In the investigation of Emil Julius Klaus Fuchs efforts have been made to have Fuchs interviewed by a representative of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. However, these efforts have been unsuccessful to date. ~~SECRET~~ (u)

Following the arrest of Fuchs, whose espionage activities were called to the attention of the British by the Federal Bureau of Investigation, an immediate request was made of the British Security Service to interview Fuchs for the purpose of identifying completely his espionage associates in the United States. At that time we were informed that no interview could be had until conclusion of the Fuchs trial. On March 1, 1950, the date on which the trial was concluded, we were informed that there could be no interrogation of Fuchs until the final disposition of Appeal, a period of 21 days. On March 8, 1950, Fuchs apparently decided against appeal and interview by British authorities commenced again. The British Home Office was not receptive to Federal Bureau of Investigation interrogation. ~~SECRET~~ (u)

On March 9, 1950, Sir Percy Sillitoe, British Security Service, advised that according to Sir Frank Newman, permanent Under-Secretary of State, the British Home Office would not be receptive to a formal request for a Federal Bureau of Investigation interrogation for the following reasons: ~~SECRET~~ (u)

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1. It is not policy to permit interviews with prisoners during the 21-day period in which appeal from sentence can be made as it is presumed that the prisoner may change his mind and file appeal at any time during that period;
2. There has been no final determination as to any permanent place of incarceration;
3. There are debate and Parliamentary questions pending in the House of Commons regarding this case.

Sir Percy Sillitoe indicated that the latter reason was probably the most important consideration to the Home Office, and indicated that the Home Office would not be receptive to any applications to interview Fuchs until these matters had been settled completely. His personal opinion was that the Home Office would view favorably a formal request through the State Department and the Foreign Office no earlier than one month from March 9, 1950, and very probably within two months. ~~SECRET~~ (u)

With respect to Sir Frank Newsam, the permanent Under-Secretary of State for the British Home Office, information has been received from a resident of London who had been in the company of Sir Newsam in November, 1947, to the effect that Newsam is violently anti-American, and has accused Americans of being barbarians. (u)

In connection with this matter we have requested the Attorney General to take up with the State Department our desire to interview Fuchs and to make formal application through the State Department and the British Home Office for such permission. ~~SECRET~~ (u)

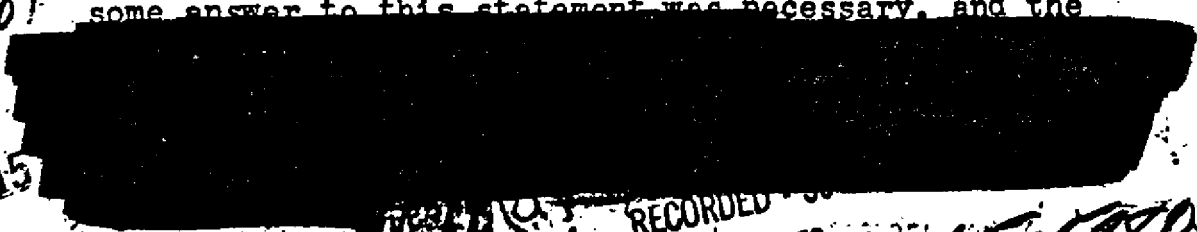

Reference is made to my telephone conversation with Mr. Al Belmont on the afternoon of March 21, 1950, relative to possible publicity that might result from a question directed to the Government in the Canadian Parliament. (u)

The Canadian Government apparently believes it will be subjected to questioning by the Opposition Party in Parliament relative to this case. The stand of the Government until this time has been to make no statement whatsoever about the Fuchs matter since it is a United States--U.K. case. However, there has been a reprint of an article under a London, England dateline of March 20, 1950, in which Prime Minister Attlee is attributed as having told the House of Commons that "the British Government had not received any warning from the Canadian Government regarding the case of Dr. Klaus Fuchs at the time of the Canadian Royal Commission on espionage in 1946." (u)

The Canadian Government apparently believed some answer to this statement was necessary, and the

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## Says Canada Did Not Warn About Fuchs

LONDON, March 20. — (CP) — Prime Minister Attlee said today the British Government had not received any warning from the Canadian Government regarding the case of Dr. Klaus Fuchs at the time of the Canadian Royal Commission on espionage in 1946. He was replying in the House of Commons to a question by Henry Strauss, Conservative member for Norwich South.

Fuchs, German-born British atomic scientist, recently was sentenced to 14 years' imprisonment for betraying Western atomic secrets to Russia.

There have been reports that United States authorities, who first discovered that Fuchs was giving secrets to Russia, received their first tip from the notebook of a Soviet agent who was investigated in connection with the Canadian spy ring.

In Ottawa there have been unofficial but reliable reports that Fuchs' name was in a notebook that came into the possession of the RCMP in their probe of the 1946 spy ring.

The name, however, was discovered only recently when it became known there was an atomic information leak in England and investigators began backchecking on all possible sources of information on spies, including material accumulated in the Canadian probe.

It was then that Fuchs' name came to light, apparently in a notebook. There has been no indication in Ottawa that the RCMP gave British intelligence a tip on Fuchs in 1946.

The purpose of this memorandum is to explain the phraseology appearing in the indictment to which Klaus Fuchs entered a plea of guilty on March 1, 1950. It will be recalled that the first count alleged a violation in Birmingham. *(u)*

Actually, the overt acts as we know them under American law would have been alleged as occurring in either London or Banbury, where the actual meetings with his Soviet contacts took place. The indictment, according to the Legal Advisor of MI-5, Mr. B. A. Hill, was drawn by a junior member of the staff of the Public Prosecutor on the basis of testimony in the record at the February 10 hearing in the Bow Street Magistrate's Court. The only place shown in the Bow Street hearings for the period covered by Count One of the indictment was Birmingham, England, where Fuchs resided at the time. *(u)*

In Count Four of the indictment, the act of espionage is alleged to have taken place in Berkshire. From the interrogation of Fuchs, it is known that the meetings with his Soviet contact during the period of this count of the indictment were in London and its immediate environs. Here again, the record of the Bow Street hearings showed for this period only that Fuchs was residing in Berkshire and was working at Harwell, which is likewise in Berkshire. *(u)*

Mr. Hill indicated that the counts in the indictment all mentioned places of residence rather than places of meetings, although it is noted that meetings actually did take place in New York (Count Two) and in Boston (Count Three) while Fuchs was temporarily residing in those general areas. *(u)*

The indictment is apparently good under English law and Fuchs has pleaded guilty to all counts and has been sentenced. *(u)*

### PURPOSE

To request that any information developed in an interview of Henry Paul Kalmus bearing upon his loyalty be furnished the Loyalty Section. It is noted that WFO was requested by letter dated March 8 to interview Kalmus who is the subject of a closed full field loyalty investigation. *(u)* *84-1*

### BACKGROUND

By memorandum dated March 8, 1950, from you to Mr. Ladd it is stated that the Washington Field Office received an anonymous telephone call on February 6, 1950, alleging that Henry Paul Kalmus, Physicist, National Bureau of Standards, was a Communist and a contact of Fuchs when Fuchs was in the United States. An attached letter to the Washington Field Office was approved which requested that Henry Paul Kalmus be interviewed for all information in his possession regarding Fuchs' contacts, activities, and background while Fuchs was in the United States. *(u)*

A loyalty investigation of Henry Paul Kalmus has been conducted and reports were furnished the Civil Service Commission on May 26, 1949, and September 21, 1949. (121-11071) *(u)*

### STATUS

Pending. *(u)*

### RECOMMENDATION

Since we have a closed loyalty investigation on Kalmus and since we are under a continuing obligation to furnish information bearing upon his loyalty to CSC, it is recommended that any information pertinent to his loyalty developed during the interview with Kalmus be furnished the Loyalty Section. The Loyalty Section should also be advised at that time whether such pertinent information developed in connection with the Foccase may be disseminated to CSC. *(u)*

Purpose:

To obtain authority to interview Dr. Hans von Hentig of the University of Colorado for all information he might possess concerning Fuchs. (u)

Background:

John Rindl, writer and former Tass correspondent in Vienna in the 1920's, has advised the New York Office that Dr. Hans von Hentig, now at the University of Colorado, formerly a professor at the University of Kiel, may have information concerning Fuchs' early life. Rindl described Von Hentig as a "German aristocrat, a liberal Social Democrat who was extremely interested in political subjects while at Kiel." It is noted Fuchs was at the University of Kiel as a student from the Fall of 1931 to the Spring of 1933, and

The Bureau files reflect that Von Hentig was born June 9, 1887, in Berlin, Germany, and is reported to be the brother of Georg von Hentig, the former German Consul General at San Francisco. Hans von Hentig appears to have been employed at the University of Kiel as a Professor of Criminal Law and Criminology for four years some time prior to 1935. He was the subject of a Bureau investigation under the character, Alien Enemy Control - G, during 1943. The investigation was discontinued in November, 1943, when Edward J. Ennis, then the Director of the Alien Enemy Control Unit, Department of Justice, advised that no further investigation was desired. It was reported during the investigation that Von Hentig was a German criminal who was ousted from Germany in 1935 because he opposed Hitler. (u)

From October to March (probably 1936-37) Von Hentig was employed at Yale University in connection with courses in Criminal Law. After this, he worked on the United States Attorney General's survey of criminal release procedure. His services with the Department terminated on June 30, 1938. From July, 1939, to August, 1943, he was employed jointly by the State of Colorado and the University of Colorado as Director of the Colorado Crime Survey and Special Consultant to the Governor of the State of Colorado on criminal law administration. For one semester in 1941-42, he worked as a visiting Professor of Sociology at the University of Iowa and in the Summer of 1943, he again became connected with the University of Iowa; this

time as a member of the staff of the Language Area Program, which was a part of the Military Government Program. He was relegated to a minor position in the curriculum and became very dissatisfied, and in February, 1944, information was received that his services with the University would terminate at the end of the academic year because the authorities were dissatisfied with his work. At that time, he was said to be negotiating for a position with the University of Puerto Rico, and it was felt he would accept a position at that University. (100-172589). (u)

In 1948, Von Hentig was employed as a Professor of Sociology at the University of Kansas City, Kansas City, Missouri, and at that time, was apparently a frequent contributor of leading articles and book reviews to the Journal of Criminal Law and Criminology of Northwestern University. (80-98-1274-12). (u)

During the 1943 investigation of Von Hentig, he was reported to be very hostile towards the Nazis. Dean Phillips of the University of Iowa said there was something in Von Hentig's makeup which caused Phillips to feel Von Hentig was not a loyal American. However, Phillips had no factual basis for this opinion. (u)

During the investigation, students of Von Hentig at the University of Iowa reported to an official of the University that they violently disliked him, and he was said to display the attitude of a persecuted refugee and the students felt he disliked America and American institutions. The students reported they obtained the impression that Von Hentig was strongly nationalistic and "looked down" on anything American or non-German. This impression was merely the students' interpretation of Von Hentig's attitude and Von Hentig had made no statement to substantiate this opinion on the part of the students. (100-172589-18). (u)

Von Hentig has written the Director on a number of occasions in connection with criminal statistics, and in the past he has been furnished with copies of the Uniform Crime Reports. In several of his letters he has emphasized that he was the principal scientific expert of the German Criminal Police and the highest German courts. He has received courteous non-committal replies from the Bureau. He furnished the Director a copy of his article entitled "The Suspect," which appeared in the May-June, 1948, issue of the Journal of Criminal Law and Criminology of Northwestern University. It is noted that Von Hentig used the Director's book, "Persons in Hiding," and Frederick L. Collins' book, "The FBI in Peace and War," on a number of occasions for material included in his article. His article is not critical of the Bureau. (80-98-1274-12). (u) 620

In February, 1945, [redacted] former confidential informant of the Philadelphia Office, furnished a copy of the article, "Communism and Nationalism," written by Ernst Boese, Hamburg, Germany, in 1930.

[redacted] described Boese as a Social Democrat. In his article, Boese described the opposition in Germany in the early twenties to the Disarmament Program, and in one instance, he refers to Dr. Hans Hentig as the leader of the Munich Nationalist Students and said Hentig wished to cooperate with the German Communist Party in the fight against disarmament. He said that Dr. Hans von Hentig became the military leader of the Red Army of Central Germany in 1923 at the time of preparation of the German Communist Party for the October revolution. Boese described the Red Army as having been dreamed up by more or less incapable "fools." [redacted] in identifying the Von Hentig spoken of by Boese, said he was at one time a Professor of Criminology at Kiel and Bonn, and in 1945 was living in Colorado. He remarked that the facts spoken of by Boese referred to Von Hentig's stormy youth. (100-72924-538, pp. 4-6). (u) b7D

In October, 1936, Gordon Dean, a Special Attorney with the Department of Justice, forwarded to the Bureau a recommendation he had received from Ernest S. Griffith, Dean of the American University Graduate School, suggesting that Von Hentig might possibly be used by the Bureau as a lecturer in the Bureau's police training school. Griffith believed that Von Hentig had been the most important man in Germany in the line of criminology and criminal law and noted that he was very active in writing on these subjects. (1-12-32). (u)

In January, 1943, the Denver Office of the Bureau interviewed Von Hentig in connection with an investigation of Fred Kurt Schaefer, who was under investigation for alleged pro-Nazi sympathies. The report reflecting the interview contained no information indicating Von Hentig was not cooperative. (100-165935-2). (u)

The New York Office has advised that one John Rindl, a writer and former Tass correspondent in Vienna in the 1920's, has said that he believes Dr. Hans Von Hentig, now a professor at the University of Colorado, may possess information concerning subject Fuchs. He said that Fuchs graduated from the University of Kiel in Germany, and that Von Hentig was a former professor at this university. He described Von Hentig as a German aristocrat, a liberal Social Democrat, who was extremely interested in political subjects at the University of Kiel. (u)

The report of Special Agent Eugene E. Bangs dated January 19, 1943, at Denver, Colorado, entitled "Fred Kurt Schaefer, Internal Security - G; Alien Enemy Control," reflects that the Denver Office interviewed Von Hentig in connection with the Schaefer investigation. (Denver File 100-2616) (100-165935-2) (u)

The Bureau files also reflect that Von Hentig was the subject of a Bureau investigation in 1943 under the character, Alien Enemy Control. Denver was Office of Origin, and the information is found in Denver file 100-3096. The investigation of Von Hentig was discontinued upon advice received from the Alien Enemy Control Unit of the Department of Justice that no further investigation was necessary, and it is noted that no action was taken against Von Hentig. The wife appeared to be of Italian ancestry and had lived and met TODARO in Rochester, New York. RITCHEY related that last summer he learned that TODARO was residing at 400 South Maine Street, Mt. Prospect, Illinois, and that he was working for the Toni Wave Company, Chicago, Illinois. TODARO has been employed by this company for about three or four years and reportedly supervised the construction of plants for the Toni Wave Company in one or more European countries. (u)

Mrs. DYER checked the American Institute of Chemical Engineers membership book for the year 1948, which reflected TODARO resided at 1486 Sheldon Avenue, St. Paul, Minnesota, as of that time. Mrs. DYER advised she did not recall TODARO when he was at the University. (u)

The Engineering College files reflected TODARO entered the University from Rochester High School in February of 1935 and received his degree in chemical engineering in 1939, September. The files of the New Haven Office reflect that by letter dated April 20, 1943 entitled "PAULA S. KENT, INFORMATION CONCERNING", the Miami Office made available to the New Haven Office a photostatic copy of a letter dated 4/4/42 from one WALTER ROSENBERG, Havana, Cuba, to Mrs. PAULA S. KENT, 26 West Putnam Avenue, Greenwich, Conn. This letter was written in German and was intercepted at the Postal Censorship Station, Miami, Fla. The letter was forwarded by the Miami Office to New Haven because of the unusual phrasing of the letter, and contained the following phraseology: (u)

"The son of my partner was supposed to cable my friend HUGO GUTHMANN just like you and, as a matter of fact, it has to do with the same thing that you attended to for Juvie (?). I want to ask you to ask him at once whether he has attended to the matter, in case it was not yet undertaken, be so good as to have it given to you, and when you come to us you can bring it along. His address is Theo Halten, New York City, 306 West 100 Str. Apt. 62 Telephone Riverside 3189. In case it is not yet settled (or done) be very positive with him for I believe it is very necessary!!! In no instance let yourself be talked down. I beg you to cable Hugh at once, how far the thing has gone for I intend to give you otherwise new instructions before your departure to us." (u)

The report of SA DONALD F. NEMITZ (A) made at New Haven 1/15/43 entitled "PAULA S. that Mrs. KENT was interested in a family reportedly of Jewish origin who left Germany and resided for a while in Switzerland. Mrs. KENT reportedly made the financial arrangements for their passage to the United States through the New York Office of the Royal Bank of Canada, and this family had sailed from Lisbon, Portugal and were denied entrance to the United States, landing at Havana, Cuba. Mrs. KENT went to Cuba in the latter part of April, 1942 and stayed there for several days. (u)

The report of SA ALBERT SPENCER made at New Haven 4/29/43 in the same case reflects investigation developed that Mrs. KENT forwarded a check in the amount of \$3,000 to HUGO GUTHMANN to finance entry to the United States of one JUCZI KOHN. (u)

Report of SA ALBERT SPENCER made at New Haven 6/9/43 reflected that PAULA S. KENT has the alias of PAULA S. KLEIN. This report reflected an interview conducted by agents of the New Haven Office with Mrs. KENT at which time she advised that she was born in Hamburg, Germany in 1897 and had married one ~~MAX KLEIN~~, deceased. She stated she was general European representative for the Kayzer Hosiery Co. of New York; that she had two children, DAISY ~~KLEIN~~, presently residing with her husband ALDEN P. SULLIVAN, Captain in the U.S. Army, and a son HERBERT ~~KLEIN~~ age eighteen, a student. She claimed United States citizenship through her parents and through the fact that she had married an American citizen. (u)

With respect to the money sent to Havana, Cuba, she stated she had sent that money to HUGO GUTHMANN for the expenses of JURSI KOHN, a Jewish refugee whom she was attempting to bring to the United States. She advised that Miss KOHN was then residing in Havana, Cuba, staying with WALTER ROSENBERG and working as a dress designer. (u)

The above information is being forwarded to the Bureau and to New York in view of the fact that one WALTER ROSENBERG may have been the unknown contact of the suspected agent in the FOOCASE inasmuch as one WALTER ROSENBERG resides at 44 Soundview Drive, Greenwich, Conn. (u)

The personnel file of the Oak Ridge National Laboratory, made available by Mr. RIORDAN, sets forth pertinent information as to background. While employed by the Fercleve Corporation from September 1, 1944 to September 1945, he held the position of Director of Plant Control Laboratory, S-50 project. He began with Monsanto Laboratory (Clinton Laboratories X-10) in September of 1945 at which time the S-50 project was discontinued. (u)

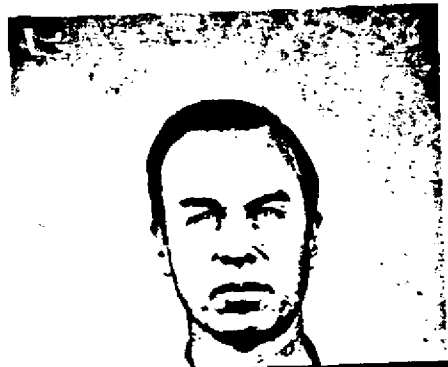

The file also reflects that BENJAMIN SCHWARTZMAN has a daughter named GERTRUDE SCHWARTZMAN and it is believed she may be identical with G. SCHWARTZMAN, listed as the subscriber. (u)

By letter dated August 19, 1940 the Los Angeles Office advised that one HENRY J. BASZOZOWSKY came to their office and advised that he had formerly been a member of the Communist Party in Bayonne, New Jersey and had gone to Spain to fight in the Spanish Civil War. He stated at that time that he had dropped out of the Party in 1935 and had nothing further to do with it except that one ALEX SCHWARTZMAN of New York City contacted him in Bayonne some time during 1937. He stated that SCHWARTZMAN was a mail carrier in Bayonne at that time and that he had been induced to accompany SCHWARTZMAN to Spain. SCHWARTZMAN was severely wounded in Spain and, according to BASZOZOWSKY, the Communist Party has been taking care of SCHWARTZMAN since his return. (u)

Mr. HUGH L. SHAW, Senior Partner of Allied Process Engineers, 91 Halsey Street, Newark, New Jersey, advised that JOSEPH ARNOLD ROBBINS was hired by his company on March 15, 1948 as a draftsman and resigned on October 22, 1948. SHAW stated that ROBBINS was not employed at their Newark office but at their office located at 86 Trinity Place, New York City. According to SHAW, ROBBINS was given a job with his company through the intercession of EDUARD NAPOLITANO who was also a former employee of Allied Process Engineers. Subsequently NAPOLITANO tried to entice a group of employees of Allied Process Engineers to quit this company and form a rival engineering company. SHAW stated that it was under these conditions that NAPOLITANO and ROBBINS resigned. (u)

Mr. SHAW suggested that ALBERT HALOWELL, Office Manager of their New York Company be contacted for additional information concerning ROBBINS. The Allied Process Engineers is presently engaged in work on classified contracts and was engaged in such work during ROBBINS' employment but SHAW stated that ROBBINS never worked on classified contracts but rather on projects such as power plants and bridges. 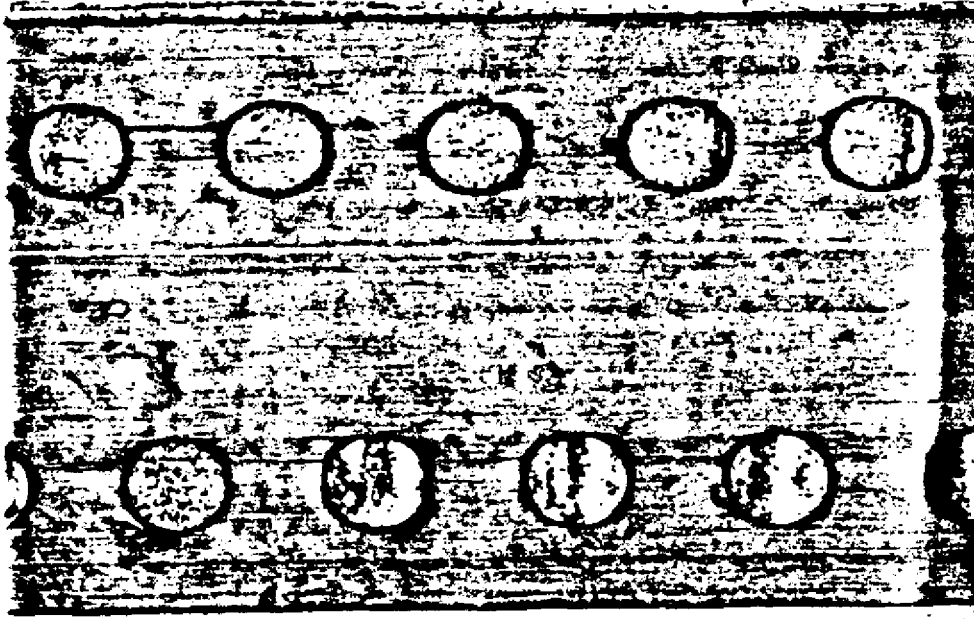
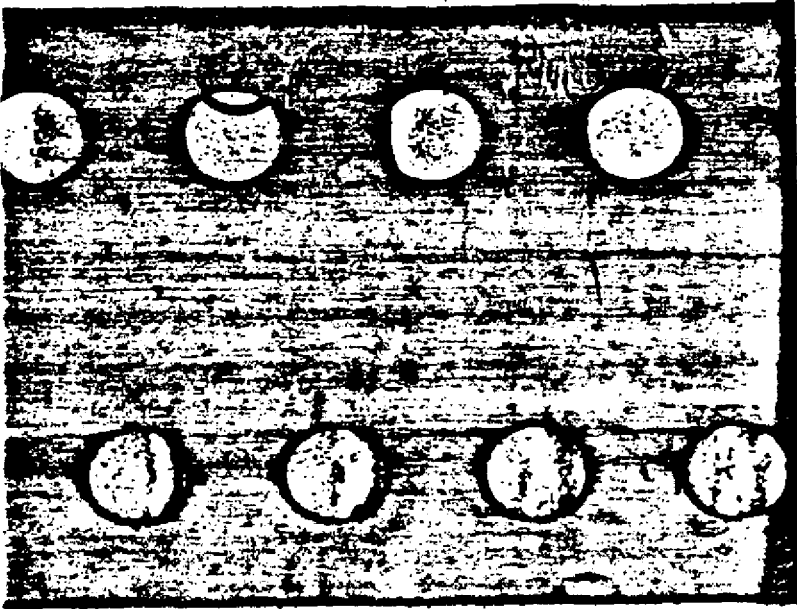

In accordance with the suggestion of the Bureau that consideration be given to interviewing ABRAHAM BROTHMAN in connection with this case, the following information concerning BROTHMAN and some of his associates is herewith set forth. BROTHMAN, it is pointed out, has been identified by [redacted] and who was handled by the same agent that reported on the activities of Dr. EMIL J. K. FUCHS. **TOP SECRET (S)**

MRS ABRAHAM BROTHMAN was born on August 15, 1918, at New York City. He was married on June 15, 1937, to NAOMI BROTHMAN, and presently resides at 41-08 42nd Street, Sunnyside, Long Island, New York. BROTHMAN was educated in New York City schools and was graduated from Columbia University in 1933 with the degree of chemical engineer. BROTHMAN's father, HARRY BROTHMAN, resides at 1565 Townsend Avenue, Bronx, New York with his sister, MRS. BEATRICE BROTHMAN SCHNEE.

BROTHMAN during the period 1938 to 1942 conducted a company known as the REPUBLIC CHEMICAL MACHINERY CO., which performed designing work on chemical machines. This company held patents on several machines which were manufactured by the HENDRICK MANUFACTURING CO. of Carbondale, Pa. These machines were vats, kettles, mixers, etc., used commercially. BROTHMAN, accordingly, received most of his income from HENDRICKS.

In June, 1942, BROTHMAN severed his connections with REPUBLIC CHEMICAL and with HENDRICKS and became associated with HENRY A. GOLWYNNE and ARTHUR PHINEAS WEBER in the CHEMURGY DESIGN CORPORATION of 420 Lexington Avenue, New York City. BROTHMAN was vice president of this organization.

While with the CHEMURGY DESIGN CORPORATION, BROTHMAN did work for the TEDLEE CHEMICAL CORPORATION and the REGAL CHEMICAL CORPORATION. In the course of his work with these two concerns, [redacted]

BROTHMAN developed an automatic machine for filling Aerosol Bombs in the field and a valve for Aerosol Dispensers, and also developed a process for making DDT. Because of contract difficulties in this organization, BROTHMAN broke off his connections with the CHEMURGY DESIGN CORPORATION.

In August, 1944, BROTHMAN organized his own firm, ABRAHAM BROTHMAN & ASSOCIATES, 114 East 32nd Street, New York City, and later moved its offices to 29-28 41st Street, Long Island City, where he is presently located. His partners in this firm at the time it was organized were EMIL Z. BARIISH, GERHARD WOLLAN, OSCAR J. VAGO and JULES KORCHIEN. However, BROTHMAN's only associate at the present time is MIRIAM MOSKOWITZ, who was formerly BROTHMAN's secretary.

The firm of ABRAHAM BROTHMAN & ASSOCIATES is engaged in developing work for firms in the U. S. and certain foreign countries including China. The firm is listed by Dun & Bradstreet as experienced chemical engineers.

BROTHMAN first came to the attention of this office as a result of the allegations made by ELIZABETH T. BENTLEY. She stated in about May, 1940, JACOB GOLOS had introduced her to one ABE BROTHMAN. BENTLEY stated that she recalled from the early summer of 1940 until the fall of 1940, she had met BROTHMAN about ten times to obtain blueprints from him. On other occasions, BROTHMAN was contacted by GOLOS. These meetings between BENTLEY and BROTHMAN frequently took place in front of the MOSLU SAFE CO., 32nd Street and 5th Avenue, New York City. BENTLEY and BROTHMAN would then have dinner together, and during the course of the dinner, BROTHMAN would turn over certain blueprints to BENTLEY. She has stated since that on several occasions the prints which BROTHMAN had given her were copies which he had made from the originals. However, on some occasions BROTHMAN gave her originals which she in turn had to have copied and subsequently returned the originals to BROTHMAN at the next or a later meeting.

BENTLEY stated sometime during the course of these meetings, she learned from either BROTHMAN or GOLOS that these blueprints were of commercial kettles, which she understood pertained to some type of a commercial vat.

Sometime during the fall of 1940, according to BENTLEY, GOLOS told her that he was becoming somewhat disgusted in his dealings

with BROTHMAN and told her that he was going to turn BROTHMAN over to someone else. BENTLEY stated that she never learned from GOLOS or anyone else to whom BROTHMAN was then directed. BROTHMAN, however, stated to Agents of this office when he was interviewed in May, 1947, that at the time his association with ELIZABETH BENTLEY was terminated, he was contacted by HARRY GOLD. GOLD said that he was sent to BROTHMAN by GOLOS. GOLD then, according to BROTHMAN, began picking up prints until the early part of 1942.

BROTHMAN has stated that although GOLD did not pick up any prints subsequent to 1942, that they did stay in contact with each other and that GOLD was hired by BROTHMAN in 1942 as a chemist and is presumably still so-employed.

It appears from the information available concerning these transactions that BENTLEY and GOLOS were under the impression that BROTHMAN was supplying them with blueprints of greater importance than these prints actually were, that is, it appears that GOLOS became disgusted in his dealings with BROTHMAN at about the same time that he learned that these prints were of strictly commercial value.

Relative to BROTHMAN's associations with both BENTLEY and GOLOS, it is pointed out that BROTHMAN testified before the Special Grand Jury sitting in the Southern District of New York on July 22, 1947. BROTHMAN stated that he first met GOLOS in the early part of 1940, at which time GOLOS had stated that he was connected with the Soviet Purchasing Commission and was in a position to obtain contracts for BROTHMAN. BROTHMAN stated that he had invented a piece of machinery at about this time, the said piece to be used in commercial processes. GOLOS wanted copies of the prints of this invention, and BROTHMAN readily turned them over to him.

BROTHMAN then stated before the Grand Jury that shortly after that, GOLOS came to see him at his office about every week to find out if there was anything new in his invention or any new equipment, improvements or new applications. About six months later, or roughly in the summer of 1940, BROTHMAN stated GOLOS introduced him to a woman whom he knew only as "Helen". HELEN, of course, was ELIZABETH T. BENTLEY.

After introducing BROTHMAN to BENTLEY, GOLOS never contacted BROTHMAN again, so BROTHMAN testified. BENTLEY, however, continued her association with BROTHMAN until approximately the spring of 1941. BROTHMAN would bring copies of drawings, blueprints, et cetera, to the aforementioned meeting place on Fifth Avenue, New York City. BROTHMAN's explanation for meeting BENTLEY on the street was that he was busy during the day at his office and did not like to be disturbed, and that it was more convenient for him to meet BENTLEY in the above manner.

Relative to the associates of BENTLEY mentioned so far in this letter, the following information concerning them is set out.

Re HARRY GOLD:

It is noted that GOLOS first contacted BROTHMAN, and that as soon as GOLOS directed BENTLEY to BROTHMAN, GOLOS never contacted BROTHMAN again. Then when HARRY GOLD first contacted BROTHMAN, presumably sent by GOLOS, BENTLEY never contacted BROTHMAN again.

GOLD was interviewed on May 29, 1947 by Agents of the New York Office. GOLD stated that he was born December 12, 1910 in Switzerland, and that he came to the U. S. in 1914 with his parents SAM and CELIA GOLD, both of whom were born in Russia.

GOLD attended night school at the Drexel Institute in Philadelphia, the University of Pennsylvania, and Columbia University, and Xavier University in Cincinnati, Ohio, from which he received a degree of Bachelor of Science summa cum laude in 1940.

From 1929 until the time he joined ABRAHAM BROTHMAN ASSOCIATES, GOLD was employed by the PENNSYLVANIA SUGAR COMPANY in their laboratories at Philadelphia, Pa.

GOLD, when interviewed by Agents of this office and when testifying before the Grand Jury, gave substantially the same information concerning his association with BROTHMAN as BROTHMAN had given.

Re EMIL Z. BARISH

BARISH was born May 8, 1916, in the United States (exact birthplace not known). Both of his parents were born in Russia. He is presently employed as chief engineer at the INDUSTRIAL PROCESS ENGINEERS CO.,

Newark, New Jersey. He is known to have been a member of the Communist Party in San Francisco and also in New York. BARISH was graduated from the University of California in 1938 with a Mechanical Engineering Degree.

Re OSCAR J. VAGO:

VAGO was born in 1898 in Budapest, Hungary. He entered the United States in 1933 and was naturalized 1938. He is a member of the Rego Park Club of the Communist Party.

Re GERHARD N. WOLLAN:

WOLLAN was born June 27, 1910 at Glenwood, Minnesota. He was employed by the HOME LIFE INSURANCE COMPANY in New York City from July 1, 1936 to December 12, 1941. He received an A.B. Degree from Luther College, Decorah, Iowa in 1931, and a Master of Science Degree from the University of Iowa in 1936. He was employed by the U. S. Navy Yard, Brooklyn, as an associate physicist from July 1, 1942, to February, 1944.

A Confidential Informant, of known reliability, advised on March 14, 1945, that WOLLAN, a physicist engaged in war work and of Norwegian descent, held Communist Political Association Card #26216 in the Kensington Club of the CPA in Brooklyn, New York.

Re JULES KORCHIEN:

KORCHIEN was born November 25, 1904, at Rochester, New York. His parents were born in Russia. By profession, he is an architect and civil engineer. KORCHIEN is a known Communist Party member and is a contact of numerous Communists and suspected Communists in New York City.

Relative to the individuals mentioned above, it would appear that any of them could possibly be identical with the Unknown Subject and this should definitely be borne in mind in an interview with BROTHMAN.

With respect to HARRY GOLD, for instance, it is obvious that GOLD was operating as a Soviet Agent, and at one time was definitely handling BROTHMAN. The known facts concerning [redacted] are not contradictory in any major portion to the information available concerning HARRY GOLD. (u) TOP SECRET

BROTHMAN's political philosophy, it would appear, is or most certainly has been Communistic. This is shown by the fact that many of the associates of BROTHMAN are Communists or have Communistic tendencies. It is pointed out that on March 5, 1946, a confidential Informant advised that in a discussion between BROTHMAN and an individual known to Informant only as "SERTRUDE", BROTHMAN stated concerning a recent speech by WINSTON CHURCHILL, that throughout the capitalist world today is the full knowledge that they could not engage in a war with the Soviet Union, and that the people of the capitalist nations would not follow their leaders in such a venture. BROTHMAN stated the prestige of America and the British Empire has fallen very cheaply, and it has been clearly described that these countries are out for the sole purpose of enslaving the rest of the world.

Also, in early 1946, BROTHMAN spent about two weeks at FRED BRIEHL's Farm in upper New York State. BRIEHL is a well known Communist, known to have registered with the Communist Party, and to have run for elective offices on the Communist Party ticket. He is reported to hold a high position in the state organization of the Party.

When BROTHMAN was interviewed by Agents of this office in May, 1947, he was shown pictures of HELEN BENTLEY and JACOB GOLOS. BROTHMAN at first denied that he knew her. However, when he was confronted with certain inescapable facts, he readily admitted their identity and described his connections with them. The Agents who interviewed him stated that he became very cooperative, but very nervous.

It would appear, accordingly, that BROTHMAN would have to be confronted with certain definite facts in an interview or be given to understand that the Bureau is in possession of very definite information. This could be done without in any way revealing or jeopardizing the original informant. It should be borne in mind that BROTHMAN is conducting his own business in which he presumably has all of his capital invested.

It is noted that the Federal Grand Jury handled by Mr. T. J. DONEGAN is to convene February 23, 1950 at New York City, at which time it is anticipated that persons allegedly connected with espionage activities will be called before it. The conviction of ALGER HISS has rather dramatically brought out the penalty for perjury before a Federal Grand Jury.

The recent publicity on the FUCHS matter undoubtedly lends to uneasiness on the part of BROTHMAN and is a further factor indicating the propriety of an interview with BROTHMAN at this time.

It is felt that an interview with BROTHMAN would in no way jeopardize this case insofar as the identification of the unknown agent is concerned. It is also believed that even in the event BROTHMAN refused to give any information, that nothing would be lost by an interview of him, and possibly he would subsequently become cooperative.

It is, accordingly, the recommendation of this office that ABRAHAM BROTHMAN be interviewed. In order to provide the proper ammunition for the interview, intensive investigation and research will be conducted for the next two weeks regarding BROTHMAN'S activities, past and present, after which the interview will be conducted if Bureau authority is granted.

In an attempt to obtain information regarding MARION GORDON MASTIN, the following agencies and organizations were contacted with negative results:

Mr. ROBERT E. O'CONNELL, JR., Postmaster, Redwood City, advised that his records reflected that one M. G. MASTIN had rented Post Office Box 93 from 1935 to 1939 but that the original rental application had been destroyed. Mr. O'CONNELL was unable to furnish any additional information regarding this individual.

The records of the Pacific Gas and Electric Company reflect that one M. G. MASTIN purchased gas and electrical service at 529 Sapphire Street, Redwood City and the service was discontinued on November 19, 1945. These records contained no additional information regarding MASTIN.

The records of the Registrar of Voters, San Mateo County Court House, reflect that Mrs. VERNIE L. MASTIN, 529 Sapphire Street, Redwood City, California, registered as a voter on June 30, 1944. She was described as born in Boddle, South Dakota; 5'3"; a housewife and registered as a Democrat. The above registration was canceled January 2, 1947 due to the fact that the registrant did not exercise her voting privilege during the year 1946.

Mrs. SALLIE ROBERTSON, 529 Sapphire Street, Redwood City, advised that she owns the above property and rented same to Mrs. VERNIE MASTIN from approximately April, 1941 to 1945. Mrs. ROBERTSON stated that Mrs. MASTIN resided alone during the above period; that Mr. MASTIN was employed as an engineer or scientist at an atomic bomb project believed located at Oak Ridge, Tennessee. Prior to Mrs. MASTIN's residence at 529 Sapphire Street in Redwood City, she resided in the State of Virginia and prior to that residence she

resided on Woodside Road in Redwood City and in Graystone Park near San Carlos, California. Mrs. ROBERTSON also advised that Mrs. ~~NANCY ADAMS~~ <sup>*Martin*</sup> (Mrs. JAMES ADAMS) is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. MASTIN and is presently residing in San Carlos, California, formerly having resided in Redwood City, California. It is Mrs. ROBERTSON's belief that Mrs. MASTIN divorced her husband in 1945, the divorce being handled by PAUL McCARTHY, attorney, 234 Marshall Street, Redwood City, California. Mrs. ROBERTSON also remembered that Mrs. MASTIN moved to Watsonville, California and is believed to be presently residing either in Santa Cruz or Aptos, California. During the period April 19, 1941 to November, 1945, Mrs. MASTIN was not a resident of Redwood City.

Mr. PAUL McCARTHY, attorney, 234 Marshall Street, Redwood City, advised that he certified a record of a Reno, Nevada divorce for Mrs. VERNIE MASTIN, which decree was filed in Reno, Nevada on July 14, 1945. Mr. McCARTHY said that he had never met Mr. MASTIN who he understood was employed as an engineer or chemist at the atomic bomb installation in Oak Ridge, Tennessee.

Mr. PAUL McCARTHY's file reflects a letter received from the U. S. Veterans Administration bearing File 9CDC-2, regarding a change in beneficiary of Mr. MASTIN's Veterans Insurance Policy. In addition to the above file number, the numbers FK275-165, K882-405 were typed directly under the above file number. Mr. McCARTHY advised that Mr. MASTIN was listed as employed in 1946 by the Hardsty Chemical Company, Henderson, Nevada, his address being listed as of March 27, 1947 as Boulder City, Nevada. Mrs. MASTIN's address was listed as care of NANCY ADAMS, 472 Quartz Street, Redwood City, California and later in January, 1947 was listed as Route 2, Box 719K, Watsonville, California.

The San Francisco indices reflect that a non-specific complaint was received from one M. G. MASTIN, P. O. Box 93, Redwood City on February 10, 1937. No additional information is recorded for this individual.
