





#### MAXWELL CHAFFETZ

I am the Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, United States Department of Justice.

The Federal Bureau of Investigation, United States Department of Justice, has been designated by the President to take charge of investigative work in matters relating to espionage, sabotage and violations of the neutrality regulations. This Sureau is also charged with the duty of investigating other matters bearing upon the maintenance of the internal security of the United States. The duties thus imposed upon this Sureau constitute a vital function in the national defense program of this country. At the present time this Sureau is required by Act of Congress to expand its personnel in order offectively to discharge the important duties devolving upon it.

Manuell Chaffetz is a trained Special Agent and has been continuously omployed by the Federal Bureau of Investigation since February 10, 1930. He has been employed as a Special Agent since February 12, 1934. He cannot be replaced satisfactorily because of the shortage of persons with his qualifications and experience in such activity, and his removal for induction would cause material loss of effectiveness in the conduct of the mational defense work of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. Extreme difficulty is being experienced at present in obtaining a sufficient number of qualified applicants to take care of the increasing expansion of this Bureau and it is impossible to consider a replacement of any individual for this reason. Turnover of personnel is extremely detrimental to efficiency, as trained and experienced members of the staff, such as laxwell Chaffetz, must form the nucleus of the expanded staff which this Bureau must recruit in order to fulfill its function, and therefore it is suggested that he be given Classification II-B.



This is in response to your letter dated March 2 calling for suggestions regarding the work in the Euresu.

So far as the work in the technical division is concerned since I entered the division a year ago, methods and our course of procedure have developed until I feel sure that we are arriving at a point at least approaching maximum efficiency. It seems to me, however, that our service could further be improved if we made some effort to encourage more careful work on the part of our contributors.

Large contributors should themselves appreciate the extent of our collection of points and the necessity on that account of submitting consistently paints that are complete and thorough. "e should only have to call the matter to their attention.

More difficulty might be encountered with the smaller contributors who perhaps do not reslize the size of our files. Much could be accomplished. I think, if they were acquainted with the fact that our division has so rapidly increased that our service to them would reach its most efficient point only when they on their part submit paints that could be classified correctly by us. with this help on their part. I am sure our service would be greatly improved.



#### NOTES FOR EXAMINING PHYSICIAN

Weight: Males, without clothing, and also in ordinary clothing without overcoat or hat (weigh twice); females, clothed but without wrap or hat.

Height: Without boots or shoes; observe that no appliances are used to increase.

The examination should include the following observations, as to-

- (1) Eyes: Ptosis; discharge; corneal scar; pterygium. In recording distant vision consider 20 feet as normal and report all vision as a fraction with 20 feet as numerator and the smallest type read at 20 feet as denominator. If glasses are used, record for each eye the finding with and without glasses.\*
- (2) EARS: Evidence of middle ear or mastoid disease; condition of drums; discharge. In recording hearing, record 20 feet as normal distance for conversational voice and record deviation from normal as fraction with 20 as denominator and actual distance as numerator.
- (3) Nose: Ability to blow through each nostril. If free, a speculum examination would not be indicated.
- (4) Mouth: Missing teeth, pyorrhea.
- (5) THROAT: Tonsils, hypertrophy.
- (6) THYROID: Presence of tumor in neck and tremor, exophthalmos; nervous highstrung disposition, especially in women.
- (7) Heart: Murmurs. If valvular disease exists, state whether or not it is fully compensated.
- (8) Lungs: It is necessary that the auscultatory cough be used. Tuberculosis; if present state whether active or arrested, and if arrested your opinion as to how long it has been quiescent. Sputum to be examined for tubercle bacilli in all suspected cases.
- (9) Inguinal Rings: Hernia, no hernia but impulse on coughing; no hernia or impulse but abnormally large rings. Any other hernia should be noted, and if present describe fully and state whether it is retained by well-fitting truss.
- (10 to 13) Scars, deformities, atrophies, paralyses, or flat foot of such a nature as to incapacitate or become aggravated by work or be later alleged as caused by accident or occupation. By "flat foot," as used in this form, is meant a foot with impaired function, the term being equivalent to "fallen or misplaced arch," an abnormal condition. Impairment of function is the point to be noted. It is not intended that small, insignificant blemishes which might be referred to as marks of identification be recorded.
- (15) Urinalysis to be made and blood pressure to be taken when especially indicated, particularly in persons over 40 when arteriosclerosis, nephritis, or diabetes is suspected.

Clegg reports that applicant presents a good personal appearance and approach; has ordinary features; has a good personality; well-poised; average in speech; self-confident; tactful; answers general questions definitely; has not studied Federal Procedure; has had investigative experience only as a fingerprint classifier; appears to be resourceful but not to have executive ability; however he is likely to develop. Applicant was good in the dictation test. He can use a typewriter.

Applicant has had experience as a lecturer on a sight-seeing bus in Washington, as clerk, and as a fingerprint classifier in the Identification Unit of this Division since February 1930. Applicant is endorsed by former Senator F. H. Gillett.

I am submitting the following suggestions in response to your letter of December 7, 1934.

(1.) I am in receipt of your letter of December 21, 1934, outlining a plan for the creation of a fund for the benefit of the families of agents who may lose their lives in the performance of official duty. I am in accord with the phan outlined, although it is my belief that further steps be taken. The following outlines breifly a plan that has occurred to me, which would in effect amount to an insurance policy but would do away with high premiums and any question of payment because of the nature of our duties.

Under this plan each agent would be required to pay into a fund a sum which would create an amount large enough to pay to the wife or any other beneficiary thesum of \$10,000 (ten thousand dollars) regardless of whether that agent may be killed by violence or die a natural death. This fund could be so administered that the expense of maintaining it would be very negligible and also in such a manner that the amount to be paid by each agent would be very small compared to existing insurance rates. It can readily be seen that creation of such a fund would relieve the individual agent of the burden he now carries in trying to maintain an insurance policy which is necessarily large, because it is hisdesire on account of the nature of his duties, to take better care of his survivors.

It is possible that under this plan the fund will become in time, large enough so that no further payments into it will be required, thus resulting in a greater benefit to the agent whose calary does not permit him to maintain any other insurance in addition to that given him by the above plan.

I do not believe that any plan the fund which only protects an

11/35

agent killed by violence is sufficient. Ido believe, however, that any plan created should give as much consideration to the agent who dies a natural death after giving his time and health to his work as to the man killed in line of duty.

(2). An equitable plan should be evolved for the benefit of agents on special assignment who are required to spend 24 hours a day away from home and yet within their headquarters city so that these agents would receive some remuneration for the expense incurred by them in obtaining meals away from home.

It has been my experience wherein the maintenance of 24 hour plants has resulted in additional expense of some thirty to forty dollars a month to me for the purchase of meals that under ordinary circumstances. I would have had at home. It is my belief therefore that an egent on special assignment under the above circumstances should be allowed some compensation for this expenditure.

(5). A plan should be evolved by which agents especially those on special assignment would receive more intensive instruction on the use of firearms; some such plan as is now in vogue in the training classes whereby agents spend aperiod of a few days at an Army post would prove very beneficial to agents who have not had such training.

In discussing this matter with other agents I have fould that many of the men, even those who have been in the service for a number of years, are not as familiar as they should be with the proper uses of firearms under all emergency conditions.

Intestinal fortitude is a necessary factor in the work which we are called upon to do, however, proper conduct under fire is an essential and I believe that every agent should be given one week at some Army camp for a very intensive training under expert supervision in the proper handling of all types of firearms. Such a period of training could also consist of practice raids in which the proper use of tear gas would be demonstrated.

The above suggestions are respectfully submitted for your consideration.

Dear Mr. Chaffetz:

I desire to refer further to your letter dated January 2, 1935 in which you submitted a number of suggestions for imprevement in the Division's operation.

With respect to your first suggestion to the effect that the proposed plan for raising a sum of money to be made available for the widow or designated beneficiary in the event of death by violence of a Special Agent of this Division be extended to an insurance policy eliminating high premiums for the benefit of Special Agents and that the amount of \$10,000 be made payable, regardless of whether the agent involved meets his death by violence or dies a natural death, The question of according protection to Special Agents of this Division, as well as to dependents, has given me no little concern and you will probably recall that some months ago an effort was made to have all agents in the service adopt a group insurance plan. The insurance company in that case tendered certain concessions which could only be received if the majority of agents voted for its adoption. It was my hope at the time that the plan would be adopted. However, a sufficient number of agents aid not accept the offer, which precluded placing this plan into operation. The plan recently initiated by the Division and mentioned above is purely temporary, in view of the fact that legislation is now being sponsored which will provide a sump sum payment for the widow or designated beneficiary of an employee killed in the line of duty in the amount of \$12,000. I do not believe it would be possible for the Division to inaugurate a plan such as the one you suggest.

RECORDED

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With regard to your second suggestion relative to the reimbursement of agents for expenditures made at their headquarters city while on special assignment, you are advised that this is a matter over which the Division has no jurisdiction and it must be guided entirely by the opinions rendered by the General accounting Office on the subject. Their opinions have been consistent to the effect that all expenditures made in the headquarters city such as enumerated in your suggestion can not be covered in the regular expense account.

Your third suggestion with regard to according special agents extensive instruction in the use of firearms meets with my hearty approval. I have always insisted that all agents receive monthly training, believing that this training is absolutely necessary in view of the nature of the work which the Division is now called upon to perform. I know you will be interested to know that a school was started here at the Seat of Government to retrain all old agents in the service. A part of the curriculum of this course requires them to spend a number of days at the army base at Quantico, Virginia, where they are placed under experts in the use of firearms and given extensive training in the use of the various types of arms now being utilized in this service.

I desire to express to you again my appreciation of your courtesy in forwarding these suggestions to me.

I desire to make the following suggestion in connection with the fund maintained by voluntary contributions in the amount of \$10.00 from each Special Agent.

It is respectfully suggested that each Special Agent desiring to do so be required, as of a given date, to pledge himself to contribute the \$10.00 to this fund when it is expended under the existing regulations. Dear Sir:

Reference is made to Bureau letter dated June 1, 1938 requesting the individual employees of the Bureau to submit any suggestions which they may have which might lead to improvement in the operation of the Eureau's activities.

In this connection I desire to submit the following suggestion:

It has occurred to me from time to time that problems arise in the individual field offices, which may be new in their nature as far as the personnel of certain offices are concerned, yet the same problems which raise a question in those particular offices may have been successfully handled in some other field offices. I have in mind the comparatively recent situation which always occurred when the field offices were required to conduct certain circularizations. In speaking to agents of various offices throughout the country it was determined that the individual offices all had the same problem and that it had been met in various ways, finally culminating in the Eureau requesting the individual field offices to secure bids from mailing houses to handle these circularizations.

My thought in the matter was that the Bureau could require that once a month or at some set time Special Agents in Charge to submit these problems to the Bureau, stating at the time how they handled the matters. Although the matters may have been handled satisfactorily the problems may have been treated differently by the various Special Agents in Charge and possibly may have been handled in a better fashion. The Bureau could devise some means whereby these problems that are raised could be brought to the attention of all the offices in order to secure individual view points and information as to how the problems had been handled in other parts of the country, and this information would certainly be invaluable to other Special Agents in Charge if the same problems or similar ones might arise in the future.

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It is also believed that all of these problems and methods of handling them could be maintained as a matter of record in the Pureau and at the time a Opecial Agents in Charge Conference is held they could be discussed in a Group, at which time it is believed that some very helpful suggestions could be obtained as to handling such problems in the future.

Yr. CHAFFITZ presents an excellent appearance, is well groomed, poised, intelligent, and experienced. He is mature, versatile, and well qualified to carry out in an efficient manner any type of investigation which he might receive. His physical condition has improved, and I believe him presently able to function satisfactorily on arduous assignments.

He is an excellent dictator and an experienced automobile driver. He types at an average rate of speed, but does not use the touch system. He has no shorthand ability.

This employee is fully qualified in the Bureau policies, procedures, and investigative techniques. He has handled all types of investigation, both of a routine and complicated nature. He has functioned in an administrative and supervisory capacity in the past, and is both an excellent investigator and administrator. Assignments can be made to him with the knowledge that the work will require a minimum of supervision and that such assignments will be carried through to a logical conclusion in an efficient, thorough and capable manner.

Fr. CHAFFETZ has testified on numerous occasions during his Bureau tenure, and is well experienced in this role.

He is rated excellent in the use of all Bureau firearms, being particularly adept with the revolver. He is well qualified to operate on dangerous assignments, and is capable of supervising others in the conduct of raids and dangerous assignments.
