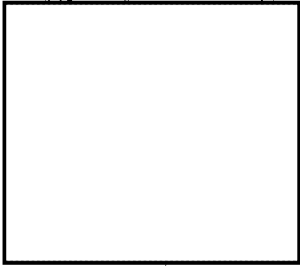

Captioned publication carried a snide and inaccurate editorial which appeared in its December 28-31, 1967, issue. The editorial contained erroneous allegations concerning the FBI. The Director has inquired: "Did we do this?"

BACKGROUND:

Attached is a copy of an editorial captioned "Check it out?" which appears in the December 28-31, 1967, issue of the "Washington, D. C., Examiner"--the tabloid-type newspaper started this year by D. C. Transit executive O. Roy Chalk. This editorial states that the November 22-26, 1967, issue of the "Washington, D. C., Examiner" contained an article reporting on "a secret agreement between the CIA and the State Department to protect their sexual screwballs from the light of day." The editorial continues that "The CIA and the FBI paid us an unfriendly visit... (and) said there was no truth" in the story which appeared in the November 22-26 issue. The editorial then charges that the FBI and the CIA "carry their policies of secrecy so far that they refuse to cooperate with the nation's press even on news stories involving national interest. Neither has ever given a reporter the time of day."

This editorial is wrong not only in stating that the FBI contacted the newspaper regarding the article in the November 22-26 issue, but also in stating that the FBI refuses to cooperate with the nation's press. In all probability, CIA and State Department representatives (rather than CIA and FBI personnel) contacted the "Washington, D. C., Examiner" with regard to the November article.

Reference is made to memorandum from Jones to Bishop dated 12-29-67 to which is attached the editorial appearing in the December 28, 1967, issue of the above paper which is very critical of the FBI and inaccurate. The editorial alleges that representatives of the FBI and the CIA called on the paper to assert that "there was no truth in an Examiner story the issue of November 22-26 which reported a secret agreement between the CIA and the State Department to protect their sexual screwballs from the light of day." The editorial stated that the CIA and FBI representatives demanded a retraction of the article, which was refused.

It was recommended and approved in the above-mentioned memorandum of 12-29-67 that someone from my office call on [redacted] to straighten him out concerning the editorial and acquaint him with the Bureau's procedure with regard to news matters. The Director also instructed that the paper be removed from all mailing lists.

After trying for several days, I was able to see [redacted] on 1-5-68, and at the same time I talked with [redacted]. When advised by me that no representative of the FBI had called on the paper as indicated in the editorial, they both stated that they had been furnished this information by [redacted] who had informed them that he had so been visited by representatives of the FBI and CIA. They both indicated that they thought it was "peculiar" that an FBI Agent had made such a visit because the article in question had not mentioned anything whatsoever about the FBI.

They both immediately advised that they would print a complete retraction in the next issue of the Examiner and stated that they both admired the FBI and regret very much that we might have been embarrassed by the inaccurate information in their editorial. On this occasion to acquaint them thoroughly with the Bureau's procedures with regard to news matters for which they were very grateful and they both indicated that it was their desire to give complete cooperation to the Bureau in every way possible.

In accordance with the Director's instructions, we will remove the Washington Examiner from the Bureau's mailing lists. It is felt that this incident will serve a very useful purpose with our future relations with this new paper, and that it will certainly not undertake to print anything that will be derogatory to the Bureau in the future without first checking with us. If they carry out their promise, it well could be that this paper will prove to be a valuable ally of the FBI and we may wish to give consideration after an appropriate period of time to reinstating the paper on the Bureau's mailing list if the paper is favorable in its dealings with the Bureau. We will follow this closely and submit a recommendation concerning the possible reinstatement of the paper to the mailing list after an appropriate period of time, if future developments warrant it.

WHO'S WHO IN CIA?

An unusual book lies on our editorial desk. Its title is: WHO'S WHO IN CIA? -- A Biographic Reference Work Covering Collaborators of the Civilian and Military Secret Services of the US in 120 Countries.

Thus far, the world has never seen a publication of this sort. Therefore, our editor Franz HELM interviewed its publisher, Berlin publicist Dr. Julius MADER.

Question: Mr. MADER, what do you hope to achieve with this biographic secret service register?

Answer: The global strategists of North American imperialism use the scandal-ridden CIA like a dangerous weapon. All US espionage and sabotage activities are planned, prepared, executed, evaluated and controlled by specific individuals. If one wishes to take the required defensive steps against these subversive acts, one must be familiar with the organizers of North American "cloak-and-dagger" policy in sufficient time and with the maximum possible accuracy. My book names thousands of these subversive elements. In order to counter US global strategy in a special area, I placed emphasis on processing data from 120 countries on all five continents.

Question: This must have required an amount of effort which it is difficult to visualize. How long were you working on this book?

Answer: Ten years ago, I published a documentary report, entitled: Gangsters in Action, dealing with the establishment and crimes of the CIA. It could be said that I have been systematically working on WHO'S WHO IN CIA since that time.

Question: How does that affect the currency of the information?

Answer: Naturally, this is assured. On the basis of research, which was also conducted in Mexico City, Yokohama, Bombay and Beirut, the book reflects the personal status as of the end of 1967 -- in individual cases, it even goes as far as the Spring of 1968.

Question: You are contravening the intensified CIA secrecy regulations through your work.

Answer: Certainly. It is said that the US secret service is as full of holes as Swiss cheese. For example, in April 1966, The New York Times published the results of its CIA agent counting efforts. The editors had found some 2,200 CIA agents under diplomatic cover at foreign representative facilities of the Department of State alone. However, The New York Times was not permitted to name a single name. In my book, those interested will also find this circle of individuals, complete with detailed data, such as dates of birth, academic degrees, military service, career development, assignment locations and -- I have restricted the last category to West Germany and West Berlin -- residential addresses, complete with house numbers.

Question: Does the biographic data pertain only to CIA collaborators?

Answer: The CIA served as an appropriate synonym. You will also find that the publication contains personal data on secret service officers of the US Army, the US Navy, the US Marine Corps, and the US Air Force. US Military Attaches and US diplomats who have been expelled from socialist countries for espionage since 1945 are listed from A to Z. Also, anyone interested in FBI officials, both on domestic and on foreign assignment, will not find a derth of information.

Question: In how many languages has your work thus far appeared?

Answer: Currently, the book is ^{ready} in German and English. Publication in additional foreign languages is still currently under discussion with prominent publishing houses.

Question: In what do you see the principal effect of your right handily printed work?

Answer: First, in the fact that at one fell swoop, many hundreds of CIA men are deprived of their cover and the searchlight of public [opinion] is focused on them and their activities, which endanger peace. Second, in the fact that precisely during a presidential election year in the US, a considerable portion of the "invisible government -- as the CIA is called in the US vernacular -- is identified by name and face [pictures?]. And third, in the fact that the branded CIA people cannot simply be sent off on new assignments to locations where their past CIA activities have remained unknown.

Let us take only three concrete examples from the book: C. G. COGAN, E. A. MARELIUS and P. R. PETERSON were unmasked by name years ago as agents of the CIA in New Delhi. The Department of State has since installed these subversion experts in the US Embassies in Khartoum, Stockholm and Warsaw. Such "transfers" will be rapidly detectable in my book, not only because of the biographic portion but also on the basis of the extensive specific geographic index.

Question: How do you visualize your further activities regarding this book?

Answer: As a rule, journalists do not like to discuss their future work. However, I cannot erase my sentence in the introduction to the book, which states: "Additional reference works could follow."
