ADDENDUM: (WCS:nar 9/9/55)

The origin of organized Fabian Socialism is traceable to the establishment of the Fabian Society in London, England in 1884, largely as the result of the influence and teachings of Professor Thomas Davidson of New York, who was an occasional visitor in London. The name "Fabian" was derived from the name of Quintus FABIUS Maximus Verrucosus who became famous for his unique military tactics of avoiding direct battles and in resorting to deliberate procrastination and the using of delaying procedures during his defense of Rome against the attacks of Hannibal. Fabius kept his army always near Hannibal's but never attacked, harassing Hannibal continually, but never engaging in direct battle. The Roman's grew tired of this and Fabius was removed from his command and supplanted by two generals who engaged Hannibal in open battle in 216 B. C. and were completely crushed by Hannibal. Later, by waiting for the right moment, Fabius took Tarentum from Hannibal, a signal victory. The aim of Fabian Socialism is to very skillfully permeate every segment of society with socialistic ideas, words, ideals, attitudes, tendencies and modes of thinking in order to gradually lay the foundation of a slow, steady, peaceful transformation of the social order from Capitalism to Socialism. The tactics used by Fabian Socialists are the military ones of Fabius but adapted and applied to human relations, namely, a policy of waiting, delay, indirection, avoidance of conflict, concessions, compromises, advances, zig-zagging, et cetera, all of which are to be done with great patience. The motto of the Fabians is: "To wait for the right moment patiently, like Fabius when he fought Hannibal; but when the right moment arrives one must strike energetically so as not to have waited in vain." The end of Fabian Socialism is the elimination of private ownership as an exclusive means of production and the substitution of state or social ownership of the means of production, hence, Socialism.
