received from the Houston Office dated August 18, 1940, by Special Agent R. H. HOSTENY entitled, "HAGGLUND PRESS, SAN BENITO, TEXAS." It is further noted that copies of this report were sent to the Atlanta Office by the Houston Field Division.

In this report of Agent HOSTENY on Page 3 it was stated that HAGGLUND, then residing in Texas, was presently printing and distributing throughout the country a book of Communistic poems written by DON WEST of Cartersville, Georgia.

From later investigation concerning HAGGLUND and his wife it was determined that he came to Las Animas in September or October of 1940 from Texas. HAGGLUND was born September 11, 1908, at Dugdale, Polk County, Minnesota. He married his present wife on May 10, 1938, at Miami, Florida.

HAGGLUND was first employed in Las Animas at the Bent County Democrat as a printer, being know as a floorman, his work consisting of setting up advertisements and making up press work. Aside from his work at the local newspaper, 'HAGGLUND apparently published poems written by himself and his wife. He apparently also has published a copy of "Toil and Hunger" by DON WEST since coming to Colorado.

The file further reflects that both HAGGLUND and his wife ISABEL have written to various newspapers in the vininity of their home articles published in the "Public Volume", which articles are of an anti-British nature.

It is further noted that HAGGLUND was dismissed from his job at the Bent County Democrat in the latter part of 1941.

To date no definite un-American activities have been found against HAGGLUND and his wife, but it is very apparent that both have anti-British sentiments. Additional investigation is being conducted by the Denver Office. If pertinent facts are developed that would interest the Atlanta Office in instant case of DONALD WEST, same will be forwarded.

Colonel WILLIAM HENRY HUFF, referred to on page 29 of reference report is referred to in the files of the Chicago Field Division. HUFF is Chief Counsel of the "Abolish Peonage" Committee and is practicing law in Chicago. He obtained the title of Colonel through membership in the military order of the guard. HUFF was born in Ogelthorpe County, Georgia.

The report of Special Agent E. L. SWEET, dated 10-20-41 entitled "WILLIAM HENRY HUFF, with aliases, Information Concerning," shows that HUFF has offered to furnish information to this office relative to current activity among the colored population in this area. HUFF has taken an active interest in alleged peonage cases in the South.

HUFF is also referred to in report of Special Agent J. C. BILLS dated 10-13-41 at Chicago, Illinois, entitled, "C.I.O. Provisional Counsel, Internal Security - R" wherein HUFF'S name appears as a member of the special committee to nominate a new contact for the Office of Midwest Representative of the International Labor Defense, which committee was appointed by BOB WIRTZ. It is also noted that HUFF is referred to in a copy of a letter from the Bureau to the Atlantic Field Division dated 7-30-41 as having sent to the Bureau a letter regarding a possible peonage case as Chief Counsel of the Abolish Peonage Committee of the International Labor Defense.

HUFF is also referred to in report of Special Agent LEON O. PRIOR dated 2-2-41 at Atlanta, Georgia entitled HARDY LEE SCOTT, with aliases, Espionage - C as being Chief Counsel of the Abolish Peonage Committee of the International Labor Defense, Chicago.

No further investigation is being conducted at the Chicago Field Division relative to the above mentioned individuals or organizations as such.

Agent COMMONS' report reflects, on pages 10 and 11, the name of MRS. ALVA W. YTAYLOR as being the wife of the Chairman of the Nashville Committee of the Southern Conference for Human Welfare. On page 25 of Agent COMMONS' report, ALVA W. TAYLOR of Nashville, Tennessee, is mentioned as having been elected Secretary and Treasurer for the Southern Conference for Human Welfare.

Inasmuch as this is the only information contained in the files of the Memphis Field Division, concerning ALVA W. TAYLOR and since at the present time no further investigation is deemed necessary, this case is being referred upon completion to the office of origin.

PATTERSON, Attorney, Comer Building, Birmingham, Alabama, who handled some of the legal problems involved with the operation of the SOUTHERN NEWS ALMANAC advised they recently received a letter from HALL from Norfolk, Virginia indicating that HALL was either about to join the Navy or was already in the United States Navy.

The reference report further indicates that the subject in this matter wrote to Mr. and Mrs. MIKE ROSS at the SOUTHERN CONFERENCE FOR HUMAN WELFARE in Birmingham, Alabama.

Reference is made to the report of Special Agent J. CULLEN KENNEDY, dated May 15, 1942 entitled LIKE ROSS, WITH ALIASES, ET AL; INTERNAL SECURITY - C. It is indicated therein that MIKE ROSS came to this area and worked for a short time for the SOUTHERN NEWS ALMANAC prior to its collapse. During that time he was known to have been active in the SOUTHERN CONFERENCE OF HUMAN WELFARE, THE LEAGUE OF YOUNG SOUTHERNERS and with LABORS NON PARTISAN LEAGUE, all Communist Front organizations in this area. ROSS is now known to be the International Representative of the International Mine, Mill and Smelters Workers Union and was recently at 18252 Carolina Avenue, Bessemer, Alabama. It is known that he is presently publishing a form of journal for that organization as part of his duties in this capacity.

In connection with the letter received by the subject from "BUDD Y. WEST, General Delivery, Birmingham, the Birmingham Field Division contains no information with regard to an individual by that name, although it is believed possible that this person may be DELLA WEST, wife of MIKE ROSS.

The writer attempted to obtain information relative to the Abraham Lincoln Brigade in Kentucky at the Lexington City library which met with negative results as this library has no information which deals with formation of any parties which does not approve of the form of Government which is now existing.

The following information was received from MR. VERNON GILES/COOPER who is subject in file #100-44 in the Louisville Field Division. MR. COOPER was interviewed by the reporting Agent at which time he advised that at the time of the organization of the Kentucky Workers Alliance he was President of this organization and that he recalls subject in this case as Secretary with business offices at 103 South Broadway in Lexington.

MR. CCOPER was questioned relative to the existence of this organization at the present time at which time he advised that the Kentucky Workers Alliance had been incorported into a national organization. When MR. COOPER was questioned as to with what national organization the Kentucky Workers Alliance had been incorporated he refused to give any further information.

It was further stated by MR. COOPER that subject remained in Lexington to the best of his knowledge only a very short period of time, during the organization of the Kentucky Workers Alliance, and at the present time he stated he did not know where subject was located.

At this time MR. COOPER failed to give any further information or to elaborate on the activity of the Kentucky Workers Alliance or to give any further information regarding subject in this case.

AT BEREA, KENTUCKY

MISS JEAN ROBERT, assistant to the Registrar at Berea College, was interviewed relative to subject's activities at Berea College. After a search of her attendance records she advised the Agent that subject was never in attendance at Berea therefore the writer was unable to obtain any information relative to subject's activities while supposedly in attendance at this college.

Inasmuch as the subject in this case did not attend Berea college, their indices would not reflect the subject's activity, if any, during the Harlan County coal strike.

CULBERTSON stated that subject continued to visit the home of MANUEL SUFTON, who is distantly related to him, at Snow Spring community up until about two years ago. He stated that he had not seen subject in that neighborhood since that time.

CULBERTSON stated that MANUEL SUTTON and as well as his sons-in-law, JEJEL EVERETT and HENRY COKER, were actively engaged in organizing Jehovah's Witness activities, and that they had meetings on the average of once or twice a week at MANUEL SUTTON's
home in the Snow Spring community, and that at these meetings representatives
of various Jehovahis Witness groups came from Tennessee, Alabama, South Carolina,
and other neighboring states.
CULBERTSON stated that he had seen and distributing Jehovah's Witness literature in Calhoun and Rome, Georgia, and also that he had seen JENEL EVERETT distributing this literature in Calhoun, Georgia. CULBERTSON stated that he could not recall just exactly what subject had said during the time that he preached around the Jnow Spring community, but said in substance that subject was opposed to the free school system and talked that labor should control all public utilities, and that in general the b6 working people should control things in this country.
REV. R. C. KINSEY, pastor of the Baptist Church, Cassville, Georgia, and former pastor of the church at Snow Spring community, advised that MANUEL SUTTON, his wife and sons were active in Jehovah's Witness work, and that though

they had formerly been members of his church, they had left his church about the time that subject first came into the Snow Spring community with his Socialistic ideas.

IIr. KINSEY stated that MANUEL SUTTON and helped subject during the period of 1930 and 1931 when subject was spreading his Socialistic ideas and some of them did distribute copies of the Daily Worker in that locality. Mr. KINSEY said that he had not heard anything unfavorable about subject for several years, and as far as he knew subject was working on a farm near Cassville, Georgia. He stated that he had seen subject about a week previous in Cassville, Georgia.

AT CASSVILLE, GEORGIA:

S. M. PITTARD who operates a general store, advised that subject had kept to himself for the past several months and that he had not heard anything specific about any further unknerican activity on the part of subject. On June 15, 1942 this office was in receipt of a letter from the Hammond, Indiana Police Department in which they advised that the individual with the initials "H. S. K." is Dr. HEDJIG S. KUHN, the wife of Dr. HUGH A. KUHN, Hammond, Indiana. She was born in Chicago, Illinois and is 47 years old. Her father, Professor STIEGLITZ, now deceased, was a professor at the University of Chicago and was known to be liberal in his views. She also has a brother, Dr. EDJARD J. STIEGLITZ, last known address Garett Park, Maryland. She is Jewish.

The letter further revealed that Dr. HEDJIG S. KUHN is a practicing eye specialist and is associated in business with her husband, Dr. HUGH A. KUHN and Dr. SMITH at 112 Rimbach Street, Hammond, Indiana. Dr. HEDJIG is very active in civic affairs, especially the "Open Forum," an organization established for the purpose of bringing nationally known lecturers to the city and she has always been very liberal, almost bordering on the communistic, but never actually connected or associated with any Communistic or other radical group in Hammond, Indiana.

The said letter revealed that most of her social connections are in Chicago, Illinois.

The letter signed by Mr. HERBERT NEAFIRK, police officer of the Hammond, Indiana Police Department stated that Mr. NEWKIRK has personally known the subject for the past eighteen years and has never heard or known her to make any un-American statements.

The following is a summary of further information regarding subject contained in the files of the Cincinnati Field Division.

In file 100-15, entitled "COMMUNIST PARTY, COLUMBUS, OHIO: INTERNAL SECURITY (C)", Report of Special Agent R. J. Campbell dated October 8, 1940 at Cincinnati, sets forth information supplied by confidential informant and who attended the Emergency Peace Mobilization held at Chicago, Illinois on August 31, September 1 and 2, 1940. On page 12 of that report subject is listed as a Communist Party member with whom informants came in contact in Chicago, and of subject be it is said, "Bethel, Ohio - Minister; writer for Daily Worker."
In Cincinnati file 100-2966 entitled "NOTES OF CONFIDENTIAL INFORMANTS and a memorandum of Special Agent S. H. Horton dated May 13, 1942, reflects that on December 9, 1941 Confidential Informant turned over a leaflet issued by the Cincinnati Youth Committee Against War. advertising speeches by REV. DONALD WEST and JOHN FOSTER. This leaflet by MARJORY DOWERS, 2022 Western Avenue,
Cincinneti, Ohio in November of 1940. MARJORY DOWLERS is a prominent member of the Communist Party at Cincinneti. The leaflet is entitled "Now the job begins" and gives notice of a rally for peace and an armistice observance to be scheduled for Monday evening, November 11, 1940 at 8:15 o'clock at the Ninth Street Baptist Church, 21 W. Ninth Street, Cincinneti, the speakers to be Rev. DONALD WEST, on the subject, "We Must Keep Out", and JOHN FOSTER on the subject "I saw China Fight for Peace". This leaflet is being retained in the Cincinneti file but will be furnished to the Atlanta Field Office upon request.
In Cincinnati File No. 65-246 entitled "COMMUNIST PARTY ACTIVITIES IN CINCINNATI, OHIO; INTERNAL SECURITY - C", serial 37 thereof, which is a report of Special Agent S. H. Horton dated January 21, 1941, contains a report of Confidential Informant ander date of November 7, 1940 at Cincinnati, which is as follows:

"At the Ninth Street Church we talked briefly with one DON WEST, an acquaintance I met in Chicago at the EPM meeting. Speakers were WEST (REV. DONALD), Bethel, Ohio and JOHN FOSTER (REV.), Cincinnati, Ohio. FOSTER returned recently from China. He spoke highly of Chinese Guerrillas, their hard scrap against the Japs. He praised the Communists and non-Communists alike. He advocated American intervention and aid to the Chinese, plus a flat embargo on Japan. It didn't sound like a peace oration. WEST talked more on the peace line, but not pacifist. He followed the Communist Party line exclusively. He disclosed that he has been shepherd of some seven churches in rural Clermont County. Ohio. (He is leaving for the South again.) He told Informant that he is settling in Georgia -- where he came from -- near Macon. He will take up the religion business down there. He has not heard from HAROLD FREECE, with whom he roomed in Chicago, since the EFM meeting. (WEST leaves for Georgia tomorrow, November 12, 1940.) He lacks two fingers of the left hand, index and middle, and hides this disfigurement very cleverly."

There being no further investigation to be conducted in this Field Division, this case is being referred upon completion to the office of origin.

REVEREND GREEN stated that during the last Presidential election he had attended a Communist meeting in Cincinnati in the company of the subject. While at this meeting he had been introduced to a man by the name of BOB GUNKEE who was secretary of the Communist Party. The REVEREND GREEN stated that the meeting seemed innocent enough to him.

The REVEREND GREEN described the subject as a man who had worked himself up, who had studied hard, and who had traveled in Russia. He was the type that was always writing to Congressmen and the type who preaches very radical sermons. He stated that the subject knew about, or was connected with, the Communist magazine, "Friday."

The REVEREND GREEN stated that he was with the subject in Georgia when Germany marched on Russia. He stated that the subject did not know what to mak of this situation. When the REVEREND GREEN got to Georgia the subject was printing pro-peace papers. However, the subject's attitude changed gradually and he stopped printing the pro-peace papers and had buried his printing press on his farm in northern Georgia. The REVEREND GREEN stated that in his belief the subject is very harmless as long as Russia is on the side of the Allies. If Russia were not on the side of the Allies he would consider the subject dangerous The REVEREND GREEN stated that he was not in Georgia at the time of the peonage trials, but that he understood that the subject had tried to organize a movement to get QUNNINGHAM, the subject in the peonage case, put in jail. The REVEREND GREEN gave the reporting Agent a copy of the "Southern News Almanac" in which there appears an article written by the REVEREND DONAED L. WEST.

The REVEREND GREEN stated that MISS PATTY LEE COGHILL, 287 Fourth Avenue New York City, knows the subject very well, and was his secretary while he was in Georgia.

Confidential Informant T-l advised that the subject had been connected with the Highlander Folk School, a school that was associated with and sponsored by Communists. Communism appeared early among the supporters of the Highlander Folk School. MYLES HORTON was the first member of the staff, and was, on December 30, 1941, the head of that school. DONALD WEST was next after MYLES HORTON to come as a member of the Highlander Folk School staff. DON WEST came from Kenesaw, Georgia. He was educated at the Berry School in Georgia, according which was founded by MARGARET BERRY.

at 177 Elizabeth Street, N. E. The 1939, 1940, and 1941 Directories conteined no record of GEORGE G. WARD. The 1942 City Directory for Atlanta listed a TEMPIE WARD as residing in Apartment #1, 186 Hurt Street, N. E.

Mrs. SALLIE R. SPINKS, 186 Hurt Street, N. E., advised on interview that she was the mother of TEAPIE WARD, the divorced wife of GEORGE GORDON TARD. She stated that her daughter had not lived with WARD for approximately four years. Mrs. SPINKS stated that GEORGE G. WARD had formerly been associated with a man named DONALD L. WEST but that she did not know just what the nature of their relationship was. She advised that her daughter, Mrs. THAPIE WARD, was employed by the Atlanta Tuberculosis Association, 286 Forrest Avenue.

Mrs. TEMPIE WARD advised upon interview that her husband, GEORGE G. WARD, resided on Central Avenue in Atlanta and was employed by the WPA. She was unable to furnish his exact address. Mrs. WARD stated that GEORGE WARD had been born and reared in Gilmer County, Georgia, and that he had known BONALD WEST in Gilmer County. She advised that she knew her former husband had been associated with WEST but was unable to furnish information as to the nature of the association. She said that WARD had brought WEST to their home several times before they were divorced. She stated, however, that she had not had much conversation with WEST and could furnish no information regarding his nationalistic tendencies.

Ers. WARD stated that she had two children and that her former husband came to see the children at her home approximately once each week.

Mrs. WARD stated that she had never heard WARD make any statement concerning VEST which would indicate that WEST was Communist, and that her
former husband would not have anything to do with VEST if he were a Communist.
She stated that WARD was definitely a loyal American, and expressed the opinion
that he would be more than willing to furnish any information in his possession
regarding the nationalistic tendencies of WEST.

Mr. B. L. PAYNE, employment manager of the WPA, 10 Forsyth Street Building, Atlanta, advised after a check of his records that GEORGE G. WARD, WPA #1160-29614, was presently employed by the WPA as a Cost and Materials clerk at Fort McPherson. He stated that his records indicated WARD had been born at Winterport, Georgia, on July 9, 1887.

GEORGE G. WARD, 642 Central Avenue, advised upon interview that he was acquainted with DONAID L. WEST, having known him for many years. He said that he and WEST were natives of Gilmer County, Georgia. WARD advised that he was the official historian for Gilmer County and that WEST, being an author, was interested in the history of Gilmer County. WARD advised that WEST had assisted him in gathering data and doing research work to write the history of Gilmer County.

WARD advised that approximately two years ago when WEST was

preaching in a small church near Zebulon, Georgia, he had come to Atlanta to spend the night with him in his home on Central Avenue. WARD stated that when WEST left his residence after spending the night he had left two suitcases and asked WARD to take care of them for him. WARD stated that he had opened the suitcases after WEST had left to see what they contained and found that they were full of literature which he considered to be Communist literature. WARD advised that when WEST returned to his house in the afternoon he had told him that he was not interested in Communist literature and requested that he remove the suitcases and literature from his home at once, and stated that VEST had complied with this request.

GEORGE WARD stated that WEST was very radical in his views and very pro-labor. He advised that he himself was an open minded individual and had associated with WEST despite his radical ideas because he, WARD, believed that evern man was entitled to his own political and religious views.

WARD was questioned concerning WEST's attitude toward the current war, particularly as to how he felt before and after the German invasion of Russia. He stated that he recalled that WEST had been a pacifist before the German invasion of Russia and that shortly thereafter WEST had changed and advocated U. S. intervention into the war. WARD advised that he recalled questioning WEST concerning this and stated that WEST had answered by saying that prior to Russia's involvement in the war the war had been an "imperialistic war" but that since Hitler had attacked Russia it was now a "worker's war." WARD advised further that at WEST's insistence he had subscribed to a paper known as the Southern News Almanac, published in Birmingham, Alabama. He stated that after receiving several copies of this newspaper he decided it was a very radical publication and probably of Communistic origin, so he had requested that WEST have his subscription cancelled. WARD advised that this was done.

WARD stated that WEST never actually told him that he was a Communist or a member of the Communist Party, and never tried to get him to join the Communist Party. He stated, however, that from his dealings and conversations with NEST he was definitely of the opinion that NEST was a Communist.

WARD stated that he last saw WEST in September of 1942 when WEST came to his home on Central Avenue am advised him that he was attempting to get a job as a school teacher at Lula, Georgia. WARD stated that WEST had tried to get him to write a letter of endorsement to the School Board of Hall County to assist him in getting this position. WARD advised that he was of the opinion that Communists had no place in public schools and, therefore, had refused to endorse WEST. He stated that he did not know whether or not WEST had been successful in securing this position because he had not seen him since that time.

WARD volunteered the information that he had attended no meetings of the Communist Party with WEST and had made no contributions to the Communist cause.

She also stated that the subject was very intimate with Postmaster JOHN E. JONES, and HUBERT TATE. TATE, incidentally, was also mentioned by as being very friendly toward WEST.
No attempt was made by the agent to make further contacts regarding the subject at this time inasmuch as informed the agent that people in Iula are generally quite garrulous and that any news of an investigation regarding the subject would immediately be circulated around the community.

MEMORANDUM FOR
HUGH B. COX, ASSISTANT ATTORNEY GENERAL
AND

J. EDGAR HOOVER, DIRECTOR FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION

I refer to Mr. L. M. C. Smith's memorandum to me dated June 28, 1943, which reviews the history, development, and meaning of the Special Case work and of the danger classifications that were made as a part of that work.

After full re-consideration of these individual danger classifications, I am satisfied that they serve no useful purpose. The detention of alien enemies is being dealt with under the procedures established by the Alien Enemy Control Unit. The Special Case procedure has been found to be valueless and is not used in that connection. There is no statutory authorization or other present justification for keeping a "custodial detention" list of citizens. The Department fulfills its proper functions by investigating the activities of persons who may have violated the law. It is not aided in this work by classifying persons as to dangerousness.

Apart from these general considerations, it is now clear to me that this classification system is inherently unreliable. The evidence used for the purpose of making the classifications was inadequate; the standards applied to the evidence for the purpose of making the classifications were defective; and finally, the notion that it is possible to make a valid determination as to how dangerous a person is in the abstract and without reference to time, environment, and other relevant circumstances, is impractical, unwise, and dangerous.

For the foregoing reasons I am satisified that the adoption of this classification system was a mistake that should be rectified for the future. Accordingly, I direct that the classifications heretofore made should not be regarded as classifications of dangerousness or as a

determination of fact in any sense. In the future, they should not be used for any purpose whatsoever. Questions raised as to the status or activities of a particular person should be disposed of by consideration of all available information, but without reference to any classification heretofore made.

A copy of this memorandum should be placed in the file of each person who has hitherto been given a classification. In addition, each card upon which a classification appears should be stamped with the following language:

"THIS CLASSIFICATION IS UNRELIABLE. IT IS HEREBY CANCELLED, AND SHOULD NOT BE USED AS A DETERMINATION OF DANGEROUSNESS OR OF ANY OTHER FACT. (SEE MEMORANDUM OF JULY 16, 1943 FROM THE ATTORNEY GENERAL TO HUGH B. COX AND J. EDGAR HOOVER)."

the subject last year but he had not made any effort to return to that school this year, due to his dislike for the Principal. Mr. SHAGRAVES stated he had taught for eight consecutive years at this school prior to leaving on July 1, 1943. SHAGRAVES gave the following information concerning the subject:

Subject told him, while he was teaching under him, that he had traveled extensively in Russia and in Germany and Belgium; that subject was very high in his craise of Russia. Subject never told him that he attended school in either Berlin or Paris. It is his information that subject was born and reared in Gilmer County and attended Oglethorpe University. He was told by subject that the reason he came to the Lula-Belton School was in order to get information for a novel which he was writing concerning rural people. Subject was always desirous of getting before the public. He organized several "Victory Clubs" in the vicinity of Lula in January, 1943, but did not carry on the work which he started with the clubs.

SEAGRAVES advised that in his opinion, the subject was a Communist, though he had nothing to substantiate his suspicion.

AT CORVILIA, GEORGIA.

On September 7, 1943, RALPH W. WATERS, Principal of the Hickory Flat School, which is located approximately five miles east of Lula, gave the following information concerning the subject:

Subject came to his school in March, 1943 and organized a Victory Garden Club, however, he made only one other trip to this vicinity and the club never did get well under way. Subject told him that he attended Vanderbilt College, Nashville, Tennessee and had taken a course at the University of Berlin and at the University of Paris in either 1938 or 1939. This informant further advised he could get more information concerning the educational background of the subject, at which time he would get in touch with an Agent of this office and pass his findings on to him.

The following investigation was conducted by Special Agent MARCUS B. CALHOUN:

AT ATLANTA, GHORGIA.

Mrs. RUTH FERGUSON, Registrer, Oglethorpe University, stated that her records indicated that DONALD L. WEST of Lula, Georgia enrolled in that institution during the Fall term of 1942 for courses in Adult Education. She stated that

this work was being done on a Master's Degree in Education. Mrs. FERGUSON advised that WEST had taken courses under Professor MORRIS HARDWICK and Dr. H. J. GERTNER.

Dr. H. J. GERTHER advised that DONALD L. WEST had taken a course in Adult Education under him at Oglethorpe University during the Fall term of 1942 and Spring term of 1945. He described WEST as being highly intelligent and a very attentive pupil, stating that WEST had never made any statement in his presence to indicate that he was anything other than a loyal American citizen. Dr. GERTHER stated that WEST had commuted to school from Iula, Georgia, where he was employed as Principal in a high school and that he had not been carticularly friendly with anyone in his class. Dr. GERTHER stated that he had probably had more conversations with WEST than anyone else at Oglethorpe University and advised that he considered him to be a good American.

In view of the fact that there is no indication that this subject is presently engaged in Communist activity, this case is being marked closed on the authority of the Special Agent in Charge.

On December 30, 1943, Confidential Informant whose identity is known to the Bureau, contacted this office and gave the following information to both Special Agent MARCUS B. CALHOUN:

Subject, Inla, Georgia, called upon her on the night of December 9, 1943 at 9:50 P.M. and stated that he had gone to Atlanta, Georgia from Monteagle, Tennessee where he had spent some time with HAROID PREACH. Subject advised that he had seen ROBERT F. HALL in Chattenonce. Tennessee and that HALL had the and furnish information instructed him to about a spy in the Communist Party in Georgia. (It is to be noted that Robert F. Hall is the former Secretary of the Communist Party, District #17). Subject stated that the Communist Party had determined that one FRANK MOALLISTER of Atlanta. Georgia was a spy who pretended to be interested in the party work but who in reality was trying to get information about the party. The subject stated that he had recently received a letter from FRANK MCALLISTER wherein MCALLISTER had questioned him as to his activities but that he had not given McALLISTER any information. WEST further advised that he wished to speak to some of the Communist leaders in Atlanta concerning this matter and specifically requesting that the informant contact NATHAN KATZ and WHITMAN DAY and ask them to call at the meeting place. KATZ and DAY were contacted along with JOSEPH A. MOREIAND. W. B. JENKISS and GERTRUDE DIAMOND and that all these individuals came to a meeting. The subject informed the individuals that the party was suspicious of MoALLISTER; that it was highly possible that MOALLISTER might try to get some information from them for the FBI and that they were to give him no information whatsoever. WEST stated that people like McALLISTER were the main cause of the Comminist Party in the South going underground at the present time. He stated that the Communist Party had a person who was watching McALLISTER. He further advised that JOSEPHINE WIIKINS who works for the Citizens Fact-Finding Committee in the Forsyth Street Building was very friendly with McALLISTER and was watching every move he makes. He stated that as long as he felt that JOSEPHINE was his friend the Communist Party did not have anything to worry about. The Informent stated that subject was questioned as to what connection WIIKINS had with the Communist Party and he stated that she was a good Communist.

WHITMAN DAY questioned subject as to whether or not FRANK MCALLISTER had any party connections and subject replied, "We won't discuss that now". He was questioned as to why the Party was suspicious of McALLISTER and stated that McALLISTER had recently gotten a very fine office in a downtown building and that the party believed he was being backed by someone other than the person he worked for. He stated it appeared McALLISTER was only trying to get information concerning the "Gentile" group in Atlanta but that he felt sure that McALLISTER would stop at nothing once he found out anything concerning the members of other Communist Party groups.



further advised that/the meeting referred to Confidential Informant above subject stated that at the present time he is doing research work because he intended to run for Congress from his Congressional district in the next election. He stated he was making a speech over the radio from Gainesville, b2 Georgia each Friday night and in this way was gaining considerable publicity b7D which he believed would aid in his campaign. He stated he had been actively campaigning for a nine months' school year forthe colored schools and had been successful in obtaining a nine months! school year for them. He advised that he was teaching school in Iula, Georgia and that he came to Atlanta every two weeks to attend classes at Georgia Tech. He advised that he is married, has two children and that his entire family is Communist. He stated he has a sister who has just returned from the Soviet Union and is presently in New York City where she is writing a book. The subject said that due to the fact that he is principal of the school at Iula and exerted a great deal of influence in that community, he believed he would be successful in organizing an active branch of the Communist Party there.

AT GAINESVILLE, GEORGIA:

On July 13, 1944, Sheriff W. A. CROWE advised that subject was a candidate for Hall County, Georgia representative in the State Legislature in the State Primary on July 4, 1944 but was defeated. Sheriff CROWE delivered to the reporting agent some of the subject's campaign literature which has a picture of the subject on it. Copies of this campaign literature are being retained in the files of this office. CROWE stated that he would closely follow the activities of the subject and report any activities inimical to the interest of this country.

WALDEMAR BRUNG HILLE, subject of Knoxville file #100-1799 and who, according to Knoxville Office is familiar with Communist matters, visited subject for three or four months beginning the first of 1944. A book of poems subject wrote entitled Toil and Hunger" directed to share croppers, textile employees, and miners, is in school library, Lula, Georgia, where subject is superintendent. Subject defeated for president of Hall County, Ga. Teachers' Association. Superintendent of Education advised subject's un-American tendencies known to Board of Education; subject probably will not be re-elected superintendent of Lula Schools at expiration of present school year. Subject visited at New York City during Christmas holidays. DETAILS:

On October 28, 1944, confidential informant T-1 advised that WALDEMAR BRUNO HILLE had visited in the home of the subject for three or four months beginning the first of 1944. Records in this office reflect that HILLE is subject of Knoxville, Tennessee file #100-1788, Atlanta file #100-3923 and according to the Knoxville Office, is familiar with Communist matters. file #100-3923 reflects that HILLE worked in a textile mill at New Holland, Georgia from January 11, 1944 to March 4, 1944 at which time he quit of his own accord, allegedly to go to New York to live with his sister.

Confidential Informant T-1 displayed to the reporting agent a book of poems subject wrote entitled "Toil and Hunger", which is directed to sharecroppers, textile employees, and miners. This informant further advised that this book of poems is kept in the school library at Lula, Georgia where the subject is superintendent. A review of this book of poems reflected that it was printed by the Hagglund Press at San Benito, Texas, 1940. The introduction which is written by JESSE STUART has this to say in the last paragraph "this man is not confined to the mountains. He has been a hitchhiker and globe trotter. After thumbing his way over the United States, he went abroad and pumped a bicycle over Germany, England, France, Belgium, Norway, Sweden, Denmark, and other countries. Few men of his age have had the varied experience of DON WEST."

This informant further advised that R. E. JONES, Postmaster at Lula, Georgia, is the closest friend subject has in this community. For this reason, no mail cover has been placed with the Postmaster on subject's mail. This informant further advised that the subject visited in New York City during the Christmas holidays, 1944, for approximately two weeks and upon his return stated that he went to New York to see about writing a book. Subject did not reveal the name of the book which he intended to write. This informant further advised that subject who is very active in civic, religious, and educational affairs and in the vicinity of Lula, Georgia, has publicly denounced Communism. in this area. He stated he had heard the subject denounce Communism in the pulpit of the Lula Baptist Church and from the stage in the auditorium of the Lula School. This informant was of the opinion that subject's action in denouncing Communism was intended to throw any of the local people off who might think he was engaged in any un-American tendencies.

At Gainesville, Georgia

On October 5, 1944, B. RHETT TURNIPSEED, Personnel Director, Pacolet Mfg.Company, New Holland Mill, advised that he was recently elected President of the Hall County, Georgia Teachers! Association. He stated at the time the election the subject was his opponent and from all appearances had a lot of supporters among the school teachers in the vicinity of Lula, Georgia. He stated, however, that outside the vicinity of Lula, Georgia, the subject had very few supporters and from what he had heard various teachers say, whose names he did not remember,

the subject is losing his popularity among the school teachers. TURNIP-SEED said he had heard several teachers say that they did not feel the subject was a loyal American citizen although they did not have anything to substantiate their feeling. TURNIPSEED stated that to his knowledge H. GRADY JARRARD, superintendent of education, was bitterly opposed to the subject and felt that the subject was engaged in un-American activities.

On the same date, JARRARD was contacted and gave the following information. He is convinced from information which he has received from the community where subject formerly taught and lived in the vicinity of Meansville, Georgia and from the subject's activities since coming to Hall County, Georgia, that he, the subject, is not a loyal American citizen, and is probably engaged in un-American activities, probably being active in Communist meetings. JARRARD stated that he had no concrete evidence to sutstantiate this belief. JARRARD stated that the subject's un-American tendencies were known to the Hall County Board of Education and that in all probability the subject would not be reelected as Superintendent of Lula Schools at the expiration of the present school year. JARRARD stated that subject told him he visited in New York City during the Christmas holidays from December 23, 1944 to January 1, 1945. Subject did not say the purpose of his visit to New York.

On August 12, 1944,

Georgia called at the Atlanta Field Division and furnished Assistant Agent in Charge A. I. MEANS, with pamphlets which he stated were received in the vicinity of Meansville from the subject. He also advised that he from HUBERT O. TATE, P. O. Box 131, Lula, Georgia, at which time Mr. TATE requested information concerning the subject. These pamphlets consist of the February, March, and June, 1944 issues of the Southern Patriot" published at Nashville, Temmessee, edited by JAMES A. DOMBROWSKI and the pamphlet entitled There are Things to Do" by LILLIAN E. STITH. All the pamphlets dealt in substance with the racial situation in the South and advocated no race discrimination and an equal opportunity to all people regardless of race, color, or creed. These pamphlets are being retained in the files of this office.

At Gainesville, Georgia

On August 19, 1944, R. C. McCLURE, Deputy Clerk, U.S. District Court, advised that J. E. JONES, Postmaster, Lula, Georgia, contacted his office and requested him to have an FBI agent come to see him at Lula in the very near future.

At Lula, Georgia

On August 19, 1944, J. E. JONES was contacted, at which time he gave the following information:

He stated he had been Postmaster for nineteen years and that during this time he had made several enemies in this community. For the past twelve to eighteen months, enemies of his had been trying to oust the subject as superintendent of education at the Luia, Belton School. JONES stated he and the subject are very close friends and, in his opinion, the subject is a splendid superintendent of education and "a 100% American citizen." JONES stated that HUBERT O. TATE had been the leader of the movement to oust the subject as superintendent there. He advised TATE had put out information that the subject was wanted by the FBI. JONES stated for this reason he desired to contact the FBI and ascertain if this was true. JONES was advised by the reporting agent that any information contained in the FBI files is strictly confidential and the Attorney General has held that the information cannot be released.

At Gainesville, Georgia

On January 24, 1945, Sheriff W. A. "Bill" CROW, advised that the subject is not as active in civic, religious, and educational affairs as he was approximately one year ago and that, in his opinion, he is losing considerable strength, Hall County, Georgia. CROW produced a letter to the subject dated April 29, 1944 from the CIO Political Action, Southeastern Region, 75 Ivy Street, NE, Atlanta, Georgia, signed GEORGE MITCHELL, Regional Director, endorsing "GOOLSEY for the U. S. Senate against GEORGE, the incumbent."

CROW stated that in his opinion neither J. E. JONES, Postmaster, Lula, Georgia, nor HUBERT O. TATE, School Official, Lula, Georgia, should be contacted relative to subject inasmuch as JONES is the subject's best friend and TATE is a very indiscreet and unpopular politician. CROW stated that TATE probably could not be confided in. CROW assured the writer that he was following subject's activities very closely and he would report his findings to an agent of the FBI from time to time.

Confidential Informant T-1 also assured the writer that he would follow and report activities of the subject as Special Agent of the FBI from time to time.

In view of the arrangements for the following of the subject's activities, this case is being placed in a pending inactive status upon the authority of the Special Agent in Charge.



On Jamuary 7, 1946, Confidential Informant T-1 advised that MOLLY BELFRAGE, wife of CEDRIC BELFRAGE, discussed the impending appearance of the subject before group meetings. At that time MOLLY stated subject was on sabbatical leave from the school at Iula, Georgia, where he was Superintendent of Schools. She also stated that the subject was of original Georgia background and intended returning to Georgia to run for Congress against Congressman WOODS of the reorganized Dies Committee.

On January 21, 1946, Confidential Informant T-2 advised that while subject was at the office of Dr. A. B. WEINSTEIN, one FRIEDA, whose identity is unknown, advised that she would meet him for lunch that day.




The Cry for Justice In the South Today


By SAMUEL SILLEN

Don West loves the South; and because he loves it he is filled with bitter grief and burning anger. He speaks for the poor people of the South, Negro and white, the people with the "gaunt eyes," the people who hate Bilbo and Talmadge with a consuming hate that lew of us up North can rival.

He is the poet of these people, singing with terrific power of their hunger and their hope, their fury which has not achieved full consciousness. It is of their debt-ridden lives that he sings, the children with rickets and flux. Of strange fruit and poisoned trees, of death in the mills.

Don West is not merely a poet of pain, but of struggle. The tragedy here is too deep for tears. Nor is there even a tiny corner here for merely benevolent, liberalism which some aristocratic southern writers have lately made popular. Nor





No, this is the authentic voice of real people, authentic in its lyric simplicity, which is something quite different from an artificially assumed folksiness. It has the beauty of a genuine identification

His is the cry for justice. He sees himself as The Agitator, the restless voice of toiling millions stirring and stumbling toward a new world. And he knows that the overworked and underfed cannot achieve freedom unless the brothers in oppression unite, unless toiling white makes common cause with toiling black.

There is agony in his pages, but there is also the firmness of spirit that comes from undivided commitment to struggle. West's poems are not slogans; they are sharp images torn out of intimate memory of dull, hopeless faces, of bent backs, of numbing terror. One feels here "The spell of living people."

These poems speak of a South whose anger is "slow, groaning" but which is born of toil and hunger and which is "Tearing at a million hearts." It is the South that Talmadge and Bilbo and their northern financial backers are seeking to hold back by more hunger, more terror. It is the South that we will be hearing from ever more insistently as the CIO campaign develops.

Don West expresses the hope that his poems will "help to kindle little sparks that will grow into big flames." It will not be his fault if the sparks are not kindled.

It is good to greet this first volume by a man whose separately E published poems many of us have admired for a long time. At 36, Don West is an important force in the creation of a people's herature not only for the South, but of the whole nation. Quarrel as one may with his repetition of images, and the uneven quality of some of his few verse forms, here things takenly is a voice that achieves individually through its intense expression of a collective experience.

The Toil And Hunger l've Seen

By DON WEST

ONCE upon a time, not too long ago, authors wrote mainly about kings and nobles-the aristocracy. Many stories and poems were filled with debauchery and intrigues. Writers occupied themselves in turning out tales about the purity of lovely ladies and the daring of gallant gentlemen who never did a useful day's work in their lives:

The fact that systems of kings and nobles, of aristocratic ladies and useless gentlemen, were always reared upon the misery of masses of peasants, slaves, or workers was carefully omitted from most books. The idea that these same peasants, slaves, or workers might themselves be fit material for literature would have been heresy:

You may think this a strange sort of way to begin an introdu tion to a group of poems. You may be one of those Americans who say you don't like poetry anyhow. No one can blame you for that. I've often felt that way, too. Maybe it's because too many poets, write in the old tradition.

Using an obscure an "subtle" private language, they write only for the little clique of the "highly literate" elite. But in spite of theirhigh and mighty intellectual snobbery, one finds them, after all, concerned mostly with minor themes.

Such literary gentlemen, writing only for the "elite" ten per-cent, spurn the "crude" and "vulgar" masses. They still have their eyes full of star dust. They sea neither the dirt and misery not the beauty and heroism of common folk life.

Vith Roots

You say you want a poem v roots in the earth; a poem that finds beauty in the lives of common people, and perhaps a poem that may sometimes show the reasons for the heartache and sorrow, of the plain folks and sometimes point the way ahead I dont blame you. I sort of feel that way too.

Does this sound like a strange notion about poetry? Maybe it is Some people say I have strange notions anyhow. I don't know. I've been a preacher, and I've preached the workingman Jesus who had some strange notions himself about the poor and the rich and the slaves; I've been a coal miner in Kentucky's Cumberlands and a textile worker in Carolina: I've béen a radio com mentator in Georgia and a ded hand on a Mississippi Rive steamboat. I've been a sailor farm owner, and farmer. I am now a school superintendent. And I've wondered why it always seems that the folks who work less get more and those who work more get less.

Our people, the real southern mass majority of whites, are the ones the Negroes were taught to call "pore white trash." And we in turn, were taught the hateful word "nigger." Nice little trick, isn't it? Hitler used it too. And it is still being used today, by the whites from the big houses, who engineer lynchings and make it seem that the responsibility is the white workers....

My real education has been beaten into me by the evertasting toll and hunger I've seen, by the struggles in textile and coal ming centers, where our people were olled down from the hills with ir promises of a better life.



The wires leading from the main frame to the Atlanta Field Division terminal box will be leased by this office under an assumed name and fictitious address. It is anticipated that thereafter recording machines will be set up in the room presently being used as a mimeograph and addressograph room in the Atlanta Field Division. It should be noted that this room has a wooden door with a glass panel opening into a public hall on the Fifth Floor of the Healey Building. (Continued on Page 5)

6 Type of case involved:

This is an Internal Security case involving DONALD LEE WEST, who is a key figure in the Communist Party activities in the Atlanta Field Division. He is a teacher at Oglethorpe University. HOMER BATES CHASE, Communist Party organizer for the states of Georgia and Florida, has been in constant touch with WEST and has had lengthy visits with him, a recent visit lasting from approximately 11:00 PM until 5:00 AM the following morning. WEST has also been seen in contact with CHASE securing printed literature which apparently was being distributed by the Communist Party. He has also been seen in conversation with CHASE and NATHAN ROSS, who is (Continued on Page 5)

7. Connection or status of subject in the case:

It is believed that WEST is working directly with the CP, USA in the south and is believed to be the principal key figure at the present time in Communist activities in the vicinity of Atlanta.

. Specific information being sought:

It is believed that information concerning the plans of the CP, USA in the south, as well as the identities of individuals connected with the movement in this area may be determined through this surveillance.

9. Reasons for believing the specific information will be obtained by the technical surveillance:

It has been noted that frequent conferences have been held between WEST and known members of the Communist movement and it is believed that from this surveillance it may be possible to determine the matters discussed at these conferences, as well as the identities of individuals contacted from this residence.

10. Importance of case and subject:

At the present time this matter is being given preferred investigative attention of the Atlanta Field Division, inasmuch as there is an indication that the Communist Party is becoming very active in this area at the present time.



11. Possibilities of obtaining desired information by other means (Explain in detail):

It does not appear that there is a possibility of obtaining the desired information by any other means, inasmuch as it is impossible to gain access to these conferences through any other manner. It is noted that speeches or discussions made at these conferences, believed held in the WEST home, may be picked up through the means of the Mic-Telephone combination.





12. Risks of detection involved:

The risk of detection in this instance is believed to be very nominal. As related hereinbefore, the Southern Bell Belephone Company has been very cooperative in the past and will run an extra set of wires from the connector block of the instrument involved to an unused pair of wires leading to the main frame of the telephone exchange, where they will be strapped onto a pair of wires leading to the terminal box of the Atlanta Office. This set of wires will be leased by the Atlanta Field Division under an assumed name and fictitious address.
