By letter dated March 2, 1950, you were furnished the nature of the information which Dr. Klaus Fuchs has divulged to his American contact concerning atomic energy.

By letter dated May 24, 1950, you were informed of the identification of Harry Gold as Fuchs' American contact and of the confession of Harry Gold implicating him with Fuchs in furnishing atomic energy information to the Russians.

The following additional technical information concerning atomic energy which Fuchs admits making available to the Russians through Gold is set forth as follows:

Fuchs admitted that in June, 1945, 1950 met Gold in Santa Fe, New Mexico and discussed the detonation plans by implosion. Fuchs has admitted that at the Boston meeting with Gold he gave Gold about six handwritten pages, including mostly what was known by him concerning implosion. He also gave Gold information regarding the facts of the high explosive, as to the type for compression, which was considered but not finally decided upon. The difficulty of multiple point detonation on which problem Fuchs was specifically working was included in this report. Fuchs has admitted furnishing Gold information concerning the outer dimensions of the high explosive either at the Boston meeting or the one following. Fuchs admitted furnishing Gold information at the June, 1945 meeting at Santa Fe regarding the size of the atomic bomb, and additional information concerning ignition although the ignition method was not yet settled. He admitted giving Gold information about ICF calculations, the method of calculation and the results of the efficiency of calculations at the estimated range from small percentages

to 50% although much later the Hiroshima test was about [redacted] and Nagasaki about [redacted]. Fuchs also disclosed that the bomb was intended for use against Japan. Fuchs admitted passing information concerning the tests at Trinity and his own information on the initiator and perhaps some data on the pre-assembled core. Fuchs stated that in the June, 1945 meeting at Santa Fe, he furnished data concerning the critical size of the bomb which was valuable only if any one desired to know how many bombs could be made, based on the rate of production.

Fuchs recalls that at some meeting he explained to Gold the work of the British Mission assigned to the Manhattan Engineer District in New York, also the physical and personnel setup concerned with gaseous diffusion and in the Kellogg Company.

Fuchs stated that he gave information to Gold concerning the separation of isotopes and the eventual use of nuclear fission in the form of the weapon during the early New York City contacts with Gold. Fuchs admitted giving information concerning his work in the air-tight compartment and information concerning plans for an isotope separation plant in the south.

On May 26, 1950, Fuchs summarized the written information which he passed at the various meetings as follows:

Various New York Meetings

1. The approximate 13 MSN documents prepared by Fuchs out of a total of approximately 19 of this series completed before Fuchs departed from Los Alamos.
2. Information from time to time as received as to the overall and general efforts and activities in connection with his own work relative to the production of fissionable material and its potential use as an explosive in the war effort.
3. General information about membranes and their composition.

He remembered passing the following oral information at the New York meetings:

1. Information regarding the large plant to be built somewhere in Southeast United States to be used in the production of fissionable material utilizing gaseous diffusion and electro magnetic process.
2. Information as to the officers and the identity of leading scientists, as known to him, at the gaseous diffusion research establishment under the Manhattan Engineer District at New York.

Written Information Passed at Boston Meetings

1. Information dealing with the whole problem of making an atomic bomb from fissionable material as Fuchs then knew the problem. Also the agreed upon, as well as the prospective plans in this production as they were then known to him.
2. Information as to the principles of the method of detonation of the atomic bomb.
3. Some information, as known, concerning the type of core used in the atomic bomb.
4. The principles of the lens system, which had not at that time been finally adopted.
5. The size of the outer dimension of the highly explosive components.
6. The possibility of making a plutonium bomb.
7. Most of the information which was then known regarding implosion.
8. The fact that a high explosive as the type of compression was being considered.
9. The difficulty of multiple point detonation, on which problem he was working.
10. The high spontaneous fission of plutonium.

11. The comparatively critical mass of plutonium as compared with U-235.
12. The approximate amount of plutonium necessary for such a bomb.
13. The current idea as to the need for an initiator.

Fuchs admitted passing the following written information to Gold at the first Santa Fe, New Mexico meeting:

1. Description of the plutonium bomb, then designed and soon planned for testing at Alamogordo.
2. A sketch of the bomb and its components, with the important dimensions shown.
3. The type of core.
4. A description of the initiator.
5. The details as to the tamper.

Fuchs admitted giving the following oral information to Gold at the first Santa Fe, New Mexico meeting:

1. The names of type of explosives to be used in the bomb.
2. The fact that the Trinity test explosion was to be made soon in July and the approximate site thereof.
3. That the Trinity test was expected to establish that the atomic bomb would produce explosion vastly greater than TNT, and that a comparison would be made between the atomic explosion and TNT.

Fuchs admitted giving the following written information to Gold at the second Santa Fe, New Mexico meeting:

1. The results of the Trinity test.
2. The technical work on the initiator.
3. Information regarding the pre-assembled core.
4. Special technical phases of plutonium.
5. Information regarding the use of a special alloy constituent.

Fuchs admitted giving the following classified documents to

Gold:

1. Report on the Jet Formation in Cylindrical Implosion with 16 Detonation Points. Report #LA-216, classified secret, dated February 6, 1945. This was given to Gold at Boston.
2. Formation of Jets in Plane Slabs. #LA-195 classified secret, dated December 27, 1944. This was passed to Gold at Boston.
3. Fluctuations and the Efficiency of a Diffusion Plant, Part III, The Effect of Fluctuations in the Flow of M-2 dated June 6, 1944. British File MSN-12. This document was passed to Gold by Fuchs in New York City.
4. Fluctuations and the Efficiency of a Diffusion Plant, Part IV, The Effect of Density Fluctuations, undated. British File MSN-15. This was passed to Gold by Fuchs in New York City.
5. On the Effect of a Time Lag in the Controller of Plant Stability, undated. British File #MSN-3. This was passed by Fuchs to Gold in New York City.
6. Note on the Effect of Fluctuations on the Efficiency of a Diffusion Plant, undated. British File #MSN-15. This information was passed by Fuchs to Gold in New York City.

7. Effect of Fluctuations on Plant Efficiency, Part II, Fluctuations in the Rate of Production, undated. British File /NSW-10. This information was passed by Fuchs to Gold in New York City.

The above reports were prepared by Dr. Klaus Fuchs.

Fuchs recalls giving excerpts from memory of the following documents to Gold at Boston:

1. Jet Formation in Cylindrical Implosion with 16 Detonation Points. Report dated February 6, 1950, LA-216.
2. Formation of Jets in Plane Slabs. Report of LA-195 dated December 27, 1944.

The above information is being furnished to the Department of Justice and the Department is being asked to specify what technical information concerning atomic energy will be used in drawing the indictment against Gold and also what technical information will be used later as evidence in the trial of Gold.

As soon as the Department advises what technical information is necessary for a successful prosecution, the matter of clearance of this information for use in the indictment and trial will be discussed with you.

I am enclosing a copy of a memorandum from the British Embassy, Washington, D. C., dated May 2, 1950, which was received by this Bureau on May 3, 1950 from the State Department, wherein the British Embassy advises that His Majesty's Government has worked out an arrangement by which it will be possible for a member of the Federal Bureau of Investigation to interview Dr. Emil Klaus Fuchs providing certain conditions are fulfilled.

It would be useless to proceed with any interview with Fuchs with this restriction imposed. Any thorough interview would have to cover atomic energy intelligence.

[REDACTED]

Imposes a restriction which would be binding on us and is impractical. It would be impossible for this Bureau to comply since we would have to furnish the results of the interview to the Atomic Energy Commission, other intelligence agencies and, possibly, to the Joint Congressional Committee on Atomic Energy. These agencies would have to know the source of the information and an evaluation of the source.

The restrictions which the British Government has placed on the interview make it impossible for this Bureau to discharge its responsibilities. Therefore, it is not believed possible for the Bureau to interview Dr. Fuchs under these conditions.

In view of the above, you may desire to take this matter up further with the State Department.

Remytel to Bureau 5/26/50, teletype to New York, 5/27/50, and New York letter to Bureau, copy to all offices, 5/24/50.

Photographs of HARRY GOLD were exhibited to DAVID C. EVANS, Graduate Assistant, Physics Department, University of Utah, Salt Lake City. MR. EVANS advised that the photograph of HARRY GOLD looks very much like the MR. GOLD mentioned in reference teletypes. MR. EVANS stated, however, that he was unable to make a positive identification from Subject's photographs.

In addition to the information set forth in reference teletype, MR. EVANS stated he spent the entire day of September 15 or 16, 1949, talking to an individual, who introduced himself as MR. GOLD, at White Sands, New Mexico. MR. EVANS advised that on the above-mentioned date, he, GOLD, and two U. S. Army photographers were waiting at White Sands, N. M. to observe the launching of a rocket. MR. EVANS stated he does not recall the identity of the Army officers but one had an interest in a photo shop located at Las Cruces, N. M. MR. EVANS advised that the Army officials may have additional information relative to GOLD.

The Albuquerque Office is not being requested to locate the Army officer at this time but same is being left to the office of origin as to whether the Army officers should be located and interviewed.

MR. EVANS further stated he took two photographs of the launching of the rocket and offered to send GOLD a print, but GOLD showed no interest in obtaining one. MR. EVANS also reported that GOLD did not seem anxious to obtain information relative to the rocket. He stated that GOLD, to whom he talked at White Sands, was identical in description to HARRY GOLD.

Photographs of HARRY GOLD were also ~~made~~ ^{made} and other information and sources of information in this area but no information of value was forthcoming.

EVANS, GRADUATE ASSISTANT, PHYSICS DEPT., UNIVERSITY OF UTAH, SALT LAKE CITY. IT WILL BE NOTED THAT EVANS ADVISED THAT HE SPENT THE ENTIRE DAY OF SEPTEMBER FIFTEEN OR SIXTEEN, NINETEEN FORTY NINE, TALKING TO AN INDIVIDUAL WHO INTRODUCED HIMSELF AS MR. 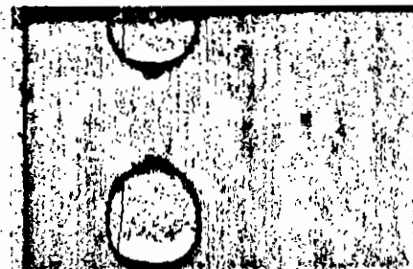

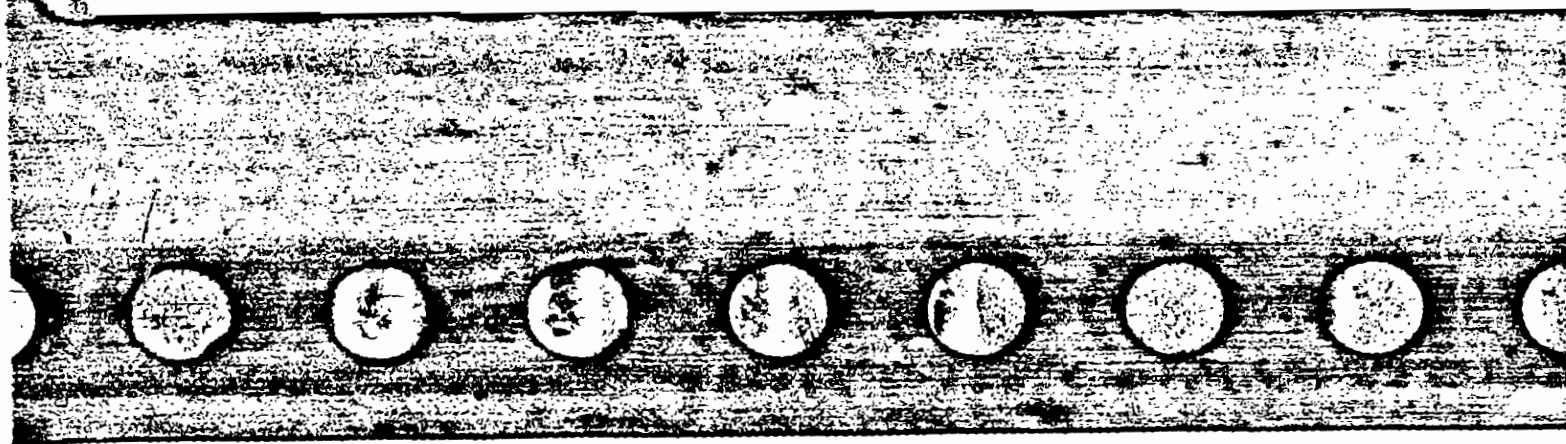

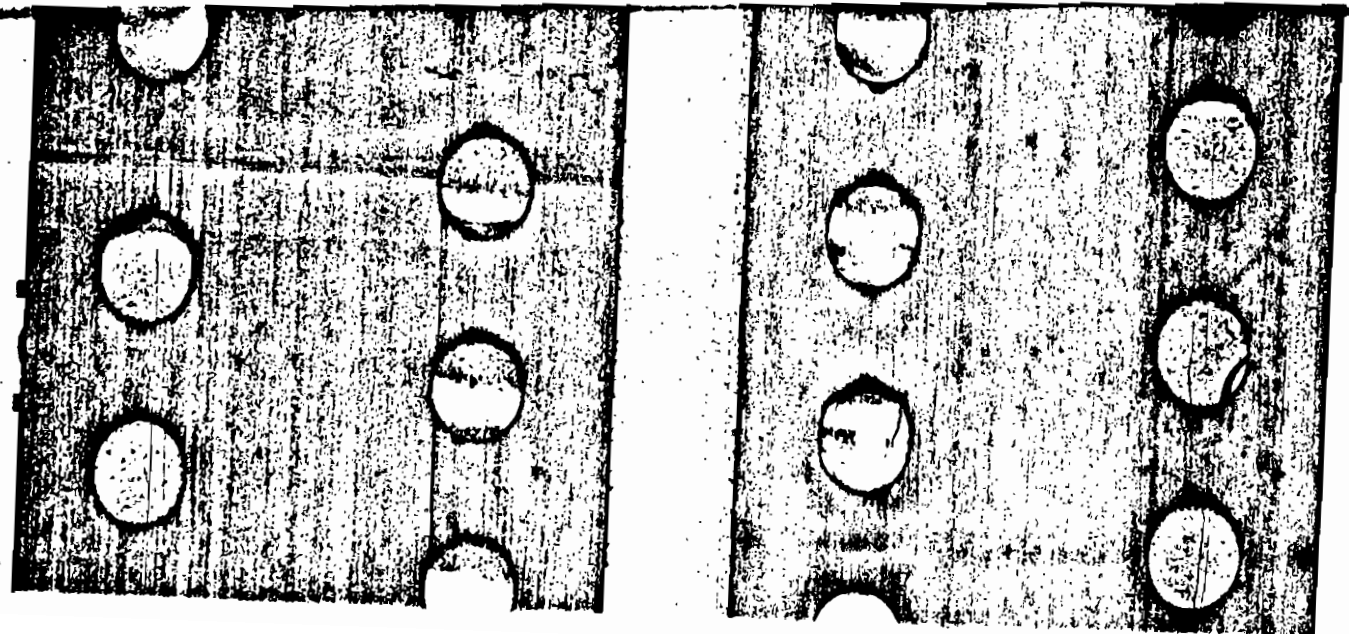

Bureau letter dated April 19, 1950 to New York, with copy to Albany, advised that information had been received from a highly confidential source to the effect that subject KLAUS FUCHS had expressed the belief that there was some resemblance between the photograph of ALEX BENJAMIN NOVIKOFF and his American contact. Albany was requested to obtain additional photographs of NOVIKOFF and furnish same to Bureau, Boston and New York.

Albany letter dated April 26, 1950 pointed out that a more desirable photograph of NOVIKOFF could be best obtained from sources at Brooklyn College, Brooklyn, New York, where NOVIKOFF had been employed for a number of years as a Professor of Biology, and especially during the years 1944-1945, the pertinent period in this case.

NOVIKOFF is presently employed in the Pathology Department, the University of Vermont, Burlington, Vermont.

The only available photograph of NOVIKOFF obtainable at the University of Vermont was a group photograph which includes NOVIKOFF. A photograph of this group photograph which was taken in the summer of 1949 has been made, and it is being furnished to interested offices. ~~DELETED RECORDING~~

It is noted that HARRY GOLD has since been identified by the Philadelphia Office as FUCHS' American contact and that there appears a certain resemblance in facial characteristics between the photograph of HARRY GOLD and the photograph of ALEX B. NOVIKOFF, which was taken in 1937 and which had been originally submitted in this investigation.

It is deemed advisable at this time to have this photograph of ALEX BENJAMIN NOVIKOFF exhibited to HARRY GOLD for possible identification.

For the benefit of the Philadelphia Office, NOVIKOFF has been reported active in Communist activities in the New York area from 1934 to 1948 and was one of the leaders of the Communist movement at Brooklyn College where he had been employed for a number of years as a Professor of Biology. He is reported to be a friend and associate of Dr. JOSEPH GREENSTAND, a Scientist employed by the Kellix Corporation, New York City, who worked on the DSM Project and

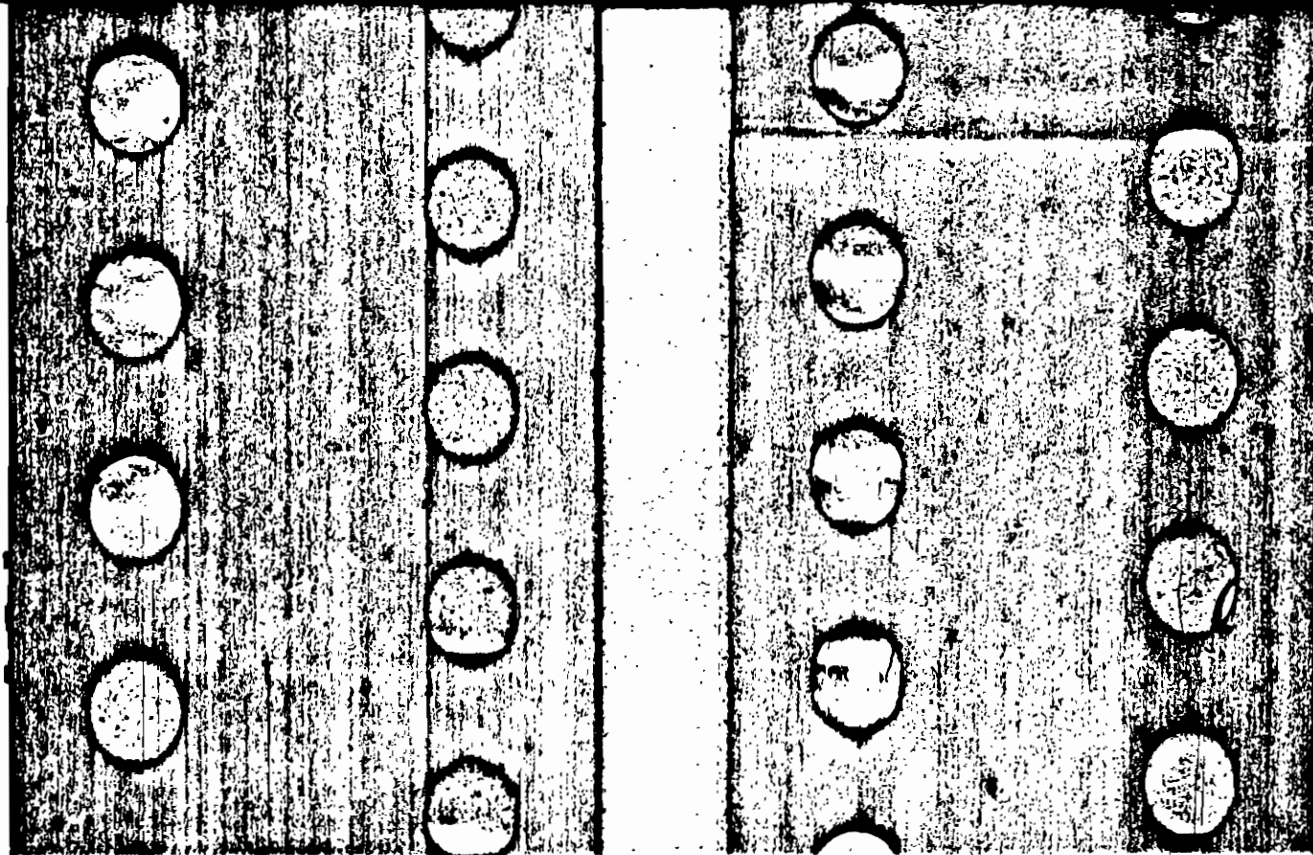

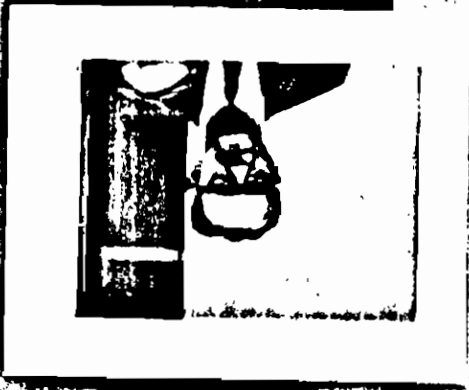

The following information was secured through Mr. FRANK M. CURTISS, Personnel Manager, and Mr. CLARENCE WOODS, Comptroller, Michigan Chemical Corporation; MARION GORDON MASTIN was employed by instant firm at St. Louis, Michigan, as a Technical Adviser from February 1943 to May 1944. Prior to this period, MASTIN was employed in a similar capacity by the Westvaco Company, Charleston, West Virginia. After leaving the employ of the Michigan Chemical Corporation, he went to work for the Hardesty Chemical Company at Henderson, Nevada.

Both CURTISS and WOODS stated that MASTIN was required to execute an application and his photograph would have been taken at the time he was employed. However, an intensive search of company records failed to produce such said application and photograph. Both WOODS and CURTISS were unable to provide any local sources through which a photograph of MASTIN could be obtained locally. They recalled that MASTIN resided in the Park Hotel, St. Louis, Michigan, while he was employed by this Company.

Mr. CURTISS located a company record which revealed that MASTIN was born August 12, 1891, at Humboldt, Iowa. His Social Security number is [REDACTED]. In case of emergency, MASTIN requested company officials to notify Mrs. JAMES A. ADAMS, 472 Quartz Street, Redwood, California. bx

Mr. FRANK M. CURTISS, Personnel Manager, Michigan Chemical Corporation, produced a copy of a letter written by him to the Batelle Memorial Institute, 505 King Street, Columbus, Ohio. Instant letter is dated July 16, 1945, and is in reply to a letter from the Batelle Memorial Institute indicating that MARION G. MASTIN had made application for employment. CURTISS' letter in this matter in part reads, "In my opinion, Mr. MASTIN's integrity was not above reproach. His

ability as a Chemist is far from being up to standard. I would even go so far as to say that if the Batelle Memorial Institute found it necessary to employ Mr. MASTIN, the Michigan Chemical Corporation would not deem it advisable to work with the Institute." In commenting on this letter, CURTISS advised that MASTIN endeavored to "take over" when he became employed by the Michigan Chemical Corporation. He disrupted plant morale by openly criticizing and undermining Mr. GILES, the Plant Manager. Moreover, MASTIN is alleged to have had immoral relations at the Park Hotel, St. Louis, Michigan, with Miss ILENE LOOPVIT, who at that time, served as his private secretary. His conduct in this matter became publicly known and was the source of considerable gossip. CURTISS informed that after MASTIN and LOOPVIT left the employ of the Michigan Chemical Corporation, they reportedly were married.

Owing to the fact that ~~HARRY GOLD~~, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, has been identified to be the unknown Subject who directly contacted FULCHS, no lead is being set out in this report to secure a photograph of MASTIN to the Westvaco Company, Charleston, West Virginia.

Photographs of HARRY GOLD were exhibited to JOSEPH ZACK KORNFEDER, 5321 Maplewood, Detroit, Michigan, and WILLIAM ODELL NOWELL, Investigator, Immigration and Naturalization Service, 3770 East Jefferson, Detroit, Michigan, and they were unable to identify GOLD. HARRY GOLD is not known to them.

I would like to strongly urge that you make every possible effort to obtain from the White House the source of the information furnished to the White House concerning the fact that there was an arrest imminent in connection with the case of Emil Julius Klaus Fuchs. I feel that it is imperative to have this information inasmuch as such a leak of information seriously imperils the operations of this Bureau. The information concerning Harry Gold was known to only a very limited number of high officials in the Bureau and such a leak naturally causes concern with reference to the integrity of our own staff. In addition, the premature leak of this information has prohibited this Bureau from developing all angles in connection with the Fuchs case, as I had desired to do. Gold was cooperating and was willing to continue to furnish information which might have permitted the further development of this case had it not been necessary, as a result of the premature leak, to proceed immediately with the arrest of Gold.

In view of the above facts, I am sure that you can realize why I consider this matter so serious and I again strongly urge that every effort be made to obtain this information through the White House.

You will no doubt be interested in information concerning Harry Gold who has been identified as the individual who received atomic information from Dr. Fuchs in the United States for transmittal to the Soviet Union. (u)

Harry Gold was born December 12, 1910, in Switzerland. In 1914 he came to the United States with his parents, Sam and Gella Selednitsky, both of whom were born in Russia. At the time of their naturalization as United States citizens their name was changed to Gold. Harry Gold claims citizenship by derivation through his parents. His mother is deceased. Harry Gold resides with his father and his brother, Joseph Gold, at 6223 Hindred Street, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. (u)

Shortly after arriving in the United States the Gold family moved to Philadelphia, where, in 1929, Harry Gold became employed by the Pennsylvania Sugar Company in their laboratories. He continued his employment with this company until about February 1946, at which time he became employed with A. Brothman Associates, Consulting Engineers, New York City. He left this firm in June, 1948. He presently is employed at the Philadelphia General Hospital and is a Civil Service employee of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. At the hospital he is engaged in the laboratory doing research in connection with serious cardiac cases. (u)

Gold received his education attending night school at the Brexal Institute, the University of Pennsylvania, and Columbia University. In 1938 he obtained leave of absence from the Pennsylvania Sugar Company to attend Xavier University, Cincinnati, Ohio, where he received a Bachelor of Science Degree summa cum laude in 1940. (u)

Gold first came to the attention of this Bureau in connection with the activities of Abraham Brothman, concerning whom Elizabeth T. Bentley furnished information. In a signed statement dated November 30, 1948, Bentley advised that in about May, 1940, she was introduced to Brothman, whose photograph she identified, by Jacob Golos, her Soviet espionage superior. (u)

She stated that Golos told her that Brothman would furnish her with certain blueprints. Following that she met with Brothman about ten times in the summer of 1940 until the fall of that year, and obtained blueprints from him for Golos. She said that in the fall of 1940 Golos claimed to have become disgusted with Brothman and told her he was turning Brothman over to someone else. (U)

As a result of this information an investigation of Brothman was conducted, which resulted in an interview of Brothman on May 29, 1947. At first Brothman denied recognizing the name or photograph of Golos. Upon being shown a photograph of Bentley, which he identified as a person whom he knew as "Helen," he then admitted that he did recognize the photograph of Golos. (U)

Brothman related that some time in 1938 or 1939 Golos had come to his office at 114 East 32nd Street, New York City, and advised Brothman that he had contacts with the Russian Government, by reason of which he was in a position to obtain contracts from that government for Brothman if Brothman would turn over to him blueprints of certain products on which Brothman was working at the time. Brothman advised that the blueprints in question were his own property. He said Golos visited his office on several occasions thereafter until Golos introduced him to "Helen." Golos advised that "Helen" would thereafter obtain the blueprints. "Helen" visited Brothman's office over a dozen times during 1938, 1939, and 1940. Some time in 1940 she stopped coming and another individual named Harry Gold appeared at Brothman's office and said that he represented Golos. Thereafter Gold visited Brothman's office on a number of occasions during 1940 and 1941, and obtained blueprints from Brothman. He said the last time Gold picked up the blueprints, according to the best of his recollection, was late in 1941 or early 1942. He was emphatic in stating that Gold was the last individual to pick up any blueprints or material for Golos. He stated that Harry Gold was, at the time of the interview, namely May 29, 1947, employed by him as a chemist in his laboratory at Elmhurst, Long Island. A signed statement to this effect was obtained from Brothman. (U)

Upon receiving the information about Gold from Brothman, Gold was interviewed the same day at A. Brothman Associates Laboratory, 8503-57th Avenue, Elmhurst, Long Island. Gold related in substance that he had met Jacob Golos in October, 1940, at a meeting of the American Chemical Society at the Franklin Institute, Philadelphia. At this time Golos propositioned Gold, saying that he had connections with individuals in a foreign country, not naming the country, and also had connections with Abraham Brothman in

New York who was turning over certain blueprints. Golos told Gold that he required the services of a chemist to go to New York City, obtain the blueprints from Brothman, and then evaluate them on a chemical basis. Gold stated that about two weeks after this, in November, 1940, he contacted Brothman in New York City and introduced himself as a representative of Golos. For the next six months he made visits to New York City on the average of every three weeks to obtain blueprints from Brothman. He said that during this period he received four or five telephone calls from Golos, who always stated that they would have to get together very soon, but that actually this never happened. He said the last telephone call from Golos was in May, 1941, after which time he had no further word from Golos. He denied that he ever had seen Golos except on the occasion when he met him in October, 1940. Gold claimed that after his second or third trip to New York City Brothman became friendly and exhibited an interest in Gold's career as a chemist. He said that ever since that time Brothman had been interested in having Gold join Brothman's organizations, but that it was not until February, 1946, that he could see his way clear to accept such employment, which he did at that time. Gold denied any financial agreement with Golos, and claimed he never received a cent from Golos. He insisted that he stood the expenses for the trips to New York City on the first two occasions, after which Brothman became friendly and furnished him a five-dollar bill to cover expenses. A signed statement to this effect was obtained from Gold. (X) U

On July 22 and 31, 1947, Abraham Brothman and Harry Gold, respectively, were called before the Federal Grand Jury, Southern District of New York. Both testified in substance before this Grand Jury to that which they had furnished on interview. The investigation of the Grand Jury concerning the changes of Elisabeth T. Bentley culminated in the finding of a "no bill." (X) U

After extensive and intensive investigation which developed information indicating that Harry Gold was very probably the United States contact of Emil Julius Klaus Fuchs, he was interviewed at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, and on May 22, 1950, he furnished a signed statement admitting espionage activity. He admitted that he began the procurement of industrial information for the Soviet Union in the Fall of 1936, and continued this activity until 1943, except for the period from 1938 to 1940 while he attended Xavier University in Cincinnati, Ohio. (X) U

Gold advised that very early in 1944 his then superior made arrangements for him to meet Dr. Klaus Fuchs in New York City. This first meeting occurred on a Saturday afternoon in February or March, 1944, on the East Side of Manhattan, from where they took a cab uptown to a restaurant around Third Avenue in the 50's, possibly Manny Wolf's Restaurant. Following the dinner they walked about and completed arrangements for further meetings. Gold recalled the arrangements for actual recognition to be that he was to carry a pair of gloves in one hand, plus a green-covered book, while Fuchs was to carry a handball. He introduced himself as "Raymond" and Fuchs introduced himself as Klaus Fuchs. He said that Fuchs never used the name "Raymond" because he knew it was fictitious. (X)u

At this first meeting no written information was passed, but Fuchs revealed that he was with the British Mission working with the Manhattan Engineer Project. He told Gold that the British Mission was working on the separation of isotopes, and Gold believes there was at least implied the eventual utilization of the energy produced by nuclear fission in the form of a weapon. Following this, Gold had about four meetings with Fuchs in the Bronx, Brooklyn, Manhattan, and Queens. During at least two of these meetings Fuchs furnished written information to Gold, who thereafter delivered it to his superior, "John." He said that he had taken a brief glance at the material on one occasion and found it to consist of a number of folded sheets of paper containing mathematical equations which seemed to concern mathematical derivations. (X)u

Gold further advised that he lost contact with Fuchs when Fuchs failed to keep a meeting in August, 1944. He stated that "John" obtained the information whereby he was once more enabled to contact Fuchs. "John" gave Gold the address of Mrs. Heineman in Cambridge, Massachusetts, the sister of Fuchs. As a result of this, he met Fuchs at the Heineman residence shortly after Christmas Day, 1944, or early in 1945. At that time Fuchs told him that he was at Los Alamos, New Mexico, a short distance from Santa Fe. Fuchs also gave him written information at the time and the two made an arrangement to meet in June of that year in Santa Fe. Gold stated that on this occasion he had been given a sum of approximately fifteen hundred dollars to offer Fuchs in a very diplomatic manner so as not to offend him. He said that Fuchs "turned it down cold." Gold returned to New York with the money and information which he delivered to "John." (X)u

Gold has further advised that he met Fuchs in Santa Fe, New Mexico, in June, 1945, and again in September, 1945. On both of these occasions Fuchs furnished him with written information. He said that during the September, 1945, meeting Fuchs told him that he had been present at the initial large-scale trial of nuclear fission at Alamogordo, New Mexico. He also stated that Fuchs told him at the time that he probably would return to England soon, but that by paying a call to Fuchs' sister he could ascertain just when. Gold said he made one or two attempts to see Fuchs again at the home of his sister, but was not successful. After the possible second attempt, which was either in late January or early February, 1946, Gold missed a scheduled appointment with his superior, "John," and has not seen or heard from him since. (S) U

In connection with the current interview of Fuchs in London by representatives of this Bureau, still and movie photographs of Gold were surreptitiously obtained for display to Fuchs. Previously, Fuchs and Robert and Kristal Weisman had failed to recognize a photograph of Gold. On May 20, 1950, Fuchs was shown the new still photographs of Gold and he did not identify them, though he stated he could not reject them. (S) U

On May 22, 1950, Fuchs viewed three repeat showings of the moving pictures of Gold, after which he stated that Gold was very likely his contact in the United States. It is most interesting to note that this information was received by cable at 11:08 AM, while Gold had first admitted his espionage activity to the interviewing agents in Philadelphia at approximately 10:45 AM the same day. (S) U

On May 23, 1950, a complaint was filed before a United States Commissioner for the Eastern District of New York, Brooklyn, New York, charging Harry Gold and "John" Doe with conspiracy to commit espionage on behalf of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics in violation of Section 32, Title 50, United States Code. A warrant was issued and Gold was thereupon taken before United States District Judge James P. McGranery at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, for arraignment. Judge McGranery gave Gold the complaint to read and he admitted that he was the Harry Gold named in the complaint. A preliminary hearing was set for June 12, 1950, and bail was set at one hundred thousand dollars, in default of which Gold was remanded to the custody of the United States Marshal. (S) U

Reference is made to the report of Special Agent J. Jerome Maxwell dated March 14, 1950 at Albuquerque and Albuquerque letter of the same date.

It is noted that Jean Parks Hereson, a teacher in the Los Alamos schools, is probably identical with Jean Parker who was reportedly friendly with Klaus Fuchs while he was in Los Alamos. You are authorized to interview Hereson to determine if she is identical with Jean Parker and to obtain from her all information in her possession concerning Fuchs.

The Washington Field Office is also authorized to interview Ann Tilghman Wilson who was reportedly also friendly with Fuchs while he was at Los Alamos.

It is not desired that Jordan Cason Mark be interviewed at the present time as previously suggested by the Albuquerque Office because of his association with various scientific organizations and with individuals who have been reported as sympathetic to Communism.
