While it is realized it is important to get any information available regarding the captioned individuals' subversive activities, it is believed that you should not become involved in any controversy over their activities on the campus of Madison College and in any controversy as to whether they should or should not be retained as professors. In order that any action that might be taken by the College should not be attributed to the FBI, you should be most circumspect in contacts with Madison College officials. The Bureau should be kept advised of any current developments in this situation. For your information, Bureau files contain no information identifiable with [redacted] and available facts do not appear to justify an active investigation at this time.

NOTE: West is on the SI and has been affiliated with the CP and related activities since 1934. There is no indication he is a current CP member. Subjects are teachers at Madison College, Harrisonburg, Virginia. School officials are disturbed over their activities and gave the opinion the subjects are part of a plot of communists' infiltration of the school. School officials admit they have no definite information on which to base this opinion. They indicate both subjects have voiced opinions against the U.S. position on Vietnam. School officials asked for opinion regarding the subjects, however, none was given. School officials indicate they intend to make every effort to discontinue the subjects' employment at Madison College.

Students have complained that WEST spends his time in class reading his poetry and leading class discussions wherein he tries to "make fools" of students defending democracy. [] requested that student [] be interviewed to better understand his suspicions of the subject. He said that WEST had made no statements re communism but he suspects he is trying to take over and mold student opinion.

On 2/21/66, [] Pearisburg, Va., a student at Madison College, appeared at the Harrisonburg RA. He said he wanted to furnish information at the request of []

[] informed that in his opinion, WEST and [] are part of an attempted communistic infiltration of Madison College. He admitted he had no definite statements by either on which to base this opinion. He said when WEST first came to Madison, he asked some of the students for a list of "liberals" on campus.

WEST or [] would then approach one of these students, using flattery and displaying extreme personal interest. Students are then invited to attend discussion meetings held on campus. Both advocate complete academic freedom. In classes, WEST does not make statements, but will ask provocative questions and then proceed to "cut down" students defending democracy. WEST also pushes the Southern Students Organizing Committee. He advocates no organization on campus at this time but has stated that liberal students should get into positions of leadership. [] estimates that the weekly or bimonthly meetings are attended by a group of about forty students. [] reiterated that he was not accusing WEST of being a communist, but only that his methods appear similar to what he had read about communist infiltration.

He said that [] has made statements in class and at meetings that "we are the aggressors in Vietnam"; that "we must have demonstrations or actions even stronger to protest". He has also claimed that our present form of government does not work and he is against religion.

On 2/21/66, [] Madison College, advised he has heard rumors among the students con-

cerning WEST. He requested advice as to what action he should take. No advice was given and it was suggested that he should handle the matter through the president of the college.

On 3/8/66, Dr. [redacted] Madison College, requested a conference with SA [redacted] of the Harrisonburg RA. On the same date, SA [redacted] conferred with [redacted] and [redacted] said it had come to his attention that inquiries were being made by the FBI concerning Prof. WEST and that he wanted to furnish all information he had developed concerning WEST. [redacted] was advised that no inquiries had been made but that Dr. [redacted] and [redacted] [redacted] had contacted SA [redacted] regarding WEST. [redacted] had felt that he did not have sufficient information to make accusations against a fellow faculty member and in the case of [redacted], it had been suggested that he discuss the matter with [redacted]. [redacted] said he was deeply appreciative. He promised complete cooperation and requested that any inquiries be made through his office.

[redacted] stated some time ago, one of his professors, who lives in Georgia, had advised him that WEST had been an acquaintance of his father's and that his father had described him as a communist. [redacted] said he has been disturbed by the actions of WEST and [redacted] on the campus and had made inquiries of the House Un-American Activities Committee through the office of Congressman JACK MARSH. He anticipates taking no further action regarding [redacted] since [redacted] has indicated he will not return. [redacted] said he has no intention of charging WEST with communist sympathies, but will make every effort to discontinue his employment. He and [redacted] feel that WEST has been vague about some periods of employment on his application which should be checked. He said he appreciated that the files of the FBI are confidential and would cooperate in any way possible.

Reference is made to the memorandum dated 3-23-66 from Mr. Brennan to Mr. Sullivan wherein it was recommended and approved that Congressman [redacted] be contacted concerning information he might possess regarding the subject and one [redacted] both members of the faculty at Madison College in Harrisonburg, Virginia.

GER N.Y. BORN 1932

Congressman [redacted] was contacted on 3-24-66 by SA David W. Bowers. He stated Donald Lee West, who he knows to have been affiliated with the communist movement since the 1930's, is on the faculty at Madison College at Harrisonburg. He said West's communist background has come to the attention of college officials and they are most anxious to get rid of him without creating a furor. [redacted] of the college, has contacted Congressman [redacted] seeking his assistance in this regard. The Congressman has requested the staff of the House Committee on Un-American Activities to prepare purely public source information on West which can be furnished to [redacted]. The Congressman fears [redacted] may mishandle this situation and he therefore declined [redacted] request that he contact the FBI on this matter. He said he fears the situation may get out of hand and he does not want to see it "hung around the neck of the FBI like an albatross."

The Congressman said Willis Benner, a retired FBI Agent, has been hired by the college to thoroughly check into West's background with the hope of turning up something which can be used to dismiss him. (Benner entered on duty 1-5-42 and retired 12-30-64 having served as Resident Agent at Harrisonburg, Virginia. His services were satisfactory.) The present plan is to attempt dismissal on the grounds that West did not completely disclose facts surrounding his prior dismissal from the faculty of Oglethorpe College. Congressman [redacted] feels the University of Maryland "unloaded" West on Madison College by giving him an excellent recommendation.

[redacted] according to the Congressman, was born in 1932 and listed his home as [redacted] New York. He stated on his application at the college that he had served in the Counter Intelligence Corps of the Army for three years and had traveled extensively in Western Europe and West Germany from 1956 to 1960. Benner, according to the Congressman, has developed a possible morals charge against [redacted] involving a coed at the college and this may be used to remove him from the college faculty. b6 b7C

Congressman Marsh stated he does not want nor does he expect any report from the FBI concerning any inquiry which may be made regarding [redacted]. He said he is certain the FBI is keeping tabs on West and he feels [redacted] should be checked. Congressman Marsh was thanked for the information.

On 3/22/66, Colonel Graham Schmidt, Director of Security, Office of the Assistant Chief of Staff for Intelligence, Department of the Army, advised that on 3/21/66 Brigadier General Howard W. Penney, Deputy Chief, Legislative Liaison Office, Department of the Army, had received a call from Congressman John O. Marsh, Jr., (Democrat - Virginia), advising that subject is reported to be a "member of or sympathizer to the Communist Party." Marsh indicated that West is a Professor at Madison College, Harrisonburg, Virginia, and that Madison College had conducted an investigation of West.

Marsh also informed General Penney that West is supporting one [redacted] in the latter's application for employment by Madison College. Marsh described [redacted] as a [redacted] for West who claimed to have served three years in the U. S. Army Intelligence Corps.

Marsh requested that some "knowledgeable person" confer with him so that he could fill him in on the details. He said he had called Army on this because of [redacted] former status in Army Intelligence. Colonel Schmidt, who described Congressman Marsh as a friendly Congressman, advised that General Penney informed Congressman Marsh that inasmuch as West and [redacted] are both civilians and, consequently, not within the investigative jurisdiction of the Army, this matter was relayed to the FBI. Colonel Schmidt requested that in view of the allegation we interview Congressman Marsh. He also requested that if any information of interest to the Army is developed such be passed on to his office.

Bureau files contain no subversive derogatory information identifiable with [redacted]. According to Colonel Schmidt, [redacted] was inducted into the Army on 1/27/54 and was released from active duty on 1/27/57. While on active duty in the Army, he did

He further determined that WEST was no longer residing at 165 North High Street, Harrisonburg, but was then residing at 900 Elton Avenue, Baltimore, Maryland.

[REDACTED] pointed out that while in a travel status in Northern Virginia, WEST is not on per diem but

He stated he had taken this matter up with the Virginia Attorney General's Office and as a result, it was decided that WEST would appear before [redacted] of Madison College, and a representative of the Attorney General's Office at 2:00 P.M., April 7, 1966. Subject was uncooperative during an attempt to interview him in 1954; refused to testify before a Senate Investigating Committee on communism in 1957, claiming the Fifth Amendment; and when subpoenaed before an House Committee on Un-American Activities hearing in 1958 expressed his wrath at this although he was not called to testify. It is therefore felt any further attempt to interview subject would be unproductive.

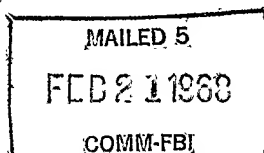

W. Va. Part Of Red Hotbed? Some Say So

By KATHY LALLY

Communism is at work in every facet of American life including here in West Virginia and must be counteracted by everyone "keeping alert to preserve this Christian nation," Mrs. E. Wyatt Payne of Huntington warned Tuesday night in a talk here.

Speaking at American Legion Post 16, Mrs. Payne told the audience of approximately 80 persons that Communism has crept into American schools in the form of progressive education.

"They are rewriting the history books so fast you wouldn't know it if you went back to school," she said. "Communists in this country are really after our children."

Mrs. Payne explained the schools were chosen as the "transmission belt throughout the United States" because there the Communist conspiracy found "a captive audience from kindergarten to college at the taxpayers' expense."

She criticized Marshall University for two speakers chosen for the spring "Impact" program. "There is no reason for Herbert Aptheker (a leader of the Communist Party in America) to be here," she said, as the audience applauded her.

She added she saw no reason for Episcopal Bishop James A. Pike "to be on a program at our university" either.

Mrs. Payne also said Don L. West's Appalachian South Folklife Center at Pipestem between Hinton and Princeton has her worried.

The center, which has been

endorsed by U. S. Sen. Jennings Randolph, former Democratic gubernatorial candidate Paul Kaufman and others, was established as a school for dropouts and a place "to study mountain culture and the ways of people of different backgrounds and races."

"I won't call it Communist, I will let you decide," she said. Discussing Mr. West's Appalachian South Folk Festival, Mrs. Payne said, "They have the nicest names for the wrong things."

She described the 350-acre farm as being far off the road and added she hoped the FBI would still be able to find it.

Mr. West says the Pipestem project is a universal Christian Center ("Watch them use Christian so no one will bother them," Mrs. Payne commented) and that it is dedicated to freedom ("Weren't we free in West Virginia before they came?" she demanded).

Mr. West was also involved in the Highland Folk School in Tennessee which was closed because of Communist affiliations, she alleged, saying, "I'm not going to editorialize or call anyone a Communist." But she added, everyone ought to do something about this right now.

A film produced by the National Education Program at Searcy, Ark., was also known. Entitled "The Revolution Underway in the United States," it depicted riots in the cities during the past few years and blamed them on radical black power advocates.

The 4/25/68 issue of the "Hinton Daily News" contained an article captioned, "National Camp Set On Pipestem Farm," set forth that fifty to sixty students from throughout the United States would come to Pipestem for a six-week leadership training program this summer. The third annual Appalachian Encampment for Citizenship will be held on the former MONTIE WEST farm in Pipestem, now owned by Rev. DOG WEST's Appalachian South Folklore Center. This article noted that plans for this encampment were discussed at a recent meeting, and speakers at the meeting included Rev. WEST, DOUGLAS KELLY, National Director of the Encampment for Citizenship, Inc., and NEIL RIORDAN of Worcester, Mass., who will direct the encampment at Pipestem. The article noted that KELLEY and RIORDAN are former members of the U. S. Peace Corps overseas, as are many of the staff members associated with the Encampment for Citizenship. According to KELLEY, a basic purpose of the encampment is broadening the horizons of young people, helping them to increase their tolerance for and understanding of different groups and ideas and the second purpose is to encourage them to take an active part in community improvement efforts in their own home communities.

The 4/25/68 evening edition of the "Sunset News - Observer," a daily newspaper published at Princeton-Bonfield, W. Va., contained an uncaptioned article which set forth that a news story from Washington, D. C., states that Mrs. WILBUR J. COHEN, a small red-haired firebrand, is backing a proposed folklike center on Lick Creek in the Pipestem District of Summers County, the center being a dream of Rev. DON WEST, Georgia poet and preacher. The article stated that the purpose is to develop a school for dropouts and to encourage and preserve the arts and heritage of the mountains, and that Mrs. COHEN's husband is Secretary of Health, Education and Welfare. The article noted that Mrs. COHEN has been involved with the Congress for Appalachian Development for some time, that the Public Welfare Foundation approved \$5,000 for it last December, and Mrs. COHEN was then raising additional funds in Washington and New York.

The 8/8/68 issue of the "Princeton Times," a daily newspaper published at Princeton, W. Va., set forth an editorial captioned, "Our Opinion," the context of which is as follows:

**"FOLK LIFE CENTER AT PIPESTEM
SHOULD BE CAREFULLY STUDIED**

"A few months ago, talk began flying around the area concerning a supposed 'Hippie' Camp located near Pipestem. Tales of bearded creatures and free love circulated quite in this area.

"For the most part, these tales are gross exaggerations. Perhaps we should be a little sorry that they were not true. We can handle hippies a lot easier than idealistic liberal crusaders who promise cures for poverty and the like. Hippies would at least stay to themselves and above all would not send out letters asking for financial assistance in the continuance of their anti-American confusion.

"The Camp situated at Pipestem is a direct product of the 'War on Poverty.' It is undeniably attached to the federal give-away programs which are so quickly sucking the life blood from this nation.

"To do not believe that the transportation to West Virginia of high school drop outs, ex-Vista workers, and liberal college professors will result in 'The enrichment of the mountain economy.'

"Furthermore, we oppose the sanctimonious use of religion as a robe to hide the unamerican philosophies to be propounded of such a school. A piece of correspondence from the school describes it as 'A universal Christian Center in the Judeo-Christian tradition.' The writers of such a line must be bowing their heads in shame, for outspoken atheists teach at this school. Never can we be convinced that an atheist can touch in the Judeo-Christian tradition.

"As long as Don West and his Camp stayed in Pipestem bothering no one, we remained silent. Now, however, letters are being mailed from the Camp asking for financial support. We cannot be silent and thereby allow people to contribute to such a cause.

"It is quite probable that the Camp will become a headquarters in this area for activism and leftist teachings. It may become the Center for civil disobedience and trouble. With such names as Sydney Bell and James V. Overdorf on the list of those who contributed, we can see little good coming from the project.

that appeared on page 328 of Deed Book 101 is a Deed from C. M. WEST and wife Violet L. WEST, to DONALD L. WEST and wife CONSTANCE A. WEST, for 3 Tracts of land. The five tracts were composed of five acres, fourteen acres, 92 1/2 acres, 40 acres, and 120 acres, totaling 271 1/2 acres, all located in the Pipestem District of Summers County, W. Va. Title was transferred on 3/25/68.

On Page 238 of Deed Book 102, there is a deed from R. W. WEST and OLA WEST to D. L. WEST and CONSTANCE WEST, dated June 12, 1967, for one lot, 50 feet by 700 feet, on Sun Valley Lake, one mile south of Pipestem, W. Va., Post Office.

On 2/9/68, Mr. JOHN E. FAULCONER, Editor, "The Hinton Daily News," Hinton, W. Va., in his column entitled, "Hinton Around" stated, "Mayor John Lindsay of New York City is sponsoring chairman of a Citizenship Encampment to be held on the Don West property in Pipestem District that is now under development.

"The encampment is partly financed by the OEO, and will be attended by 70 young people and some 20 staff members, Mr. West said.

"Mr. West, a retired University of Maryland professor, two years ago purchased several hundred acres of land that will be developed into a school for Appalachian youth.

"Tuition for the students between the age of 15 and 18 years will be \$500, however, Mr. West will recommend 10 more youths from the mountain area.

"Barrack type buildings will be erected to house the students and when the camp is started employment at the minimum wage will be provided six or seven women in the area.

"Outstanding work was done during the camp school period.

Mr. West is now on a speaking tour, and his last appearance was Wednesday at Princeton University.

"This first student camp is just one more of the many things that are happening in the area that will give a considerable boost to the local economy. "

On 2/12/68, Mr. JOHN FAULCONER advised that on 2/6/68, Mr. DON WEST stopped at his office at the "Hinton Daily News," Hinton, W. Va., and informed him that he was a retired college professor from the University of Maryland and he was planning to establish a new type school on the property he had purchased near Ripston, W. Va. Mr. FAULCONER said it was his understanding that the school would be a summer camp and underprivileged children from big city areas like New York, could come there for the summer, but local youths would also be invited to attend. FAULCONER said WEST claimed he was obtaining support for the camp from the Office of Economic Opportunity, but WEST did not explain the project in detail. Mr. FAULCONER said he had heard of Mr. WEST being in the area on two other occasions within the past year and on each of these occasions Mr. WEST was attending meetings of the Community Action Association which is funded by the Office of Economic Opportunity to assist in the area.

Mr. FAULCONER said WEST is apparently well acquainted with many persons at Charleston, W. Va., and in particular with writers associated with the "Charleston Gazette" newspaper. He said WEST mentioned being acquainted with L. T. ANDERSON, who was formerly employed by the "Hinton Daily News," and who is now a feature writer for the "Charleston Gazette."

Mr. FAULCONER further stated that he concluded that Mr. WEST now earns a living by coupling the cost of speaking engagements and he apparently often appears on the same program with his daughter, HEDY WEST, who is a folk singer and who reportedly only recently returned from Europe.

On February 13, 1968, [REDACTED] Pipestem, W. Va. (PROTECT IDENTITY) advised that DONALD L. WEST came to Pipestem during the summer of 1966 and purchased a farm of slightly less than 200 acres from [REDACTED]. She said this farm contained a small residence and a few farm buildings and an old house trailer has been moved onto it since it was acquired by WEST. She said Mr. WEST stated he purchased this farm in order to build a boys home and school and he gave the impression that the operation would be something like "Doystown, Neb.," but from the beatnik type students who have visited WEST, it would appear that this would not be the type establishment he intends. She stated that during the Easter college vacation holiday customarily granted by most colleges, in 1967, a group of "beatnik type" students from various colleges came to Pipestem to assist Mr. WEST in building his school. She said this group succeeded in tearing down an old building which Mr. WEST purchased from the State of West Virginia and they piled the lumber on the farm which he bought, but nothing further was accomplished. She said Mr. WEST did not reside at Pipestem during 1966 or 1967, but periodically he returned to the area for short periods, and he said that he was touring the country on speaking engagements, however, for a short time during the summer of 1967, a few college students reportedly from Concord College, Athens, W. Va., visited with WEST and supposedly were to help him build his school. [REDACTED] said that during the Spring or Winter term of Concord College in 1967, Mr. WEST made an appearance at Concord College for a lecture and his daughter HEDY WEST, a folk singer, also appeared on the program. She said she attended this program and there were a number of people reportedly from Kentucky present who had come to support Mr. WEST. She said that the people from Kentucky wore old looking clothing, the men had beards, and all of them appeared

to be dirty and it was here also standing, that Mr. WEST had been associated with these people in Kentucky. She said these people were the "Black" or Florida Children, type as seen on television.

[redacted] continued that Mr. WEST's program was most critical of the United States Government and so the songs which were sung by MISS WEST and she and others who attended this program from Pipestem were very unfavorably impressed.

[redacted] further advised that Mr. WEST had now been at Pipestem for two or three months prior to 2/3 or 10/68 and he said he had been on a speaking tour, but would be in the area much more frequently in the future and his wife planned to join him and they were planning to spend the summer there to work on his boys' home and school.

[redacted] said that during the 1967, Mr. WEST gave her copies of a magazine entitled, "The Appalachian South," published by Appalachian Associates, Inc. (a Universal Christian publication), Post Office Box 4104, Charleston, W. Va. She said these magazines were about poverty, poverty workers, folk music, and folk lore, and had articles contributed by a number of different people. She said Mr. WEST informed her that [redacted] who resides in Charleston, W. Va., was primarily responsible for publication of the magazine, but he was attempting to third class mailing privileges for the magazine at the Pipestem Post Office. She continued that about February 12, 1968, he mailed approximately 100 of these magazines to various persons and places throughout the United States. Mrs. [redacted] furnished a copy of the magazine and it was listed as [redacted]. Mrs. [redacted] pointed out that many of the articles in this issue were contributed by Mr. WEST, but many other persons wrote articles for the magazine and one of the articles was written by [redacted] an [redacted] at Concord College, Athens, W. 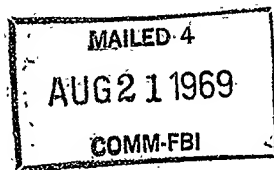

Mr. Morris. Well, were you a member of the Communist Party 3 days ago?

Mr. Morris. You have been a contributor to the Communist publication, Masses and Main Stream, have you not?

Mr. West. I will claim the fifth amendment on that, sir.

Mr. Morris. In fact, the editor of Masses and Main Stream, Mr. Samuel Sillen, has been an intimate friend of yours, has he not?

Mr. West. As I have previously said, sir. I would have to claim the fifth on past associates or affiliations, and claim it now.

Mr. Morris. Did he not come from New York and visit in your home at Christmastime in 1954?

Mr. West. I take the fifth on that, sir.

Mr. Morris. Now, your wife is Jeannette West?

Mr. West. I would take the fifth on that.

Mr. Morris. Was she formerly a correspondent in Moscow of the Daily Worker?

Mr. West. I would take the fifth on that.

Mr. Morris. Do you have a sister, Belle, B-e-l-l-e?

Mr. West. I would have to claim the fifth on that.

Mr. Morris. To your direct knowledge, has she been a Communist Party organizer in this particular area?

Mr. West. I take the same position, sir.

Mr. Morris. Have you been the editor of the publication called the Southerner?

Mr. West. I would take the fifth on that, sir.

Mr. Morris. All right.

Senator Jenner. Mr. West---

Mr. West. Yes, sir.

Senator Jenner. Do you honestly believe the truthful answer to questions propounded to you by Mr. Morris concerning your wife and your sister would tend to incriminate you?

Mr. West. I would take the fifth on that, sir--have to.

Mr. Morris. Mr. Chairman, in view of the responses of the witness, I would rather not prolong this too much. But Mr. Mandel has compiled a long series of exhibits--we of course have enough evidence and information, the sum total of which is that he, this witness today, has been one of the more prominent Communist organizers in the South over a period of years.

I wonder if, Mr. Chairman, subject to more questions by Mr. Sourwine and yourself--I would like to offer this for the record.

Senator Jenner. They may go in the record and become part of the record.

(Page 27 of Record)

(The material above referred to was marked "Exhibit 2-M" and reads as follows:)

Exhibit 2M.

DON WEST

"Don West, Louisville, Ky.: This man, formerly in charge of Atlanta, Ga., for Communist Party, is a preacher and a graduate of Vanderbilt University. He sneaked out of Atlanta on a truck, under a load of gunnysacks, when Assistant Solicitor General Hutson

swore out warrants for his arrest. After a short period in New York City, he was sent to Kentucky and there made organizer.

"It has been reported on numerous occasions that he was a part-time employee of the Textile Workers Union, a CIO affiliate and at the same time was district organizer of district No. 23, Communist Party." (Part of the records introduced by Mr. John P. Frey, president of the metal trades department of the A. F. of L., before the House Un-American Activities Committee on August 13, 1938; p. 129, vol. 1, Investigation of Un-American Propaganda Activities before the House Un-American Activities Committee, August 1938).

Contributing editor; The Negro Liberator (p. 625, vol. 1, ibid.).

Affiliated with the People's Institute of Applied Religion (p. 139, testimony of Walter Steele before the House Un-American Activities Committee, July 21, 1947). People's Institute of Applied Religion has been cited as subversive and Communist by the Attorney General in letters to the Loyalty Review Board dated June 1, 1948 and September 21, 1948.

"Mr. Mandel. (Did you ever meet) Don West?

"Mr. Crouch. I knew him very well, for many years, as Don West and as Jim Weaver. He was district director of the Communist Party of North Carolina while I was district organizer in the fall of 1934 or early 1935. He then left the Carolinas and went to Kentucky as district organizer of the Communist Party through most of 1935, and then was released from that post and returned to the South, where he has spent most of his time as a writer. The latest news I had was that he was a professor at Oglethorpe University in Georgia and recently published a book of poems" (testimony of Paul Crouch before the House Un-American Activities Committee, p. 191, May 6, 1949).

One of the organizers of the Highlander Folk School at Monteagle, Tenn. (p. 193, ibid.).

"Mr. Russell. Will you tell the committee what you know about Don West?

"Mr. Crouch. Yes. I first met Don West in North Carolina in July or August 1934 when he was sent by the central committee to act as central director. He acted in that capacity 1 year, using the name Jim Weaver. During this time he headed the Burlington defense committee. He was released from North Carolina to go to Kentucky as district organizer of the Communist Party. After leaving Kentucky he went to his old home in Georgia, where he engaged in literary pursuits for some time, and I understand at present he is a professor at Oglethorpe University, and the author of a recently published book of poems. He is a brother-in-law of Nat Ross, southern representative of the central committee of the Communist Party, and a brother-in-law of Bart Logan, a former district organizer in North Carolina; and a sister of Don West, Jeannette Weaver, has been Daily Worker correspondent at Moscow over a number of years" (p. 209, ibid.).

"Mr. Tavenner. (What do you know about) Don West, of Bethel, Ohio?

"Mrs. Edmiston (former member of the Communist Party). He was a minister. What religion I don't know. He was also a Boy Scout leader at Bethel, Ohio. He was identified as a Communist Party member and an active member of the American Peace Mobilization.

"Mr. Tavenner. How did you know he was a member of the Communist Party?

"Mrs. Edmiston. He was identified to us by Steve Grattan, secretary of the Communist Party at Columbus (p. 2716, testimony of Martha Nichols Edmiston, House Un-American Activities Committee hearings regarding Communist activities in the Cincinnati, Ohio, area, pt. 1, July and August 1950) (on p. 2726, *ibid.*, Mrs. Edmiston identifies West as being minus one finger on one of his hands).

Mr. Sourwine. Mr. Chairman, Mr. Morris, have two questions not in the area where the witness said he would have to claim the fifth amendment. Maybe we can get answers.

Senator Jenner. All right, proceed.

Mr. Sourwine. When were you last in Knoxville?

Mr. West. Sir, I could not remember when I was last in Knoxville.

Mr. Sourwine. You have been in Knoxville this year?

Mr. West. Not that I recall, sir.

Mr. Sourwine. On March 17 of this year?

Mr. West. I don't remember that.

Mr. Sourwine. Do you know Helen Parsons?

Mr. West. I would have to claim the fifth amendment, sir, as to all my past associations and acquaintances.

Mr. Sourwine. Do you know whether Helen Parsons lives in Knoxville?

Mr. West. I do not, sir. I could not say truthfully that I do know.

Mr. Sourwine. I want to refresh your memory and give you an opportunity to correct the previous answer. Isn't it true that on March 17, 1957, you visited Helen Parsons' home at Knoxville?

Mr. West. I would have to claim the fifth on that, sir.

(Page 29 of Report)

Mr. Sourwine. Now, we will go back to the prior question when I asked you whether you were there in March of this year. Do you want to change your prior answer?

Mr. West. I said, sir, that I could not recall, and I would have to take the fifth amendment on any questions---

Mr. Sourwine. You now take the fifth amendment on that?

Mr. West. Yes, sir.

Senator Jenner. I think you previously stated, Mr. West-- however, the record will speak correctly--that you could not recall?

Mr. West. That is true.

Senator Jenner. Now, do you recall, or do you take the fifth amendment?

Mr. West. I take the fifth, sir, upon the question.

Senator Jenner. That is all, then.

Mr. Morris. Sir, I have one more question I would like to ask you.

I would like to offer--

Mr. Barber, will you offer this piece of paper to the witness?

I wonder if you will read that for us, Mr. West. Begin reading, so that you will be able to identify it in your own mind and give us a general idea what it is.

Mr. West. You want me to read aloud?

Mr. Morris. Yes. At least, the beginning of it, until you are able to answer whether you identify that.

Mr. West. Do I have to read this, sir? I mean---

Mr. Morris. Well, I am asking you to.

Mr. West. And do I have to read it?

Mr. Morris. Can you?

Mr. West. Yes, sir. It is:

Correspondence: Any person or persons handling mail or correspondence with sharecroppers, farmers, or tenants or organizers in the South should remember the following elementary rules.

Mr. Morris. Now, did you author that?
 Mr. West. Beg your pardon?
 Mr. Morris. Did you author that? Did you write that? Did you compose it?
 Mr. West. Sir, I would have to take the fifth amendment on that.
 Mr. Morris. Mr. Mandel. I wonder if Mr. Mandel would read this in the record?
 Senator Jenner. Proceed, Mr. Mandel.
 Mr. Mandel (reading).

Pointers on work in the South. 1. Correspondence: Any person or persons handling mail or correspondence with farmers, sharecroppers, tenants, comrades or organizers in the South should remember the following elementary rules:

(a) Envelopes should never be addressed by typewriter, handwriting is better, and should not be too flashy--better if somewhat poor. Always use title (Mr., Mrs., Miss, etc.). Never use business envelopes.

(b) Don't use return address of our offices, use some innocent address, better if a house address. If writing to a Negro, use address from Negro section of city. If name of a company or business house is used, use one that corresponds to the kind of package or envelope sent.

(c) Packages must always be well wrapped (so they don't fall apart in transit) and must look innocent. Don't send papers openly, but if a bundle, put in a box, so that it looks like a gift or something personal. In addressing, abide by rules given for letters. Single copies of paper should be sent first class.

(Page 30 of Record)

(d) Time: Don't send packages or letter to any given address too often. Alternate, have at least 2 or 3 addresses in each locality, if possible. Don't continue sending bundles for too long a time to one address. Three months' limit.

(e) By all means, do not send any circular letters as third class. Send first class, following directions for letters. They expose at once. If the organization is known, on rare occasions, such can be done. But don't make this a practice.

(f) Content of letters; When writing letters, always, although writing business matters, make letter appear as personal. Address person as "Dear Friend," etc. Avoid mentioning names, do so only when absolutely necessary. Always use very simple language. Experience shows that letters from our office have not been understood by sharecroppers, and necessitated a "learned" person to transcribe same.

Some general suggestions:

(a) Always avoid too much mail. Try to get along with as little as possible.

(b) Have all southern mail and addresses handled by one responsible person, who has been assigned to do it.

(c) Build up a definite machinery to handle contacts, addresses, etc. Use past experience of our organizations.

(d) Do not mail letters and packages to the South with other office mail. This practice should be followed all the time.

(e) Always remember the following:

1. One letter, wrongly handled, can subject receiver to terror, discrimination, etc.

2. The mailing apparatus is part of the United States spy system.

3. Farmers, sharecroppers, tenants, etc., always live in localities where "local inquisitiveness" is rampant.

To editors: Some things to remember.

(a) Always use very simple picturesque language. Avoid all long words. Don't try to prove your intelligence by high language. It usually brings the opposite result.

(b) Avoid using names of people. (This does not apply to our enemies).

(c) Names of places, if connected with definite events, often give away our friends. Be careful how such is used.

(d) Often a detailed account of an event will expose those connected with it. Such material should not be used.

(e) Don't write long articles.

(f) Use letters from friends.

1. Try and save the southern language, terms and names of things; changing such will greatly lessen value of article or letter.

2. By all means, use such correspondence. Our papers contain too little from the South.

3. When in doubt, as to facts, data, etc., of letter or article, get in touch with the nearest organizer.

Mr. West. May I say just a word, please, sir, Mr. Morris?

Mr. Morris. Yes, Mr. West.

Mr. West. I know that--see, in the first place, I only received the subpoena late Friday afternoon. I haven't consulted any attorney or anybody else, and I know that in a case like that I could say that I did not author it and there might be someone who might swear that I did, but I am going to take a chance and give a frank answer. I have never seen nor heard that reading in my life, as far as I can recall, and I certainly did not author it. Now, that is the plain answer to that.

Mr. Morris. Is your testimony, Mr. West, that---

Mr. West. My testimony is that I did not write the piece of paper, and as far as I can recall I have never seen it or heard it read in my life.

Mr. Sourwine. Did you write the original of which this is a copy?

Mr. West. Sir, I said I did not author that piece of paper.

Mr. Sourwine. Did you write the original of which this is a copy, Mr. West?

Mr. West. That is what I am trying to say.

(Page 31 of Record).

Mr. Sourwine. You did not?

Mr. West. No, sir, I did not.

Mr. Sourwine. Did you write a--or send in information to be set in a memorandum of this general nature and content at any time?

Mr. West. Not that I recall, sir. As I say, I have never recalled having ever seen or heard this particular paper or writing.

Mr. Morris. Did you know Carl Braden?

Mr. West. Beg your pardon?

Mr. Morris. Do you know Carl Braden?

Mr. West. I would have to take my former position, sir, that I claim the fifth.

Senator Jenner. You might identify him. What is it, Carl Braden, worked formerly for the Courier-Journal and was----

Mr. Morris. Former newspaperman, who was a defendant in a criminal case.

I would have to take the fifth.

Mr. West, as I understand, you are claiming the fifth amendment on all matters concerning Communist activities or affiliations?

Mr. West. As I say, any questions concerning affiliations and association in the past, I claim the fifth amendment, sir.

Mr. Sourwine. When were you last in Monteagle, Tenn.?

Mr. West. I can't remember, sir, when I was last in Monteagle, Tenn.

Mr. Sourwine. Were you there over the past Labor Day weekend?

Mr. West. You would know that better than I. I was not. That I will answer you flatly, that I was not.

Mr. Sourwine. You were not there?

Mr. West. No, sir.

Senator Jenner. No further questions.

Mr. Morris. I have no questions.

Senator Jenner. Then you may be excused, Mr. West.

Mr. West. May I return home, sir?

Senator Jenner. That is all right.

(Witness excused.)

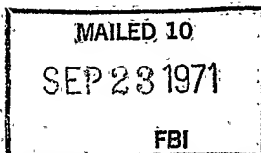

A large "social welfare organization" is to convene at Lake Junaluska, North Carolina on April 24, 25, and 26 of 1970.

Films scheduled to be shown to young people at this gathering are designated as SCEF films, NEWSREEL films, and APPALACHIAN VOLUNTEERS films.

Workshops are scheduled to kick off a drive for "Appalachian Studies" in Appalachian schools to complement the "Black Studies" agitation already repugnantly familiar to other areas.

SCEF stands for "Southern Conference Educational Fund", perhaps the most widely exposed communist front in America. Under the name of "Southern Conference for Human Welfare" as well as its present name it has been cited as "conceived, financed, and set up by the Communist Party to promote communism in the South". (See House Committee on Un-American Activities [HUAC] and House Committee on Internal Security [HCIS] reports write your Congressman.)

NEWSREEL is, in its own words, a "political propaganda organization". It has been "politically active" in practically every riot staged by the "movement" in recent years. NEWSREEL films depict the Viet Cong, Castro, the Black Panthers, etc. as heroes; and the U. S. "Imperialist" government and its "fascist" police as the enemy. (See Move-Speak, Official Catalog of the Movement Speakers' Bureau.)

APPALACHIAN VOLUNTEERS, although nominally a separate group charged with "training and recruiting workers" in Appalachia, is the organizing arm of the convening body. Both AV and SCEF personnel were indicted by the Pike County, Kentucky grand jury in 1967 for attempting to violently overthrow the government, seize federal funds, and place communist organizers in local schools to "promote their ideology among school children." (See Pike County Grand Jury report. Also see Kentucky Joint Legislative Committee on Un-American Activities [KUAC] reports, same subject.)

The group staging this gathering was formerly known as "Conference of Southern Mountain Workers". Under its newest alias of "COUNCIL OF THE SOUTHERN MOUNTAINS", and utilizing the organizational capabilities of their Appalachian Volunteers working as "Vistas", CSM has penetrated and taken control of virtually every poverty program in West Virginia. It is probably best known as the sole administrator of the federally funded anti-poverty program in McDowell County, operating from its office on McDowell Street in Welch. (See Encyclopedia of Associations; Section 6.)

Although it is no secret that the Communist conspiracy has been operating through a system of "Folk Schools" for many years and that several have been closed down by courts and legislatures of different states, it is not widely known that representatives of such schools make up a large percentage of the CSM board of directors. Of necessary interest to citizens of West Virginia and McDowell County are the "Appalachian South Folklife Center" at Pipestem, W. Va., and "Highlander Center" in Knoxville, Tenn. Myles Horton and Don West, Communists and SCEF pioneers, direct these two. The staff of Highlander Center are all Appalachian Volunteers and the Appalachian South school was built by "Vistas". (See BECKLEY POST HERALD 11/23/69 and PRINCETON TIMES, 9/26/68.)

SCEF has just completed work on a textbook on "Appalachian History" that will be introduced into West Virginia schools if the CSM-SCEF drive is successful. It will "prove" the Don West thesis that Appalachia is and has always been a "colony" of the capitalist industrialists and that poverty can only be relieved by "a complete restructuring of the system of ownership, production, and the distribution of wealth", in other words . . . COMMUNISM!

With control of Headstart, Follow-Through, and their involvement in Adult Education programs, Council of the Southern Mountains already has ample opportunity to work this into the McDowell County school curriculum. Will you let it happen?

Your Attention Please

For this mailer to have ANY IMPACT AT ALL on SCEF-CSM activities it must be read by everyone in McDowell County who can read and write, and read aloud to every person who can't.

It must be sent to every elected or appointed public servant in West Virginia and throughout the nation. It must be sent to all newspapers in West Virginia and every major newspaper throughout all the United States. It must receive the widest possible distribution in the widest possible area. Be warned that even then only a miracle would ensure its making the slightest dent in the programmed planning of the communist conspiracy.

If you are willing to pray to Almighty God for a miracle; and if you believe that wide distribution of this leaflet should be attempted and accomplished, this much you can do:

After reading it yourself, don't put it away. Pass it along to someone else who can then pass it to someone else. If this copy is not so worn and bedraggled that you can hardly read it, it has not been read by enough people. Pass it on!

Subject was reportedly active in the Communist Party, USA (CPUSA) in Atlanta, Georgia, and Trade Union Organizer with the CPUSA in North Carolina during 1934. From about 1936 to 1938, he was state organizer for the CPUSA in Kentucky.

He reportedly became a member of the CPUSA in 1934 and was a member of the CPUSA throughout the 1940's.

During the 1940's and 1950's, subject, a writer of poetry, newspaper, and magazine articles, had reportedly followed the CPUSA line in his writings.

Subject in appearing before a Senate Investigating Committee in Memphis, Tenn., during 10/57, relied upon the Fifth Amendment for the basis of refusing to answer any pertinent questions asked of him by this committee.

Although subject had not been reported to have been active in the CPUSA and front organizations from the 1960's to present, he has reportedly been associated with members of the CPUSA as late as 1964.

For the information of Pittsburgh, FBIHQ files reflect DONALD LEE WEST was born 6/5/08, at Ellijay, Gilmer County, Georgia.

In 1934, he served as Trade Union Organizer for the COMMUNIST PARTY in North Carolina and was District Organizer for the COMMUNIST PARTY in Kentucky during 1935-36. WEST is a poet and writer and has contributed numerous articles and poems to the "Daily Worker" and other communist periodicals. The above mentioned informant listed numerous COMMUNIST PARTY front activities in which WEST was involved. Among these, he stated that WEST helped to organize the Highlander Folk School at Monteagle, Tennessee. m

In 1955, WEST was a Minister of the Church of God of the Union Assembly, Dalton, Georgia, and was publishing a monthly newspaper, "The Southerner." In October, 1955, he invoked the Fifth Amendment when questioned regarding his past COMMUNIST PARTY connections before a County Grand Jury in Dalton, Georgia. According to a local daily newspaper, WEST was expelled from the church in January, 1956, after refusing to take an oath at a public meeting that he was not a communist. 100-20396-243

Former employment was indicated as; Hindman Settlement School, Junior High Principal, Kentucky; Summer workshops for teachers, Lula, Georgia; and Oglethorpe University, Professor Humanities and Director; Maryland Council of Economic Education, Summer Work Shops, 1963.
