In connection with a current study boing made by PFIAB into the effectiveness of the collection of human intelligence by various U. S. agencies, PFIAB staff members have been traveling abroad visiting various U. S. establishments, including brief visits with our Legal Attaches.

We have been receiving communications from the Legal Attaches after these visits by the PFIAB staff members who have been concentrating most of their time abroad in visits with Central Intelligence Agency stations and Defense Attaches. In most instances the visits with our Legal Attaches have been essentially courtesy calls, and the PFIAB representatives have not raised any problems or indicated any new approaches which would affect the Bureau.

A PFIAB team recently visited briefly with cur Legal Attache in Singapore. The visit was cordial, and the PFIAB representatives were briefed by the Legal Attache concerning the functions of his office. During this visit, one of the PFIAB representatives commented that PFIAB's current visits to U.S. establishments abroad are based on a concern the high Government circles that not enough is being done in the area of human collection of intelligence and that PFIAB is attempting to determine what can be done either to improve the existing procedures or to create more effective procedures. He stated that much of the concern centers around what he described as a parochialism among some Federal agencies and





Following the regularly scheduled meeting of the United States Intelligence Board this morning, Mr. Helms called a short Executive Session. His purpose was to advise members regarding his future in view of the extensive speculation appearing in the newspapers regarding his leaving the Central Intelligence Agency (CIA). Helms stated that he plans to retire in the very near future although he gave no specific date. It is to be noted that Helms will be 30 years old in March of 1973. He has enforced a rule making it mandatory that employees retire from active service with CIA upon reaching the age of 60.

Helms noted that he has absolutely no idea who might succeed him as the Director of CIA other than that which he reads in the newspaper. He stated he has had no conversation with the President and has no idea when an announcement will be made. He did state that the issues discussed in the newspaper regarding his disagreements with Dr. Kissinger are completely false, and that minutes of the United States Intelligence Board meetings would clearly show he had no substantive disagreements with Dr. Kissinger.



The article went on to state that "Agents had been despatched abroad after a White House meeting of Mr. Nixon, Mr. Kissinger, and Mr. Hoover" and further indicated that the White House had lost confidence in the CIA and decided to move the Bureau into CIA activities abroad to double-check on these activities. The article further stated that the Bureau currently spends three million a year to maintain 40 Agents and 30 clerks in foreign "intelligence liaison units." Expansion of FBI operations overseas in October 1970, estensibly on the orders of President Nixen, was designed to give the White House a worldwide source of intelligence independent of the CIA and the State Department, The Star-News has learned.

This expansion, which remains in effect today, put the FBI in the position of gathering intelligence overseas, which it has no legal authority to do.

It also is a violation of delimitation agreements reached in the post-World War II period under which the CIA's role in domestic intelligence was limited by agreement with J. Edgar Hoover, while the FBI accepted restrictions on overseas operations.

Many of Hoover's toplevel assistants opposed the 1970 oversens expansion of FBI activities on legal grounds, because it duplicated CIA efforts and because of the estimated \$3 million-a-year cest. But Hoover, although he never showed his top intelligence aides anything in writing, always insisted that the expansion was on the authority of the President himself.

The Star-News was unable to determine whether the new foreign intelligence role of the FRI was floover's idea, that was approved by the President, or whether the order came down from the White House to Hoover. But observe believe the FBI e rail in into overseas its ligence must have had White House blessing or

there would have been howls of protest from CIA and State.

"THE 1974 expansion raised the number of FBI agents operating overseas to 39, plus 47 clerical employes. In addition to the traditional embassies where FBI agents have long served under the title of legal oftaches - Bern, Bonn, Buenos Aires, Long, don, Mexico City, Ottawa, Paris, Rome and Tokyo -Hoover respend offices in Brazil, Medzid and Manila and established agents in Beirut, Caracus, Copenhagen, Hong Kong, Lal Paz, Managua, Singapore: and Tel Aviv.

At that tome it was claimed the purpose was for police liaison in erindinal matters, but FBI veterons say the real objective was intelligence gathering.

The expansion came at a time when Hoover and the FBI we emider considerable are for failure of domestic intelligence gathering about radical youth, bombings and dissident black groups.

The old established offices had already had liaison respensibilities in Austrin, Liecotenstein, Switzerland, West Germany,
the Netherlands, Argentina, Paragnay, Uruguay,
the British Isles, Mexico,
Canada, Bellium, France,

The expursion gave the FBI intelligence-gathering responsibilities in Lebanon, Colombia, Ecquader,

British West Indian associsted states and colosies. Iceland, Finland, Netway, Sweden, Denmark, Hong Kong, South Vietnam, Bolivia, Peru, Spain, Portugal, the Balvaric and Canory Islands, Gibraltar, Morocco, Panama, British Honduras, the five Central American republics, the Philippines, Australia, New Zealand, Malaysia, Singapore, Thialand, Indonesia and Israel. The FBI 'legal at-

taches" operated independently of the American ambassadors and of the CIA and send their reports directly to FDI headquarters in a code unknown to other embassy perspanel. It was Heover's practice to send these intelligence reports directly to the White House, The Star-News was told, without any attempt at coordination with CIA or State Department.

THERE WAS never any inter-agency quarrei about the presence and activities of FBI agents in the con-

Venezuela. Barba and Conada. And the long-Guyana, Trinidad and Conada. And the longtobago, the French and established legal attaches Notherlands Antilles, 16 British West Indian associoted states and colonics, Iceland, Finland, Nerway, sections, including CIA.

However, some of the new FBI activities ran into both open and covert opposition. In La Paz, Bolivia, Ambassador Errest Ciracusa had a confrontation with the FBI agent who was sent there when a coded message to Washington from the legal attache came to the envoy's deskland he could not read it. Siracusa domanded to know the contents and the FBI man had to refuse.

Sinacusa fired off a cable to Washington protesting that he was being bypassed by an embassy section estensibly under his control and in essence was told to let the matter drop. Somewhat the same thing happened in Tel Aviv.

FEI insiders have said that the intelligence gathered by the agents involved in the expansion was at best marginal and often worthless. State Department and CIA personnel generally kept silent or limited themselves

to non-public protests about the injection of FEI agents into soreign intelligance. Privately they ableated fire 1970 FDI expression as both illegal and counter-productive.

Hoover, The Star-News was told reliably, would never brook any efforts by his subordinates to rescind the expansion into foreign intelligence. In May 1979, Hoover had abruptly climinated the jubs of the FBI liaison mem with other government agencies, including CIA and the State Department, and, transferred the sgents to other duties.

Ironically, it was in June 1970, that Hower had decisively opposed an interagency plan for expanded intelligence operations in the United States which was approved by President Nixon and which called for resumption of wire-tapping, surveillance and even surreptitious entry. This cational securny plan, desclosed by the -White Hous¢ lest May 22, existed for only five days and was never implemented because of Hoover's opposition, the White House said.

Senator William Proxmire (Dem. - Wisconsin) introduced S.1935, a bill to amend Section 102 of the National Security Act of 1947 to prohibit certain activities by the Central Intelligence Agency (CIA) and to limit certain other activities by such agency.

The bill would amend the National Security Act of 1947 (50 U.S.C. 403) by adding a new subsection designed to clarify the role of CIA with regard to domestic activities. The first provision of the new subsection directs that no interpretation of the Act shall be made to authorize CIA to engage in police, law enforcement or internal security activities by itself or in conjunction with any other agency.

The second provision would prohibit CIA from providing assistance to any other Government agency engaged in police, law enforcement or internal security activity unless such assistance is specifically approved by the CIA oversight committees of the Senate and the House of Representatives.

The third provision prohibits the CIA from participating directly or indirectly in any illegal activity in the United States.

The fourth provision prohibits CIA from engaging in any covert action in any foreign country without specific written approval from the CIA oversight committees of the Congress. "Covert action" is defined as having the same meaning as used by the National Security Council based on the understanding of that term by the intelligence community of the Federal Government and the practice of the intelligence community during the years, 1950-1970.

A featured article (attached) by Jeremiah O'Leary in "The Sunday Star" June 10, 1973, has been copied in the foreign press and has raised questions concerning FBI operations abroad. O'Leary stated that these had been materially expanded in October, 1970, "ostensibly on the orders of President Nixon" to give the White House a worldwide source of intelligence independent of CIA and State. He further claimed that the expansion was opposed by many FBI officials, that FBI intelligence collection is without legal authority, and that CIA and State view it as "both illegal and counter-productive."

These are the facts:

In September, 1970, former Director Hoover advised that he had been asked by the President to expand his foreign operation to collect political intelligence. At that time, we had eleven offices abroad manned by 28 Agents and 32 clerks, for a total of 60 FBI employees. These offices were in Bern, Bonn, Buenos Aires, Hong Kong, London, Madrid, Mexico City, Oltawa, Paris, Rome, and Tokyo. Following brief negotiation with State, six additional offices were opened during December, 1970, in Tel Aviv, Caracas, Managua, La Paz, Copenhagen, and Beirut. In May, 1971, Mr. Hoover indicated that the President had asked him to expand further and, following protracted negotiation with State and opposition by former Assistant to the Director W. C. Sullivan, offices were opened during early 1972 in Brasilia, Manila, and Singapore. This has resulted in our present complement abroad of 41 Special Agents and 47 clerks, for a total of 88 personnel in twenty foreign offices.

FBI has had Agents stationed abroad since early 1940. They are not operational and conduct no investigations. They are entirely dependent upon the law enforcement and security agencies of the host government for the coverage of FBI leads overseas. They maintain regular liaison with these agencies, both in the countries where they are stationed and in other

countries which they visit on road trips. During the course of these liaison activities, they receive all sorts of information, much of it relating to law enforcement work but some of it relating to political intelligence. From the outset, they have cabled to the Bureau all matters of possible U. S. interest and FBI Headquarters has promptly disseminated such information to other agencies having an interest. The cable traffic to and from the Legal Attaches is and always has been in code, whether it deals with kidnappings, administrative matters, political intelligence, or applicant work. The only change in operations that occurred as a result of the President's requests that FBI collect political intelligence was a formalization of the practice which had been in effect for many years. Commencing in January, 1971, and continuing through the present, records have been kept of the number of political intelligence items submitted by each office. There is nothing illegal about this procedure. Each Legal Attache, before submitting an item. must coordinate the information with interested agencies in the Embassy where he is stationed. This would, in practically every instance, mean that both CIA and State in the Embassy are informed of the item before or simultaneously with its submission to the Bureau by cable. On receipt, each item is carefully reviewed by the desk in the FBI Intelligence Division which is concerned with the subject matter and, if deemed suitable, the item is then dispatched by teletype to Dr. Kissinger at the White House and to you.

Although the offices opened since 1970 were specifically intended to submit political intelligence, they have also made substantial contributions to the regular work of the Bureau. The O'Leary article is causing problems abroad and the Mexican press is protesting the operations of both CIA and FBI in that country. The FBI representative in Bern states that a Swiss reprint of the O'Leary article has caused him to prepare the following for the U.S. Information Service Office in Bern to issue in the event inquiries are received: "For years it has been public knowledge that the FBI has had representatives in various cities throughout the world since shortly after the end of World War II. These representatives are not operational, but conduct liaison with the police agencies in numerous foreign countries in matters of mutual interest, much in the manner of Interpol." The FBI representative in Mexico is being scrupulously careful to avoid attracting attention during the current newspaper publicity.

## The Attorney General

We are not "pushing" the intelligence collection program. No pressure is being used on the FBI representatives to increase their production of intelligence items, and this activity occupies an extremely minor portion of their time as nearly all of them are fully occupied in handling the Bureau's regular work.
