SUBJECT: DISTRIBUTION OF CIA PERSONNEL LISTS THROUGHOUT FBI FIELD OFFICES AND RESIDENT AGENCIES

On March 5, 1952

[redacted] visited this office informally and, during the course of conversation, casually mentioned his desire that CIA furnish each FBI field office with lists of CIA personnel in the respective field divisions and that thereafter each field office disseminate these lists to Resident Agencies throughout the country. [redacted] mentioned that in several instances his representatives, even after displaying proper credentials, were questioned by citizens who occasionally called the FBI concerning the CIA representatives; that this resulted in possible impersonation investigations and required the FBI to contact CIA to determine the authenticity of the CIA representatives. [redacted] thought that if each FBI field office and Resident Agency in the country knew the names of CIA representatives, this situation might be remedied. He did not make an official request that such be done by this office.

I pointed out to [redacted] that such procedure would more properly emanate on a national level from Washington, D. C. I pointed out that on a national basis the procedure would probably involve considerable indexing work and correspondence by field offices with various Resident Agencies; that if changes in CIA personnel occurred, corrective action would be necessary by the FBI. I then mentioned the possibility that if such project were instituted for CIA, many other Federal agencies throughout the Government might, for similar reasons, desire that identical procedures be taken regarding their representatives, resulting in many thousands of names on various lists being disseminated through the FBI.

[redacted] said he would consider the matter further and might at some future date discuss the possibility with his CIA headquarters in Washington.

This is furnished for the Bureau's information in the event such inquiry should be instituted through CIA in Washington.

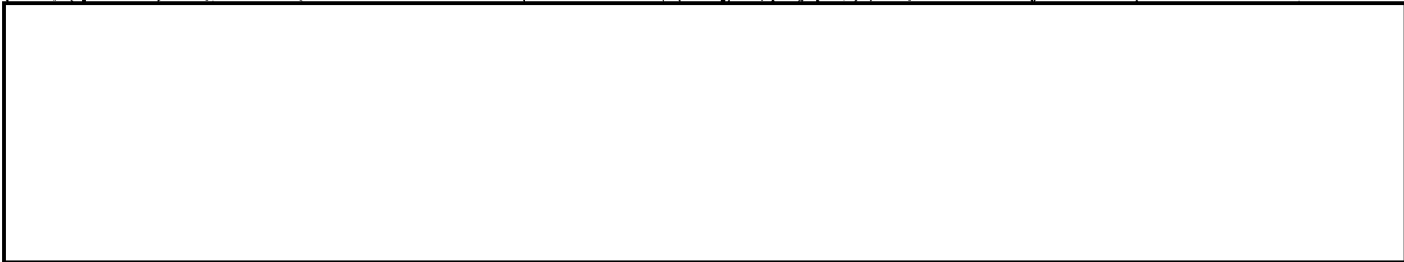

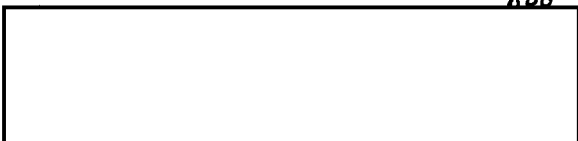

You will recall that by memorandum dated March 5, 1952, you were advised that the Bureau had been invited to attend a briefing on the Central Intelligence Agency. The briefing was to be held for the purported purpose of orienting certain U. S. agencies concerning CIA operations. The first of these briefings was held approximately two weeks ago. This was exclusively for military personnel. The second such briefing was held on the afternoon of March 28, and was attended by some military personnel and representatives from the civilian agencies such as the Department of State, Atomic Energy Commission, and the Bureau. Mr. Papich of the Liaison Unit and Mr. Laughlin attended for the Bureau.

The briefing was given in Room 2028 Q Building. It began at 2:00 P.M. and lasted until 5:05 P.M.

In the absence of General Smith, Director of CIA, Deputy Director Allen Dulles made the opening remarks. Mr. Dulles' statements were brief, in substance welcoming those present and explaining the purpose was to tell the other Governmental agencies what CIA was trying to do in order that the other agencies might be of benefit to CIA and CIA be of better service to the other agencies.

Mr. Dulles was followed by [redacted] CIA. [redacted] comments, likewise were brief. He reiterated the general theme of Mr. Dulles' comments. [redacted] did make a significant observation during his remarks in referring to any so-called jurisdictional disputes. He said that every time any problem on this subject arose, he remembered General Smith's most emphatic remarks that "there are no such things as jurisdictional problems. If any agency can assure me that it can carry out a particular responsibility, I would be most delighted to have that agency handle that responsibility."

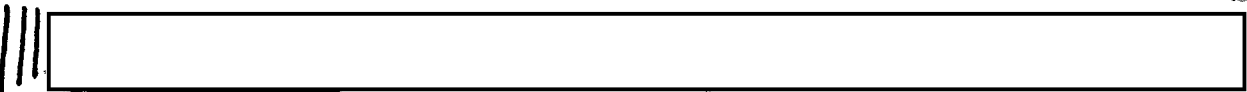

PURPOSE:

Joseph Katz, as you know, is a known Soviet agent. He has been out of the United States continuously since 1948 and up to June 1951 was principally believed to be in France. As of the latter date, he left France for Israel. Information received from reliable sources indicates that he is now residing in Tel Aviv.

To point out that we have received no information concerning this subject since he went to Israel. To further point out that there is no indication that he contemplates returning to the United States in the future.

DETAILS:

Joseph Katz, an American citizen, has been definitely identified as a Soviet agent by Elizabeth Bentley, Amadeo Sabatini, Harry Gold, Thomas L. Black, Robert Owen Menaker, and Floyd Cleveland Miller. Katz left the United States in 1948 and has not returned to this country since his departure.

From our investigation and according to information received from French sources of the Legal Attache at Paris, it is believed that Katz was principally in France up until June 1951. As of June 27, 1951, Katz left Marseilles, France, bound for Haifa, Palestine. Since that time it has been determined through two reliable sources that Katz is apparently residing at 19 Ben Yehuda Street, Tel Aviv, Israel.

OBSERVATIONS:

As stated above, Joseph Katz has been out of the United States since 1948. He is currently traveling on an American passport which will not expire until March 1953. There has been no indication that he plans to return to the United States. Katz has been and probably is at this time a Soviet agent of paramount importance. If he would cooperate, he could be of inestimable value to us in a number of cases currently under investigation.

You will recall that we were in the process of making arrangements with French Intelligence sources for the return of Katz to the United States at the time he departed that country. In view of the publicity which has been afforded Elizabeth Bentley, it is reasonable to assume that Katz is well aware of our interest in him. It is therefore considered highly unlikely that he will return to the United States of his own accord. The fact that he has been out of the United States since 1948 is further indication that he does not intend to return. Still further, Katz' wife, Bessie and his daughter are now living in the United States and our investigation of them has failed to give any indication that he will return.
