KONSTANTIN LAPAZANOS was interviewed by Speoial Agenta Charles E. Pelletier and Richard W. Dow, on February 3, 1950. He advised that he dil not have a mildie name and that he residen with his parents at
$\therefore$ the above address. He was born in Polopanessus, Greseo, and was naturalis ol in the U.S. District Court, Boston; Mass. He etated that he is unamployed and is gathering material for an artiole on history; however, no definite plans have been male as to its publication. He etated that he graduated from Dartmouth College in 1935, and was formerly omployed in the Bethleherr Shipbuilling Corporation, Eingham, Mass., during Forld \#ar II. He stated he had no milltary servioe and was rejeoted for service due to a phyaical oondition, the nature of which he did not atate.

## Association with Robert B. Heinaman

Informant advised he first met ROBERT B. HEINEMAN in 1940 or 1941, when they were both feilow studente in the history olans at Harvard college, Cambridge, Mass. He tated that he never lived at the Heineran residenoe im Cambridge, axcept for intermittent periods of one week or a few days, while Mr. and Mrs. HEINBMAN were away, at which time he took care of the HEINBNAN ohildrem. He stated that to his conowiedge netther ROBERT HEINBMAN nor his wife, KRISTGL, are nembers of the Commuist Party. He olasbified ROBERT HBINRMAN as a "libaral", "idealist", and "humanitarian," in that he was always willing to help people, and wante to prevent suffering. He atated that ROBERT HEIMEMAN has no definite political conviottons, and based apon his association with HEINBHAN, over a long period of yoars, he would etate that he is a "loyal Americen." He had no knowledge of any Commanist mestinge hell at the residenoe of the Hentradis.

He tated that about 1947, after Morid War II terminated, ROBERT HEINEMAN went to Moxiog City to gather material for an article and that he paid his own expenses and was gone for about two or three months. When EEINEMAN returned, he exhibited to informant photostatic copies of material wich was to be used in comection whin the article. He stated that ROBERT B. BEINENAN is a man of some means, and that he could never understand why a persion like him would have so much interest in labor questions. He was of the belfef that gsingyar made a social visit

- to Hen Fork City on one occasion; however, be was opable to flx the date or the year. He did note that he was gone for three or four days
- and at that time inde brother-in-law, KlaUS FUCHS might have beak in New
?. Fork. He believed, hewever, that this trip took place while he.
- PBEINEMAN, was employod by the General Electrio Company. He alao.
- reoalled that les. REINEMAN sent eigarettes to her brother, KLaUS ruCBS, at an internment camp in Canada; however, he did not know just how the

cigarettes were transported to her brother. She sent the oigarettes during the early stages of World Mar II, while her brother was interned.
 for a position of an overseas ambulance driver, with the American Field Service; however, he was turned down due to his health. Informant did not furnish any information regarding Informant advised that ROBERT HEINEHA told imrormant that kLaUS fucHs was "etand-offiah" and "snob."

With respect to the associates of Mr. and yrs. ROBERT BENNENAN, informant advised that Mr. and Mrs. HENRI CADBURY occasionally visited the BEINEMAN residence. AETHUR OCDEN was very friendly with ROBERT HEINEMAN When they both attend e Harvard College. Informant was unfamiliar with the name of Miss or lis. TRACY. Informant stated that he never met the couple now living at the EEINEACN residence, but that this couple has been residing at the HEINEFAN residence for the past two or throe months. He stated that previously another couple lived at the HEINEMN residence for about five or six months; however, he did not know the names of this couple.

With respect to this last un-named couple who had resided in Henfrian ${ }^{\text {n }}$ home in Cambridge, Mas., Informant provided the following information: Informant admitted that pe was very devoted to the HEINBMAN children, and that he felt they might not be properly oared for and as a subterfuge, he told an official at the Festboro State Hospital, that the unknown couple living at the BEINEMKN residence were "Communists" or "Fascista". Informant stated that his motive for making this report was that he wanted the Social Service workers to call frequently at the HEINEMAN residence to assure that the children were being given proper upbringing. He stated that this official at the Festboro State Hospital told him that that agency could not handle the matter, but that a Social Service worker from the Mount Auburn Hospital in Cambridge mould call at the HEINEMAY residence. Informant admitted that he "slandered" ROBERT HEINEMAN by this story. Informant stated that ROBERT HETHEMAN and KLAUS FUCHS, in his opinion, would not work together very well on any case, because there is a clash of personalities and he did not think anyone would trust ROBERT HEINEMAS for undercover work as he is "not olever enough."

Mrs. ROBERT B. (KRISTEL) HEINEMAN
Informant stated that he first met Mra. BEINBMAN when he oalled at the HEINEMAN residence at the request of ROBERT HEINEMAN. He stated that Mrs. HEINEMAN was not very much interested in political questions. Informant -bated at far back as 1938 , he observed that the $\operatorname{HEINEMANE}$ were not getting -along very well.

Informant advised that he had no diary or records to evidence any date of any occurrences which he might discuss; however, he did recall that on one occasion, 'KLAUS PUCAS', while visiting Cambridge, told Mra. HEINEMAN that.

according to his itinerary, he was to viait a phyaicist in Soheneotady, Hew York, and that it would be a good opportumity for her to take a vacation and accompany him. Informant stated that he was sure that the person whom KLIUS FUCHS was to visit was in Sohenectady, Hew Yorks however, he did not know his naime, but believed that it was a German mame and that
he was somehow connected with either the General Eleotric. Co., at Sohenectady or Cornell Univeraity, at Ithaca, Hew York, Informant believed that this trip was made in about 1948. Informant rocailed this epecifio
 ohildren during her absenoe. at this time 4 rs. HEINEMGN was not getting along very well with her husband, aocording to the informant. Informant did recall that at his euggestion, Irs. HEINEMGN and FUCHS boarded a train at back Bay Station in Boaton, and they were gone not more than two daye and they probably got a borth on their return trip to Botion. He also reoalled that Mrs HEINEMN complained that when they boarded the train at Back Bay Station, they could not obtain seats and the train was "dirty". Informant atated that aithough be could not remember the name of the unknown physioist, he oonld identify the name if several names were submitted to him.

Informant stated that he visited Mrs. HEINEMAN at the MoLean Hospital, in Waverly, and the Weatboro State Hospital, and that he never obsserved her in any spell, and in hisiopinion, He. HEINEMAN is mane. Informant stated he believed 3re. HeINEMiN is being confined at the inetigation of her husband because they do not get along very well. (It ohould be noted that both the MoLean Hospital and the Westboro State Hospitel are mental hospitals.)

Informant stated that Ars. HEINEMAN'E brother, KAAUS FUCHS, is very fond of her, In fact during the war he requested her and the ohildren to iive in
 HBINEMAl instituted divorce proceedings, but that she would want custody of the ohildren. He did not know whether or not yr. HEDNEMAN instituted divorce proceedings.

EMCL KLAUS FUCES (father of Mrs. HEINEXGN)
Informant recalled the occesion when EMIL ZLAUS FUCBS, Mra. HEINEMAN is father visited Cambridge. Ke stated that wen the father visited his daughter, he told het about the suicidal tendencies in the family and that he told her all about her brother, GERHIRT, who was presently in a sapitarium in Switzerland, and the fact that Mrs. HibNEMAN's mother committed suicide as well as her sister. ELIZABETH, and that ever inee Iars. HEINELAN has heen in a disturbed mental atate. Informant further

- tated that in this connection, he wrote to KHAUS FUCES oriticicing
* the father for inparting euch information to his daughter. Informant
- "reoalled that 妡s. HEINEMAN's father viafted the Onited States ${ }^{-t}$ to. give a teries of lectures during the Sumer of 1949, under the auspioes

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of the Friends Service Committee. Informant stated he mot Me. HEINEMAN's father on one ococision while the father was visiting Irs. HEINEMAN at the Wegtboro State Hospital:

## ZISOS FDCHS

Informant recalled that Mrs. HETNEMAN's brother, HLAUS PUCHS, eeveral monthe'after his entry into the Inited States, came to visit the
 thile the HEINEMANs resided at 144 Lakeview Ave., Cambridge, Mass. Informant stated that ZLAJS FOCHS was a mathematician and was omployei in Washington, D. C., and after the news of the atamio bomb expiosion was released to the public, RLAUS FUCES told Informant that he was enloyed at Los Alamos; New Maxioo. On the ocoadion of thic firat viait of kLADS FUCHS, he remained at the GEINEMAN residence for foar or five days. He stated that to his korledge, while maOS FOCES was in Cambridge; he; KLaUS FUCES, never had any contacte. Ee stated that he recalled on one occasion that informant aocompanied yr, and yrs. HEINEMAN aid KlaUS FUCHS to the Ioe Follies in Boston. He stated that FLAUS FUCHS Tisited the HEINEMAN realdenoe on two or three decasions and he recalle that after the atomic bombexplosion was released to the public, KLAOS FUCES told him he had been woriding on the bomb and shortly before his departure from the Dnited States, KLAUS FOCHS axhibited photographs of the Atomic Bomb explosion, Which photographs eleo appeared in the publio press, according to informant. Informant stated that he asked KLADS FUCHS somathing about the bambe but FUCES would not diecussit. Informant did reoell that on one occasion, while GaUS FUCES was visiting the HBINEMANs, he received a telegram, wioh was telephoned by the Festerin Dioion. lrs, HEIEIEMAN told informant to proceed to the Western Diiion office in Cambridge, Mass., in order to obtain the text of the message wioh he did. Informant realled that the telegram was from some British aoientist in Washington, inetructing KLAUS FUCHS to report for work somewhere. He did not recall the name of the scientist, but oould identify the name if aubinitted to him. Informant did not recall any meetings being held at the gielnewan residenoe.
urs. HEINEMAN told informant on one oocasion that RLAUS FUCHS told her that he, KLiOS FUCES, thought well of infermant. He stated that kLaUS POCES wat very friendly and close to his sister; 保的. HEINEMAN. Mrs. HEINBMAN never indioated to informant that KLADS FUCES wab involved in any subveraive aotivities or eapionage.

ISRAKL HATPERTN
The name of ISRAEL HALPERIN was not famillar tio informant.

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Photographic Equipment of ROBERT GEIFEMAN
Informant advised that ROBERT EXINELAN has bean a camera onthugiast for many years and that he purchased a lot of photographic equipment after his trip to Mexico City and that he used a slide viewer to project slides of his material mich he gathered in Mexico city for his article. Informant had no information of mIllaiS FUCH's working In HEINEMAN's dark room or asking ROBERT GRINEMAN to do any dark room work for him.

During the course of the interview, informant did not volunteer any information concerning his alleged paternity of any of the feiNElaN children.

The files of the Boston Office reflect that one KONSTANTM लEibine IAFAZANOS, in Dotoler, 1946 , was reported by
 Naturalization Service, Boston, reflect that he was born in Kalamata, Greece, on April 18, 1911, the son of NICOLAOS and ARTHANASIA GIANOMOPOULON. He was naturalised at Boston, Massy, on Pelruary 4, 2946.

The records of Harvard College, Cambridge, Mass., indicated that he graduated Prem Dartmouth College in 1935, with the degree of AB and that his legal name was constantin Charles lafazanos and that he was then a traveling fellow of the American School of Classical Studies, Diviversity of Athens. At Dartmouth College, he used the name of CHARUES NICHOLS LiFAZANOS.

The records of Local Board \#162, Winthrop, Massy, reflect that he was rejected for military service because of psychoneurosis, His former landlady reported that he received the magazine "USSR", but she had no knowledge of any Communist activities on his part. Inasmuch as the investigation failed to develop any Communist activities it. was discontinued.

Ifs. KRISTEL IEINETHN was intorviowod at tho ${ }^{\text {State }}$ lospital in tho presence of $\mathrm{V}_{\mathrm{r}}$ ROLLINS K. LLiDLEY, Lireotor, who advised that she was in good health and that an intorviow would in no may interfore with her treatmont or recuvery.

PERSONAL HISTORY
The following personal history, additional to that set forth in hospital rocords conoorning hrs. GEIEHMN, was obtained from hex.

EIRSTEL IEINEXN statol her mothor had diod when she was abuut eleven years of age and she had boun sent to a private sohool when fourteon, in the year 1935. Her family associations from that timo on ware extremely limited because of the politioal difficultios in which tho othor membere of her family pere involved and the severity of her own sohooling.

Questionod conoerning her childhood and any games she may have played, she stated she had no nioknames. She ansually remombered sinoe she had baen afflicted with montal illness and bofore her incaroeration $\bar{y}$


FFIENDS $\angle \mathrm{HD}$ ISSOCL $\angle$ TES OF MR. LND LIRS. ROBERT HEINEIUN Its. DEINEidN atatod that she had very few frionds. Hor husband was also linitod in his scoial activity and his friends mero for the noet part follow mombora cf the Commist rarty who will be roferrod to under suoh a huading below.

1frs. MBIMEiLAN stated that perhaps the most frequent visitors at hor home woro iirs. KipTHERINE xiERRIHG ani hur husband, whoso first nomo she could not rocall.

Bhw identified KOXSTMFIIT LLPANZGNOS as hor "lovor" and oonetant visitor. She stated she was on extromoly good terme with BETTY FURRY and LLICE LIDUR, who will bo muntioned below.

ERISTEL MEITHASN statod that sho was not now a momber of tho Comanist Party ani had novor beon a mumbor of tho Commaiat Party. She stated sho attondod mootings of the Young Comanist Loague with her husband bofore thoir marriage while both were at Ewathnore College. Howover, sho was of rcligious persuasion and, therofore, the doctrinos of Comaunisn had never held an appoal fur hor.
 of the Young Compunist League at Swathmoro Collogo during the years 1955-1938, Lbsociated with hin in the Young Commuist leaguo at that timo wore the fullowing persuns:

NANCY CAFDOZh, LHRY IVGNS and TED TELTFORT. She tatod that VELTFORT wont to Spain to fight for the Comamists. ibri, IEINEIUN statod at the ond of hor husbond's freshman yoar at Swathnore he had taken on Intcurist trip to the soviet Union bofore returaing for the fall somestor; She stated he has naver disoussod this trip extolsivoly. Tho only compent sho con remember ho mado was that he liked the Caspion Son.

At Harvard Colloge; Lis. HEINEILN olaimod that har musband had ocntimued his Comanist affiliations. She assortod he was a momber of the Communist Farty while at Llarvard and belonged to a Branoh which frequently met at their home. ismbers of this bronoh includad iENDELL II. FURRY,
 TRLSEY, TSLDOR GMDUR and LLICE LIDUR. (LIL of these people will be referred to bolow).

Lirs. HEINBrAM stated she did not know her husband's curront otatus in tho Communist Party and that the last yoar che is positive that he hold a mombership card was 1947.

## EML FUCHS, FATH.R OF KLAUS FUCES and ERISTEL HEINEMGN

KRISISL IEINMIAN statod that her father was a very religious mon in his profossion in the ministary. Politically, he was foumdor of the Sooial Demoorat (roligious) Party of Germany. In 2934, shority after tho doath of her mothor, her fathor was oalled to Eorlin and, told by the minions of IIitler to eithor oupport sitler or pay tho ponalty. He apont ono your in jail, tho looation of which was not lonown to hor, and he theroafter sufforod continuously beokuse of his political viows.

Sho assorted that he was not n mombor of the Communist Porty in Germany to her muwludge but that he had foum many favorable aspeots in Condunism. He is currontly living in the Russion Zone of Gormany and is proaching a dootrine that all Gormany should bo united but not undar the control of any one group. It is notod that tho exhibit seotion of tile ropurt will contain adiditional infurmation rogarding her father.

KLLUS FUCIS
GRISTEL IEINEHLN stated that boonuse of family ounditions sho saw hor brother for a fow days during tho sohool holidaya during 1933. Sho hoard through other members of the family in 1934 that he had boon compelled to rosign from the Univorsity at Kiol booauso of politioal notivity; that all of his soholastio reoords hid boon stampod "This man is a Commanist" and that as a political fugitivo he walkod noross tho Gorman bordor into Franoo.

In 1935, whon she was on routo to the United States, she apent two days with KLAUS FUCIBS in Paris. . Sho did not hoar from him again until 1943 and thon indireot2y.
 FURRY and that IEMDELL FURRY had a brother-in-law in tanada, who was a soiontist. ifith son prompting she rocalled this brothcr-in-law to bo IGRAEL WJLPFRIN. Sometimo in 1943 HILPIMRIN wrote FURRY that he had mot KLdUS FTCIIS, whoso brother-in-law and sistor were believad to be known to FURRY, FUHRY advisod the HEINEILLIS that KILUS FUCHS had been interned as a German alion in a Canodian intornnent oamp. Thereaftor, sho hcard regularly through tho FURRYS of KLADS' aotivitios, until somotine in vory oarly 1945 when KLuOS wrote that he was ooming to visit them.

ERISTEL IRINEIAN oan romomber that RLAUS visited the HEIMEITHN home ponotive in February, 1945, Sho stated that there wero many visitors, the only one of whom sho oan olearly reoall is isrs. HERRING, montionod abovo, who, due to some diffioulty at her own home, was temporarily rosiding with tho EEINEWMS:

On the oocasion of this visit ERIBTEL believes her brother spent two or three days at her home. It is her reoolleotion that thereafter he Was a froquent visitor in 1945 for one-ciay periods; 1.0 ., ho would arrive in the morning and depart in the aftornoon or evening. She could reoall he had one friend in Carbridge nomed DEUTSCH. Itrs. 1945 or not but not know whother KILUS was aoquaintod with D. 3 UTSCLI in 1945 or nut but she is oortain that DEUSSCH worked with KIaUS at Los

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Llamos. Upon the termination of the Los Alamos work DEUTSCH oame to lassnohusetta $I_{\text {nistituto of }}$ eohnclogy as a faoulty member. 8he can furthor recall that DEOSSCII's wifo's first name was MELBMA and she is unior the distinot improision that BELBNL DEUTSCE was a poyohiatrist.

Ifs. IEINE:GN statod that KLAOS FUCDS als visited her in the surmor of 1946 for a fom days and that thoro worc a nunbor of guosts who oallod on thom. Bho could romomber that ancong those wore Dr . and izs, HENRY CLDBURY. Sho beliuvod that this asscaiation was prodioated upon CLDBURY!s leadership in the Sooioty of Friends. She asbortod that it was vory pesaiblo that MuvS FJCFS oould have boen noquaintod with hor husband's associatos in the Comanist Party, but the cioes not know that to be positivoly eo.

Lirs. HiLNELLN statod she has not heard fron her bruther KIGUS FUC:IS in a long time and is very arxicus to o averse with hime
It is noted that the Los $410 n 0 s$ roocrde indicate that RLANS MOCHS was visiting in "anbridico, Has sachusotto, fron Fobruary il, 1945 to Fobruary 25, 1945 and that ho pormanontly departed from Los 41 anos on Juno 15, 1946.

## CERELARDT FUCES

Irs. ERINEMEN advised that her brother GERILIRDT had been oustod from the, Univorsity at Kiel in 1934 together with her brother KINUS. His rocords were also stamped "This man is a commanist" and hes as a politioal fugitive, went to Switzerland. Sho does not know his present politioal viempoint or the nature of his ourrent employmont.

## FINARLIL AFFATRS OF THE FEDEXANS.

KRISTEL HEMEMSNN advised she had been tuld by hur hueband on the occasion of their marriage that he had sume money aooumalated through his father. She stated ho made it a oustom to deposit a sonall arm in a oheoling aooount for her use in ouvering household exponses.

Sho knew on one oocasion he roceivod a rathir largo ancunt of monoy -tronsforred from a Chicago bank, but shi nover know the omount or the disposition:

She knows furthor hor husband maintainod a safety doposit box in Cambridge, but tho ountonte ware not known to hor nor dic aho havo oocoss to it.

I. BACKGROUND
a. General

ROBERT BLCCK HEINETAN, 94 Lakeview Avenue, Cambridge, Mass., Was interviewed by Special Agents CHERLES E. PELLETTER and THOMAS F. MoLAWGHLIN, Jr., on February 2, 1950, at his residenco. He advised that he was born Herch 25, 1917, at Mausau, Wisoonsin, the son of GABRIEL B. HEINEMAN and ALMA BLCCE. He adrised that his birth certificate reads "Eoinemarin." The permanent address of his parents is 320 South Plymouth Court, Chicago, Illinois, and they are presently in their seabonal home in Hollywood, Florida.
b. Family 1

HEIMEMAN advised that he has the following relatives:
Wife: KRISTEL FUCHS, who was born in Germany and is otill an aliene Fis wife applied for oitizenship papers and thoy were returned by the Immigration Service for oorreotion and she never resubmitted the papers. He belleved this to be at Boston, Mass., about eleven or twelve yoars ago. Ho belioves he has his wifo's imaigration papers and of fered to make a search for them and have them available.

Sister: Mrs. ERNEST (IAARGARET) SOLOMON, age 38, residence, Tinnotika, Illinofs, whose husband is a physician:
 Sohools; Berwya, Pemsylvania.

Parents: GABRIEL B. HEINBMAN and ALMA (BLOCR) HEINERAN, reBidence, 320 South Plymouth Court; Chi oago, Illinois.

Children: STEPHEN, age 10; MaRCIA, age 8; and KRISTEL, age 6. All children born in Baker Memorial Hospital, Boston, Nass.
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0. Education

HEINEEAR advised that ho graduated from tho Oniveraity High Sahool, Chicago, Illinois, in 1934, and recoivod the Degree of Bachelor of Arts from Swarthmore Collego, Swarthnore; Penneylvania, in 1938. Ho attendod Harvard Colloge Graduate Sohool of Arts and Soiences, Cambridgo, Mass., from 1938 to 1941 or 1942, where he roceived a Mator's Degrec. Ho continucd further studies toward his Doctorate of Philosophy but did not succosefully complete the course, He is presontly enrollod in the Harvard Graduate School of Education where he is sooking a faster of Etucation Degroo, in order, according to his own statemcnt, to bocome a otivoly affiliated with the teaching profoseion.

## d. Enployment

EEINEMAN advisod that he was omployod by the General Elootric Company, Riter fiorks, Lynn, 体es., frombout 1943 to 1945, as a dispatcher and assistant foromn. Ho taught at the Antrim High School, Antrim, New \#nmpshire, from 1945 to 1946; toaching Social Studios and Fronch. He was a substitute tascher at the Nolrose; Mass, Bigh School for threo wooks and a substitute teacher in the Public School System of the City of Boston for a fow days.

- Rosidoncos

HEINHiSAN advisod that ho formorly rosidod et 55 Carver Streot, Watortown, Masa.; Cambridgo Streot, Combridge, Masae; Dans Streot, Cambridgc, Mass.i and 144 Lakeviow Avenuo, Cambridgo, Yase., and prosontly resides at 94 Lakaviow Avenuc, Cambridge, Nass: Ho advisod that he did not recall the stroct numbers of somo of his former residoncos.

## f. Travel

BEINEHAN advised that during tho Sumner of 1937, he travelad to England, Swoden, Finiand, Russia, Poland, Austria, Italy, and France; that he loft aboard tho SS Aquitania and returned aboard tho Ile de Franco. He stated that the purpose of his travel was pleasure and he was single at tho time and obtained a passport under his own namo. Fle statod that as far as ho is aware, he otill has it in his possession and that he would be glad to search for tho passport and have it available the following day,

FEINEMAN statod that he also visi ted Cuba during tho Christmas holidays of 1936-1937, whilc a atudont at Swarthrore Coliogo. The purpose of this trip was ploasure and he was nocompanied by e fellow atudent whoso namo he did not recall.

HEINEMAN stated that during January, 1947, he went to Mexico City and was there for a period of three months and that he returnod to Cambridge around ky 1, 1947. He stated that during this period, ho had marital difficultios with his wifo and "took a racation." Ho. stated that the purpose of this trip was primarily to gathor material for an article. He enterod Foxico City via the port of Larcdo, Texas, and roontcrod the U. S. at the samo port. He stated that he also stayed in Monteroy, Nexioo, during this trip.

He rocalled taking a vacation of one weck while employed by tho Goneral Electrie Company, Iynn, Mass.; howover, he did not regall where he went or whom ho visited.

## Mrs. ROBERT (KRISTEL) BLOCK HEINEMAN (Wife)

HEINEMAN advised that his wifo onterod the Unitod States of Amarion under the auspioes of the Friends Sorvioc Committee on a atudent risa and she subsequently procooded to Cabn and reontcrod the Onitod States while a studont at Swarthmoro College, in ordor to comply with the immigration requirements.

He stated that he marriod his wife at Boston, Hass., about the year 1938 and that for tho past five or six years, his wifo has been having delusions and that as he refleots upon the various statoments made by his wife, he takes thom with a great doal of skepticisme Ho advisod that about a yoar proviously, her illness bocamo acuto and Dr. JACESCN THOHLS of Boston, Mass., a psychiatrist, oxaminod her and she was comitted to MoLoan Hospital, Waverly, Mess., on Haroh 25, 1949, where sho remained for one woek and was then transferrod to the Combridge City Hospital, and subscquently transferred to tho Westboro State Fospital.

He rocalled one speoific instance of a dolusion wherein his wife complained that the woman next door was looking into her kitchen to see what kind of a housekeeper she was.

HEINGIAN advised that to his knowledge, he does not belleve that his Wife traveled during 1944 or 1945 but that there is a bare poseibility that she might have traveled to New York.

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HEINEMAN statod that he and his wife have not been on friondly terms for the past five or six years and on ono occasion as a rosult of a dispute with hie wife, ho took over an apartment either at 65 or 165 Dano Strect, Cambriego, lhas. Ho recolled that this was whilo he was omployed by tho Gencral Eleotrio Compary. Ee remained in this apartment for four or fivo months. Ho stated that he never had any reasion to question the loyalty of his wifo to the Joited States of America.

## g. Kemborship in Organizations

At tho outsot of the intorviow, FEINEMAH dented being oonnectod with any underground or Comrunist groups; however, during the intter part of the interview, he admitted that he beoame a momber of the Young Communist Lenguo at Strarthmore Collego about 2935, and that he oontinued his affilintion with the Young Coumunist Leagus until he oame to Combridge, linss. Ho statod that he was drawn into the Young Communiet Loague by his interost in the Spanish Civil Wrr. Ho did not rocall the namo of the partioular olub or unit and admitted that he was an officer in the Young Conmmist loague and was very aotive in it. He statcd he made no attempt to troat his affiliation oonfidentially.

With respoct to nombership in the Communist Party, ho denied being $a$ momber of this organization; however, ho admitted that he might have applied for memborship in the Communiat Party in Philadelphia, Ponnsylvania. Later during tho interview, BE nramiv admittod joining the Communist Party at Philadelphia, about 1935 to 1938 , and statod that he oarriod a membership oard but doubts whethor it was issuod in his true nome. Ho clajnod that he did not rocall this incident oinco it happened auch a long time ago. He stated that he considers himsolf a liboral but that under probent day oonditions, a liberal is oalled a Commumiat.

FEINEMAN atated that he contimued hia membership in the Young Communist Leaguo at liarvard College for two or three years after his arrival but that he pas not an officer in that pariticular branch. He explained that the rules of the College roquire the registration of all organieations and thet he in behalf of the Young Communist Leaguo, registered this organization with the proper Oniversity official. He stated that he was very busy with his studies and that he beoome rather incictive in the Young Communist league about the time of the Munich Agreement, which agreement aused him to become very much upset. Ho reiterated, however, that ho was not conneoted with the Young Communist League wille he was employod at the Genoral Eleotrio Company.

HEINETAN stated he recalled signing some oards in oonneotion with the Spanish Appeal; howorer, he did not rcoall whether the oards were
oiroulated under the auspices of the Communist Purty or the Young Communist Lergue. Ele stated that he nover applicd for momborship in the Communst Ferty in New ingland, but that ho did cooporate with the Commists and that ho also contributed money to the Joint Anti-Fasoist Rerugee Comittes rocently.

He etated that his wife was nevor a mamber of the Communist Purty or the Young Communist League, to his knowledge but that his wife did know about his memborship in the Young Commuist League. He explained that his wife could not join the Young Communst Loague while at Swarthmoro because, boing an alien, she would be placed in a prejudicial position with regard to gaining eitizonship: $:$

EMIL KIAUS PUCES (Father-In-1an)
HETRETKN cduvited that ERIL KLADS FUCHS, his father-in-1ow, visited Cambridge, Miss., in October, 1948, and thit he wis in the Onitod States of America from Ootober, 1948 until July, 1949, nevor having previousiy been in the Unitod States. He oame on the invitation of the Friends Service Committoe, Fiallingford, Ponnsylvania, to give b. series of leotures. He statod that he is now teaching Thoology at the University pof Laipzig. The nophew of EEINETAN nrmod KLAUS相TTOESKI, age 14 years, aocompanicd EIIL KLUUS FJCHS on his visit and KIhUS KITTORSEI is tho ano of RSINEMAN's sister-in-law, ELIZABETH FUCPS KITTOWSEI.

HEINBIAN stated that Yise, EEINBUAN told him that she had a difficult time with her father which condition existed prior to tho time of their marriage and which apparontiy related to a persomal family problem. Ee added further that his wife's father whe present at Combridge, 退ss., at, or about the time, of his wifels oounitmont to a montel institution and he stated that the allogations of his wife, with regard to the fomily problem reforred to above, wore. decied by her father at that time.

HIST NOMAN stated that his father-in-law is what is known as a social democrat or religious sooialist and that he formerly lived in the Festern Zone of Germany but whe unable to obtain work and was offered a position in the Eastern Zone in Germany, which he nocepted ot Leipeig

KLUUS FUCES (Brother-in-1am)
HEINEMAN stated that he first met KLID S FOCRS; who is about 38 years of age, whon be came to the Thited States in order to work at Los Alamos Droject. He onme to tho Onited Strates as a rescoiroh employee

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of the British Government, occording to FEMNETHN. Then questioned with respect to the spocifio date, BEIFRMAN was mable to provide that informition other than to recall that his firat oontact with ELAUS FWCRS whe incidental to FTCES' arrivol in the Onited States for this purpose. HBINEMAN advised that prior to that time, he had no porsonal oontcet with him nor did he have agy oorrespondence With him at any time:
FETMWHN stated that tht the outbreak of Forid Far II, KLAUS FGCES Wis internéd in Eaginnd, and was tranaferred to an interrant oomp in Canada ns an internee. He was reloased because of his soientifio. knowledge and was made a Fellow of the Royal Society and was sent to England. HEI NEMNI did not recall the name of the Canadian Interment camp.

HETMEAN stated that his Wife and brother-in-icw, ALAOS FICBS, wib very friendily and close and that his wife hid not seen XLios since 1933, at which time KIANS left Germany and proceeded to England. Heither he nor his wife know that KLAUS FUCFS was ooming to the United States, acobraing to HEIMEINT.

HEINEPAN atated that while he was teaching at the Antrim, Mew Rompshire Figh Sohool, KHitJS FUCES visited his wife in Cambridge, kasepe at wisoh time the $\mathbb{E}$ INEIAN family was living at 144 Lakeviem Avenue, Cambridge. Ee stated that GLAUS FOCES remained at the REINBMN residence for a couple of daye. FeINFish rocalled that on the next fisit of ELAD S FUCRS, he lived at 94 Lakevien Avenue. Fe stated that during the time ILins FUCES was in Cambridge, lirse., to his knowledge, he hed no social oontacts and bad no individuals call on him and he did not recall any ocrmunications addressed to FOCES. Ho stated that a friend, $H E N R Y$ CLDBURY, might have boen invited to the BEINEPMAR residenoe but he oould not definitely recall.

FE INEMAN acivised that KLADS FUCRS was very quiet and seoretive and never spoke about his work on the atom bomb. He stated that et no time had KLidS FOCIS indicated my ovidence of Commism or underground aotivities as he was oompletely. "wrapped up" in his work.

BEINEMAN reonlled that KLITS FUCHS worked in New York for a thort period of time prior to going West. He recalled that on one oocasion he went to New York City when KLADS FOCHS was working there and Hes. HEINEIN wantod him to stay with KIAUS FUCFD in. New York. He stated that he nevor mot KLADS FUCHS anywere other than at Combridge, Ness.

HEINEFAN did recall that on ono ococsion KLIJS FUCFS apoke about his boss in the Fest, stating that his boss' Wife was Jemish and that the wanted him to got somo Jewish brend or something and he believed FUCHS' boss' namo was Dr. OPPENEMER. However', he was not positive that EIAOS FUCES montionod the name.

HE INEMAN reoallod that on the occabion whon KLAOS FUCFS visited Cambridge, Mass., on his way back to Europe, he exhibited some photographs of the atom bomb explosion which oocurred during a test and he askod KLiUS PUCBS whother he was allowed to possess cuch photographs and RLAOS stated that he was because the photographs wore relonsed to the proses.

IEINEPAN statod, to his knowledgo, he does not have in his possession any porsonal property, docunents, eto. belonging to KIAUS FUCES. Fo stated that ho wont through all of his whe's papors and possessions with a Fiew to obtaining information which he oould use in comnection with his prospoctive divorce fron his wife and dic not locato any information pertinent to the FBI or for use in oomection with bis divoroe proceedings.

HeInguan indicated during the oourge of the interview that he was very devoted to his three children and that he would proteot the ohildren et all costs and would not proteat his brother-in-iaw, xLiJs Fucps.

He stated that on the occosions when RLAUS FUCIS Fisited his house in Cmbridge, Hass., that he slept inte in the morning and usually took the children out for a walk and that he did not associate with any other indivicuals. He did recall that FUCES went. to the Ice Follies with him and his wife, FEINEALAN stated that, to his knowledge, KLAOS FUCES, while Visiting him in Crmbridge, Mass., never made use of the telephone

## ISRAEL HALPERIN

HEINEMAN stated that he nevor met ISRAEL HALPERIN but that a man namod HhLPERIN, whose first name he did not recall, relayed some oigarettes to KLAUS FJCES when the lattor was in an internment oamp in Canada. FEINEMAN stated that, to his knowledge, ISRAEL HALPERIN never visited the FE INRAKN residence. He stated that, to his knowledge, his wife whe not aequainted with ISRABL HALPERIH.

PHOTOGRAPEIC EQUIPMENT OF ROBERT B. HETNEMATI
The interviow with BEINFPAN took place in a combination drak room and library located on the first.floor rear in the Leineman residence. It

Fan obsarved that HEINITAN has a seven-foot work bench, an amega onlarger 4 X , whioh is equipped with a color head, Model D-il. Fif also has a slide viewer and various ohemicals and paper and apparatus used in photography. He stated thet he has been a comora enthusiast for many ycars. HEINEMAR advised that EIADS FUCFS saw the photographic equipment and nevar asked him to do any photography for him and that his wife wal not interested in photography.

General
It is noted that during the oourse of this interview, an attempt was made to draw from ROBERT BLOCI EEINEMM ocmplete details with respeot to his Commint Party mombershif and affiliction, the identity of the undte with which he was affiliated, the officers and other members, who were associated with him. In addition, concerted effort was extended towards developing his knowledge, tsesociation and affiliation with KLAUS FUCFS with a Flow towards identifying FUCiS: wisits to Cambridge, lisse, any porsons with whon he might hove oome in contact, in any way, during the courso of these visits, any particular recollection BEINEEAN might have th rospect to speaflo parsons who wantod to see FUCES or whom FUCES wanted to $s$ ee or any other related material or information pertinent in establishing the oontaote of FJCHS.

During the entire oourse of the interview, EEINETAN was hostile to the extent that he was obviously trying to ignore completely the spociflio questions asked and responded in goneral terns whioh failed to provide ary aubstantial information. He was onstmotly pressed for this information and only under direot questioning uith respeot to his Young Communist Leage and Commuist Party affiliations, was it possible to ideatify these affiliations and their possible relationship to the instant investigation.

Prior to the olose of the interview, HEINEMiN atated that he felt if he had sufficient timo to refleot upon the period involvod, he night be in a position to identify the persons with whom he wes cffiliated during his Commaist Perty membership days and clso be of some asistanoe in oonnection with the viaits of his brother-inlaw to Cambridge, Mass., and the persons whom he moy heve seen ot that time. FEINEMAN statod that he was tremendously confused beoause of the family problems which had developed during rocent yeara onding with the confinoment of his wife, KRISXEL FEINW"M; to the Festboro State Hospital, togothor with conditions relating to his ohildren which oaused him to foel that his obligation and responsibility

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towtrd the three children might not be discharged if he was aotually involved in sone violation of law, which, he states, could not have been wh his knowladge. He appenred to be highly confused, therefore, the interviow was closed at a time when he remained en a friendly basis toward the Agents. ...

ROBERT B. HEIMEMAN Was reinterviewed by Speoial Agents BREMTON S. GORDON and THOMAS F. MoLAUGHITN, WR. the Boston FBI office on February 3, 1950.

The following represents additionel information to that developed during the course of the initial interview with HBINEMAN on February 2, 1950, which interfiew took plaoe at his reaidence, 94 Lakeview Avenue, Cambridge, Liassaohusette. It was noted at that time that he was extremely vague and indefinite with respect to dates, oirounstanges and the identities of individuals who were assooiated both with his family and with KLAUS FUCES.

BACRGROUND
HEINEMAN made available for examination a passport ismed in his name: dated Lay 3, 1937 and mubered 403647. It identified hfm as a student, born ifarch 25, 1917 in Thausau, Fisconsin. The passport sontained yisas permitting him to enter Great Britain, Ruseia, France, Germany, Italy, Poland; Finiand, Sweden and Ceechoslovalia, it being noted that FEINEMAN advised that the visa for ${ }^{\text {Germany was not used and oontained ne stanye. }}$

HEINEMAN stated that his trip to kurope was designed for pleasure and that in conneotion with hia visit to Kussia he mentioned Mosoom, Leningrad, Kiev and Yalta emong those points which he visited. Ihis trip was arranged by Intourist.

He also made available for examination a form isaued by selective Sorvice Board'ill, 205 trest Vincken Drive, Chicago, Illinois, identifying him as a regictrant under Grder Number 2534; Serial Number 2085, and granting authority for travol on his part to Maxioo by himself. This form Fas dated December 26, 1946. HEINEPMAN assorted that while in Lexioo it was nooessary for hin to dram upon funds vilioh he had on doposit at the Cambridge Trust Company, Cambridge; kassaohusetts, and he exhibited a bonk transfer draft dated iaroh 5,1947 , indioating that an amount of 6300 vas transferred to his oredit by the Cambridge Irust Conpany at the Banoo Internaoional, S; Af, Lexioo, D. Fo, it boing noted that HEINERSAN's address was recorqcy as Edison 51, Mexice city.

HEINEiLA mas quationed as to the oiroumstanoes surrounding this partioular Fisit and he statod it was during that period that strained folations
existed betweon himsolf and his wifo and ho found it noeessary to leavo thoir rosidonee and ho statod the Moxican trip mas mado undor suoh oiroumstoncos: Ho addod furthor that he was then oonduoting historionl rosoarch rolative to the Unitod Statos-Moxican War of 1847 and that during the courso of this trip ho did some rosearoh work both in Efontorgy and in Hoxioo City, HEINEMAN statod bo roturnod from loxioo to tho Unitod Statos in time to mect his paronts in Baltimore, Maryiand, on Hay 1, 1947.

HEINEMAN indicatod that following on unsuo00ssful yoar toaching, onding in Juno, 1946 ho had sought unsuocossfully to obtain a buttor position in the teaching fiold through tho fall of 1946. He was dospairod of suooceding in this fiold and this was anothor roason for going to Hexico in January, 1947. He statod that whilo visiting his parents in Baltimoro in the first weck of way, 1947 he first bogan to oonsider cabondoning the toaching profossion and thero was some dispussion of his going into the Lamdermat businose, whioh ultinatoly openod in the fall of 1947.

In addition to the above matorial, HEINENKN also producod a birth cortificato issuad by tho Wisconsin State Board of Health, atoting that ho was born Karoh 25, 1917 at Vausau, Wheoonsing that his parents were recordod as GABE B. HENEIKN, a Unitad States oitizen ongagod as a 1 umber manufaoturar, and ALMK BLOCH GEINENAN, also a Unitod tates oitizen. The family rosidenco mas then reoordad as 820 Fulton Stroet, Wausau, Fisconsin.

FRIEMDS AND ASSOCLITES OF ROBERT HRINEMAN AKD KRISTEL BEDNEMEN
During the course of the previous interview as set forth, EEINBMAN was unable to identify any individuals whom he know to have had contact or acoess to KIGUS FUCHS at any time other than a HENRY CADBURY, whom ho identifiod as a friond rosiding in Cambridge, Massachusetts. Further identification of CADBTRY will be sot forth.

HEINEMAFH during the oourso of the initial interviow was pressed to sot forth the identities of persons whom he considered his owin personal frionds, without any dotermination of whother or not those porsons knew, or may have oome in oontaot with, KLAUS FUCHS, but again his reoolleotion was poor and his response gencrally negative.

During the courso of this intorview, HBingitll was agaili prossod to

$\therefore$ Tho official register of Harvard Univorsity He9, Novembor, 2949, being a dirootory of thivorsity officers and atudents, whioh will bo subsoquently idontified as tho Offiolal Rogistor of Harvard University in this report, idontifios GEORGE TLAD as a Profossor of Biology, whoso prosent rosidonoe 1s 20 Hillside Terraco, Belmont, and whose Diniveraity offico is at the Biological Laboratory.

Mrs. BERR, Lakeview Aromue, Cambridge, whose husband was asscoiated with tho Department of Government, Horvard University. The Offioial Kogister of Harvard Univarsity idontifios samJeL HUICHISON BEER as afsociato Professor of Government, Tutor in the Department of Government and mombor of the Board of Freshman Advisors. His residonce is 87 Lakeview dvonue (Cambridge, Massaohusetts) and his offioe at Holyoke 6.
$\triangle R T H R$ OGDEH, whom he identified as a follow student at Harvard and earlior at Swathmore College. EEINEMLN stated that OGDEN had nevor boen a momber of the YCL or affiliatod with the Communist Party. He added that he last saw him in the apring or summer of 1949, when OGDEN passed through Cambridge on route to a now-forgotion destination. HEINEMAN's best recollootion is that OGDEN livos somowhoro in Now York; that he has novor vorkod and apparontly does not nood nork although HEITEILNN doos not know the source of his income, He statod CGDEN borderod on the gonius in mental oapaoity and at a vory low lovel on the produotivo.

HORIENI LEVINSON, Whom HEIMETAS idontifiod as a faculty member at laneaohusotta Institute of Teohnology in the Dopartment of Mathomatios. ERINEICNS stated that LEV:NSON had visited him and he had viaited IEVINSON but that he had not soen him for quito somo time and did not know his prosent occupation or residence addross.
lit. and hrs. RICILiED EDSALL of Caribridge, Lhassaohusotts. HEINEMLN stated that his children attondod the Shady Hill \$ohool with the EDSLIL children and he met the FDSLLLS in this faahion or through mitual momborshtp or activity in the rrogrossive farty of Cambridge. EEINEMN Etated he know IDSSLL to be an edvertising oxecutive, could not recall his prosent rosidence address and he was not aoquainted with him during the time whon FUCHS Visitod the HEINEiLINN home. He statod that ho had visitod the EDSLIL home but that EDSGLL had nover tisitod h1s homo.

 noighbors who voro docustomod to drop into the REINEINN home and who may woll have dono so during thoso days PUCHS was visiting.

LISA CRLIEY was describod as a HEPNELAN boarder during the fail of 1947, porhaps through tho Christmas holidays. EEINEHian could reoall almost nothing ooncorning hor exoept that she had a dispute with his wife conoorning a mattor ungown to him and had left suddenly with $i l l$ feelinge
iffs, LaRGARRET SIMCER FAS docoribod as a noighbor on Lakeviam avonuo who is oortainly very friondly with him now but whom he connot oloarly rocall as a friend of the fazily in 1944-1947. Her husband is DONbID SYEACER, who tholl known in Cambridge and who presently marves as prosidont of the Cambridge Taxpayors assooiation.

HELEN VELTFCRT was desoribod by HBINENGAN as a friend whom he had mot while at $S_{\text {wathmore }}$ and as the wifo of a very good friend, THECDORE VELTFORT,
 visited him at some time during the portinent period but he oould not recall the year or the circumstanoes. Ho made no reforenoo to hor hubleand.

HILLIMM STEFPi HELLI, 191 Waldon Stroot, Combridge, a friond whom ho first mat while on employee of the Gonoral Elootrio at Iynn, Wassaohusotts.

JOSEPH R. F. RLCICOT, 31 Donxybrook $K_{\text {oad, }}$ brighton. This friond is omployod in the printing industry but HEIIFLiNN was unablo to idontify the name of the oompany.

Mrs. RUTH BERRY; now rosiding on Shalor Lano, "Cambridgo, Linasaohusotts, Whe IWITEidin's housekcopor following his wifo's comitment and through August; 1949. He doas not rooall the name of her husband but balicves be is otill a liarvard studont. Ho atatod tho BERRYS woro not at his home during the purtinent period.

Following the termination of lirs. BERRY's employroent by HEINEHN ho has sinos socured the servioos of itr, and Lirs. HENRY IITLLER. Tho IIILLERS are ourrontly residing ais oo-tomints and housokoopers in the IIBIFBrall home. Ho dosoribed HENRY IIILJER as a atudont at the Harvard sohool of Buainess administration and notod that lifs. illlukR was prognont.

Tho lat friond montionod by HiINEMLN was mentionod with reluotanoo and With some oynioism whon the word "friend" was used. GEINEinN rovoalod that he had associatod in his oarly days at harvard with a follow studont
 the poriod beginningently, fuist how froquently he was not suro, during Lowoll, fiabnohusotts, or its gonoral vioinity and ho etatad that ho has boon informod that LAFiNLANOS becamo intimate with his wifo; -EE INEIEN furthor stated "Ho is almost ap crazy as sho is."

Egincidif asserted that he had often discossed Communist theories with LAFINZaNos but Lafgitunos was not a Comunist Party member nor was life. HEINEXiGN. He statod that LifldiZlNOS may well have been at his home when FUCBS called; He made the oomment "It is a mise father who knows his own ohild." He further noted that LGFLNZLNOS had periodically "hookled" him by oharging him in tolephone and othor oonveraations with inoaroorating iss. 开INEishaN at the lieatboro Eospital. He addod that he had found it noosssary to request the hospital authoritios to boep his mifo from secing LAFLNTLNOS at the hospital.

## LAEMBERSIIIP OF ROBERT B. HEINEMGN and RRTSTEL HETIEMEN

 IN THE COMMNIST PLRTYProvious interview with HEINEMGN disolosed that by his ovm admission he was affiliated with tho Young Commenist Leagie while at Ewathmore Collogo, swathmoro, Ponnsylvania, and this association continuod during his otudont days at Harvard Univorsity, "ambridgo, dotails of whioh have boon proviously set forth. On this occabion, HEINEIfN ras requostod to furthor identify his interest and cotivities in tho Young Commenist Loaguo, at which timo he atatod ho first became affiliatod with the Leaguo in 1936 or 1937 and continuod as an active menber until 1938, at whioh time he graduated from Swathmore College. Ee atated that the memborship of tho group approximated ton to twonty persons; that he was an officor but he was unable to identify or resall the offioe he held. tho other offloors or any members of the group. Ho stated that his memborship and affiliation was openly knom and resented by sono mombors of the oollege faculty. He further asserted that his leadership in the Young Cormunist Leaguo group at Swathmoro Collogo took the form of his roquating formal rogistration of the group ot the dean's offioe.

When questioned as to the nature of the organizational aotivities of the group, ho asartod that anong its notivities was the raising of monoy for what tio oallod "The Spanish Causo."
 was a nomber of the abrahom Linooln Brigade or had in any way participatod in tho Sponish Civil War.

It should be notod furthor that his passport whioh vas issued to him on Wlay 3, 1937, the details of whioh have been previoualy set forth, contained . $\because$.. tho notation "Not valid for travol in Spain."

Ls a result of his Young Commanist Longue notivitios at Swathroro, Ponnsylvania, Hilncian stated he joined the Comunist Porty at Philadelphia, Ponnsylvania, in 1938; Thon quc etionod as to tho oirounstanoos undor Whioh ho joinod the Comunist Porty ho statod ho attended a lerge meeting
at which oards mero passed out and that under such oirounstancos he mas formally enrollod. It was suggested to hill thet suoh prooeduro sooned Inconsistont with the norian polioies of organizational notivitios and ho was again ovasive and failed to provido any dotails.

Ho was questionod as to whothor or not ho had obsorved a Comnumist Party momborship oard and he statod he had and furthor that he had roooivod a. Cournuist Yarty card in his orm narse in conceotion with his Philadolphia Cormanist Porty association.

Fiith referonoo to the dbraham Linooln Brigade, HEINEikhf asserted that a part of tho Young Conmunist League aotivity had been to raiso reoruita. He recalled that a Jowish studont at Swathwore had beon reoruitod and hid boen killad in Spain but he did not romember his name. He furthor stated that his friend THEODORE VELTFORT also wont to Spain in the Abrahan Lincoln Brigade but provided no additional information oonoerning any partioipation he may havo had in Voltfortis goneral notivities.

Opon his graduation fron Swathnore College in 1938, EEINEibN atatod he oane to llarvard University, Carbridge, to continue his oduantional progran at the Gradunte $S_{\text {chool of }}$ Luta and Boienoos. He statod that at Cambridga he irmodiately booano offiliatod with the Young Cormanist Languo. Ls he did at Swathnora Collage, he atatod that he was the individual who officially requested the University nuthorities at Harvard College to approve tho Young Cominist League as a atudent organization.

Whon quastioned as to Cotails relating to the activities of the Young Comanist League wit to whioh he roforred, HETNELUS assorted that a petain whom he know thon as DhTIEL BCONE, whose surnaro ho could not reoall but when auggested to him that it might bo SCHIREER, he readily agrood.
!. DAIEL BOCNE SCHIRIER was a gradunte of Harvard Collego, Class of 1937, is an notive Leader of the Communist Party at Boston, liassachusotts and is asseciated with all phases of Communist Party aotivity on a fulltimo basie.

EETMHBN statad that tho meotings of the Young Comumist Leaguo of Farvard College woro held in a bookatore on Holyoke Stroot, Cambridgo, Lass.

- HEINBLiN statod that his relationship with the Young Coumniet Loaguo it harvard, which was made up of some thirty to forty poopie, vas a haphozard one beoauso ho was ondonvoring to study. it Swathmore,
HEINELAN noted, he had givon littlo attontion to his coursos.
With reapoot to Comaniat Porty aftilintion while in Cainbridgo, memmun assortod that ho had novor hold a Ccmamist Par ty card in the Groator Boston aroa; that his absociations with the Young Comiunist Leaguo and

Communist Party gradually dissolvod so that in 1941 nothing remainod of thom. He noted that he had visitod the Progressive Bookehop, on Bonch Streot, Bostinn, liasscohusetts, on one or two occosions since 1941
: and placed his last visit to that establishmont as ooourring na couplo of years ago." It is furthor noted he reariliod the location of the bookshop with some difficulty and proipting.

EBIITHMN atatod he was unable to recall eny of his assoointes in the Conmunist i'arty or tho Young Communist Leaguo. It is notod, howevor, in every way he indicated he could do so but was umilling to do so lost ho be unfair to them.

In conneotion with the information set forth above horoin, EEIEELLN assortod that his Comunist Farty affiliations olosed in 1941. Information has boon previously reportod disolosing that his Conmunist Party associations at Boston, kisesaohusotts, havo continuod intormittontly since that time with evidonoe of morborship establishod in 1944 and 1947.

On thie sane dato Eisimetan telophonioally oontaoted Spocial agont TEOLLS F. MoLiUGGIIM in connootion with his cesire to oxplain on item whioh ocourred during the courso of this oonversation, at which tian ho again reforred to his inability to be of any assistance in oonnoction with the inquiry. It was suggosted to him at that time that his statemont with respect to disaffiliation with the Comsuniat Party in 1941, whioh etatemont ho insists to be a fact, was known to be an untrue statenont and that his knowledge of it to be untrue representod a barrier to his providing tho information oithin his possession in oonneotion with this inquily. HeIMEinN had no spocific comment to mako at that timo other. than to indicato that he ontioipated being ocntactod furthor with reference to tho mattor.

As is noted above, HEINEiLLN aBacrtod that his mifo KRISTEL had never been a member of any Commanist organization, oither in Boston or in Philadolphin.

ELIIL KLAOS FUCHS - Father-in-Iaw of GEINEMEN
In connection with his father-in-law HEINEWW assertod that he forwarded
-- funds to Now York City through the facilities of Pan mmerioan Lirways
In conneotion with his father-in-law's visit to the United States, which Henveitill had proviously assortod to havo oocurred fron Ootober, 1948

HEINESLi,N oxhibitod a recoipt oaptionod "Pan morioon birways, Ino.," datod Soptombor 20, 1947 as follons; "Roooived fron ROBERT iEINEIAN, forty-oight dolicifa on account of EiIL FUCHS, TFL LON opon, Pan kmorion A1rways, Ince, signod,"

It was oallod to H minnihn＇s attention that his previous aseertion with rospoct to his father－in－low＇s Fisit to the Unitod States eot the date as October，1948，whioh was inoonsistent with the date sot forth on tho above reooipt．He statod ho wade this purchaso of funds for tronamittal at the ion mmorioan Airway＇s offioo at the Fiotel Statlor，Boston， Lassaohusotts，and that apparently some mistako had been made by tho olork．

Subsequently，aB aot forth abovo in ocnnootion with information relating to 理Hialimes Gomunist Party affiliations，HEINELN oontaoted Spooial Legont ioliugimin telephonioally on this band anto．The purpose of the call was to explain that the advanoe of funds，as indicated by tho above reooipt，was not，as previously indicated，to be handed to his father－ in－law Eill FUCiS upon his arrival in New York from England buti rather the money was sont by him to his father－in－law in kinglond．Ho was questionod as to why this method of transaittal was utilizad when ho had banking facilities through which＇a bank draftior astransifar：o＇s sunde could be mado．This he was unablo to expinin．It is noted this was a tolophone oall and no offort mas mode to pross him further on the matter．

IEINETAN in response to questioning revoalod that his father－in－law＇s entrance into the Unitod States was boing sponsorod sy tho Sooloty of Friends，and he did not lenow the naturo of the finonoial rolationship betweon the Society and the senior FUCHS．For that matter，HEINEVKN did not know FUCHS needed the monoy．He did stato that prior to the sending of the munoy，it had boon plannod，that ho or his wife would go to New York to meet tho Sonior FUCES and that failing this，the monoy had been transmittod，

HEINEHMN stated that his wifo and fathor－in－law did corrospond at fairly regular intervals．Ho did not always soe this corrospondenoe，either incoming or outgoing．

HEINEIWN statod that his fathor－in－law was ourrently in the Enstorn Zone of Gormany，that his fathor－in－law had boon ohargod by Lhs．HEINEMAN with boing rosponsiblo for the death of ther mothor but that he had soen oorrospondonoo from other children apooifically donying this asscrtion，which he attributed to his wife＇s nental condition．

## EIAUS FTUCHS

Broopting for the following data，HEIAETiAN provided no information ounoorning KLLUS FOCAS additional to that set forth in tho previous intorviow on him．HEINEikN did advise noithor ho nor his wifo huard ＂from RLAUS FUCLS sinoo his wifo＇s comritmont tu the liostboro Stato Hospital．Confrented with a nowspaper hocalino rogarding the arrost of KL\＆US FUCIIS，IEINEIAN statod it surprisod him but did not shook hin beoauso the family hid boen involvod in ono bizarre inoidont oftor another．


HEINELSN further stated that his wife had informed him, chortiy before her oomaitmont, that sho hnd boon acivised by her brothor RLAOS to leave her husbend and go to lingland with her ohildron to live with KHisU FUCLS.

## LI-s. KRISTEL EEINELHN

With roforonoo to his wife, RORERT IEINEIBN. providod the following information alilitional to that sot furth in the provious intorviow of himi

Ho statod that KRIGTEL HEINEiliN had no Gorman rolatives residing in the United Dtates and to his knowlodge but ono German friond, OLGA
 reoall OLGL's maidon name and the surname given tho agonts was hor name by her first marriage but she has sinoe ronarried and be oannot rocall her present nome. She resides in the Philadelphia area.

HEINEISN atated that the FUCBS fanily was a very umaunl family, ind noted above, his wife had ncoused her father of being in come way responsible for the death of her mother. She was oonstantly conoornod conoorning hor brother GERH $A$ RDT FOCHS, who is now residing in Switzeriand and who suffers fron tuborouiosis. GERIARDT had fled ormany beoause of political a otivity and had abondoned his wife and ohild. His wife has since romarriod. Howevor, GERELPDT's wife is still on very friondly terms with KHIsTEL's father.

4 sister of KRISTEL oomitted suioide and her husband, whose neme was unkown tolletselian, is residing in the Eastern 2 cne of Germany and is apparontly still on friendly terns with tho FuCES family,

## ADDITIOMAL PERSOHLI IIISTORY OF ROBERT B. HEINEILK

sienneren stated that in conneotion with his porsonal diffioultios with his wife he had moved out of his lambridgo home at sometime in 1942, had gone to Fhiladelphia and romained in that oity until somotino in 2943. In Philadelphia he cocupied a rutm in a roonsing house, but he oould not furnish the address nor tho datos of ocoupancy.

In 1943, upon his retura, he sooured his omployment at tho Ceneral Eleotric. In 1944 whilo at General Eleotric ho boomo tho Chairman of tho CIO-PAC at Lynn, Liassachusotts, and further beoamio involvod in the organization MTho Indepondent Yoters for FDR." In 1945-1946, as indicatod previously, he was in Hew Hompehiro. HEINEIAM also ir ovealed at this tino ho ormod a farm looatod at Bricgowator Corners, Yormont, and that ho had fron tino to timo takon rosidonco on it. He doos not rooall that his brothor-in-law KLaUS FJCils has visitod the form but ho dic romomber his "friond" KONSTLSIIIN LUPLNZANOS had frequontly usod the promisos.

## INTERVIEV OF ROBERT B. HEINEIAAN - FEBRDARY 4,1950

## ASSOCIATION OF ROBERT B. HEINGIAN WITH THE COMZIWIST PARTY

ROBERT B. BEINEIAN on this occasion admitted that he had attonded meetings of the Comumist Party during the nineteen forties and that come of these meetings occurred at his home. He admittod formal menbership in the Commuist Party at Cambridge in 1947 and in 1943 but denied mombership in 1944، He otated, however, that it was possible that momo party offioial might havo rorogisterod him in 1944, following his 1943 membership, without his knowledgo. He mssertod he otill regarded himself as a Comunist and deolerod that he holds many of the ideals of Communiam very highly. Be stated that throughout his Party oxperienoo ho had hlways enoountered difficulty in aijusting his ofn personality to the disoipline of the organisation; i.e., intelleotual disoipline.

HEImBiN continued to insist that he had no Commonist. Party oontacts whilo omployed at the General Eleotrio Plant in Lynn. Ho noted that his politionl notivity during this timo took tho form of his loadership of the GE workors CIO-Political Aotion Comattee and in his partioipation in a noighborhood group knowh as the Indopandent Votors for FDR.

HEINEMEN was oonfronted with the fact that it was known that his Party namo had boon ROBERT EIL. Il. had first doniod and then admittod that this was so. HiINEHMN rofused to identify his assooiates in tho Communist Paity but did note that no meetings had ocourred at his home sinoe ho had moved from 144 Lakeviow avonue to 94 Lakeviow Avorue, Cambridga. He moved to 94 Lakeview hvenuo on lhy 1, 1946
 may affiliatod with him in his Commaist ootivity. Ho did not bow NORIEN LEVINSON as a Comunist but could rooall that his wifo hed boen an aotive leader during wartimo in Russian Fiar Rolief and he had boon in that fashion associatod with har. Ho did not know RICHARD EDSLLL to be a Comamist Party mombor but ho did know him to bo-m offioor of tho Joint Anti-Fasoist Refugoo Comittoe, an organization in vhoso work ho had proviously admittod interost.

EBITMILN atatod that $\angle R T H U R$ OGDEN may well have boon a momber of tho Young Comrnist Leaguo at Swathroro; at lqast ho and HeINEinN had
disoussed the organization and had debated its polloios, - ioveover, HEIMEINS was of the opipion that OGDEN had likely boen a member of the Young Comanist Laggue or Cominiat Party at Harvard, but he was not cortain of tilis.

KLGUS FUCBS KWD HIS COITGOTS $4 T$ CLEBRIDGE, MSSACHUSETTS
HEINEILN stated that he oannot recall that FUCBS ever viaited with him at Cambridge. Vastachusotts, during the Christmae sesson of 1944. He did not know that anyone had onlled at his home in that period seoking FUCHS. Ho did know that FWCIS had visitod his homo in Canbridga in Fobruary, 1945 and likoly betwoen February 12 and $23_{4} \therefore$ a He furthor rooalled that on one ococsion during this visit he had attendod the Ico $H^{\prime}$ oilios in boston with FUCHS and hia wifo KRISTEL. . During this partioular visit Henseuan has a dofinite reoollootion that ho drowa FUCES alone to the home of one DEUTSCH, on Buokinghan Stroat, : Cambridge, Hassochusotts. He did not meot DEUTSCH on this or any otrez. accasion.

He was definite in that the HEIMEMN family assooiation with DEUSCH was predicated upon the close arsooiation between KlijuS FOCHS and DEUTSCH rather thian upon any assoolations betwoen the REINENAN fomily and DEUTSCH. The assooiation of the HEINEIGNS with DEUTSCH and with FUCHS, as known to ROBERT HEINELFSH, ia being set forth in a separate paragraph below.
 in elther late Jume or very early July, 1946. HEIME!sid remombors ho had Just oompleted his teaching duties at Antrim, How Hamphire, whon KLAUS FUCHS was a visitor. He oan reoall on thia ocoasion his wifo, KRISTEL, and KEAUS FUCiBS had made a quiek trip to Soheneotady, New York.

In this oomeotion he oan reoall that he oither had to taike tino off from his normal dutios or he had had to have his friond KONSTaHIIN
 rooollootion that the man visitod in Bohoneotody by KLAUS FYCHS and KRISTEL HEINELCN was HWNS BETES, of Cornell Univarsity: It is notod that he selacted this name whon the known assoointos of, KIAUS FUCES at Los hlamos were enumorated, boing some ton in numbor;

In conneotion with the lattor onvmerating of FWCHS' as soelatos at Los Clamos the namo VICTOR EEISSKOPF atruck a familiar notoo BEINELAN statod ho could recall that on somo ono of FUCES' visits to. Cowbridgo, insenohusetts, he had borrowod YEISSKOPFts nutomobilio, lEIMEINN furthor notod that approxinatoly two yoars ago his wifo KIRSTEL notod IEISSKOPF's picturo in tho oston pross and oomentod sho had not 7EISSKOPF through
her brother KLAUS; that the two men were very friendiy. .
Fith coferonce to HANS BETHE, above, ROBERT HEINEMLN Etatod that his Wife had also soen BETHE's name in the nowspapor ard had mentionod she had mot him.: Sho did not in tho samo broath mantion ahe had mot hid through har brother KIhUS.
 home, KLAUS FUCHS took KRISTEL HEINEISN and tho HEINESILN childron to the beach at Ipwwioh, ifassaohusottis.

ASSCLIMION OF THS HEINEITHNS AHD KLUOS FUCHS YITH JUPTIN DEUTSCH
ROBERT HEIITEM前 stated that during the Fobruary, 1945 visit of KILUS FUCHS to 144 Lakeviom bvonue, Cambridge, Insscohusetts, FUCHS had on one ovoning roquosted IfIkEUN to drive him to an address on Buokingham Stroot, Carabridgo, Massaohusotte, so that FUCIS night noet with one DEUTSCE. IEIIEIUN statod ho had nevor mot DEUTSCH at that timo and hes not moot him since. Ho had, howevor, somo mowledgo of DEOTSCII E oxistonoo booause DEUTSCH was in som fashion relatad to the mother-in-lan of TED VELTFORT, montionod olsowhore horein.
Horoover, HEINE: in roocilled that in the sumor of 1944 he rontod a oottago at "ennisport, wassachusotts, namod "Giospuler" (phonetio): He socurad this oottago through VEITFORT's mother-in-lam, whom ho reoalled as a ire, ROCK. (Boston filos rofloot jers. VELTFORT's maidon nome was RinKK):

HEInEikN himeelf romainod in Cambridgo in oummer sohool during tho sumper of 1944 but ho has a din rocolleotion that DEUFSCH and his fanily visited ERISTEL HEINALiN during that sumor at omisport. His recollootion is dim because it is prediocted on an almost now forgotton statoment to that offoot by KRISTEL HEINEMAN to him. Lit that time tho HEDIEUN marital relations wore vory strainod and there mes very little conversation botweon him and his wife. He could rocall. however, that DEUTSCS vas the son of a-dootor and a moman psyohiatrist who rosided in his immodiate aroa. (The 2944 City Direotory revealod that IELEN DEOTSCH and FELIX DEUTSCH resided on Larotmood Rond, whiah is in tho aroa of Lakoviow avomuo and furthor that FELIX is a physioian and IELEn is a payohiatrist. It is furthor known that lifRTIN DEiFBCH has a roaidonoo at Bi Buckinghom Stroet, Cambridge, Lassaohusetta).

ROBERT INENETH could furthor rooall that sometimo in a sumar, most likoly tho sumer of 1946, wre, DEUSSCII, while prognant, ..rosicod for a short time with tho IEIminill at 94 Lakeviow mponue. This boarding arrangomont, of a short and tomporary naturo, was mace by KRISTEL IEINELAK out of appreaiation of her brother's frionciship with tho DEUTSCEIS and tho details conoorning it wero novor oloar to HPIGE:HNo

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HEIFEIAN further etated that during the occasion of GH0S FOCIS \({ }^{1}\) visit to Coubridgo in lobruary, 2945 and in mbeequait visitgi ho ufgod his wifo XRIBTBL to open their home to guegti in order to ontortain KLAUS FuCHS. Tho only porson he oan ramember haiving been entortainod was Dr. HENRY CLDBURY. He furthor reanlled that he parmittod KLitJS FUCLS to borrow tho IEEIMETH oar on one evening to visit porsons unkown to hin. He was of tho opinion at that tiue that it was 1ikoly DEVTECH but ho has nothing to substantiate this opiniom;
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 Whon ELLUS did arrive, both ho and irs. EEIMEIVN viaitod tho DEUYSCH homo to make his prosenoe in Cambridge known to the DEUTSCIS, fra. IRINEikN insisted that sho nevor met inhirIN DEUTSCH beforo this. Sho notod sho had not iss. DEUTSCI through mitual friends; i, $0_{0}$, tho GREGORY RCCKIINS and booauso the RCCKLIIS, tho DEDPSCIS end tho IIPINELLIAS ell had ahildren in tho Shady Hill Sohool, Combridgo.

Tho day following HiUUS' and ERISTEL's visit to the DEUTSCH homo, irs. DEUTSCE called upon the IEIMEWHNS and invited KIAUS FWCIS to tho
 invitation and mont to tho DEUTSCH home wacoompanied by oithor If. or lirs. EEINEMN:
ifs. HEIIELAN stated that the forogoing roprosonts all assooiation known to her betroon tho idiliuns andor ialus fucis with the DEUTSCE family.
 instanoo of her husband, she does possess sufficiont desoriptivo data oonoorning DEUTSCH so that thore is no doubt that it is LhRTIM DEUSECH.

## ASSOCIGTIONS OF KRISTEL GND/OR ELCUS FUCIS TMTH ISRAEL HAPERIN

Mra, ifinmeilh otated that ohe had horrc, from suroos not now romomberod, in april 1942 thnt her brother ILLUS was interned as a Gorman Enomy Alion in a oonip in Conada. Sho stated that BLAUS PUCES was eo internod for approximatoly one your. She disoussed FUCES internenent with the TAENDELL FURRYS who advised that they had a brother-In-law in Canada, and that they would write and have the bricther-in-law ountact ELu,uS FUCIB. This brother-in-law was then not known to her but he is now known to her as ISRLEL HILPERIN.

On the oooasion of this interview, ifs. Henfilian etated auring the year of her brother's internment sho ient him oigarottes and books direotly ani not through any intermediary. She asserted that she had reocived but one letter from Kilud during his yoar of intornment in Canada:

In tho summer of 1947 Mrs. IEIHE:SNN has a dim rooolleotion that sho not LiNRY IHLLPERIN, wifo of ISRGEL IWhP:ARIN. She oan reoald on the oooasion of this meeting LikRY HLLPERIN was concorned about hor husband's
 FUCIIS in any way and does nut boliove that FUCIB not inRY indPMRIN while in Cambridge or oven lnew of izaRY Hallekinds presence in Cambridge at at the time.

Irs. HEfNEMAN stated that approxmately three meeke before RIADS FUCHS arrived in Lambridge in Fobruary, 1945, an midontified chomist oalled at her home and inquired as to whother or not hor brother KIANS FUCES had arrived. This unknown aubjoot introducod himself to KRISTEL as a ohemist who had worked with KIAJS FJCES. XRISTEL is inder the impression that the unknown subjeot had worked with FCCES at Los Alamos but detailed questioning revealed that there is no basis now known to her for this assumption. The unknowen oubjeot yisited with KRISTEL and her ohildren and she gave him lunoh. She edvised him of the approximate time of her brother's arrival in Cambridge, Massachusetti. KRISTEL HEINELAN stated there was no one at her home excopting the ohildren and the unknown subjegt op this oveasion. IS' 4
On the second day of KIADS FUOHS' Fisit to the HEIREMAN home in Pebruary, 1945 the same unimown subjeot again rang her doorbell. The unknown subjeot and KLAUS FUCHS apent approximately fifteen mimutes in her living room, She was present but did not 21 ston to their oonveration and hor only opinion now is that thoy wero apparently not mell sequainted with one another. The unknown subjeot on this oocasion brought candy for the HERELHN ahildren and a book, to her beat recolleotion, entitled "kers. Palmer's Honey" for her. She does not know whother the ohemist receivod anything from FUCis or gave anything to FUCHS, He was again apparently botwoon trains and left ahortly after his arrival.


Sometime in the following fow months this same unknown subjeot again stoppod at her homo and again mado inquiry as to when KLaUS FOCIS might visit her. She had no knowledge of an 1mponding visit. She again gave the unknown subject lumoh. XRISTESL stated on this third oisit only she, her childron and the unknown subjoot were prosont for lunoh. ERISTEL has a dim ropollootion on this third visit hor husbond, ROBERT EEINEMAN, may have met this man as the ungown subjeot loft tho HEINEitaN homog IS 4近s. HEINEItSN further reooilled that the uricnown aubjoct had promised her oldost boy 8TEVEN a ohemiatry set but he had never sent it to him. IS 4 Lfe. BEIMELASS desoribed the whinown subject he followsz

Lat Indicated above, ho was in Spain af a mombor of tho abraham Lincoln Brigade in 1987-1988. In 1938-1939 he and the girl who booame his wife wore atudying togothor at Columbia Vniversity and they also studiod togother at Erinoeton University in the iummer of 1940.

VELTFORT servod in the United States Havy, NSN 403-90-84; from April, 1941 to July, 1941. Wo eorved in the Dnited 8 tates druy from August 27. 1942 through Dooember 13, 1945. His Acmy Sorial lumber was 110=-$880-47$.

VELTFORT had a residenoe address in Lambridga, basasohusoẗti, in 1945 at 18 Larohnood Drive. He ohanged this addreas sometime in 1945 to 8 Eeroer Circle. On lapch 19, 1946 he moved to the fifet Coait.
VELEFORT' 's father is the managor of the Brass and Copper Researoh \&ssociation and is further goneral seoretary of the Brass and Copper Aseociation, both of IIrw Fork City.

VELTFORT on Soptomber 24, 1941 at Caubridga, Lasisnohusotts, married $67 D$ HELEFE JHRIAME RANX, a native of Viumna, suatria.
$\because$ It is intereating to note that the reoords of VELTFCRT If Selegtive Sorvico board rofloot that ho attemptod to gain a doferaent in 1941 by olaining a prior intent to marry, whioh established a depondent etatus. Among thosi filing letters in his behalf was one BEIRY LELAND

HAJPERIN was identified as one "Boon," an agent working in behalf of Soviet Intelligence in Canada, by IGOR GUZENEO, defooted ode clerk at tho Soviet Embassy at Ottawa, Canada. As a result of the charges made by GUZENKO, BKIPRRIN was arrested in February, 1946 by the CliP and charged with a violation of the Official Secrets act. He was subsequently acquitted and apparently largely because of the failure of Captain GORDON LUNAN, who was convicted, to testify against him.

## FACTS

DATE: Karch 22, 1950

During the early stages of this investigation, after the arrest of Fuchs, the Director instructed by routing slip as follows: ${ }^{-}$I think we should send memo to Souers and $A G$ re any new developments (other than confidential unconcluded leads) in Fuchs case once a week."

In accordance with this instruction, there are attached letters to Rear Admiral Sourrs and the Attomey Ceneral; setting forth Fucha' identification of certain persons impilicated to a limited extent in his espionage activities abroad, and incorporating a sumary of information on these persons in Bureau files.

One of these persons, Jurgentikuczinski, is known to have been attached to Berlin Oniversity, Berlin, Germany, haring 1949. Another of these individuals, Vassili $\nabla$ • Soukhomline, Paris, France, was the subject of an inquiry by CIA in September, 2949, and it is presumed, therefore, that CIA ma have an active investigation concerning him. In fiew of this, there also are attached identical letters to CIA and Aruy Intelifigence.
