Dear Sir:

Please refer to the letter from this office dated February 17, 1950, regarding the derogatory statements made by Lord Portal and Dr. Michael Wilcox Perrin concerning the FBI.

Brigadier General John B. Ackerman, Air Attache, who originally informed this office regarding the statements made by Lord Portal, has just informed me that he saw Lord Portal at a reception, or some other gathering, a short time ago and at this meeting Lord Portal told him that both he and Dr. Perrin had been reprimanded by the FBI for certain statements made by them regarding the handling of the FUCHS case. Brigadier General Ackerman stated that, when telling him this, Lord Portal looked him straight in the eye, apparently in an attempt to determine if he was the Bureau's source of information. Brigadier General Ackerman stated that he expressed surprise but was unable to state whether Lord Portal, nevertheless, still suspicious him and his wife as being one of the sources.

Brigadier General Ackerman was informed that similar reports had reached the Bureau through the Atomic Energy Commission in Washington, as apparently both Lord Portal and Dr. Perrin had made similar statements to visiting American atomic scientists who were in England at that time. He was also informed that the Bureau would not let such statements go unchallenged and that they would be spiked immediately, regardless of the individuals involved or their position or rank, and which was exactly what was done in this case.

In his talk, Mark was highly critical of the Personnel Clearance Program. He objected to the Roberts Board serving as an appeal board because that board also acted in an advisory capacity to the AEC in personnel clearance matters. He objected to the Hearing Board finding guilt by association, and stated that if all the top scientists working on the Atomic Energy Program voluntarily furnished information about themselves and their associates, that the Commission would probably have to deny clearance to all and that the Atomic Energy Program would be wrecked. (U)

At a Federation of American Scientists council meeting on January 30, 1949, Mark said that there might be changes in the Atomic Energy Act during the session of Congress and suggested that one change which should be made was that the Atomic Energy Commission should be directed by the Act to grant clearance unless there were reason to fear danger to the common defense and security rather than the present direction to the AEC to grant clearance only when it shall have determined that to do so will not endanger the common defense and security. This meeting was held at the College of the City of New York. (U)

Ursula's father, Dr. Rene Robert Kuczynski, is said to be a professor of statistics of European renown. He was born August 12, 1876, in Berlin, Germany. He comes from a family of bankers. He studied in Universities at Fryburg, Munich and Berlin. From 1898 until 1900 he was employed in Statistisches Amt Der Stadt in Berlin. From 1900 until 1901 or 1911 (probably the latter) he was employed in the Census Office in Washington, D. C. In 1911 he became Director of Statistics in Elberfeld. From 1916 to 1921 he worked as Director of the German Statistical Office in Schoneberg near Berlin. He was Honorable Professor of the Commercial Academy in Berlin. Being a man of great fortune, in 1922 he withdrew from public work and devoted himself to an independent undertaking of teaching, announcing in Germany, England and America the whole series of works from statistical spheres and presented in these countries examples based on this theme. He was vice president of a reportedly Leftist organization called the German League for People's Rights in 1933. With the advent of

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Hitler he removed himself to London permanently where he lectured in the London School of Economics. In Germany he was not a member of the Communist Party but prior to 1933 his son, Jurgen, and his daughter, Brigitte, were active members of the German Communist Party. It has been reported that his children influenced him in the direction of Communism. Dr. Kuczynski headed the Free German Committee in London. The suggestion has been made that he was chosen to lead this committee because of his Communist leanings and by virtue of his outstanding reputation as a teacher and scholar. It was hoped that he would succeed in uniting various political groups in Great Britain much the same as he had done in Germany when he was head of the Plebiscite Committee. Mrs. Clara Gettner, 47 East 88th Street, New York City, has advised that she is a cousin of Max Hamburger and that his children consider her their aunt. She stated that for over a century Max Hamburger's antecedents operated a linen mill in Landeshut-Schlesien and that the family was extremely wealthy, having a second home in Breslau, Germany. According to Mrs. Gettner, Rudolph was educated as an architect in a German university. He went to Shanghai and did architectural work. He later went to Warsaw, Poland, and came to the United States for his summer vacation. Thereafter, according to Mrs. Gettner, he married Ursula Kuczynski, an English girl whose brother and father were prominent economists. She stated that Rudolph and Ursula had three children and that Ursula made frequent trips of two or three months

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duration to Russia leaving the children with Rudolph, and that during this time Rudolph and Ursula were living in Switzerland. She stated that Rudolph and Ursula were ultimately divorced and that they were cousins although the exact degree of relationship is unknown.
