

Each photograph bears a number on the back, and the explanatory information that appeared with the photograph appears under the corresponding number which will be described below. The photographs were obtained from a confidential source in the Philadelphia Inquirer, who advised that the photographs were nationwide news service photos and should not be reproduced for publication without permission of the news services.

Photo #1

"This photograph was secured from Cleveland on 9/11/34, and the description reads:

"Dr. ARISTID VON GROSE, visiting assistant professor at University of Chicago, at work in the lab. there during his experiments that resulted in isolating protactinium, number 91 in list of 92 known chemical elements. To date only 1/10 gram has been secured and at a cost that places its value at a million dollars an ounce. It is silvery in color and radioactive, with rays more penetrating than those of radium."

Photo #2

This photograph was secured from Cleveland on 9/11/34, and the description reads:

"Dr. A. VON GROSE, 29-year-old University of Chicago chemist at 88th annual meeting of American Chemical Society with Dr. J. V. MORRELL."

This photograph appeared in the Philadelphia Inquirer on 9/17/48, and the description reads:

"Dr. ARISTID VON GROSSE, one of seven original atomic scientists, has been elected president of Research Institute of Temple University. He lives at 456 Glyn Wynne Road, Haverford, (Pa.)"

Dr. VON GROSSE is still president of Research Institute at Temple University, and the current phone directory reflects that he is still living in Haverford, Pa., at 456 Glyn Wynne Road.

A description of VON GROSSE, as obtained from a confidential source at Temple University is as follows:

Age:	45 years
Height:	Approximately 5'10"
Weight:	185 pounds
Build:	Solid and well built, but not heavy
Hair:	Dark, straight, receding over temples, no noticeable bald spot
Eyes:	Color unknown
Glasses:	Wears glasses
Dress:	Neat, conservative dresser, looks like prosperous American industrialist
Speech:	Excellent and fluent English, no specific accent; however, one is slightly conscious of a foreign implication in speech
Characteristics:	Affluent, interesting talker. Has an air of efficiency

The same informant related that VON GROSSE often talks of his White Russian background and experiences in Russia. He relates differences between the United States and Russia and speaks of the United States as being stronger and superior to Russia since the United States has industrial knowledge and strength. He gives impression of being definitely opposed to the Russian Revolution and the present regime in Russia. He intimates that his views and his fortune required that he leave Russia. He has never spoken of his German or Chinese background. The same informant suggested that if this office desired any additional information on VON GROSSE, JAMES DONNELLY, 417 Grove Road, Warberth, Pa., should be contacted. The informant described

DONNELLY as the one who directs the Research Institute at Temple from an administrative and personnel standpoint. DONNELLY is an ex regular Navy Captain.

The same person advised that the Research Institute at Temple University operates on a commercial basis and does not handle research projects for the school. This commercial work is done for industry and the Government on fee or cost-plus basis. Thirty-five to forty people are regularly employed by this Institute, and quite a few part-time employees are hired as special projects demand.

The Bureau and offices receiving this letter are requested to examine these photographs and determine if these photographs are sufficient. Unless advised to the contrary, Philadelphia will make no further efforts to secure other photographs.

It will be noted that Klaus Fuchs, according to the records of the Inspector of United States Naval Material, General Electric Company, Schenectady, New York, contacted Dr. Herbert E. Pollock of the General Electric Research Laboratory on November 17, 1947, to discuss cyclotrons, synchrotrons, and betatrons. Dr. Pollock was investigated as an Atomic Energy Act applicant beginning in March, 1948, and in view of the non derogatory information developed as a result of that investigation, the case was closed on May 8, 1948.

You will note that in the investigation conducted by the Albany Office under the caption "John Paul Bennett; Myrtle Mildred Bennett, aka, Atomic Energy Act Applicant," it was indicated that Dr. Herbert E. Pollock was a reference for John Paul Bennett. The only information in the Bureau's file which is not available to the Albany Office reflects that in the investigation of "Alfred K. Stern and Martha Dodd Stern, Espionage - R," under the date of May 21, 1949, Alfred K. Stern contacted Dr. Herbert Pollock at telephone number Regent 7-5408. It was indicated that that individual could be reached at 45 E. 66th Street, Manhattan. There is no information in the Bureau's files to indicate the significance of the contact with Stern and it is not indicated that this person is identical with the subject of the present inquiry.

In view of Dr. Pollock's contact with Klaus Fuchs in November, 1947, it is requested that he be interviewed for all information in his possession regarding Dr. Fuchs. The details of this interview should be furnished Airmail Special Delivery to the Bureau, Boston, and New York.

Reference is made to Boston teletype to the Bureau dated February 27, last, and setting forth the photographs which were exhibited on that date to ROBERT HEINEMAN with no identifications effected.

In the interview of February 27, the following additional information concerning the instant related case was obtained from HEINEMAN:

ROBERT HEINEMAN'S MEXICAN TRIP, 1947

ROBERT HEINEMAN voluntarily advised that in late January or early February, 1947 he left Cambridge, Massachusetts, by automobile and went to Mexico. His prime purpose in going to Mexico he did not disclose to anyone at that time. It was to get as far away from his wife and an unhappy domestic life as possible. When he departed from Cambridge he stated he had an intention of never returning.

He entered Mexico at Nuevo Laredo, and proceeded directly to Monterey. He spent a week at the latter city in a roominghouse, the address of which he cannot now recall. He intended to spend his time in research work on the United States - Mexican War through examination of the documents contained in libraries at Monterey. After a week he determined his knowledge of Spanish was insufficient and he left Monterey for Mexico City. He remained in Mexico City for the greater part of his time in Mexico. He enrolled in Obrera University for courses in the Spanish language. He described the latter school as a Marxist school operated by the Confederation of Labor and he further noted that the word Obrera in Spanish means "workers." He stated that the school had been, prior to his arrival, a successful Communist school but that at the time he was there it was "broken down" and the only classes then being taught were in the Spanish language.

When at Obrera University he performed research at two national libraries in Mexico City, one of which he described as being located in a building dedicated solely to its own use and the other being located in a building occupied by other government offices.

He resided while in Mexico City at the Hollywood Arms (This is the best recollection of HEINEMAN of the name of the small inn but he notes that it may be a similar name and his memory may not be exact. that the inn belied its name and was in no way showy).

While in Monterrey, HEINEMAN had met the curator of the National Archives who was desirous of obtaining photographic copies of certain documents in the above described libraries in Mexico City. HEINEMAN stated he obtained these documents for the curator, whose name he cannot now recall.

While in Mexico City, HEINEMAN took two overnight trips to Tasco and Cuernavaca. He stated the latter trips were purely in the nature of vacation and that he was not away from Mexico City more than two nights on each occasion. He also took one daylight trip to Puebla, Mexico.

In mid-April, 1947 HEINEMAN returned to Monterrey and occupied a room in a boarding house, in which no one, other than himself, spoke English. It is his best recollection that the boarding house was owned by a Mexican named Saltillo. HEINEMAN while in Monterrey hired a guide to visit points of historical interest and spent approximately a week doing so.

Because of his success in obtaining the photographs described above for the curator of the National Archives at Monterrey he was permitted to photograph a considerable number of documents maintained in those Archives. He stated that the latter action was an unusual privilege afforded him and not usually afforded United States research scholars.

Late in April, 1947 he decided that he was idling away his time and that he might as well go back to Cambridge and once again attempt to straighten out his tangled domestic situation. He communicated with his parents in Florida and ultimately returned to the United States in time to meet them at their hotel in Baltimore, Maryland, on May 1, 1947.

HEINEMAN noted throughout his stay in Mexico he lived pretty much as a recluse, excepting for his association with fellow students at Obrera and with the curator of the National Archives at Monterrey, whom he is quite certain would recall him. He further noted that he possesses in his home all of the historical research data which he obtained in Mexico and offered to make these documents available for examination if the Bureau so desired. His attorney, former Special Agent JAMES F. MAHAN, readily assented to the latter suggestion. Since there appears to be no point to be proven, this matter is not being pursued further in the absence of advice from the Bureau. It is further suggested that additional investigation at Mexico City is unnecessary.

HEINEMAN was queried concerning his possible actual associations with persons known to KLAUS FUCHS in the latter's trip to Mexico. HEINEMAN stated that as far as he knew FUCHS went to Mexico purely on a vacation, that he had never been informed as to exactly where FUCHS went and since their relations were strained at the time he never made inquiry. As far as he knows, he met no one in Mexico who had earlier met FUCHS or was known to FUCHS at any time.

KLAUS FUCHS' TRIP TO MEXICO

As indicated above, ROBERT HEINEMAN stated that KLAUS FUCHS was known to have vacationed in Mexico in the fall of 1945. Los Alamos records reflect that this vacation occurred in November, 1945. HEINEMAN further noted that throughout his tenure at Los Alamos, FUCHS had many times suggested that KRISTEL HEINEMAN and the HEINEMAN children join FUCHS at Los Alamos. FUCHS allegedly had volunteered to support the HEINEMAN family, ROBERT HEINEMAN excepted. KRISTEL HEINEMAN has corroborated this item and noted that her brother's exclusion of ROBERT HEINEMAN from his invitation was at her request.

ROBERT HEINEMAN stated while KLAUS FUCHS was in Mexico he sent postal cards to the HEINEMANS, all of which were destroyed shortly after their receipt. He also sent the HEINEMAN boy, STEVEN, a "Mexican version of an erector set." ROBERT HEINEMAN further advised that in his trip to Mexico, KLAUS FUCHS had driven an automobile. HEINEMAN did not know whether FUCHS had owned or borrowed this car but he knew that at sometime while at Los Alamos FUCHS had purchased a car. This car, according to HEINEMAN's best memory, was a Buick. He can recall this because when FUCHS concluded his employment at Los Alamos he wrote a letter to KRISTEL HEINEMAN offering to give her the automobile. He stated if she wished to possess the car he would drive it to Cambridge from Los Alamos. The HEINEMANS discussed the offer and HEINEMAN can remember that there was considerable discussion as to whether or not they could afford to operate a Buick as well as the Chevrolet which HEINEMAN was then driving. It was finally decided that they could not do so and FUCHS was informed that the HEINEMANS were grateful but had no use for his vehicle.

INTERVIEW WITH KRISTEL HEINEMAN, FEBRUARY 27, 1950

KRISTEL HEINEMAN was interviewed at the Westboro Hospital on February 27, 1950 and the photographs enumerated in Boston teletype to the Bureau dated February 27, were exhibited to her with negative results. It was noted that the teletype to the Bureau, New York and Albany, setting forth the descriptions of the individuals contacted by her and FUCHS in June, 1946 represent a complete summary of all information obtained from her on this particular item.

In addition to the matter related in the cited teletype, KRISTEL HEINEMAN provided the following information: She insisted that she never knew or suspected that her brother, KLAUS FUCHS, was at any time engaged in Communist Party activity of any nature whatsoever while in the United States. She further insisted she had never known of any such activity on the part of her brother GERHARDT. She firmly declared that all political activity in Germany on the part of the FUCHS family was in the nature of anti-Fascist, i.e., they were wholeheartedly and unitedly opposed to Hitler and primarily upon religious grounds. She insisted she had no memory of any of KLAUS FUCHS' associates or contacts in Chicago, Buffalo, Philadelphia or New York.

KRISTEL HEINEMAN was interviewed at the Westboro State Hospital, Westboro, Massachusetts, in the late afternoon of March 2, 1950, by Special Agents JOHN J. O'LALON, III, and BRENTON S. BORDON, in the presence of Dr. ROLLINS HADLEY.

These photographs will be set forth in a Boston teletype reflecting the interview with ROBERT HEINEMAN, which is to occur at 2:00 P.M., this date.

KRISTEL HEINEMAN was specifically questioned with reference to her walks with her brother, KLAUS FUCHS, in the Boston area. It is noted that she had earlier failed to recollect ever walking with FUCHS in Boston.

On March 1, 1950, KRISTEL stated that in company with her children and KLAUS FUCHS, she walked to Harvard Square, Cambridge, Massachusetts, in February, 1945, took the subway to Park Street Terminal, Boston, Massachusetts, and then walked across the Boston Common and the Public Gardens to observe the swan boats and to let the children ride thereon. This was obviously error, inasmuch as the swan boats are lifted from the frog pond in early November and the pond is drained for the winter. It is not placed in operation again until mid-spring. When this was ultimately pointed out to her, she stated she could not remember on what occasion they had visited the swan boats but that it had been done possibly in June, 1943.

KRISTEL HEINEMAN also revealed at this time that when her brother first visited Boston in the summer of 1944, on two or three different evenings, he had taken her dinner dancing. They proceeded in the following fashion: KRISTEL HEINEMAN and KLAUS FUCHS, accompanied by no one else, walked from 144 Lakeview Avenue, Cambridge, Massachusetts, down Huron Avenue to Harvard Square, where they took the subway.

to Park Street. They came out of the tube and walked across Boston Common to a dinner-dance spot along Boylston Street, between Tremont and Charles. She could not recall the name of the place where they had dined and dance, but she remembers clearly that KLAUS FUCHS had selected it without consulting her and in advance of their departure from Cambridge. There are two such establishments on Boylston Street in the area described by her. One of these is Steubens, and she specifically denied that that was the place to which they had gone. The other is in an alley midway in the block described and is known as "The Pirate's Den." This name did not mean anything to her, although she did not deny that it was possibly the place to which they had gone. She specifically stated that KLAUS FUCHS had never left her on any one of these evenings to go to the men's room, the bar, or any other place. She insisted that they had met no one on the three or four occasions they had visited the establishment. She further insists that all such dancing expeditions occurred in the summer of 1944, and none thereafter.

KRISTEL HEINEMAN stated that she had never at any time walked, ridden, or in any way visited Boston's shopping center, financial center, or waterfront in company with KLAUS FUCHS.

KRISTEL HEINEMAN studied the several photographs of GEORGE PLACZEK now available in Boston and categorically denied that she had ever seen or heard of this man; that he was not known to her as an acquaintance of her brother's or any other mutual acquaintance.

Reference is made to the instructions contained in New York teletype of February 25, 1950, requesting a review of Security Index subjects in an effort to locate persons answering the general description of the unknown subject with alias [redacted] b1

The files of the Newark Office reflect that ~~JACK GREENFIELD~~, with aliases, ~~JAKE GREENFIELD~~, ~~JACOB GREENFIELD~~, ~~JOHN DAVE~~, answers this description; however, no photograph of him is available in the files of the Newark Office. A review of the Security Matter - C case pertaining to ~~GREENFIELD~~ reveals that he has been employed by the U. S. Industrial Chemical Company, 390 Lorena Avenue, Newark, or subsidiaries thereof since about 1935.

In 1943 during his employment with Strooch and Kittenberg, a subsidiary no longer in existence, Mr. C. JOHNSON, Plant Manager of Strooch and Kittenberg, was interviewed concerning GREENFIELD. At that time JOHNSON furnished considerable information about GREENFIELD's Communist activities, although they were on friendly terms and JOHNSON had been a guest in GREENFIELD's home on several occasions.

It has been determined that JOHNSON's full name is CHRIS JOHNSON and that he is employed in the home office of U. S. Industrial Chemical Company, 60 East 42 Street, New York City.

An effort was made to secure a photograph of GREENFIELD through an established contact in U. S. Industrial Chemical Company, but it was ascertained that this contact is no longer connected with the concern. It is therefore suggested that the New York Office endeavor to secure a photograph through CHRIS JOHNSON. In the event no photograph is available, the Newark Office should be promptly advised in order that efforts may be made to secure surveillance photographs. Should a photograph be obtained by New York, copies should be furnished the Bureau, Boston, and Newark.

RE: FOOCASE

I called Inspector Belmont at the Bureau on the afternoon of March 7 and advised him that Miss NORMA ABRAMS advised me that members of the press were needling JOHN G. BRUNINI, Foreman of the Special Grand Jury, since they know he is rather publicity hungry. They asked him, for instance, if the Grand Jury was going to be interested in the FUCHS case and he would not deny that they were interested in it but stated that apparently Washington had clamped a lid down on the case. When asked by the press if he intended to pry the lid off, he laughed and commented that the members of the Grand Jury individually were all interested in the FUCHS case. He also told the press that the Grand Jury was going to meet in Executive Session on Thursday to review the whole matter of their deliberations and see if they could mark out the path they were to travel for the rest of their existence.

On March 7, I called Mr. Donegan to discuss this matter with him and he said that he had noticed a couple of articles in the paper this morning quoting BRUNINI's interest in the FUCHS case. Donegan said that no mention was made of the FUCHS case in the Grand Jury in Donegan's presence. Whether it was discussed in Executive Session or with the press Donegan was not advised. Donegan further advised that the Grand Jury is going to be in Executive Session on Thursday, March 9.

On the afternoon of March 7 I called Mr. Belmont's attention to an article appearing in the "Post" on March 7, 1950, which quotes BRUNINI as saying that the FUCHS case "unquestionably has a New York angle. There seems to have been a lid clamped down in Washington. We are very much interested in the FUCHS case as individuals", he added. I also advised Mr. Belmont of my conversation with Donegan and told him also that Donegan had advised me that he intended to be in Washington tomorrow, March 8.

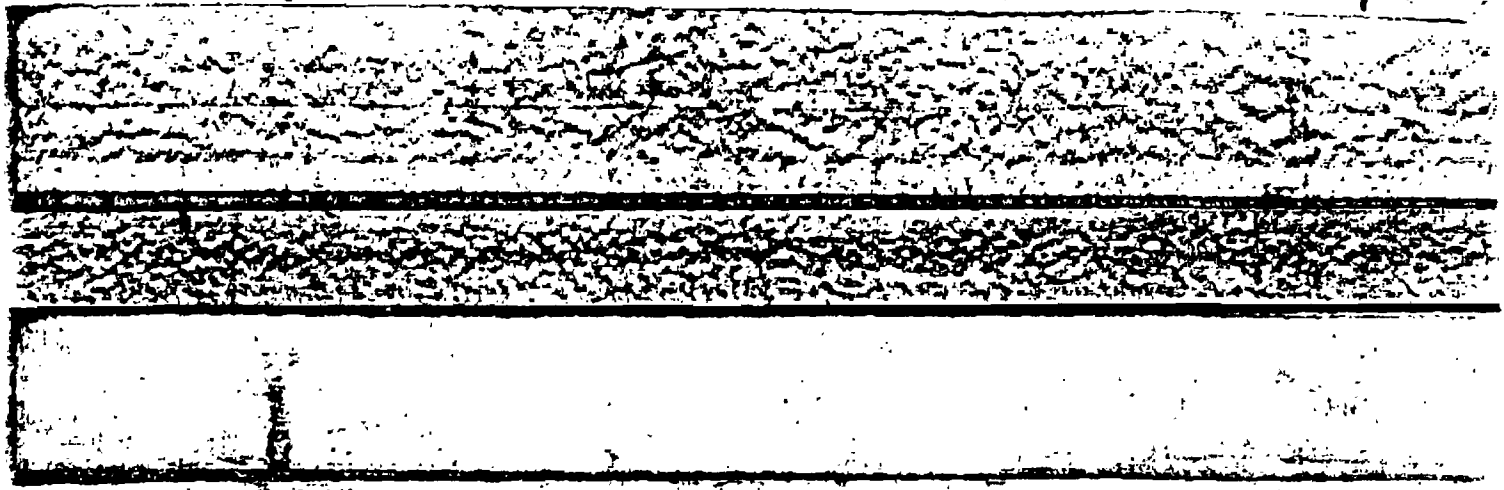

LAFAZANOS WAS INTERVIEWED EXHAUSTIVELY ON FEBRUARY FIFTEEN, NINETEEN FIFTY. AS INDICATED IN ABOVE PAGE NINETEEN, HE WAS HAZY. HE STATED AT THAT TIME THAT HE WOULD NOT RECOGNIZE THE BACTERIOLOGIST TO WHOM HE REFERRED AND WAS UNABLE TO PROVIDE FURTHER DESCRIPTIVE NOTES OF SAID INDIVIDUAL, ALTHOUGH ALL FEATURES OF THE HUMAN FACE AND FRAME WERE SUCCESSIVELY CALLED TO HIS ATTENTION. LAFAZANOS IS BELIEVED, BY THE AGENTS WHO INTERVIEWED HIM, TO BE AN UNRELIABLE CHARACTER OF PERHAPS UNSTABLE MIND. A SIMILAR AND EARLIER CONCLUSION WAS REACHED BY THE AUTHORITIES AT THE WESTLORO STATE MENTAL HOSPITAL, ON THE BASIS OF HIS CONTACT WITH THAT INSTITUTION IN MID-SUMMER NINETEEN FORTY NINE. IT IS NOTED THAT DURING WORLD WAR TWO LAFAZANOS WAS CLASSIFIED FOUR DASH F BY REASON OF A MEDICAL STATEMENT THAT HE WAS THEN A PSYCHONEUROTIC. The Fate of a Family

By Dr. CURT BLEY

On Friday Scotland Yard in LONDON arrested Dr. KLAUS
EMIL JULIUS FUCHS for alleged disclosure of atomic secrets. The
world has been enriched by another atomic sensation. Dr. FUCHS
occupied one of the key-positions in British atomic research.
He was the chief of the Section for Theoretical Physics in the
British Atomic Research Centre at HARWELL.

Dr. FUCHS is not unknown in GERMANY. He is the son of
Professor EMIL FUCHS who until 1933 occupied a chair for theology
at the Pedagogic Academy at KIEL. Prof. EMIL FUCHS was a Christian
Socialist and a leading member of the German Quaker Congregation.

Prof. FUCHS had three children—one daughter, the sons
KLAUS and GERHARD. It was typical of the younger socialist
generation before 1933 that it selected the more radical road
opposite the fathers. KLAUS studied mathematics and physics,
GERHARD political economy and jurisprudence. Both were known in
little KIEL as the "red foxes." This term also applied to the
color of their hair.

The year 1933 dispersed the family. It suffered the
bitter fate which HITLER had prepared for the opposition. The
National Socialists at first made a proposal to the professor of
theology, FUCHS, because of his high personal esteem, and when he
refused it, they dismissed him.

Some time later Prof. FUCHS was arrested and sentenced
to one month in jail for insulting the state government. Despite
all dangers he remained in GERMANY. Stronger than ever before he
worked in the interest of the Quaker movement.

His son KLAUS, because of the fate of his father, knew very well that he could not remain in GERMANY. In the first place he was interested in science and wanted to enter upon a university career. During the first years after HITLER's assumption of power, foreign countries made scholarships available to German scientists who suffered political persecution. KLAUS FUCHS succeeded in obtaining a British scholarship and emigrated to OXFORD. The FUCHS family is Aryan, and for his emigration only his political sentiments were decisive. He has never concealed them.

In ENGLAND, KLAUS FUCHS accomplished his first scientific work within the sphere of theoretical physics, at that time far removed from any practical use. It was sensational. In ENGLAND the scientific career was open to him.

Here in GERMANY something terrible had happened in the meantime. KLAUS FUCHS' sister, an intelligent and artistically highly-gifted individual, had married a worker, driven by the idealism of the students' movement which also demanded a personal decision. Her husband was sent to the concentration camp TORGAN after 1933. After a long time he succeeded in escaping with the aid of his wife who had hidden civilian clothes near the camp. When the personal relations were interrupted despite the successful escape, she committed suicide in a tragic manner.

Her brother GERHARD was arrested by the GESTAPO for illegal activity and sentenced to a high fine.

Prof. FUCHS finally left GERMANY in 1943. He stayed in SWITZERLAND until 1945, where he wrote in his high seventies his last books "LEONHARD RAGAZ—Prospect of Our Time" and "Christianity and Socialism." Prof. FUCHS returned to GERMANY and resided in FRANKFURT, BAD PYRMONT, and BERLIN. Then he was offered a chair at the University of LEIPZIG. He accepted it and still occupies the chair for theology at LEIPZIG.

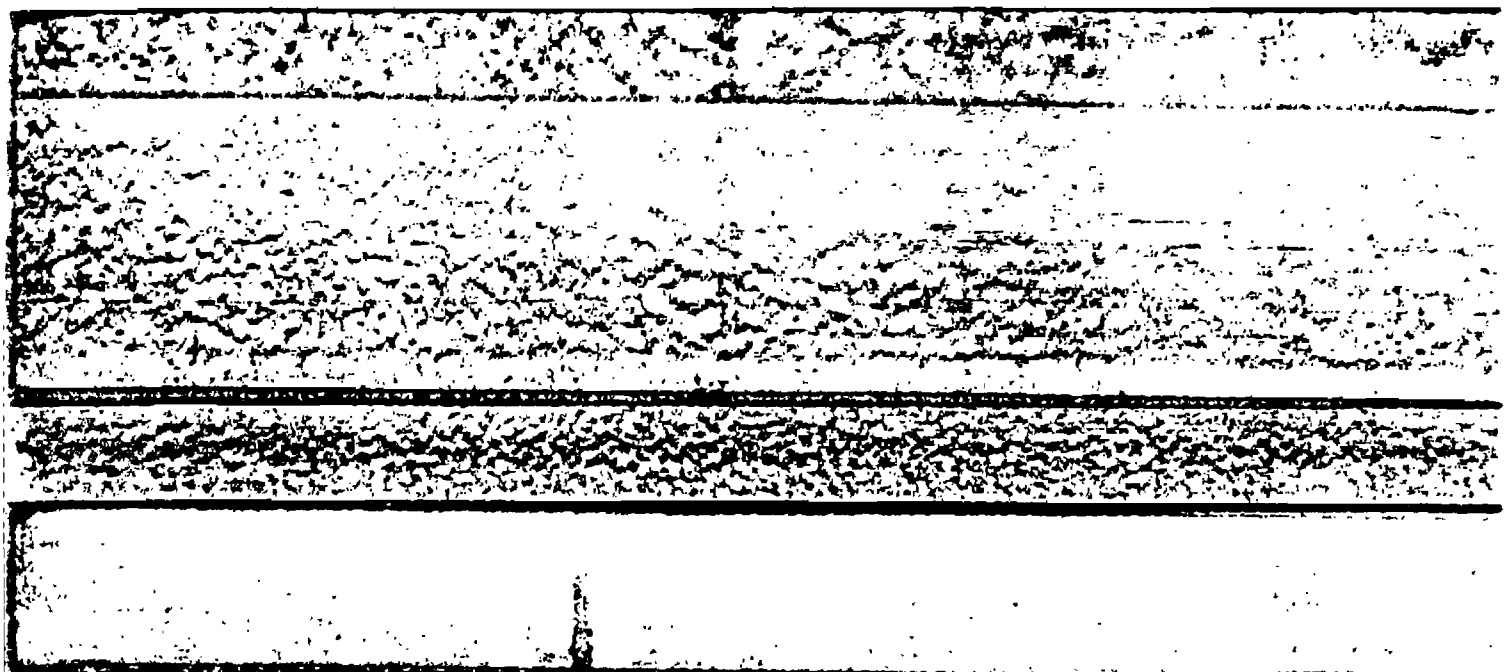
