It had been reported to the Department that GOODMAN had previously been employed as Assistant Professor of Chemistry at the University of Colorado, Boulder, Colorado. In September, 1946, his name appeared on a list of speakers on the Soviet Union, sponsored by the Denver Council of Soviet-American Friendship. He is reported to have been present at a meeting of Boulder Communists on the evening of April 7, 1947. In May, 1947, at a meeting of the Colorado-Wyoming Academy of Science, the subject with two others introduced a resolution that the United States destroy all fissionable materials including all atomic bombs and installations. In a recent investigation conducted at Boulder, Colorado, it was ascertained that GOODMAN was discharged by the University of Colorado at which time he was accused of lying about his "red connections."

The Secretary of the Vice President of the U. S. has referred to us a personal letter received by the Vice President from Igor Gouzenko in which Gouzenko requests the assistance of the Vice President in obtaining financial assistance from the U. S. for information he furnished to our country concerning Soviet espionage in the U. S. He cites a \$100,000 tax-free award made by Congress in 1956 to William Frederick Friedman, a cryptologist who broke Japan's diplomatic code before the outbreak of World War II. Gouzenko requests a similar grant. He also requests the assistance of the Vice President in having a novel he wrote entitled "The Fall of a Titan" made into a movie. The Secretary of the Vice President has requested "a reading" on the information set forth in Gouzenko's letter.

Gouzenko was a code clerk for the Soviet Military Attache in Ottawa, Canada, from the Summer of 1943 until his defection to Canadian authorities in September, 1945. He furnished considerable information to Canadian authorities concerning the existence of a widespread Soviet Military Intelligence network in that country. Some of the information he furnished, of course, had American ramifications.

### ALGER HISS

In his letter Gouzenko claims that in 1945 he told American authorities that one of the Assistants to Secretary of State Stettinius was a Soviet spy and later Hiss was unmasked as this spy.

The facts are that the Bureau's identification of Hiss as a Soviet agent came through the revelations of Whittaker Chambers and not through information furnished by Gouzenko.

### KLAUS FUCHS

In his letter Gouzenko claims he identified one Professor Halperin as a Soviet spy operating in Canada and that after

In his letter Gouzenko claims he exposed two important Soviet spies operating in the U. S. under the names of Ignacy and Bunia Witzak.

The information furnished by Gouzenko concerning the Witzaks was the basis for an intensive Bureau investigation of these individuals. Our investigation revealed that Witzak was an assumed identity. Witzak and his wife subsequently disappeared while under surveillance and reportedly returned to the Soviet Union. We identified a number of individuals in the U. S. recruited by Witzak for intelligence assignments in the Orient and South America. This case was presented to the Department for prosecutive action. Prosecution was declined on the basis of Witzak's absence and insufficient evidence against his associates.







HARRY GOLD, who has confessed to having engaged in Soviet espionage work, advised on October 18, 1950 that on the evening of December 26, 1946, he received a telephone call at his place of employment from "JOHN" (identified by GOLD as ANATOLI A. YAKOVLEV), the Soviet agent with whom he had steadily engaged in espionage on atomic energy from March, 1944 to late January or early February, 1946. "JOHN" told him to go to the rendezvous at the Earle Theatre in New York City at the designated time that evening and GOLD went to the theatre well in advance of said time. At one minute before 8:00 P.M., he went to the upstairs lounge of the theatre where he was accosted by a man whom GOLD positively identified from a photograph as being identical to PAVEL IVANOVICH FEDOSIMOV. Upon noticing GOLD'S astonishment at not meeting YAKOVLEV, FEDOSIMOV said "I am Paul," pronouncing it as though it were "Pawl." FEDOSIMOV then

GOLD immediately recognized this as a means of identifying an alternate Soviet agent which had been agreed upon by YAKOVLEV and GOLD in August, 1945. FEDOSIMOV immediately said, "You have papers from the doctor?" The word "doctor" was the code name used by YAKOVLEV and GOLD for Doctor KLAUS FUCHS. GOLD replied in the negative. A look of savage disappointment came over the features of FEDOSIMOV, who then instructed GOLD in halting English to proceed to the southwest corner of 34th Street and Eighth Avenue, but "outside the bar," where GOLD was to meet YAKOVLEV in an hour.

The report indicated HALPERIN was operating in Canada under Red Army Intelligence.

HYDROGEN BOMB IS A "BOGEY OF WALL STREET" SAYS MOSCOW. This statement was broadcast as a deliberate lie. Stalin Russia knew U S could make hydrogen bomb, but called it "a myth...a fairy tale" for propaganda purposes. ] o/s

But arrest of Dr Klaus Fuchs, one of top British atom scientists, who has made a complete confession that he gave Soviet agents atom and hydrogen bomb information, gave considerable basis in fact to Moscow's statement. Fuchs, while in U S, had access to top secret information concerning the atom bomb...and to an unpublished amount of information on hydrogen bomb.

Fuchs' espionage activity...and success of Canadian spy ring...made U S atom bomb nothing but a "bogey" to Communist Russia. And maybe hydrogen bomb, too, is little more than that now. U S would never start offensive war with H-Bomb. Russia will wait until she has it. Meanwhile, value to U S of H-bomb as a deterrent to Soviet aggression is lost.

And Russia may be ahead of U S in H-bomb development already. Prof Harrison Brown, atomic scientist of Univ of Chicago, said last week (before it was announced that Fuchs was a Soviet spy) that if Russians had decided to go ahead on H-bomb development "they were probably ahead of" U S now, because new developments in U S are so much slower than they were during war.

AND STALIN RUSSIA IS ON THE OFFENSIVE EVERYWHERE. In Germany the Russians are using semi-blockade tactics. There is talk of starting airlift again as countermeasure. This will weaken U S economy. Last airlift cost U S over 1/2 billion dollars...and Russia is stronger in Berlin today than when airlift was started.

A Communist plot to overthrow govt's of Boliva and Chile has been uncovered. Plot was backed by Cominform. Communist leaders from Brazil, Peru and Chile went to Bolivia to direct the planned uprising.

The Peking (Communist) radio called for revolt this week. In broadcast to Southeast Asia, Quomo Mo called on the youth of that area to rise and overthrow their govts as a contribution to "lasting world peace." o/s

"We have an underground, and we know exactly what is happening twenty-four hours a day," Vittorio Vidali told a U S correspondent in CP hq in Trieste. Vidali is reputedly Stalin's top assassin. He is credited with masterminding the death of Leon Trotsky in Mexico in 1940, the murder of Carlo Tresca, anti-Stalin leftist, in NYCity in 1943...and with many other political murders. Soviet Russia gave him right of asylum when he was deported from U S in 1928. He went to Moscow and attended Comintern's school for political sabotage. Later he went to Mexico where he was in charge of planning int'l underground brigade to fight U S in case of war with Russia.

And now Vidali says that Stalin knows exactly what is going on in Yugoslavia 24 hrs a day...and that "Tito's regime must go!"

All these facts prove that Soviet espionage activity is greater

than it has ever been before. Stalin's int'l spy ~~ing~~ has always been very effective. As a result he has been successful in nearly all the aggressive moves he has taken since U S recognized Communist Russia in 1933. o/s

Vidali's statement is a hint of the extent of espionage now going on in U S. No other country is a force for Stalin to cope with - his main spy effort must be concentrated here...and it must involve all phases of U S defense...not just A-bomb & H-bomb developments.

It was the FBI which disclosed the spy activities of Dr Klaus Fuchs. At time of Canadian atomic espionage disclosure Sec of State Byrnes said there had been no U S atom bomb leaks...that U S had exclusive knowledge of A-bomb manufacture. FBI findings have disproved this & other misleading statements made by Administration officials during past few years, which have lulled Americans into false sense of security.

It was FBI, too, that developed information leading to arrest of Judith Coplon & Valentin Gubitchev. It knew of espionage activities of Alger Hiss but, being a purely investigative body, could not prosecute him. When Hiss was finally indicted for perjury, FBI successfully followed a 10 year old trail and turned up information that led to his conviction. Now J Edgar Hoover says that job of protecting U S from spies is greater than during second World War. He has asked for 677 more staff members and an increased appropriation to run FBI during coming year. FBI is the only agency with power to investigate civilian espionage in U S.

BUT NATIONAL LAWYERS GUILD WANTS TO DESTROY POWER OF FBI. The Guild has come out with a new demand to cripple the only agency which can effectively fight espionage in U S: It also wants to arouse public opinion against J Edgar Hoover, FBI director, and if possible have him fired.

Earl Browder identified the Guild as a "transmission belt" of Communist Party as early as 1939. And Louis Budenz, former editor of Daily Worker, CP national newspaper, has stated "Most of the labor lawyers who work with and for the Communists are members of the National Lawyers Guild."

Six of the defense attorneys for the eleven convicted CP leaders were members of the National Lawyers Guild. Abraham Pomerantz, now defending Valentin Gubitchev, is a Guild member. So, too, is Carol King, who defended Hans & Gerhart Eisler. o/s

Lee Pressman & Nathan Witt, Guild members, were named by Whittaker Chambers & Elizabeth Bentley as members of Washington espionage ring.

Guild joined Stalin's Int'l legal front, the Int'l Assn of Democratic Lawyers when it was set up in Paris in 1946. Martin Popper, now a V P of the Guild, attended founding convention and was elected exec secretary. Robt Kenny, former Guild Pres, was elected a V P. At the 1948 convention of IADL in Prague, Popper urged that "observers" be sent to trial of 12 CP leaders in U S to "report to the world" the evils of their persecution. When the delegation arrived in U S in 1949 Popper went to UN with it to lodge formal protest against U S. It was claimed that by prosecuting the Communist leaders U S was violating the UN Declaration of Human Rights.

The Guild has fought many U S defense and security measures. It has opposed efforts to tighten up anti-espionage laws; fought non-Communist affidavits of Taft-Hartley law, the Mundt-Nixon bill, the loyalty oath; filed a brief in support of Gerhart Eisler, claiming Un-American Activities Committee was unconstitutional; opposed peace-time military training, & listing of organizations as subversive by the U S Atty Genl.

Communist Party has been gunning for the FBI for many years. Now

"RED DEAN" AGAIN TRYING TO ENTER U S. The Very Rev Hewlett Johnson, better known as the "Red Dean" of Canterbury, has applied for a visa to enter U S. He is an admitted Communist and a member of the editorial board of the London Daily Worker, natl newspaper of British Communist Party (CP).

U S Immigration laws forbid entry of any alien who believes in overthrow of U S Govt by force and violence. Immigration Service interprets this as referring to all Communists.

State Dept has violated U S laws twice to admit Red Dean. He was granted visa in 1945, and during trip that year spoke at rally of Natl Council of American-Soviet Friendship with then Under Sec of State Dean Acheson.

In 1948 he was refused a visa...at first. But State Dept said it was only because his tour was sponsored by Natl Council of American-Soviet Friendship, which is on Atty General's list of fronts.

And then State Dept gave him a visa...after a phony "welcome committee" had been set up to sponsor his tour. Committee was headed by Prof Ralph Barton Perry of Harvard University, front supporter & sponsor of Natl Council of American-Soviet Friendship, who has been praised by Pravda as one of best friends of Stalin Russia in the U S.

Rev Richard Morford, exec director of Natl Council of American-Soviet Friendship, actually managed Dean Johnson's '48 tour of U S for this committee. Morford has been convicted of contempt of Congress.

Red Dean's arrival was accompanied by a wave of publicity. He travelled all over U S addressing front groups & wound up his tour in NY. There he spoke at a huge Madison Square Garden Rally of the Natl Council of American-Soviet Friendship with Soviet Ambassador Panyushkin & Henry Wallace. He went to the "Little Kremlin" on 12th St to confer with U S Politbureau in its 9th floor offices, and then visited editorial offices of Daily Worker.

Johnson praised Communists during his tour. One statement he made is particularly interesting now. There were many Communist scientists in England, he said, "but they are too valuable for us to get rid of them... We don't hound them as you do in America. It would be absurd." Was he thinking of men like Dr Klaus Fuchs, the British scientist who was convicted of stealing A-bomb & H-bomb secrets from U S to give them to Stalin?  
CP's right arm in U S, the "Progressive" Party, recently published an article by the Red Dean in its semi-official paper, The Compass.

"I embraced scientific Socialism and Communism," Dean Johnson says in this article, though in 1948 he said he wasn't a CP member. He quotes "Soviet Text-book of Marxist Philosophy" and states, "This won me 40 years ago, first as scientist and engineer, then as Christian Minister." He also claims that Communism is compatible with Christianity.

"A civilization higher than any yet known" will be produced by

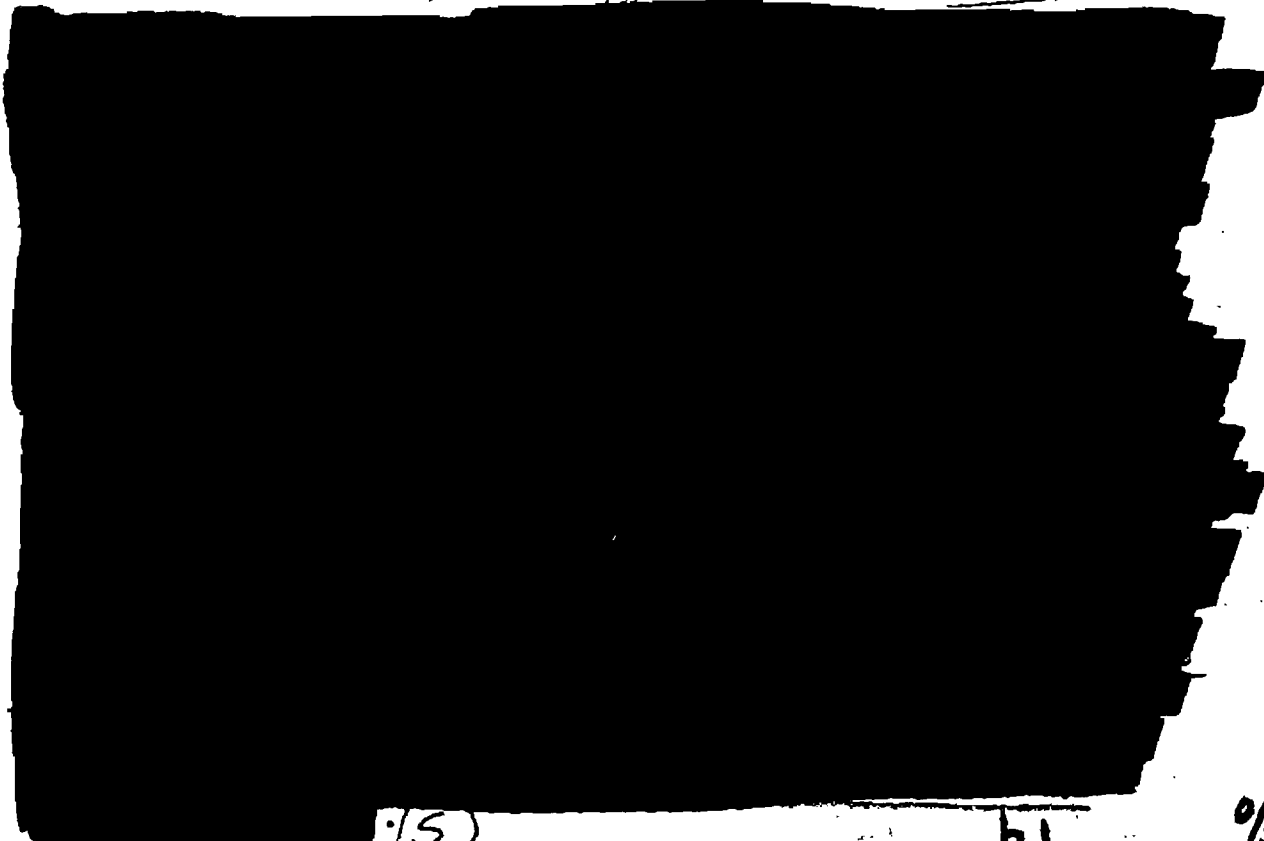

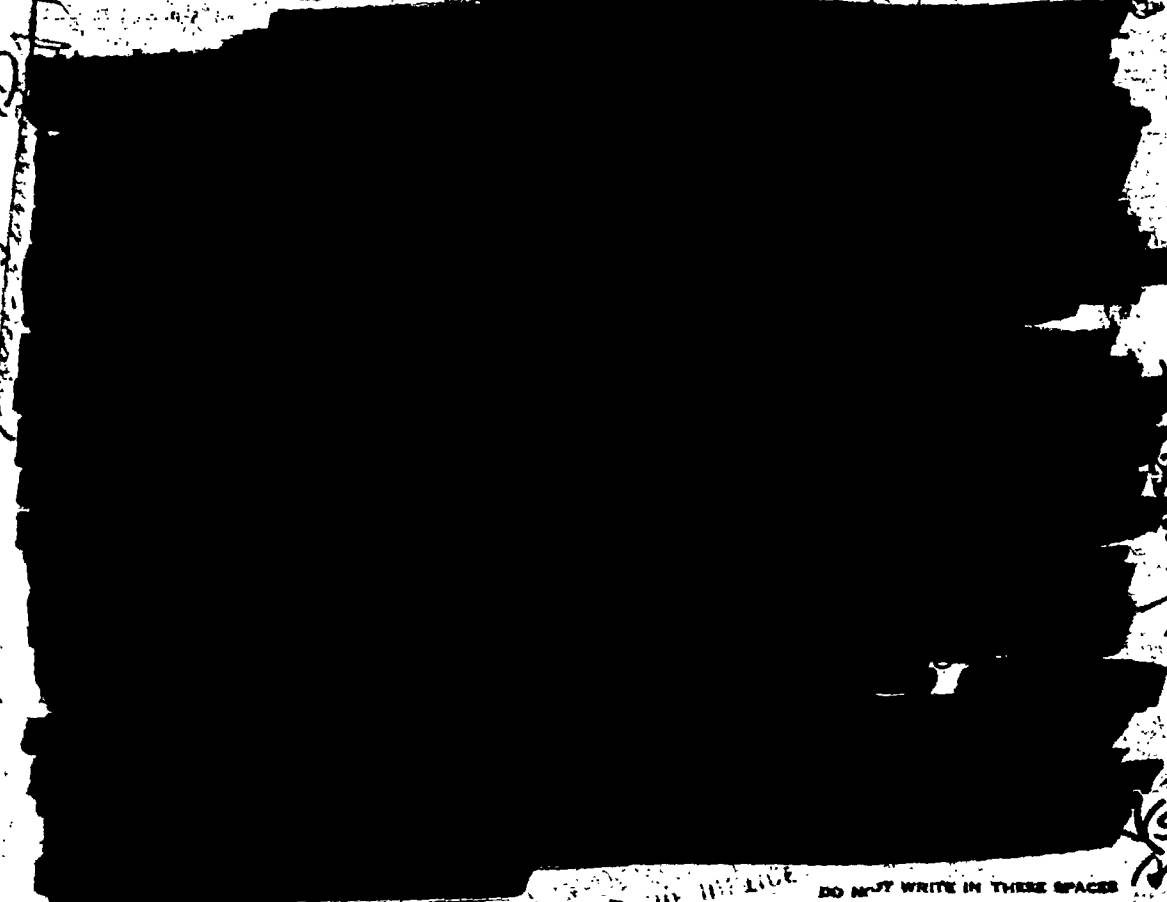

# Instructor accused of perjury

Arrested by FBI

Caltech Prof. Sidney Weinbaum, who protested that the Army wouldn't permit him to engage in secret military research work, was arrested today by the FBI on charges he concealed his membership in the Communist party.

The Russian-born mathematics teacher was accused of two counts of perjury in a criminal complaint issued by U. S. Commissioner Howard V. Calverley.

The charges are based on Weinbaum's alleged failure to admit Communist party membership both in a written security

honors and before an Army hearing officer.

Weinbaum, 52, was arrested this morning by FBI agents at his home, 185 South San Marino avenue, Pasadena.

U. S. Atty. Ernest A. Tolin said the first count of the complaint was based on the filing of an allegedly false statement with the U. S. Army Ordnance department.

Weinbaum, on April 8, 1949, filed a written statement for use by the Army in connection with a personnel security check, listing his memberships in various fraternal and professional organizations, the complaint said.

He did not, however, state that he had been a member of the Communist party, Tolin said.

The United States attorney said that Weinbaum had been a member of Professional Unit 123 of the Communist party and was known under the name of "Sydney Emission."

The second count alleged that Weinbaum again perjured himself on Sept. 23, 1949, while testifying before Lt. Col. Francis Wray, who was acting as chairman of the Industrial Employment Review board.

Colonel Wray, attached to the ordnance division, had been detailed to conduct a hearing on Weinbaum's protest that he had been excluded by the Army from employment on secret work. Caltech was conducting for the military.

At that hearing Weinbaum again denied membership in the Communist party, the complaint alleges.

Weinbaum, who was born in Kamenez, Russia, came to the United States April 28, 1922, and took the oath of citizenship Dec. 2, 1927, federal records disclosed.

He came to Caltech in September 1922, and received his bachelor of science degree there in 1924. In 1933 he obtained his doctorate, cum laude. Weinbaum remained at the institute as research fellow, specializing in theoretical physics.

During the war he was employed by Bendix Aircraft Corp. and later in other defense industries where he is said to have distinguished himself in aviation research.

In 1946, Weinbaum joined Cal-

tech's jet propulsion laboratory but was dropped from this research project in July, 1949, as result of which the professor protested against his "exclusion."

It was because of his allegedly false statements in the subsequent hearings on his protest that the perjury complaint was issued today.

Tolin said the arrest was made after lengthy investigation by FBI agents. The case will be given to the federal grand jury during the week of July 4, Tolin said.

Weinbaum's wife, Lena, refused to comment on her husband's arrest. The couple's daughter, Selma, also is employed at Caltech.

The professor was released in \$5000 bond pending the grand jury's hearing of the case.

While in the U. S. marshal's office, Weinbaum put in a call for an attorney friend, Spencer Austrian.

Austrian explained that he has retired from his law practice and probably will not represent Weinbaum but "would assist him in any way he could."

The lawyer said he had known the professor for 25 years. Weinbaum was well thought of, he said, and never was known to have any previous encounter with the law.

The suspect himself refused comment on his arrest.

"I do not care to discuss this matter in any way," he said.

The U. S. attorney was equally uncommunicative. Tolin refused to say whether Weinbaum's arrest was in any way connected with other arrests throughout the country.

# Caltech Jet Prof Jailed on Communist Lie Charge

## Red Spy Suspect Linked to Fuchs by FBI Agents

SYRACUSE, N.Y., June 16 (AP) — FBI agents linked a second American suspect today to the Klaus Fuchs spy ring which fed atomic secrets to Soviet Russia. They declared Alfred Dean Slack, a 44-year-old Syracuse chemist arrested here last night, admitted giving samples of a secret high explosive to Harry Gold, Philadelphia biochemist now awaiting trial on espionage charges.

Gold is accused of passing the samples and production secrets on to Semen M. Semenov—an employee of the Russian Amtorg Trading Corp.

Gold's arrest stemmed from information from Dr. Fuchs, who is serving a 14-year prison term in England for betraying British and American atomic secrets to Russia.

### Atom Project Worker

Slack—a \$75-a-week paint firm chemist—worked at Kingsport, Tenn., where the secret explosive RDX was manufactured, and later on the Manhattan Atomic Project at Oak Ridge, Tenn.

He is now being held in \$100,000 bail.

Slack roundly declared he was innocent when interviewed by reporters. Asked whether he knew Harry Gold, he replied:

FBI agents today seized a Caltech scientist and charged him with perjury and fraud against the government in denying Communist Party membership.

Taken into custody on a complaint filed with the Commissioner was Dr. Sidney Weinbaum, 52, of 185 S. San Marino Ave., Pasadena, a research fellow with the Caltech chemistry department.

Richard B. Hood, special agent in charge of the local FBI office, said Weinbaum testified under oath Sept. 23 before the Industrial Employment Review Board that he never had been a member of the Communist Party.

### In Unit 122

Actually, the charges set forth, the scientist held membership in the party's Professional Unit 122 under the name of Sydney Em-  
son

The FBI also asserted that on April 8, 1949, Weinbaum fraudulently omitted a statement of his Communist Party membership in a personnel security questionnaire he signed in connection with employment at Caltech's jet propulsion laboratory.

Dr. Weinbaum was employed in 1946 as a research scientist at the laboratory and stayed until last July.

Arresting agents said the scientist was born Israel Weinbaum in Russia and changed his first name to Sidney when he was naturalized here in 1927.

He came to the United States in 1922, giving his last residence as Lemberg, Poland, and his occupation as a student.

# Bank Bandit Shoots FBI Man 7 Times

PORTLAND, Or., June 16 (AP) — A convict out of prison just a day robbed a bank yesterday then walked into the arms of the FBI. A wild gun battle followed.

The battle ended with the convict, Wayne Long, 26, wounded twice, not critically, and one FBI agent, Leonard Frank, 30, nicked seven times by .45-caliber slugs.

It was a running battle, and the convict got about a block before eight FBI agents converged to shoot him down.

### Bullets Bounced

The convict swung his sub-machine gun at Frank at close range. The bullets seemed only to bounce off the FBI man. Later

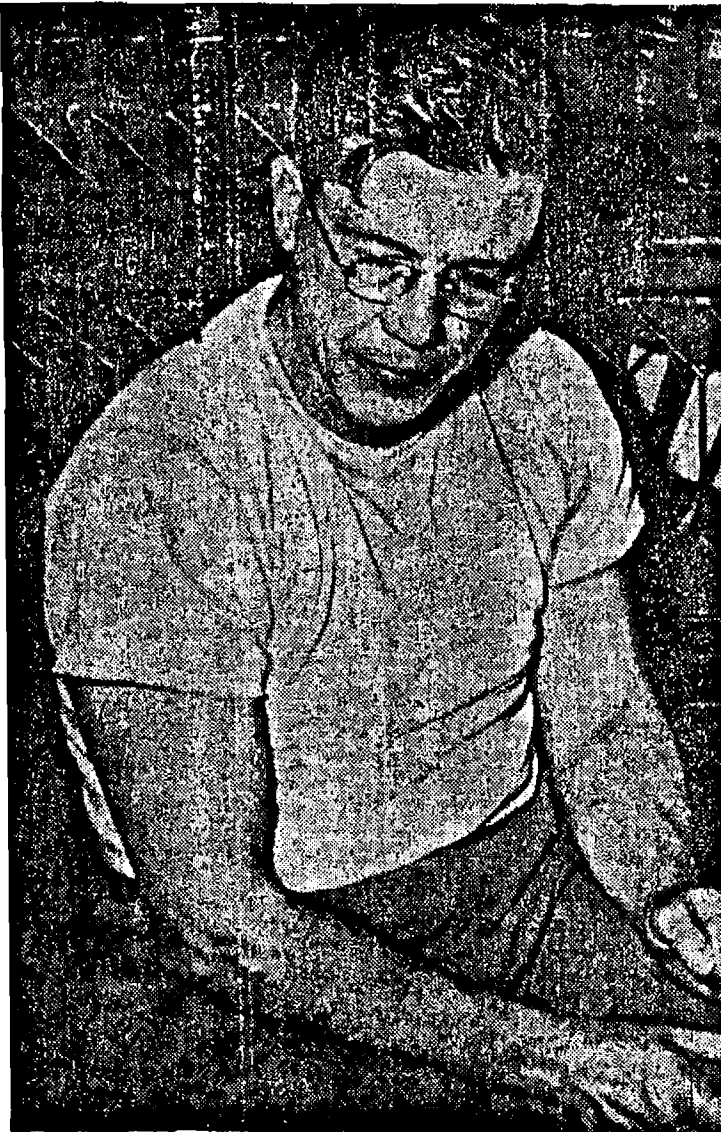

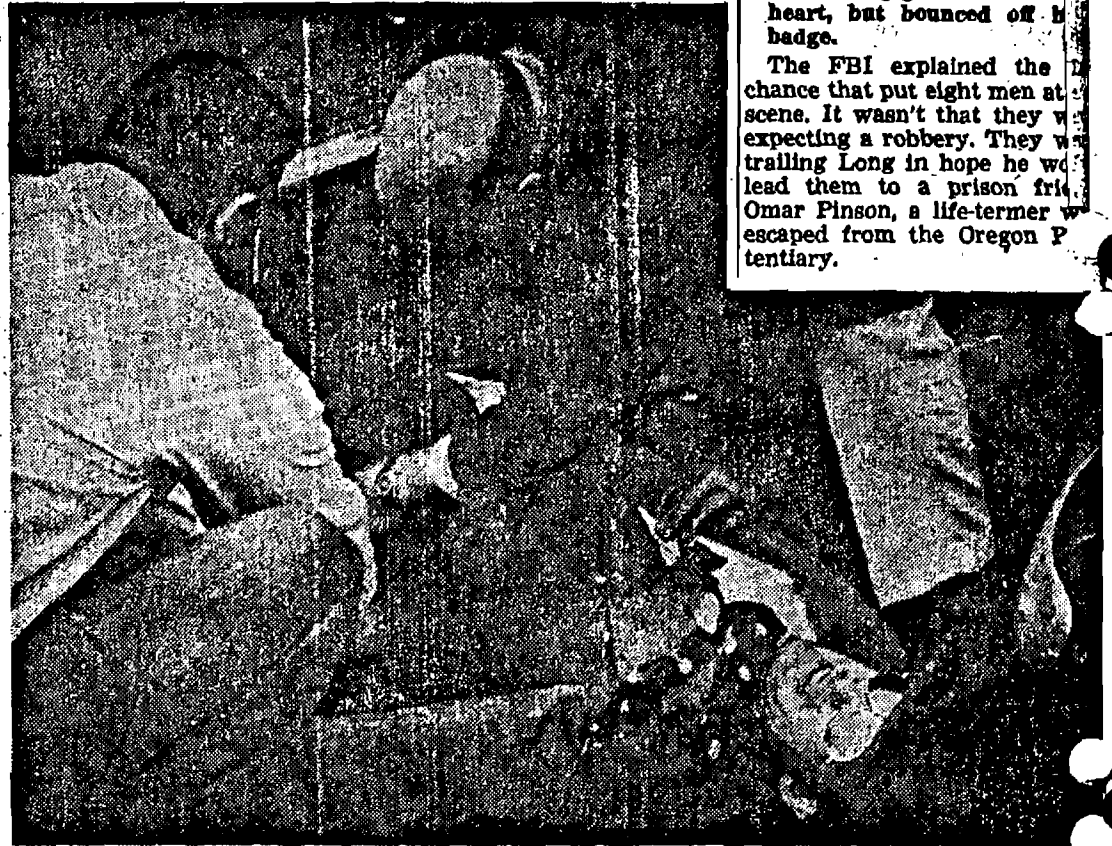

Mrs. MARGARETE WEIGERT had stated to the Immigration and Naturalization Service that her husband held a chair in the Department of Photochemistry at the University of Leipzig from 1914 until 1936. During his stay at the University of Leipzig, Leipzig, Germany, he was the author of more than 150 internationally known scientific papers and several major textbooks on photochemistry. Several of his relatives were also eminent scientists, among whom were PAUL ERHLICH, discoverer of 606, commonly known as the "magic bullet", and KARL WEIGERT, discoverer of the "Weigert Stain", a method to make tuberculosis bacillus visible.

Immigration and Naturalization Service records further reflect that other relatives were interested in politics in Germany, with an uncle serving as a Democratic member of the Berlin City Council and another relative was a Democratic Judge. All the relatives were dismissed when HITLER came into power and the relatives, along with FRITZ WEIGERT, were forced to flee.

Both L. H. GRAY and Dr. EMIL JULIUS KLAUS FUCHS were in the country in the fall of 1947. Since both are English scientists interested in radiation and since both have displayed interest in the atomic bomb, it is possible that L. H. GRAY has had some contact with EMIL KLAUS FUCHS.

**TWO ON "SPY" CHARGE**

**New York Arrests**  
Two more Americans, one woman, were arrested in New York yesterday for alleged complicity in activities of a spy ring which

obtained atomic information for Russia during and after the war. The Federal Bureau of Investigation said to-day that there would be more arrests.

Those held yesterday were: Abraham Brothman, 36, chemist and engineer, head of Ulster Chemical Co., Cliffwood, New Jersey; and Miss Miriam Moskowitz, 34, principal stockholder of the company.

Their detention brings to six the number of arrests made by the FBI since its agents went to England early this year to interview Dr. Klaus Fuchs, now serving a 14-year sentence for giving atom secrets to Russia.

They were charged with having arranged with Harry Gold, chemist, now awaiting sentence after having admitted passing information to Fuchs, that he should give "false, fictitious and manufactured information" when he testified before a grand jury on July 31, 1947. Brothman was also charged with having attempted to obstruct justice.
