State Department memorandum dated March 11, 1941, Bureau File 100-16776-2, reflects that Jurgen Kuczynski's wife is Marguerite, nee Steinfeld. The [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] Ursula Hamburger was the head of a group of Russian espionage agents which operated in Switzerland from 1938 to the end of 1940. This was a part of the Rote Drei (100-344753-388). (TS) b1

From 1930 until 1935, Ursula, with her then husband, Rudolph Hamburger, was a Russian espionage agent in China. (100-344753-393).

Ursula's present husband, Leon Charles Beurton, was recruited by Ursula and operated with her in Switzerland as an espionage agent. (100-344753-393).

Ursula divorced Hamburger on October 26, 1939, and on February 23, 1940, she married Beurton. (100-344753-393).

In February, 1941, and since that time, Ursula has lived in England with two children by her marriage to Rudolph. (100-21002-17X6).

On April 19, 1943, Rudolph Hamburger was arrested by the United States Army in Teheran, and after it was determined that he was a Russian espionage agent, was turned over to the Russians. (100-21002-17X1) APR 2 1950

Rudolph is now believed to be a prisoner in Russia. Ursula has maintained contact with him. (121-20978-5).

Otto Hamburger, with alias Han Pei Chia, is a brother of Rudolph. (100-210002-19X2; 100-344753-393, encl. p. 114)

Otto Hamburger is now in London, as is Ursula. The report of Special Agent William A. Flynn, Jr., at New York City, dated August 8, 1949, in the case entitled "Dr. Viktor Hamburger, was, et al, Internal Security - R," New York File 100-58324, Bureau File 100-21002-31, reflects that the Trans-Ocean Commerce, Limited, occupies Suite 2804, at 165 Broadway, New York City. The officers of this concern are Eugene Blum, President and Secretary, Henry M. Steinfeld, Vice President, and Mrs. Hannah H. Leroi, Treasurer. The firm was incorporated during September, 1949, by the officers, who had previously been principals in the same line of business for more than ten years. Eugene Blum, age 43, and single, was born in Germany. He came to the United States in April, 1941. While in Germany, Blum was a private banker. He later went to Holland and engaged in the import-export business. Upon arrival in the United States, Blum became President of the Elatce Corporation, formerly at 165 Broadway, New York City, and later became Secretary and Vice President of the Columbus Commercial Corporation at the same address. He resigned his position with that concern during 1945. Henry M. Steinfeld resided in Japan from 1908 to 1941. He was engaged there in the import-export business. He came to the United States in 1941 and was inactive until 1944, when he became an officer of the Trans-Ocean Commerce, Limited. He is also President of Mann & Rossi, Incorporated, import and export agents, located at 165 Broadway, and occupying the same suite as Trans-Ocean Commerce. Mrs. Hannah Leroi is active in the business and travels extensively in Europe. Her husband is a partner in Leroi and Flench Company, insurance brokers, New York City. Hannah Leroi, whose home address is 61 W. 83rd Street, New York City, was a correspondent of Rose Beigel Arenal, one of the subjects of the Alto case. (u)

In an effort to definitely determine the present whereabouts of Rudolph Hamburger, Steinfeld was interviewed by the Bureau in the Summer of 1949. He advised that he knew Otto Hamburger, Rudolph's brother, in Japan for over ten years, and that he met him "through mutual friends." Otto was both a customer and personal friend. At one time Steinfeld recommended Otto for a position with the Chien Sien Engineering Company in Shanghai. Otto worked for that firm until the beginning of the war. Otto then founded the Hay Tung Engineering Company in Shanghai, where he remained in business until about a year ago. Steinfeld said that with the advent of the present Chinese situation, Otto attempted to secure permission to enter the United States. He was unsuccessful. Steinfeld tried to assist him. Steinfeld said that he was in China and saw Otto there in December, 1948. (100-210002-31). (u)

Comment:

By his own admission, Fuchs has implicated Jurgen Kuczynski in this espionage case. Jurgen Kuczynski is married to Marguerite Steinfeld. Jurgen's

ster, Ursula, is a known Russian Espionage agent, having operated in China with Rudolph Hamburger and in Switzerland. Rudolph Hamburger's brother, Otto, has been in the Far East from April, 1938, to 1949. Ursula and Rudolph are known to have maintained some contact. One of Otto's friends in China is Henry Steinfeld, who may or may not be related to the wife of Jurgen Kuczynski. Steinfeld came to this country from China in 1941, and was "inactive" until 1944, and is engaged in a business which is a perfect front for espionage work. (U)

Recommendation:

It is recommended that the New York Field Division be requested to obtain further information concerning Henry M. Steinfeld in an effort to determine whether or not he may be related to the wife of Jurgen Kuczynski. If the investigation warrants, the possibility should be borne in mind in conducting this investigation that Steinfeld may be the unknown subject [redacted] If you approve, there is a letter attached hereto to this effect. (TS) (K)
