



RapJudge, Cop In Rioting On The Westside

By ADOLPH J. SLAUGHTER

The Fillmore District police station and two pol officers, one from the Austin District (28th), were verely criticized this week for their performance in Westside race riot, last Friday, in which more than persons participated, but which resulted in the arr

of only negroes involved.

The Civil Liberties Union, calling the incident "disgraceful" lodged a protest with the police department against officers Kenneth Arens (badge no. 10231) a n d Timothy Nolan (6569), of the Austin District station.

Arrested by police following "free-for-all" in Garfield Park were Mrs. Annie Pittman, 31, of 3902 W. Wilcox, her two sons, Curtis, 14, and Alton, 15, and a third teen-ager, Milton Lenon, 15, of 3822 W. VanBuren st.

Mrs. Pittman has filed complaints against the police officers charging they called her and other Negroes '"niggers" and other derogatory names. WHITES ATTACK NEGROES

According to reports, the at home at the time, said melee begari when Brian Pittman, a 12 year old son of Mrs. Pittman, was attacked by two white youths while delivering papers in the vicinity of Fultton and Hamlin aves., a predominantly white neighborhood.

other youths to help him liver papers. When the fo boys were attacked by white youths, Stanley ran he and reported the incident to grandmother, Mrs. Mar Jackson, mother of Mrs. Pi man.

Mrs. Jackson said she call police at Fillmore district w came to her home, but told l they didn't have time to go lo for Brian, "but if they hea about it, they would send I home."

Mrs. Jackson and her gra son, Alton, decided they wo go and search for Brian who. then had been given refuge one of the white subscribers his route.

ed to move from his Lincoln Park West apartment because he had Negro guests. The owner of the building who lives in the suburbs himself, reportedly told the executive that he did not want Negroes in that building, even as servants.

In addition to the owner, the executive who took the case to court, said that the neighbors taunted him because he had Negro friends. In court, the executive agreed to move after being awarded about \$1,000 for the humiliation he had undertone.

Mrs. Marjorie Pierce, an order typist at Inland Steel's st Chicago (Ind.) Harbor Works, called to report the refusal enday of the Auditorium Grill, located at 3436 Main st., st Chicago, to serve her and another Negro girl co-worker.

Mrs. Pierce, of 1400 Jackson st., Gary, said she and Misserle Flynn, a file clerk, of 3822 Euclid, East Chicago, waited vain for more than an hour after a waitress had practically nored their presence.

The victim of the act of discrimination said she called grill later and asked whether it was their policy to refuse rvice to Negroes. The answer was in the affirmative.

Mrs. Pierce said white co-workers who witnessed the inident expressed their shock and deep regret.

On June 29, 1961 around 8:30 p.m., a friend who works owntown rides the Halsted bus to and from work was waiting for a bus at 55th and Halsted to ride to Normal Blvd. Thile standing there he said a gang of about eight white boys ame up to him and said "nigger you are lost..." He said he st stood there and said nothing. Again one of them said, higger" did you hear what I said? So he replied that he had st got off from work and was en route home. He said they ld him, "well nigger you are lost over here," and began to tack and beat him. The only thing he could do was to n. He out ran them, but not before they took his glasses and her items.

The same thing happened to me in the summer of 1957 or at 57th and Halsted. This goes on every summer and thing is done about it. It is useless to report it to the police. Ley know about it, but don't care. But yet they come over re in the Negro neighborhood and ride around all day and ght but where they are needed, you can't find not a one.

This is not Alabama or Mississippi—this is Chicago. Most the Negroes here in Englewood act as if they are not conrned about what's happening. But to me it is a serious and ngerous situation. If the Negroes would cooperate and stick gether, we could break it up. But two or three cannot do all.





The four freedom riders consisting of two white males and two white females who were delayed in reaching Jackson, Mississippi, on July 21, 1961, because of a bus breakdown, arrived at Jackson at 0:31 a.m., Central Standard Time (CST), that date, and were arrested by the Jackson, Mississippi, Police Department (PD) at 0:32 a.m., CST, when they failed to move from the lunch counter in the colored waiting room after being ordered to do so by the PD.

The thirteen freedom riders, who were arrested at Jackson, Mississippi, on July 23, and 21, 1961, were all convicted of breach of the peace in Jackson Municipal Court on July 21, 1961. Each was sentenced to serve four months in jail and was fined \$200.

Elmer L. Brown, the freedom rider who reportedly attempted to hang himself in his jail cell on July 20, 1961, was released on appeal bond. July 21, 1861. another freedom rider, was also released on appeal bond, on July 20, 1981.

Two hundred civity freedom riders have been arrested at Jackson since May 24, 1961. One hundred thirteen have been released on Road, four have been released upon the payment of fines, one has been released without the filling of charges, and four have been released on probation. One hundred thirty-eight remain in custody.

GREENBERG said he expects to be met in Nashville by representatives of the Christian Leadership Conference. Just before boarding the bus, he described the trip as "just a matter of being a liberal American".

According to this article, Miss RIKKITROSENTHAL,

Vice Chairman of the Baltimore Chapter of Congress of Racial

Equality, said this group expects to send some 18 more riders
to the South in the near future. She added an application
is sent to the New York Office of Congress of Racial Equality

Three white and two Negro Freedom Riders who arrived here Sunday were refused counter service Monday evening at the Howard Johnson Restaurant, 3118 Broad St

They did not leave after a restaurant official denied them service and closed the counter. Four uniformed policemen escorted them from the premises about 6 p.m., some 30 minutes after they arrived.

Members of the group smoked, talked and read newspapers until they were ousted by the policemen. They left the regaurant parking lot in a car with Hamilton County license plates.

Memorandum to Mr. Belmont

On 7-18-61 a preliminary hearing was held in U. S. District Court, Tallahassee, Florida, regarding the suit previously filed by three Negro ministers who seek to end segregation of the restaurant in the Tallahassee airport. The proceeding was limited to legal arguments and the matter was taken under advisement by the court. Plaintiffs and defendants are to file new briefs within five days at which time a date will be set for further hearings.

The Hinds County Sheriff's Office, Jackson, Mississippi, advised that Elmer Brown, a convicted freedom rider incarcerated at Mississippi State Penitentiary, Parchman, Mississippi, fell from his bunk and injured his head at about 11:00 p.m., 7-18-61. He was taken to the hospital at Greenwood, Mississippi, where it was determined that Brown has a fractured skull but is not seriously injured. He was removed to the University of Mississippi hospital at Jackson for observation and treatment.







Group Headed Here Takes to Auto in Virginia, Destination Secret

ROANOKE, Va. (A) - Five 'Freedom Riders' en route from New York through Washington, Roanoke and Bristol to Chattanooga were last seen Thursday night leaving a Charlottesville bus station by car.

The group left New York Thursday morning on Trailways Bus 5711, reportedly to test segregated eating facilities along the way.

In the group were a white student, two rabbis and two S 22 8 17 1 Negroes.

Trailways bus driver Charles Brooks, who let the group off about 6 p.m. EST in Charlottesville, said the five sat together in the middle of the bus but caused no disturbance.

He said two of them had tickets to Roanoke and the other three to Charlottesville.

A Trailways bus dispatcher in Charlottesville told the Roanoke Times the group left the station in a private car immediately after getting off the bus.

He said they did not indicate if or when they would continue their journey.

Trailways was scheduled to DATE 11-02-2009 BY 60324 UC BAW/SAB/STW leave Charlottesville in the early morning hours, arriving at Roanoke at 4:30 a.m. EST.

Three white men and two Negroes, traveling together to test racial policies at bus stations, rode into Chattanooga Sunday afternoon on two Greyhound Lines buses and ate at the terminal's cafeteria without incident.

Some 20 young white men watched through plate-glass windows along Market Street as the five bus riders and three Chattanooga Negro clergymen dined together at a large table.

Police Chief Ed Brown and Chief Inspector Malcolm W. Upchurch stood in a summer rain among the youths as a silent warning that the bus station was, well policed.

Henry Thomas, 19, of St. Augustine, Fla., one of the travelers, said the five plan to remain in Chattanooga two or three

They were promptly served Saturday afternoon in the Trailways bus station cafeteria at Knoyville, where they spent that night.

Thomas was separated from his four companions when they left Knoxville Sunday because two buses, crowded with weekend traffic, were running the same route. He arrived in Chat-tanooga about 20 minutes before the other four reached the terminal in the second bus.

He talked with the Negro pastors and newsmen in the loading area back of the station until the second-bus rolled in.

Then the five travelers' and three ministers walked into the cafateria and ordered meals. They completed their dinner and smoked before leaving.

Four freedom riders proceeded from Montgomery, Alabama, to Jackson, Mississippi, by airplane on July 24, 1961. Upon their arrival in Jackson, they entered the waiting room and were arrested for breach of the peace when they failed to comply with instructions of the police that they move on.

The seven freedom riders who were arrested in Jackson on July 23, 1961, were convicted in Jackson Municipal Court on July 24, 1961. Each was sentenced to serve four months in jail and was fined \$200.

Two hundred seventy-one freedom riders have been arrested at Jackson since May 24, 1961. One hundred twenty-one have been released on bond, four have been released upon the payment of fines, one has been released without the filing of charges and four have been released on probation. One hundred forty-one remain in custody.

Sheriff Gilfoy advised Elmer Brown, who allegedly was injured by falling from his bunk at Mississippi State Penitentiary 7-18-61, actually struck his head against the wall, original story was a fake.

Brown told press 7-20-61 he was misled by Congress of Racial Equality and regreted participating in freedom ride. Brown later attempted to hang himself in his cell after which Sheriff contacted Brown's lawyer and arrangements were made for him to be released on bond 7-21-61.

Freedom Action Committee of Chicago organized to recruit and train freedom riders, to raise funds for freedom riders and to encourage nonviolent action against discrimination in Chicago. Supporting organizations include CORE.

Freedom ride scheduled to depart Santa Monica, California, 7-28-61 will proceed to Jackson.

CORE, Baltimore, intends to send 18 additional freedom riders to the South.

Freedom riders who were at Memphis took bus to Little Rock 7-20-61 without incident and arranged to return to their homes by airplane.

DETAILS:

On 7-20-61 an interracial group of clergymen met at Tougaloo Christian College which is on the outskirts of Jackson, Mississippi. The purpose of the meeting reportedly was to discuss developments of freedom ride activity and methods of relieving racial tension throughout the nation. Reverend Martin Luther King was one of the principal speakers at the meeting which was closed to the public and press.

At 8:40 p.m., CST, 7-20-61, a group of nine, which
consisted of six white males, one white female and two Negro males,
was arrested for breach of the peace at the Jackson Municipal
Airport. It was stated that some of those arrested had attended the
meeting at Touglaoo Christian College. None of those mentioned by
as having an appointment with the Attorney General
was among the group which was arrested at the airport.

According to the police the arrest took place when the group entered the waiting room, took seats and failed to comply with instructions of the police that they move on. A press representative who was on the scene has advised that the arrest occurred when the group attempted to enter the cafe at the airport which is used only by white people.

Four white freedom riders were to arrive in Jackson by Greyhound bus from Nashville, Tennessee, at 5:35 a.m., CST, (7:35 a.m. Washington time), 7-21-61. However the bus suffered a breakdown and is running about two and one-half hours late.

Two hundred fifty-six freedom riders have been arrested at Jackson since 5-24-61. One hundred eleven have been released on bond, four have been released upon the payment of fines, one has been released without the filing of charges and four have been released on probation. One hundred thirty-six remain in custody.

With regard to Elmer Brown, a freedom rider who allegedly was injured in a fall from his bunk at Mississippi State Penitentiary, 7-18-61, Sheriff J. Robert Gilfoy, Hinds County, Mississippi, advised he has determined that Brown actually struck his head against the wall and faked the story about falling from his bunk.

Brown talked to the press on 7-20-61 and said that he had been misled by the Congress of Racial Equality (CORE) and regreted that he participated in the freedom ride. Sheriff Gilfoy subsequently advised that Brown attempted to hang himself in his cell but he was discovered by a trustee. The Sheriff then contacted Brown's lawyer on 7-20-61 and the lawyer arranged for Brown to be released on bond on 7-21-61.

FACC reportedly has organized to recruit and train freedom riders, to raise funds for freedom riders and to encourage nonviolent action against discrimination in Chicago. Organizations whose representatives will serve with FACC include CORE, the Urban League, National Organization of Social Workers and the American Friends Service Committee.



It has previously been reported that a freedom ride will depart from Santa Monica, California, on 7-28-61 but the destination of this group was unknown. Information has now been received that they will proceed to Jackson.

It has been reported that CORE in Baltimore, Maryland, plans to send 18 additional freedom riders to the South in the near future.

The freedom riders who were at Memphis, Tennessee, proceeded to Little Rock, Arkansas, by bus on 7-20-61 and ate in the bus terminal at Little Rock without incident. They then arranged to return to their homes by airplane.

According to the press report the group included white and Negro ministers of several denominations and one rabbi and that the Attorney General urged the nation's clergymen to play a more active role in fighting racial discrimination.


Synopsis:

9 Freedom Riders, identified in details of report, arrived Jackson, Miss., via Trailways Bus, at 6:08 p.m., 6/21/61. All arrested by Jackson PD at Trailways Terminal when they failed to obey the orders of Jackson PD officer to move on. All charged with breach of the peace. No incidents at time of arrest, All tried in Jackson Municipal Court, 6/22/61, and after NG pleas were convicted of violation of Section 2087.5, Miss. Code. All sentenced to 4 months in jail and fined \$200.00. No incidents during trial. 3 Freedom Riders released bond 6/27/61, remainder transferred to MSP, Parchman, Miss., 6/28/61.

DETAILS:

Investigation in this case was predicated upon information furnished by the Atlanta Office of the FBI on June 19, 1961 advising that a group of Freedom Riders were scheduled to arrive in Jackson, Mississippivvia Trailways Bus on June 21, 1961.

By communication dated June 16, 1961, the Chicago Office advised that information had been received that the following three individuals from Chicago, Illinois would leave Chicago, June 16, 1961, en route Nashville, Tennessee, and then to Jackson, Mississippi:



By communication dated June 18, 1961, the Memphis Office advised that information had been received that a group of Freedom Riders would leave Nashville, Tennessee, June 18, 1961 en route Atlanta, Georgia. In Atlanta, they would join with another group of Freedom Riders and leave Atlanta, June 19, 1961, en route Jackson, Mississippi, via Montgomery, Alabama.

By communication dated June 19, 1961, the Atlanta Office advised that Southern Christian Leadership Conference, Atlanta Gadvised June 19, 1961, that a group of Freedom Riders, including those who arrived from Nashville, Tennessee, June 18, 1961, and consisting of approximately 7 or 8 total, would leave Atlanta by Greyhound Bus, 12:40 p.m., June 20, 1961. They planned to go to Montgomery, Alabama where they would spend the night and leave 11:30 a.m., June 21, 1961 for Jackson, Mississippi via Trailways Bus.

By communication dated June 20, 1961, the Mobile Office advised that 9 Freedom Riders arrived Montgomery, Alabama at 5:01 p.m., June 20, 1961, via Greyhound Bus. Group consisted of 4 Negro males, 1 Negro female, 1 white male, and 3 white females. They were met at the station by Reverend RALPH ABERNATHY and an unknown Negro male.

By communication dated June 21, 1961, the Mobile Office advised that the 9 Freedom Riders who arrived Montgomery, Alabama, June 20, 1961, planned to depart Montgomery, Alabama for Jackson, Mississippi, 11:30 a.m., June 21, 1961, via Trailways Bus.



Little Rock Chief of Police ROBERT E. GLASSCOCK furnished the following information:

On July 20, 1961, five male Freedom Riders, three whites and two Negroes, arrived unannounced at Little Rock, Arkansas, at 4:38 P.M. via bus at the Greyhound Bus Terminal, 6th and Broadway. The five were served at the lunch counter without incident. Two of the white members of the group departed Little Rock by plane at 8:50 P.M. on the same date without incident.

On July 21, 1961, the other three members of the group left Little Rock by plane without incident, two of them on a plane at 2:30 in the afternoon and the third at 8:00 P.M. on another plane. It appeared that Little Rock was the end of the Freedom Ride as the participants apparently returned to New York and vicinity.

On July 14, 1961 Chief of Detectives M. B. Pierce, Police Department, Jackson, Mississippi, furnished the following information:

His department is preparing affidavits for the __James Bevel,__ and proposes to arrest them on July 14, 1961. The charge against the four will be conspiring to contribute to the delinquency of the minor freedom riders arrested at Jackson as a result of the sponsering of these and organization of some of these rides originating in Jackson by the Jackson Non Violent Movement. The above four-named individuals are associated with the Jackson Non Violent Movement and act in an executive capacity in organizing these rides. Pierce said that some of the juveniles arrested for freedom rides originating in Jackson and their participation in some sit-in demonstrations had given signed statements to the effect that if they had to do over what they had done by participating in the rides and sit-ins, they would not do it and would not have done it if they had not been coached by people who are operating the Jackson Non Violent Movement. He said complaints have been made to the police and other people by the parents of these juveniles arrested that they had not been advised by the operators of the Jackson Non Violent Movement or by the persons who coached their children that they were to take part in the sit-ins. These parents would not sign complaints as they were afraid of repercussion from members of their own race. According to Pierce, a number of the juveniles arrested had been given \$2.00, fed their breakfast and then talked into participating in the demonstrations. Based on this information affidavits were filed against the above four persons charging them with contributing to the delinquency of a juvenile. The complaints are based on the state affidavit and signed by James L. Spencer, Acting Ex Officio, as Justice of the Peace, and the charges will be heard before him. According to Pierce, the sentence under this particular act is \$500 fine and six months in jail on each count.



Reference is made to the letterhead memorandum captioned as above and dated July 17, 1961, at Chicago, Illinois.

A source advised on July 24, 1961, that on July 23, 1961, the National Federation of Business and Professional Women's Club had as their guest speaker Arkansas Governor Orval Faubus. Governor Faubus spoke before this group at the Conrad Hilton Hotel, Loop, Chicago, Illinois.

At about 7:00 p.m. on July 23, 1961, about 50 demonstrators appeared and walked on the sidewalks outside the hotel, protesting the invitation to and the appearance of Governor Faubus. The demonstrators carried placards which said in effect "business women do not endorse Faubus or Jim Crow".

The demonstration consisted of about 30 Negroes and 20 white persons. The demonstrators also carried placards which urged the support of the Freedom Riders (FR).

The demonstration, which was peaceful and without incident, disbanded at about 10:00 p.m.

A second source advised on July 24, 1961, that the new Chicago organization Feedom Action Committee of Chicago (FACC) plans to hold a rally on July 30, 1961, for the purpose of raising funds for the FR.

On 8/17/60, a pretext phone call to Stiles Hall, YMCA, University of California, Berkeley, revealed that a CECIL A. THOMAS, 962 Ordway, Albany, Calif., was then Associate Executive Secretary of Stiles Hall. He has not been the subject of investigation in San Francisco since no information has been received that he has been associated with any basic revolutionary group or active front group activity.

Records of the Berkeley Post Office, reviewed 8/15/60, revealed that Dr. CECIL THOMAS, 962 Ordway, Albany, Calif., was listed as a reference by the person who secured P.O. Box 885 on 6/20/60, in the name of the Bay Area Students Legal Aid Fund and was designated as one of the individuals to receive mail of this organization. A month following the riot at City Hall, San Francisco, during the HCUA Hearings, 5/12 through 14/60, there appeared in the Bay Area throwaway leaflets captioned "Bay Area Students Legal Aid Fund". These leaflets set forth that the purpose of the organization was to take steps to see that students arrested at the HCUA Hearings got the best possible legal defense when their cases came to trial. All tried in Jackson Municipal Court, 6/20/61 and after NG pleas were convicted of violation of Section 2087.5, Miss. Code. All sentenced to 4 months in jail and fined \$200.00. No incidents during trial. All convicted Freedom Riders transferred to MSP, Parchman, Miss., 6/28/61.

DETAILS:

Investigation in this case was predicated upon information furnished by Congress of Racial Equality (CORE), Jackson, Mississippi, on June 13, 1961. He advised that a group of Freedom Riders were leaving from the West Coast for Jackson, Mississippi, via New Orleans, Louisiana, the latter part of the week. He had no other details.



The following observations were made at the Illinois Central Railroad Station, Jackson, Mississippi, on June 20, 1961:

At 10:11 a.m., a group of two Negro males and one Negro female, together with an unknown number of white males and females were observed to descend the stairway from the railroad tracks and to enter the white waiting room.

At 10:15 a.m., the above two Negro males and the above Negro females together with seven white males and four white females were observed after they had been taken into custody by officers of the Jackson Police Department. At the time of observation, these individuals were observed walking from the white waiting room in the passageway immediately north of this waiting room and were observed to walk down this passageway in a westerly direction to the alleyway on the west side of the Illinois Central Railroad Station where they were placed in the Jackson Police Department paddy wagon.

No incidents of any type were observed.







On July 29, 1961, our Hemphis, Tennessee, Office learned that among a group of freedom riders scheduled to travel from Nashville, Tennessee, to Jackson, Mississippi, was who is one attending college in this country. Appropriate representatives of the Department of State and the Immigration and Naturalization Service were promptly advised.

It later developed that the was thought and to be the Department of State advised the Unsuccessful telephonic efforts were reportedly made by embassy officials to dissuade the student from participating in the trip and he traveled to Jackson with the group which consisted of five white males and five white females. After having indicated that he was merely traveling as an observer with the group; the student entered the Negro vaiting room with the other members of the party upon arriving at the bus station in Jackson on July 29, 1961.

Upon the desire of the Department of state make appropriate Mississippi authorities aware of the identity of the student and the potentialities of the situation, our New Orleans, Louisiana, Office arranged for telephonic contact between the Captain of Detectives of the Jackson Police Department and a representative of the Department of State. Assa result of this contact and through the excellent relations between our New Orleans Office and the Captain of Detectives, was not arrested with the other members of his group in Jackson, Mississippi. In this connection it is noted that according to the Captain of Detectives, the student apparently desired to be arrested and did not wish to leave the bus station willingly. We have also been advised the Governor of Mississippi was initially but finally agreed with the in favor of arresting Captain of Detectives not to arrest him since he was a visitor from a friendly nation. #### DETAILS:

Investigation in this case was predicated upon information furnished by Chief of Detectives M. B. PIERCE, Police Department, Jackson, Mississippi, on June 23, 1961. He advised that he had just received a phone call from a member of the local press advising him they had been tipped that 4 Freedom Riders would attempt to leave Jackson, Mississippi at the Trailways Bus Terminal in approximately ten minutes from the time of the call.

The following observations were made at the Trailways Bus Terminal, Jackson, Mississippi, June 23, 1961:

At 2:25 p.m., two Negro males and two Negro females entered the Pascagoula Street entrance of the white waiting room as a group and walked inside the terminal a distance of about fifteen feet from the door. At this point, they stopped and Captain of the Jackson Police Department was observed to go over to the group and speak to them. Shortly thereafter, all four in the group were escorted from the Trailways Bus Terminal by Jackson Police officers and placed in a patrol wagon.

There were no incidents in connection with the above matter.

Chief of Detectives M. B. PIERCE, Jackson Police Department, Jackson, Mississippi, advised that the four Freedom Riders, listed below, were arrested at the Trailways Bus Terminal, Jackson, Mississippi, at 2:25 p.m., June 23, 1961. He said all four had entered the white waiting room of the terminal as a group and when ordered by Captain of the Police Department to move on, they had refused to move. At this point, Captain placed them all under arrest on a charge of breach of the peace. Chief PIERCE advised that there were no incidents in connection with the arrests. He said that when questioned later by detectives, the Freedom Riders told him they had intended to go into the waiting room and purchase bus tickets to New Orleans, Louisiana.
