PURPOSE

To advise what is being done to identify Unsub, was [redacted]

FACTS

Available information concerning [redacted] has come from three sources, namely [redacted] subject Fuchs, and Robert and Kristel Heineman. The information is meager and very general in nature, so much so as to fit numerous individuals in the United States. Of course, further information from any of these sources would be most helpful. *T.S. u*

- Inasmuch as Robert Heineman expressed the belief that [redacted] began with the letters "Rob" and his first name was "Joseph," a complete check of these names against the Bureau's indices was made. This check developed Joseph Arnold Robbins as a suspect and, accordingly, a photograph was obtained and shown to the Heinemans and Fuchs. The Heinemans failed to identify the photograph, but Fuchs selected it from a group and stated that he was pretty sure the person pictured was the man he had met in the United States. Subsequently, however, "1950" surveillance photographs of Robbins were shown to Fuchs and he rejected them. Furthermore, Robert Heineman personally viewed Robbins in New York City and stated that Robbins definitely was not the man. In this connection it should be noted that since Fuchs has admitted having met his contact in the Heineman home, it is apparent that the person known to the Heinemans is identical with Fuchs' contact, [redacted]. Investigation of Robbins has been continuing because available information [redacted] is not sufficient for a definite identification or elimination. Most recently, records of all absences of Robbins from employment during the pertinent period were obtained and it appears that Robbins, who was frequently absent by reason of illness, was not working on any of the significant dates, with one exception -- namely June, 1945, at which time [redacted] visited Fuchs at Santa Fe, New Mexico, according to Fuchs. However, in July, 1945, Robbins was absent from work for a sufficient period to have made a trip to Santa Fe and, accordingly, if Fuchs happened to be wrong in his recollection of the date, Robbins would have been free to make all of the known contacts. Current investigation of Robbins is to determine his present activity and to develop his past activity and whereabouts. *T.S. u*

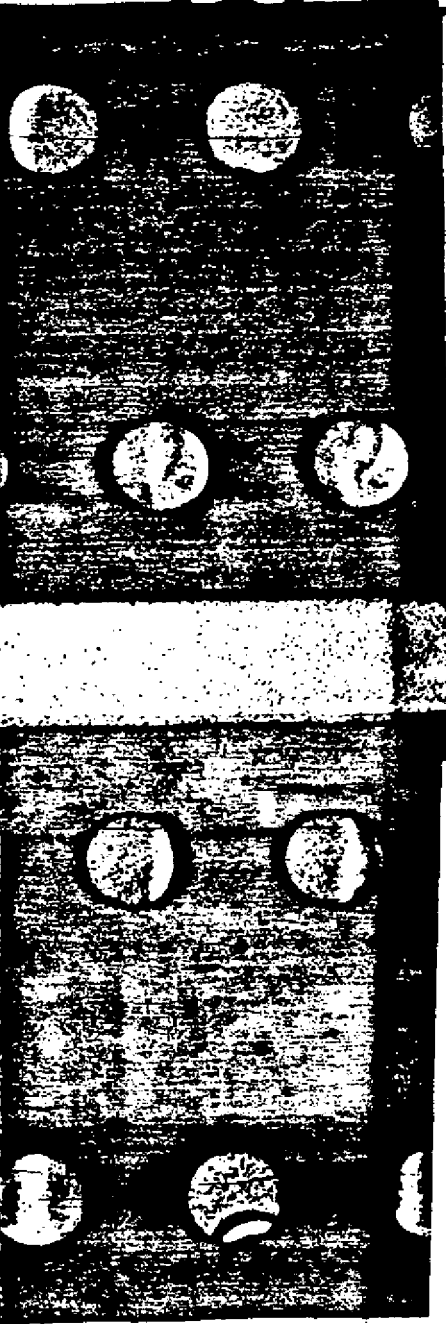

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The Rochester Democrat & Chronicle under date of March 5, 1950 carried a picture of DR. DONALD RANDOLPH CHARLES. Copies of this photograph have been obtained and are being submitted to the Bureau and the New York and Boston Offices. (u)

Dr. ROBERT EUGENE MARSHAK, who is now the Chairman of the Physics Department, River Campus, University of Rochester, Rochester, New York, stated that from the middle of 1943 until about May 1944 he was employed by the Canadian Government doing confidential Research work at one of the Laboratories operated by the Canadian Government. In May of 1944 he advised he communicated with Dr. HANS BETHE, who at that time was doing Confidential United States Government work at Los Alamos, New Mexico and inquired of Dr. BETHE whether he, MARSHAK, could be used by Dr. BETHE at Los Alamos, in view of his knowledge and training in the field of Nuclear Physics. As a result of this request, Dr. BETHE requested that ROBERT MARSHAK come immediately to Los Alamos, where his services could be utilized by the project. To the best of MARSHAK's recollection, he arrived at Los Alamos in May 1944 and was directly connected with the research relative to the atom bomb until April 1946, at which time he returned to the University of Rochester. (u)

Dr. MARSHAK could not state definitely whether the subject was already present at Los Alamos when he arrived, or whether the subject came after he had assumed his duties with Dr. BETHE. He does recall, however, that he is of the opinion that the subject, FUCHS, had previously spent sometime in New York City prior to his coming to Los Alamos. MARSHAK could not be more specific in this regard, nor give any information as to FUCHS's duties in New York, length of his stay in that city, nor the nature of his work, except to state that he believed that this work was being done in conjunction with Dr. RUDOLPH PEIERLS, an English Scientist, who had come to this country at the request of American authorities. (u)

While Dr. MARSHAK was with the Theoretical Physics Division at Los Alamos, he was assigned to Group #2 while the subject, FUCHS, was assigned to group #1. According to the Doctor, although, the members of each group knew in a general way the work being done by the other groups, they were not specifically acquainted with the nature of that work and consequently, he, MARSHAK, did not have a very close connection with Dr. FUCHS while they were both at Los Alamos. He did state, however, that any member of the Theoretical Physics Division at Los Alamos would be in possession of a large amount of confidential and valuable information relative to atomic energy. He was not acquainted with the specific duties of subject FUCHS while he was at Los Alamos in view of the fact that they were members of two different groups. (u)

Concerning the social life at the project, Dr. MARSHAK stated that both he and his wife RUTH, who was also at the project for

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a considerable period of time and associated with FUCHS on numerous occasions. Some of these occasions would be picnics or outings arranged by various individuals who were working at the project and in addition, he knows that on several occasions FUCHS was a member of groups which went from the project to nearby cities for the purpose of shopping. Each individual at the project, according to Dr. MARSHAK, was given one day off per month to do his shopping and that frequently all the individuals who had that particular day off would arrange to go to a nearby city to do their shopping and then return later on in the day. In addition, they frequently formed small groups which attended movies which were furnished by the Army and which were shown at the base and on infrequent occasions entertained each other at their apartments by means of dinners or small gatherings in the evening. As a result of his association with FUCHS while they were both at the project, Dr. MARSHAK stated that he knew of no close friend which FUCHS had during this period and knows of no individual whom he contacted except project personnel. In addition, he added FUCHS never did or said anything to cause him, MARSHAK, to have any reason to believe that he was engaged in any espionage activities. He stated definitely that FUCHS never did, to the best of his recollection, try to obtain information from him relative to his, MARSHAK's duties at the project. (u)

Relative to FUCHS background, the Dr. stated he recalls FUCHS having made some statement concerning his sister having committed suicide, although, the sister was never identified, nor was any mention made of the circumstances surrounding the suicide, nor the time nor the place of its occurrence. He remembers that FUCHS was rather highly regarded in Scientific circles in England and as a result of his ability in the field of Physics, he was brought to this country by Dr. RUDOLPH PEIERLS, who was a very well known English Scientist. (u)

Dr. MARSHAK advised that immediately after the recent publicity relative to FUCHS' espionage activities, both he and his wife RUTH on several occasions discussed the subject for the purpose of trying to recall some statement made by the subject or some action performed by him which would indicate possible espionage activities on his part. On all of these occasions, both he and his wife failed to recall any instant which could possibly be associated with espionage or disloyal activities. (u)

Dr. MARSHAK stated that in the Spring of 1948 or 1949, he could not remember the exact date, FUCHS telephonically contacted him from Ithaca, N.Y. and advised him that he, FUCHS, was in this country for the purpose of attending a declassification meeting concerning atomic energy matters and had come to Ithaca for the purpose of visiting Dr. HANS BETHE, who was associated with the Physics Department of Cornell University. Dr. MARSHAK requested FUCHS to visit him

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in Rochester. FUCHS immediately accepted the invitation and came by bus from Ithaca, New York to Rochester, New York and was met at the bus station by Dr. MARSHAK and his wife RUTH. He arrived in the city early in the evening and the three immediately had dinner at the Howard Johnson Restaurant in Rochester. Immediately after the dinner, Dr. MARSHAK and his wife drove the subject to the Rochester junction of the Lehigh Valley Railroad where FUCHS boarded a train for Chicago. During this visit, the subject did not state the reason for his travelling to Chicago, nor did he mention whom he intended to contact in that city. During this period FUCHS did not try to obtain any information relative to Atomic energy and Dr. MARSHAK did not question FUCHS concerning these matters for fear of making Fuchs refuse to answer questions for security reasons. Dr. MARSHAK stated that in this connection, Scientists who are working on classified matters have formed the habit of not questioning each other relative to their activities, because it puts the other person in an embarrassing position. (u)

During the dinner FUCHS mentioned CHALK RIVER, however Dr. MARSHAK could not recall whether FUCHS had already been to CHALK RIVER or whether he intended to go there before he returned to England. He is of the opinion that FUCHS had already attended the declassification conference before he arrived in Rochester and consequently, he does not believe that FUCHS went to Chicago in connection with the declassification conference. (u)

Dr. MARSHAK further stated that just before Christmas of 1948, his wife RUTH sent a box of Christmas candy to the subject at Harwell, England and that under date of January 30, 1949 the subject wrote to him at the University of Rochester thanking him for the candy and discussed the possible publication of some material relative to atomic energy, which had previously been declassified. This letter, which is in the subject's handwriting, is being sent as an enclosure with this report to the Bureau. (u)

Dr. MARSHAK stated that his only personal contact with the subject was while they were both working at Los Alamos, and during the subject's visit to Rochester, New York, mentioned above. He added that to the best of his knowledge, the subject had not contacted any individual while at Los Alamos, who was not an employee of the project. He explained his lack of information relative to the subject's background by saying that although they were both working at the project in the theoretical physics Division they were members of different groups and had little if any contact during working hours. After working hours, he and his wife on numerous occasions did have periodical social contact with the subject but usually on these occasions, the conversation was never directed towards the work being done at the project, but rather towards run

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of the mill topics of conversations which were of current interest as a result of newspaper publicity. (u)

It is noted that Dr. MARSHAK stated that FUCHS proceeded to Chicago, Illinois from Rochester after visiting MARSHAK in the summer of 1948 or 1949. Referenced New York teletype dated February 25, 1950 reflects that FUCHS' sister is of the opinion that UNKNOWN SUBJECT [redacted] came to Boston from the Chicago area. It is not known by this office whether FUCHS has been questioned concerning this trip to Chicago or its purpose, nor the identity of any contacts made there by him. (S)(u) b1

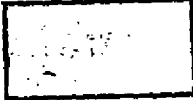

addition to Fuchs, who was the most logical suspect on the basis of information set out hereinafter in this letter, the British Mission in New York City included Dr. Rudolf Ernst Peierls, Christopher Frank Kearton, and Tony Hilton Boyle Skyrme. Investigation was instituted immediately to single out, if possible, which of the four members of the British Mission might be the responsible party by means of developing information concerning them and comparing it with the meager facts made available by the original informant. After we had furnished British Security Authorities with the name of Dr. Fuchs on September 22, 1949, as the individual believed to be responsible for the disclosures of atomic secrets to the Russians, they advised on October 29, 1949, that they concurred in our belief and that they contemplated interviewing Fuchs. On December 22, 1949, they reported that on the previous day Fuchs had been interviewed, but had flatly denied he had acted as an espionage agent. On January 31, 1950, the British advised that under protracted re-interrogation Fuchs had confessed to continuous espionage from the end of 1941 to February, 1949.

On October 21, 1949, a letter was directed by me to the Atomic Energy Commission, attention Dr. S. A. Holander, Jr., advising that an espionage investigation was being conducted regarding Fuchs, who was then employed as the senior research worker at the Atomic Energy Research Establishment, Harwell, England. In this letter there was set forth information reflecting that the name of Fuchs appeared in the address book of Israel Halperin and in a captured German document.

With respect to Israel Halperin, documents abstracted from the Soviet Embassy at Ottawa, Canada, by Igor Gouzenko, Soviet Code Clerk who defected to the Canadian authorities on September 8, 1945, supported by the testimony of Gouzenko himself, established that Halperin was a member of the Soviet Military Intelligence espionage network operating in Canada during the period 1942-1945. Apprehended in February, 1946, Halperin subsequently was placed on trial for conspiracy to violate the Canadian Official Secrets Act. However, on March 4, 1947, charges against him were dismissed upon refusal of a co-conspirator to testify against him and the consequent failure on the part of the Crown attorneys to link him with the conspiracy through independent evidence, a condition precedent to the admissibility of the Soviet documents. X U

On March 12, 1946, the Bureau liaison representative in Ottawa, Canada, forwarded photostatic copies of an address book and diary found in Halperin's possession at the time of his apprehension. The address book and diary contained several hundred names of individuals living in the United States and other parts of the world. Among the entries appeared the name of Klaus Fuchs, Asst. to H. Born, 84 George Lane, Univ. of Edinburgh, Scotland, Camp 5 (Camp L.) Internment Operations.

~~SECRET~~

The Royal Canadian Mounted Police have advised the Federal Bureau of Investigation that this data also was made available to British Security Authorities. No investigation was conducted by the Bureau regarding persons listed in the address book as not residing in the United States inasmuch as both the Canadian and British authorities were conducting investigations in connection with the ramifications of the Canadian espionage network, and pertinent information being developed by the respective services was being exchanged.

~~SECRET~~

The only known link between the widely publicized Canadian espionage case and espionage activity of Fuchs is the Halperin address book entry. Recent press articles setting out that the United States, in 1946, was advised of Fuchs' activity through the Canadian Royal Commission, have absolutely no basis in fact. The Royal Canadian Mounted Police have advised that neither the Royal Commission nor the Royal Canadian Mounted Police had possessed any information regarding Fuchs' espionage activity in 1946, as stated in various news articles, including the Canadian weekly, "The Enigma."



~~SECRET~~

Among the thousands of German documents captured at the end of the war, there were two documents which apparently were prepared by the German Security Police in the Spring of 1941, prior to the invasion of Russia. These documents contained thousands of names and were indexed for future reference in this Bureau's files in the Spring of 1948. Included in the lists were the following:

Gerhard Fuchs is the brother of Emil Julius Klaus Fuchs. The NSHA reportedly stands for the Central Office of the Security Police in Germany, and the names on the lists were reportedly of persons suspected by the Germans as Communists or Soviet agents. After the investigation of Fuchs was initiated, an examination of the documents reflected the names of Fuchs and his brother.

This Bureau does not know the basis of the clearance of Fuchs by the British authorities prior to his coming to the United States in connection with atomic energy research in 1943 inasmuch as the responsibility of security rested on the Manhattan Engineer District, and Federal Bureau of Investigation responsibilities were not fixed by law until the Atomic Energy Act of 1946 became effective January 1, 1947. When Fuchs came to the United States in 1947 he was cleared by the Atomic Energy Commission without reference to the FBI.

In connection with the above, I desire to draw to your attention the fact that the information contained herein is of a strictly confidential nature, particularly with reference to the original informant, and should be considered as of Top Secret classification. ~~TOP SECRET~~

Agents sifted through every record they could find that might produce any sort of lead. But now his name meant something. The bits and pieces of information, when joined together, all weighed against Fuchs. On Monday, Senator Brien McMahon informed me that at a recent executive session of the Joint Committee on Atomic Energy, certain questions came up and the staff was directed to get the answers; that pursuant to this session Bill Borden had prepared a letter addressed to the Bureau, which Brien will not sign because he believes it involves certain matters that we should go over first informally. He stated that he would send the letter on down here; that after we had looked at the letter he would slip us a copy of the transcript if we desired.

Late this afternoon, Bill Borden, who heads the staff, called and stated that Brien suggested he come by and see me some time tomorrow when it is mutually convenient. Accordingly, I arranged to see Borden at 2:30.

This whole thing is sort of mysterious and I don't know exactly what they are talking about.

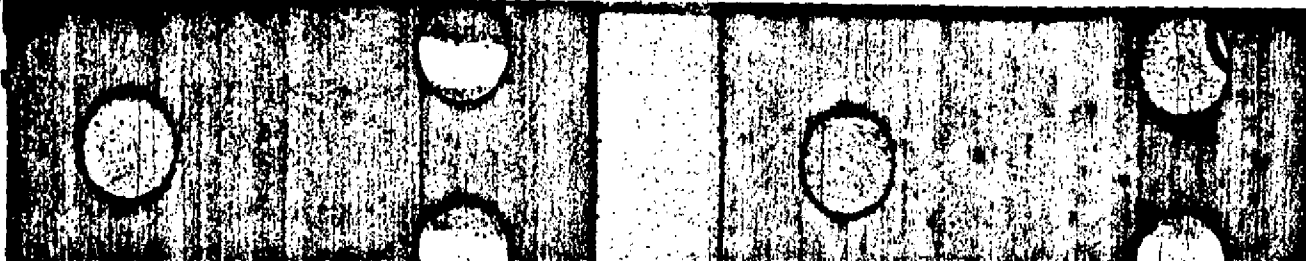

At 9:05 a.m., May 2, 1950, Inspector Glenn Bethel called from Ottawa to advise that there is some additional publicity in the paper concerning the Fuchs case today. He advised that this case is being used somewhat as a political football in Canada. He stated that the paper this morning in Ottawa carried a statement by Mr. L. B. Pearson, External Affairs Minister, putting the Fuchs' case onus on the United Kingdom. The gist of the article is that investigation should have been conducted concerning Fuchs after his name turned up in 1946 in the notebook of a suspected espionage agent. The article went on to say that there were some 436 names in the book, of which 163 were in the United States.

Mr. Bethel advised that he was sending the clippings to the Bureau along with a letter setting forth this information in detail.

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In accordance with Bureau instructions contained in Bureau teletype of March 28, 1950, the following recommendations are being made with reference to the interview of ABRAHAM BROTHMAN.

As was set forth in New York letter of 2/14/50, the New York Office is in favor of interviewing BROTHMAN regarding the identities of all of his associates, particularly any that he knew were associated with the Russian Government. The purpose of this interview would be to identify FUCHS' contact, WHO was also apparently contacting BROTHMAN. However, the New York Office now recommends that this interview with BROTHMAN be deferred temporarily and that all of his contacts as set forth in the report of SA John R. Murphy dated 4/5/50 be identified wherever possible and that photographs of each of them be obtained to be exhibited to FUCHS and HEINEMAN.

It is also felt that the Bureau representative should be allowed to interview FUCHS as soon as possible, since his story, as it has been developed by MI-5, has many gaps and unexplained situations which, if fully explored, might lead to the identification of his American contact.

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With regard to the possibility of interviewing BROTHMAN'S associates, such as OSCAR J. VAGO, EMIL BARISH and JULES KORCHEIN, this office recommends that if they are interviewed, as well as GERHARD WOLLAN, that their interviews and BROTHMAN'S be conducted simultaneously. It is expected that all the principals, including BROTHMAN, will be hostile.

All of the above-mentioned individuals, with the exception of Gold and Moskowitz, were partners of Brothman in A. Brothman and Associates. Gold has been an associate of Brothman since 1940, and in February, 1946, he entered the employ of Brothman. Moskowitz, Secretary to Abraham Brothman, is known to have already been in Brothman's employ as of December, 1945, and there is indication that she may have begun her employment with him in August, 1944. She still is associated with Brothman and is his only partner in A. Brothman and Associates at this time. It appears, therefore, that any or all of these individuals may be able to make known the identity of *[Redacted]*

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I. ABRAHAM BROTHMAN

A current investigation of Brothman is in progress. Brothman was born August 15, 1913, at New York City. In 1933 he graduated from Columbia University, where he specialized in accountancy and chemical engineering. On June 15, 1937, he married Naomi Matt and they have one child. As of September, 1949, he resided at 41-08 42nd Street, Sunnyside, Long Island, New York. (100-365040-1, page 2)

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
