The following investigation was conducted by SA DONALD W. KUNO:

Information concerning the Appointee at the San Francisco Examiner, daily newspaper, was reviewed on June 26, 1961. Biographical data dated December 6, 1956, reflected that Appointee then resided at 4160 Coulombe Drive, Palo Alto, California. He was Regional Director of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP), 690 Market Street, San Francisco. He was born October 27, 1917, at Flushing, New York. His parents were ARTHUR R. WILLIAMS and ALINDA LOWRY. He obtained an A.B. Degree at Lincoln University, Pennsylvania, and ar LL.B. Degree from the School of Law, Fordham University. He and had two sons.

In an article dated March 29, 1984, the Appointee was reported to have made a speech at the Oakland auditorium on March 28, 1954, in which he warned Negroes against organizations purporting to fight for Civil Rights which often purposely raise the cry of racial descrimination to create dissention. He said, "Do not be fooled by these organizations. They seek only to distort and subvert." He declared that a reporter from the "Daily People's World" (DPW), a West Coast Communist newspaper, had been thrown out of the rally because the Communist Party is one of these groups. (U)

The July 29, 1959, issue reflected that the Appointee had been appointed as head of the New Constitutional Rights Section in the California State Department of Justice to protect civil liberties. The article stated that WILLIAMS was a partner in a San Francisco law firm, and was a member of the New York and California Bar Associations.

In an article dated April 1, 1961, it was disclosed that the Appointee had been appointed on March 31,1961,

by President KENNEDY to serve as a Special Assistant to Peace Corps Director, SARGENT SHRIVER.

The material in the library at the San Francisco "Chronicle" was reviewed on June 26, 1961. It contained no additional information.

The material on the Appointee at the San Francisco "News Call Bulletin" was reviewed on June 23, 1961. The biographical data as of September 25, 1950, reflected that at that time he resided in Berkeley and had been West Coast Regional Secretary-Counsel for the NAACP since 1945 after graduating as an honor student from Fordham School of Law where he was an Associate Editor of the "Fordham Law Review." He was a veteran of World War II and a former member of the National Planning Board of the American Veteran*s Committee. He became a member of the New York Bar in 1945 and practiced before the United States Supreme Court in January, 1949.

The Appointee was contacted in connection with an official investigation of the FBI by SA JAMES DUNPHY in January, At that time the Appointee related instances of his anticommunist feeling and specifically mentioned the expulsion of a chapter of the NAACP in Arizona because it was controlled and dominated by Communists. He advised that his anti-communist sentiments were well-known to the Communist Party. The Communist Party (CP) has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States as being within the purview of Executive Order 10450. On October 17, 1952, he told SA DUNPHY that any evidence that came to his attention that an individual or even a Chapter of the NAACP was Communist Party controlled he did not hesitate in expelling the individual or even a whole chapter. It was his expressed desire to eliminate all CP members from the ranks of the NAACP. He advised that frequently the NAACP functions were attended only by reporters of the West Coast communist newspaper "The Daily People's World", which sent reporters

to cover the function. As a result, Appointed's name frequently appeared in the "Daily People's World" with portions of his speech taken out of context. (u)

The "Daily People's World" February 20, 1953, carried an article stating six Northern California Negroes including the Appointee, were formally sworn to the California State Bar on February 11.

The Ninth Report, Un-Imerican Activities in California 1957," a report of the Senate Fact-Finding Committee on un-American activities to the 1957 regular California Legislature, Sacramento, from pages 109 through 125 refer to the NAACP. (1)

The following is a quote from page 109:

"In order to warn NAACP members against the overtures of these subversive groups and publications, Mr. (4) Franklin Williams, West Coast Regional Officer of the NAACP, issued the following circular:

"Keep your eyes wide open.



"These groups, organizations and publications are attempting to milead the Negro community: California Labor School, Civil Rights Congress (CRC), (National) Negro Labor Council, The Militant (newspaper), People's World (newspaper), Political Affairs (magazine).

"Check and double-check before you sign petitions, attend meetings, serve on "defense" committees, or join or contribute to questionable organizations.

The report stated that this circular was widely read by members of the NAACP throughout the entire West Coast. (U)

The California Labor School, (CRC, National Negro Labor Council have been designated by the Attorney General of the United States as within the purview of Executive Order 10450.

"The Militant" is the official newspaper of the Socialist Worker's Party which has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States as within the purview of Executive Order 10450.(4)

"Political Affairs" was an official CP monthly theoretical magazine. (U)

The Appointer's testimony before this committee is recorded on pages 116 through 125. He discussed the problems of the NAACP experienced in California referring to cases heard, "with callous hypocrisy, the Communist apparatus milked every major case where a Negro had become embroiled with the law in some serious offense, draining the incident of every vestige of its propaganda value and then completely ignoring the individual involved."

It was pointed out in his testimony that the NAACP policy precluded its sending any more news releases or photographs to the "People's World" and, therefore, it should be obvious to the "People's World" that any coverage of affairs, events, conferences, or meetings sponsored by the NAACP is considered undesirable by the NAACP.(U)

NAACP 690 Market Street, stated she had known the Appointee for 14 years. She stated there was no question in her mind but that he was loyal to the United States and that he is a man of great ability and tremendous energy. She stated he was capable in whatever line of endeavor he attempted, whether it was investigation of a problem on a broad scale or detailed organizational and administrative work. She said she had known him while he was working in a legal capacity for the NAACP in the East and was a neighbor of his when he lived in Berkeley in December, 1950. She had worked with him in the office from 1952 until he obtained a job as Assistant Attorney General in Charge of Fair Employment Practices for the State of California with She has maintained contact with offices in San Francisco. and the two him and his family. She regards boys as well mannered, loyal and reputable. She went on to describe the Appointee as a man of initiative, energy and understanding. She recommended him highly for any position of trust with the U. S. Government. She added that he had been untiring in his efforts to oust Communists and all other subversive elements from the NAACP. The interview was on June 27, 1961.(U) SAME TENENT

on June 27, 1961, stated law firm with the Appointee from August, 1957, until he took his position with the State of California in 1959. She described him as a man with a firm, strong personality, as being efficient, conscientious, profoundly intelligent, thorough in his work, and capable in office procedure. She described him as a detached thinker and stated he was above reproach as to character, associates, reputation, and loyalty to the United States. She described him as "inspirational" in laying groundwork for any new programs and recommended him highly for a reponsible position with the U. S. Government.

stated that the Appointee was a "1,000 per cent American." He would not question his loyalty to the U. S. Government. stated he had known the Appointee since 1957 as a business partner but did not know him in a social way. He stated that the Appointee had been active in the NAACP and that it was his opinion that the Appointee had been sent to the West Coast in order to clean up the subversive elements in the NAACP in that

He described the Appointee as intelligent, personable, energetic, extremely articulate, and loyal to the U.S. Government. He recommended the Appointee for a responsible job with the U.S. Government. The interview was on June 27, 1961.

known the Appointee well since he came to the San Francisco area in 1950. They had worked closely together in the NAACP and he has visited at his home on numerous occasions. stated that the Appointee is aggressive, intelligent, imaginative, very alert, and mentally agile. He stated the only weakness that he could think of the Appointee has is that he has a tendency to "take authority and run away with it." stated that this trait had been of considerable benefit to the NAACP because. as a minority group, it was often necessary for a leader to be extraordinarily firm in his stand, but questioned whether in a position of "power", the Appointee might have a slight tendency to misuse that power in his desire to get things recommended the Appointee highling for his responsible position with the Peace Corps. He vouched for the Appointee's loyalty to the United States and stated that he had been untiring in his successful effort to rout out Communists and other subversive elements from the NAACP. He was interviewed on June 27, 1961.(U)

stated that he had known the Appointee since he came to California and had worked closely with him in the NAACP. He described the Appointee as able, brilliant, a good citizen who expresses himself well, and recommended him very highly for a responsible position with the U. S. Government. He stated he knew the Appointee both socially and in business. He described as a very personable lady and the two sons as well brought up boys.

General's Office, State Office Building, Civic Center, on June 28, 1961, stated that he had worked with the Appointee for two years while the Appointee was in charge of the Fair Employment. Practices Division of the State Attorney General's Office. He described the Appointee as a man of high caliber, well qualified and well suited to his present job as a top administrator in the new Peace Corps. He stated that he had learned of the Appointee's

Mr. STANLEX MOSK, Attorney General, State of California, State Office Building, San Francisco, stated on June 28, 1961, that he had known the Appointee since 1957 and in October 1959 he had appointed FRANKLIN WILLIAMS to the position of Assistant Attorney General in Charge of the Fair Employment Practices Division as a man he felt best qualified for the position and Mr. WILLIAMS had not failed him in any job which he had. Mr. WILLIAMS was equally interested in furthering the interest of all minority groups and Mr. MOSK stated he was very sorry to lose the Appointee but did not want to stand in his way. He described the Appointee as brilliant, articulate, knowledgeable, and conscientious. He would not question the Appointee's loyalty to the United States. He said Appointee had terminated his position as Assistant Attorney General in April 1961 in order to accept his present position with the Peace Corps. (1)

Confidential Informants who have some knowledge of subversive activities, including Communist activities, in Northern California were contacted and have no information indicating membership or sympathy in any subversive organization by Appointee. (4)

SF T-1, advised on February 24, 1959, that Communist Party members in the San Francisco area have always felt that there was nothing that could be done with the NAACP mainly because FRANKLIN WILLIAMS was Regional Director. The Communists, according to SF T-1, consider FRANKLIN WILLIAMS as "quite a reactionary person."

His major was Philosophy, and his minor was French and Sociology. He was graduated cum laude and ranked third in a class of 68.

In his file is a letter to the Dean of Men dated October 24, 1945, stating he forgot the address he listed on his original application, but believed it to be 33-05 Murray Street, Flushing, N. Y. He said he had been living at 144-37 Barclay Avenue, Flushing, N. Y., prior to admittance. He asked the University to state in answer to any inquiry that he lived at 33-05 Murray Street when he registered, and his address had never changed. His reason for this request was that at that period of his life he was "shuttled" back and forth between his uncle's home and his grandfather's home at 144-37 Barclay Avenue, and he was not sure of the dates.

Previous employments are listed as June 1930 to September 1930, messenger, FRANK C. 

BACON, Fordham Law School, advised SA CLANCY that he recalled WILLIAMS as an excellent student and an industrious and hard working individual whose loyalty he did not question. Based on his limited teacher-student relationship, he said that he would recommend WILLIAMS for a position of trust.



Registrar, substantiated above comments on June 27, 1961 and also indicated that there are no other members of the faculty available who might recall WILLIAMS.

 (Committee on Un-American Activities, House Report 3123 on the National Lawyers Guild, September 21, 1950, originally released September 17, 1950.)
- "3. 'To defend the cases of Communist lawbreakers, fronts have been devised making special appeals in behalf of civil liberties and reaching out far beyond the confines of the Communist Party itself. Among these organizations are the * * * National Lawyers' Guild. When the Communist Party itself is under fire these offer a bulwark of protection.' (Internal Security Subcommittee of the Senate Judiciary Committee, Handbook for Americans, S. Doc. 117, April 23, 1956, p. 91.)"

"ORIGIN: The New York Youth Council is the result of a reception meeting held May 12, 1946, in behalf of the American delegates to the World Youth Conference in London in November, 1945, where the World Federation of Democratic Youth was formed. At this meeting it was agreed that a New York Youth Council should be organized."

The California Committee on Un-American Activities report of 1948, page 54, reflects that the World Youth Conference was an international gathering in London in November, 1945, at which a commission was created which developed the completely Communist dominated World Federation of Democratic Youth.



The last reported activity of this organization was reflected in the "Daily Worker" issue of January 15, 1948, page seven, column two, wherein the New York Youth Council was called upon to coordinate and organize a mass delegation to participate in the fight against Universal Military Training. (1)

The "Daily Worker" is a former east coast Communist newspaper which suspended publication on January 13, 1958.



APPENDIX

QUEENS CONFERENCE FOR DEMOCRATIC LEGISLATION

New York T-7 advised that many prominent Communist Party members were active in the Queens Conference For Decocratic Legislation and had attended the Conference on February 8, 1947. He further related that literature of the Conference had been distributed to all of the Party members in the Sunnyside section of the Communist Party through the Communist Party channels and that all Party members had been urged to attend the Conference on February 8, 1947.



On July 10, 1961, El Paso Times, made available the mirofilm maintained by his department regarding the El Paso Times publication for May 28, 1943. A review of this publication revealed the following letter on Page 17 under the caption "Speaking the Public Mind:"

"Editor, El Paso Times

"Since my first day of hospitalization here in El Paso, I have been a regular and satisfied reader of your paper. However, now we have come to the parting of the ways, as I find myself in sharp disagreement with your editorial policy in re the "Poll Tax Bill" - a fundamental disagreement which strikes to the very roots of my belief in the cause for which I am fighting.

"We are a nation at war! A nation fighting to preserve for ourselves and to extend to others certain basic principles of government fundamental to a working democracy. Since this is our professed purpose, let us set the example. You condemn those members of Congress who insist on the passage of an "Anti-Poll Tax Bill" now - and in the same breath say that the South "is coming out of its swaddling clothes." If this be true, if the South is truly 'growing-up' at last, then let them demonstrate this by granting freedom of the polls - at least in federal elections - to the citizens of their respective states regardless of their ability or inability to pay a tax.

"We all know that the 'raison d'etre' of the poll tax laws. We all know - though some won't admit - that they were originally established for the express purpose of disfranchising a large portion of the Southern people because of their race or economic status. Is this just? Is this a democratic act? Is this one of the principles for which million of us are fighting and thousands dying? Is this one of the practices we are holding out to the peoples of the various conquered nations? I say "It is not!" - It is rather, one the things we are frankly ashamed of.

"The people of El Paso have expressed themselves publicly quite vociferously concerning many national and local problems threatening our total war effort. Let them now make themselves heard in Washington concerning this cancer on democracy's back of which all true Americans are ashamed.

"Why should a bill to grant a just privilege to American citizens cause disunity? The individuals to be condemned are not the backers of the bill, but rather those men in Congress who will, with no compunction whatever, filibuster for days on end in order to prevent American citizens from enjoying the full fruits of this

blessing. Such men are as traitors in acting thusly as 5th columnists, strikers, and draft-dodgers; nay they are worse, as they defile the sacred halls of Congress with their flaunted bigotry and prejudice.

I have since your statements, familiarized myself with the history, personnel and general policies of the Negro press from the time of its first publication in 1827 to the present.

"My general impressions have been as follows:
Negro newspapers stress mistreatment of colored people, because mistreatment is a fact, and the white press ignores it or plays it down. They bend over backward in giving credit to white people even when they make only a gesture of being fair. - as observe the play given by them to Mrs. Roosevelt, Pearl Buck, and Wendell Willkie. But when Negroes are beaten and killed, exploited and robbed, insulted and humiliated because they were fortunate or unfortunate enough to be born Negroes; their press would be worthless if it remained silent.

"Newspapers are supposed to report the news, stressing that which is of the greatest importance to the greatest number. This rule compels Negro newspapers to prominently report cases of discrimination, segregation and humiliation, because of color and they'd have no raison d'etre if they didn't.


Corpsmen can do a lot to sell democracy just by their work and their attitudes; he said. "We don't insist that they subscribe to an official party line, and in that, we're doing something the Communists can't afford to do," he added.

Williams, who has pleaded civil rights cases before the U.S. Supreme Court, said he is confident that this session of Congress will pass a "substantial" civil rights bill. He added that a law that does not ban discrimination in public accommodations could not be considered "substantial."

He believes the mass civil rights demonstration planned here for later this month will help to secure passage of President Kennedy's bill. Without the background of previous demonstrations, he feels, such a bill would stand no chance of passage, even with all-out Administration backing.





Appointment confirmed by Senate 7-8-64. He was investigated for Peace Corps 1961. He is nephew of deceased former Special Agent James E. Amos. From 1961 to his current assignment with United Nations, he served in official capacities in Peace Corps and was Sargent Shriver's Special Assistant. In 1946 Williams was connected with the American Veterans Committee and he was active in National Lawyers' Guild in late 1940s, New York City. He was active in affairs of National Association for the Advancement of Colored People. He is regarded as anticommunist and persons interviewed in previous and current investigations spoke highly of him and recommended him.

An applicant-type investigation was conducted regarding Er. Williams in 1961. This summary memorandum contains the results of that investigation as well as the results of the current inquiries concerning him.

I. BIOGRAPHICAL DATA

Birth

Mr. Williams was born on October 22, 1917, in Flushing, New York.

Education

He attended Lincoln University, Lincoln University, Pennsylvania, from September, 1937, to June, 1941, receiving an A.B. degree, cum laude.

Mr. Williams attended Fordham University Law School, New York City, from September, 1941, to April, 1942, and from February, 1944, to September, 1945, receiving an LL.B. degree.

Employment

He was reportedly employed by Frank C. Osmers, New York City, during the Summer of 1930. No record could be located with which to verify this employment.

Mr. Williams was employed by the New York Urban League, New York City, as a counselor at Camp Urban, Peekskill, New York, during the Summer of 1934 and at Camp Farley, Poughkeepsie, New York, Curing the Summer of 1935.

Mr. Williams was reportedly employed by the Palace Chow Mein Company. New York City, as a chauffeur from June. 1936, to September, 1937. This firm is no longer in business and no records could be located regarding the foregoing employment.

While attending Lincoln University from 1937 to 1941 Mr. Williams was reportedly employed in a clerical capacity by Professor H. F. Grimm. It has been ascertained that Professor H. F. Grimm is deceased and no information could be located concerning the above employment.

During the Summer of 1940 Mr. Williams was employed as a counselor by the New York City Mission Society at Camp Minesink, Port Jervis, New York.

He was employed during the Summer of 1941 as a bellboy by the Warden Hotel, Saratoga Springs, New York.

Mr. Williams was reportedly employed by in New York City as an assistant steward on a part-time basis from 1941 to 1942. No record could be located with which to verify this employment.

From September, 1941, to May, 1942, Mr. Williams was employed by Ruth W. Whaley, attorney, New York City, as a law clerk.

He was employed by the National Distillers and Chemical Corporation, New York City, from February, 1944, to May, 1944, as a messenger, part time.

He was employed from April, 1944, to October, 1945, by attorney, New York City, as a law clerk.

From October, 1945, to November, 1945, he was employed as a law clerk by attorney, New York City.

From October, 1945, to October, 1950, Mr. Williams was employed by the National Association for the Advancement of

Colored People (NAACP) in New York City as a member of the legal staff.

He was employed by the NAACP in San Francisco, California, from October, 1950, to October, 1959, as the West Coast Regional Secretary and Counsel.

During the period 1957 to 1959 Mr. Williams was engaged in the practice of law in San Francisco, California, and he was a member of the law firm Dominguez, Haet and Williams.


From October, 1959, to April, 1961, Mr. Williams was employed as Assistant Attorney General in the Fair Employment Practices Division of the State of California, San Francisco, California.

On April 10, 1961, he was appointed a consultant in the Office of Program Development and Operations, Peace Corps, Washington, D. C. On October 12, 1961, he was appointed Chief of the United Nations and International Agency Programs and Special Assistant to the Director of the Peace Corps. He was appointed Chief of the Division of Private Organizations on May 31, 1962, and on July 14, 1963, he was named Director of the Division of University Private and International Cooperation. Mr. Williams was appointed Director, Regional Office for Africa, Office of Program Development and Operations, on September 15, 1963. He served in this position until July 9, 1964.

On June 26, 1964, Mr. Williams was nominated for the position of United States Representative to the Economic and Social Council of the United Nations. His nomination was confirmed by the United States Senate on July 8, 1964, and he took the oath of office for the above position on July 10, 1964.

Military Service

Mr. Williams was inducted into the United States Army on May 8, 1942, and he entered on active duty on the same date. He was honorably discharged on November 19, 1943, as a private while a patient at the William Beaumont General Hospital, El Paso, Texas. He was under treatment at that



hospital for 285 days. He was issued a Certificate of Disability for Discharge due to physical disability. His service record shows he was "unfit for service because of other diseases of the respiratory system, pulmonary fibrosis, manifested by %-ray evidence and dyspnea, type and cause undetermined." It was stated further in the record that Mr. Williams' disability was believed to be permanent. His service file contains no additional pertinent information.

II. RESULTS OF INVESTIGATIONS

Interviews

May Chinn, N.D., interviewed in New York City during the 1961 investigation advised she had been acquainted with Mr. Williams during his entire life. She mentioned she was Mr. Williams' godmother. She also mentioned that Mr. Williams' mother died when Mr. Williams was about one year old and that subsequently Mr. Williams resided with his maternal relatives. She said Mr. Williams was always a persevering young man, and at an early age he became employed and saved his money in order to defray his college education expenses. She described Mr. Williams as an intelligent, resourceful, reliable and trustworthy person of exemplary character and conduct. She stated there was no question regarding his loyalty to the United States one his complete opposition to communism.

Informants, who have furnished reliable information in the past, advised that Dr. May Chinn was a member of the Negroe Labor Victory Committee as of August 19, 1944, and she was a guest lecturer at the George Washington Carver School, New York City, during the winter term of 1944.

The Negroe Labor Victory Committee and the George Washington Carver School have been designated pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

during the 1961 investigation in New York City, stated he had been acquainted with Mr. Williams since 1945 in connection with Mr. Williams' employment with the NAACP. He described Mr. Williams as a capable, conscientious, intelligent and industrious young man, who was imaginative, energetic and personable. He stated there was never any question regarding his reputation or loyalty to the United States and he was "genuinely interested in his work, home and his family." He recommended Mr. Williams for a Federal appointment.

activities in the American Veterans Committee (AVC) particularly his work against the attempts of the "Leftist elements," who sought to control the AVC. He stated that it was through Hr. Williams' efforts that the NAACP was able to stop the "Leftist elements" in their attempts to penetrate the NAACP.

On a background data form prepared by Mr. Williams in 1961 he indicated he was Area President of the AVC from 1945 to 1948. It has been ascertained that Mr. Williams was Chairman of the AVC Metropolitan (New York City) Area Council in 1947.

With reference to the American Veterans Committee, informants who have furnished reliable information in the past reported that several chapters of this organization were heavily dominated by communists shortly after its formation in 1946, particularly in the New York City area. In 1950 the American Veterans Committee adopted a resolution directed against the communists and specifically forbade communists to be members of the organization.

Stanley Mosk was interviewed during the 1961 investigation in San Francisco, California, at which time he was the Attorney General for the State of California. He stated he had known Mr. Williams since 1957 and in Cctober, 1959, he appointed Mr. Williams to the position of Assistant Attorney General in the Fair Employment Practices Division of the State of California. He described Mr. Williams as a brilliant, articulate, knowledgeable and conscientious person. He said he was given no reason to question Mr. Williams loyalty to the United States.

of Program Developments and Operations, Peace Corps, Washington, D. C., interviewed during the current inquiries advised he was closely associated with Mr. Williams during the latter's entire association with the Peace Corps. He stated he has a high regard for Mr. Williams, both professionally and personally, and he stated he considers Mr. Williams a very capable and fine person. He said he has been given no reason to question Mr. Williams' character, reputation, loyalty or associates, and he recommended Mr. Williams for a position of trust and confidence.

Officerior Africa, Office of Program Development and Operations, Peace Corps, Washington, D. C., interviewed during the current inquiries, advised he has been acquainted with Mr. Williams on a social and professional basis since 1962. He had he regards Mr. Williams as a person of high character, who is completely dedicated to his work. Mr. Williams, he stated, is a very capable and resourceful individual who has boundless energy and strong leadership qualities. He stated no information of an adverse nature has been brought to his attention regarding Mr. Williams! character, reputation, loyalty or associates. He recommended Mr. Williams without qualification for a position of trust and confidence.

CONFIDENTAL!

Forty additional persons, comprising social all and professional acquaintances, present and former co-workers and supervisors, references and neighbors, were interviewed during the investigations. They furnished favorable comments regarding Mr. Williams' character, reputation, loyalty and associates. His professional acquaintances stated he is an aggressive, capable and highly intelligent person. They recommended him for a position of trust and confidence. Persons acquainted with his close relatives stated they are reputable individuals and their loyalty to the United States is above question.

Credit and Arrest Checks

Information has been received from the appropriate credit reporting and law enforcement agencies indicating that their files contain either no record or no additional pertinent information regarding Mr. Williams or his close relatives.

Bar Affiliations

Mr. Williams was admitted to practice law in the State of New York on December 119, 1945, and in the State of California on February 11, 1953. He was admitted to practice before the United States Supreme Court on January 31, 1949. No grievances have been filed against him.

Passport Record

The records of the Passport Office, Department of State, show that Mr. Williams was issued a passport on April 14, 1961, for travel to Africa and Asia in behalf of the Government. This passport has been revalidated several times for travel to various countries of the world in behalf of the Government. The records of the Passport



Office contain no additional pertinent information concerning Mr. Williams.

Agency Checks

There is either no record or no additional pertinent information regarding Mr. Williams in the files of the Bureau of Personnel Investigations, Civil Service Commission; the House Committee on Un-American Activities; the Office of Special Investigations, Department of the Air Force; the Office of Security, Department of State; or G-2, United States Army Counterintelligence Records Facility, Fort Holabird, Maryland.

<u>Miscellaneous</u>

Volume V, Book VII, of the July, 1947, issue of the "New York Guild Lawyer," a publication of the National Lawyers' Guild (NLG) in New York City sets forth the names of the newly elected officers and directors of the New York City Chapter of the NLG for the years 1947 and 1948. The names Franklin Williams is listed as having been elected to the Board of Directors of the above chapter. (100-353587-23, pg. 1)

In December, 1949, an informant who has furnished reliable information in the past advised that Franklin H. Williams, 20 West 40th Street, New York City (NAACP headquarters office), was a member of the NLG.

The NLG has been cited by the House Committee on Un-American Activities as a communist front. organization.

During the investigations information was obtained that Mr. Williams over the years has displayed a proven anti-communist attitude and he successfully thwarted many of the Communist Party aims and policies in connection with Negroes, especially in northern California.

The investigations referred to by Mr. Williams are all closed and are entitled, respectively, as follows: ERNEST THOMAS (DECEASED): VICTIMS MAILED 3 CIVIL RIGHTS AUG 1 6 1971 UNKNOWN SUBJECTS: HARRIETT T. The Phelps-Stokes Fund reportedly was established in 1911 for the improvement of tenement housing in New York City and for the education of disadvantaged persons. In 1952 a witness, in testimony before a committee of the House of Representatives, stated that for a time prior to the divorce of Mrs. Rose Stokes, an alleged "Charter member of the party," communists obtained money from the Fund through Mrs. Stokes.

This Bureau strongly opposes making available documents from any of its investigations, particularly in the indiscriminate manner suggested by the far-ranging request submitted by Mr. Williams. To accede to such a request would set a dangerous precedent ultimately leading to a wholesale public rummage through FBI files. It would appear that the information requested by Williams is exempt from the provisions of the Act because it represents investigatory files compiled for law enforcement purposes. Accordingly, it is recommended that Williams' request be denied.
