





This refers to your memorandum of June 30, 1961 in which you advised, among other matters, that it has been reported that admitted traveling to Cuba in February 1961, with a group of students to attend a Soviet-sponsored seminar concerning the techniques of sit-ins and freedom rides.

According to information appearing in the press on June 30, Brigadier General T. B. Birdsong, head of the Mississippi Highway Patrol, made the statement at a news conference that 202 American students attended the Sovietdirected seminar in Havana in February. The article alleges that James R. Wahlstrom of Madison, Wisconsin, as well as Katherine Pleune, attended the Havana meeting. Wahlstrom stated that he went to Cuba last Christmas with other University of Wisconsin students who were members of the Fair Play for Cuba Committee.

On June 29, 1961, Mr. Lincoln White, State Department Press Officer, issued a statement warning American citizens that they face heavy penalties if they visit Cuba without special U.S. Government permission. Mr. White further advised that the Department of State has recently received information that some U.S. citizens are being encouraged to visit Cuba via Central or South America without complying with a special requirement to have their passports endorsed for such travel. Mr. White did not identify the group concerned. According to the press, other officials of the Department of State advised that about 30 students of San Francisco State College appéar to have been recruited by someone connected with the college for a tour to Cuba by way of Mexico and it has been reported that similar promotion is being undertaken in other parts the country.

Section 1185(b) of Title 8, U.S. Code, makes it unlawful to depart the United States without a valid passport to travel to a country for which a passport is required under the applicable regulations. Effective January 19, 1961, the regulations under Part 53 of Title 22, Code of Federal Regulations, promulgated pursuant to the authority of Section 1185(b), require that U.S. citizens traveling to Cuba must possess a passport which has been specifically validated for such travel.

It would be appreciated if you would furnish this Division with any information reflecting whether or other individuals involved in the foregoing matters, may have departed the United States to travel to Cuba subsequent to the State Department regulations issued January 19, 1961, in violation of Section 1185(b). We are also desirous of receiving information reflecting whether the seminar allegedly held in Havana in February was Soviet-directed and whether the alleged recruitment for a tour of Cuba referred to above by State Department officials, may be Soviet-inspired.

Reference is made to your letter of July 6, entitled "Freedom Ride 1961, Racial Matters: Destruction of Aircraft or Motor Vehicles; Civil Rights," With regard to your inquiries, the following is set forth:

(1) Regarding your attention is directed to our memorandum of December 29, 1960, entitled "The Fair Play for Cuba Committee, Internal Security-Cuba, Registration Act-Cuba," a copy of which was furnished to the Records Administration Office, which contained information to the effect that were among a group of 204 individuals which was participating in a ten-day tour of Cuba, beginning December 23, 1960, under the auspices of the Fair Play for Cuba Committee. There is enclosed herewith for your additional information one copy of a memorandum dated February 28, 1961, at Chicago, Illinois, concerning

It is noted that refused to be interviewed by Agents of our Chicago Office on April 27, 1961, concerning her participation in Fair Play for Cuba Committee activities. We have received no information indicating that made any other trips to Cuba or were and/or in Cuba during February, 1961,

(2) Regarding the alleged Soviet-directed seminar in Havana during February, 1961, we have received no information from our sources concerning such a seminar. As noted in my letter to the Attorney General of June 30, 1961, captioned Freedom Ride 1961, this allegation was based on a press release issued by the Mississippi Highway Patrol on June 29, 1961, which, in turn, was reportedly based on admissions of Pleune to Mississippi authorities following her arrest at Jackson, Mississippi. We have instructed our New Orleans Office to make further inquiries through officials of the Mississippi Highway Patrol concerning this matter in order to determine the original source of this allegation and, if possible, to resolve it. You will be kept advised of the results of these inquiries.





The entire group walked to a bench near the main entrance of the depot where some of the women took seats and the balance of the group stood around. Captain of the Jackson Police Department approached the group and was heard to say twice. "You must move on". None in the group made any move and Captain then said, "You are all under arrest". The arrest was made at 10:13 a.m.

The following observations were made at the Illinois Central Railroad Station, Jackson, Mississippi on June 25, 1961:

At 10:12 a.m., a group of individuals consisting of four
white males, six white females, three Negro females, and seven Negro
males was observed to descend the stairway from the railroad
platform to the Illinois Central Railroad Station, where they walked
directly into the white passenger waiting room. These individuals
walked to the bench located in the southwest corner of this waiting
room where some of the females then sat down. The remainder of
this group congregated in the area immediately in front of this
bench. These individuals were then addressed by Captain
Jackson Police Department, who told them twice that they must move
on. None of the individuals complied with order whereupon
told them they were all under arrest at 10:13 a.m. These
individuals were then taken out through the hallway located on the
north side of the white waiting room to the west side of the sta-
tion where the 11 males were placed in the Jackson Police Depart-
ment paddy wagon. The nine females were placed in two Jackson
patrol cars and the entire group was transported to the Jackson
Police Department.

No incidents were observed in connection with the above arrest at the Illinois Central Railroad Station.

While in Little Rock the group considered staying in a white motel but were advised that this could not be arranged. They then considered a colored motel but decided that this would attract police officers to the motel where a high percentage of Negro guests not involved in the freedom ride might be arrested for cohabitating with persons of the opposite sex to whom they were not married. The group ultimately spent the night in the private homes of "friends."

The jurisdiction of a federal court is fixed by the Acts of Congress. 28 U.S.C.A. 2254 provides as follows:

"12254. State custody; remedies in State Courts. An application for a writ of habeas corpus in behalf of a person in custody pursuant to the judgment of a State court shall not be granted unless it appears that the applicant has exhausted the memedies available in the courts of the State, or that there is either an absence of available State corrective process or the existence of circumstances rendering such process ineffective to protect the rights of the prisoner.

An applicant shall not be deemed to have exhausted the remedies available in the courts of the State, within the
meaning of this section, if he has the right under the
law of the State to raise, by any available procedure,
the question presented."

It not appearing from anything asserted in the petition in this case that petitioner sought to appeal her conviction, which she alleges to have been void and unconstitutional, or that she is financially unable to make bond pending such appeal, and it not appearing that petitioner has no right to test her detention by habeas corpus in the state courts of Mississippi, there appears to be no sound reason for this Court to grant petitioner's motion for expediting the hearing in this Court. There thus appears to be no sound reason for granting petitioner's motion for permission to appeal upon the original papers, since no allegations are contained in the petition asserting petitioner's financial inability to cause the record to be prepared in accordance with the rules of this Court.





Friends of the Soviet Union was cited as a Communist Party front, by the Special Committee on Un-American Activities, House of Representatives, on January 3, 1940, June 25, 1942, and March 29, 1944.

The Photo League (NYC) has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

"Soviet Russia Today" was cited as a Communist Party front by the Special Committee on Un-American Activities, House of Representatives, on June 25, 1942, and on March 29, 1944.

On March 29, 1944, the House of Representatives Special Committee on Un-American Activities cited the "New Theater Magazine" as a Communist Party publication.

"The Open Letter for Closer Co-operation with the Soviet Union" was described by the House of Representatives Special Committee on Un-American Activities on June 25, 1942, and March 29, 1944, as a Communist front.

Confidential Informant MI T-5 on May 2, 1960, reported that on April 28, 1960, attended a luncheon at the Hotel Grosvner, 35 Fifth Avenue, New York City, for the purpose of raising funds for the "Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell."

Concerning the Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell, the Guide to Subversive Organizations and Publications, dated January 2, 1957, issued by the House Committee on Un-American Activities, page 60, contains the following:

"Following the execution of Atomic spies ETHEL and JULIUS ROSENBERG in June, 1953, the 'Communist campaign assumed a different emphasis. Its major effort centered upon Morton Sobell', the Rosenberg's co-defendent. The National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case - a Communist front which had been conducting the campaign in the United States - was reconstructed as the National Rosenberg-Sobell Committee at a conference in Chicago in October, 1953, and 'then as the National Committee to Secure Justice For Morton Sobell in the Rosenberg Case'---."

In September, 1954, the name "National Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell" appeared on literature issued by the committee. In March, 1955, the current name "Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell," first appeared on literature issued by the committee.

The 1959-60 Borough of Manhattan Telephone Directory listed the "Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell" as being located at 940 Broadway, New York, New York.

WISCONSIN SOCIALIST CLUB

On December 10, 1957, a source described the Wisconsin Socialist Club (WSC) as then a duly registered and authorized student campus organization at the University of Wisconsin with a charter membership of 21, including MATTHEW CHAPPERON and RONALD RADOSH.

On June 23, 1958, a source described the WSC as an organization founded primarily on principles closely allied with those of English socialists with many of its members probably genuine socialists, but source observed that there existed a pro-Marxist element in the club, including CHAPPERON and RADOSH, which element has taken the lead in policymaking functions of the WSC. On 9/20/60, this source reported that RADOSH and CHAPPERON had been elected President and Secretary respectively for the 1960-61 school year.


CHAPPERON and RADOSH were publicly known as officers of the University of Wisconsin chapter of the Labor Youth League during the 1955-56 school year.

The issues of the "Daily Cardinal," a student publication at the University of Wisconsin, during the 1960-61 school year indicated that the WSC continued to function as an active student campus organization.

On November 30, 1960, a source identified MATTHEW CAMPPERON as then a member of the State Committee of the Communist Party of Wisconsin.

following information:

On or about July 24 or 25, 1961, a young Negro man came into land asked if he could leave a poster in the window. stated that he was collecting contributions to the Freedom Riders Fund and wished to know if the source would contribute. The source declined on the basis of not being financially able. He agreed, however, to the poster being left in his window.

The source stated that he is sympathetic with any group who is being mistreated but that he is suspicious of outsiders coming into the South to take up the Negroes! cause and that he feels this is the case of the Freedom Riders.

The poster is printed on cardboard approximately 12" by 18". It shows the caricature of a crow standing upright as a man. He is dressed as a two-gun man with a wide brim hat, open collared shirt and wearing a starshaped badge. In the background it shows a bus with scenes of men on the ground being kicked by others. The following is printed in the upper right-hand corner and is apparent intended to be spoken by the principal figure, "AH KNOW!N they aint gonna GIVE NUTTIN." Across the bottom of the poster is printed, "DOES HE SPEAK FOR YOU? GIVE FREEDOM RIDERS FUND GREATER BETHESDA BAPTIST CHURCH, 53rd. Mich."

Stamped on the poster by rubber stamp is the notation "Student Non-Violent Movement, Chairman, James Bevel, phone AL 5-8757." is printed in the upper right-hand corner and is apprently RIDERS FUND GREATER BETHESDA BAPTIST CHURCH, 537d. Mich." phone AL 5-8757."

There is no Bethesda Baptist Church at 53rd Avenue North and Michigan Avenue in Nashville, Tennessee.

FREEDOM RIDE 1961 RACIAL MATTERS; DESTRUCTION OF AIRCRAFT OR MOTOR VEHICLES: CIVIL RIGHTS

Information has been received which indicates that National Mendemarters of the Congress of Racial Equality (CORE) has infermed CORE officials throughout the country that an emergement exists, all field secretaries are to be alerted for pessible transfer and all freedem riders who have been released on appeal bonds are to return to Jackson. Mississippi, on August 14, 1961.

b7C It is noted that one hundred seventy-four freedom riders have been released on appeal bonds at Jackson, Mississippi. These bonds are returnable in Minds County Court, Jackson, Mississippi, on August 14, 1961, which is the first day of the court term. It has been a rule of the court since March 25, 1960, that every person who has been released on an appeal bond must be present on the opening day of court and each day thereafter until disposition has been made of the case. Failure to be present when the docket is called can mean forfeiture of the appeal bond. We have been advised that Jusk Travis, City Prosecutor, Jackson, Mississippi, has brought this rule to the attention of attorney for the freedom riders.

J. Robert Gilfoy, Sheriff, Hinds County, Jackson, Mississippi, stated on August 3, 1961, that his office is holding approximately \$87,000 in cash bonds which have been posted by CORE for the freedom riders. Sheriff Gilfoy expressed. the opinion that CORE may be in financial difficulty as several informed him that fifteen freedom riders days ago would post bend. Mortly thereafter, informed Sheriff Gilfey that only seven would make bend as he did not have emough memor to post bond for the remaining eight.





Information has been received that the Congress of Racial Equality (CORE) is sponsoring a "freedom walk" in Los Angeles on 8/5/61. This is reported to be a rally in support of the freedom riders, and is to speak.

Information has also been received of plans to hold a demonstration on 8/11/61 at the Los Angeles Rams - Washington Redskins football game in Los Angeles. This is a charity game sponsored by the "Los Angeles Times" newspaper. On 8/2/61 this paper reported it had received a written protest from the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) because of the Redskin policy of not employing Negro players. The same letter is also reported to have been sent to the Los Angeles Rams and various county and city officials. The letter allegedly threatened a boycott of the game.

Los Angeles has advised that CORE plans to hold the "freedom walk" as scheduled; however, plans for the demonstration at the football game are still in the discussion stage and have not solidified. CORE leadership is reportedly indifferent to holding a demonstration at the football game and according to Los Angeles there is no indication of planned demonstration by the NAACP.

ACTION

In connection with the freedom riders who have been released on appeal bonds and who must appear in Jackson, Mississippi, for the opening day of court en August 14, 1961, the Congress of Racial Equality (COME) has sent registered letters to one hundred eighty-six freedom riders giving instructions for proceeding to Jackson.

CORE, New York, anticipates that ten or filteen of the freedom riders will probably not appear in Jacason for one reason or another.

The train is scheduled to arrive in Houston at 9:25 a.m., August 11, 1961.

FREEDOM RIDE, 1961 GREYHOUND BUS NASHVILLE, TENNESSEE TO JACKSON, MISSISSIPPI July 21, 1961

"The Sun", a Baltimore, Maryland newspaper, dated July 19, 1961, contained an article to the effect that on July 18, 1961, JOEL GREENBERG, age - 21, 7103 Boxford Road, left the Greyhound Bus Station, Baltimore, for Nashville, Tennessee, as Baltimore's first "freedom rider." According to the article, GREENBERG said he had studied for a year at St. Johns College, Annapolis, Maryland and for the last nine months has been working for his father and taking a few courses at Loyola College, Baltimore, in the evenings.

GREENBERG said he expects to be met in Nashville by representatives of the Christian Leadership Conference. Just before boarding the bus, he described the trip as "just a matter of being a liberal American."

According to this article, Miss RIKKI ROSENTHAL, Vice Chairman of the Baltimore Chapter of Congress of Racial Equality, said this group expects to send some 18 more riders to the South in the near future. She added an application is sent to the New York Office of Congress of Racial Equality for screening and the candidate for the ride is interviewed before being sent on a freedom ride.

"The Sun" newspaper, dated July 22, 1961, contained an article stating in effect that JOEL BEN GREENBERG, 7103 Boxford Road, Baltimore, was fined and jailed on July 21, 1961 in Jackson, Mississippi. According to the article, GREENBERG was one of four "freedom riders" given \$200.00 fines and four months jail sentences. None of them presented a defense but agreed through their attorney that theirs was a continuance of earlier trials in which 243 others have been convicted of Breach of the Peace.

FAIR PLAY FOR CUBA COMMITTEE (FPCC)

The April 6, 1960, edition of "The New York Times" newspaper contains a full page advertisement captioned, "What Is Really Happening in Cuba," placed by the FPCC. This advertisement announced the formation of the FPCC in New York City, listed various sponsors of the Committee and declared the FPCC intended to promulgate "the truth about revolutionary Cuba" to neutralize the distorted American press on Cuban affairs.

"The New York Times" edition of January 11, 1961, reported that at a hearing conducted before the United States Senate Internal Security Subcommittee on January 10, 1961, Dr. CHARLES A. SANTOS-BUCH identified himself as one of the organizers of the FPCC. Also, Dr. SANTOS-BUCH identified ROBERT TABER as a co-organizer of the FPCC and said TABER drafted the aforementioned FPCC advertisement. Dr. SANTOS-BUCH further testified that he and TABER obtained \$3,500.00 from the Cuban Government through the son of Cuba's Foreign Minister, which funds, along with about \$1,100.00 collected from supporters of the FPCC, paid for the cost of aforementioned advertisement in "The New York Times."


On October 3, 1960, a source advised that the Socialist Workers Party (SWP) in New York had become active in the FPCC, and that SWP members, in a recent FPCC election, had been able to remove several Communist Party members who were on the Executive Board of the FPCC and gain control of the organization. This source asserted that the SWP members believed that they had achieved a great influence in the course of the Cuban revolution through their control of the FPCC.


On February 10, 1961, a second source advised that PHIL BART, National Organizational Secretary and member of the National Committee, Communist Party, USA, had reportedly stated recently that the FPCC had been captured by the Trotskyites, but that the CP had not given up in the FPCC.

The SWP and the CP, USA, have been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.
