KONSTANTIN LAFAZANOS was interviewed by Special Agents Charles E. Pelletier and Richard W. Dow, on February 3, 1960. He advised that he did not have a middle name and that he resides with his parents at the above address. He was born in Peloponessus, Greece, and was naturalized in the U.S. District Court, Boston, Mass. He stated that he is unemployed and is gathering material for an article on history; however, no definite plans have been made as to its publication. He stated that he graduated from Dartmouth College in 1935, and was formerly employed in the Bethlehem Shipbuilding Corporation, Hingham, Mass., during World War II. He stated he had no military service and was rejected for service due to a physical condition, the nature of which he did not state.

Association with Robert B. Heineman

Informant advised he first met ROBERT B. HEINEMAN in 1940 or 1941, when they were both fellow students in the history class at Harvard College, Cambridge, Mass. He stated that he never lived at the HEINEMAN residence in Cambridge, except for intermittent periods of one week or a few days, while Mr. and Mrs. HEINEMAN were away, at which time he took care of the HEINEMAN children. He stated that to his knowledge neither ROBERT HEINEMAN nor his wife, KRISTEL, are members of the Communist Party. He classified ROBERT HEINEMAN as a "liberal", "idealist", and "humanitarian," in that he was always willing to help people, and wants to prevent suffering. He stated that ROBERT HEINEMAN has no definite political convictions, and based upon his association with HEINEMAN, over a long period of years, he would state that he is a "loyal American." He had no knowledge of any Communist meetings held at the residence of the HEINEMANs.

He stated that about 1947, after World War II terminated, ROBERT HEINEMAN went to Mexico City to gather material for an article and that he paid his own expenses and was gone for about two or three months. When HEINEMAN returned, he exhibited to informant photostatic copies of material which was to be used in connection with the article. He stated that ROBERT B. HEINEMAN is a man of some means, and that he could never understand why a person like him would have so much interest in labor questions. He was of the belief that HEINEMAN made a social visit to New York City on one occasion; however, he was unable to fix the date or the year. He did note that he was gone for three or four days and at that time his brother-in-law, KLAUS FUCHS might have been in New York. He believed, however, that this trip took place while he, HEINEMAN, was employed by the General Electric Company. He also recalled that Mrs. HEINEMAN sent cigarettes to her brother, KLAUS FUCHS, at an internment camp in Canada; however, he did not know just how the

cigarettes were transported to her brother. She sent the cigarettes during the early stages of World War II, while her brother was interned. Informant also recalled that on one occasion ROBERT HEINEMAN applied for a position of an overseas ambulance driver, with the American Field Service; however, he was turned down due to his health. Informant did not furnish any information regarding [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] Informant advised that ROBERT HEINEMAN told informant that KLAUS FUCHS was "stand-offish" and a "snob." b7c

With respect to the associates of Mr. and Mrs. ROBERT HEINEMAN, informant advised that Mr. and Mrs. HENRY CADBURY occasionally visited the HEINEMAN residence. ARTHUR OGDEN was very friendly with ROBERT HEINEMAN when they both attended Harvard College. Informant was unfamiliar with the name of Miss or Mrs. TRACY. Informant stated that he never met the couple now living at the HEINEMAN residence, but that this couple has been residing at the HEINEMAN residence for the past two or three months. He stated that previously another couple lived at the HEINEMAN residence for about five or six months; however, he did not know the names of this couple.

With respect to this last un-named couple who had resided in HEINEMAN's home in Cambridge, Mass., Informant provided the following information: Informant admitted that he was very devoted to the HEINEMAN children, and that he felt they might not be properly cared for and as a subterfuge, he told an official at the Westboro State Hospital, that the unknown couple living at the HEINEMAN residence were "Communists" or "Fascists". Informant stated that his motive for making this report was that he wanted the Social Service workers to call frequently at the HEINEMAN residence to assure that the children were being given proper upbringing. He stated that this official at the Westboro State Hospital told him that that agency could not handle the matter, but that a Social Service worker from the Mount Auburn Hospital in Cambridge would call at the HEINEMAN residence. Informant admitted that he "slandered" ROBERT HEINEMAN by this story. Informant stated that ROBERT HEINEMAN and KLAUS FUCHS, in his opinion, would not work together very well on any case, because there is a clash of personalities and he did not think anyone would trust ROBERT HEINEMAN for undercover work as he is "not clever enough."

Mrs. ROBERT B. (KRISTEL) HEINEMAN

Informant stated that he first met Mrs. HEINEMAN when he called at the HEINEMAN residence at the request of ROBERT HEINEMAN. He stated that Mrs. HEINEMAN was not very much interested in political questions. Informant stated as far back as 1938, he observed that the HEINEMANs were not getting along very well.

Informant advised that he had no diary or records to evidence any date of any occurrences which he might discuss; however, he did recall that on one occasion, KLAUS FUCHS, while visiting Cambridge, told Mrs. HEINEMAN that,

according to his itinerary, he was to visit a physicist in Schenectady, New York, and that it would be a good opportunity for her to take a vacation and accompany him. Informant stated that he was sure that the person whom KLAUS FUCHS was to visit was in Schenectady, New York; however, he did not know his name, but believed that it was a German name and that he was somehow connected with either the General Electric Co., at Schenectady or Cornell University, at Ithaca, New York. Informant believed that this trip was made in about 1948. Informant recalled this specific travel on the part of Mrs. HEINEMAN. He, informant, took care of the children during her absence. At this time Mrs. HEINEMAN was not getting along very well with her husband, according to the informant. Informant did recall that at his suggestion, Mrs. HEINEMAN and FUCHS boarded a train at Back Bay Station in Boston, and they were gone not more than two days and they probably got a berth on their return trip to Boston. He also recalled that Mrs. HEINEMAN complained that when they boarded the train at Back Bay Station, they could not obtain seats and the train was "dirty". Informant stated that although he could not remember the name of the unknown physicist, he could identify the name if several names were submitted to him.

Informant stated that he visited Mrs. HEINEMAN at the McLean Hospital, in Waverly, and the Westboro State Hospital, and that he never observed her in any spell, and in his opinion, Mrs. HEINEMAN is sane. Informant stated he believed Mrs. HEINEMAN is being confined at the instigation of her husband because they do not get along very well. (It should be noted that both the McLean Hospital and the Westboro State Hospital are mental hospitals.)

Informant stated that Mrs. HEINEMAN's brother, KLAUS FUCHS, is very fond of her, in fact during the war he requested her and the children to live in England. He stated that Mrs. HEINEMAN would not contest a divorce if Mr. HEINEMAN instituted divorce proceedings, but that she would want custody of the children. He did not know whether or not Mr. HEINEMAN instituted divorce proceedings.

EMIL KLAUS FUCHS (father of Mrs. HEINEMAN)

Informant recalled the occasion when EMIL KLAUS FUCHS, Mrs. HEINEMAN's father visited Cambridge. He stated that when the father visited his daughter, he told her about the suicidal tendencies in the family and that he told her all about her brother, GERHART, who was presently in a sanitarium in Switzerland, and the fact that Mrs. HEINEMAN's mother committed suicide as well as her sister, ELIZABETH, and that ever since Mrs. HEINEMAN has been in a disturbed mental state. Informant further stated that in this connection, he wrote to KLAUS FUCHS criticizing the father for imparting such information to his daughter. Informant recalled that Mrs. HEINEMAN's father visited the United States to give a series of lectures during the Summer of 1949, under the auspices

of the Friends Service Committee. Informant stated he met Mrs. HEINEMAN's father on one occasion while the father was visiting Mrs. HEINEMAN at the Westboro State Hospital.

KLAUS FUCHS

Informant recalled that Mrs. HEINEMAN's brother, KLAUS FUCHS, several months after his entry into the United States, came to visit the HEINEMANs in Cambridge, Mass., which was about the year 1943 or 1944, while the HEINEMANs resided at 144 Lakeview Ave., Cambridge, Mass. Informant stated that KLAUS FUCHS was a mathematician and was employed in Washington, D. C., and after the news of the atomic bomb explosion was released to the public, KLAUS FUCHS told informant that he was employed at Los Alamos, New Mexico. On the occasion of this first visit of KLAUS FUCHS, he remained at the HEINEMAN residence for four or five days. He stated that to his knowledge, while KLAUS FUCHS was in Cambridge, he, KLAUS FUCHS, never had any contacts. He stated that he recalled on one occasion that informant accompanied Mr. and Mrs. HEINEMAN and KLAUS FUCHS to the Ice Follies in Boston. He stated that KLAUS FUCHS visited the HEINEMAN residence on two or three occasions and he recalled that after the atomic bomb explosion was released to the public, KLAUS FUCHS told him he had been working on the bomb and shortly before his departure from the United States, KLAUS FUCHS exhibited photographs of the Atomic Bomb explosion, which photographs also appeared in the public press, according to informant. Informant stated that he asked KLAUS FUCHS something about the bomb, but FUCHS would not discuss it. Informant did recall that on one occasion, while KLAUS FUCHS was visiting the HEINEMANs, he received a telegram, which was telephoned by the Western Union. Mrs. HEINEMAN told informant to proceed to the Western Union office in Cambridge, Mass., in order to obtain the text of the message which he did. Informant recalled that the telegram was from some British scientist in Washington, instructing KLAUS FUCHS to report for work somewhere. He did not recall the name of the scientist, but could identify the name if submitted to him. Informant did not recall any meetings being held at the HEINEMAN residence.

Mrs. HEINEMAN told informant on one occasion that KLAUS FUCHS told her that he, KLAUS FUCHS, thought well of informant. He stated that KLAUS FUCHS was very friendly and close to his sister, Mrs. HEINEMAN. Mrs. HEINEMAN never indicated to informant that KLAUS FUCHS was involved in any subversive activities or espionage.

ISRAEL HALPERIN

The name of ISRAEL HALPERIN was not familiar to informant.

Photographic Equipment of ROBERT HEINEMAN

Informant advised that ROBERT HEINEMAN has been a camera enthusiast for many years and that he purchased a lot of photographic equipment after his trip to Mexico City and that he used a slide viewer to project slides of his material which he gathered in Mexico City for his article. Informant had no information of KLAUS FUCH's working in HEINEMAN's dark room or asking ROBERT HEINEMAN to do any dark room work for him.

During the course of the interview, informant did not volunteer any information concerning his alleged paternity of any of the HEINEMAN children.

The files of the Boston Office reflect that one KONSTANTIN CHARLES LAFAZANOS, in October, 1946, was reported by [REDACTED] for being a possible front man for the Communists. The files of the Immigration and Naturalization Service, Boston, reflect that he was born in Kalamata, Greece, on April 18, 1911, the son of NICOLAOS and ARTHANASIA GIANOKOPOULON. He was naturalized at Boston, Mass., on February 4, 1946. b7D

The records of Harvard College, Cambridge, Mass., indicated that he graduated from Dartmouth College in 1935, with the degree of AB and that his legal name was KONSTANTIN CHARLES LAFAZANOS and that he was then a traveling fellow of the American School of Classical Studies, University of Athens. At Dartmouth College, he used the name of CHARLES NICHOLS LAFAZANOS.

The records of Local Board #162, Winthrop, Mass., reflect that he was rejected for military service because of psycho-neurosis. His former landlady reported that he received the magazine "USSR", but she had no knowledge of any Communist activities on his part. Inasmuch as the investigation failed to develop any Communist activities it was discontinued.

INTERVIEW WITH KRISTEL HEINEMAN  
ON FEBRUARY 2, 1950, WESTBORO  
STATE HOSPITAL

The following investigation was conducted by Special Agents JOHN J. O'LALOR III and BRENTON S. GORDON at Westboro, Massachusetts, on February 2, 1950.

Mrs. KRISTEL HEINEMAN was interviewed at the State Hospital in the presence of Dr. ROLLINS K. HADLEY, Director, who advised that she was in good health and that an interview would in no way interfere with her treatment or recovery.

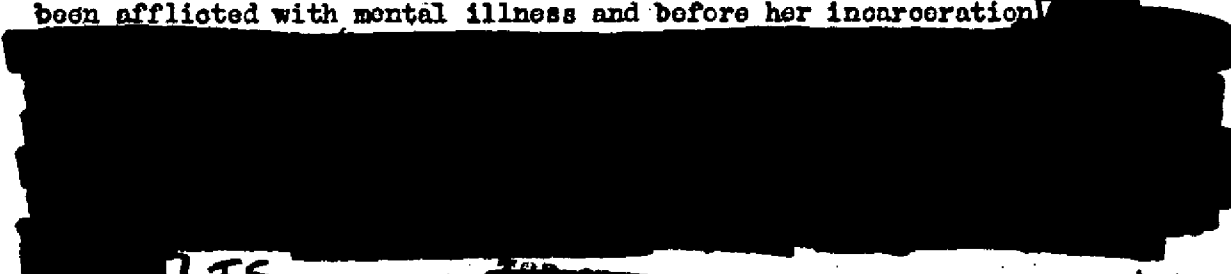
PERSONAL HISTORY

The following personal history, additional to that set forth in hospital records concerning Mrs. HEINEMAN, was obtained from her.

KIRSTEL HEINEMAN stated her mother had died when she was about eleven years of age and she had been sent to a private school when fourteen, in the year 1933. Her family associations from that time on were extremely limited because of the political difficulties in which the other members of her family were involved and the severity of her own schooling.

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Questioned concerning her childhood and any games she may have played, she stated she had no nicknames. She usually remembered since she had been afflicted with mental illness and before her incarceration



FRIENDS AND ASSOCIATES OF MR. AND MRS. ROBERT HEINEMAN

Mrs. HEINEMAN stated that she had very few friends. Her husband was also limited in his social activity and his friends were for the most part fellow members of the Communist Party who will be referred to under such a heading below.

Mrs. HEINEMAN stated that perhaps the most frequent visitors at her home were Mrs. KATHERINE MERRING and her husband, whose first name she could not recall.

She identified KONSTANTIN LAFANZANOS as her "lover" and constant visitor. She stated she was on extremely good terms with BETTY FURRY and ALICE ANDUR, who will be mentioned below.

MEMBERSHIP OF MR. AND MRS. HEINEMAN IN THE COMMUNIST PARTY

KRISTEL HEINEMAN stated that she was not now a member of the Communist Party and had never been a member of the Communist Party. She stated she attended meetings of the Young Communist League with her husband before their marriage while both were at Swathmore College. However, she was of religious persuasion and, therefore, the doctrines of Communism had never held an appeal for her.

Mrs. HEINEMAN stated that ROBERT HEINEMAN was an active member and leader of the Young Communist League at Swathmore College during the years 1935-1938. Associated with him in the Young Communist League at that time were the following persons:

NANCY CARDOZA, MARY IVANS and TED VELTFORT. She stated that VELTFORT went to Spain to fight for the Communists. Mrs. HEINEMAN stated at the end of her husband's freshman year at Swathmore he had taken an Intourist trip to the Soviet Union before returning for the fall semester. She stated he has never discussed this trip extensively. The only comment she can remember he made was that he liked the Caspian Sea.

At Harvard College, Mrs. HEINEMAN claimed that her husband had continued his Communist affiliations. She asserted he was a member of the Communist Party while at Harvard and belonged to a Branch which frequently met at their home. Members of this branch included WENDELL H. FURRY, ARTHUR OGDEN, HASSLER WHITNEY, Mrs. ELSSER WHITNEY, a woman named TRACEY, ISADOR ANDUR and ALICE ANDUR. (All of these people will be referred to below).

Mrs. HEINEMAN stated she did not know her husband's current status in the Communist Party and that the last year she is positive that he held a membership card was 1947.

EMIL FUCHS, FATHER OF KLAUS FUCHS and KRISTEL HEINEMAN

KRISTEL HEINEMAN stated that her father was a very religious man in his profession in the ministry. Politically, he was founder of the Social Democrat (religious) Party of Germany. In 1934, shortly after the death of her mother, her father was called to Berlin and told by the minions of Hitler to either support Hitler or pay the penalty. He spent one year in jail, the location of which was not known to her, and he thereafter suffered continuously because of his political views.



She asserted that he was not a member of the Communist Party in Germany to her knowledge but that he had found many favorable aspects in Communism. He is currently living in the Russian Zone of Germany and is preaching a doctrine that all Germany should be united but not under the control of any one group. It is noted that the exhibit section of this report will contain additional information regarding her father.

#### KLAUS FUCHS

KRISTEL HEINEMAN stated that because of family conditions she saw her brother for a few days during the school holidays during 1933. She heard through other members of the family in 1934 that he had been compelled to resign from the University at Kiel because of political activity; that all of his scholastic records had been stamped "This man is a Communist" and that as a political fugitive he walked across the German border into France.

In 1935, when she was en route to the United States, she spent two days with KLAUS FUCHS in Paris. She did not hear from him again until 1943 and then indirectly.

Mrs. HEINEMAN stated that her husband was very friendly with WENDELL FURRY and that WENDELL FURRY had a brother-in-law in Canada, who was a scientist. With some prompting she recalled this brother-in-law to be ISRAEL HALPERIN. Sometime in 1943 HALPERIN wrote FURRY that he had met KLAUS FUCHS, whose brother-in-law and sister were believed to be known to FURRY. FURRY advised the HEINEMANS that KLAUS FUCHS had been interned as a German alien in a Canadian internment camp. Thereafter, she heard regularly through the FURRYS of KLAUS' activities, until sometime in very early 1945 when KLAUS wrote that he was coming to visit them.

KRISTEL HEINEMAN can remember that KLAUS visited the HEINEMAN home sometime in February, 1945. She stated that there were many visitors, the only one of whom she can clearly recall is Mrs. HERRING, mentioned above, who, due to some difficulty at her own home, was temporarily residing with the HEINEMANS.

On the occasion of this visit KRISTEL believes her brother spent two or three days at her home. It is her recollection that thereafter he was a frequent visitor in 1945 for one-day periods; i.e., he would arrive in the morning and depart in the afternoon or evening. She could recall he had one friend in Cambridge named DEUTSCH. Mrs. HEINEMAN does not know whether KLAUS was acquainted with DEUTSCH in 1945 or not but she is certain that DEUTSCH worked with KLAUS at Los

Alamos. Upon the termination of the Los Alamos work DEUTSCH came to Massachusetts Institute of Technology as a faculty member. She can further recall that DEUTSCH's wife's first name was HELENA and she is under the distinct impression that HELENA DEUTSCH was a psychiatrist.

Mrs. HEINEMAN stated that KLAUS FUCHS also visited her in the summer of 1946 for a few days and that there were a number of guests who called on them. She could remember that among those were Dr. and Mrs. HENRY CADBURY. She believed that this association was predicated upon CADBURY's leadership in the Society of Friends. She asserted that it was very possible that KLAUS FUCHS could have been acquainted with her husband's associates in the Communist Party, but she does not know that to be positively so.

She remembered that KLAUS FUCHS met her "lover," KONSTANTIN LAFANZANOS.

Mrs. HEINEMAN stated she has not heard from her brother KLAUS FUCHS in a long time and is very anxious to converse with him.

It is noted that the Los Alamos records indicate that KLAUS FUCHS was visiting in Cambridge, Massachusetts, from February 11, 1945 to February 25, 1945 and that he permanently departed from Los Alamos on June 15, 1946.

#### GERHARDT FUCHS

Mrs. HEINEMAN advised that her brother GERHARDT had been ousted from the University at Kiel in 1934 together with her brother KLAUS. His records were also stamped "This man is a Communist" and he, as a political fugitive, went to Switzerland. She does not know his present political viewpoint or the nature of his current employment.

#### FINANCIAL AFFAIRS OF THE HEINEMANS.

KRISTEL HEINEMAN advised she had been told by her husband on the occasion of their marriage that he had some money accumulated through his father. She stated he made it a custom to deposit a small sum in a checking account for her use in covering household expenses.

She knew on one occasion he received a rather large amount of money transferred from a Chicago bank, but she never knew the amount or the disposition.

She knows further her husband maintained a safety deposit box in Cambridge, but the contents were not known to her nor did she have access to it.

Interview - February 2, 1950

I. BACKGROUND

a. General

ROBERT BLOCK HEINEMAN, 94 Lakeview Avenue, Cambridge, Mass., was interviewed by Special Agents CHARLES E. PELLETIER and THOMAS F. McLAUGHLIN, Jr., on February 2, 1950, at his residence. He advised that he was born March 25, 1917, at Wausau, Wisconsin, the son of GABRIEL B. HEINEMAN and ALMA BLOCK. He advised that his birth certificate reads "Heinemann." The permanent address of his parents is 320 South Plymouth Court, Chicago, Illinois, and they are presently in their seasonal home in Hollywood, Florida.

b. Family

HEINEMAN advised that he has the following relatives:

- Wife: KRISTEL FUCHS, who was born in Germany and is still an alien. His wife applied for citizenship papers and they were returned by the Immigration Service for correction and she never resubmitted the papers. He believed this to be at Boston, Mass., about eleven or twelve years ago. He believes he has his wife's immigration papers and offered to make a search for them and have them available.
- Sister: Mrs. ERNEST (MARGARET) SOLOMON, age 38, residence, Winnetka, Illinois, whose husband is a physician.
- Sister: Miss CONSTANCE HEINEMAN, age 35, attached to the Devereux Schools, Berwyn, Pennsylvania.
- Parents: GABRIEL B. HEINEMAN and ALMA (BLOCK) HEINEMAN, residence, 320 South Plymouth Court, Chicago, Illinois.
- Children: STEPHEN, age 10; MARCIA, age 8; and KRISTEL, age 6. All children born in Baker Memorial Hospital, Boston, Mass.

c. Education

HEINEMAN advised that he graduated from the University High School, Chicago, Illinois, in 1934, and received the Degree of Bachelor of Arts from Swarthmore College, Swarthmore, Pennsylvania, in 1938. He attended Harvard College Graduate School of Arts and Sciences, Cambridge, Mass., from 1938 to 1941 or 1942, where he received a Master's Degree. He continued further studies toward his Doctorate of Philosophy but did not successfully complete the course. He is presently enrolled in the Harvard Graduate School of Education where he is seeking a Master of Education Degree, in order, according to his own statement, to become actively affiliated with the teaching profession.

d. Employment

HEINEMAN advised that he was employed by the General Electric Company, River Works, Lynn, Mass., from about 1943 to 1945, as a dispatcher and assistant foreman. He taught at the Antrim High School, Antrim, New Hampshire, from 1945 to 1946, teaching Social Studies and French. He was a substitute teacher at the Melrose, Mass. High School for three weeks and a substitute teacher in the Public School System of the City of Boston for a few days.

e. Residences

HEINEMAN advised that he formerly resided at 55 Carver Street, Watertown, Mass.; Cambridge Street, Cambridge, Mass.; Dana Street, Cambridge, Mass.; and 144 Lakewood Avenue, Cambridge, Mass., and presently resides at 94 Lakewood Avenue, Cambridge, Mass. He advised that he did not recall the street numbers of some of his former residences.

f. Travel

HEINEMAN advised that during the Summer of 1937, he traveled to England, Sweden, Finland, Russia, Poland, Austria, Italy, and France; that he left aboard the SS Aquitania and returned aboard the Ile de France. He stated that the purpose of his travel was pleasure and he was single at the time and obtained a passport under his own name. He stated that as far as he is aware, he still has it in his possession and that he would be glad to search for the passport and have it available the following day.

HEINEMAN stated that he also visited Cuba during the Christmas holidays of 1936-1937, while a student at Swarthmore College. The purpose of this trip was pleasure and he was accompanied by a fellow student whose name he did not recall.

HEINEMAN stated that during January, 1947, he went to Mexico City and was there for a period of three months and that he returned to Cambridge around May 1, 1947. He stated that during this period, he had marital difficulties with his wife and "took a vacation." He stated that the purpose of this trip was primarily to gather material for an article. He entered Mexico City via the port of Laredo, Texas, and reentered the U. S. at the same port. He stated that he also stayed in Monterey, Mexico, during this trip.

He recalled taking a vacation of one week while employed by the General Electric Company, Lynn, Mass.; however, he did not recall where he went or whom he visited.

Mrs. ROBERT (KRISTEL) BLOCK HEINEMAN (Wife)

HEINEMAN advised that his wife entered the United States of America under the auspices of the Friends Service Committee on a student visa and she subsequently proceeded to Cuba and reentered the United States while a student at Swarthmore College, in order to comply with the immigration requirements.

He stated that he married his wife at Boston, Mass., about the year 1938 and that for the past five or six years, his wife has been having delusions and that as he reflects upon the various statements made by his wife, he takes them with a great deal of skepticism. He advised that about a year previously, her illness became acute and Dr. JACKSON THOMAS of Boston, Mass., a psychiatrist, examined her and she was committed to McLean Hospital, Waverly, Mass., on March 25, 1949, where she remained for one week and was then transferred to the Cambridge City Hospital, and subsequently transferred to the Westboro State Hospital.

He recalled one specific instance of a delusion wherein his wife complained that the woman next door was looking into her kitchen to see what kind of a housekeeper she was.

HEINEMAN advised that to his knowledge, he does not believe that his wife traveled during 1944 or 1945 but that there is a bare possibility that she might have traveled to New York.

HEINEMAN stated that he and his wife have not been on friendly terms for the past five or six years and on one occasion as a result of a dispute with his wife, he took over an apartment either at 65 or 165 Dana Street, Cambridge, Mass. He recalled that this was while he was employed by the General Electric Company. He remained in this apartment for four or five months. He stated that he never had any reason to question the loyalty of his wife to the United States of America.

g. Membership in Organizations

At the outset of the interview, HEINEMAN denied being connected with any underground or Communist groups; however, during the latter part of the interview, he admitted that he became a member of the Young Communist League at Swarthmore College about 1935, and that he continued his affiliation with the Young Communist League until he came to Cambridge, Mass. He stated that he was drawn into the Young Communist League by his interest in the Spanish Civil War. He did not recall the name of the particular club or unit and admitted that he was an officer in the Young Communist League and was very active in it. He stated he made no attempt to treat his affiliation confidentially.

With respect to membership in the Communist Party, he denied being a member of this organization; however, he admitted that he might have applied for membership in the Communist Party in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. Later during the interview, HEINEMAN admitted joining the Communist Party at Philadelphia, about 1935 to 1938, and stated that he carried a membership card but doubts whether it was issued in his true name. He claimed that he did not recall this incident since it happened such a long time ago. He stated that he considers himself a liberal but that under present day conditions, a liberal is called a Communist.

HEINEMAN stated that he continued his membership in the Young Communist League at Harvard College for two or three years after his arrival but that he was not an officer in that particular branch. He explained that the rules of the College require the registration of all organizations and that he in behalf of the Young Communist League, registered this organization with the proper University official. He stated that he was very busy with his studies and that he became rather inactive in the Young Communist League about the time of the Munich Agreement, which agreement caused him to become very much upset. He reiterated, however, that he was not connected with the Young Communist League while he was employed at the General Electric Company.

HEINEMAN stated he recalled signing some cards in connection with the Spanish Appeal; however, he did not recall whether the cards were

circulated under the auspices of the Communist Party or the Young Communist League. He stated that he never applied for membership in the Communist Party in New England, but that he did cooperate with the Communists and that he also contributed money to the Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee recently.

He stated that his wife was never a member of the Communist Party or the Young Communist League, to his knowledge but that his wife did know about his membership in the Young Communist League. He explained that his wife could not join the Young Communist League while at Swarthmore because, being an alien, she would be placed in a prejudicial position with regard to gaining citizenship.

EMIL KLAUS FUCHS (Father-in-law)

HEINEMAN advised that EMIL KLAUS FUCHS, his father-in-law, visited Cambridge, Mass., in October, 1948, and that he was in the United States of America from October, 1948 until July, 1949, never having previously been in the United States. He came on the invitation of the Friends Service Committee, Wallingford, Pennsylvania, to give a series of lectures. He stated that he is now teaching Theology at the University of Leipzig. The nephew of HEINEMAN named KLAUS KITOWSKI, age 14 years, accompanied EMIL KLAUS FUCHS on his visit and KLAUS KITOWSKI is the son of HEINEMAN's sister-in-law, ELIZABETH FUCHS KITOWSKI.

HEINEMAN stated that Mrs. HEINEMAN told him that she had a difficult time with her father which condition existed prior to the time of their marriage and which apparently related to a personal family problem. He added further that his wife's father was present at Cambridge, Mass., at, or about the time, of his wife's commitment to a mental institution and he stated that the allegations of his wife, with regard to the family problem, referred to above, were denied by her father at that time.

HEINEMAN stated that his father-in-law is what is known as a social democrat or religious socialist and that he formerly lived in the Western Zone of Germany but was unable to obtain work and was offered a position in the Eastern Zone in Germany, which he accepted at Leipzig

KLAUS FUCHS (Brother-in-law)

HEINEMAN stated that he first met KLAUS FUCHS, who is about 38 years of age, when he came to the United States in order to work at Los Alamos Project. He came to the United States as a research employee

of the British Government, according to HEINEMAN. When questioned with respect to the specific date, HEINEMAN was unable to provide that information other than to recall that his first contact with KLAUS FUCHS was incidental to FUCHS' arrival in the United States for this purpose. HEINEMAN advised that prior to that time, he had no personal contact with him nor did he have any correspondence with him at any time.

HEINEMAN stated that at the outbreak of World War II, KLAUS FUCHS was interned in England, and was transferred to an interment camp in Canada as an internee. He was released because of his scientific knowledge and was made a Fellow of the Royal Society and was sent to England. HEINEMAN did not recall the name of the Canadian interment camp.

HEINEMAN stated that his wife and brother-in-law, KLAUS FUCHS, are very friendly and close and that his wife had not seen KLAUS since 1933, at which time KLAUS left Germany and proceeded to England. Neither he nor his wife knew that KLAUS FUCHS was coming to the United States, according to HEINEMAN.

HEINEMAN stated that while he was teaching at the Antrim, New Hampshire High School, KLAUS FUCHS visited his wife in Cambridge, Mass., at which time the HEINEMAN family was living at 144 Lakeview Avenue, Cambridge. He stated that KLAUS FUCHS remained at the HEINEMAN residence for a couple of days. HEINEMAN recalled that on the next visit of KLAUS FUCHS, he lived at 94 Lakeview Avenue. He stated that during the time KLAUS FUCHS was in Cambridge, Mass., to his knowledge, he had no social contacts and had no individuals call on him and he did not recall any communications addressed to FUCHS. He stated that a friend, HENRY CADBURY, might have been invited to the HEINEMAN residence but he could not definitely recall.

HEINEMAN advised that KLAUS FUCHS was very quiet and secretive and never spoke about his work on the atom bomb. He stated that at no time had KLAUS FUCHS indicated any evidence of Communism or underground activities as he was completely "wrapped up" in his work.

HEINEMAN recalled that KLAUS FUCHS worked in New York for a short period of time prior to going West. He recalled that on one occasion he went to New York City when KLAUS FUCHS was working there and Mrs. HEINEMAN wanted him to stay with KLAUS FUCHS in New York. He stated that he never met KLAUS FUCHS anywhere other than at Cambridge, Mass.



HEINEMAN did recall that on one occasion KLAUS FUCHS spoke about his boss in the West, stating that his boss' wife was Jewish and that she wanted him to get some Jewish bread or something and he believed FUCHS' boss' name was Dr. OPPENHEIMER. However, he was not positive that KLAUS FUCHS mentioned the name.

HEINEMAN recalled that on the occasion when KLAUS FUCHS visited Cambridge, Mass., on his way back to Europe, he exhibited some photographs of the atom bomb explosion which occurred during a test and he asked KLAUS FUCHS whether he was allowed to possess such photographs and KLAUS stated that he was because the photographs were released to the press.

HEINEMAN stated, to his knowledge, he does not have in his possession any personal property, documents, etc., belonging to KLAUS FUCHS. He stated that he went through all of his wife's papers and possessions with a view to obtaining information which he could use in connection with his prospective divorce from his wife and did not locate any information pertinent to the FBI or for use in connection with his divorce proceedings.

HEINEMAN indicated during the course of the interview that he was very devoted to his three children and that he would protect the children at all costs and would not protect his brother-in-law, KLAUS FUCHS.

He stated that on the occasions when KLAUS FUCHS visited his house in Cambridge, Mass., that he slept late in the morning and usually took the children out for a walk and that he did not associate with any other individuals. He did recall that FUCHS went to the Ice Follies with him and his wife. HEINEMAN stated that, to his knowledge, KLAUS FUCHS, while visiting him in Cambridge, Mass., never made use of the telephone.

#### ISRAEL HALPERIN

HEINEMAN stated that he never met ISRAEL HALPERIN but that a man named HALPERIN, whose first name he did not recall, relayed some cigarettes to KLAUS FUCHS when the latter was in an internment camp in Canada. HEINEMAN stated that, to his knowledge, ISRAEL HALPERIN never visited the HEINEMAN residence. He stated that, to his knowledge, his wife was not acquainted with ISRAEL HALPERIN.

#### PHOTOGRAPHIC EQUIPMENT OF ROBERT B. HEINEMAN

The interview with HEINEMAN took place in a combination dark room and library located on the first floor rear in the Heineman residence. It

was observed that HEINEMAN has a seven-foot work bench, an Omega enlarger 4 X 5, which is equipped with a color head, Model D-11. He also has a slide viewer and various chemicals and paper and apparatus used in photography. He stated that he has been a camera enthusiast for many years. HEINEMAN advised that KLAUS FUCHS saw the photographic equipment and never asked him to do any photography for him and that his wife was not interested in photography.

#### General

It is noted that during the course of this interview, an attempt was made to draw from ROBERT BLOCK HEINEMAN complete details with respect to his Communist Party membership and affiliation, the identity of the units with which he was affiliated, the officers and other members, who were associated with him. In addition, concerted effort was extended towards developing his knowledge, association and affiliation with KLAUS FUCHS with a view towards identifying FUCHS' visits to Cambridge, Mass., any persons with whom he might have come in contact, in any way, during the course of these visits, any particular recollection HEINEMAN might have with respect to specific persons who wanted to see FUCHS or whom FUCHS wanted to see or any other related material or information pertinent in establishing the contacts of FUCHS.

During the entire course of the interview, HEINEMAN was hostile to the extent that he was obviously trying to ignore completely the specific questions asked and responded in general terms which failed to provide any substantial information. He was constantly pressed for this information and only under direct questioning with respect to his Young Communist League and Communist Party affiliations, was it possible to identify these affiliations and their possible relationship to the instant investigation.

Prior to the close of the interview, HEINEMAN stated that he felt if he had sufficient time to reflect upon the period involved, he might be in a position to identify the persons with whom he was affiliated during his Communist Party membership days and also be of some assistance in connection with the visits of his brother-in-law to Cambridge, Mass., and the persons whom he may have seen at that time. HEINEMAN stated that he was tremendously confused because of the family problems which had developed during recent years ending with the confinement of his wife, KRISTEL HEINEMAN, to the Westboro State Hospital, together with conditions relating to his children which caused him to feel that his obligation and responsibility

toward the three children might not be discharged if he was actually involved in some violation of law, which, he states, could not have been with his knowledge. He appeared to be highly confused, therefore, the interview was closed at a time when he remained on a friendly basis toward the Agents.

ROBERT B. HEINEMAN was reinterviewed by Special Agents BRENTON S. GORDON and THOMAS F. McLAUGHLIN, JR. at the Boston FBI office on February 3, 1950.

The following represents additional information to that developed during the course of the initial interview with HEINEMAN on February 2, 1950, which interview took place at his residence, 94 Lakeview Avenue, Cambridge, Massachusetts. It was noted at that time that he was extremely vague and indefinite with respect to dates, circumstances and the identities of individuals who were associated both with his family and with KLAUS FUCHS.

#### BACKGROUND

HEINEMAN made available for examination a passport issued in his name dated May 3, 1937 and numbered 403647. It identified him as a student, born March 25, 1917 in Wausau, Wisconsin. The passport contained visas permitting him to enter Great Britain, Russia, France, Germany, Italy, Poland, Finland, Sweden and Czechoslovakia, it being noted that HEINEMAN advised that the visa for Germany was not used and contained no stamp.

HEINEMAN stated that his trip to Europe was designed for pleasure and that in connection with his visit to Russia he mentioned Moscow, Leningrad, Kiev and Yalta among those points which he visited. This trip was arranged by Intourist.

He also made available for examination a form issued by Selective Service Board #1, 205 West Wacker Drive, Chicago, Illinois, identifying him as a registrant under Order Number 1534, Serial Number 2085, and granting authority for travel on his part to Mexico by himself. This form was dated December 26, 1946. HEINEMAN asserted that while in Mexico it was necessary for him to draw upon funds which he had on deposit at the Cambridge Trust Company, Cambridge, Massachusetts, and he exhibited a bank transfer draft dated March 5, 1947, indicating that an amount of \$300 was transferred to his credit by the Cambridge Trust Company at the Banco Internacional, S. A., Mexico, D. F., it being noted that HEINEMAN's address was recorded as Edison 51, Mexico City.

HEINEMAN was questioned as to the circumstances surrounding this particular visit and he stated it was during that period that strained relations

existed between himself and his wife and he found it necessary to leave their residence and he stated the Mexican trip was made under such circumstances. He added further that he was then conducting historical research relative to the United States-Mexican War of 1847 and that during the course of this trip he did some research work both in Monterrey and in Mexico City. HEINEMAN stated he returned from Mexico to the United States in time to meet his parents in Baltimore, Maryland, on May 1, 1947.

HEINEMAN indicated that following an unsuccessful year teaching, ending in June, 1946 he had sought unsuccessfully to obtain a better position in the teaching field through the fall of 1946. He was despaired of succeeding in this field and this was another reason for going to Mexico in January, 1947. He stated that while visiting his parents in Baltimore in the first week of May, 1947 he first began to consider abandoning the teaching profession and there was some discussion of his going into the laundromat business, which ultimately opened in the fall of 1947.

In addition to the above material, HEINEMAN also produced a birth certificate issued by the Wisconsin State Board of Health, stating that he was born March 25, 1917 at Wausau, Wisconsin; that his parents were recorded as GABE B. HEINEMAN, a United States citizen engaged as a lumber manufacturer, and ALMA BLOCH HEINEMAN, also a United States citizen. The family residence was then recorded as 820 Fulton Street, Wausau, Wisconsin.

#### FRIENDS AND ASSOCIATES OF ROBERT HEINEMAN AND KRISTEL HEINEMAN

During the course of the previous interview as set forth, HEINEMAN was unable to identify any individuals whom he knew to have had contact or access to KLAUS FUCHS at any time other than a HENRY CADBURY, whom he identified as a friend residing in Cambridge, Massachusetts. Further identification of CADBURY will be set forth.

HEINEMAN during the course of the initial interview was pressed to set forth the identities of persons whom he considered his own personal friends, without any determination of whether or not these persons knew, or may have come in contact with, KLAUS FUCHS, but again his recollection was poor and his response generally negative.

During the course of this interview, HEINEMAN was again pressed to identify those persons whom he considered at any time during his residence at Cambridge to be friends of either himself or his wife, without any consideration as to whether or not these individuals may or may not have been known to or have been in contact with KLAUS FUCHS. It was under these circumstances that HEINEMAN mentioned the following individuals, concerning whom additional available information will be set forth below:

Mr. WAID, resident of Grozier Road, Cambridge, a biologist associated with Harvard University.

The official register of Harvard University #29, November, 1949, being a directory of University officers and students, which will be subsequently identified as the Official Register of Harvard University in this report, identifies GEORGE WAID as a Professor of Biology, whose present residence is 20 Hillside Terrace, Belmont, and whose University office is at the Biological Laboratory.

Mrs. BEER, Lakeview Avenue, Cambridge, whose husband was associated with the Department of Government, Harvard University. The Official Register of Harvard University identifies SAMUEL HUTCHISON BEER as Associate Professor of Government, Tutor in the Department of Government and member of the Board of Freshman Advisors. His residence is 87 Lakeview Avenue (Cambridge, Massachusetts) and his office at Holyoke 6.

ARTHUR OGDEN, whom he identified as a fellow student at Harvard and earlier at Swathmore College. HEINEMAN stated that OGDEN had never been a member of the YCL or affiliated with the Communist Party. He added that he last saw him in the spring or summer of 1949, when OGDEN passed through Cambridge en route to a now-forgotten destination. HEINEMAN's best recollection is that OGDEN lives somewhere in New York; that he has never worked and apparently does not need work although HEINEMAN does not know the source of his income. He stated OGDEN bordered on the genius in mental capacity and at a very low level on the productive.

NORMAN LEVINSON, whom HEINEMAN identified as a faculty member at Massachusetts Institute of Technology in the Department of Mathematics. HEINEMAN stated that LEVINSON had visited him and he had visited LEVINSON but that he had not seen him for quite some time and did not know his present occupation or residence address.

Mr. and Mrs. RICHARD EDSALL of Cambridge, Massachusetts. HEINEMAN stated that his children attended the Shady Hill School with the EDSALL children and he met the EDSALLS in this fashion or through mutual membership or activity in the Progressive Party of Cambridge. HEINEMAN stated he knew EDSALL to be an advertising executive, could not recall his present residence address and he was not acquainted with him during the time when FUCHS visited the HEINEMAN home. He stated that he had visited the EDSALL home but that EDSALL had never visited his home.

Mr. PENDLETON HERRING and Mrs. KATHERINE HERRING were also described as neighbors who were accustomed to drop into the HEINEMAN home and who may well have done so during those days FUCHS was visiting.

LISA ORLIEY was described as a HEINEMAN boarder during the fall of 1947, perhaps through the Christmas holidays. HEINEMAN could recall almost nothing concerning her except that she had a dispute with his wife concerning a matter unknown to him and had left suddenly with ill feeling.

Mrs. MARGARET SPENCER was described as a neighbor on Lakeview Avenue who is certainly very friendly with him now but whom he cannot clearly recall as a friend of the family in 1944-1947. Her husband is DONALD SPENCER, who is well known in Cambridge and who presently serves as president of the Cambridge Taxpayers Association.

HELEN VELTFORT was described by HEINEMAN as a friend whom he had met while at Swathmore and as the wife of a very good friend, THEODORE VELTFORT, with whom he was associated at Swathmore. HEINEMAN stated Mrs. VELTFORT visited him at some time during the pertinent period but he could not recall the year or the circumstances. He made no reference to her husband.

WILLIAM STEFFANELLI, 191 Walden Street, Cambridge, a friend whom he first met while an employee of the General Electric at Lynn, Massachusetts.

JOSEPH R. F. RACICOT, 31 Donnybrook Road, Brighton. This friend is employed in the printing industry but HEINEMAN was unable to identify the name of the company.

Mrs. RUTH BERRY, now residing on Shaler Lane, Cambridge, Massachusetts, was HEINEMAN's housekeeper following his wife's commitment and through August, 1949. He does not recall the name of her husband but believes he is still a Harvard student. He stated the BERRYS were not at his home during the pertinent period.

Following the termination of Mrs. BERRY's employment by HEINEMAN he has since secured the services of Mr. and Mrs. HENRY MILLER. The MILLERS are currently residing as co-tenants and housekeepers in the HEINEMAN home. He described HENRY MILLER as a student at the Harvard School of Business Administration and noted that Mrs. MILLER was pregnant.

The last friend mentioned by HEINEMAN was mentioned with reluctance and with some cynicism when the word "friend" was used. HEINEMAN revealed that he had associated in his early days at Harvard with a fellow student named KONSTANTIN LAFANZANOS. HEINEMAN stated that LAFANZANOS was around his home quite frequently, just how frequently he was not sure, during the period beginning in 1936. He knew that LAFANZANOS had a home in Lowell, Massachusetts, or its general vicinity and he stated that he has been informed that LAFANZANOS became intimate with his wife. HEINEMAN further stated "He is almost as crazy as she is."

HEINEMAN asserted that he had often discussed Communist theories with LAFANZANOS but LAFANZANOS was not a Communist Party member nor was Mrs. HEINEMAN. He stated that LAFANZANOS may well have been at his home when FUCHS called. He made the comment "It is a wise father who knows his own child." He further noted that LAFANZANOS had periodically "heckled" him by charging him in telephone and other conversations with incarcerating Mrs. HEINEMAN at the Westboro Hospital. He added that he had found it necessary to request the hospital authorities to keep his wife from seeing LAFANZANOS at the hospital.

MEMBERSHIP OF ROBERT B. HEINEMAN and KRISTEL HEINEMAN  
IN THE COMMUNIST PARTY

Previous interview with HEINEMAN disclosed that by his own admission he was affiliated with the Young Communist League while at Swathmore College, Swathmore, Pennsylvania, and this association continued during his student days at Harvard University, Cambridge, details of which have been previously set forth. On this occasion, HEINEMAN was requested to further identify his interest and activities in the Young Communist League, at which time he stated he first became affiliated with the League in 1936 or 1937 and continued as an active member until 1938, at which time he graduated from Swathmore College. He stated that the membership of the group approximated ten to twenty persons; that he was an officer but he was unable to identify or recall the office he held, the other officers or any members of the group. He stated that his membership and affiliation was openly known and resented by some members of the college faculty. He further asserted that his leadership in the Young Communist League group at Swathmore College took the form of his requesting formal registration of the group at the dean's office.

When questioned as to the nature of the organizational activities of the group, he asserted that among its activities was the raising of money for what he called "The Spanish Cause."

It is noted that in the previous interview with HEINEMAN he denied he was a member of the Abraham Lincoln Brigade or had in any way participated in the Spanish Civil War.

It should be noted further that his passport which was issued to him on May 3, 1937, the details of which have been previously set forth, contained the notation "Not valid for travel in Spain."

As a result of his Young Communist League activities at Swathmore, Pennsylvania, HEINEMAN stated he joined the Communist Party at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, in 1938. When questioned as to the circumstances under which he joined the Communist Party he stated he attended a large meeting



at which cards were passed out and that under such circumstances he was formally enrolled. It was suggested to him that such procedure seemed inconsistent with the normal policies of organizational activities and he was again evasive and failed to provide any details.

He was questioned as to whether or not he had observed a Communist Party membership card and he stated he had and further that he had received a Communist Party card in his own name in connection with his Philadelphia Communist Party association.

With reference to the Abraham Lincoln Brigade, HEINEMAN asserted that a part of the Young Communist League activity had been to raise recruits. He recalled that a Jewish student at Swathmore had been recruited and had been killed in Spain but he did not remember his name. He further stated that his friend THEODORE VELTFORT also went to Spain in the Abraham Lincoln Brigade but provided no additional information concerning any participation he may have had in Veltfort's general activities.

Upon his graduation from Swathmore College in 1938, HEINEMAN stated he came to Harvard University, Cambridge, to continue his educational program at the Graduate School of Arts and Sciences. He stated that at Cambridge he immediately became affiliated with the Young Communist League. As he did at Swathmore College, he stated that he was the individual who officially requested the University authorities at Harvard College to approve the Young Communist League as a student organization.

When questioned as to details relating to the activities of the Young Communist League unit to which he referred, HEINEMAN asserted that a person whom he knew then as DANIEL BOONE, whose surname he could not recall but when suggested to him that it might be SCHIRMER, he readily agreed.

DANIEL BOONE SCHIRMER was a graduate of Harvard College, Class of 1937, is an active leader of the Communist Party at Boston, Massachusetts and is associated with all phases of Communist Party activity on a full-time basis.

HEINEMAN stated that the meetings of the Young Communist League of Harvard College were held in a bookstore on Holyoke Street, Cambridge, Mass.

HEINEMAN stated that his relationship with the Young Communist League at Harvard, which was made up of some thirty to forty people, was a haphazard one because he was endeavoring to study. At Swathmore, HEINEMAN noted, he had given little attention to his courses.

With respect to Communist Party affiliation while in Cambridge, HEINEMAN asserted that he had never held a Communist Party card in the Greater Boston area; that his associations with the Young Communist League and

Communist Party gradually dissolved so that in 1941 nothing remained of them. He noted that he had visited the Progressive Bookshop, on Beach Street, Boston, Massachusetts, on one or two occasions since 1941 and placed his last visit to that establishment as occurring "a couple of years ago." It is further noted he recalled the location of the bookshop with some difficulty and prompting.

HEINEMAN stated he was unable to recall any of his associates in the Communist Party or the Young Communist League. It is noted, however, in every way he indicated he could do so but was unwilling to do so lest he be unfair to them.

In connection with the information set forth above herein, HEINEMAN asserted that his Communist Party affiliations closed in 1941. Information has been previously reported disclosing that his Communist Party associations at Boston, Massachusetts, have continued intermittently since that time with evidence of membership established in 1944 and 1947.

On this same date HEINEMAN telephonically contacted Special Agent THOMAS F. McLAUGHLIN in connection with his desire to explain an item which occurred during the course of this conversation, at which time he again referred to his inability to be of any assistance in connection with the inquiry. It was suggested to him at that time that his statement with respect to disaffiliation with the Communist Party in 1941, which statement he insists to be a fact, was known to be an untrue statement and that his knowledge of it to be untrue represented a barrier to his providing the information within his possession in connection with this inquiry. HEINEMAN had no specific comment to make at that time other than to indicate that he anticipated being contacted further with reference to the matter.

As is noted above, HEINEMAN asserted that his wife KRISTEL had never been a member of any Communist organization, either in Boston or in Philadelphia.

EMIL KLAUS FUCHS - Father-in-Law of HEINEMAN

In connection with his father-in-law HEINEMAN asserted that he forwarded funds to New York City through the facilities of Pan American Airways in connection with his father-in-law's visit to the United States, which HEINEMAN had previously asserted to have occurred from October, 1948 through June, 1949.

HEINEMAN exhibited a receipt captioned "Pan American Airways, Inc.," dated September 20, 1947 as follows: "Received from ROBERT HEINEMAN, forty-eight dollars on account of EMIL FUCHS, TFA LON open, Pan American Airways, Inc., signed."

It was called to HEINEMAN's attention that his previous assertion with respect to his father-in-law's visit to the United States set the date as October, 1948, which was inconsistent with the date set forth on the above receipt. He stated he made this purchase of funds for transmittal at the Pan American Airway's office at the Hotel Statler, Boston, Massachusetts, and that apparently some mistake had been made by the clerk.

Subsequently, as set forth above in connection with information relating to HEINEMAN's Communist Party affiliations, HEINEMAN contacted Special Agent McLAUGHLIN telephonically on this same date. The purpose of the call was to explain that the advance of funds, as indicated by the above receipt, was not, as previously indicated, to be handed to his father-in-law EMIL FUCHS upon his arrival in New York from England but rather the money was sent by him to his father-in-law in England. He was questioned as to why this method of transmittal was utilized when he had banking facilities through which a bank draft or a transfer of funds could be made. This he was unable to explain. It is noted this was a telephone call and no effort was made to press him further on the matter.

HEINEMAN in response to questioning revealed that his father-in-law's entrance into the United States was being sponsored by the Society of Friends, and he did not know the nature of the financial relationship between the Society and the senior FUCHS. For that matter, HEINEMAN did not know FUCHS needed the money. He did state that prior to the sending of the money, it had been planned that he or his wife would go to New York to meet the Senior FUCHS and that failing this, the money had been transmitted.

HEINEMAN stated that his wife and father-in-law did correspond at fairly regular intervals. He did not always see this correspondence, either incoming or outgoing.

HEINEMAN stated that his father-in-law was currently in the Eastern Zone of Germany, that his father-in-law had been charged by Mrs. HEINEMAN with being responsible for the death of their mother but that he had seen correspondence from other children specifically denying this assertion, which he attributed to his wife's mental condition.

#### KLAUS FUCHS

Excepting for the following data, HEINEMAN provided no information concerning KLAUS FUCHS additional to that set forth in the previous interview on him. HEINEMAN did advise neither he nor his wife heard from KLAUS FUCHS since his wife's commitment to the Westboro State Hospital. Confronted with a newspaper headline regarding the arrest of KLAUS FUCHS, HEINEMAN stated it surprised him but did not shock him because the family had been involved in one bizarre incident after another.

HEINEMAN further stated that his wife had informed him, shortly before her commitment, that she had been advised by her brother KLAUS to leave her husband and go to England with her children to live with KLAUS FUCHS.

Mrs. KRISTEL HEINEMAN

With reference to his wife, ROBERT HEINEMAN provided the following information additional to that set forth in the previous interview of him:

He stated that KRISTEL HEINEMAN had no German relatives residing in the United States and to his knowledge but one German friend, OLGA RADENMACHER. KRISTEL HEINEMAN met OLGA at Swathmore. HEINEMAN cannot recall OLGA's maiden name and the surname given the agents was her name by her first marriage but she has since remarried and he cannot recall her present name. She resides in the Philadelphia area.

HEINEMAN stated that the FUCHS family was a very unusual family. As noted above, his wife had accused her father of being in some way responsible for the death of her mother. She was constantly concerned concerning her brother GERHARDT FUCHS, who is now residing in Switzerland and who suffers from tuberculosis. GERHARDT had fled Germany because of political activity and had abandoned his wife and child. His wife has since remarried. However, GERHARDT's wife is still on very friendly terms with KRISTEL's father.

A sister of KRISTEL committed suicide and her husband, whose name was unknown to HEINEMAN, is residing in the Eastern Zone of Germany and is apparently still on friendly terms with the FUCHS family.

ADDITIONAL PERSONAL HISTORY OF ROBERT B. HEINEMAN

HEINEMAN stated that in connection with his personal difficulties with his wife he had moved out of his Cambridge home at sometime in 1942, had gone to Philadelphia and remained in that city until sometime in 1943. In Philadelphia he occupied a room in a rooming house, but he could not furnish the address nor the dates of occupancy.

In 1943, upon his return, he secured his employment at the General Electric. In 1944 while at General Electric he became the Chairman of the CIO-PAC at Lynn, Massachusetts, and further became involved in the organization "The Independent Voters for FDR." In 1945-1946, as indicated previously, he was in New Hampshire. HEINEMAN also revealed at this time he owned a farm located at Bridgewater Corners, Vermont, and that he had from time to time taken residence on it. He does not recall that his brother-in-law KLAUS FUCHS has visited the farm but he did remember his "friend" KONSTANTIN LAFANZANOS had frequently used the premises.

INTERVIEW OF ROBERT B. HEINEMAN - FEBRUARY 4, 1950

ROBERT B. HEINEMAN was reinterviewed in the late evening of February 4, 1950 at the offices of the Boston Division, FBI, by Special Agents RICHARD W. D.W and the writer. The following additional information was obtained:

ASSOCIATION OF ROBERT B. HEINEMAN  
WITH THE COMMUNIST PARTY

ROBERT B. HEINEMAN on this occasion admitted that he had attended meetings of the Communist Party during the nineteen forties and that some of these meetings occurred at his home. He admitted formal membership in the Communist Party at Cambridge in 1947 and in 1943 but denied membership in 1944. He stated, however, that it was possible that some party official might have reregistered him in 1944, following his 1943 membership, without his knowledge. He asserted he still regarded himself as a Communist and declared that he holds many of the ideals of Communism very highly. He stated that throughout his Party experience he had always encountered difficulty in adjusting his own personality to the discipline of the organization; i.e., intellectual discipline.

HEINEMAN continued to insist that he had no Communist Party contacts while employed at the General Electric Plant in Lynn. He noted that his political activity during this time took the form of his leadership of the GE workers CIO-Political Action Committee and in his participation in a neighborhood group known as the Independent Voters for FDR.

HEINEMAN was confronted with the fact that it was known that his Party name had been ROBERT HILL. He had first denied and then admitted that this was so. HEINEMAN refused to identify his associates in the Communist Party but did note that no meetings had occurred at his home since he had moved from 144 Lakeview Avenue to 94 Lakeview Avenue, Cambridge. He moved to 94 Lakeview Avenue on May 1, 1946.

He specifically denied that SAMUEL H. BEER and GEORGE WALD were in any way affiliated with him in his Communist activity. He did not know NORMAN LEVINSON as a Communist but could recall that his wife had been an active leader during wartime in Russian War Relief and he had been in that fashion associated with her. He did not know RICHARD EDSALL to be a Communist Party member but he did know him to be an officer of the Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee, an organization in whose work he had previously admitted interest.

HEINEMAN stated that ARTHUR OGDEN may well have been a member of the Young Communist League at Swathmore; at least he and HEINEMAN had

discussed the organization and had debated its policies. Moreover, HEINEMAN was of the opinion that OGDEN had likely been a member of the Young Communist League or Communist Party at Harvard, but he was not certain of this.

#### KLAUS FUCHS AND HIS CONTACTS AT CAMBRIDGE, MASSACHUSETTS

HEINEMAN stated that he cannot recall that FUCHS ever visited with him at Cambridge, Massachusetts, during the Christmas season of 1944. He did not know that anyone had called at his home in that period seeking FUCHS. He did know that FUCHS had visited his home in Cambridge in February, 1945 and likely between February 12 and 23. He further recalled that on one occasion during this visit he had attended the Ice Skollies in Boston with FUCHS and his wife KRISTEL. During this particular visit HEINEMAN has a definite recollection that he drove FUCHS alone to the home of one DEUTSCH, on Buckingham Street, Cambridge, Massachusetts. He did not meet DEUTSCH on this or any other occasion.

He was definite in that the HEINEMAN family association with DEUTSCH was predicated upon the close association between KLAUS FUCHS and DEUTSCH rather than upon any associations between the HEINEMAN family and DEUTSCH. The association of the HEINEMANS with DEUTSCH and with FUCHS, as known to ROBERT HEINEMAN, is being set forth in a separate paragraph below.

HEINEMAN recalled that FUCHS had visited his home at 94 Lakeview Avenue in either late June or very early July, 1946. HEINEMAN remembers he had just completed his teaching duties at Antrim, New Hampshire, when KLAUS FUCHS was a visitor. He can recall on this occasion his wife, KRISTEL, and KLAUS FUCHS had made a quick trip to Schenectady, New York.

In this connection he can recall that he either had to take time off from his normal duties or he had had to have his friend KONSTANTIN LAFANOS mind his children. It is HEINEMAN's best, but not positive, recollection that the man visited in Schenectady by KLAUS FUCHS and KRISTEL HEINEMAN was HANS BETHE, of Cornell University. It is noted that he selected this name when the known associates of KLAUS FUCHS at Los Alamos were enumerated, being some ten in number.

In connection with the latter enumerating of FUCHS' associates at Los Alamos the name VICTOR WEISSKOPF struck a familiar note. HEINEMAN stated he could recall that on some one of FUCHS' visits to Cambridge, Massachusetts, he had borrowed WEISSKOPF's automobile. HEINEMAN further noted that approximately two years ago his wife KRISTEL noted WEISSKOPF's picture in the Boston press and commented she had not WEISSKOPF through

her brother KLAUS; that the two men were very friendly.

With reference to HANS BETHE, above, ROBERT HEINEMAN stated that his wife had also seen BETHE's name in the newspaper and had mentioned she had met him. She did not in the same breath mention she had met him through her brother KLAUS.

HEINEMAN can recall that on the occasion of one visit to the HEINEMAN home, KLAUS FUCHS took KRISTEL HEINEMAN and the HEINEMAN children to the beach at Ipswich, Massachusetts.

ASSOCIATION OF THE HEINEMANS AND KLAUS FUCHS WITH MARTIN DEUTSCH

ROBERT HEINEMAN stated that during the February, 1945 visit of KLAUS FUCHS to 144 Lakeview Avenue, Cambridge, Massachusetts, FUCHS had on one evening requested HEINEMAN to drive him to an address on Buckingham Street, Cambridge, Massachusetts, so that FUCHS might meet with one DEUTSCH. HEINEMAN stated he had never met DEUTSCH at that time and has not met him since. He had, however, some knowledge of DEUTSCH's existence because DEUTSCH was in some fashion related to the mother-in-law of TED VELTFORT, mentioned elsewhere herein.

Moreover, HEINEMAN recalled that in the summer of 1944 he rented a cottage at "ennisport, Massachusetts, named "Giospuler" (phonetic). He secured this cottage through VELTFORT's mother-in-law, whom he recalled as a Mrs. ROCK. (Boston files reflect Mrs. VELTFORT's maiden name was RANK).

HEINEMAN himself remained in Cambridge in summer school during the summer of 1944 but he has a dim recollection that DEUTSCH and his family visited KRISTEL HEINEMAN during that summer at "ennisport. His recollection is dim because it is predicated on an almost now forgotten statement to that effect by KRISTEL HEINEMAN to him. At that time the HEINEMAN marital relations were very strained and there was very little conversation between him and his wife. He could recall, however, that DEUTSCH was the son of a doctor and a woman psychiatrist who resided in his immediate area. (The 1944 City Directory revealed that HELEN DEUTSCH and FELIX DEUTSCH resided on Larchwood Road, which is in the area of Lakeview Avenue and further that FELIX is a physician and HELEN is a psychiatrist. It is further known that MARTIN DEUTSCH has a residence at 86 Buckingham Street, Cambridge, Massachusetts).

ROBERT HEINEMAN could further recall that sometime in a summer, most likely the summer of 1946, Mrs. DEUTSCH, while pregnant, resided for a short time with the HEINEMANS at 94 Lakeview Avenue. This boarding arrangement, of a short and temporary nature, was made by KRISTEL HEINEMAN out of appreciation of her brother's friendship with the DEUTSCHS and the details concerning it were never clear to HEINEMAN.

HEINEMAN further stated that during the occasion of KLAUS FUCHS' visit to Cambridge in February, 1945 and in subsequent visits, he urged his wife KRISTEL to open their home to guests in order to entertain KLAUS FUCHS. The only person he can remember having been entertained was Dr. HENRY CADBURY. He further recalled that he permitted KLAUS FUCHS to borrow the HEINEMAN car on one evening to visit persons unknown to him. He was of the opinion at that time that it was likely DEUTSCH but he has nothing to substantiate this opinion.



INTERVIEW WITH KRISTEL FUCHS HEINEMAN - FEBRUARY 5, 1950

KRISTEL FUCHS HEINEMAN was interviewed on February 5, 1950 at the Westboro State Hospital by Special Agents RICHARD W. DOW and the writer and in the presence of Dr. ROLLINS K. HADLEY. The interview began at approximately 12:20 PM and ended at 1:45 PM.

In contrast to the interview of the same person on February 2, 1950, Mrs. HEINEMAN was on this date generally confused. Dr. HADLEY stated that in contrast with the earlier interview she did, on this occasion, demonstrate many of the mental ailments which have been a part of her mental difficulties.

ASSOCIATIONS WITH KLAUS FUCHS

Mrs. HEINEMAN stated on this occasion that she first met her brother KLAUS during the Christmas holidays, 1943. He came to Cambridge, Massachusetts, to visit her at 144 Lakeview Avenue, shortly after his arrival in the United States. She could recall no other details concerning this visit.

Mrs. HEINEMAN stated she next saw FUCHS in February, 1945 at 94 Lakeview Avenue, Cambridge, Massachusetts. (It is noted that she was not then residing at 94 Lakeview Avenue but rather at 144 Lakeview Avenue). She stated that on this occasion VENDELL and BETTY PURRY had called on the HEINEMANS during her brother's visit. Dr. and Mrs. HENRY CADBURY had also visited them.

She at this time stated that MARTIN DEUTSCH also visited the HEINEMANS and FUCHS but at a later point in the interview she contradicted this statement and stated that neither she nor her brother had ever met DEUTSCH prior to the summer of 1946.

Mrs. HEINEMAN asserted that in February, 1945 she, her children and KLAUS FUCHS traveled to the beach at Ipswich, Massachusetts. She had no recollection of ever having attended the Ice Follies with anyone in 1945 and asserted the first time she had seen such a show in her lifetime was in 1948. She expressed the opinion that KLAUS FUCHS might have taken one or more of her children to the Ice Follies in 1945 but she has no positive memory of such an event.

Mrs. HEINEMAN stated KLAUS FUCHS did visit her in Cambridge sometime in the latter part of June, 1946 for about one week.

She stated this visit occurred at 94 Lakeview Avenue. She has no memory as to what he or she might have done while in Cambridge in 1946.

Mrs. HEINEMAN asserted that KLAUS FUCHS came to the United States at some time during the summer of 1947. He was on a mission for his British employing agency and arrived at Washington, D. C. From Washington he proceeded to the HEINEMAN home in Cambridge and spent a few days with her. During this visit it was necessary for him to make a trip to Schenectady, New York, in connection with his British business. He was going to visit a scientist who had worked with him at Los Alamos and who, according to her, was a very important man. She could not recall the name of this individual.

Mrs. HEINEMAN stated she and FUCHS left Boston on an evening train, arrived in Schenectady, New York, on the following morning and KLAUS FUCHS left her at a drugstore not far from the railroad station for several hours. KLAUS FUCHS took a taxi cab from the drugstore to visit the unidentified scientist. Several hours later FUCHS returned and with KRISTEL took a bus to the outskirts of the city where they called on the same unidentified scientist. They had dinner at the man's home and met several students who had met to see the scientist. She cannot recall the name of any person, aside from her brother, whom she met on this trip. She and FUCHS considered the possibility of flying to Boston but because of misty weather conditions again took a night train to Boston.

With reference to the above described unidentified scientist, Mrs. HEINEMAN stated that the man was employed for a period of one year by a company with offices in Schenectady. She cannot recall the name of the company. The unidentified scientist was by training and profession a college professor and thus it was not unusual that students should have been visiting his home.

Mrs. HEINEMAN stated it was not unusual for her brother to take her on this rather uneventful trip, as far as she was concerned, because the aim of it was to give her an opportunity to get away from her children and her family and the difficulties they were then causing her.

When FUCHS left Cambridge in the summer of 1947 he went to Montreal, Canada, in furtherance of his British mission and then returned to England.

ASSOCIATION OF KLAUS FUCHS AND MARTIN DEUTSCH

Mrs. HEINEMAN stated that in the summer of 1947 DEUTSCH inquired as

when her brother, KLAUS FUCHS, might be in Cambridge, Massachusetts. When KLAUS did arrive, both he and Mrs. HEINEMAN visited the DEUTSCH home to make his presence in Cambridge known to the DEUTSCHS. Mrs. HEINEMAN insisted that she never met MARTIN DEUTSCH before this. She noted she had not met Mrs. DEUTSCH through mutual friends; i.e., the GREGORY ROCKLINS and because the ROCKLINS, the DEUTSCHS and the HEINEMANS all had children in the Shady Hill School, Cambridge.

The day following KLAUS' and KRISTEL's visit to the DEUTSCH home, Mrs. DEUTSCH called upon the HEINEMANS and invited KLAUS FUCHS to the DEUTSCH home for dinner. Mrs. HEINEMAN stated KLAUS accepted this invitation and went to the DEUTSCH home unaccompanied by either Mr. or Mrs. HEINEMAN.

Mrs. HEINEMAN stated that the foregoing represents all association known to her between the HEINEMANS and/or KLAUS FUCHS with the DEUTSCH family.

It is noted she does not know DEUTSCH as MARTIN DEUTSCH, but as in the instance of her husband, she does possess sufficient descriptive data concerning DEUTSCH so that there is no doubt that it is MARTIN DEUTSCH.

#### ASSOCIATIONS OF KRISTEL AND/OR KLAUS FUCHS WITH ISRAEL HALPERIN

Mrs. HEINEMAN stated that she had heard, from sources not now remembered, in April 1942 that her brother KLAUS was interned as a German Enemy Alien in a camp in Canada. She stated that KLAUS FUCHS was so interned for approximately one year. She discussed FUCHS' internment with the WENDELL FURRY who advised that they had a brother-in-law in Canada, and that they would write and have the brother-in-law contact KLAUS FUCHS. This brother-in-law was then not known to her but he is now known to her as ISRAEL HALPERIN.

On the occasion of this interview, Mrs. HEINEMAN stated during the year of her brother's internment she sent him cigarettes and books directly and not through any intermediary. She asserted that she had received but one letter from KLAUS during his year of internment in Canada.

In the summer of 1947 Mrs. HEINEMAN has a dim recollection that she met MARY HALPERIN, wife of ISRAEL HALPERIN. She can recall on the occasion of this meeting MARY HALPERIN was concerned about her husband's future employment. Mrs. HEINEMAN does not associate MARY HALPERIN with FUCHS in any way and does not believe that FUCHS met MARY HALPERIN while in Cambridge or even knew of MARY HALPERIN'S presence in Cambridge at the time.

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FUCHS' CONTACT WITH UNIDENTIFIED CHEMIST

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u JS Mrs. HEINEMAN stated that approximately three weeks before KLAUS FUCHS arrived in Cambridge in February, 1945, an unidentified chemist called at her home and inquired as to whether or not her brother KLAUS FUCHS had arrived. This unknown subject introduced himself to KRISTEL as a chemist who had worked with KLAUS FUCHS. KRISTEL is under the impression that the unknown subject had worked with FUCHS at Los Alamos but detailed questioning revealed that there is no basis now known to her for this assumption. The unknown subject visited with KRISTEL and her children and she gave him lunch. She advised him of the approximate time of her brother's arrival in Cambridge, Massachusetts. KRISTEL HEINEMAN stated there was no one at her home excepting the children and the unknown subject on this occasion. JS u

JS On the second day of KLAUS FUCHS' visit to the HEINEMAN home in February, 1945 the same unknown subject again rang her doorbell. The unknown subject and KLAUS FUCHS spent approximately fifteen minutes in her living room. She was present but did not listen to their conversation and her only opinion now is that they were apparently not well acquainted with one another. The unknown subject on this occasion brought candy for the HEINEMAN children and a book, to her best recollection, entitled "Mrs. Palmer's Money" for her. She does not know whether the chemist received anything from FUCHS or gave anything to FUCHS. He was again apparently between trains and left shortly after his arrival. JS u

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JS Sometime in the following few months this same unknown subject again stopped at her home and again made inquiry as to when KLAUS FUCHS might visit her. She had no knowledge of an impending visit. She again gave the unknown subject lunch. KRISTEL stated on this third visit only she, her children and the unknown subject were present for lunch. KRISTEL has a dim recollection on this third visit her husband, ROBERT HEINEMAN, may have met this man as the unknown subject left the HEINEMAN home. JS u

u JS Mrs. HEINEMAN further recalled that the unknown subject had promised her oldest boy STEVEN a chemistry set but he had never sent it to him. JS u

Mrs. HEINEMAN described the unknown subject as follows:

OTHER POSSIBLE CONTACTS OF FUCHS

Mrs. HEINEMAN had read to her the names of those persons known to have been closely associated with subject FUCHS at Los Alamos. None of them were in any way familiar to her, so she said. Specifically, here it can be noted, she claimed to have no prior knowledge or familiarity with the names of HANS BETHE and ROBERT MARSHAK. It is noted that the name VICTOR WEISSKOPF was associated by her with a meeting of students of German origin held prior to World War II at the Parker House Hotel in Boston. She described this WEISSKOPF as a Czechoslovakian who had addressed this meeting and who was then affiliated in some capacity with Harvard University. It is noted that none of these descriptive notes would appear to have any application to the VICTOR WEISSKOPF who was associated with subject KLAUS FUCHS at Los Alamos and who is now a faculty member at Massachusetts Institute of Technology.

AVAILABLE INFORMATION CONCERNING KNOWN CONTACTS OF THE HEINEMANS WHO MAY, THROUGH THEM, HAVE KNOWN KLAUS FUCHS

The interrogation of KRISTEL FUCHS HEINEMAN and ROBERT BLOCH HEINEMAN, set forth above, has provided the identities of at least some of their associates at Cambridge, Massachusetts. The following represents a summary of available information concerning each contained in the files of the Boston Division.

MARTIN DEUTSCH

MARTIN DEUTSCH was born in Vienna, Austria, on January 29, 1917, the son of FELIX and HELENE DEUTSCH. His father was a native of Austria and his mother, a native of Poland. Both are now citizens of the United States and MARTIN DEUTSCH was naturalized under Certificate #4929393 at Boston, Massachusetts, on February 3, 1941. Prior to 1939, MARTIN DEUTSCH resided with his parents at 44 Larchwood Drive, Cambridge. From 1939 to 1944, DEUTSCH resided at 61 Garfield Street in Cambridge. From 1944 to 1946 he was at Los Alamos, Texas. His current address is 86 Buckingham Street, Cambridge, Massachusetts, and has been such since his return from Los Alamos. The exact date that his tenancy began at 86 Buckingham Street is not known.

DEUTSCH attended Massachusetts Institute of Technology at Cambridge, from 1935 to 1941 and he holds the degrees of Bachelor of Science and Doctor of Philosophy from this institution.

DEUTSCH traveled in Austria and Switzerland from July through August, 1936 on vacation and again visited Mexico from January through February, 1946 on vacation.

He is married to SUSANNE DEUTSCH and has a child LAWRENCE PETER DEUTSCH who was born August 7, 1946.

Boston T-4, of known reliability, has identified AMDUR as a member of the Henry Thoreau (Professional) Branch in Cambridge in 1945 and his wife ALICE as a member of the Cambridge Branch in the same year.

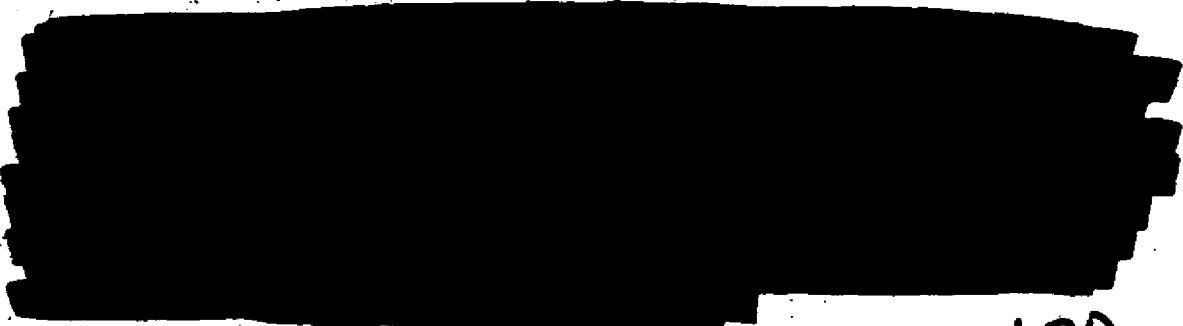
No informant has provided any information of recent date, indicating Communist activities on the part of AMDUR or his wife.

NORMAN LEVINSON

NORMAN LEVINSON was born at Lynn, Massachusetts, on August 11, 1912. He has also done graduate work at Cambridge University in England and at Princeton University.

He married ZIPPORAH A. LEVINSON at Brooklyn, New York, on April 11, 1938. During the war years LEVINSON was engaged in research work at Massachusetts Institute of Technology, which work was being performed under contract with the United States Army Air Corps. He has been since his graduation from MIT affiliated with the Institute in one capacity or another in the Department of Mathematics. He is currently Associate Professor of Mathematics and is currently residing at 62 Clark Road, Brookline, Massachusetts.

Confidential Informant T-4 has identified LEVINSON as a member of the Henry Thoreau Branch of the Communist Party in 1944.

WENDELL HINKLE FURRY was born at Prairieton, Indiana, February 18, 1907. He is the son of JOHN HENRY and EFFIE E. FURRY.

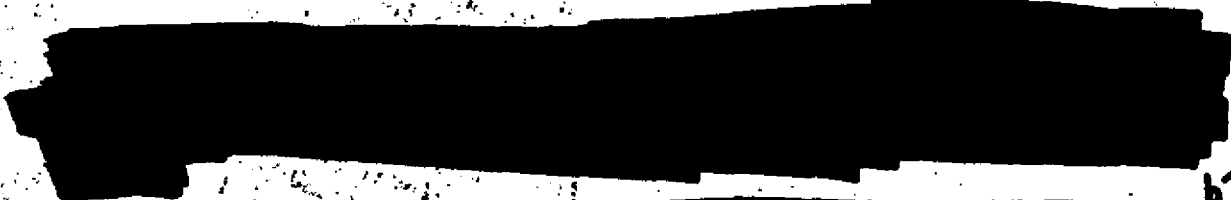
He received an AB degree from De Paul University in 1928, a Master of Arts from the University of Illinois in 1930 and a Ph.D from the same school in 1932.

On December 27, 1931 at Rockford, Illinois, he married ELIZABETH JOSEPHINE SANDY. It can be noted that MARY SANDY married ISRAEL HALPERIN, referred to herein.

FURRY was a Fellow at the University of Illinois from 1928 to 1932 and a Tutor at the California Institute of Technology from 1932 to 1934. Since 1934 he has been associated with the Physics Department of Harvard University. His current rank in this department is Associate Professor of Physics. At this moment FURRY is on an exchange professorship in physics at the Royal Institute at Copenhagen, Denmark.

FURRY has traveled extensively in England, France, Scandinavia and the Soviet Union. His current address is 17 Frost Road, Belmont, Massachusetts.

Boston T-4 has identified FURRY as a member of the HENRY THOREAU Branch of the Communist Party as of 1945.

THEODORE ERNST VELTFORT, JR.

THEODORE ERNST VELTFORT, JR., was born at Cambridge, Massachusetts, on February 23, 1915. He studied at Princeton University, majoring in engineering and physics for two years and at Swathmore, majoring in physics for a year and a half. He met his present wife while both were at Swathmore in 1936.

As indicated above, he was in Spain as a member of the Abraham Lincoln Brigade in 1937-1938. In 1938-1939 he and the girl who became his wife were studying together at Columbia University and they also studied together at Princeton University in the summer of 1940.

VELTFORT served in the United States Navy, NSN 403-90-84, from April, 1941 to July, 1941. He served in the United States Army from August 27, 1942 through December 13, 1945. His Army Serial Number was 110-880-47.

VELTFORT had a residence address in Cambridge, Massachusetts, in 1945 at 18 Larchwood Drive. He changed this address sometime in 1945 to 8 Mercer Circle. On March 19, 1946 he moved to the West Coast.

VELTFORT's father is the manager of the Brass and Copper Research Association and is further general secretary of the Brass and Copper Association, both of New York City.

VELTFORT on September 14, 1941 at Cambridge, Massachusetts, married HELENE MARIANNE RANK, a native of Vienna, Austria.

It is interesting to note that the records of VELTFORT's Selective Service Board reflect that he attempted to gain a deferment in 1941 by claiming a prior intent to marry, which established a dependent status. Among those filing letters in his behalf was one HENRY LELAND

CLARKE, who was then at the Westminster Choir College, Princeton, New Jersey, who subsequently was identified by T-4 in 1945 as a member of the Communist Party in Cambridge, Massachusetts. CLARKE was also a contact of ISRAEL HALPERIN.

The San Francisco Division has advised that VELTFORT is currently attending Stanford University at Palo Alto, California, under the GI Bill of Rights. San Francisco further advised that in 1948 VELTFORT had apparently given consideration to establishing a short-wave receiver in order to receive messages from one ANNA LOUISE STRONG at Yenan, China.

There is no current information reflecting that VELTFORT is now affiliated with the Communist Party.

It is noted that the HEINEMANS are both under the impression that VELTFORT is related in some fashion to MARTIN DEUTSCH.

#### ISRAEL HALPERIN

ISRAEL HALPERIN was born January 5, 1911, probably in Canada. He attended the University of Toronto, receiving an AB degree in 1932 and an MA in 1933. He then attended Princeton University from which he received his Ph.D degree in 1936. He was an instructor at Harvard University in mathematics from April 12, 1937 to the end of the fall term, 1939. In mid-semester, in January, 1940, he went to Queens University, Kingston, Ontario. *IS U*

HALPERIN was identified as one "Bacon," an agent working in behalf of Soviet Intelligence in Canada, by IGOR GUZENKO, defected code clerk at the Soviet Embassy at Ottawa, Canada. As a result of the charges made by GUZENKO, HALPERIN was arrested in February, 1946 by the RCMP and charged with a violation of the Official Secrets Act. He was subsequently acquitted and apparently largely because of the failure of Captain GORDON LUNAN, who was convicted, to testify against him.

As indicated above, HALPERIN married MARY BAIDEY, a sister to Mrs. WENDELL FURRY.

#### HASSLER WHITNEY

HASSLER WHITNEY was born March 23, 1907 at New York City. He attended high school at New Haven, Connecticut, and received a Ph.D degree at Yale University in 1928. He then did two years of graduate work at Harvard University in mathematics. During World II WHITNEY was employed with the Applied Mathematics Group, Division of War Research, Columbia University, New York City, and through this work received a draft deferment at the behest of the OSRD.

WHITNEY, since 1930, is reported to have visited the following foreign countries: France and Switzerland, June, 1933 to August, 1933; France, Switzerland, Germany, USSR and England, July, 1936 to August, 1936; France and Switzerland, July, 1939 to August, 1939.

HASSLER WHITNEY has been associated with the Department of Mathematics at Harvard University since 1933 and currently holds the rank of professor. It is noted he taught mathematics at Harvard University simultaneously with ISRAEL HALPERIN

No informant has been able to place WHITNEY in the Communist Party. However, Boston T-4 identified his wife as a member of the Communist Party in Cambridge in 1945 and the Massachusetts Legislative Committee investigating subversive activities in the Commonwealth in 1937 established that she operated the Holyoke Bookshop in Cambridge. This bookshop was described by the same committee as an outlet for Communist Party literature in Cambridge and it is further noted that ROBERT HEINEMAN has admitted attending meetings of the Young Communist League at this establishment. The bookshop is no longer in operation.

WHITNEY, according to the current telephone directory, is currently residing at the Eliot House, Harvard University, Cambridge, Massachusetts.

GEORGE WALD

As indicated above, GEORGE WALD is a Professor of Biology at Harvard University, Cambridge, Massachusetts. GEORGE WALD is known to have been a subscriber to "Science and Society," a Marxist publication, as of December 2, 1936. WALD was contacted by Bureau agents in February, 1945 concerning the Boston-Cambridge Branch of the American Association of Scientific Workers and refused to provide any information concerning the group because, in his opinion, the organization was not subversive.

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GERHARD WOLLAN

A photograph of GERHARD WOLLAN was exhibited to ROBERT B. HEINEMAN during the course of interview on February 4, 1950. WOLLAN was unknown to HEINEMAN.

Similarly, a photograph of WOLLAN was exhibited to KRISTEL F. HEINEMAN during the interview of February 5, 1950 and he was also unknown to her. It is noted that in each instance the photograph was mingled with those of other persons.

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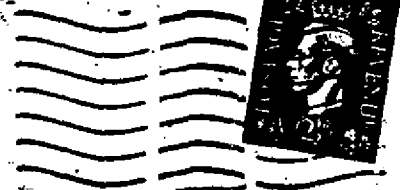

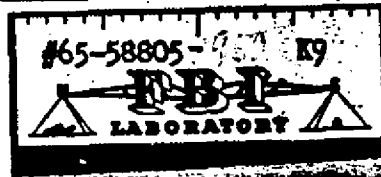

PURPOSE

To obtain approval for dissemination of attached letters and modification of present instructions concerning dissemination.

FACTS

During the early stages of this investigation, after the arrest of Fuchs, the Director instructed by routing slip as follows: "I think we should send memo to Souers and AG re any new developments (other than confidential unconcluded leads) in Fuchs case once a week."

In accordance with this instruction, there are attached letters to Rear Admiral Souers and the Attorney General, setting forth Fuchs' identification of certain persons implicated to a limited extent in his espionage activities abroad, and incorporating a summary of information on these persons in Bureau files.

One of these persons, Jurgen Kuczinski, is known to have been attached to Berlin University, Berlin, Germany, during 1949. Another of these individuals, Vassili V. Soukhomline, Paris, France, was the subject of an inquiry by CIA in September, 1949, and it is presumed, therefore, that CIA may have an active investigation concerning him. In view of this, there also are attached identical letters to CIA and Army Intelligence.

It does not appear that the information in these letters is of immediate interest to the remaining agencies to whom dissemination in this case has been made in the past. It will be noted that this type of information does not add to our investigative results. It also will be noted that the basic investigation being conducted is for the purpose of identifying UNSUB [redacted] and that this investigation is within the classification of "confidential, unconcluded leads." *R*

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that, if you approve, the attached letters be sent to Rear Admiral Souers, the Attorney General, CIA, and Army Intelligence, and that there be no further dissemination of this information at this time.

Working from this information, a photograph of Joseph Arnold Robbins was secured by the New York Field Division and was submitted to the Boston Division for display to the Heinemans. The Heinemans failed to recognize the photograph, a copy of which is attached hereto for your information. This photograph was also sent to Mr. Gimperman in London, in order that it might be displayed through Mr. Whitson to Fuchs, on February 23, 1950.

A check is being made of Bureau files regarding Robbins. However, it appears at first check that there is little information concerning Robbins. On February 16, 1950, a teletype was sent by the Bureau to the New York, Boston and Washington Field Offices, instructing that a photograph and description be obtained immediately of Joseph Robbins, 5501 Fourteenth Avenue, Brooklyn, who was mentioned in the New York report of March 23, 1945, entitled "Communist Infiltration of FAECT; Internal Security - C." This teletype was the result of a check in the Bureau on the information furnished by Robert Heineman.

A call was immediately placed to the New York Office this afternoon upon receipt of the possible identification of unsub [redacted] ASAC Whelan advised that the true name of Robbins is Joseph Regenstreich, as obtained from Mr. John McCausland, a realtor at 16 Court Street, Brooklyn. This information was given by Robbins in his application for an apartment. The present address of Robbins is 5501 Fourteenth Avenue, Brooklyn, New York. His telephone number is Gedney 8-1111 under the name of Joseph Robbins at this address. Robbins was employed at the Sanderson and Porter Construction Company, 52 Williams Street, New York City from January 9, 1942, to October 20, 1942, as civil engineer; at M. W. Kellogg Construction

Sharpe, 30 Church Street, New York City, from June, 1943 to August, 1944; at Jakobson Shipyards Company, Oyster Bay, New York, August, 1944 to July, 1946; and, at Janke and Company, Jersey City, New Jersey, from July, 1946 to January, 1948.

The exact work performed by the above companies is not known at this time unless otherwise indicated above. The present employment of Robbins is not known by the New York Office.

Robbins received a Bachelor's Degree in civil engineering in February, 1941 from City College of New York. His description is given by the New York Office as age 34 (born February 3, 1916 in Brooklyn, New York); height 5'9" or 5'10"; weight 164 to 175 pounds; eyes blue; and hair brown. The photograph in question was secured from George G. Sharpe, one of the employers mentioned above and was taken in June, 1943. There is no record in the New York indices on the name Joseph Regenstreich.

ACTION:

The following instructions were given to the New York Office for immediate and intensive investigative attention:

- (1) Secure an up-to-date photograph of subject and forward copies to the Bureau and Boston for further identification purposes;
- (2) Make an immediate survey to see whether a technical surveillance can be placed;
- (3) Place a mail cover;
- (4) Institute an immediate discreet physical surveillance to determine the subject's activities, associates and contacts. Bearing in mind that unsub would normally be apprehensive over the publicity, attention should be paid to whether he is "hot." ~~TOP SECRET~~ **TOP SECRET** **TS** **u** **bl** **S**
- (5) Immediately ascertain the subject's present employment; and, **u**
- (6) Make every effort to ascertain whether Robbins has been associated with Abraham Brothman and others who, according to ~~TOP SECRET~~ **TOP SECRET** **TS** **u** **bl**

The vital importance of affording this case immediate attention was impressed on the New York Office. **bl**

Mr. Glenn Bethel, of Ottawa, called at 11:35 a.m. and advised that an article captioned "Spy Probe Listed Dr. Fuchs" appeared in the Ottawa Evening Journal on April 6, 1950. This article, the substance of which is that the British had admitted that they had received information from the Canadian authorities regarding Dr. Fuchs at the time this information became available to the Canadians during their investigation of espionage in 1946, is quoted:

"SPY PROBE LISTED DR. FUCHS"

"Ottawa Told London, Says External"

"An External Affairs Department spokesman for the first time confirmed today that the name of Dr. Klaus Fuchs, convicted in London of transmitting atomic secrets to the Russians, appeared in the notebook of one of the men examined in the Canadian espionage investigation in 1946.

"It appeared the Canadian authorities had intervened to correct statements made in the United Kingdom that British Security Services had not been informed about Fuchs by the Canadians.

"The spokesman said today that the name of Fuchs had been found in a notebook owned by a man examined by the Royal Commission on espionage.

"This man was an avid collector of names and the note of Fuchs was one of many," the spokesman said.

"I cannot say whether this man was one of those who was charged and faced trial."

"He added the Canadian Government was glad to see that a correction has been made in the United Kingdom to make clear the authorities there had been informed.

"Previous statements by Prime Minister Attlee and Lord Chancellor Jowitt in the United Kingdom might have left the impression that Canada had not bothered to pass on information on Fuchs, who had been in a concentration camp in Quebec before becoming engaged in top level secret atomic work.

"The name and all other evidence of this kind was made available by Canada to the United Kingdom and the United States," the spokesman said.

"If we had not done that we would have been derelict in our duty."

MEMORANDUM FOR MR. LADD

"Yesterday Lord Jowitt told the House of Lords that the name of Fuchs had been found in a notebook in Canada. He corrected a statement he made last week that there was no truth in press reports that the Canadians had given the British a copy of a diary containing Fuchs' name. Yesterday he said he had been imperfectly informed when he made that speech. His first statement had been similar to another made in the Commons by Mr. Attlee."

Mr. Bethel said he wanted the Bureau to have this information promptly inasmuch as the article indicated that not only was this information available to the United Kingdom, but also to the United States.

Gentlemen:

Many members of the Joint Committee feel strongly that the Fuchs confession and interview - copies of which you have transmitted to us - should be declassified and made public.

It is felt that the Soviet Union in all probability possesses the information contained in these documents, which are couched in fairly general terms in any event. Accordingly, publication would have the advantage of informing our people as to the extent of the increased danger which they confront as a result of the Fuchs affair - and in a democracy they would seem to be entitled to this information. Moreover, the Commission is experiencing difficulty in recruiting scientific and technical personnel needed in our own hydrogen project, and the Fuchs documents, if made public, might influence the needed people to make available their services. By the same token, publication might help create greater security consciousness among project employees.

Members of the Reactor Development Subcommittee, who visited the Argonne and Knolls Laboratories last week-end, have advised the full committee that publication of the Canadian report arising out of the case involving Dr. Allan Nunn May had a helpful effect upon our own people in stimulating them to take greater care in guarding classified information, and also in impressing them with the need for the utmost efforts on our part in order to retain atomic leadership.

For all such reasons as these, I request that careful consideration be given to the idea of declassifying and publishing the Fuchs documents, and that the Joint Committee be advised as soon as possible regarding such action as may be taken along these lines.

With reference to the attached communication from Senator Brien McMahon, I called him to advise that of course the Bureau could not remove the classification from the Fuchs confession. I told him that this would probably be something he would undoubtedly want to take up with the State Department.

In response to his inquiry, I told him that we still had not had the privilege of talking to Fuchs. McMahon stated he thought this was outrageous; that he was going to go to the State Department on declassifying the Fuchs confession and in addition was going to make a personal protest to the British Ambassador in the United States, whom he knows personally. He stated that after the revelations in the Canadian spy case the attitude in the scientific fraternity changed materially. He now feels that if the Fuchs confession could be made public that the scientists of the Hans Bethe type would be forced to get on a white horse and really go to work.
