
EXPLANATION OF EXEMPTIONS



He advised that during his acquaintance with the PARDOS he has never heard of anything which might be considered as derogatory concerning the character, reputation, or loyalty of the applicant's parents or any of his other immediate relatives.

Additional attempts to locate other persons who might be well acquainted with the applicant and his family were made with negative results.

There was no criminal record found on the applicant or any of his immediate relatives at the Norwich, Connecticut Police Department.

Norwich Credit Rating Bureau, advised that her records reflect in a report dated June 25, 1947, that the credit rating of MR. and MRS. LIONEL JARVIS, 14 Orchard St., Norwich, Connecticut, was satisfactory. MRS. 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He is married and has two children. He was employed by the company on June 15, 1944 as a senior announcer and has worked there ever since. The only previous address listed for him, in addition to his present residence, is 37 Messer Street, Providence, Rhode Island. He is a member of the American Federation of Radio Announcers. In addition to other data previously available, education is noted for PARDO at Providence College 1937 to 1938, and at a school named EMERSON, not further mentioned or address given, where he took courses in radio from 1942 to 1943. He speaks, reads, and writes Polish and French. Nothing unfavorable is reflected in his record.

PATRICK KEILY, Chief Announcer, National Broadcasting Company, advised that PARDO has worked as a staff announcer under his direct supervision for about five years. PARDO is a very decent person and a devoted family man. His character, associations, reputation, and loyalty are all very good. He has no reason at all for misgivings about PARDO.

Residences

At 2997 Marion Avenue, Bronx, New York

Mrs.ANNIE E. CLEMENS, landlady, advised that PARDO and his wife and two children have lived there as her tenants since late 1944 or early 1945, shortly after PARDO brought his family down to New York from Providence, Rhode Island. Before that, PARDO lived with a friend for a short while at the National Bible Institute, Mrs. CLEMENS understands, but she knows nothing about any residence on 74th Street. She described PARDO and his wife and children as a very fine family and excellent tenants in every respect. They seemed to be good, loyal Americans of good reputation and character.

Mr. and Mrs. JAMES A. CLEMENS, advised that they have known PARDO and his wife and children as neighbors during the entire period of the latter's residence there, and have formed the impression that they are persons of excellent character and reputation. They seemed to be very good American citizens, and on the basis of their acquaintanceship with PARDO and his family, they would recommend PARDO for a position of trust in the government. They suggested contact with neighbors MATHEWSON and JONES, as neighbors with whom the PARDOS seemed to be on friendly terms.

Mrs. CHARLES MATHEWSON, 2995 Marion Avenue, advised that she and her husband had known PARDO and his wife and children as neighbors on a social basis for approximately four years, and that on the basis of that

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acquaintanceship, she would recommend PARDO highly for government service. She described PARDO and his wife as persons of excellent character and reputation, and undoubtedly loyal to the United States. In addition to Mrs. JONES, she suggested an interview with Mrs. REEL, another neighbor with whom the PARDOS are acquainted.

Mrs. FRANCIS G. JONES, 354 Mosholn Parkway, advised that she has known the PARDOS for a period of approximately four years both as neighbors and socially. She described PARDO and his wife as truly decent, respectable American citizens of excellent character and reputation; and she said that on the basis of this acquaintanceship with them, she would unhesitatingly recommend PARDO for a position of trust in the government.

Mrs. HELEN REEL, 2965 Marion Avenue, advised that she has known PARDO and his wife for about two years, and that she would recommend either of them as persons of excellent character, reputation, and loyalty.

> At the National Bible Institute 340 West 55th Street

desk clerk; secretary to the President; and nurse; all advised that they did not recall PARDO and that no record of him could be found there as a resident, as a member, or as an employee. They admitted the possibility that he might have resided there for a short time as a roommate of someone listed as a regular resident.

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PARDO, in his Personnel Security Questionnaire, lists residence during 1944 and 1945 on West 74th Street, but no number is given. This is during the same period of his indicated residence at the National Bible Institute. No record of PARDO's residence was indicated in his employment file at the National Broadcasting Company, and all persons interviewed in connection with instant investigation who might be able to furnish the address stated that they did not know of his residence on 74th Street.

RALPH COURTENAY, actor, 546 West 113th Street, stated that he has known PARDO since 1938 or 1939 while he was head usher at a Providence, Rhode Island theater and PARDO was doorman at the Albee Theater in Providence. Since then, PARDO has worked with him on radio programs in Providence, and, with the exception of his, COURTENAY's service in the Army, they have been

socially acquainted until the present. He also is acquainted with PARDO's wife, his father and mother, and his brother. PARDO and all of his family enjoy a very good reputation and all are persons of excellent character and undoubted loyalty to the United States, so far as COURTENNY knows. He would unhesitatingly recommend PARDO for work with the VOICE OF AMERICA.

JACK COSTELLO, radio announcer, National Broadcasting Company, advised that he has known PARDO rather well during the approximate four years of the latter's employment as an announcer for the National Broadcasting Company. He has also known PARDO and his wife socially. Both enjoy a good reputation, and both seemed to be good, loyal American citizens of excellent character. He would have no reason of any kind not to recommend PARDO for government service.

WILLIAM MALCOIN, radio announcer, National Broadcasting Company, advised that he has known PARDO approximately four years, having followed PARDO into employment by the company by about six months. He has known PARDO socially and has met the latter's wife. PARDO and his wife enjoy a good reputation. 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



River Avenue, Providence, R. I., advised that the records indicated that the applicant attended the Extension School evening courses from October 1, 1940 until he withdrew voluntarily. No date is indicated for his withdrawal. While at the school, he studied public speaking. The applicant received no credit for the course and there is no further information concerning him in the files of this school.
