

## EXPLANATION OF EXEMPTIONS

### SUBSECTIONS OF TITLE 5, UNITED STATES CODE, SECTION 552

- (b)(1) (A) specifically authorized under criteria established by an Executive order to be kept secret in the interest of national defense or foreign policy and (B) are in fact properly classified to such Executive order;
- (b)(2) related solely to the internal personnel rules and practices of an agency;
- (b)(3) specifically exempted from disclosure by statute (other than section 552b of this title), provided that such statute (A) requires that the matters be withheld from the public in such a manner as to leave no discretion on issue, or (B) establishes particular criteria for withholding or refers to particular types of matters to be withheld;

- (b)(7) records or information compiled for law enforcement purposes, but only to the extent that the production of such law enforcement records or information ( A ) could reasonably be expected to interfere with enforcement proceedings, ( B ) would deprive a person of a right to a fair trial or an impartial adjudication, ( C ) could reasonably be expected to constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy, ( D ) could reasonably be expected to disclose the identity of confidential source, including a State, local, or foreign agency or authority or any private institution which furnished information on a confidential basis, and, in the case of record or information compiled by a criminal law enforcement authority in the course of a criminal investigation, or by an agency conducting a lawful national security intelligence investigation, information furnished by a confidential source, ( E ) would disclose techniques and procedures for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions, or would disclose guidelines for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions if such disclosure could reasonably be expected to risk circumvention of the law, or ( F ) could reasonably be expected to endanger the life or physical safety of any individual;
- (b)(8) contained in or related to examination, operating, or condition reports prepared by, on behalf of, or for the use of an agency responsible for the regulation or supervision of financial institutions; or
- (b)(9) geological and geophysical information and data, including maps, concerning wells.

Thank you for your promptness in sending me the forms. I will appreciate anything you can do to speed up the process of clearance. Along that line, on the advice of two friends who were in the C.I.A., I want to supply you with some information that may help you and that you can use as you see fit.

Although I have never attended any of its meetings (and have not even had a chance to vote for its candidates, as they do not appear on the Louisiana ballot), I have been, for the past year, a member of the Socialist Party-Social Democratic Federation.

At the University of Wisconsin, as a graduate student between 1958 and 1960, I knew and often talked with [REDACTED] and the other history graduate students who started the journal, Studies on the Left (I understand, but do not know for certain, that some of these were involved in forming the Fair Play for Cuba committee). These men have good minds, and I enjoyed arguing with them, especially so often, although I never agreed with them.

I am opposed to segregation of the races (which is primarily what led me to the Socialist Party) and have so stated publicly.

In 1962 I helped organize, and for a short period served as vice-chairman of, the New Orleans Council for Peaceful Alternatives. This group, which advocated disarmament, was inspired by the Committee on Correspondence (now the Council on Correspondence)

[REDACTED] Last fall, after I had left New Orleans, an agency of the state of Louisiana seized this organization's papers, because they were in the same office with the papers of the Southern Educational Conference (I'm not sure of that name). The state agency charged the Southern Educational Conference with subversive activity. To the best of my knowledge, these papers are now in the office of Senator J. Eastland.

Finally, I once recommended a Negro girl, for a scholarship, to the Southern Educational Conference. I do not remember her name; she did get the scholarship, as the announced purpose of the organization is integration.





Confidential informants, some of whom are acquainted with Communist and pro-Communist activities in the Madison area, advised that STEPHEN AMBROSE was highly regarded at University of Wis. as varsity football player and leading fraternity man while undergraduate and as capable and intellectually active graduate student in history, whose intellectual activity and graduate school training under the late Prof. WILLIAM HESSELTINE led him to engage in discussions with many types of individuals, including some graduate students in History Dept. regarded pro-Communist in opinion. In these discussions, AMBROSE believed to have opposed opinions of his pro-Communist fellow graduate students, and informants believe AMBROSE to be loyal American, of excellent character, reputation and associates and a man of high integrity. RESULTS OF INVESTIGATION

AT MADISON, WISCONSIN

EDUCATION

On March 23, 1964 [redacted] advised that STEPHEN AMBROSE was well known on the University of Wisconsin (UW) campus as an undergraduate from around 1953 to 1957. Informant said that he was a good student while an undergraduate, but he was better known for such extra curricular activities as membership on the varsity football squad and having a leading role in fraternity circles as an active member of one of the leading fraternities on campus. Upon his graduation from the UW, AMBROSE took his Master's Degree at a Southern university and returned to Wisconsin in 1958 where he studied for his PhD degree, which he received in 1960.

During his graduate years in the History Department at the UW, AMBROSE was said by the informant to have shown considerable intellectual depth in terms not only of his routine studies but through his participation in discussion groups, both formal and informal in nature. Amongst the informal discussions which the informant believed AMBROSE to have engaged in were discussions with other graduate students in the History Department. [redacted]

[redacted] said that AMBROSE's purpose in engaging in discussions with such individuals was undoubtedly that of probing in depth the intellectual opinions of the men so engaged. Informant was sure, from his knowledge of AMBROSE both as a person and graduate student in history, that AMBROSE did not at any time agree with such individuals as [redacted] in their pro-Communist theories, whether these theories were open or disguised.

[redacted] further expressed the opinion that AMBROSE is a completely loyal American of excellent character and reputation, whose personal associates are individuals of very fine caliber and who is a man of high integrity.

[redacted] who is acquainted with Communist and pro-Communist activities in the Madison area, has never acquired any information connecting AMBROSE in any way with these activities. Informant concluded by recommending AMBROSE highly for employment by the U. S. Government in a sensitive position.

A characterization of "Studies on the Left" is attached to the appendix section of this report.

On March 23, 1964 [redacted] said that STEPHEN AMBROSE was well known as a football player and leading fraternity man during his undergraduate years at the UW. Informant said that from 1958 to 1960 AMBROSE also established a reputation as a very capable graduate student in history at the UW, whose intellectual depth and activity led him to engage in discussions connected with such formal groups as the Civil War Round Table in Madison, of which group AMBROSE's supervising professor in history, the late Professor WILLIAM HESSELTINE, was also a member.

[redacted] said that AMBROSE was particularly noted for his fondness for informal discussions with individuals, frequently with individuals who opposed AMBROSE's views and sometimes with such individuals as [redacted] also graduate students in the History Department and known to the informant

[redacted] views. The informant said there was no doubt that AMBROSE's purpose in discussing points of view with such individuals as [redacted] as to obtain firsthand information concerning the basis of these views. The informant expressed the opinion, based on personal acquaintance with and close observation of AMBROSE, that AMBROSE is a completely loyal American of excellent character, reputation and associates. He said that AMBROSE would be completely opposed to the views of [redacted] and who would not be in any way influenced by them. [redacted] recommended

AMBROSE without reservation for employment in a sensitive position by the U. S. Government.

On March 24, 1964 [redacted] aid that STEPHEN AMBROSE was very well known as a graduate student in history of considerable ability during the period from 1958 to 1960 at the UW. Informant said that AMBROSE was very active intellectually and liked to engage in discussions, particularly with other students of opposing or differing opinions in the field of history. [redacted] said that this attribute of AMBROSE's was part of the training he received from his senior professor in the field of American History, the late Professor WILLIAM HESSELTINE, who believed in vocal exchange and discussion as a means of acquiring knowledge and depth concerning any particular subject.

[redacted] said that AMBROSE held discussions with such fellow graduate students in history as [redacted]

[redacted] in sentiment among certain groups on the campus of the UW. The informant said, however, that there could be no question concerning AMBROSE's loyalty to the United States, and his purpose in discussing any subject with such individuals as [redacted] would be to oppose any Communist or un-American theories and principles espoused by [redacted]

[redacted] expressed the opinion that AMBROSE is not only a loyal American but a man of high integrity and very sound character, who can be recommended without reservation for employment in a sensitive position by the U. S. Government.

On March 23, 1964 [redacted] advised that STEPHEN AMBROSE was well known at the UW as a varsity football player and leading fraternity man while an undergraduate and as an excellent student during his graduate study years from 1958 to 1960. This informant did not know AMBROSE personally but the informant is acquainted with Communist and pro-Communist activities in the Madison area, and the informant stated no information had ever been acquired which connected AMBROSE in any way with such activities.

STUDIES ON THE LEFT, INC., Aka  
Studies On The Left (SOTL)

The "Wisconsin State Journal," a daily newspaper published at Madison, Wisconsin, on November 26, 1959, announced that a new scholarly magazine, "Studies On the Left," a historical review dedicated to the leftist point of view, edited by present and former graduate students at the University of Wisconsin (UW), but having no connection with the UW itself, would begin publication soon.

Records of the Wisconsin Secretary of State reflect SOTL was incorporated under laws of Wisconsin July 16, 1959, as a non-stock, non-profit corporation with headquarters P. O. Box 2121, Madison, Wisconsin. The first issue contained a policy statement from the editors, stating SOTL was primarily a magazine for national circulation, designed to give younger men with radical views a place to voice their opinions. About two issues a year are published, the most recent in February, 1963.

Publicly listed members of SOTL's Editorial Board SAUL LANDAU, STEPHEN SCHEINBERG, MARTIN J. SKLAR and JAMES WEINSTEIN have been identified by sources previously as having participated in the activities of the Labor Youth League (LYL); while Editorial Board members DAVID BAKINS and MATTHEW CHAPPERON have been identified as active members of the Communist Party (CP). Another source has identified SKLAR and WEINSTEIN as handling the finance and business affairs of SOTL.

Volume #3, Number 2, Winter 1963 issue of SOTL, published in February, 1963, on the inside front cover contained an announcement that effective March 1, 1963, the new mailing address of SOTL will be "Studies On the Left", Box 33, Planetarium Station, New York 24, New York.

A source advised on May 13, 1963 that SOTL has as its mailing address Box 33, Planetarium Station, New York 24, New York.

The Labor Youth League (LYL) has been designated pursuant to Executive Order 10450.



On 9/14/61 received promotion to Assistant Professor of History and now eligible for appointment as Associate Professor. During the present school year of 1963-1964 has been teaching at LSU, Baton Rouge, [REDACTED]. Associates consider extraordinary scholar and a prolific writer who has published two books and has a third at the publishers. They consider AMBROSE a man of strong convictions who is not known to have any connection with subversive type organizations. During 1963, AMBROSE was a member of the Executive Board of the New Orleans Council for Peaceful Alternatives, described as a pacifist group. He joined the American Socialist Party in 1963 following a speech in New Orleans, La., by NORMAN THOMAS. AMBROSE is unknown to confidential informants having some knowledge of Communist Party activities in the New Orleans area. AMBROSE [REDACTED] [REDACTED] have satisfactory credit record at New Orleans and no arrest record New Orleans or Baton Rouge, La.

[REDACTED] advised that AMBROSE was appointed as Instructor in history on September 8, 1960 at Louisiana State University, New Orleans (LSUNO), and that he was made an Assistant Professor on September 14, 1961. He was transferred to Baton Rouge campus for one year to [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] Graduate School, LSU, advised on March 25, 1964, that STEPHEN EDWARD AMBROSE received a Master of Arts (M.A.) Degree in History from the Graduate School, August, 1958.

[redacted] History Department, LSU, Baton Rouge, Louisiana, advised on March 26, 1964, that he has known STEPHEN AMBROSE since 1957. [redacted]

[redacted] He stated that he did not have any other association with AMBROSE until AMBROSE secured a position with LSU in New Orleans. He stated he had not had any social contact with AMBROSE. [redacted] stated that AMBROSE is "very bright," competent, a hard worker, and "research orientated." [redacted] advised he did not know anything derogatory or adverse about AMBROSE and that he did not have any reason to doubt AMBROSE's loyalty to this country. [redacted] advised that from his association with AMBROSE as a [redacted] he would recommend AMBROSE for a position of trust and responsibility.

[redacted] History, LSU, Baton Rouge, Louisiana, advised on March 26, 1964, he has known STEPHEN AMBROSE [redacted]

[redacted] advised that he has had social contact with AMBROSE and he has found AMBROSE to be of good moral character and reputation. He described AMBROSE as being "a social drinker" and stated he had never observed AMBROSE to drink to an excess. [redacted] stated that AMBROSE had strong convictions about some "local social customs" and that because of this some people might not like him. He stated that the customs he was speaking of was the segregation question and that AMBROSE was opposed to segregation. [redacted] stated that he did not have any reason to doubt the loyalty of AMBROSE to this country and would certainly recommend him for a position of trust and responsibility.

[REDACTED] He stated that AMBROSE is a graduate of the University of Wisconsin and went to LSU, Baton Rouge, [REDACTED] He received his Master of Arts (M.A.) Degree at LSU in 1953 and returned to the University of Wisconsin to work for his degree of Doctor of Philosophy (Ph. D.). [REDACTED] stated AMBROSE joined the staff at LSUNO on September 8, 1960, as an instructor in History even though his dissertation for his Ph.D. was not complete.

[REDACTED] advised that Dr. AMBROSE had specialized in Military History with emphasis on the Civil War. AMBROSE is a prolific young scholar, has a long list of publications to his credit, and during the school years of 1962-63, he received a grant from the Eleutherian Mills Historical Library to work on the papers of LARRY DUPONT and the Preparedness Campaign of 1916-17.

[redacted] stated that on September 14, 1961, AMBROSE was appointed as an assistant professor and at the end of this school year he will be recommended to become an associate professor. He said that AMBROSE has risen quickly in his position with the University, has prodigious energy, and has a variety of talents. He pointed out that AMBROSE was a varsity football player at the University of Wisconsin. He said that AMBROSE has an intense feeling in matters that interest him and is very open in his convictions; however, there is nothing in his convictions that has given [redacted] any reason to suspect AMBROSE's loyalty to the United States. He pointed out that AMBROSE is not a run of the mill conformist and particularly has been outspoken against the matter of segregation. He said that AMBROSE also is known to favor universal disarmament.

[redacted] stated that he has been acquainted personally with Dr. AMBROSE and considers him a good

[redacted] LSUNO, advised on March 25, 1964, that Dr. AMBROSE is an Assistant Professor in History at LSUNO. He said that he considers AMBROSE a good man in all respects. He noted that although AMBROSE was a varsity football player at the University of Wisconsin, he was an excellent student. He described him as an energetic, aggressive, and well afforded young man. [redacted] advised that he has never heard any reports that AMBROSE has been associated with or interested in leftist-type organizations. He said that AMBROSE is not a crusader but is interested in his own career. He stated that he knows nothing derogatory concerning him.

Department of History, LSUNO, stated on March 25, 1964, that he has worked with Dr. AMBROSE for the past three years. He said that he expects that Dr. AMBROSE will be promoted to Associate Professor of History on the basis of his publication efforts, which have been effective.

[REDACTED] described AMBROSE as the "all American boy," stating that he was a guard for the University of Wisconsin football team, that he is a young person to have accepted the responsibilities that have been placed on him, has a quick mind, high ideals, and is active both physically and mentally.

[REDACTED] stated that AMBROSE has already published two books, one on "Walleck" who was LINCOLN's Chief of Staff and another "Wisconsin Boy in Dixie." He has a third book at the publishers at the present time. He has also written for numerous historical papers.

[REDACTED] described AMBROSE as having a "stormy personality" who is impatient with routine. He has been opposed to the southern practices of segregation. During the past year, he belonged to some type of pacifist organization having a name similar to Peaceful Alternatives, but he understands that this organization has been dissolved. He stated there would be no reason to question the loyalty of AMBROSE to the United States.

[REDACTED]  
History, LSUNO, advised on March 25, 1964, that Dr. AMBROSE is considered "the fair haired boy of the History Department." He said that AMBROSE has a tremendous capacity for work and can be expected in the future to be a major power in the history field. He is a prolific writer on historical matters and is well thought of by the University.

[redacted] advised in regard to organizations to which AMBROSE is known to have belonged that he was connected with the New Orleans Council for Peaceful Alternatives during 1963 as an officer. He described this as a "ban the bomb or pacifist group." He said also that during 1963 NORMAN THOMAS, whom he described as the head of the American Socialist Party, was in New Orleans to speak. AMBROSE admired NORMAN THOMAS and afterwards joined the American Socialist Party. He did not know of any activity on the behalf of AMBROSE with this group.

[redacted] stated that he had no reason at all to question AMBROSE's loyalty to the United States.


[redacted] stated that AMBROSE has very strong opinions but besides this has a very open mind. He considers him more patriotic than most persons since AMBROSE has studied totalitarianism. Because he has studied the subject, he hates it and has been afraid that it could happen in the United States. AMBROSE also hates the race problem in the South and has been outspoken against segregation, which has caused some feeling against him.

[redacted] stated that AMBROSE is from the State of Wisconsin and the late Senator ROBERT LAFOLLETTE was his hero. As a result of his being inspired by ROBERT LAFOLLETTE, he was also inspired by NORMAN THOMAS. After NORMAN THOMAS made a speech in New Orleans in 1963, AMBROSE joined the American Socialist Party as sort of a gesture in favor of THOMAS. *La*

[redacted] stated that Mr. H. STEWART HUGHES was the founder of the Committee on Correspondence, which was established to promote domestic and foreign policy discussions among those in the academic community. An off-shoot of this committee was the New Orleans Council for Peaceful Alternatives. Dr. AMBROSE became a member and an officer of the New Orleans Council for Peaceful Alternatives during 1963. He said that BRUCE WALTZER and BENJAMIN SMITH, attorneys to his recollection, were also officers of this group. Recently the records of this group, which he believes now to be defunct, were seized by the New Orleans Police Department at the time that they seized the records of the Southern Conference Educational Fund (SCEF) in a raid of the office of the SCEF. He stated that AMBROSE gave up his membership in the New Orleans Council for Peaceful Alternatives, which was a pacifist-type group, since it turned out to be a "foolish organization" and he found no compatibility with the type of persons in the organization. *La*

"The Southern Patriot", a monthly publication, shows that it is published by the SOUTHERN CONFERENCE EDUCATIONAL FUND, INC. (SCEF).

"The Southern Patriot" was cited as an "organ" of the SOUTHERN CONFERENCE FOR HUMAN WELFARE (SCHW) by the Committee on Un-American Activities, House Report 592, on the SCHW, June 12, 1947.

The SCHW was cited as a communist front by the Committee on Un-American Activities, House Report 592, June 16, 1947.

An amendment to the charter of the SCHW changed the name of that organization to the SCEF, and listed its purpose as being to improve the educational and cultural standards of the Southern people in accordance with the highest American democratic institutions, traditions, and ideals. The amendment was dated April 26, 1946.

A source advised on March 2, 1961, that CLAUDE LIGHTFOOT, a Communist Party functionary, stated at a meeting of the Communist Party in Baltimore, Maryland, on February 25, 1961, that the Communist Party is not connected with any progressive movement but indirectly they do have some influence in the SCEF.

A second source, who is familiar with some phases of Communist Party activity in the New Orleans area, advised on May 27, 1963, that during the time the SCHW was in existence, Communist Party (CP) members have not been encouraged to work in the SCEF. The source stated the SCEF is a progressive, liberal organization, which he considers a CP front organization because it has gone along with the Communist Party on certain issues, particularly on the racial question.

On May 27, 1963, the second source advised that in the past he has considered JAMES DOMBROWSKI, the Executive Director of the SCEF, to be a communist, if not an actual Communist Party member, because he followed communist principles.

The second source also advised on May 27, 1963, that many people who are officials and members of the SCEF, while liberal in their views, are by no means communists.
