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

TO DATE: : DIRECTOR, FBI FROM : SAC, WFO (77-0-402I) SUBJECT: CENTRAL INTELLIGENCE AGENCY CHECK Re WFO lets to Bureau dated 11-6-51, 11-28-51, 12-13-51, and 1-3-52, subject as above. At present the Central Intelligence Agency is processing flimsy requests submitted by the FBI on 11-28-51, and dates subsequent thereto which makes the oldest list 44 calendar days old. Since the communication submitted to the Bureau on 1-3-52, CIA has returned to the FBI flimsies and has received from the FBI flimsies which tends to indicate that CIA is losing ground. This extreme CIA delinquency was discussed by SA L. RUSSELL WHARRY, WFO Liaison Agent to CIA, with CIA, on 1-4-52, and daily thereafter in an effort to expedite the return of flimsy requests. stated that he. in turn, discussed the situation with his superior, in each instance was instructed by to personally contact the unit or units responsible for the delay and appraise them of the seriousness of the delinquency and urge them to greater efforts. said he did as he was instructed but was unable to do more as b3 he was in no position to exert more pressure. is of the opinion that the interested CIA personnel are now fully cognizant of the situation and are exerting all efforts to produce the requested checks. However, based on past performance, was unwilling to make any commitments and stated that the hope Tor improvement might not materialize. Inasmuch as the situation presently existing at CIA precludes any possibility of meeting deadlines in coses requiring CIA checks and as there are at present approximately outstanding flimsy requests at CIA and as continuous pressure by this office has failed to improve this CIA delinquency, it is suggested that the Bureau may desire to discuss this problem with CIA on a Bureau level.

Efforts will be continued by the WFO to alleviate this extreme CIA delinquency and the Bureau will be advised of my change



Decker has been a CIA official since April, 1951. Kent, for many years a member of the Yale University faculty, has been with CIA since November, 1950.



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

Kea SUBJECT: CENTRAL INTELLIGENCE AGENCY ORIENTATION PROGRAM\_ has been irlendly in the past with Bureau representatives. advised that the <u>Central Intelligence</u> Agency periodically holds an Orientation Program for its employees in Washington, D. C. The next such program will be held the second week in April and will be attended by between employees from all the various divisions of CIA. stated he would like to schedule someone from the Bureau to speak on the organization, work, and functions of the FBI. He stated he thought it would be a great deal of benefit if someone from the Bureau could appear and acquaint their employees with the work and jurisdiction of the Bureau. He advised that one hour would be the desired time and that if we could designate someone, it would probably be scheduled for Thursday, April 10. These meetings are held in the Department of Labor. He pointed out that all of the personnel will be cleared for top secret information and that they provide their own guards so as to have security at the meetings. I advised McCarthy I would check, and let him know if we could have someone appear. It would appear to be to the Bureau's benefit to appear before this group and acquaint them with our responsibilities as it would certainly prevent CIA employees from invading our responsibilities through ignorance. Also, it might help in insuring that information of interest to the Bureau which isreceived by GIA is properly referred tolus. I suggest Special Agent Ralph R. Roach be designated to make this talk.
