It was desired by Assistant United States Attorney, BACON, that the Bureau obtain a copy of the magazine and the original, if possible, of the photograph. He stated that the picture was very important as it shows a cast over one eye and that identified ANNA M. ROSENBERG by the photograph. Mr. BACON suggested that the Bureau may have a copy of the photograph in its files.

It was requested by Assistant United States Attorney, BACON, that this inquiry be expedited without delay in order that his office may proceed with the presentation of this case before the present Federal Grand Jury not sitting in Washington, D.C.

Mr. BACON advised that this request would be confirmed in a letter to the Special Agent in Charge, Washington Field Office.

A copy of this letter is being designated for the New York Division, in the event investigation is authorized by the Bureau.

No investigation will be conducted until and unless advised by the Bureau.

Dear Russ:

Here are the photostats, together with a memorandum on the Communist organizations with which A. R. has, according to public records, been affiliated.

On the question of whether or not the A. R. of these documents in the A. R., I can report that there is not the slightest doubt. I have made exhaustive inquiries and investigations, as a result of which I have established beyond any possibility of dispute that there has been only one Anna Rosenberg sufficiently known in public life to be listed with the well-known names on these documents, and that there has not been any other Anna Rosenberg of comparable fame, stature, notoriety, or what-have-you during the past 25 years. One of my sources is the Jewish organization which knows about these things.

Ben Mandel tells me that he told you that Anna Rosenberg is a name like John Smith. My comment on that is "nuts!"

Furthermore, in the files of the FBI there is a report on A. R. which is literally startling, but, of course, I could not substantiate it.

Dear Mr. Freedman:

You recall when you first brought your proposal to us, that we supply you with certain mailing lists, we tried to dissuade you from continuing with the project, because we felt at the time it was not in the public interest.

You presented certain arguments to bolster your contention that you had been unfairly treated by certain groups and publications in the country and in fairness to you, I was willing to hold in abeyance any decision on our part until you could supply me with some substantial proof in connection with your contentions, that you were being made the victim of vilification and abuse.

When you turned over the proof of the publication you contemplate mailing to the community leaders, the list of which we were to provide, I read it carefully and after a careful analysis I find that the material does not jive with the public record of the hearings held by the Armed Services Committee.

I have known of Mrs. Rosenberg's career for the better part of two decades and I have heard people speak of her only in the most praiseworthy way. She has, during these years, enjoyed the respect and affection of both labor and management and it is interesting to know that she has managed to maintain her blue chip clients thru the years.

I have reached the very definite conclusion that in view of the critical world situation, no one should do anything to weaken confidence in our government leaders particularly one holding a responsible position in our military establishment.

It is more in sorrow than in anger that I have to reflect at my futile efforts in trying to persuade you that the community is not trying to injure you or your family - on the contrary, I think that your persistent attitude in not following the public trend of thinking is doing irreparable harm to your child.

I know that you can purchase mailing lists from a score of other sources, but again I ask you to pause and consider the consequences of keeping alive an issue that received a very public airing and investigation by the finest minds in the legislative branch of our government and I think that it will





You are advised that, on February 6, 1951, HAROLD H. BACON, Assistant United States Attorney, telephonically advised that United States Attorney GEORGE MORRIS FAY had assigned to him the study of this case and its presentation for possible prosecution. He was advised that an Agent would contact him at 9:30 AM - February 7, 1951 - for further details, but that no investigation would be conducted unless cleared by the Bureau.

On February 7, 1951, Special Agent EDWARD J. ARMBRUSTER contacted AUSA BACON, who advised that the United States Attorney desired a limited investigation in connection with the possibility that Perjury may have been committed by and BENJAMIN H. It is believed that the New York Office of the FBI has additional information on the activities of BENJAMIN H. FREEDMAN.

- Mr. BACON stated that he would like to know whether the FBI had a file on and BENJAMIN H. FREEDMAN. If so, he would like to examine this file for any pertinent information concerning these individuals.
- 4) Mr. BACON stated that he would like to know whether FBI Agents ever talked with one WALT CARMEN, and, if so, what type of information was obtained from CARMEN.

If CARMEN has not been contacted, it was not desired that he be interviewed at this time, but that his present address be ascertained so that the United States Attorney could subpoena him as a possible witness before the Grand Jury.

Mr. BACON advised that CARMEN was mentioned by one "OAK" - a former Officer in the JOHN REED CLUB, and is mentioned in some of the FBI'S Reports - dates unknown.

He desired to know whether the FBI has an independent file on Freedman, Walt Carmen (a former John Reed Club member. according to , Sam Fastman (also known as Sam Fox, who said was a Communist Party member and a John Reed Club member and who allegedly told about the destruction of John Reed Club records to protect persons gaining prominence), and the John Reed Club. If so, he would like to see them.
- 4. That the present addresses of Carmen and Fastman be ascertained so they might be subpoensed. Interviews with these persons were not desired.

 5. That Drew Pearson be interviewed to obtain a purported copy of a letter in his possession from Gerald L. K. Smith to Benjamin H. Freedman. Also, to obtain information allegedly in his possession concerning the identity of a bellboy at the Congressional Hotel who allegedly would state that he had on numerous occasions taken Edward Nellor to the room of Smith on or before December 5, 1950.
- 6. That oral requests for additional investigation be permitted. Written confirmation of such requests to be subsequently submitted.
- The Bureau indices reflect no pertinent independent file on Freedman, Fastman, or the John Reed Club. Neither Fastman nor Carmen were interviewed in instant investigation. Background information concerning each of the above is set forth in the reports concerning Rosenberg that have been made available to Fay and this should suffice in the absence of an additional request. Carmen appears identical with Bureau file 100-189899 pertaining to Walt Carmon and is presently the subject of an SI card in New York City. His last known residence was 240 East 13th Street, New York City.

OBSERVATIONS:

In addition to this situation involving an alleged perjury violation, it appears that it also involves (1) a political squabble; (2) a controversy between the Anti-Defamation League and other similar organizations and the Arab League and anti-semitic organizations; (3) a personal feud between Drew Pearson and Fulton Lewis, Jr.

MEMORANDUM TO MR. LADD

RECOMMENDATIONS:

That the attached teletype to New York City and Washington Field be approved authorizing the requested investigation and instructing the Washington Field Office to request the United States Attorney to continue to submit any requests for additional investigation in writing stating specifically what is desired. This will forestall criticism of the Bureau for conducting a fishing expedition and will also allow a more sensible and logical investigation. It is not believed advisable to allow the United States Attorney to review our file on Carmon, and New York has been instructed in the attached teletype to set forth a summary concerning Carmon's Communist Party affiliation in their forthcoming report along with his current address. Unless advised to the contrary, copies of the reports in this matter will be furnished United States Attorney Fay's Office directly by the Bureau. The United States Attorney's Office will also be advised upon transmittal of these reports that the Bureau has no available independent files as requested in Item 3 above.

At approximately 4:10 PM today (2/13/51) SA(A) Edward J. Armbrewster of the WFO telephonically advised Mr. G. C. Callan that Assistant United States Attorney Harold H. Bacon had just requested that the interview with Drew Pearson be held in abeyance in view of the fact that a representative of Pearson's Office was going to confer with Irving Shapiro of the Criminal Division of the Department, who is aiding the United States Attorney's Office in the presentation of this perjury case before the Federal Grand Jury in Washington, D. C. Mr. Bacon advised that all of the information in Pearson's possession would probably be furnished directly to Shapiro's Office and that in the absence of a further request no contact on the part of the FBI with Pearson regarding this case was necessary.



Attorney had indicated he desired to have appear before the Grand Jury and to also ascertain when they were wanted. He was advised to tellighted the Assistant U. S. "After a lapse of some time, I met said Freedman in the lobby of the Ritz Carlton Motel, this eity, and he teld me he had been thinking about me and that he would like to come in and discuss some mailing list requirements that he may have in connection with a proposed microfilm venture. This encounter took place in the early part of December 1950, the exact day or date unknown.

"Some days later Mr. Freedman called at the office of the above corporation and stated that he was about ready to order some lists for this enterprise, but he had a reservation to the effect that he could not place the order, at that moment, but would come in a few days later with the final details as to his exact requirements. He accordingly came in two days later and placed an order with us. The date of this order was early in January, to be exact the date fixed is January 3rd.

"He told me, at the time, that his associate in this venture would be a well known authority on microfilm no name mentioned: He made several subsequent visits to this office checking on the progress that we were making on his order.

"When I read in the newspaper that Mr. Freedman was giving testimony in the hearing before the Senate Armed Services Committee with respect to an alleged connection with the Communist Party of Anna M. Rosenberg, whose name had been presented to the Senate for confirmation as Asst. Secretary of Defense, and sensing that there might be a pessibility that the lists that we were preparing for Freedman were to be used in connection with these allegations, I telephoned to Mr. Freedman's apartment and told his wife, who answered the phone, that we would have to hold delivery of the lists in abeyance until he came to see me. His wife told me he was in Washington attending the hearings and that upon his return to the Gity, she would give him the message and he undoubtedly would contact me.

"Following the close of the hearings before the Committee, Mr. Freedman tame to the office and I presented him with the fact that I did not want our lists used in connection with this matter and after some hedging, he admitted that some of the lists were intended for his microfilm enterprises

and other lists then ordered and others to be ordered were to be used for the circularization of a newspaper, which he was to publish, the contents of which were to the effect that the entire affair was a case of mistaken identity and that he would quite clearly indicate in this editorial material that both Mrs. Rosenberg and himself were victims of an unfortunate situation."

From the above it would appear that there is a possibility that Preedman did induce ______ to testify concerning Rosenberg on the promise that he would back him in his microfilm business venture.

In the event the Assistant U. S. Attorney desires a copy of the complete statement above mentioned, the same will be made available to him or, if he desires, efforts will be made to obtain a new statement from Odza relating solely to the information quoted above.

To advise of additional requests for investigation from U. S. Attorney Fay's Office concerning captioned matter.

DETAILS:

Assistant U. S. Attorney Harold H. Bacon, in the Office of U. S. Attorney Fay, Washington, D. C., has requested the following additional investigation through the Washington Field Office:

- 1. Correspondence between Benjamin H. Freedman and Asham Pasha, which he believes was delivered to the FBI and the State Department by the Anti-Defamation League in January 1951. Bacon said that photostats of this correspondence would suffice.
 - 2. He would like to know if the Bureau has made any effort to determine the authenticity of this correspondence and, if so, the results of same.

With respect to the above, there is currently pending a case in the Security Investigative Division relating to this matter captioned "Anti-Defamation League Material, Special Inquiry, State Department".

3. Bacon furnished a copy of a letter purported to be from Gerald L. K. Smith to Benjamin Freedman which was turned over to Irving Shapiro of the Department by Fred Blumenthal, an employee of Drew Pearson. Bacon alleged that Smith is supposed to have represented to persons acting for Drew Pearson that the carbon copy of the original of this letter is in his, Smith's, files in Washington, D. C. Bacon requested that we interview Miss Renalta LeGant, secretary to Smith, concerning the existence of this copy. He also requested that she be interviewed to determine whether Freedman, Donald Surine, or Edward Nellor visited

This encounter took place in the early part of December 1950, the exact day or date unknown. "Some days later Mr. Freedman called at the office of the above corporation and stated that he was about ready to order some lists for this enterprise, but he made a reservation to the effect that he could not place the order, at that moment, but would come in a few days later with the final details as to his exact requirements. He accordingly came in two days later and placed an order with us. The date of this order was early in January, to be exact the date fixed is January 3rd. "He told me, at the time, that his associate in this venture would be a well known authority on microfilm no name mentioned. He made several subsequent visits to this office checking on the progress that we were making on his order. "When I read in the newspaper that Mr. Freedman was giving testimony in the hearing before the Senate Armed Services Committee with respect to an alleged connection with the Communist Party of Anna M. Rosenberg, whose name had been presented to the Senate for confirmation as Asst. Secretary of Defense, and sensing that there might be a possibility that the lists that we were preparing for Freedman were to be used in connection with these allegations, I telephoned to Mr. Freedman's apartment and told his wife, who answered the phone, that we would have to hold delivery of the lists in abeyance until he came to see me. His wife told me he was in Washington attending the hearings and that upon his return to the City, she would give him the message and he undoubtedly would contact me. - 3 -

RECOMMENDATION:

That the attached letter to the Washington Field Office be approved to call the above information to the attention of the Assistant U. S. Attorney handling the perjury inquiry before the Grand Jury. It has not been indicated to date that this matter is being looked into, and the Assistant U. S. Attorney does not, of course, have the benefit of the information furnished by Odza, as set out above, although the other information is in his possession.

To determine whether Freedman promised backing to to set up a To do this it was requested, that if feasible, it be ascertained what type of equipment would be necessary for such a venture; that leading manufacturers in this field in New York City be contacted to see if has approached them to purchase any and to determine if he suggested to any of these concerns that he was looking for employment in this field.

That further inquiries be made to locate any other bank account of Freedman and his wife, the only one located thus far being that found in Philadelphia. The purpose being to locate the account out of which Freedman paid for the printing of the special issue of "Common Sense" dealing with the Rosenberg matter. It was estimated that this issue cost Freedman about \$3,500 but no such entry was found in the bank account located. It was suggested that the printing firm be located that handled the printing of this sheet that was published by Conde McGinley at Union, New Jersey. Full details concerning this transaction were requested.

With respect to Conde McGinley he has been described as violently Anti-Semitic, a political agitator, and has been quoted as saying that Hitler had been sent by God to deliver the world from Jews and Communism. McGinley reportedly, after publishing a few copies of the issue of "Common Sense", giving a complete story of Freedman's participation in the Anna Rosenberg affair, refused to allow additional copies to be distributed. Thereafter, according to "Know The Truth," Freedman decided to publish his story in this publication which was

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Memorandum to Mr. Ladd done on 1-2-51. McGinley has been interviewed by the Bureau on several occasions wherein he has been the victim in alleged extortion matters. He has referred to the Department of Justice, to Bureau Agents, as an organization to protect the Communists as four or five big Jews dictated policy to Tom Clark. That the identity of the International Press be determined, it being noted that Freedman's account showed a payment of \$1,080 to this concern on 1-2-51. No interviews were desired unless necessary to ascertain this information. It is noted that 1-2-51 is the date of the issue of "Know The Truth," allegedly put out by Freedman concerning his part in the Rosenberg matter. It is probable therefore that the International Press had something to do with this publication and a review of Bureau files reflect the most logical concern by this name would be that operated by Gustav Kosik, 178 Maple Avenue, Wallington, New Jersey. In 1944 Kosik was interviewed in connection with another matter at which time he advised he was editor, publisher and printer of the International Press and said that he prints numerous small publications on a contract basis. He also reportedly stated at that time that he was not particularly Anti-Semitic and has printed some Jewish papers. Kosik was characterized as an opportunist who would do anything for money. 5. Freedman's account also showed a number of payments to the Benart Mail Service. The identity of this concern was requested. The Bureau indices are negative. Payments were also made by Freedman to one Russell Maguire. It was requested that his identity be ascertained but no interview was desired. Bureau files contain reference to one Russell Maguire who is probably the person referred to although the purpose of such large payments by Freedman to this Maguire are not apparent. This Russell Maguire is President of Maguire Industries Inc., 1437 Railroad Avenue, Bridgeport, Connecticut. He also has offices at 50 5th Avenue, New York City. This Maguire is also the principal stockholder of Thompson Automatic Arms Corporation and the Auto-Ordnance Corporation located at 31 Nassau Street, New York City. This same Maguire in 1945 had a residence address of Buckfield Lane, Greenwich, Connecticut and a business address of 80 Broadway, New York City (same as 1 Wall Street). A confidential source advised that this Maguire's name appeared on the mailing list of the German Library of Information. In testifying before the Armed Services Committee concerning Rosenberg, Freedman mentioned that he had a friend in the Thompson Machine Gun business. He did not identify this friend. This discussion was brought out by the Senators because of an old allegation that Freedman was dealing in arm's for the Arabs.

Memorandum to Mr. Ladd A Renegotiation Act matter is currently pending concerning the Maguire Industries, Inc. A payment was also made by Freedman on 11-11-50, in the amount of \$1,953.51 to Edwards Motors, Inc. The details of this transaction were requested to determine whether Freedman may have bought a car for DeSola. That a copy of the signed statement of Herbert Odza, relating to Freedman's alleged impersonation be furnished to them. This statement contains information to the effect that Freedman told Odza he was going into the Micro Film business. This has been photostated and is being made available to the United States Attorney through the Washington Field Office. The United States Attorney's office was advised by Herman Edelsberg of the Anti-Defamation League that a meeting was held on 1-11-51, at the Jefferson Hotel, Washington, D. C., attended by Senator Joseph McCarthy, one Joseph Levy and others. The United States Attorney has requested that efforts be made to determine if Joseph Levy was in Washington on 1-10, 11, or 12-51, and what he was doing here. It was stated that Levy should not be interviewed. In connection with the case entitled Anti-Defamation League Material, Special Inquiry, State Department, the Security Investigative Division is currently endeavoring through Levy; to determine if Levy has had recent contacts in Washington with the State Department. This may or may not assist in answering the above question. Hence New York and Washington Field are being required to attempt to obtain the desired information. RECOMMENDATIONS: That the attached teletype be approved, directed to New York, Washington Field, and Newark to endeavor to obtain the requested information. It is recommended that Conde McGinley be interviewed at the outset as it is possible that he may have had a falling out with Freedman and if willing to furnish any information could entirely answer or at least provide pertinent leads to items 3, 4, and 5 above.

PURPOSE:

To advise of the additional request for investigation received from the office of USA Fay.

DETAILS:

My memorandum of February 16, 1951, reflected that AUSA Baker advised that a legman for Drew Pearson named Blumenthal had furnished information to Irving Shapiro, an attorney in the Criminal Division of the Department. This information was to the effect that a bell boy at the Congressional Hotel had informed either Drew Pearson or one of his men that on December 5, 1950, he had taken Ed Nellor, a legman for Fulton Lewis Jr., to the room of Gerald L. K. Smith at the Congressional Hotel. At that time, AUSA Baker had requested that we interview this bell boy and obtain a statement from him concerning this matter, but requested that we interview several of the bell boys at the hotel, apparently for the purpose of protecting Drew Pearson's source of information. The Director noted "we will do no such thing." The Washington Field Office was instructed to so advise AUSA Baker, but at the same time inform him that we would be willing to interview the particular bell boy if his name was furnished.

The USA's office has now requested that it be ascertained whether Gerald L. K. Smith occupied a room in the Congressional Hotel during the period November 25 through December 15, 1950, and whether he was visited at the hotel by Donald Surine, former Agent and presently investigator in Senator McCarthy's office, Fulton Lewis Jr., and Edward Nellor. It was also requested that we ascertain whether one Simon Manache and one George Hamour, also known as Aliani Hamour, occupied a room at the Jefferson Hotel on January 10, 11, or 12, 1950. If so, the USA requested any background information concerning these persons in the files of the Bureau but stated that they should not be interviewed.

OBSERVATIONS:

The sources of obtaining the desired information concerning the visitors of Gerald L. K. Smith at his hotel room are necessarily limited and in the absence of the name of the particular bell boy,

we would be doing exactly what was initially wanted, namely contacting a number of the bell boys, possibly all of them, before coming to the right one, if in fact a right one does exist. This, of course, is what we previously refused to do.

This being the case, it is felt that in order to be consistent and to avoid being injected further into a squabble between Fulton Lewis Jr., Drew pearson, the ADL, the Arab League, and Senator McCarthy, but still be in the position of complying with the desires of the USA, we should limit our investigation in this regard to record sources.

It is believed that we should check the register at the Congressional Hotel to see if Smith was registered during the pertinent period and if so, we should obtain access to the record of his phone calls during this period to determine whether the names or phone numbers of any of the pertinent persons appear thereon without disclosing their identity to the management.


Nellor, of course, testified before the Armed Services Committee and at that time denied any personal knowledge of or any type contact with Gerald L. K. Smith. However, neither Lewis nor Surine testified at these hearings and therefore, it is not readily apparent how they can fit into the perjury picture as principals, which again indicates that an effort is being made by Drew Pearson to use the Bureau in furtherance of his personal feuds. The only possible justification for such investigation as is being requested is to establish one great conspiracy hatched and nourished by the persons mentioned and all inferences in this regard have apparently been promoted by either the Anti-Defamation League or Pearson. Based upon the information available to us, neither to date has furnished anything that they seem willing to vouch for as factual information.

With respect to Simon Manache and George Hamour mentioned above, the Security Division is interested in these persons in their case entitled Anti-Defamation League Material, Special Inquiry, Department of State. Simon Manache was carried in that case as Simon Menache, aka, Malley and George Hamour, aka, Aliani Hamour, is also known as El Dali. Washington Field Office by teletype dated 2-1-51 to the Bureau and New York City, ascertained in connection with this matter that no Aliana Hamour, aka, El Dali was registered at the Jefferson Hotel in January 1951. No check was made, however, concerning Manache or of Hamour under the name of George Hamour. The Washington Field Office teletype stated, however, that the manager recalled no Arabs having recently been in that hotel.

At approximately 10:10 AM, 2/16/51, SA Armbruster of the WFO, advised he had just received a call from Assistant U. S. Attorney Raymond E. Baker, requesting the following investigation:

It seems that a leg-man for Drew Pearson named Sumenthal visited Irving Shapiro, an Attorney in the Criminal Division of the Department who is allegedly assisting the United States Attorney's Office in the presentation of the perjury case in connection with the Rosenberg matter before the Federal Grand Jury, yesterday, February 15. On this occasion, Blumenthal is alleged to have told Shapiro that the bell captain of the Congressional Hotel had advised either Drew Pearson or one of Drew Pearson's men that, on December 5, he took Ed Nellor, who is a leg-man for Fulton Lewis, to the apartment in the Congressional Hotel of Gerald L. K. Smith.

The United States Attorney's Office would like to get a statement from this bell captain and they requested that we interview him and obtain a statement from him with regard to Nellor and that we also ask him if he knows Don Surine in Senator McCarthy's Office. However, Baker wants our agents to interview several of the bell hops in the Congressional Hotel so that it will appear that we had no advance information in this matter, the whole setup being apparently to protect Drew Pearson's source of information in the Congressional Hotel.
We will do morsuchthing- 10.

Of course, as usual they fant this investigation conducted today, assigning as the reason for the terrific haste that they intend to subpoena before the Grand Jury next Monday, February 19. It is our understanding, based upon information pre- b3 viously furnished by them that they have already had the Grand Jury once. With regard to this request, I see no reason why we should be playing games to protect Drew Pearson's source of information.

PURPOSE:

To recommend that Assistant U.S. Attorney Harold H. Bacon be advised that the State Department will not authorize the release of copies of correspondence between Benjamin H. Freedman and Azzam Pasha, and to suggest that he may desire to take the matter up directly with the State Department.

DETAILS:

You will recall that Assistant U.S. Attorney Harold H. Bacon requested copies of what purports to be letters between Benjamin H. Freedman and Azzam Pasha of the Arab League, for use in connection with the perjury inquiry currently in progress before a Grand Jury in Washington, D. C. Bacon also desired a comment as to the authenticity of these documents.

At the time Bacon requested these documents he stated that Mr. Edelsberg of the Anti-Defamation League had informed him that his organization had submitted copies of this correspondence to the Bureau and the Department of State and that Mr. Armstrong of the Intelligence Branch of the State Department had these documents.

This matter was taken up with Mr. Armstrong by Mr. Roach of the Liaison Section and Armstrong advised that the State Department felt that until the material is proven authentic that it was too risky to be used except in the Government channels that now have it. He also said that he felt that the Department of Defense should also be consulted as some of the material came to the State Department from the Department of Defense.

RECOMMENDATION:

That the attached letter to Washington Field Office be approved instructing that Mr. Bacon be informed of the State Department's decision and suggesting that he may desire to take the matter up directly with Mr. Armstrong of the State Department.

DETAILS:

A letter received from the WFO dated 2-14-51 and captioned as above advises that AUSA Harold H. Bacon has requested copies of what purport to be letters between Benjamin H. Freedman, concerning whom a perjury inquiry is under way, and Azzam pasha of the Arab League. You will recall that we have copies of what purport to be a letter from Benjamin Freedman to Azzam dated December 1, 1950, and concerning Anna M. Rosenberg and a reply from Azzam to Freedman dated December 3, 1950. At the request of the Department of State the Bureau is presently endeavoring to authenticate the ADL material of which these purported letters are a part.

Since our investigation in the ADL case is proceeding as a special inquiry Department of State, it will be necessary to ask Mr. Park Armstrong of that department, at whose request the inquiry west undertaken, whether he desires the Bureau to make photostatic Copies of the purported correspondence between Freedman and Azzam available to Mr. Bacon.

Mr. Bacon stated he would like to know if the Bureau has made any effort to determine the authenticity of the purported correspondence and if so the results of same. Although no concentrated effort has been made on the correspondence itself, the Bureau has been endeavoring to determine whether the ADL material, consisting of over one hundred pages, is authentic. No positive results have been attained to date.

Concerning the manner in which Bacon became aware of the purported letters between Freedman and Azzam, the following observations may be made.

When Mr. Armstrong called at the Bureau on December 29 to request us to establish if possible the authenticity of the ADL material, he pointed out that Herman Edelsberg of the ADL on December 18, 1950, left with Anna Rosenberg the two letters involved in instant matter. He stated that Marx Leva in the Office of the Secretary of Defense (where Rosenberg is also employed) had received a call from Tris Coffin of Drew Pearson's staff inquiring as to whether the Office of the Secretary of Defense had heard anything indicating that Freedman may have been working with the Arab League on the Rosenberg case.

On January 2, 1951, Edelsberg told Mr. Armstrong that he had unintentionally given Tris Coffin a lead to the fact that he had delivered certain papers to the State Department bearing upon the relationship of Benjamin Freedman and the Arab League. Edelsberg said that he did not believe Coffin had enough information to use and that he, Edelsberg, would be more discreet thereafter.

It is interesting to note that a copy of a purported letter signed by Gerald L. K. Smith and directed to Mr. Freedman on December 5, 1950, was turned over to the Criminal Division, Department of Justice by an employee of Drew Pearson's office. It is interesting to note further that a memorandum from Mr. Nichols to Mr. Tolson dated December 20, 1950, concerning a conversation had with Tris Coffin indicated that Marx Leva had been discussing the perjury angle of captioned matter with Peyton Ford.

From the above, it would appear that AUSA Bacon learned of the purported correspondence between Freedman and Azzam either from Marx Leva or from Drew Pearson's office.

ACTION:

It is requested that Mr. Rocks of our Liaison Section immediately advise Mr. Armstrong of the State Department that the

Bureau has been requested to furnish copies of the purported letters between Freedman and Azzam to AUSA Bacon for use in an inquiry looking toward perjury charges against Freedman and as an outgrowth of their testimony before the Senate Armed Services Committee in connection with the nomination of Anna M. Rosenberg as Assistant Secretary of Defense.

Armstrong should be akked whether the State Department desires that the Bureau make available to Mr. Bacon photostatic copies of the purported correspondence.

LETTER FROM LENJACIN FOREDIAN TO AFDEL RANDAM AZZAM FASIA, Dec. 1

Excellency:

After many months of effort, working incessently and tirelessly, the American alonists have succeeded in outting in one of the himgest posts; in the American administration a fellow traveler full of hatred against the Arch cause and full of symmathy for the Israel Zionists. Thanks to many millions of dollars, the Zionist movement has succeeded in planting a woman, a so-called american, in a post where she will have almost unlimited powers. The woman in question as you know is Frs. Anno dosenbor appointed by General George Farshall, Secretary of Defense, as Assistant Secretary in charme of the mobilization of manpower. As I told you personally two days are, - and you agreed with me - this nomination signified two things:

1) In the military domains there willbe no further prospect for the Arab states to get the arms they need to defend themselves against Zionist aggression. 2) In the political domains all efforts on the part of the pro-Arab groups in the State Department and in the Pentagon to win justice for the Arab sause willbe defeated.

It should be understood that the significance of this nomination reaches much further than these two misfortunes. The Zionist Morgenthau was one of the most active protanonists for the Jewish cause. Mrs. Mosenberg would work in the same direction on Mr. Truman. He is already surrounded by a rotten clique in the pay of the Jews. I read it and had it translated for distribution at the Arab League with the indication that it is a notable document. I feel that the fight that you have led and intend to lead to destroy our enemies inspires not only the felicitations of every individual loving liberty and justice but also of all those who have at heart the protection of the rights and the sovereignty of peoples. I have met you many times and I have heard you mentioned by mutual friends. I read some of your appeals both to Cairo and to New York. But permit me to say to you that I was skeptical of your motives and of your intentions until I saw you in action.

It is really regrettable that a Jew representing such an insignificant minority in the U.S. should be appointed to a post of such importance. You are advised that on 3/6/51 Miss DOROTHY GRACE MATTON, 2107 O Street, N.W., Wesley Hall, Washington, D.C., was interviewed in the Washington Field Office by Special Agent E. J. Armbruster.

The interview was negative, non-productive, and proved of no value whatsoever, insofar as the present inquiry is concerned. In substance, Miss HATTON advised that in 1939 or 1940 she was a member of an organization known as the Women's Trade Union League, which occupied quarters on Lexington Avenue, near 34th Street, in New York City.

On one occasion, or possibly two, however Miss HATTON is not sure, Mrs. ANNA.M. ROSENBERG appeared before this club and made a talk on some subject of interest to the members. Miss HATTON could not recall the subject, although believed it was on some educational matter.

The only thing Miss HATTON recalls is that Mrs. ***ROSENBERG was held in high esteem by people with communistic leanings or "left of center" as she, HATTON, expressed it. The club, however, was not a subversive organization according to Miss HATTON.

Miss HATTON advised that in 1940 she was employed by the British Ministry of Supply Mission, 37 Wall Street, New York City. She left that agency on 10/1/44 and entered the employ of French North African Mission and General Service Department in Washington, D.C. Subsequently, she accepted employment with Mission of Industrial Production, French Supply Council, 12/1/45 to 7/15/46; French Rubber Association, 7/16/46 to 6/30/47; Office of Commercial Counselor, French Embassy, 2129 Wyoming Avenue, Washington, D.C., from July 1, 1947; is presently employed by the Walker-Goulard-Plehn Company, paper dealers, 1200 - 18th Street, N.W DEFERMAND SECONDING

With reference to the so-called "Glove District" mentioned by Miss HATTON, she advised that she worked for a glove manufacturer in Brooklyn prior to 1940 and that, in her opinion, some "radicals" were employed in the factory in which she worked; and some of them had a high regard for Mrs. ROSENBERG. She cannot remember the names of any of the so-called radicals or leaders of these groups.

Your letter poses a question concerning the fitness of an individual to hold a high public office and, in effect, asks this Bureau to pass upon her qualifications, or at least to express its epinion concerning her worthiness to hold the position she now occupies.

I am sure you will appreciate that it is not the function of this Bureau as an investigative organization to assume such a prerogative. Indeed, upon reflection, the impropriety of its doing so, under our American System of Government, becomes rather apparent.

The responsibility for examining Mrs. Rosenberg's qualifications and for approving or disapproving her for the position she now holds belongs to the United States Senate. That body, after its Committee on the Armed Services had held extensive hearings and had heard both her proponents and her critics and had reviewed written material concerning her, including that to which you allude in your letter, saw fit to confirm her nomination.

I am sure that you will understand the reasons why this Bureau is not in a position to comment concerning the subject matter of your letter.



On April 3, 1951, Assistant United States Attorney, R. E. BAKER, advised that he had completed a review of all requests made of the Bureau in this matter and believes that two items have not been covered or completed, as follows:

In the United States Attorney's letter of February 8, 1951 (Item 2), Mr. BAKER stated that he would like to know whether the FBI had a file on and BENJAMIN H. FREEDMAN. If so, he would like to examine this file for any pertinent information concerning these individuals.

By letter dated February 14, 1951, the United States Attorney requested that Miss RENALTA LeGANT, Secretary to GERALD L. K. SMITH, be interviewed to determine whether the carbon of the letter attached to his communication is in existance and, if so, where. According to information received by United States Attorney the carbon copy is, or was, in GERALD L. K. SMITH's files in Washington, D. C.

The same letter also requested that Miss LeGANT be asked whether BENJAMIN H. FREEDMAN, DONALD SURINE, of Senator McCARTHY's Office, or EDWARD NELLOR, of FULTON LEWIS, JR.'s Office, visited Mr. SMITH at the Congressional Hotel during late November or early December, 1950 and, if so, how frequently.

Inquiry at the Congressional Hotel subsequently failed to reveal that Miss LeGANT was registered at this hotel during this period. However, at the time this information was brought to the attention of Mr. BAKER, he requested that no further investigation be made at that time. He now desires that the Bureau conduct the necessary investigation to locate Miss LeGANT and appropriately interview her.

On March 5, 1951, the United States Attorney, by letter, requested in the last paragraph thereof that the Bureau attempt to ascertain whether or not Mrs. ANNA M. ROSENBERG acted as a mediator in a dispute between two factions of the Union of the Writers Project of the Works Progress Administration in New York City, alleged to have been held in May of 1936.

On March 7, 1951, the Bureau was advised by the WFO that the United States Attorney informed that a check of the WPA records should be held in abeyance and that no action be taken unless advised to the contrary.

It now appears that the United States Attorney wishes to have this request covered, if possible.

On April 4, 1951, Assistant United States Attorney, BAKER, telephonically contacted this Office and requested that the reason for not carrying out his request of February 14, 1951 be answered in writing. At the time this request was made the Bureau advised the Assistant SAC, telephonically, that Mr. BAKER should be informed that the Bell Captain of the Congressional Hotel would be interviewed and a statement obtained from him, if possible. However, the Bureau advised that the WFO was not to resort to any subterfuge by interviewing various bell boys in order to protect the Bell Captain. This information was verbally brought to the attention of Assistant United States Attorney, BAKER, on February 17, 1951, who then stated that he did not wish that the Bell Captain be directly interviewed.

No action will be taken on any of the above requests by the WFO unless and until advised by the Bureau.
