Mr. Joseph Kingsbury Smith, European Manager of International News Service, 37 Rue Caumartin, Paris, who was in London to cover the British election of February 23, 1950, furnished the Office of the Legal Attache a news item which had been written by Eugene F. Monda, International News Service Staff Correspondent in Zurich, Switzerland.

This news item was to the effect that Gerhardt Fuchs, brother of the subject, has been residing for the past six years in a philanthropic institution for tuberculosis convalescents known as "Das Band Genossenschaft" in Davos, Switzerland. This institution is run, according to Gonda, by the Swiss Sanitary Center, which was created at the time of the Spanish Civil War to give aid to members of the International Brigades. The item continues that the Swiss Sanitary Center has branches everywhere in the satellite countries and in the Soviet Zones of Germany and Austria. It also has been active in the South of France among Spanish refugees, and even in the Western Zone of Germany.

The state of the second Gonda, in his article, indicates that the Directors of the Swiss Sanitary Venter include personalities of extreme Left tendencies, es well as Communist militants, and lists Professor Doctor Hans You Fischer; Mrs. Anna Von Fischer, former German Communist Deputy in the Prussian Landtag; Otto Chutz and Otto Srunner, Swiss Communists; and Ernst hosenbuch Frei, a Zurich attorney who defended one Soltan Vitiano, a Rumanian Communist spy in Switzerland.



Confidential Informant T-1 furnished the results of a hearing held for FUCHS at Bow Street magistrates Court, February 10, 1950, from which some excerpts are set forth hereinafter:

Mr. CHRISTMAS HUMPHRIES, Director of Public Prosecutions, read the charges against FUCHS, both under Section 1.1 (c) of the Official Secrets Act, C 1911.

The first charge is that on a day in 1947 for a purpose prejudicial to the safety or interest of the state, he (FUCHS) communicated to a person unknown, information relating to atomic research which was calculated to be or might be directly or indirectly useful to an enemy. That offense took place in England.



the second charge is that he (FUCHS) being a British subject, on a day in February, 1945, for a purpose prejudicial to the safety or interest of the state, in the U.S.A., communicated to a person unknown, information relating to atomic research which was calculated to be or might be useful to an enemy.

The prosecutor stated that he intended to call three witnesses to whom FUCHS made statements orally which amount to a confession of the two charges against him.

The prosecutor stated that when FUCHS first entered atomic research which was before he was naturalized (a British citizen) he signed the usual security undertaking. He did this again in 19th and in that document, it was made perfectly clear to FUCHS how security minded he must be and understanding it, he signed it. "It is now clear that such an oath of allegience meant nothing whatsoever to a man whose mind was irrevocably wedded to Communist principles."

After deciding to inform Russia and establishing contact through another member of the Communist Party, FUCHS confessed that there was a continuous passing of information relating to atomic research at irregular but frequent intervals. According to FUCHS, this irregular communication was commenced on his own initiative without any approach having been made to him. FUCHS says that some of the contacts were certainly Russian but often other nationalities. FUCHS said he realized he was carrying his life in his own hands but had done this in his underground days in Germany.

On February 2, 1950, FUCHS was arrested and the charges were read to him. He was cautioned and he made no reply. At the Police Station, he was formally charged, again cautioned and made no reply.

FUCHS was committed for trial during the sessions beginning February 28, 1950, and will remain in custody until that time.



## RESULTS OF INTERVIEWS OF KRISTEL AND ROBERT HEINE AN

The Boston Office has interviewed KRISTEL HEINEMAN, who is presently a patient at the Vestboro State Hospital, Westboro, Massachusetts, where she has been confined since April 5, 1949. The hospital records reflected that KRISTEL HEINEMAN is a schisophrenic-melancholic.



Mrs. HEINEMAN stated that she saw her brother, EMIL JULIUS KLAUS FUCHS for a few days during the Christmas holidays of 1933 and that she heard from other members of the family in 193h, that he had been compelled to resign from the University at Kiel because of his political activity. She believed that all of his scholastic records had been stamped, "This man is a Communist", and as a political fugitive, he walked agross the German borders to France.

In 1935, when she was enroute to this country, she spent two days with her brother in Paris and did not hear from him again until 1943 and then indirectly. In early 1945, she states that FUCHS wrote that he was coming to visit them. She recalls that FUCHS visited the HEINEMAN home sometime in February, 1945, during which visit he spent two or three days in her home.

It is her recollection that thereafter, he was a frequent visitor in 1945 for one-day periods, that is, he had arrived in the morning and departed in the afternoon or evening. She recalled that FUCHS! only friend in lambridge was a man named DEUTSCH whom she believed had worked with FUCHS at Los Alamos. Upon the termination of the Los Alamos work, DEUTSCH came to the lassachusetts Institute of Technology as a faculty member.

It is to be noted that the Los Alamos records reflect that FUCHS was visiting in Cambridge, Massachusetts, from February 11 to 25, 1945.

Mrs. HEINEMAN stated that approximately three weeks before FUCHS arrived in Cambridge in February, 1945, an unidentified chemist called at her home and inquired as to whether or not FUCHS had arrived. This unknown man introduced himself to her as a chemist who had worked with her brother. Mrs. HEINEMAN is under the impression the unknown man had worked with FUCHS at Los Alamos, although detailed questioning on this point revealed there is no basis now known to her for this assumption.

On the occasion of this first visit, the unknown man visited with Mrs. HEINEMAN and her children and she gave him lunch. She informed this man of the approximate time of her brother's arrival in Cambridge, Massachusetts. Mrs. HEINEMAN stated that there was no one at her home except the children and the unknown person on this occasion.

On the second day of FUCHS' visit to the HEINEMAN home in February, 1945, this same unknown man again rang her doorbell. She stated that this man and FUCHS spent approximately fifteen minutes conferring in her living





room. She stated she was present but did not listen to their conversation and that she has the impression now that they were well-acquainted with one another. On this occasion, the unknown man brought candy for the HEINEMAN children and to her best recollection a book entitled, "Mrs. Palmer's Honey", for her.

Mrs. HEINEMAN does not know whether the chemist received anything from FUCHS or gave him anything, but she was under the impression that the unknown man was again between trains and left shortly after his arrival.

Sometime in the following few months, this same unknown man again stopped at her home and made inquiry as to whether FUCHS might visit her. She had no recollection of an impending visit from FUCHS and so advised the unknown man. Again, she gave the unknown man luncheon. Again, only she and the children were present, but she has a dim recollection on the visit that her husband might have met this man as he was about to leave the HEINEMAN home. She also recalled that the unknown man had promised her oldest boy, STEPHEN, a chemistry set but had never given it to him.

Mrs. HEINEMAN provided the following physical description of the unknown man:

She is of the impression he came from the Chicago area.

Mrs. HEINEMAN also believed that the unknown man had made some reference to his wife and that he had more than one child, younger than her own second child. This would make the child or children of the unknown man less than four years of age in 1945.

It is her further recollection that the unknown man had approached the HEINEMAN residence by walking and that he had come into the city by train.





She also recalled that when FUCHS first heard that the man had been asking for him at the HEINEMAN residence, he had expressed surprise over the fact that the man had taken the trouble to come to Cambridge looking for FUCHS. It was her further recollection that the unknown man had stayed for luncheon but that on the morning he contacted FUCHS, he stayed only a short time, perhaps only fifteen minutes. She also stated that the unknown man showed a familiarity with children and played well with her children.

The HEINEMANS also recall that possibly the City of Philadelphia and the amount of snow in Buffalo were mentioned by the unknown man in the course of one of the visits.

#### ANALYSIS OF ABOVE INFORMATION

It appears quite obvious from the statements made by FUCHS that it is his intention to protect the identity of persons whom he regards as innocent as exemplified by his statement that the name of the Communist Party member who arranged for his first contact with the Russians is incidental and immaterial.

It is also obvious that in relating the details of his meetings with the unknown subject in Boston, he is attempting to protect his sister, KRISTEL HEINEMAN, by denying that he had ever met with the unknown subject in her home.

It is also conceivable that he is withholding information regarding his association with ISR/EL HALPERIN, a member of the Canadian espionage ring. It is to be noted that FUCHS, according to TONEY R. HASKYRME, an associate, that he, FUCHS, and Dr. RUDOLFYFEIRELS visited Montreal, Canada, prior to the time that they left New York for Los Alamos in 1944. It is known further that FUCHS visited Montreal in 1945 and further that he departed for Great Britain in 1946from Montreal, indicating that there may be some connection between FUCHS' activities and the activities of the Canadian ring under the direction of Colonel AMBOTIN.



On this point, Confidential Informant T-2h, who is in a position to know, has stated that that title is a reasonable and logical one to have been selected by someone who, in order to write an intelligent document in keeping with the title, would have had to have an over-all and intimate knowledge of the production problems encountered at the thermal diffusion project (S-50) at Oak Ridge, Tennessee.

Confidential Informant T-24 stated that the H. K. Ferguson Company of New York constructed and operated the thermal diffusion unit at Oak kidge which, in itself, was an extraordinary procedure, since usually one company would construct the unit and another would operate it. It was Confidential Informant T-24 sopinion that someone high in the operational department of



Ferguson, or among the ranking MED officers or among the civilian Navy personnel who supervised the S-50 project, would have authored such a document. Confidential Informant T-24 stated that anyone else associated with the S-50 project, would not have had the over-all picture of the production problems encountered.

In this connection, Confidential Informant T-24 considered it quite unlikely that any theoretical physicist or chemist whose interests are in the theory involved rather than the production problems, would have written such a document. He stated that an engineer is more likely to have written the document.

Confidential Informant stated that in the event the document was written after the spring of 1945, it would have been written as a "declassifying document" and, hence, would not be indexed in any records now maintained by the Atomic Emergy Commission. T-2 stated that the S-50 project was begun in about July, 1944, was a failure and was closed down in the spring or early summer of 1945.

#### FUCHS' RESIDENCE IN NEW YORK CITY.

The Bureau had advised previously that FUCHS lived in an apartment house between Columbus and Amsterdam Avenues and between 59 and 72 Streets, New York City, and that he occupied a first floor front in this apartment which was located on the south side of the street. Actually, between 59th Street and 72nd Street, Broadway runs north and south between Columbus and Amsterdam Avenues for a greater portion of that distance.

Subsequently, on February 2, 1950, the Bureau advised by teletype that after his residence at the Taft Hotel, FUCHS had lived at the Barbizon Plaza Hotel and next in an apartment on Test 77th Street, midway between



Columbus and Amsterdam Avenues, approximately 120 West 77st Street. FUCHS was said to have taken this apartment from ANIS, another member of the British of Diffusion Mission, when ANIS returned to Great Britain. February 28, 1944. Since it was also known that the Unknown Subject.

in an effort to locate FUCHS apartment and to determine whether the apartment superintendent or any roomer recalled FUCHS or any of his visitors.

The following investigation was performed by SA JOSEPH C. WALSH and the reporting agent:

Inquiry was made with negative results at the following addresses all on the south side of West 77th Street between Columbus and Amsterdam Avenues:

100, 102,104, 106, 108, 110, 112, 114, 116, 118, 120, 122, 124, 126, 128, 130, 132, 134, 136, 138, 140, 144, 146, 148, 150, 152, 154, 156, 166, 168, 170 and 172.

In the case of 128 West 77th Street, one Mr. GEORGE SCHULMIN advised that this apartment had recently been renovated and that most of the present occupants had moved into the house since the renovation. SCHULMIN was shown the photograph of FUCHS and he failed to identify it.

Subsequently, the Bureau advised that FUCHS probably lived at 128 West 77th Street, telephone, Ir. 4-6785. The following investigation was conducted by SA RALPH F. MILLER:

The January, 1944, Manhattan Telephone Directory listed the above number to Mrs. FRIEDA STADTLER.

Mr. and Mrs. WILLIAM WADLEIGH advised that they have resided in this building for about ten years in Apartment 2-A and that Mrs. FRIEDA STADTLER had been the only landlady until June, 1949, when she sold the building and moved to 5804 189th Street, Flushing, Long Island. Neither Mr. nor Mrs. WADLEIGH could identify a photograph of FUCHS.

The records of Confidential Informant T-4, of known reliability, reflected that FUCHS occupied Apartment 3-A from February 1 to April 12, 1944, Request





and that he listed his employment as the British Supply Mission, 115 Broad Street, New York City. One HENRY STATES had occupied this apartment from January 20 to January 29, 1944. The hames of the other roomers who occupied apartments at 128 West 77th Street, during the pertinent period, are as follows:

ANN DEDHORSKY, August 18 to November 1, 1944, FUCHS: apartment. She is employed in Doctors Hospital and left the forwarding address, 114 West 103rd Street.

Major S. FOLEY, Apartment 3-B from February 9, 1943 to March 31, 1945. Major FOLEY was with the United States Air Corps, 90 Church Street, New York City, and left the forwarding address of the Pentagon Building, Washington, D. C.

Mrs. FRIEDASTADTLER, from March 15, 1941 to July 6, 1946.

Mrs. MAY STIEGEL, Apartment 4-A, July 6, 1944 to March 27, 1945, and left the forwarding address, 3215 35th Street, Astoria, Long Island.

GLADYS MCCABE, Apartment 4-B, October 28, 1947 to sometime in 1945.

LIDE FRANKLIN and LUCKELSNER, Apartment 5-A from February 25, 1944, to June 15, 1945, and left the forwarding address 100-10 67th Road, Forest Hills.

Mrs. HARRIS HOBERTS, Apartment 5-B, from February 18, 1944 to May 22, 1945, and left forwarding address of 265 Franklin Street, Holton, Maine.

LEWIS BARORNS, Apartment 2-B, from June 6 to December 1, 19hh, and left forwarding address 687 Boylston Street, Boston, Massachusetts.

ELEANOTOFFA, Apartment 2-B, March 1 to June 1, 1944, and left forwarding address, 323 West 21st Street, New York City.

Mrs. FRIEDA STADTIER, 580h 189th Street, Flushing, stated that she and her husband owned and operated the apartment house at 128 West 77th Street, from 1941 until Mr. STADTLER'S death in 1947. Mrs. STADTLER, who is an aged woman, advised that she did not recall the tenants in Apartment 3-A in 1944







and 1945, nor was the name EMIL JULIUS KLAUS FUCHS familiar to her. She did not recognize a photograph of FUCHS as a former resident of this address. She stated that due to her advancing years, her recollection of former tenants was dim and that the only ones that she could now recall are the WADLEIGHS. She also stated that she recently destroyed all the records pertaining to the tenants at 128 West 77th Street. She also related that she and her husband had furnished all the janitor and cleaning services at this apartment dwelling and could not recall any person who might furnish any information regarding the tenants other than the WADLEIGHS.

Mrs. STADTLER stated that she and her husband occupied Apartment 1-B on the ground floor rear during the entire time they had the building and that the telephone number, Tr. 4-6785, was a public coin box on the first floor hallway listed in her name.

Mrs. MARIOMATTKO, daughter of Mrs. STADTLER and her nephew, RICHARD LISSNER, 580h 189th Street, Flushing, New York, stated they had resided at 128 West 77th Street, New York City, during most of 19hh and 19h5, but did not recall the tenants in 3-A during this time, nor was the name FUCHS familiar to them.

Upon viewing FUCHS' photograph and being furnished with a description of him, Mrs. MTTKO stated she had a wague recollection of collecting rent from a man of this description but did not recall the name or the apartment involved. Neither did Mrs. MTTKO nor Mrs. STADTLER recall any inquiries having been made about FUCHS or tenants in Apartment 3-A.

A check of the records of Doctors Hospital, New York City, revealed that ANN PODNOPSKY had been employed there from September 18 to October 9, 19hh, and upon completing her training for the Army Nurse Corps at Cumberland Hospital, Brooklyn, she had given as references Mrs. M. E.SWEENEY, 1105 Pleasant Street, Worchester, Massachusetts, and SAMUEL BEEBER, principal of the South High School, Worchester, Massachusetts.

Mrs. JOHN MITBRAND, nee, ANN PODHORSKY, 582 Second Avenue, Brooklyn, New York, advised that she had resided in Apartment 3-A, 128 West 77th Street, New York City, from the middle of August until the end of October, 1944, with a roommate, ELSIBERASLE. She related that both she and Miss MASLE had been







assigned night duty at Doctors Hospital, New York, during all the time they lived together at this address. Mrs. HILLBRAND knew nothing concerning the former tenant of this apartment. She stated that the name of FUCHS was unfamiliar to her and she did not recognize a photograph of FUCHS. She further stated she did not recall any inquiries made at her apartment concerning the former tenant. She advised Miss MASLE is presently employed at the Methodist Hospital in New York, and resides at 35h West 58th Street, New York.

The Boston Office was requested by teletype to interview Mrs. HARRIS ROBERTS, Holton, Maine, and LETTIS R. KORNS, Boston, Massachusetts. The Washington Field Office was requested to locate and interview Major S. FOLEY who occupied the apartment next to FUCHS during all the time that FUCHS was there.

Efforts are continuing in the New York Office to locate other residents of 128 West 77th Street, New York City.



#### ARTHUR PHINEAS WEBER

Confidential Informant T-24 advised February 6, 1950, that ARTHUR PHINEAE WEBER had been in New York City over the weekend and that he had an appointment to see T-24 at 3 P. M. on February 6, 1950. A physical surveillance was instituted on WEBER at 4:15 P. M., February 6, 1950, when he left the office of T-24, by





SAS LESTER O. GALLAHER, MAURICE W. CORCORAN and RICHARD E. BRENNAN. WEBER proceeded immediately to Penn Station where he boarded a train for Long Beach, Long Island, his home. He was observed entering his residence at 25 West Broadway, Long Beach, at 6:05 P. M. on that date. The surveillance was temporarily discontinued at that point.

On the morning of February 7, 1950, WEBER, accompanied by his wife and two children, left his home at 25 Vest Broadway, Long Beach, via automobile, New York license ND-15-74. They proceeded to Freeport, Long Island, where they looked at homes in Freeport Estates and later at the Birchwood Homes Section of North Rockville Centre, New York. WEBER, his wife and child returned to 25 West Broadway, Long Beach, at 1:05 P. M. At 4:05 P. M., WEBER left 25 West Broadway, walked to the Long Island Railroad Station where he boarded a train for New York. It is noted that he was carrying a large suitcase at the time.

Upon arriving at Penn Station, WEBER ate and then took the 6:10 P. M. train, Car 321, for Dayton, Ohio. Upon arriving in Penn Station, he was observed to meet a man and have a brief conversation with this man. A surveillance of this individual reflected that he went to 2005 East Eighth Street, Brooklyn, at 8 P. M. on February 7, 1950. It is to be noted that that address is where WEBER'S parents are known to live and it would appear that this individual was a relative of WEBER.

Confidential Informant T-24advised that he had a long conversation with WEBER on the afternoon of February 6, 1950, during which WEBER discussed personal problems with T-24. WEBER explained that his wife is reluctant to move to Dayton, Ohio, and he is reluctant to return to New York for the reason that he has had clearance difficulties with the Atomic Energy Commission and fears that he cannot find suitable employment in the New York area. WEBER stated that he did not care to advise his wife of these difficulties.

Confidential Informant T-34 explained that originally, WEBER'S clearance was delayed at the time he became involved in the Tedlee Chemical Company case. Later, when his clearance came up for official attention at the AEC, the official at AEC in New York and the official at AEC in Washington who were handling the case, had personal differences over the manner in which WEBER'S case was being handled.







As a direct result, after each had accused the other of mishandling WEBER'S case, no action was ever taken to clear WEBER, although the Kellex firm had recommended in WEBER'S favor. Confidential Informant T-P4 stated that he had advised WEBER to remain with the firm in Dayton, Ohio (International Engineering Corporation) for a couple of years until such time as he had established himself, after which his clearance might be effected. T-P4 strongly advised WEBER against making any approach at this time to the AEC officials regarding his clearance.

Confidential Informant T-24 stated that WEBER was obviously upset regarding this problem. In the course of the discussion, T-24 mentioned the FUCHS case to WEBER and WEBER stated that he had not known FUCHS or any of the British Delegation during his employment at Kellex. T-24 stated that there was no doubt in his mind that WEBER was telling the truth regarding this since he quickly passed off any discussion of the FUCHS case.

A photograph of WEBER was obtained from Confidential Informant T-24 and forwarded to the Bureau and Boston.

#### GERHARD NORVAL WOLLAN

SA JOHN J. McKENNA obtained a copy of an investigative report repared by the United States Navy Intelligence, Ninth Naval District, in 1942, regarding WOLLAN. One copy of this report was forwarded to the Bureau and the Atlanta Office.

BARISH, along with JULES KORCHIEN, WOLLAN and OSCAR I AVAGE, was a partner of AHRAHAM BROTHMAN on and after August, 1944, when BROTHMAN opened his own firm, A. Brothman and Associates, 114 East 32nd Street, New York City.

BARISH was born May 18, 1916 at Seattle, Washington. He graduated in 1939 from the University of California at Berkeley, California, with a chemical engineer degree. BARISH was formerly employed by the General Engineering Company and the Electrical Steel Foundry Company, Portland, Oregon, from 1939 to 1942. From 1942 to 1944 he was employed by the United States Rubber Company, Naugatuck, Connecticut. In 1944 he was also employed by the Chemurgy Design Corporation, 420 Lexington Avenue, New York City, a firm with which BROTHMAN was also associated. Thereafter, he became a partner of EROTHMAN. At the present time, BARISH is employed as Chief Engineer for the Industrial Process Engineers Company, 8 Lister Avenue, Newark, New Jersey.

Since October, 1943, BARISH has lived at 2144 78th Street, Jackson Holghts, New York.

Confidential Informant T-5, of known reliability, advised in December, 1944, BARISH was a member of the Garden Bay Club of the Communist Political Association, having membership card number 35097. The same source advised in March, 1945, that BARISH had been elected Press Director of the Garden Bay Club of the CPA.

Confidential Informant T-6, of known reliability, advised in November, 1946, that BARISH was on the active list of Communist Party Hembers in Queens County. Following is a physical description of BARISH obtained from employment records and observation:

From July, 1941, when VAGO left the FWA in Washington, he became associated with Fellheimer and Wagner in New York City, which firm employed him until November 1, 1943.

From 1938 to 1941, VAGO lived at 4117 North Fourth Street, Arlington, Virginia, and 6324 Luzon, Avenue, Washington, D. C. From June 10, 1941 to the present, VACO has lived at 6607 99th Street, Forest Hills, Long Island.

His actual resignation was effective as of January 4, 1942. Subsequently, he became instructor at the School for Democracy. From January, 1942, to August, 1943, he was employed in the Technical Research Laboratories at Montclair, New Jersey. On August 2, 1943, he was affiliated with the Gussack Machine Products Company, Long Island City. In 1948 he became a partner of LEWIS BALAMUTH in the General Research Laboratory at Newark, New Jersey.

COHEN as President of Balce Research Laboratory, Inc., and BALAMUTH as Secretary-Treasurer. This business was established in June, 1946, to engage in research in relation to new processes of machining ceramics and cemented carbides. COHEN resides at present at 2028 Mcrmaid Avenue, Brooklyn. He formerly resided at 2026 West 10 Street and 2879 West 22nd Street, Brooklyn.

On August 1, 1943, he became affiliated with Gussack Machine Products Company, Long Island City. From May 21 to May 23, 1943, BALAMUTH was "consultant in chemical groups" at Metlab, Chicago. H, s position was also described as "D.S.M. Project at the University of Chicago".



As of February 4, 1947, he was employed by the General Research Laboratories, 580 Market Street, Newark, New Jersey. This firm was organized in June, 1946, by MORRIE/COHEN. On August 10, 1946, BALAMUTH was employed by the Balco Research Laboratories. This corporation was also known as the Micromet. In February, 1949, BALAMUTH was reported as President of Balco Research Laboratories.

# CARL FREDERICK GEISER Alias Carl Geiser

GEISER was born at Orrville, Ohio, December 10, 1910. He attended Fenn College, Cleveland, Ohio, from 1928 to 1933, where he studied Electrical Engineering but did not graduate. The files of the New York Office reflect that while in college, GEISER toured Russia as a member of the YCL and led the College's Communist activities. On February 28, 1933, he was the sole representative of the Communist Party, U.S.A., to attend a South American anti-war congress at Montevideo, Uruguay. There he made a violent speech attacking the United States Government and advocating its overthrow. About 1934 he was the Bronx County YCL Educational Director.

From 1938 to 1939, GEISER was a prisoner of General FRINCO. He had been a Battalion Commissar of the Abraham Lincoln Brigade. He returned to the United States, May 7, 1939. In 1939 he was elected to the National Council of the YCL. In 1941 he was employed by the Liquidometer Corporation, airplane instrument factory, 41-03 36th Street, Long Island City, as a motor assembler. He was employed at this corporation until 1949 in the Experimental Department. He was also the union organizer. In 1942 he was elected President of Local 1227 of the UERWAA, CIO, and at this time took a leave of absence to devote full time to this position. In 1944 he was a member of the 4th A.D., CP, Queens, and in 1945 was transferred to the Nor th Jamaica Club, CP. GEISER has claimed his occupation to be an electrical engineer.

From 1933 to 1939 he was employed at Columbia as a research chemist. From 1939 to 1942, he was employed as an instructor in the Chemistry Department at Brooklyn College, Brooklyn, New York. From 1942 to 1943 he was employed by the Rockefeller Institute, East 66th Street and York Avenue, New York, at which time he was reported to be very friendly with Dr. HARRY GRUNDFEST, a contact of ARTHUBADAMS. Other contacts included IRVING ROBERTS, CLARENCE HISKEY. Dr. ELVINGABAT, ALEXANDER BANGUIKOFF. On July 12, 1943, GREENSPAN was employed at Kellex, and was separated therefrom October 25, 1945. He was re-employed February 16, 1946 to June 7, 1946. The reason given for his separation from Kellex was that his phase of the work was completed.





In 1944 CREENSPAN organized his own laboratory in partnership with PHILIP HOSENBLATT and SYLVESTE (LIOTTO, both reported formerly active in the Communist clique at Brooklyn College and both later associated with the D.S.M. Project. Since separation from the D.S.M. Project, GREENSPAN has been working in his own company originally known as the Greenspan Laboratory, and now known as the Process and Instrument Company, 60 Greenpoint Avenue, Brooklyn. It is reported that they are engaged in the building of mass spectrographs. which process he learned on the D.S.M. Project. It was alleged that he is the only person outside of General Electric Company which has this information

Confidential Informant T-9 advised that CREENSPAN was prominent in . the American Association of Scientific Workers, together with his wife, ELE/NOP SKISKIN. He was further affiliated with the Consumers Union and the Teachers Union.

In 1918 he received a graduate degree from the School of Mines, Chemistry and Engineering. He studied for his Ph.D. at Columbia sometime after 1918, was dismissed and later obtained a Ph.D. at New York University in 1925 in the subject Physical Chemistry.

From August 1, 1929, to July 31, 1934, he was employed by the Atlantic Refinery Company, Newark, New Jersey; October 1, 1935, to June 30, 1936, by the Ponteflore Hospital, New York. From 1937 to 1938 he was an instructor in the New School of Social Science, New York. From June, 1939, to December, 1941, he was with the Consumers Union, New York City. From 1938 to 1942 he was part time teacher at Brooklyn Polytechnic. In December, 1942, he formed the Unified Laboratories, Inc., 1775 Broadway, New York City, a firm engaged in research work in connection with the war effort. In 1945, MALISOFF became the head of the Longevity Research Foundation, 254 West 31st Street, New York City. MALISOFF died on November 17, 1947.





# PETER GABRIEL BERGMANN

BERGMANN was born in Berlin, Germany, on March 24, 1915. He attended the Technische Hochschule, Dresden, Germany, 1931-1932; University of Frieberg, Germany, 1932-1933; University of Prague, 1933-1936.

BERGMANN arrived in the United States on September 24, 1936. He was employed as an assistant to Professor ALBERTHEINSTEIN at the Institute of Advanced Study, Princeton, New Jersey, from 1936 to 1940. Later, during 1941, he became an instructor at the Black Hountain, North Carolina College, as an Assistant Professor of Physics. He took a similar position at Lehigh University, Bethlehem, Pennsylvania, in 1942, which position he held until April, 1944. On May 10, 1944, BERGMANN accepted a position as physicist in War Research with Columbia University, Division of War Research, New York City, assisting in the compilation and analysis of confidential data being used by the United States Navy.

On November 30, 1945, he terminated his work with Columbia, and became Assistant Director at Woods Hole, Massachusetts, Oceanographic Institute, being assigned to the New York Office, 350 Fifth Avenue. He was Assistant Director and head of Sonar Group of the National Academy of Science in 1947, in Washington, D. C. Since September 22, 1947, BERGMANN has been employed as associate professor of Physics at Syracuse University, Syracust, New York. In January, 1948,





BERGMANN applied for a position as Consulting Theoretical Physicist at Brock-haven National Laboratory, Camp Upton, New York, which appointment was certified on June 25, 1948. He signed a contract as consultant scientist at the rate of \$30.00 a day, to be called whenever necessary.

BERGMANN was identified as taking part in Communist meetings in 1939-1941, at Princeton, New Jersey, and one informant was certain that BERGMANN was then a Communist Party member. Also, BERGMANN'S name and address, and that of his wife appeared in the notebook of ISRAEL HALPERIN, who was arrested in Canada as a Soviet Agent in connection with the GUZENKO case.

BERGMANN was considered by many members of the Association of New York Scientists to be a part of a pro-Communist clique. He is a member of the Executive Council of the Association of New York Scientists, having been proposed for this position by Dr. MELBER PHILLIPS and HARRY GRUNDFEST, both known pro-Soviet individuals. He has attended meetings of the American-Russian Institute for Cultural Relations with the Soviet Union.

He was on the teaching staff in the Chemistry Department at Columbia during the summers, 1933-1934, and the regular school terms, 1934-1936. He continued his studies at Columbia during these periods, and received a Ph.D. in Chemistry in 1941.

From 1937 to 1939 he did research in radio activity in the Physics Department at Columbia. In 1941 he wrote an article on radio activity metals





while at the Pupin Physics Laboratory, Columbia. From 1939 to 1942, he was an instructor in Chemistry at the College of the City of New York. Records at City College show he was terminated by the president. Another source stated he resigned at the time of the Rapp-Coudert investigation of Communism. From 1942 to 1944, STEIGMAN is reported to have been an Associate Director of Research at the Technical Research Laboratories, Montclair, New Jersey, and from 1944 to 1947 he was employed as a consultant for a private firm. One source has reported that STEIGMAN organized his own company, the Steigman Research Company, and had a contract with the Schori Process Division of the Ferro Corporation, 8811 43rd Road, Leng Island City, from 1944 to August, 1947.

Since September, 1947, STEIGMAN has been an Assistant Professor of Chemistry at Brooklyn Polytechnic Institute, where he works under the supervision of Professor CLARENCE FAMISKEY, head of the Chemistry Department. HISKEY is a known contact of ARTHUR ADAMS, Soviet Agent. From January, 1948, to October, 1949, STEIGMAN also was employed with HISKEY on two research projects for the Office of Naval Research, which were conducted at the Brooklyn Polytechnic Institute.

In February, 1941, the name LXSTEIGMAN appeared on a petition described in the "Daily Worker" to defeat lend-lease. In 1943 and 1944, STEIGMAN and his wife sent communications to Governor DEWEY, urging the pardon of MORRIS U. SCHAPPES, City College professor, convicted of perjury in connection with an inquiry into Communism.

MARSH HISKEY, wife of CLARENCE HISKEY, mentioned STEIGHAN to a third person in November, 1945.

In 1948, STEIGMAN is known to have received a request for a contribution for the defense and bail of the Communist Party leaders.

STEIGMAN'S name and address was found in the personal possession of a telephone directory of Dr. JOSEPH GREENSPAN and IRVING ROBERTS, who were employed on MED projects and are known Communists. One informant has stated that STEIGMAN was a Communist and a contact of GREENSPAN. MARKASTEIGMAN, his wife, has been an active Communist Party member since 1935.

# Dr. HARRY GRUNDFEST

CRUNDFEST was born on January 10, 1904, at Minsk, Russia. He entered the United States at New York on September 1, 1913, and was naturalized in Jersey City on September 27, 1921.

CRUNDFEST has been active in the American Association of Scientific Workers for several years. Presently he is the International Corresponding Secretary and corresponds with scientists throughout the world. He has continuously followed the Communist Party line, and is a member of the World Federation of Scientific Workers. GRUNDFEST'S contacts include WENDELL FURRY, a brother-in-law of ISRAEL HALPERIN, a defendant in the GUZENKO case. Also, he has communicated with Professor RAYMOND BOTER and NORMAN KATEALL, both of whom were involved in the GUZENKO case.

It is noted that GRUNDFEST was employed at the Climactic Research Section of Fort Monmouth Signal Laboratory until September 23, 1944. It was reported that because of GRUNDFEST'S Communist affiliations and Russian contacts that the Climactic Research Section was completely dissolved so that GRUNDFEST might be removed from a vital area. It is also noted that GRUNDFEST had looked around for other employment during the fall of 1944, and on January 2, 1945, started work at the Guyot Laboratory, Princeton University, Princeton, New Jersey. GRUNDFEST'S work there was on a confidential contract for the Office of Scientific Research and Development. Later, it was learned that steps had been taken to have the CSFD contract at Princeton terminated at the end of February, 1945, by which action the MED hoped that GRUNDFEST would be forced to leave the campus and, therefore, would not be near the work of interest to the DSM project. GRUNDFEST'S work was to study the effect of tissue on high velocity projectiles.

In June, 1945, it was reliably reported that GRUNDFEST had access to the Soviet diplomatic pouch.

According to another informant, GRUNDFEST stated at a National Executive Committee meeting of the American Association of Scientific Workers that a friend of his, one IGNACY/ZLOTOWSKY, Polish diplomat, was a good friend of his, and that he, GRUNDFEST, could arrange for the use of the diplomatic pouch in the event any scientist desired to send information from the United States without detection of the F.B.I. or other United States Government agencies.

Surveillance of GRUNDFEST revealed the following information of possible significance:

On December 14, 1944 GRUNDFEST left Rumson, New Jersey, and went to the home of Major B. F. RULLER, Washington, D. C. It is noted that on October 8, 1944, ZELMA BAKERMILLER, wife of Major B. F. MILLER, was in contact with ARTHUR ADAMS, Soviet Agent, in New York City, between trains when





she was en route from Bedford Hills, New York, for Washington. Mrs. MILLER was then employed in the Naval Medical Research Laboratory, Bethesda, Maryland,

On December 15, 1944, CRUNDFEST came to New York, went to the Horace Mann School, 120th Street and Broadway, and after attending a meeting, came out with one ALEX B. NOVIKOFF.

On November 16, 1944, GRUNDFEST attended a meeting at Madison Square Garden of the National Council of American-Soviet Friendship. Immediately after the meeting he went to Toronto, Canada, where he made a speech before the National Council of Canadian-Soviet Friendship on Movember 18, 1944.

On January 25, 1945, GRUNDFEST came from New Jersey to Pennsylvania Station, New York City, where he acted in a most peculiar manner, making eleven telephone calls, each from a different booth in Pennsylvania Station.

During the summer months for a number of years since 1927, GRUNDFEST has visited the Marine Biological Laboratories, Woods Hole, Massachusetts, where he conducts scientific research.

In 1944, GRUNDFEST was one of five directors of the National Council of American-Soviet Friendship, Inc. While at Fort Monmouth, GRUNDFEST was active in the Communist-controlled Federal Workers of America, CIO.


#### GEORGE PLACZEK

It will be noted that Albuquerque letter to the Bureau of February 9, 1950, reflects that PLACZEK registered at the LaFonda Hotel, Santa Fe, from June 6, to June 8, 1945. The AEC files, Los Alamos, reflect that PLACZEK originally came to the Los Alamos project as a member of the British Mission, on May 7, 1945. He was then an employee of the University of California, at Los Alamos, from February 1, 1946, to July 9, 1946, in the Theoretical Physics Division with FUCHS, and for a time was the leader of that division. PLACZEK Division with FUCHS, and for a conference with a Mr. DAVISSON, from June 7 to June 13, 1945. The security office files of AEC reflect that PLACZEK was going to New York in June, 1945, for his final naturalization hearing, and as a matter of fact, he was naturalized in New York on June 11, 1945.

The New York Indices reflect that the name GEORGE PLACZEK, Cornell University, Ithaca, New York, appeared on a typewritten list bearing names of approximately forty American scientists known to have been in the possession of IGNICY ZLOTOWSKI, former Polish delegate to the United Nations Atomic Energy Commission.

Confidential Informant T-11, of known reliability, furnished the following information regarding PLACZEK to the New York Office in July, 1948:

Confidential Informant T-11 stated he first met PLACZEK in the University of Hamburg, Germany. He said that PLACZEK is a man of fine habits, discreet, dependable, and an absolutely loyal United States citizen. He





declared that PLACZEK'S experiences in Dharkov, Russia, have made him bitterly opposed to the Communists, to whom he refers as "animals and liars". According to T-ll, he is equally opposed to Nazism and Fascism on a two-fold basis; one, because he despises the totalitarian ideology, and secondly, because his brother was killed by the Nazis when they entered Czechoslovakia.

The following information regarding PLACZEK appears on an Atomic Energy Commission Personnel Security Questionnaire:

From 1932 to 1938, PLACZEK performed research work for the Institute for Teoretisk Fysik, University of Copenhagen, Copenhagen, Denmark, except for four months in 1933, while performing research work and teaching at the Ukrainian Physical Technological Institute, Kharkof, Russia, and except for eight months in 1935 when he was performing research and teaching at the University of Jerusalem. From October, 1938, to January, 1939, he was performing research at the College de France, at Paris, France. In January, 1939, he established residence in the United States. From February, 1939, to July, 1942, he was performing research and teaching at Cornell University, Ithaca, New York. From July, 1942, to January, 1945, he was performing war research in Atomic Energy for the British Government at Cambridge, England; Montreal, Canada and Los Alamos, New Mexico. From February, 1945, to July, 1945, he was doing research for the University of California at Los Alamos. From August, 1945, to the present time, he has been doing research work for General Electric, Schenectady, New York.
