quenches the Spirit. The early Methodists, for instance, feared "salvation by works" like the plague. To depend on works is to court self-righteousness and to block spiritual renewal.

Christ is the only foundation. We build in trust because of the grace of God. If the church is to experience renewal it must regain the vision and experience of God's grace. We used to sing:

Amazing gracel how sweet the sound That saved a wretch like me! I once was lost, but now am found, Was blind, but now I see.

Twas grace that taught my heart to fear, And grace my fears relieved; How precious did that grace appear The hour I first believed!

Whatever shortcomings John Newton's life had, in this hymn he has struck the bedrock of Christian experience: the grace of God in Christ.

When you take trust personally God changes your life by his grace, but more than that, you become a channel for spiritual renewal. This world is like a human body where all the cells are interrelated. Push the hypodermic needle in the arm and the bloodstream carries the toxin-antitoxin to heal the diphtheria throat. The whole world is related through God's presence in creation in such a way that every part is related to all the rest.

I should like to repeat Teilhard de Chardin's word of hope on this point, namely, that "immensity represents the action common to all atoms. The volume of each of them is the volume of the universe. The atom is no longer the microscopic, closed world we have imagined to ourselves. It is the infinitesimal center of the world itself."

So it is. The problem of affecting the world, therefore, is not a matter of time and space so much as the quality of the life we live.

What matters most is the kind of faith we have. When we open up heedlessly in full trust to the grace of God for spiritual renewal, there is no limit to what God can do through us to change the world. "God is able to make all grace to abound" not only to us but just as much through us for spiritual renewal.

Will you also take prayer personally? Stop saying prayers and begin to pray. Saying prayers is second-hand praying. When you pray your whole being relies on God and within that relationship the Holy Spirit

prompts your prayer. Prayer is the full acceptance of God's will. It is losing one's life to find it in God. It is creative passivity. It is finding the power to belong to true community and to live in line with our destiny.

Prayer is at the same time our identification with the whole world. It is our unreserved involvement in the world's problems and pains, its hopes and attainments for its inclusive and concrete good. Prayer is our participation in the world's life at its center where decisions are made and where the results must be met. The praying person becomes a link between God and man, God's channel through our freedom where his grace can flow into the world's fulfillment.

Prayer is basically our resting in God. God's rest stimulates the world's work. God's silence speaks potently in the midst of the world's shouting. God's quiet Spirit writes the most constraining letters. We have tried too long to live without prayer, to work without prayer, to rest without prayer. Prayer is the power of God's presence for the world in the midst of its turmoils, dissolving false tensions and creating constructive endeavor. Try prayer through trust. God will not fail you.

Will you also take witnessing personally? Try to witness by your own struggle and meet your own defeat. Try to witness by trusting and what you become will thunder God's presence. Christ claimed to be the truth. He linked truth with a way and a life.

Try walking in the way of trust and living within the reality of prayer and you will find that God's presence in you cannot be hid. Your heart will be full of God's presence and you cannot help both doing and speaking the truth.

Bishop James A. Pike has written a book, Doing the Truth. Truth is doing. But it is a matter of doing only if it is prompted by God's being in us. When God is in us our actions conform to Christian standards. Christian life is a matter of character but of character moved by concern. Christian "doing the truth" is conduct motivated by compassion. Doing Christ's truth is character in the service of community. Unless we live according to Christian principles we shall neither be nor do the truth, but Christian principles are love's directives in unlimited openness to the joys and sorrows of others.

When witnessing is first by being and then by doing, our saying also becomes genuine. Then our words stop being empty and false. Then our whole selves speak and our neighbors are truly addressed. The world has stopped listening because most speech is self-protective and self-promoting. The world's words center in the self no matter how much that self may then pretend interest in others.

When we speak in the words given by the Holy Spirit we speak in the demonstration of the authenticity that results from a full union of being, doing, and speaking the truth. Will you stop letting the

preacher be the only constant witness—and that all too often from a safe pulpit and hid behind cherical garb? Will you in the ordinary ways of life find a way of letting God witness through you, even through your failures, even through your stattering and stammering his truth?

Spiritual renewal can come only when an aroused laity will become God's constant medium for witnessing to the reality and relevance of the Gospel. The Gospel alone fully fits the world's needs.

Through the Family

Spiritual renewal must also come through the Christian family. Let each family see how it builds on the only foundation for spiritual renewal, even Jesus Christ, the Son of God's love. The family obviously cannot take the place of any person. In God's wisdom no person or group can take the place of anyone else. Salvation is both corporate and personal. But the family occupies a place of peculiar importance in God's dispensation, standing as it does between the individual person and the inclusive fellowship of the church. The family is God's intensive mode of community where the ultimate and the intimate meet.

The family is the world in miniature. In the family come together man's main concerns. The spiritual and the social, the economic and the political struc-

tures and functions of the family resemble, on a small scale, the problems of the world. The family is the testing ground for life in the large. Whoever can solve his problems genuinely within the family will seldom fail in the world. Whatever family can exhibit its overcoming of the world within itself can the most fully help that world.

Peculiarly enough, the family is a constant unity of human community. Its forms may vary but its intimate nature and function in human society remain the same. Man's general community in human history has changed from early tribal relations to modern man's consciousness of world responsibility. Wider and wider has grown the human community in history. But the family base has secured man's permanence of relationships. God has a special purpose for the family.

We are all born in a family and reared in a family. Our affections are colored for life within our family living. To change the world we must change the tamily. Without change at the center of life's beginning and growth there will be no effective change anywhere else. Our mothers are the most strategic people for letting God's new age come. Don't ever say, "I'm only a housewife." No, homemaker. No, much more, you are the mother of humanity.

For God to become real and for spiritual renewal to go deep we need parents who care enough for their children to put first things first. To live for God and the world in the family by living for each member of the family, and for the family as a community, is life's central task. The inner circle of human community is constantly the family. Change the family and we change the world. Win the family for Christ and the world will find him, too.

The family judges us most searchingly, but it is also the place where we can become the most effective. It is impossible to fool the family. You may be a hero to multitudes and looked down on by your own family. They may know you are sham. Or you may be a monster to countless people through false propaganda, while your own family who knows you loves and admires you. Will you become genuine in your spiritual renewal in the face of your family?

I remember attending the funeral of one of America's spiritual leaders. In the family car following the hearse an important guest was tactless enough to ask a teen-age daughter of the deceased whether her father at home was really such a saint as he was hailed. Without hesitation, in a painful hour of her life, she replied tenderly, "He was no more than average." Our children know us more deeply than our reputation, be it good or bad!

Over and over again I keep repeating to myself the saying reported to me of a sociologist to the effect that two or three genuinely committed people could change a church. Jesus said that where two or three are gathered in his name he himself will be in their midst. What cannot a family do if it becomes possessed through and through by the Holy Spirit! We cannot control the world. Can the family be persuaded to make completely central to its life this task of spiritual renewal? Will you take the spiritual dare and try changing your church by making it your priority as a family through trust, prayer, and witness?

God's judgment and God's grace can combine in your family to produce an inaugurated eschatology. By this I mean a fragment of the fulfilled future. God came in Christ to create a new community to the end of the world and to the end of time. He can do an unbelievable job in your family if you let him.

I feel myself both more judged and more rewarded by God's grace in the family than anywhere else. I am not worthy of the kind of family I have received. But one thing I know. If I had lived God's love more trustingly and more genuinely there is no limit to what God could have done in such a family as mine. More and more I acknowledge God's reality and increasingly at the same time I confess my own failure. Will you join me in making the priority of family life the spiritual renewal of the church?

Our concern is with spiritual renewal. The family must take its full part in this concern. It can do so only within the grace of God. Only the family trusting the grace of God can play its part in the renewal of the church. It must be a worshiping family. Family worship for me is high celebration. In the family in

which I was brought up the worship of God was central. My parents perhaps had many failings, but they never failed us in the seriousness with which they took family worship.

In our own experience as a family we have lived around the family altar. How good it is to start the day together singing great Christian hymns, reading the Bible together, and praying aloud, one and all, for God's will in the world and for the meeting of our own needs in God's way.

- Will you join us in building a family altar, and, if you have one, in putting more fuel on the fire? Begin where you are. Make a church in your own house. That is biblical. If you cannot all pray aloud, why not begin with using The Upper Room or some other daily devotional guide. Read and sing and pray as you can and as you grow.

If you make such family worship life's primary appointment you will find life in the family transformed by it. Of course, the children like to sleep on Saturday mornings or when they are home from school or college on vacation. If the prayers are real, however, they will rejoice in a family that thinks enough of its worship to get them up for it. Don't be inflexible, of course; prove sometimes that you are not legalistic about it. Don't let devotions degenerate to a duty. How you carry on such worship depends on you, but you can't help the family more than by making its worship central.

Worship together depends on the strength of your personal prayer life. You cannot rest your personal prayer life on that of the family. Will you learn to pray faithfully for the other members of the family? In prayer you enter imaginatively into their lives; you pray for grace to let them live their own lives in fellowship, you grope for ways of helping them without intruding in their lives.

What a difference such praying for the other members of the family makes! How significantly you enter into their lives. How willingly you let them alone to grow and learn when that is best for them. How the problems and projects of each becomes a family concern.

No one lives lonely any more. How easily all members of the family can share their joys in a circle of primary support and not of primary competition. The deepest drives of life can find discipline and direction within family living if each member is continually supported by common prayers and individual prayers in humble acceptance and concern for each and all.

The family can be an unparalleled gift from God. If the world passes you by or hurts you in your deepest longings, you are still buoyed up and steadled by family love. The Christian family lives for God's will in the whole world as it enters into God's love for his whole family of man. The local Christian family becomes part of the church family without boundaries,

and having turned toward God, it turns back by his grace to face with arms wide open the needs of the neighborhood and of the world. Family prayers range from God to all the world and down to the smallest immediate need.

What matters the most is where your treasure is. If your treasure is steadily God's longing for spiritual attainment for his whole world, your family life becomes lifted and led to that end. If you are to take your task of spiritual renewal with full seriousness, you must make decisive the spiritual renewal of your own family.

Will you let God renew his church and help to turn world history through your family? Don't keep the Father waiting. Bless him now by your firm and lasting decision.

Through the Church

But personal and family renewal are not enough. We are speaking of spiritual renewal in Christian terms. This means the renewal of God's people, of the church, of Christ's body. Spiritual renewal involves letting Christ be Lord. He must become the effective head of the church. Our aim is to renew the church of God and through it to offer the world a new chance for civilization.

When God renews his people he makes them see

what the true nature of the church is. The church is founded on Christ. Our text is plain: there is no other foundation on which to build. The only foundation is Christ and Christ is nothing less than God's presence on earth in human form. Christ is God incarnate. Christ is the Word made flesh.

The church is likewise God's presence on earth in the Christian community. The church is not primarily sociological but theological. It is not only God's work but his presence; it is not only his representative but his own dwelling among men. To be sure, the church does not have the same power over sin that Jesus did. How utterly far the church falls short of the glory of God! Christ was in Jesus pre-eminently and organically. But unless God is the head of the church there is no church, for Christ alone can be the head of the church, and Christ is God's presence on earth.

Jesus Christ by being God's holy love on earth founded the church. Jesus Christ by teaching God's unlimited, outgoing love founded the church. Jesus Christ by establishing a community within his love and through the power of the resurrection founded the church.

He gathered a human community, a group of followers, a band of wandering disciples, but nothing could withstand the community where all had the same care for one another and where the whole community preached the Gospel to the ends of the world. Jesus Christ is the head of the church because God's presence found power in him for the open, inclusive, concerned community. The Christian church is the community of God's ever-faithful love living for the whole world and to the end of earthly time.

The head of the church is Christ. In the body God works through the Holy Spirit. Christ is the unity of God's love above and for the church. The Holy Spirit is the diversity of God's love in the unity of the common body. Thus God comes into the church both through Christ the head and through the Holy Spirit, his corporate presence. The church was founded on Pentecost by the presence and power of the Holy Spirit. The disciples waited in Jerusalem for the return of their Lord. He came as head of the church to his body, the church, by the reality and work of the Holy Spirit.

The Holy Spirit guided the original church and made it grow. God gave the increase. Therefore the early church celebrated Pentecost. Neither Christmas nor Easter is mentioned as such in the New Testament. They came to be celebrated a good deal later, but already in First Corinthians 16, as we saw, Pentecost is mentioned as a date on the calendar. Please ponder this fact. Relive it.

We shall have no renewal of the church till we declare Christ to be Lord, but we can do so only in the power of the Holy Spirit. What is lacking today is the reality and power of the Holy Spirit. We shall not have spiritual renewal until we, too, wait in prayer

for our Lord. When he comes he will come with Pentecost, with his glorious power in the church testifying to the head of the church, the living Christ.

All talk about Christ is the mumbling of cliches until the Holy Spirit possess us and use us. Let us wait in trust for the Holy Spirit to create us a community of grace. Let us wait in trust for the Holy Spirit to empower us in life and teaching. Let the Word and Sacrament be no longer rites to dull the Spirit but celebrations of the living Christ within the presence and power of the Holy Spirit.

I have a concrete suggestion to this end. We must restore core-Christianity, through intimate life and worship in small groups. A peculiarly powerful historical case in hand is the original Methodist Class Meeting. The power of yesterday's church was the prayer meeting. It was the thermometer of the life of the church. But many modern changes in life have killed the prayer meeting. To some extent the death of the prayer meeting signifies the death of vital personal faith sufficiently general to sustain such an act of regular worship. From another angle our knowledge of psychology and our changed sociological conditions have caused the demise of the prayer meeting. Most of us believe it can hardly be revived for our churches in its original form.

Nevertheless we need the more intimate form and power of the faith. How can we get it? Some try study groups, some discussion groups, some social gatherings,

some prayer partners. The Methodist Class Meeting combined the need for small groups in worship, in prayer, in study, in discipline, and in confession. For a few glorious months I participated in such a group in England among Methodists with a Primitive Methodist background. In it I knew the warmth of intimate fellowship, the openness of confession, the seriousness of worship, and the diligence of study. I believe that the class meeting can be re-created to meet our modern conditions and that through it God can create both depth and intensity of spiritual renewal.

The church cannot be the church, however, without experiencing concern for the world. It is called to preach the Gospel to the world, to evangelize it. It is also called to teach the world the truth of Christ, to educate it. With equal insistence it is also called to be socially responsible.

The church is in, but not of, the world. Therefore it has light and leaven to offer the world. The church is not the world, but lives by the grace of God a new creation. As such it offers salt to the world. The church is called to preserve what is good, to illumine what is evil, and to change the world by the interpenetration of its healing presence.

Such responsibility for the world in all its social, economic, and political problems is not the heart of the Gospel but it belongs to the very heartbest of the Gospel. The heart of the Gospel is God's ever-faithful and inclusive love in Christ, but such love has no

meaning unless it expresses itself to those in need everywhere and of every kind.

In our world today the church that has nothing to offer a world in peril of immediate destruction has no Gospel. The church that does not care about God's creatures and creation itself is not Christian. The church without a Gospel for society is simply sham.

We must destroy war or war will destroy us. A new inclusive kind of community came in Christ. It is our only alternative to deterioration and destruction. Let the inclusive human society become inclusively concerned, using only such police power as is necessary within its inclusive community. We have war with us yet because the Church has failed its mission. It has falsely detached souls from society. It has isolated spirit from body.

We must work now for an inclusively effective world organization of power. We need world law and world rule. Militarism must die. It may not do so until we kill the spirit of capitalism, We need to destroy greed and corruption in politics. A start to that end is the use of property more inclusively both within our nation and to the ends of the world. What that will involve politically I do not know and care only secondarily. If we have the need of all the people and of the whole world on our Christian hearts, God will guide us into the proper working out of the problems of order.

We do not want atheistic Markism. It is becoming

a giant of power and of unimagined growth. What have we to offer? Atom bombs will not keep back an aroused humanity. Let us answer with creative concern to do away with oppressive militarism and exploitive property relations, and release the world's goods for the world's people in faith and freedom. We must kill war, the killer of mankind.

We must destroy racialism as well. We have made a beginning. A Methodist minister walks with a Catholic priest in New Orleans to proclaim the Gospel of brotherhood, risking his own little daughter to the hostile mobs that jeer at racial co-operation. The Gospel is big enough for the full job. I know no other power big enough for the task than God's love for the common good. Let the church itself wake up to the lateness of the hour. We face increased racial destructiveness or the dawn of racial acceptance.

In the neighborhood in which I live, a typical, comfortable upper middle-class neighborhood, four Negro families have recently moved in. I feel that our neighborhood is now more sacred because it is truly more human. Although the neighborhood is predominantly Christian, our two immediate neighbors are Jewish. Some apologize for the fact that our neighborhood "isn't what it used to be." A few racial "causists," of course, glory in it. We simply accept such cultural mixing as genuinely human, rejoicing only in the fact that we live together not only in peace but in friendship. No spiritual renewal can come

'until we are cleansed of prejudice and live normally the reality of the Gospel of God's love for all.

If we are to find spiritual renewal our whole lives as people must be involved. Too long have we lived according to secular values. We have felt and acted like the world. Spiritual renewal involves a dimension of genuineness in all human relations. We must dare to become fully and worthily human. The church is God's inclusive community of creative and co-operative concern.

The church is no moralistic in-group. It is no defensively group-centered organization. It does not live by comparing itself with other groups. It lives in the open grace of God for fullness of community and knows a human fulfillment that is real in personal, family, and community relationships.

We must get rid of conformity to the secular world. We must become transformed by the renewing of our minds within the perfect will of God for the world. Let there be less of the world in the church and there will be more of the church in the world.

As we dedicate ourselves to spiritual renewal, many voices will warn us not to go the whole way in our commitment. In Second Chronicles 18 there is the story of the false prophets versus the true. The false prophets were all conformists and conformers. They advised the king to do what was in his heart and God would be with him. The true prophet stood alone

demanding a drastic change of ways. The king followed the false. The false prophets were possessed with lying spirits to lead him astray. The true asked God for repentance and spiritual renewal.

Today, similarly, I can offer no hope for a safe future. All I can say is that if we repent and reform, God can use us beyond all thought for the salvation of the world. God is able to save.

In First Samuel 14 Jonathan is reported to face a hopeless situation, but he turned the tide because of his conviction that "nothing can hinder the Lord from saving by many or by few."

Do you remember how Aaron, in Numbers 16, when the plague was spreading in the camp, had to stand between the living and the dead until the plague stopped? Today we are in the same situation. We must withstand the plague of destruction by the power of spiritual renewal, trusting that God can save even by the few.

Once David numbered all the people for war, but he was not allowed to number the Levites, the servants of God. The reason for that, said the late Methodist Bishop William Alfred Quayle, was that God was not counting them but counting on them. God does not count you, but counts on you.

The church and the family need spiritual renewal. Until they are renewed the world cannot be changed toward the creative and co-operative community that will usher in God's new age. But you are the key to

the family and the church. I put the offer of God's presence and power right up to you. You can be used beyond your every imagination to renew the spirit of the church. Will you decide to put your whole life in God's hands to be used by him and will you persevere and grow in the power of the Holy Spirit? Right now we are fast heading for destruction. But with God's help we can turn about and face a new day.

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

Dear Mr. Hoover:

My wife is a member of an Episcopal Church and I have been supporting this Church. But we are now concerned about the direction that the Episcopal Church in general along with other Protestant denominations and the National Council of Churches are taking.

Churches in Cleveland and Chicago, and probably other cities, have been reported to be allowing their premises to be used to instruct our youth in draft dodging.

The Episcopal Church is raising \$200,000.00 for the Black Economic Development Council which is the James Foreman - Black Manifesto - group. Our recent Diocese of Ohio publication admits the money is actually going to these people and the B.E.D.C. itself claims it has been promised these funds. I have read the black Manifesto and find it to be full of Marxist ideology and violent revolution.

In Detroit, recently, the N.C.C. raised to its Presidency a lady who is reported to be a leader of "Peace" marches in Washington. If true, we now have someone claiming to speak for 42 million Protestants who has walked in parades organized by pro-Communists and where the Viet Cong flags were flying. I believe she has embarrassed the President and Government and has aided the enemy by helping to prolong the war.

Mrs. Wedel is probably not a Communist or eyen a Sympathizer, but can't it be assumed she is being used by them?

There are persons in the same contacting members of Christian Churches requesting and urging them to withhold funds from their local Churchebecause of their Denomination being a member in the National Council of Churches.

These position is based upon statements which say, in effect, that the NCC has been investigated and found Communistic by the Federal Bureau of Investigation; and that the NCC has been brought to trial in Louisiana and found to be Communist.

If my information is correct, I would be most grateful to have a statement from you stating the position of the F.B.I. regarding the ECC.






