PURPOSE

To request that any information developed during an interview of Manson Benedict which would have a bearing on the loyalty of his brother, William Sidney Benedict, be furnished the Loyalty Section. It is noted that by letter dated March 10, 1950, the New York Division was instructed to interview Manson Benedict. His brother, William Sidney Benedict, an employee of the National Bureau of Standards, is the subject of a closed full field investigation.

BACKGROUND

By memorandum from Mr. Henrich dated March 10, 1950, it was recommended that Manson Benedict be interviewed inasmuch as it is believed he may have known Klaus Fuchs. A letter to New York dated March 10, 1950, directing that office to interview Manson Benedict was approved and forwarded.

William Sidney Benedict, brother of Manson Benedict, has been investigated under the Loyalty Program and reports were furnished the Civil Service Commission on July 20, 1948. By memorandum dated November 29, 1948, the Loyalty Review Board advised the Bureau that he had been retained in his position at the National Bureau of Standards. (121-3480)

PURPOSE

To call to your attention the fact that Joseph Gold, brother of Harry Gold, is presently employed at the U. S. Naval Supply Depot, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

DETAILS

Investigation and interrogation of Harry Gold has developed the fact that his brother, Joseph Gold, is an employee of the U. S. Naval Supply Depot, Philadelphia.

On the basis of information now available, there is no indication that Joseph Gold was cognizant of or assisted in any way in the admitted espionage activities of Harry Gold. Harry and Joseph Gold have been residing together with their father, Sam Gold, at 6823 Kindred Street, Philadelphia.

The Correlation Unit of the Security Division is presently preparing a correlation memorandum on Joseph Gold. The Navy Department was advised by Liaison that Joseph Gold is a brother of the subject, Harry Gold.

RECOMMENDATION

That this memorandum be routed to the attention of the Loyalty Section for consideration as to the necessity for instituting a loyalty investigation of Joseph Gold.

PURPOSE

To authorize the furnishing to the Atomic Energy Commission a copy of a document that speaks of "thermal diffusion" for their opinion as to whether it pertains to atomic energy, and whether it is classified.

BACKGROUND

On May 6, 1950, a highly confidential source furnished the attached document that speaks of "thermal diffusion," which was obtained from the office of Abraham Brothman, a close associate of Harry Gold, a known Soviet espionage agent. It is desired that the AEC be furnished the document for review and advise whether it pertains to atomic energy or related matters, and if so, whether it is classified. It should be further noted that under no circumstances should it be disclosed that the document was obtained from the office of Abraham Brothman.

ACTION

It is recommended that this matter be forwarded to Liaison for handling. It is requested that the Liaison Section return AEC's reply, together with the attachment to the Espionage Section.

Jack Neal of the State Department telephoned and advised he had seen in the paper that Mr. Clegg and Mr. Lamphere had returned from England. He stated they had been briefed by Mr. Arneson of the State Department with reference to atomic energy matters, prior to their departure, and now that they have returned he is wondering whether they have anything they could give Arneson with reference to the atomic energy material. If so, he suggested that a contact be made with either Mr. Mason Drury or Walter Jessup, in the Secretary's Office, who will make an appointment for them to see Arneson.

Re Washington Field Office letter June 14, 1950, wherein it is set forth it was not believed that any pertinent information would be obtained from an interview with WILSON in view of the fact that the Unknown Subject had been identified. It was not intended that the Washington Field Office letter obviate instructions in Bureau letter of June 8, 1950, as these two letters crossed in the mail; however, in connection with ANN TILGHMAN WILSON, it is believed that the Bureau will want to consider the following information prior to having WILSON interviewed, and until again authorized to do so this office will not interview WILSON.

On January 28, 1949, this office in a letter to the Bureau concerning JAY DAVID WHITAKER CHAMBERS, set forth information received from [redacted] who had reported during the month of December 1948, that a number of conversations took place between Mrs. ANN MARKS and ELLINORE BONFICQUE. ANN MARKS is the wife of HERBERT MARKS, former Assistant General Counsel of TVA and former General Counsel of AEC as well as informally employed in the State Department. This letter further pointed out that ELLINORE BONFICQUE was an attorney, and that she and ANN MARKS had at that time been associated with a Committee of the Rockefeller Foundation to Investigate the President's Loyalty Program.

Further reflected as coming from [redacted] was that on December 6 and 9, 1948, BONFICQUE and MARKS had a conversation concerning the HISS case during which nothing pertinent was noted.

On December 29, 1948, BONFICQUE related to ANN MARKS that a friend of hers, ISABELL MAHAFFEY, had been interviewed by the Federal Bureau of Investigation, and then BONFICQUE related the substance of the interview, which was set forth in the letter of January 28, 1949.

On January 9, 1949, BONFICQUE told ANN MARKS to give her the latest on the HISS case, at which time they discussed the complete job the FBI was doing.

On July 19, 1949, the Chicago Office in a letter to the Bureau, concerning the Educational Foundation for Nuclear Science, Inc., and the Bulletin of Atomic Scientists, submitted Volume V, June, July 1949, issues 6 and 7 of the above mentioned bulletin, which contained an article entitled "Washington Votes", "AEC Under Fire" by ANN WILSON MARKS. This article reviewed the hearings which had taken place with respect to the awarding of AEC fellowships and with respect to the then current topic of misplaced uranium.

WILSON MARKS
With regard to HERBERT SIMON MARKS, husband of ANN WILSON MARKS, the files of this office reflect that he was very friendly with HAROLD STEIN, who is a member of the Washington Committee for Democratic Action, and the Washington Bookshop Association. Further, a Mrs. MURIEL S. WILLIAMS of 4108 Anderson Street, Chattanooga, Tennessee, testified relative to Communist activities in the TVA before the Special Committee on Un-American Activities, Volume II, Page 1294, and stated she had attended Communist Party meetings in Knoxville, Tennessee, with one HERBERT MARKS, not further identified.

The report of Special Agent ELSUM G. HEDGES, dated March 10, 1949, at Washington, D. C., entitled HERBERT SIMON MARKS, EUROPEAN RECOVERY PROGRAM, reflects that the files of the House Committee on Un-American Activities then contained no reference that HERBERT MARKS, employed by TVA, was a member of the Communist Party and under transfer to the Bonneville Dam Project, which had been reflected in the Civil Service Commission files.

This same report of Agent HEDGES reflects membership in the National Lawyers Guild of HERBERT MARKS from 1937 until 1940, and residence at 1509 Cameron Street, Alexandria, Virginia.

A pretext phone call to Overlook 5682 reflects this listing has been changed and the individual answering the phone stated he had had this listing for about one month, and that prior thereto it was apparently listed to HERBERT S. MARKS. The person answering the phone stated that the listing was not presently at 1509 Cameron Street.

The current phone directory reflects HERBERT B. MARKS, Lawyer, Ring Building, Washington, D. C., and also contains a listing for Rear Admiral GEORGE B. WILSON, 3135 Connecticut Avenue, who is the father of ANNE WILSON MARKS.

Because you might be personally interested, there is attached hereto the original signed statement which was read personally and in detail by Fuchs during our interview with him and it was observed that he made several longhand notations on this original statement, each page of which he signed. This statement of 10 pages contains a considerable amount of technical detail of a classified type. It is believed that this statement would serve as a fairly comprehensive summary of the basic material information which we obtained from Fuchs during the course of the interviews with him.

There is also attached the original longhand sketch of an Atom Bomb made by Fuchs with pencil, which is his recollection of the reproduction of a sketch which he made and gave to Gold at the meeting he had with Gold in Santa Fe, New Mexico in June 1945. This sketch is supposed to represent matters of principle, but it was thought you might be interested in seeing it.

These two original documents will, following your examination, be attached to the original of the report which we are preparing.

For your information, there was also obtained another signed statement from Fuchs 7 pages in length from which all technical, restricted information of a confidential nature was eliminated in the event it were necessary to use it in any Grand Jury or other proceedings. It is phrased identically with the attached signed statement except that the confidential technical terms have been eliminated.

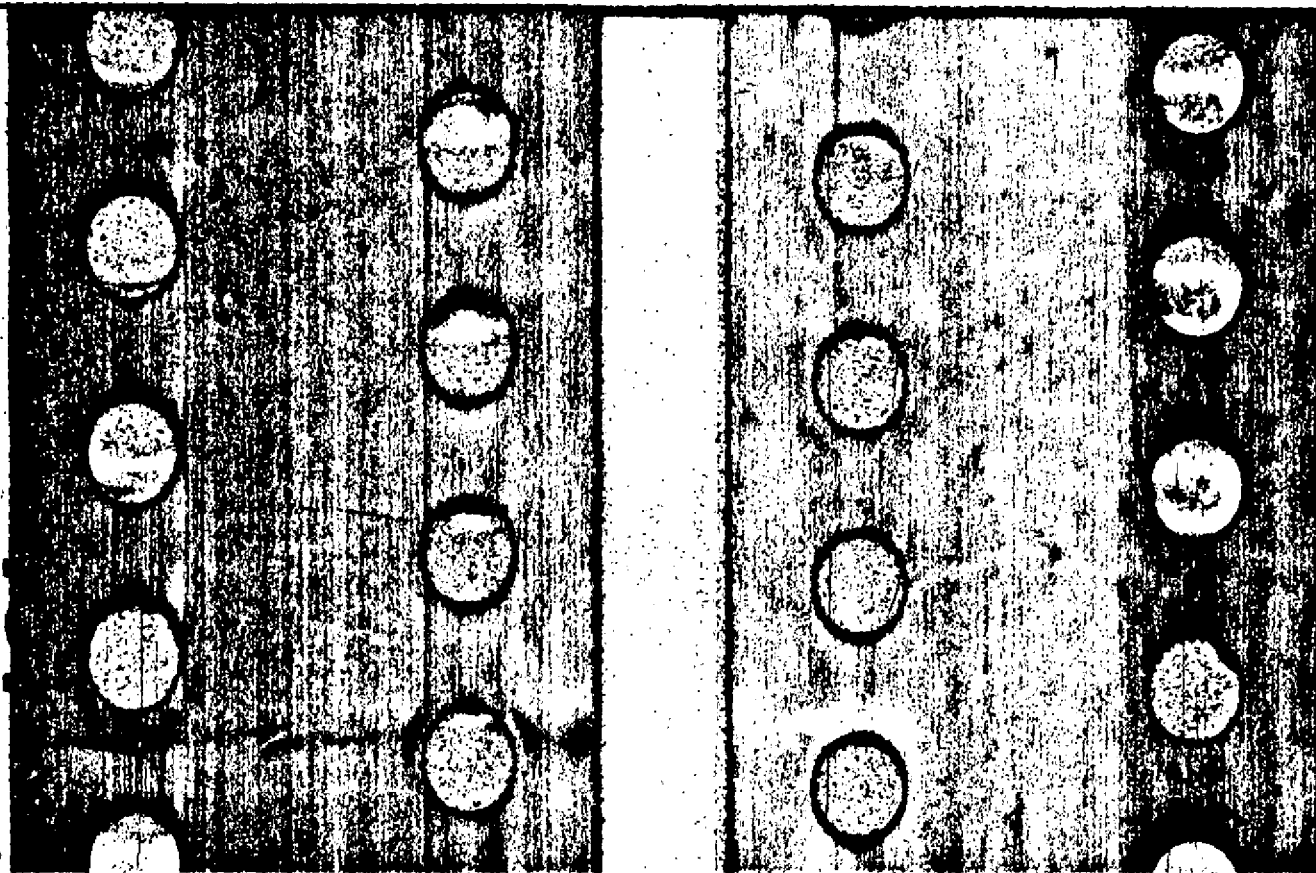

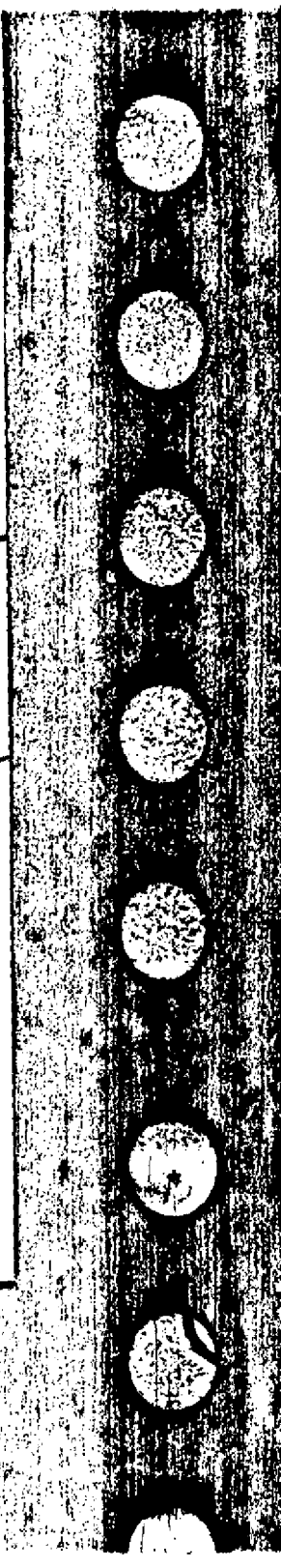

Reference is made to New Haven teletype dated 5/25/50 in the FOOCASE, and Philadelphia teletype dated 5/25/50, as well as New York teletype dated 5/26/50 in the case entitled "HARRY GOLD, Was., ET AL; ESPIONAGE R".

On 5/25/50 [redacted] who operates [redacted] Hamden, Conn., advised that Dr. HERBERT WYATT, M.D., whom he described as a displaced person, and who is a cardiologist with offices at 1696 Whitney Avenue, Hamden, Conn., and whose wife, MARION KUSNIER, is a practising physician at Meriden, Conn., had studied with Dr. HARRY GOLD, both at Philadelphia and New York City. According to [redacted] Mrs. WYATT indicated that GOLD loved her and would do anything for her. LEVITINI felt that many of the past actions of Dr. WYATT had been suspicious, such as receiving mail from Europe which, after reading, he would tear up into very small pieces; also that Dr. WYATT showed a sudden possession of money when he had previously indicated he was penniless. [redacted] stated that WYATT advised he was in the British Army during World War II and was attached to the Dies (ph) Hospital, London, England. WYATT also indicated that his father had resided for many years in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, but had later returned to Germany. According to [redacted] WYATT advised that he had secured entry into the United States by applying for a position with the Mc Kesson & Robbins Laboratory at Bridgeport, Conn., but on arrival in the United States did not go to work for this company but instead went to work for HARRY GOLD for two years and did research work with GOLD.

[redacted] also reported that WYATT would frequently be gone for weekends and that about six months after WYATT had moved to Hamden, Conn., which was about 1 1/2 years ago, WYATT told [redacted] that GOLD had written him a personal letter inviting him to attend a big cardio meeting in New York City. [redacted] advised that he severed connections with Dr. WYATT about Easter 1949 because of certain dishonest practices on the part of WYATT.

EDWARD MURPHY, M.D., Secretary of the Connecticut State Medical Board, advised that their records reflected the following information concerning the subject.

HERBERT WYATT, M.D., was born HERBERT KWIATKOWSKI at Rixdorf, on 2/17/10. Dr. MURPHY believed that Rixdorf was in the eastern part of Germany. Dr. WYATT attended the Kaiser Frederick School at Berlin, the University of Friedburg, and the University of Berlin, receiving his M.D. from the latter institution in 1936.

From Germany WYATT went to London as a Rockefeller Research Foundation Fellow in the fall of 1936. In London he studied at the Guis Hospital and received a Ph. D. from the University of London in 1940. From 1941 to 1946 he was attached to the National Research Council of the British Government. According to notations in the Connecticut State Medical Board files WYATT claimed that he worked in an undercover capacity in Europe during World War II for the British Government and Dr. MURPHY believed that WYATT claimed that it was during this time that the British gave him the name WYATT.

WYATT arrived in the United States on 12/12/46 traveling under a Certificate of Identification issued by the British Foreign Office, London, England. He secured his first papers in the United States District Court, Brooklyn, New York in 1947, Certificate no. 348467, Naturalization file no. 0300-K-50782.

WYATT passed the Connecticut State Medical examination and Dr. MURPHY advised that the person who identified Dr. WYATT'S photograph at the time of his entrance into medical practice in Connecticut was one MARION KUSNIER, M.D., of Meriden, Conn.

The records further reflected that from July 1947 to May 1948 WYATT was attached to the White Plains, New York Hospital and from there went to a hospital in Meriden, Conn. for one year and was licensed to practice in Connecticut in July 1948. WYATT gave as references to the Connecticut State Medical Board the names of ALLEN RYAN, M.D., of Meriden, Conn.; WILLIAM T. WALTER, M.D., Professor of Gynecology, Yale Medical School, who in 1948 stated that he had known WYATT for three years; JOHN FULTON, M.S., Professor of Gynecology, Yale Medical School, who in 1948 stated he had known Dr. WYATT for five years by reputation. Dr. MURPHY pointed out that Dr. FULTON was a graduate of Oxford University, England, and that both Dr. FULTON and Dr. WALTER had numerous friends in England and Europe and perhaps they had met WYATT in England.

Dr. FRANCIS G. BLAKE, Physician in Chief, Grace-New Haven Hospital, New Haven, Conn.,

stated that WYATT, in the fall of 1948, sought an appointment in the Department of Cardiology at that hospital. He did not receive such appointment but Dr. BLAKE was under the impression that WYATT visited as an observer in the Cardiac Out-Patient Clinic of the hospital. This privilege is granted to all physicians in the New Haven area for purposes of refreshing themselves in any particular field they desire.

Dr. ALLEN GOODYER, of the Department of Cardiology, New Haven Hospital, advised that he first met WYATT in September, 1948. WYATT at that time appeared at the Department of Cardiology and indicated that he would like to look for some position in the Cardiology Department. He gave the impression that he was learned in Cardiology but never actually stated that he was an expert in this field. WYATT has come to the hospital cardiac clinic many times and has observed the staff physicians in their work.

Dr. FRANK GRAY, of the cardiac clinic, New Haven Hospital, furnished substantially the same information as had Dr. GOODYER. Both Dr. GOODYER and Dr. GRAY stated they never had occasion to know Dr. WYATT personally.

The records of the New Haven Credit Bureau, New Haven, Conn. reflected that Dr. WYATT was 38 years of age in 1949; that he is a physician and maintains his office at 2454 Whitney Avenue, Hamden. His wife, MARION, is also a practicing physician and has her office on Colony Street, Meriden, Conn. As of 1/3/50 the credit records reflect that Dr. WYATT'S address was 1696 Whitney Avenue, Hamden, Conn.

A notation dated 12/7/48 lists his employer as the New Haven Hospital.


The Milwaukee office by teletype dated 5/26/50 advised that there was no record in the Milwaukee office indices under the name WEIFKOVSKY or variations in that spelling.

The Philadelphia office by teletype dated 5/25/50 stated that subject HARRY GOLD, of the "FOOCASE", during previous interviews had advised that on occasions he had been mistaken for a Dr. HARRY GOLD, a prominent cardiologist in New York City. Subject GOLD further stated that he was not capable of writing articles on cardiac research as was Dr. HARRY GOLD. This teletype further advised that the Philadelphia office had no knowledge of subject GOLD having contacted WYATT.

By teletype dated 5/26/50 the New York office advised that Dr. HARRY GOLD was employed as an Associate Professor of Clinic Pharmacology at Cornell University Medical School, New York City, and was not identical with subject of the FOOCASE, HARRY GOLD. New York suggested discontinuance of investigation re Dr. HARRY GOLD

vacationing at Haverns Haven, Ludington, Michigan, advised that he had been employed in the Experimental Division at Los Alamos during the period that Subject was attached to the Theoretical Division there. He continued that he, KERST, had also been treasurer of the Ski Club and said that he had a vague recollection that he had had a conversation with FUCHS on one occasion when he collected his dues for the Ski Club. However, he stated that it was possible that he was entirely wrong about this and that FUCHS might not even have been a member of this club. He said that beyond this, he was unable to remember any conversations with FUCHS other than chance meetings as they passed in the corridors at Los Alamos. He said that he was unable to recall the occasion in which he and FUCHS first met. He continued that he last saw him at a breakfast in Harwell, England, in the Fall of 1948. He explained that he, KERST, at that time was attending a nuclear physics conference at Birmingham, England, and that they only engaged in small talk at this breakfast. He said he spent no other time with FUCHS in England. He further explained that he believed he was living in Los Alamos with his family when FUCHS originally came to Los Alamos and that FUCHS probably lived in the dormitory during that period as he was single and that he was sure he never knew any of FUCHS' friends or even who they were.

KERST advised that he visited Los Alamos in March, 1950, and that during this visit to Los Alamos, Dr. EDWARD TELLER made the remark, "We can be sure that Mr. FUCHS is a very thorough man and if he were to communicate any information, it would be a report including a great deal of detail". Mr. KERST explained that this remark was made by TELLER in the way of emphasizing the importance of the amount of harm FUCHS has possibly caused and further explained that TELLER had felt that the interest in this work among scientists outside Los Alamos has waned in the past two years and was making the point strongly regarding FUCHS to arouse interest. He continued that there has been a tendency among scientists outside of Los Alamos to minimize the harm that FUCHS had done, although he personally felt that he could have contributed an immense amount of aid to the Russian cause. He pointed out that there was two types of information that FUCHS might have passed on. Firstly that he could have supplied which of the parallel developments in this work were "paying off" and that such information would have released an enormous amount of Russian manpower to be devoted to more fruitful channels. Secondly, he said FUCHS might have communicated engineering details to the Russians, although he emphasized that would have taken a much longer contact or much longer report. He continued FUCHS had access to a vast amount of information, "particularly on bombs". He said that it was interesting to speculate on how much he was able to communicate. He further reflected that there is some concern among United States scientists that FUCHS may still be a potential giver of information if he has not already passed all of his information to the Russians.

KERST stated that FUCHS could have been systematic about technical things and at the same time have been a "forgetter of names". He also stated that the remark made by Dr. TELLER was more in the way of emphasizing FUCHS' thoroughness rather than stressing his memory.

KERST stated that he quoted or paraphrased the remark made by Dr. TELLER in March, 1950, to perhaps a half dozen people when he was asked to characterize FUCHS. However, he asserted that personal contacts with FUCHS were very limited and that Dr. TELLER and others connected with the Theoretical Division at Los Alamos had a much greater opportunity to know FUCHS. He also stated that he had formed the impression from his chance meetings with FUCHS in the halls at Los Alamos that FUCHS was a "sour puss". However, he said that he has since learned from other scientists that this was erroneous and was, himself, surprised and impressed to find FUCHS extremely jovial when he met him at the afore-mentioned breakfast in England in the Fall of 1948. KERST also stated that he had the impression that FUCHS was about to be married when he was apprehended in England. However, he said that he was unable to recall the source of this information and remarked that "this may have come out of Newsweek".

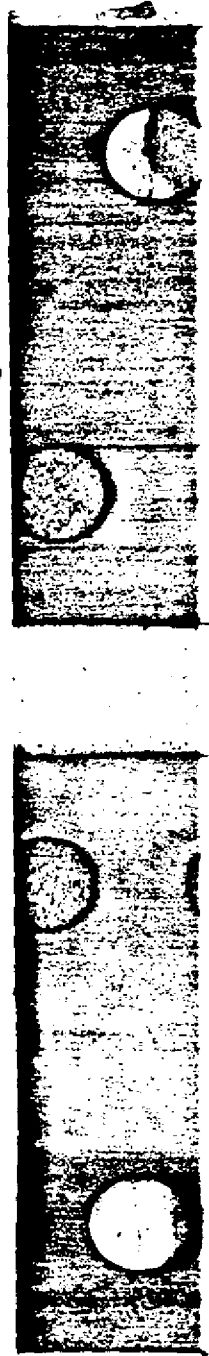

Senators Hit Britain For Putting Limitation On FBI Quiz of Fuchs

By the Associated Press
Three Senators assailed Great Britain yesterday for withholding full co-operation from the United States in the Klaus Fuchs atomic spying case.

Senator Johnson, Democrat, of Colorado, a member of the Senate House Atomic Committee, told a reporter he is shocked at reports that Britain has agreed to give the FBI only limited opportunity to question Fuchs, convicted of passing atomic secrets to Soviet agents.

Senators Bridges, Republican, of New Hampshire and Ferguson, Republican, of Michigan said information the FBI might get from Fuchs may be vital to defense plans under the North Atlantic pact and ought not to be denied this country.

No Official Statement.
There has been no official statement, but reliable reports are that the British insist on fixing conditions under which FBI agents can talk to Fuchs—an arrangement the FBI is said to regard as inadequate if it is to get at the bottom of the atomic spying system.

A Senator who asked that his name not be used publicly said even these unsatisfactory arrangements were not agreed to by the British except under pressure exerted by high American officials.

Senator Johnson said he thinks this amounts to "very shabby treatment of the security problem" by the British, adding:

"They ought to give us full complete co-operation so that whole case can be fully explored and so that any aides or assistants of Fuchs in this country can be unearthed."

Senator Ferguson noted in a separate interview that the information Fuchs admitted giving the Russians came from this country, where he worked on the atomic project during the war.

Scotland Yard to Stand By As FBI Questions Fuchs

LONDON, May 4 (AP)—A Scotland Yard agent will stand by when FBI agents question Dr. Klaus Fuchs about Russian espionage in America.

Responsible sources today said that Britain imposed this condition in granting an American request for permission to interview Fuchs in prison.

Britain was reported reluctant at first to grant the request, but later acceded, with conditions, because of the "exceptional circumstances" of the case. Informants refused to discuss any of the other conditions.

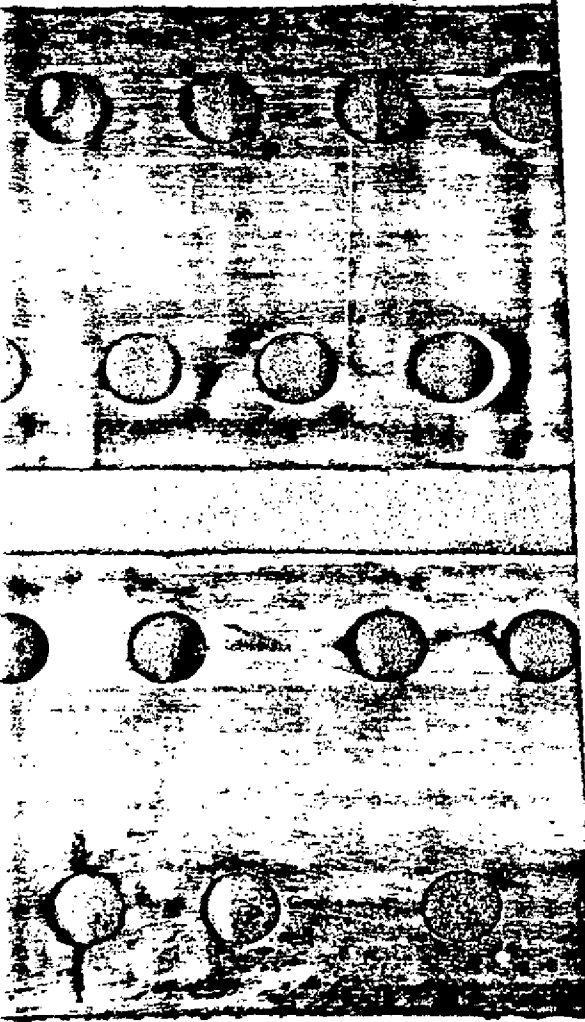
Fuchs was sentenced last March to 14 years in prison for disclosing British-American atomic secrets to the Russians. He contacted Soviet agents here and in New York City and Boston while employed as a physicist by the British government.

The Home Office has refused to disclose his state of disposition.

MOSCOW CLAIMS THAT FUCHS WAS NOT A SOVIET SPY
ALL INFORMATION CONTAINED
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"London - The local papers have published a report from TASS, the Soviet Press Agency that Dr. KLAUS FUCHS, English scientist who was sentenced to 14 years in prison for giving atomic secrets to the Soviet Union, lied when he stated that he was a Soviet Atomic spy.

"FUCHS was not known to the Soviet authorities, stated TASS, not even one Soviet agent had contacted him.

"The Russian press agency states:

"Reuters news agency published a report about the court procedure against the British Physicist, Dr. FUCHS, which took place in London and where FUCHS was sentenced to 14 years in prison for the corruption of State secrets.

"In the lawsuit the chief British prosecutor, Sir HARTLEY SHAWCROSS, stated during the proceedings, that FUCHS gave atomic secrets to the agents of the Soviet Union.

"TASS therefore states that this is not true because FUCHS was not known to the Soviet government and no "agents" of the USSR had any connections with FUCHS.'

"Spokesmen for the Communist Party stated that FUCHS was not a member of the party. The Communist Party would not tolerate a man in their ranks who was occupying himself with spying without any regard for which side he was carrying on this service.

The first section has been started with a synopsis of the facts which briefly summarizes the important developments.

Your attention is directed to the fact that considerable information from [redacted] has been set forth in detail in this brief. As you know, this information has not been given any dissemination by us, having been received under agreement that it will not be disseminated. There is also contained in the brief highly classified information relating to atomic energy developments.

In the section entitled "Collaboration with [redacted] MI-5," only that information dealing with the over-all aspects of our collaboration has been set forth. Incidents such as the Lord Portal affair were not set forth and distorted press accounts dealing with alleged activities of FBI Agents in Britain which have no basis in fact, have been ignored.

The section dealing with "Investigation Preceding the Identification of Harry Gold as [redacted]" of course, been summarized to a considerable extent. However, an effort was made to indicate the scope of [redacted]
