Charles Cagle, a suspect who was picked up by the Analysian along with Robert E. Chambliss and John Wesley Hall was tried in Recorder's Court, Birmingham on 10-8-63. He pled not guilty to possession of dynamite through his attorney Matt H. Murphy, Jr. He was found guilty by Judge J. Earl Langer sentenced to pay \$100 fine plus costs and six months at hard labor. During the investigation of captioned case in the Knoxville Division, no pertinent information was developed relating to any of the bombing matters, Birmingham Division. No suspects or subjects were developed during the investigation by the Knoxville Division. All known members of klan-type and hate-type organizations in the Knoxville Division were interviewe with negative results. Three currently listed bomb suspects and three formerly listed bomb suspects of the Knoxville Division wer interviewed, their whereabouts during pertinent periods determine and check of toll calls made; all met with negative results.

In accordance with suggestion made to Birmingham in Knoxville teletype to Birmingham 9/26/63 and approved by Birmingham teletype to Knoxville 9/26/63, no report being submitted this division as no pertinent information was developed. All interviews of members or suspected members of klan-type and hate-type organizations in the Knoxville Division, interviews of present and past bomb suspects, and interviews with individuals to verify whereabouts of bomb suspects were recorded on FD-302s. The original FD-302s relating to all of the above are being retained in Knoxville file 157-189. Set forth below is a summary of investigation and list of individuals interviewed for indexing purposes of Birmingham and Bureau.

The NATIONAL STATES RIGHTS PARTY is reported not actively holding meetings or organizing in any group activities in the Knoxville Division. There are some members of this organization who appear to be the only "card holding" members residing in Knoxville and LaFollette, Tennessee, and vicinity. The known members of this organization were interviewed and furnished no pertinent information relating to bombing matters at Birmingham, Alabama, and listed no individuals who could be considered as suspects. During investigation of instant case, 52 individuals at Chattanooga and vicinity have been interviewed, whose names or similar names have previously been reported as members or past members of DK, KKKK, Inc., Chattanooga, Tennessee. Of this number, 37 have admitted membership. Six additional ones have admitted membership but not active and not sure if their names continue to be on current membership of DK, KKKK, Inc. In addition to these 43 individuals. four others have refused to be interviewed and

A total of 46 present and past members were interviewed. One recently active member presently in the hospital with cancer not interviewed. Six others with similar names were interviewed; all denied membership, and it was not possible to establish if they were or were not present or past members. No pertinent information re bombing matters at Birmingham, Alabama, or suspects developed.

The overall results of these interviews is that members, leaders, and the organization as a whole opposes violence, describes their organization as a political and religious organization, but very definitely opposed to integration; however, any action in opposition to integration to be accomplished by legal means and principally by voting. Of those who were not belligerent, they advised generally that if they had information regarding persons responsible for the bombing matter, instant case, they would report same to the FBI or to some law enforcement agency. However, almost without exception, all reported the DK, KKKK, Inc., as a secret, fraternal organization, and they would not furnish information regarding other members and activities where no violation of the law existed.

He pointed out that information had been received that the Alabama Highway Patrol had very little substantial evidence regarding the two individuals. There is attached for your information a copy of a memorandum prepared for the Attorney General by Burke Marshall, Assistant Attorney General of the Civil Rights Division, under date of 10/4/63. It is noted the Bureau had received similar information to the effect had no basis for arresting Chambliss and Cagle except that he found tha out that the FBI was questioning numerous Klan members and wanted to jump the gun and therefore picked them up. Result of examination:

It was concluded that specimens Q3 and Q4 were typed on the same typewriter as used to prepare specimens Qcl and Qc2, previously submitted.

Evidence in this case has previously been searched in the appropriate sections of the Anonymous Letter File without effecting an identification.

It was further concluded that the typewriter used to prepare specimens Qcl through Q4 in this case was not used in the preparation of Q11 and Q12 in the case entitled "BAPBONB" or in the preparation of specimens ( VICTIM: Indianapolis Recorder Newspaper - VICTIM: EXTORTION RACIAL MATTERS."

The five-cent stamp on specimen Q3 was torn from a sheet of stamps. No watermarks or other identifying characteristics were observed on specimens Q3 and Q4.

The typewriting on specimens Qcl through Q4 most closely resembles the Laboratory's standards for Underwood Distinctive pica type having a horizonal spacing of ten letters to the inch.

Q3 and Q4 are returned herewith. Representative photographs have been made.

In view of his finding that there is substantial work remaining to be done; the heavy overtime by the agents assigned to the special investigation; and the importance of this case, I agree with his recommendation that the investigation continue as is, with a further re-examination in ten days.

Mr. Rosen went to Birmingham under instructions to go into this investigation thoroughly, including personnel. He finds that the investigation is well organized and being handled with competence by SAC Moore. In view of this, if the Director desires, Mr. Rosen will return to Washington.

On the basis of current information and developments in the Birmingham area, the present operation appears justified for the following reasons:

1. All personnel on assignment at the Birmingham office, whether of the special assignment or regularly assigned, including both Special Agents and clerical employees, are productively assigned.

2. Extensive interviews have been conducted and are presently under'way This does not include special assignments, such as surveillances, et cetera, which are necessary because of developments during the day.

3. Administrative procedures in force are efficient and effective.

4. There is a positive control of manpower assigned to the investigatic

5. Developments during the day are coordinated intelligently. All personnel are kept aware of current progress.

6. Agents are alerted to important developments as they occur and before such material is reduced to writing.

7. A nightly meeting, under the direction and supervision of SAC R. K. Moore, is most effective. Each agent reports in open session the nature and extent of his daily activity. Information so developed is then subjected to questioning and evaluation by the other agents in attendance. A determination is then made as to whether further activity is warranted. Assignments are then made for all night coverage of suspects, points of interest, and possible disturbance areas. Assignments are also given to each agent for the following day.

9. Through a communications system directly tied into the SAC, embrgency assignment of personnel is adequately arranged.

10. No one office has furnished an excessive amount of personnel which could unduly affect the work of the office from which they have reported. One office, namely Little Rock, has furnished as many as five. This includes the SAC. The balance range from one to four in number. This is not an excessive drain of agent personnel from the contributing offices.

11. The entire investigation is being directed toward bringing as much pressure as possible on all prime suspects developed and being developed. This is accomplished through interviews and reinterviews; through constant harassment tactics; through the use of technical equipment wherever possible; through surveillances; through examination by the use of the polygraph; through information developed as a result of contacts with sources of information in a position to furnish information which may be pertinent to any facet of the investigation; and through saturation and redirection techniques.

12. Concurrent with the above action, extensive liaison is maintained with persons and organizations who are in a position to furnish information.

13. All paper work in the preparation of reports and memoranda is maintained in a current status.

14. Circumstantial evidence and possible witnesses are being lined up in the event it becomes desirable to present any phase of this investigation for possible grand jury action.

15. There is a total of 34 Special Agents and 8 clerical employees presently on special assignment. The overtime for the agents on special assignment at Birmingham ranges from an average low of 6 hours and 38 minutes per day, to a high of 9 hours per day.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

On the basis of the enthusiasm, pressure, and attitude of the personnel on this assignment, I recommend there be no reduction or addition in manpower at this time; that present pressure points and procedures which have been discussed with SACs Moore and Faisst be continued for the time being, to be re-evaluated in ten days, at which time a recommendation should be submitted to the Director concerning the manpower situation and direction of the investigation. This will depend upon developments during the interim.

Assistant Director Rosen called from Birmingham. He had (/ been going over this case with SAC Moore and the Agents assigned to the case until midnight last night, pinpointing what each Agent is doing and the potential in the case. He is continuing today and will have another conference of all Agents on the case tonight.

He said the Agents are covering 80 to 100 leads a day, in addition to an analytical conference each night. Agents are averaging about 7 hours overtime a day on this special. Each Agent has an assignment to cover immediately in the event there is additional violence or bombings.

He said it is clear that the work is well organized and that much is being done in the way of checking out and applying pressure points to get cooperation from suspects and their associates. In other words, this is a hard-hitting investigation with no holds barred. He said he was impressed with the enthusiasm of all of the Agents assigned to the case.

Mr. Rosen is continuing his examination, looking toward further methods of applying pressure to get results. SAC Moore has been considering the possibility of a Federal Grand Jury in the future if it appears that this will be helpful. Mr. Rosen is checking into the personnel situation and whether **iteis is** the best interests of the Bureau to release personnel now or in the near future. He will report further.

# SOURCES OF DYNAMITE

Date <u>9/19/63</u>

A crime scene search was conducted at the Alabaster Lime Company, Verlie, Alabama, in connection with the breaking and entering of a power house located on a rock road on the Western edge of the lime company, and the attempted breaking and entering of a second power house located approximately one hundred yards to the South of the first mentioned power house on the same lot.

The first power house did not have a padlock as should have been the case. Soil samples from a pallet and from the floor of the interior of this power house were obtained for possible future comparison.

An examination of the second power house revealed tool marks on the hasp portion, and the orlinder block portion of the padlock to the door of this second power house. These tool marks appear to be similar to those that would be made with some type of sawing instrument such as a hacksaw. This padlock is being retained for possible future spectographic comparison examination.

At a point approximately twenty feet, Southwest, of the second power house on the extension of the rock road running past, a ballpoint pen, black with silver trim, bearing the lettering Southern Screw Company, Statesville, North Carolina, was found.

Fingerprint examination of the doors to both power houses, the remaining padlock, and the pen did not develop any latents of value. Dirt samples from the area immediately adjacent to the door of the second power house were obtained for possible future comparison examination. Photographs of the two buildings were obtained. No other evidence of value was located.

> Subsequently, CHAMBLISS, HALL and CAGLE were booked for illegal transportation and possession of dynamite; were tried in Birmingham Recorders Court, were found guilty and given the maximum sentence of six months and a \$300 fine. These cases are presently on appeal and all are out on bond. In connection with the investigation of this matter, according to State officials, CAGLE directed them to a field in Gardendale where he had placed the dynamite. State authorities advised they located a case of Monobel B Dynamite at one area in this field and  $2\frac{1}{2}$  sticks of dynamite in a paper sack in another area.
