November 13-15 Antiwar Effort

Sponsors of the November 13-15, 1969, antiwar protest in Washington hope to involve between 250,000 and 500,000 persons. The New Mobilization Committee to End the War in Vietnam (NMC) leads a coalition of antiwar groups including the Communist Party, USA, the anarchistic Students for a Democratic Society (SDS), and various pacifist, clergy, and student groups, and its leaders have claimed that the protest action will be dignified and orderly. On the other hand, some elements, including SDS forces, have vowed to "tear Washington apart," to bomb the South Vietnamese Embassy, and to provoke a violent confrontation between themselves and National Guard and Metropolitan Police units. SDS will march on the Department of Justice building along with the Yippies--Youth International Party--who, according to the Yippies leaders, will smash windows, throw Molotov cocktails, and try to break into the building--as a protest against the trial in Chicago of individuals accused of conspiracy to violate Federal antiriot statutes during the Democratic National Convention in Chicago in August, 1968.

A demonstration in support of world peace and against President Richard M. Nixon is scheduled to take place Saturday, November 8, 1969, at Key Biscayne, Miami, Florida, where President Nixon will then be in residence. The demonstration will be sponsored by "The Movement" and the University of Miami Vietnam Moratorium Committee, which are student organizations at the University of Miami opposed to the Vietnam War.

Arnold Johnson, the Communist Party's public relations director, who is also a member of the NMC steering committee, has voiced concern that the speeches of Vice President Agnew and Attorney General Mitchell showing Communist Party affiliation with the antiwar protest have worked against the Communist Party and himself.

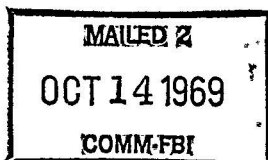

Antiwar Demonstrations

The logistical problems involved in providing housing for the thousands of antiwar marchers expected in Washington, D. C., for the November 13-15 demonstrations are plaguing the leaders of the protest action. Representatives of the New Mobilization Committee to End the War in Vietnam (NMC) have complained that preparations to house the demonstrators in the Washington area are in a state of chaos. Housing has been found for 7,000, but there is urgent need for accommodations for some 80,000 persons. There is also a shortage of funds for buttons and literature. More importantly, both the Teamsters Union and the United Automobile Workers Union have turned down NMC requests for funds and support.

Radical groups are zeroing in on the Department of Justice as a focus of action during the Washington demonstrations.

[redacted] has declared that his group considers a demonstration at the Department of Justice on November 15 as the "main thing we are thinking of in terms of action as a thing that has any potential." (1)

New York City Bombings (2)

Information has been developed that the recent bombings in New York City as well as several earlier bombings in this country and Canada were the work of six militant antiwar activists led by one Samuel Joseph Melville, aged 34. Bombs detonated almost simultaneously at approximately 1 a.m., November 11, 1969, in New York City caused extensive damage at the Chase Manhattan Building, the RCA Building, and the General Motors Building.

Since last July, several other major explosions, all apparently caused by dynamite-type bombs and resulting in extensive damage, have taken place in the New York City area. In each instance, a telephonic warning had been received by authorities immediately prior to the bombing.

Melville allegedly stated that bombings were planned for the night of November 10-11, but he did not mention the specific targets. Melville's whereabouts is unknown, but round-the-clock surveillance is being maintained on his New York City residence.

Latin America

(U) Dominican Republic: A ranking government official of the Dominican Republic cautioned early this month that General Elias Wessin y Wessin, candidate for President in the 1970 Dominican national election, will not accept defeat at the polls. This source stated that Wessin y Wessin, who has significant influence in all branches of the Dominican military services, may claim election fraud if defeated and attempt to wrest control of the government through a military coup. (S)

(U) Panama: Arnulfo Arias, deposed President of Panama who is residing in Miami, Florida, plans to visit Washington, D. C., later this month prior to a scheduled trip to Mexico. He feels this is necessary to dispel an impression current among Panamanians that he was removed from the Canal Zone by the United States Government, and subsequently instructed by American officials to stay away from Washington. (S)

(U) General Omar Torrijos Herrera, leading political force in the provisional junta government of Panama, has informed his Ambassador in Washington, D. C., that he is displeased with developments in current negotiations with the United States over procurement of helicopters for the Panamanian Government. He felt American reaction to political comments he had made for home consumption was quarrelsome and deserved counterarguments on his part. Ambassador Roberto Aleman attempted to reassure Torrijos that the American attitude was not as he had interpreted it. (S)

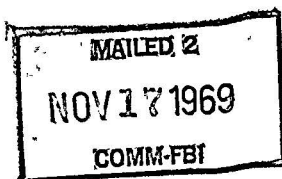

Antiwar Demonstrations

With the Washington, D. C., antiwar demonstrations started, these reports of special interest have been received:

The Vietnam Solidarity Committee (VSC), an intensely militant coalition of radical students from northeastern colleges, has established temporary headquarters in Washington to coordinate protest activities which have a high potential for violence. To be known as the Revolutionary Contingent (RC) while in Washington, this group will hold a rally at Dupont Circle at 8:30 p.m. today. Several speakers will address this rally, including a member of the violence-prone Black Panther Party and possibly one of the seven defendants in the Chicago Federal antiriot trial. After this meeting, RC leaders plan a demonstration at the South Vietnamese Embassy. A deliberate decision will be made at the rally, depending on the size and temper of the crowd, as to whether the Embassy demonstration will be peaceful or violent. If the latter, RC leaders have declared they intend to force entry into the Embassy to present an "eviction notice."

On November 15, RC plans to organize an afternoon march on the Department of Justice Building, the time to be decided based on the militant temper of the demonstrators involved. The Department of Justice Building will be encircled by demonstrators, and a mock trial will be held, which will be climaxed by burning effigies of the President and the Attorney General. Leaders of the RC state that demonstrators, wearing helmets and carrying gas masks, will attempt to break through police lines and storm the Office of the Attorney General.

The Mad Dog faction of the Students for a Democratic Society (SDS) is providing the principal leadership and direction for the VSC activities in Washington. The Weatherman and Revolutionary Youth Movement II factions of SDS are represented in the VSC coalition, as are a number of other strongly militant groups in the East. (4)

Financial difficulties continue to plague the New Mobilization Committee to End the War in Vietnam (NMC), although substantial collections of money have started to come in. On November 12, alone, contributions totaling

\$36,000 were received, but they were in the form of checks, not cash. The checks are drawn on banks outside the Washington, D. C., area, and the NMC's Washington banker, the American Security & Trust Company, has refused to issue funds against the checks until they have cleared their respective banks. NMC creditors, aware of the tight money situation, are refusing to provide services for NMC until payments in certified or cashiers checks are presented. (2)

The University of Miami Vietnam Moratorium Committee has announced that a march will be made on President Richard M. Nixon's compound at Key Biscayne, Miami, Florida, on November 16, 1969. (3)

Black Panther Party

Black extremist assaults on police officers are seriously accelerating in our larger cities. In the past six months, six officers have been killed and 120 injured in more than 100 unprovoked black attacks on policemen. Eight officers were wounded and one was killed by gunfire in Chicago on November 13, after police responded to a "man with gun" call in a Negro neighborhood. This unprovoked attack involved three Negro men. One of these was killed and another wounded by police gunfire. The third man is being sought. The wounded assailant has been identified as a member of the viciously antipolice Black Panther Party (BPP). Members of this extremist organization have been involved in a number of police assaults in the past several months.

The violence of the Black Panthers has brought heavy prosecutive pressure to bear on members of that organization. The Party's funds are being depleted as legal fees mount and sources of revenue dwindle. Murray Kempton, former "New York Post" columnist, is attempting to do something about the BPP's money problems by acting as a fund raiser for the Party in New York City. Working in New York with BPP National Field Marshal, [redacted] Kempton is soliciting funds from affluent New Yorkers by trading on his prominence as a writer for liberal causes. His efforts were expected to produce an immediate \$1,000 for the Party and an additional \$3,000 by the first week in December, 1969.

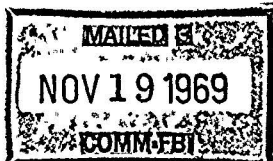

Pursuant to the Director's telephone call, I talked to the above-captioned person this morning concerning the White House and the Attorney General's concern relating to FBI security material being furnished the White House.

I told Mr. Huston about the voluminous amount of information of current value that has been sent to the White House and of the scope of our operations that produced it. Mr. Huston replied that since the new arrangement whereby he has direct liaison with the Bureau and receives directly and promptly our security material, he has had no reason to be anything but satisfied. He commented on the speed with which he is getting it and the value of it. Mr. Huston remarked that probably the criticism which arose dates back prior to the new arrangement and that the time lag might explain the concern.

I told Mr. Huston that no stone is being left unturned in order to provide the White House with the necessary intelligence information. He said he understood that.

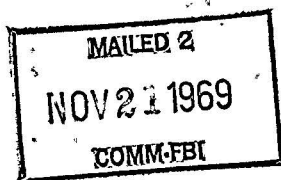

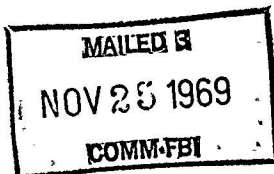

Demonstrations--Japanese Prime Minister

A demonstration led by Students for a Democratic Society (SDS) protesting American military involvement in Japan is scheduled for San Francisco International Airport on November 23, 1969, upon the visit there of Prime Minister Eisaku Sato of Japan. The demonstrators--members of the Stanford University chapter, other SDS groups in the Bay area, and the Resistance, a militant antiwar organization--will begin the protest action at 1:30 p.m. in the United Air Lines lobby of the airport. A demonstration is also planned for 3 p.m. that day at the Mark Hopkins Hotel. (1)

Soviet Espionage: Old Faces in New Places

Filipp Tikhonovich Sarychev, the personal chauffeur of Soviet Foreign Minister Andrei Gromyko during Gromyko's recent visit to New York to attend the 24th session of the United Nations General Assembly, served as a Soviet intelligence officer in this country in the late 1940's. In 1949, while on the staff of the Soviet Delegation to the United Nations, Sarychev had at least three contacts with Harry Gold in New York. Gold, a confessed Soviet espionage agent, was involved in the Rosenberg-Sobell atom bomb spy ring during World War II. Sarychev's objective in meeting with Gold was to reactivate him as an espionage agent.

Sarychev's clandestine contacts with Gold would ordinarily bar the issuance of a visa to him as a member of the Soviet Delegation to the United Nations. He has, however, been admitted to this country yearly since 1963 for brief periods of time at Mr. Gromyko's specific request that he serve as his personal chauffeur.

Latin America

(U) Julio Sanjines, Bolivian Ambassador to the United States, speculates that his assignment in Washington may be nearing an end. He believes that his revolutionary fervor is in question by the new military government in Bolivia and that he may be recalled within a month or two or when the first crisis shakes that government. ANTIWAR DEMONSTRATIONS

Washington

Despite pledges by the leaders of the New Mobilization Committee to End the War in Vietnam (NMC) that the Washington, D.C., antiwar demonstrations would be peaceful, violent confrontations with police were carried out by thousands of demonstrators. At the Dupont Circle rally on the night of November 14, members of militant factions of the Students for a Democratic Society (SDS), the Youth International Party, and other groups--a mob estimated at more than 3,000--charged police lines as they attempted to reach the South Vietnamese Embassy to serve an "eviction notice." Turned back by police tear gas, the demonstrators--many helmeted and carrying sticks or rocks--smashed windows along Massachusetts and Connecticut Avenues, attacked private cars, and repeatedly hit police officers with rocks, bottles, and other missiles. Windows in some 70 buildings were smashed; 26 militants were arrested; 50 police vehicles were damaged, and approximately 30 persons were injured.

The Dupont Circle street fight brought strong disclaimers of responsibility from the NMC. But it did not trigger any really positive action by New Mobe leaders to head off promised violence by the Mad Dogs (SDS faction), Crazies, and others at the Department of Justice Building on the following day.

In the massive march from the Capitol to the Washington Monument grounds on the morning of November 15, repeated taunts were hurled by the marchers as they passed the Department of Justice Building that it would "catch hell" that afternoon. Many of these demonstrators had been observed before the march arming themselves with rocks and other missiles. At the mammoth Washington Monument rally, some 225,000 persons participated. David Dellinger, one of the seven defendants at the Chicago Federal antiriot trial and a leader of the NMC, declared to the crowd that he, Abbie Hoffman, and Jerry Rubin (also defendants) would be at the Department of Justice at 5 p.m., and he urged everyone to be there.

After the rally, demonstrators surged to the Department of Justice Building. As the crowd grew to an estimated 20,000, the NMC marshals quickly proved ineffectual. Demonstrators on the Constitution Avenue side of the Justice Building showered the building with rocks. Windows were broken and the building was also hit by red paint. Many at the scene observed a preponderance of persons who were of nonstudent age. This was in contrast to the crowd at the Washington Monument rally which was largely comprised of young people, many of whom were from colleges and high schools in the metropolitan Washington-Baltimore area. Few Negroes were observed in the crowd at the Justice Building. Repeated use of tear gas by the police drove the militants from the Department of Justice and into the downtown business area where they smashed many windows and attacked private automobiles. (1)

A WEATHERMAN FORECAST: VIOLENCE AT THE JUSTICE DEPARTMENT

Militants of the Weatherman faction of the Students for a Democratic Society who demonstrated at the Department of Justice on November 15 had been well organized to promote a strategy of disruption. At a meeting that Saturday morning in the temporary Washington headquarters of the Weatherman group, two tactical units of activists composed of four squads each, were organized to implement their plans. Unit and squad leaders were designated and tactics for the day's disruptive activity, particularly at the Justice Building, were devised. It was agreed among these militants that, in the demonstrations planned for 5 p.m. at the Justice Department, they would stay in the background themselves but would deliberately attempt to foment violence in the crowd.

Operating with a degree of disciplined organization rarely seen in the new left movement, the Weatherman units filtered through the crowds at the Washington Monument rally that afternoon distributing literature and agitating for disruptive action against the Department of Justice. At the Justice Building following the rally, they agitated among the crowd with chants of "Stop the trial! Free Bobby Seale!" and, with other militants, draped Viet Cong flags on the doors of the building. As the crowd became more menacing, rocks and bottles were hurled through windows of the building. The police were finally forced to respond with tear gas, dispersing the crowd.

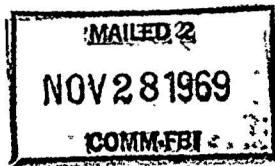

In the aftermath of this month's antiwar activities, a costly accounting: 606 persons injured, 26 of them police officers; 175 demonstration-related arrests; repair cost for damaged doors and broken windows in businesses estimated at \$218,000 to \$240,000; cost of replacing over 100 broken windows in 20 U.S. Government owned or leased buildings, \$7,700 with an additional \$2,230 estimated to replace damaged shrubbery; estimated cost to repair 76 damaged law enforcement vehicles, \$6,200; damage in parks, including the Washington Monument grounds, \$10,000 to \$12,000; cost of removal of 50 tons of debris estimated at \$8,500; overtime pay estimates for the three major Washington Police Departments, \$473,776; and additional costs, over and above normal expenses, for troop deployment in the Washington area estimated at \$1,000,000.

Poland: Tourists are Welcome

Americans in Poland seeking privacy should steer clear of tourist hotels. At least, this is indicated by the recent experience of one couple in Krakow, Poland. The Krakowia Hotel, a new tourist facility, held reservations for them when they arrived to visit relatives, but through a mix-up, their room was not immediately available. Taking a walk while the matter was being straightened out, they fell into conversation with a Polish Catholic priest. At mention of the reservation problem, the priest told them that the rooms on the 4th, 5th, and 6th floors of the Krakowia Hotel--all reserved for tourists--were reputedly equipped with listening devices. Tourists on other floors could expect prompt visits to their rooms from hotel employees intent on correcting some minor maintenance difficulties--and also on installing hidden listening devices. The priest cautioned the couple against unguarded remarks in the privacy of their room, as such information had been used by Polish Security Service agents in the past to pressure tourists into cooperation with them in covert intelligence roles.

During their visit in Poland, this couple detected a strong undercurrent of anti-Americanism among the less educated people they encountered, an attitude sharply in contrast with the general friendliness they had encountered on an earlier visit. Friends provided them with an explanation and also a sharp insight into the harsh realities of living under a communist regime.

They learned that the Polish Government imposes a 10 per cent tax on the gross earnings of all Polish citizens to raise funds in support of the North Vietnamese war effort. The natural resentment that this tax has engendered among the workers has found an outlet in hostility against Americans who are incessantly condemned by Polish Government propaganda as imperialist aggressors in South Vietnam.

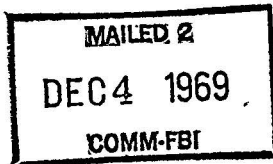

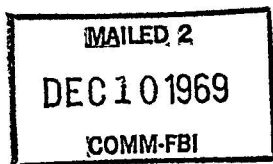

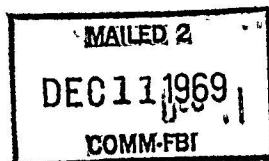

Eldridge Cleaver declares vengeance justified in wake of Chicago Black Panther Party (BPP) leader Fred Hampton's death in a shoot-out with police. (1) Cleaver, fugitive Panther Minister of Information, telephoned the Illinois chapter of the BPP from his Algerian exile on December 4. He called for a report on the death of Fred Hampton, Deputy Chairman of the chapter, killed in a Chicago gun fight in which two police officers were injured. Retaliation seemed to be on Cleaver's mind as he asked specifically about the reaction of the Negro community to the incident. Cleaver declared that talk of vengeance then current among the Panther members was totally justified because the BPP is fighting for the "liberation" of black people. ***** Earlier on December 4, BPP National Headquarters attempted unsuccessfully to telephone Cleaver for guidance on how the Panthers should react to the shooting of Hampton. ***** Hampton's death, coupled with the December 3 arrest of the [redacted]

[redacted] has intensified an already serious leadership problem. Hampton was slated to take over from [redacted] after [redacted] a promotion for his revolutionary zeal and fiery loyalty to the Party. It was Hampton who, during a private conversation in April, 1968, expressed interest in developing some means of poisoning guests attending functions at the White House.

Connecticut Black Panthers plan to instigate riots and make a "show of armed force" in New Haven when [redacted] is returned to that city on extradition from California. (2) The return of [redacted] may come next week. An extradition hearing [redacted] is.

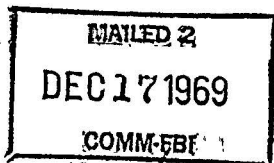

For your guidance the following are suggested types of information (not all-inclusive) that would be appropriate for this intelligence letter:

- (1) Information of national or international significance which is security related.
- (2) Important current or pending developments in major security cases.
- (3) Current information which is representative of or calls attention to a significant developing intelligence trend.

- (4) Material which has a bearing on national security, particularly that from sensitive and/or penetrative coverage of foreign establishments, which could affect American relations with foreign countries, or assist in formulating United States policy.

Soviet intelligence continues to circumvent United States travel restrictions. By having intelligence personnel assigned to the United Nations Secretariat (UNSEC) in New York City, the Soviet Government is able to avoid travel restrictions imposed by the United States on employees of Soviet official establishments, such as the Soviet Mission to the United Nations and the Soviet Embassy. Although this practice violates UN regulations, by early this month the Soviets had succeeded in placing 44 identified intelligence personnel among the 203 Soviet officials assigned to UNSEC. These intelligence operatives, who do not possess diplomatic immunity, use the UNSEC cover to travel without restriction throughout the United States. An example is [REDACTED]

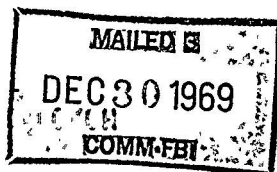

Black extremist allegedly tipped off to police search plans by aide to Cleveland mayor. Early on December 17, 1969, Cleveland police officers with a warrant searched the apartment of [redacted] for a cache of guns. [redacted]

Weatherman leaders divulge revolutionary aims to representative of pro-Chinese Communist (Chicom) organization. Prominent leaders of the Weatherman faction of the Students for a Democratic Society (SDS) conferred this month with a representative of a United States-based pro-Chicom organization. This representative was informed that SDS is striving to develop a small, tough, action-oriented revolutionary party with reliance on the white, urban intellectual for leadership. This aim is necessary since SDS does not believe unity between black and white youth is possible or that the white worker is now oriented toward goals of SDS. Consequently, the essential strategy of SDS is to build a white, paramilitary organization totally committed to revolution and designed to carry out guerilla warfare in American cities. The Weatherman leaders hold no prospect for developing a large, national party in the United States. But, they feel American workers will join them eventually as the capitalist economic "crisis" mounts and leads to diminishing living standards. The Weatherman faction is determined to accelerate this crisis by means of tactical guerrilla warfare as waged by Cuba's Fidel Castro. (1)

Communist Party, USA (CPUSA), leader to report to Soviets regarding American domestic scene. CPUSA General Secretary Gus Hall is to report to the Communist Party of the Soviet Union on his current assessment of the domestic situation in the United States. An FBI informant says Hall's appraisal is based on the theme of a developing recession in this country which threatens to become a depression. ***** Hall perceives the present economic picture as comparable to that of the late 1920's and early 1930's. Economic factors involving the stock market and inflation are, in his view, leading to a political crisis. Hall contends that this crisis is manifested by an ideological split among members of the President's Cabinet. He believes this split will be aggravated by continued revelations of United States atrocities in Vietnam, which are affecting world opinion. A domestic crisis involving industry will develop also, according to Hall, as the Administration becomes increasingly anti-labor in attitude and practice. (2)

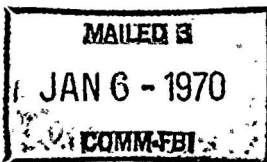

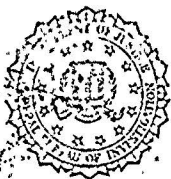

DETROIT --- A Constitutional Convention of the Republic of New Africa (RNA) will be held in Detroit, Michigan, January 23-25, to elect the young nation's first active President and a new government and decide on the form and method of adopting its first constitution.

Brother Gaidi (Atty. Milton Henry), First Vice President, has served as chief executive since the founding of the nation when Robert Williams, then in exile in China, was named President. Williams resigned last November, two months after the Republic engineered his safe return to America, without ever having assumed active office.

Brother Gaidi joined with Brother Imari, Speaker of the National Council of Representatives (RNA's legislature) and author of the book WAR IN AMERICA, in urging all citizens of the Republic to make very sacrifice to attend this important Convention. Black people who believe in building an independent nation but who have not yet formally become citizens are also urged to attend. The Convention opens Friday noon, January 23, at the Northond Family Center, 150 Belmont Avenue, Detroit.

Founded by declaration of several hundred black nationalists assembled in Detroit on March 31, 1968, the Republic seeks to carve an independent nation out of the five Southern states now known as Louisiana, Mississippi, Alabama, South Carolina, and Georgia. Since its founding the still-landless nation has spread to virtually every state in the Union where there is a significant number of black people and is represented on 33 college campuses.

Republic policy has been to seek negotiations with the United States, for money reparations as well as land, and to prepare for plebiscites --- independence elections --- in the Southern States under conditions which would bring in the United Nations. Strong forces at the Convention are expected to push for authority and support to turn the Mississippi liberation campaign into "an intense national project" immediately. They are intent upon making 1970 "The Year of the Republic."

Power and Peace, Fellow Citizen:

1. In accordance with a decision of the Supreme Court of the Republic of New Africa, handed down on 27 December 1969 by Justice Chokwe Lumumba, a CONSTITUTIONAL CONVENTION will be held in Detroit, Michigan, at the North-End Family Center, 150 Belmont Avenue (John R. Street near Boston Boulevard, phone 867-3119), on Friday, 23 January 1970 through Sunday, 25 January 1970. Registration (\$3.00 per person), housing check-in, and dinner will be from noon until 7:00 PM Friday. The Convention will formally open and organize itself at 7:00 PM. It will be hosted by the officers of the National Council of Representatives.

2. The Supreme Court has ruled that a Constitutional Convention is necessary because the present Government goes out of existence by 25 January 1970. The Constitutional Convention will do the following things:

- a. Decide what laws will continue and what new laws are needed;
- b. Decide the time and manner of writing, discussing, and approving a Constitution;
- c. Authorize a structure of Government to be in operation until effect of the Constitution, and
- d. Elect officers to fill that structure.

3. Each Consulate must now elect seven Delegates for the Convention. No officer of the Government and no Founder or anyone else will automatically be a Delegate. All Delegates must be elected. The Consul should send names to reach Sister Lana Mitchell, Uhuru Market, P.O. Box 15321, Cincinnati, Ohio, 45215, no later than Wednesday, 21 January 1969. All citizens must be given at least three days notice of the Consulate election. All citizens must be permitted to vote in the Consulate election.

4. ALL CITIZENS ARE URGED TO ATTEND THE CONVENTION. If 40% of all citizens come (with at least 10% of citizens from every area), all citizens attending will participate in deliberations and vote. Otherwise, citizens attending will participate but only Delegates will vote. In this case, Citizens who come from areas where there are no Consulates will be organized, by the Convention, in a way to assure voting rights.

5. Consuls and Justice Ministers must get all citizens together and carefully work out proposals for the Convention in advance.

6. Every citizen is asked to fill out a tax pledge. (The attached copy may be reproduced.) The head of the Consulate Delegation (or the citizen, where there is no Consulate) must bring the tax pledge to the Convention, in a secure fashion, for financial planning of the new Government. Or it may be mailed to Box 667, Detroit, Michigan 48206. (ZIP Code important.)

7. There is some free housing, but citizens should bring at least \$12.00 to cover two nights.

REPUBLIC OF NEW AFRICA (RNA)

A source advised in May, 1969, that the Republic of New Africa (RNA) is an all-Negro organization founded in Detroit, Michigan, in March, 1968. ROBERT F. WILLIAMS, who was then residing in Peking, China, was named as its President-In-Exile. After fleeing the United States in 1961 following the issuance of a local warrant in North Carolina on a charge of kidnaping growing out of a racial incident, WILLIAMS published and broadcast hate-type material in Cuba and China prior to his return to the United States in September, 1969.

A second source has advised that the purpose of the RNA is to establish an independent black nation within the United States, demanding the States of Alabama, Georgia, Louisiana, Mississippi, and South Carolina in addition to \$10,000 per black citizen as payment for 400 years of ancestral slave labor.

A third source advised on March 14, 1969, that an army of the RNA, known as the Black Legion, dedicated to black freedom and committed to the concept of systematic armed revolution, has been established. Black Legion members are expected to participate in military training and engage in firearms practice. The RNA plans to establish an underground Black Legion in addition to an aboveground Black Legion in order to avoid detection by the police.

According to this source, Black Legion members acting as bodyguards at a session of the Second National Convention of the RNA in Detroit, Michigan, on March 29, 1969, were involved in a shoot-out with members of the Detroit Police Department which resulted in the killing of one policeman and the critical wounding of another.

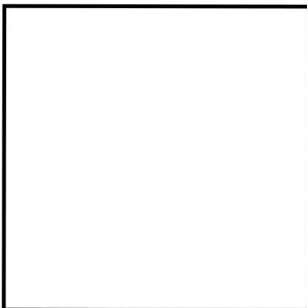

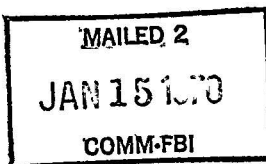

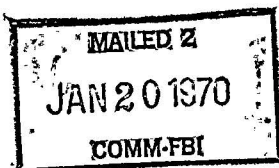

Sino-Soviet border clashes of past summer severe defeats for Chinese.

Communist Party, USA (CPUSA), has informed sources within the CPUSA that Red Chinese forces were severely beaten in last summer's border conflicts with Soviet troops.

He asserted that several divisions had been committed to the conflicts on both sides and that the Chinese units had been badly mauled. [redacted] believed these reversals prompted Peking's decision to discuss the border disputes with the Soviet Union. ***** Gus Hall, CPUSA General Secretary, recently told a trusted associate that a number of Soviet and Chinese infantry and armored divisions were involved in the Central Asian border clashes. He affirmed the heavy Chinese losses and stated the Soviets took thousands of prisoners. (1)

Eldridge Cleaver, fugitive leader of the Maoist-oriented Black Panther Party (BPP), repudiated by Red Chinese. This is the report received by an FBI source who recently visited Algeria. During frequent contacts with persons close to Cleaver in that country, the source was told by one individual that Red Chinese representatives had sought to gain Cleaver's exclusive support for their political line. Cleaver balked at this attempt to tie him down and was repudiated by the Chinese. Cleaver is alleged to have personally disclosed this information to the person who furnished it to the FBI source. This person stated Cleaver is now "being run by the Soviets." The BPP has placed a heavy ideological reliance on the writings and teachings of Chinese Premier Mao Tse-tung. ***** Cleaver, from his Algerian exile, continues to develop ties with the Al Fatah guerrilla organization in support of the Arab cause against Israel. His meetings with Arab Commando Yasser Arafat have led to shrill attacks on Israel in the Black Panther newspaper. On December 27, 1969, Cleaver addressed the International Conference in Support of the Armed Liberation of Palestine which met in Algeria. He pledged Black Panther support for Al Fatah and labeled Israeli leaders as enemies of his Party. (2)

Mrs. Vincent Astor threatened in aftermath of New York party for Black Panthers. Although invited, New York society leader Mrs. Vincent Astor did not attend conductor Leonard Bernstein's much-publicized fund-raising party for the Black Panthers on January 14th. She does not approve of the Panthers. The January 16 edition of the "New York Post" erroneously listed her as one of the guests, however. Two days later, a package for Mrs. Astor containing six hand-written notes was left with the doorman at her New York residence by an unidentified white woman in a chauffeured limousine. One of the notes--all of which were purportedly from the Black Panther Party (BPP)--threatened "...We are going to kill you and all white pigs. Most of all J. Edgar Hoover and the FBI white pigs. You too. Signed the Black Panthers." This matter was reported to the New York City Police Department. (1)

An FBI source reports Donald Cox, BPP Field Marshal who attended the Bernstein party, claims \$12,000 was raised for the Panthers at this affair. This money is slated for use by Panther National headquarters for travel and other operating expenses, although the donors at the party were informed it was for legal defense. (2)

Communist Party, USA (CPUSA), leader's blindness incurable. Last September, CPUSA General Secretary Gus Hall announced to the Party's National Committee that Soviet medical treatment of Henry Winston, CPUSA National Chairman, blinded in 1961 by a brain tumor, promised eventual restoration of his eyesight. Special Soviet drug therapy was credited with the expected cure. It is now reported that Hall was wrong; that Winston's eyesight cannot be restored. This is the information received by a CPUSA member from a high Soviet official. The official scoffed at the story of Winston's recovery and declared Soviet medical authorities have known for years Winston's blindness is irreversible because of damaged nerves in his eyes. Antiwar activists promote war crimes project.

A new antiwar offensive which will capitalize on alleged American atrocities in Vietnam is gaining momentum. This project, a sponsored activity of Clergy and Laymen Concerned About Vietnam (CLCAV), is aimed at gathering evidence of United States war crimes. American policies "that produced Songmy" will be investigated, and the project will seek to establish responsibility at the policy level for violations of the "laws of war." The Law Center for Constitutional Rights, a legal activist group which has been involved in numerous litigations on behalf of new left and draft resistance litigants, will be asked to conduct investigations for this project. CLCAV considers the following legal action may result from these investigations: (1) damage suits or claims for compensation by Vietnamese victims and (2) suits brought in behalf of all GIs under 21, presently and formerly in Vietnam, for "impairing the morals of minors by encouraging them to become indiscriminate killers of civilians." 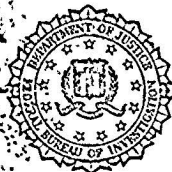

This affair was held on the first day of a three day meeting of the National Committee of the CP, USA, in New York, and several members of that Committee were present.

A variety of food was served in what was said to be a lavish buffet and Elizabeth Hall received many compliments on her hospitality. The source also noted the rich furnishings of the Hall home which included many antiques.

A discussion among the members of the National Women's Commission concluded that a national women's day conference should be held, at which a cry would be raised for allocation of federal funds for child care centers throughout the country. Those present were urged to select Congressmen who might be favorable to this idea and then "neighborhood people", that is, persons not identified with the CP, could approach them to vote for such a program.

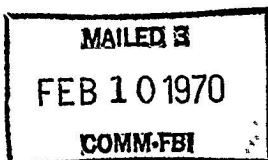

The Yablonski Murders: What was the motive? A detailed narrative of the Yablonski killings has been obtained from one of the trio arrested by the FBI. From those admissions, coupled with information supplied by two sources, a picture of the crime has emerged. The three killers, [redacted] Claude Vealey, and Aubran Martin, all of Cleveland, Ohio, had the simplest of motives--they had a "contract" to kill for money. But the persons and motives behind the contract are yet to be identified and remain paramount issues in the case. Speculation persists that the murders may have been connected with the bitter factional dispute which has raged in the United Mine Workers of America (UMWA) and in which Yablonski was a central figure. The investigation to date has developed some hints which may add substance to such speculation.

Admissions of Claude Vealey: Vealey, a small-time burglar, grew up in the coalfields of West Virginia and has never been far from them and the violence they have spawned. Following his arrest in Cleveland on January 21, he confessed his part in the Yablonski murders and provided an account of the crime. According to Vealey, [redacted] asked him, in July, 1969, to join him in a \$4200 contract. Vealey agreed, but he did not learn until later that Yablonski was the target. They did nothing to carry out the crime until October, 1969, when they made trips to Washington, D. C., and Scranton and Clarksville, Pennsylvania, to locate Yablonski. On one trip in November, they broke into Yablonski's home in Clarksville to determine its layout. By November, the person who had given [redacted] the contract was getting impatient. [redacted] told Vealey that [redacted] whose identity is unknown to Vealey, had called him and wanted the job done "in a hurry."

[redacted] and Vealey returned to Clarksville on December 8, this time determined to carry out the contract. Steeled for the kill and armed with revolvers, they knocked on Yablonski's door, but when the latter appeared, they merely asked about a job then slinked away. "We chickened out," Vealey said.

In late December they tried again, this time with newly recruited Aubran Martin, a petty criminal acquaintance. [redacted] told them that the contract price had been upped--\$5200 was now being offered by [redacted]. The three assassins left Cleveland for Clarksville on December 30. On the way they bought a six-pack of beer and a pint of whiskey. As they watched the Yablonski house that night from a nearby hill, they planned the crime and decided to kill any persons in the house with Yablonski. They also drank the beer and whiskey, throwing the beer cans out of their car. (The cans were later to provide important evidence in the case. A team of FBI Agents, sifting through a heavy snow

which had subsequently covered the hill, pushed up a number of these containers. Clear, identifiable fingerprints of the killers were found on some of them.)

Emboldened by the boilermakers, the trio moved down the hill to the Yablonski house shortly after midnight. After cutting the telephone lines, they slipped through a jimmied door, removed their shoes, and with a sure knowledge of the house layout crept upstairs to the Yablonskis' bedrooms. Mr. and Mrs. Yablonski were asleep in one room, the daughter in an adjoining room. The daughter was killed first; then Yablonski and his wife were shot to death. Yablonski was cut down as he tried to reach a shotgun in the room.

Before his death, Yablonski had charged the UMWA leadership with the rankiest corruption. He admitted his knowledge was derived, in part, from his own complicity while associated with the regime of UMWA President William Anthony Boyle. These charges, brought before and after Yablonski's unsuccessful election bid, had seriously splintered the union and threatened the power base of the UMWA hierarchy. Thus, the possibility that UMWA officials may be involved in the killings cannot be ignored. Investigation is being vigorously pursued to resolve this crucial point.

The Weatherman faction of Students for a Democratic Society (SDS) is going underground to stage a campaign of "strategic sabotage" against military and police installations. This was the assertion of [redacted] at a closed Weatherman conference in Cleveland last week. [redacted] declared the faction will prepare for this new role by dropping its passive members, closing the SDS National Office, and establishing an underground apparatus. Bombings, assassinations, and direct confrontations with police will characterize this campaign of revolutionary violence. [redacted] claimed the centers of Weatherman strength will be New York City, Chicago, Detroit, and Berkeley, California, and the policy of strategic sabotage will be carried to other areas of the country from these cities.

Communist Party, USA (CPUSA), launches new youth group. The long-promised and frequently postponed convention to form a new communist youth organization was finally held in Chicago, February 7 through 9. Meeting under the watchful eyes of CPUSA leaders, 257 delegates--white, black, Puerto Rican, and Mexican-American--formed the Young Workers Liberation League. This is the latest CPUSA bid to gain greater influence among radical youth and attract young people as potential Party recruits. The launching of this communist front marked the end of the ineffectual W. E. B. DuBois Clubs of America, until now the Party's only entry in the radical youth movement.

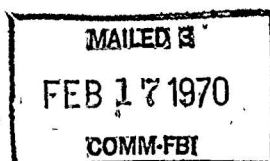

Breakfast with the Panthers. In a number of major cities, the Black Panther Party (BPP) serves breakfasts to black children living in ghetto areas. At the same time, it serves them generous portions of black hate propaganda. This does not make the breakfasts any less nourishing for the youngsters, but it does say something for the cynicism and worse behind Black Panther assistance projects in the black community. Last July, the children in the Baltimore Black Panther breakfast program unknowingly had a near brush with a more sinister side of Panther activity--the torture-murder of a suspected police informant. U

This crime--uncovered in October, 1969, when Baltimore police found the skeletal remains of the victim--has now been traced to several Black Panther members and to a July evening last year at Baltimore BPP headquarters. Investigation indicates the victim, Eugene LeRoy Anderson, was held prisoner in Panther headquarters that night where he was cruelly tortured. The grisly details have been supplied by a source.

Anderson was beaten about the head and body with fists and wooden bed slats; his face was burned with cigarettes; and he was repeatedly kicked on all portions of his body. As the night wore on, the viciousness of his tormentors increased. A hunting knife, its blade heated to a glowing red, was dipped in a syrupy solution of water and sugar. The blade was then rubbed along Anderson's body, stripping away large patches of blistered skin. U

The next morning, one of the Panther members involved was sent out from headquarters to locate a safe place to dispose of Anderson's body, although at that time Anderson was still alive. This assignment completed, the member proceeded to another, that of helping with the Panther breakfast program in a neighborhood church. He arrived as the meal was being completed and walked some of the participating children to their homes in the neighborhood. That night, this member and three others took Anderson to the site chosen for disposal of his body. There he was shot and killed. U

There may also be an attempt to recover an amount equal to the money expended by the police department in payment of overtime and the repairing of damaged equipment. 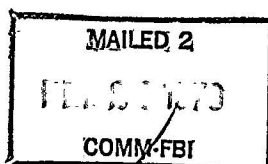

Attached are letters to the President and Attorney General enclosing captioned letters for February 17, 1970. Enclosure contains four items of intelligence data chosen for their timeliness and their potential interest to the President. The following brief narrative which summarizes the four items in the Intelligence Letter is furnished for information:

1. Children in the Black Panther Party (BPP) breakfast program in Baltimore last July had a near brush with a BPP torture-murder. One of the Panthers involved in the torture and death of the victim also helped with these children in the breakfast program the day of the murder.
2. United Florida Ku Klux Klan has letter-writing campaign in progress to have 15,000 printed form letters sent by the public to President Nixon protesting Federal school integration policies.
3. Polish Premier Wladyslaw Gomulka is in failing health and is subject to lapses of memory and sudden changes in temperament.
4. City of Los Angeles is considering filing a civil suit against Los Angeles chapter of BPP to recover damages for injuries sustained by police officers in December 8, 1969, raid on Los Angeles BPP office.

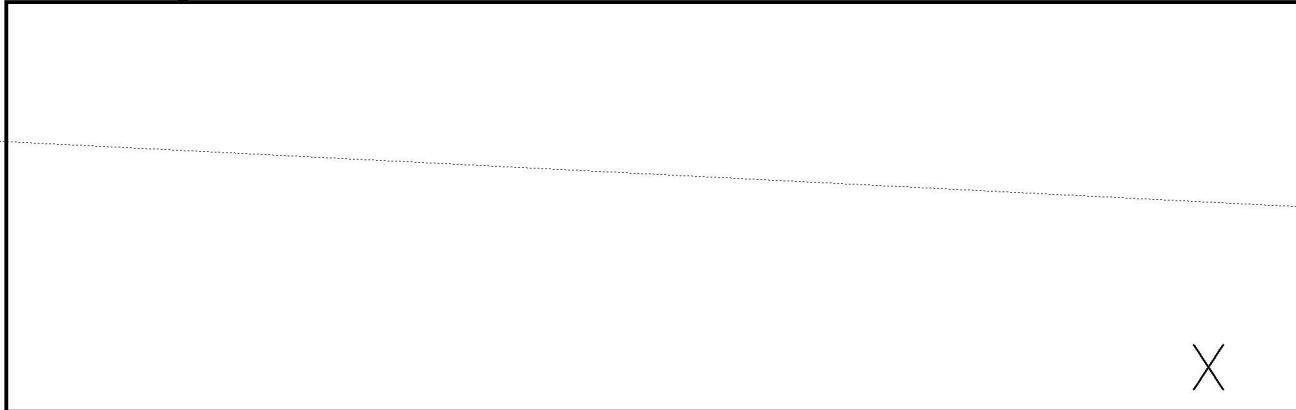

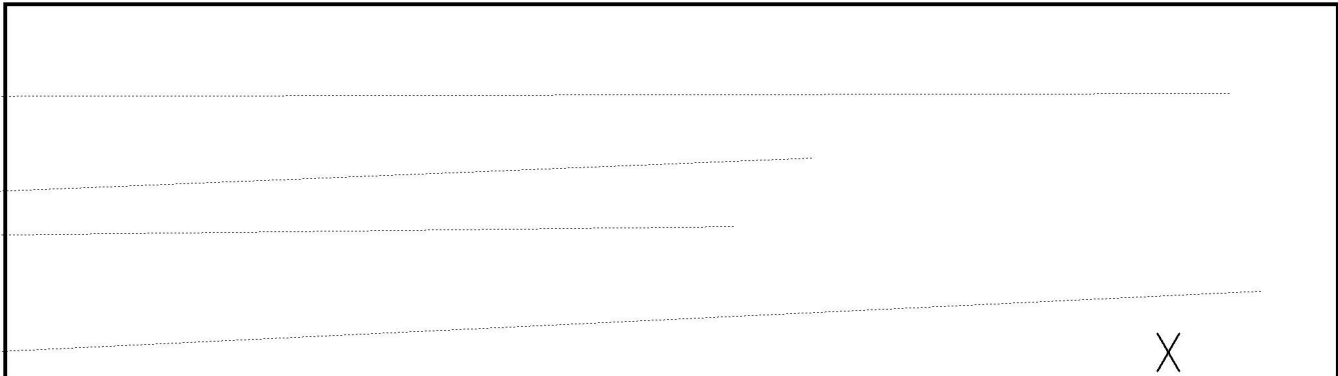

In Washington, D. C., and other cities Mr. Pompidou will visit, large-scale demonstrations are planned by various Jewish organizations. The kickoff for these activities will be a 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. demonstration at Lafayette Park, Washington, on February 23, the day before Mr. Pompidou arrives in Washington.

Other demonstrations are planned in San Francisco on February 26; Stanford, California, on February 27; Chicago on February 28; and New York City on March 2. All will coincide with Mr. Pompidou's visits to those cities.



Alleged assassination plot against President Pompidou reported. The French Consulate in New York City received a telephone call on the evening of February 13 alleging there is a plot to assassinate Mr. Pompidou when he addresses a joint meeting of Congress on February 25. The caller, who gave his name as [redacted], has not been further identified. Federal and local agencies having security responsibility with regard to Mr. Pompidou's visit are cognizant.

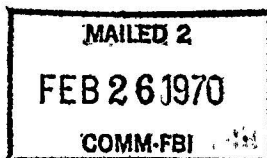

Attached are letters to the President and Attorney General enclosing captioned letter for 2/26/70. Intelligence Letter contains three significant items. Statements of William M. Kunstler, attorney for defendants in the Chicago Antiriot Trial, following his sentencing for contempt of court, are disclosed. Corollary is seen between his remarks at recent demonstrations and follow-up street violence of participants at scene.

The second item pertains to city of Los Angeles civil suit against violence-prone Black Panther Party (BPP) to collect damages for injuries sustained by police during gun battle 12/8/69 at Los Angeles Black Panther office. BPP has filed countersuit of \$57 million against three police officers alleging false arrest and assault and battery, and charging police warrants obtained fraudulently. Contempt citation fails to silence Kunstler.

William M. Kunstler, following his sentencing for contempt of court at the Chicago antiriot trial, continues to trigger disruption and violence in the wake of a series of public appearances. During a rally at Northwestern University on February 19, Kunstler called for "street action," if necessary, and some of his listeners promptly took to the streets and broke windows in business establishments in Evanston, Illinois. On February 21, Kunstler appeared in Washington, D. C., and publicly urged that people must "go to the streets" and "make the Government afraid." Subsequently, demonstrators threw rocks at police and broke windows in Government buildings. On February 23, he was the principal speaker at a demonstration in New York City protesting the Chicago trial which led to more window breaking at a local bank. A number of arrests were made by local police in connection with these incidents.

Kunstler has a history of connections with procommunist causes. In 1963 he was a sponsor of the National Committee to Abolish the House Committee on Un-American Activities, and in 1964 he represented the Committee to Secure Justice for [] both procommunist organizations. Kunstler has also served as counsel for the militant Black Panther Party (BPP) and for [] prominent black extremist.

Black Panthers and Los Angeles police file countersuits.

The city of Los Angeles has filed a civil suit against the Black Panthers to collect damages for injuries sustained by police officers during a gun battle December 8 at the Los Angeles BPP office. The BPP promptly filed a countersuit alleging false arrest and assault and battery, and charging that police warrants were obtained fraudulently. Damages of \$57 million are requested from the three police officers. Los Angeles authorities intend to press their suit by obtaining a court order impounding BPP funds.

New York Congressman expresses approval of Black Panther violence. During a highly inflammatory speech at Chicago State College on February 26, Congressman Adam Clayton Powell launched a bitter attack against the Director of the FBI. He accused the Director of conspiring with the Chicago Police Department in committing genocide against the Black Panther Party (BPP). He took credit for having originated the Black Power concept and said he is proud of the BPP. Powell voiced approval of BPP shootings and fire bombings, but criticized the Panthers for not being more efficient in their violence. He expressed hope that black veterans returning from Vietnam will join the Party to teach proficiency in shooting and bombing.

Powell proclaimed that the U. S. is in the midst of a revolution and that white people will not be in power at its end. His diatribe also included criticism of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People and the National Urban League, which he termed "farces."

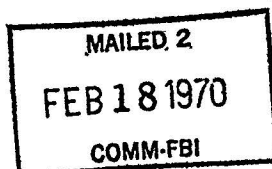

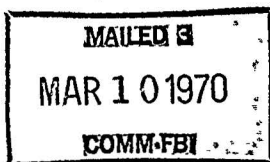

Poles seek support for shipping access to Great Lakes ports. The Polish Ambassador recently met with [redacted] to ask his support for Poland's request for shipping access to Great Lakes ports. [redacted] it is reported, is considering sending a letter to [redacted] expressing his endorsement of this request. [redacted] reportedly feels expansion of Polish-American trade is desirable and the entry of Polish shipping into the Great Lakes would benefit the economy of that area.

Polish merchant ships are restricted to the use of specific ports on the east and gulf coasts. A substantial increase in this usage has been noted recently. Since January 1, 1970, 11 merchant ships have entered U. S. ports, and two fishing boats have been permitted emergency-type entry for resupplying. Poland's port usage far outstrips that of any other communist-bloc nation. (S)(u)

Panthers receive funds from Eldridge Cleaver. Elbert Howard, Black Panther Party (BPP) Deputy Minister of Information, back from an urgent visit with Party leader Eldridge Cleaver in Algeria, deplaned at Los Angeles International Airport this week with \$6,000 cash in his pocket. The money, disclosed during a Customs search, was given to him by Cleaver for use as BPP bail money, Howard claimed. This is indicative of Cleaver's continuing strong influence in the BPP despite his long self-exile. He directs much of the Panthers' propaganda activities and has an important role in sustaining the Party's ideological image in Europe and the Middle East. Contributions for the Party received from sympathetic radical solidarity committees in Europe flow through Cleaver, and he controls the distribution of these funds to Panthers in the U. S.

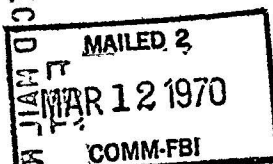

Soviet Premier Kosygin reportedly nearing retirement.
Hints of an impending change in the hierarchy of the Soviet Government have come out of discussions between personnel of an American television company and diplomats of the Soviet Embassy in Washington, D. C. (S)(u)

Last month, Soviet [redacted]

[redacted] informally agreed to a proposal that the American company be awarded television rights to film a Kremlin tour personally conducted by Soviet Premier Aleksey Kosygin. An understanding was reached that the company wished to undertake this project within the next few months and that a company representative would go to the Soviet Union to work out the details, possibly in August, 1970. (S)(u)

Discussions of this project continued at a meeting at the Soviet Embassy last week. [redacted] told company personnel their representative should now be prepared to leave for the Soviet Union on 24-hours notice. Other Soviet officials were at this meeting, and one, not identified by name, commented that Premier Kosygin would be retired by the time the tour was ready to be filmed. He suggested that if a conducted tour was required, the filming should be delayed until a new premier is installed. (S)(u)

A specific time for Premier Kosygin's retirement was not mentioned at this meeting. However, the implication was clear that it is expected at an early date. This was strengthened by the Soviets' insistence that the television company's representative be available to leave for the Soviet Union on short notice to complete arrangements for the filming. As an aside during the meeting last week, [redacted] stated that [redacted] will be returning to the Soviet Union shortly. He claimed [redacted] services are urgently needed in Moscow and he will not return to the United States. [redacted] replacement was not identified. (S)(u)

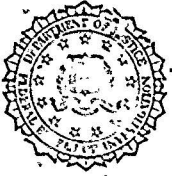

Special Agent [REDACTED] in the presence of Special Agent [REDACTED] immediately called upon Deal, at Fayette, Mississippi, and advised him that they were mistaken in the identity of the person allegedly with the sheriff, that no Agent had been in Fayette on March 6, or March 5, 1970. Deal was a policeman on the Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, Police Department during the period June, 1954, until early 1969; was active in civil rights activity in Philadelphia during the 1960's and was elected Second Vice-President of the Philadelphia Chapter of the NAACP in December, 1962.

DEAL was interviewed by Special Agents of the FBI on 5/13/53. He advised he was the Educational Director of the UAW-CIO of the Budd Manufacturing Company. He said he was a loyal American citizen and would fight for his country against Russia or any other country if the need ever arose. He stated he did not believe in the communist form of government because of the lack of political freedom afforded in a Democratic form of government. He said he was not presently a member of the Communist Party but declined to say whether he had ever been a member.

He was reinterviewed on 1/5/54 at which time he exhibited a friendly attitude. He furnished information concerning himself which substantially agrees with information set out above. He also furnished limited information concerning five other subjects who were the subjects of security investigations in the Philadelphia Division at that time. DEAL denied that he had ever applied for membership in the Communist Party and stated that he had no knowledge of anyone submitting his name as an applicant for CP membership.

DEAL admitted he attended two or three gatherings at the [redacted]. The subjects of the discussion at these gatherings were shop matters but DEAL felt [redacted]

In January 1955, the Philadelphia Police Department advised it was conducting an investigation of DEAL, a policeman, who was currently awaiting trial on departmental and disciplinary charges and that the nature of his background might be a important factor in the outcome.

This office is not aware of the outcome of this investigation; however, it is known he was still a Philadelphia Police Officer as late as 1968.

In April 1964, a complaint was received in this office that DEAL had violated the civil rights of

In the 8/15/68 issue of the Philadelphia, Pa., "The Evening Bulletin" page 44, a feature article appeared captioned, "Two Worlds of AL DEAL; Policeman and Militant" by MICHAEL VON MOSCHZISKER. In this article DEAL was referred to as a NAACP activist and that ROY WILKINS teed off on him weeks ago for inviting NELSON ROCKEFELLER to the head table at a non-political dinner. This article stated that the Philadelphia-Delaware Valley Restaurant Association gave dDEAL an award for being Philadelphia's outstanding public service policeman. The article stated AL DEAL, policeman, is a civil rights leader. as well and sees nothing disparate in two roles.

The article continued that in 1954 DEAL joined the Philadelphia Police Department and had been there even since serving in the districts and on the old commissioner's squad making a name for himself as the most diligent traffic officer or all times at Broad Street and Olney Avenue. The article stated DEAL had worked on the Labor Squad which seeks to preserve the tempers of all concerned during industrial dispute. The article stated

DEAL served on the Board of Deacons in his Church, organized a benevolent organization of policemen called the Guardian Civic League (he is its president), was president of the Philadelphia Fair Housing Council, and was elected second vice president of the Philadelphia Chapter of the NAACP, in December 1962.

The article stated in the two worlds of ALFONSO DEAL, there are those who distrust him. Black militants ask him to leave a citizens meeting at a church and some fellow police officers who wouldn't be caught dead at such a meeting looked askance at DEAL for going there. To DEAL such reactions are no surprise and they're nonsense is all the same. "Policemen and Black Leader?" He says, "Why not? Why should I have to quit my profession because I feel a responsibility to the community I live in? And how can a man keep his self-respect if he abandons his responsibility to the community because of his profession?"

On 10/2/69, [redacted] identifying himself as a member of the Guardian Civic League of Philadelphia which group consists of present and former Negro members of the Philadelphia Police Department advised the Guardian Civic League had purchased a 1970 Oldsmobile to be used by the Police Department of Fayette, Miss. That same date, three Negro officers, Philadelphia Police Department, one of whom was ALFONSO DEAL, were driving the car to Fayette, Miss. They were to pick up [redacted] en route and would accompany them to Fayette. Detroit bombing attempts linked to Weatherman group.

attached to one of the firecrackers as an igniter but it had failed
to set off the explosives. Also, on March 6, a 34-stick dynamite
bomb similarly fused with firecrackers and cigarettes was discovered
in a women's rest room at the Detroit Police Department. Du Pont
brand dynamite, dated June 30, 1969, was used in both bombs.

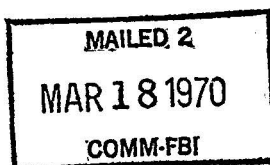

Dominican President Balaguer to announce for re-election. Political pressures in the Dominican Republic are building with the approach of the May national elections in that country. Dominating the volatile political scene is speculation on the future plans of incumbent President Joaquin Balaguer. A source reports President Balaguer will seek reelection and intends to announce this decision on March 30. He also plans to replace his Minister of Armed Forces and Armed Forces Chief of Staff prior to the national elections.

Information has also been received that General Neit Nivar Seijas, Commander of the Dominican Army First Brigade, the military group controlling the capital city of Santo Domingo, has designs on the presidency if Balaguer is not a candidate. Nivar has reportedly prepared "sealed orders" for selected officers in his command directing them to move to overthrow the government if Balaguer is assassinated or does not run for reelection. Under Nivar's plan, a military junta, with Nivar at its head, would be set up and known communists and ultra-rightists would be eliminated.

Weatherman explosives traced to New England. Dynamite found in the wreckage of the Greenwich Village townhouse destroyed March 6 in a Weatherman bomb-making accident has been traced to a Keene, New Hampshire, explosives firm. It was part of a 100-pound dynamite purchase made at that firm on March 2 by a man who gave a false name and address. He has not been identified.

A similar 100-pound purchase of dynamite--not so clearly linked to the Greenwich Village "bomb factory" but no less Weatherman-oriented--was made four days later in nearby Barre, Vermont. In this case, however, the buyer was identified despite his use of fictitious identification. He was

Attempts to trace his movements are continuing.

Students for a Democratic Society (SDS) rally in support of Postal strike. SDS forces are moving rapidly to take advantage of the Postal disruption by organizing demonstrations in support of the striking workers. Rallies are scheduled today and tomorrow in New York City and Boston by the Workers Student Alliance faction of SDS. Yesterday, an SDS rally was held at Boston University (BU) which was addressed by BU professor, and former Communist Party, USA, member, Howard Zinn. Zinn pledged support for the striking Postal employees and called for a future national strike to bring the entire Nation to a standstill.

American Communist Party chief misses Soviet party line. Even old-hand communist Gus Hall, a veteran at aping Soviet semantics, comes a cropper occasionally in trying to keep up with the political polemics of the Kremlin. In Moscow last month, a paper prepared by Hall which was to be presented at a conference on "Leninism and the World Revolutionary Process" considerably upset leaders of the Communist Party of the Soviet Union (CPSU) by denouncing the "crimes of Stalin" and also "the correction and criticism of these errors." Both, Hall declared, had a serious effect on the world communist movement, CPSU officials thought they detected in this an implied condemnation of the entire leadership of their Party, as well as an attempt to turn the conference away from Leninism to a discussion of Stalin. The embarrassing reference to Stalin was deleted by the Soviets and a straddle-fence statement substituted for it.

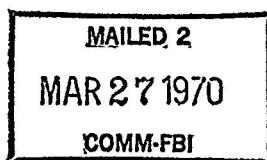

Weatherman leaders flee to underground. In February, the Weatherman faction of Students for a Democratic Society (SDS) began to restructure its operations into an underground apparatus, an organizational setup from which Weatherman leaders planned to carry out bombing strikes against military and police installations. The SDS National Office was to be closed and a clandestine leadership activity established in the underground.

The accidental dynamiting of the Greenwich Village Weatherman "bomb factory" on March 6 threw these plans into disruption. Immediately after the explosion, every major Weatherman leader dropped out of sight and into hiding in the underground apparatus. Since that date, no definite information regarding the locations of [redacted] or other principal leaders of the group has been received.

Intensive investigation to locate them has run up against a wall of noncooperation from radical elements. The families of the vanished leaders have provided no clues to their locations. Most are uncooperative, and some are even subsidizing the young revolutionaries by providing them money for living expenses. [redacted]

[redacted] and several other Weatherman women leaders are charged in Chicago with mob action for confrontations with police last October. Their failure to appear for trial last week brought filing of Federal charges against them for unlawful flight to avoid prosecution.

Cambodian Ambassador to the United Nations leaves suddenly on mysterious trip. Yesterday afternoon, Cambodian Ambassador to the United Nations Huot Sambath abruptly abandoned his post and, with his wife and child, left the US apparently by Soviet flight en route to Moscow. His departure was a complete surprise to Cambodian UN Mission personnel who had been trying to contact the Ambassador all day. They did not learn of his departure until after 5 p. m. when his chauffeur returned from Kennedy Airport with the news. Sambath's action left the Mission without a designated head. An order prepared for Sambath's signature yesterday designating the Deputy Ambassador Charge d'Affaires during a trip Sambath was scheduled to take to Cambodia for consultations was left unsigned. There is speculation Sambath's mysterious trip was prompted by a cable received at the Mission March 25 from deposed Cambodian Chief of State Sihanouk in Peking warning Mission personnel that those supporting the new Cambodian regime "will be dealt with accordingly." Sambath's destination beyond Moscow is not known but he possibly may be en route to Peking to contact Sihanouk.

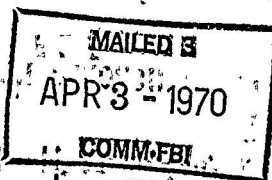

University of Michigan (UM) President Robben W. Fleming buckling under pressure of a black-led student strike. At a secret meeting of the University Board of Regents last week, he demanded \$4.5 million to meet the costs of capitulating to the strikers. Fleming's plan for obtaining the funds includes freezing faculty salaries for the next three years, leaving professional vacancies where possible, and seeking lesser qualified individuals to fill indispensable positions. Fleming advocated the admission of any black who applies--providing constant tutoring if necessary--in order to realize a ten per cent black enrollment. Fleming expressed optimism in obtaining substantial additional Federal funds. His announcement this past weekend of assured funding for a ten per cent enrollment of blacks at UM by 1973 brought a blast from the Black Action Movement (BAM), the militant Negro student coalition on campus which fomented the strike. A BAM spokesman branded Fleming a "liar" and castigated him for making the release without BAM approval.

The UM Regents met with Fleming on March 31, demanding an explanation of his handling of this matter. Contrary to a press report which indicated that Fleming received a full vote of confidence from the Regents, it has been reported that this body was evenly split, four to four, on this vote. Fleming's current troubles are a classic example of chickens coming home to roost. Last September, Fleming opened the door to demonstrations of all types at UM when he labeled the Vietnam war a "colossal mistake" and offered the facilities of the University for use of antiwar protesters. (2)

Black Panthers focus on [redacted]

Black Panther Party (BPP) members from every chapter in the United States are under instructions to send representatives to New Haven [redacted]

Alex Rackley, BPP member from New York who was killed in May, 1969. Party officials have already proceeded to the area, where Charles Garry, chief legal counsel for the BPP, appeared at a pretrial hearing in March. As many as 200 additional Black Panthers reportedly will be assigned to New Haven in the near future. The BPP is already negotiating for the purchase of a \$30,000 house in that area to be used as a permanent information center. [redacted] has been promised by BPP headquarters [redacted]

In the face of [redacted] is the BPP's dominant aim. Information has been received that the Party's sole criterion for judging its success in the [redacted] will be [redacted]

[redacted] is irrelevant to this basic issue. Trials involving [redacted] have been the major cause of Party travel in recent months. In 1970 over 95 trips, totaling in excess of 190,000 miles and costing about \$12,000, have been made by BPP members. (1)

Soviets fear prospect of Japanese-Red Chinese coalition.

Soviet officials representing Mashpriborintorg (Soviet State Purchasing Agency) have expressed concern to an American businessman about the prospect that Red China with its vast manpower and Japan with its technical skill and productive capacity will form a tandem threat to the Soviet Union. While negotiating a \$4 million contract for Soviet purchase of geophysical equipment in Moscow, the Soviets conveyed anxiety regarding Sino-Soviet relations. They speculated that the next world conflict would be predicated on racial differences rather than economic or political incompatibilities. Meanwhile, they expressed friendship toward the United States and disappointment over United States peace overtures toward Red China. (2) (S)

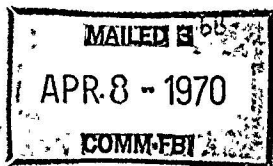

Accidental police shot possible cause of student death in Isla Vista demonstration. Early Saturday morning, at the height of the second night of student violence at Isla Vista, California, a student at the University of California at Santa Barbara was shot and killed. Hit while trying to extinguish a blaze started by fire-bombing demonstrators in a Bank of America temporary building, the student was thought at first to have been a sniper victim. Authorities now believe a police officer may have accidentally shot the student with a .30-06 caliber rifle. This weapon, carried by a Santa Barbara police officer, allegedly discharged accidentally as the officer hurriedly left his car to help protect the bank building. Ballistics tests are being run on the lethal slug and the rifle today by California authorities. If the rifle is identified with the tragedy, a prompt public statement will be made and a local investigation initiated. It is feared this may spark additional violent disorders.

Student violence at Isla Vista started last Thursday night in the aftermath of a rally at which [redacted] was to speak. When [redacted] failed to appear, bands of demonstrators attacked a temporary Bank of America building in Isla Vista which was erected after the bank's permanent facilities were burned by student rioters in February.

* * * * *

Soviets impressed with plans for nationwide antimilitary demonstrations. Earlier this month, [redacted]

[redacted], a southern California leftist coalition, returned from discussions in the Soviet Union on the role of antiwar elements in the United States. This experienced activist, until recent years a member of the Communist Party, USA, told PAC associates the Soviets were favorably impressed with plans being developed for nationwide antimilitary demonstrations next month. This protest activity is to be directed at the disruption of Armed Forces installations. Broad appeals will be made to military personnel to join in demonstrations against the Vietnam War, and special attention will be given to highlighting alleged violations of enlisted men's rights.

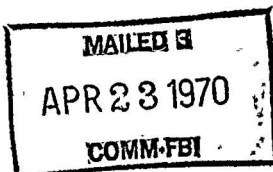

There are attached letters to the President and Attorney General enclosing captioned letter for 4/20/70. The first item of the Intelligence Letter reports a significant development in the student disorders at Isla Vista, California. Bands of student demonstrators attacked a temporary Bank of America building in Isla Vista on the nights of 4/16 and 17/70. On the early morning of 4/18, a student was shot and killed while attempting to put out a fire in the bank. It was thought at first he was a sniper victim; now information has been received on a highly confidential basis that a police officer may have accidentally shot the youth. Ballistic tests are being conducted today and if this is confirmed, a public statement will be made. It is feared such a statement may touch off new waves of disorders.

The second item relates to highly revealing contacts [REDACTED] a southern California leftist coalition, had with the Soviets during a recent trip to the Soviet Union. [REDACTED] until recent years a member of the Communist Party, USA, has advised associates the Soviets were favorably impressed with plans being developed by peace elements in the United States for nationwide antimilitary demonstrations next month.

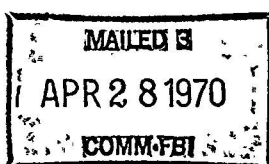

This memorandum recommends that we extend our dissemination of the FBI Intelligence Letter (Inlet) to include Vice President Agnew.

Inlet is outgrowth of Director's personal suggestion for a channel of high-level intelligence directly to the President. It has provided medium for furnishing President sensitive and top-level data in which he would have direct interest and has been disseminated only to President and Attorney General. Since first Inlet issued 11/7/69, we have prepared 36 issues which have summarized 120 individual items of significance on a wide range of topics, including racial violence, New Left intrigue, Soviet and communist bloc espionage, and important foreign intelligence data. Material is presented in a one-page format tailored to the President's convenience.

Vice President Agnew in recent conversations with the Director has indicated a keen interest in the information the Bureau has been furnishing him in recent months regarding domestic and foreign subversion. It is obvious the Vice President is relying on the Bureau as a key source of information. In view of Mr. Agnew's vital interest in these matters and the high position he occupies, it is believed we should at this time include him in dissemination to Inlet.

ACTION:

If the Director approves, the Vice President will be included in future dissemination of this material.

Klan arsonists destroy Nation of Islam (NOI) farmhouse. The controversial NOI farm holdings in St. Clair County, Alabama, hard hit in March by a series of cattle poisonings, were additionally damaged early this month when a large farmhouse on the property burned. A source reports the fire was set by three members of the United Klans of America (UKA), the Alabama-based Klan group headed by Robert Shelton. The arsonists, all from [redacted]

[redacted] Rags soaked with fuel and ignited by candles were used to set the fire in the house. According to the source, [redacted]

[redacted] helped plan the crime and was in contact with [redacted]

[redacted] regarding its execution. State authorities have been advised.

Hollywood actress a heavy supporter of Black Panthers. Film actress Jean Seberg is one of Hollywood's staunchest Black Panther Party (BPP) partisans. The star of such recent movie releases as "Paint Your Wagon" and "Airport" has been a consistent contributor to Panther coffers. Miss Seberg's commitment has not stopped at the ideological. She has for some time been the paramour of BPP Minister of Education Raymond Hewitt. She recently informed a source she is four months pregnant by Hewitt and expects to have his baby in Europe this fall. Hewitt has had other illegitimate children, a fact wryly acknowledged by Miss Seberg when she said she had devised a new nickname for him, "Johnny Applesed."

Black Panther pressure continues to build in New Haven. With a massive May 1 demonstration in support of [redacted] only three days off, many out-of-state BPP members are moving into the city. About 200 are expected to join the estimated 100 members already in the New Haven area. White extremist supporters from such groups as Students for a Democratic Society are also arriving in force for the demonstration. Panther violence is feared during this time, with some speculation given to the possibility of an [redacted] On the heels of a reported BPP arms buildup in New Haven, there has been an upsurge in weapons burglaries in Connecticut. On April 8, six Negroes were arrested after a Meriden, Connecticut, gunshop had been burglarized. On the previous night, the shop had also been broken into, with the loss of 19 guns. At Newington, Connecticut, on April 24, 44 rifles were stolen from a warehouse, and during the April 25 weekend, 360 guns were stolen from a freight company at North Branford, Connecticut. There is a definite possibility these weapons may have been taken for Black Panther use.

There are attached letters to the President, Vice President, and Attorney General enclosing captioned letter for 4/28/70. The first item of the Intelligence Letter reports significant information received that three members of Robert Shelton's United Klans of America in Alabama set fire earlier this month to a farm house on property owned by the Nation of Islam in St. Clair County, Alabama. The three have been identified and state authorities have been advised.

In the second item, Jean Seberg, white film actress, is identified as a staunch supporter of the Black Panther Party (BPP) and as the paramour of BPP Minister of Education, Raymond Hewitt. Miss Seberg, who has been a consistent contributor of funds to the Panthers, is four months pregnant by Hewitt and expects to have his baby in Europe this Fall.

The third item contains important additional information concerning the current serious racial condition in New Haven, Connecticut, where [redacted]

It is reported that out-of-state BPP members are moving into the city in connection with a massive demonstration planned by the Panthers in New Haven on May 1. Panther violence is feared during the demonstration. It is reported that there has been an upsurge in weapons burglaries in Connecticut this month and that during the past few days over 400 guns were stolen in burglaries in towns near New Haven. There is a definite possibility these weapons may have been taken for BPP use.

It is to be noted that with this letter we are initiating transmittal of the Intelligence Letter to the Vice President. This dissemination was approved by [redacted] to W. C. Sullivan memorandum of 4/23/70 captioned "FBI Intelligence Letter for the President."

RECOMMENDATION:

That attached letters to the President, Vice President, and Attorney General enclosing the FBI Intelligence Letter for 4/28/70 be approved.

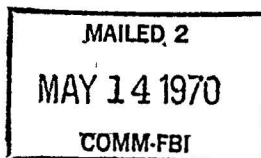

Demonstrations against military bases planned for May 16. Militant antiwar groups throughout the country are planning nationwide demonstrations on May 16 directed against approximately 45 military bases here. These demonstrations are being sponsored by the so-called "GI Task Force" of the New Mobilization Committee to End the War in Vietnam, the Student Mobilization Committee to End the War in Vietnam, the American Servicemen's Union, and the Students for a Democratic Society. In several instances, efforts will be made to gain access to the bases or to force confrontation with military authorities such as by blocking traffic. Major efforts will likely be made at Fort Bragg, Fayetteville, North Carolina; Fort Hood, Killeen, Texas, and Fort Dix, Wrightstown, New Jersey. A number of leading New Left luminaries will take part in the protests, including [REDACTED] Abbie Hoffman, [REDACTED] who were all recently [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] has played a leading role in seeking to drum up support for the demonstrations and has made particular efforts to promote similar demonstrations at U. S. military installations in France.

Efforts to disrupt Washington, D. C., telephone service. A handout being circulated in the Boston area, supposedly issued by students at Brandeis University, calls for a nationwide effort to disrupt long distance telephone communications to and from Washington, D. C., on the afternoon of May 15. The pamphlet urges sympathizers to flood Washington long distance information operators between 2 p.m. and 3 p.m. on that afternoon with inquiries in a deliberate effort to tie up long distance traffic to and from the Nation's Capital. Telephone Company officials are cognizant.

Black Panther Party (BPP) members reportedly being considered for revolutionary training in Middle East. Information recently received by FBI sources indicates there is a definite possibility that members of the black militant BPP may be sent to the Middle East in the near future to receive training from the Arab guerrilla organization Al Fatah. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] recently approached an individual connected with the Panthers and inquired if he was interested in attending a "Revolutionary School" which will be held beginning in June, 1970, in the United Arab Republic. It was indicated the training would last approximately two months. The BPP is considering sending several members to receive Al Fatah training. If the plan goes through, BPP members would set up similar training schools in the U.S. following their return here.

It includes information concerning planned demonstrations by antiwar elements against some 45 U.S. military bases on Saturday, May 16; a reported effort by radical students in Boston area to disrupt telephone communications at Washington, D. C., during mid-afternoon of May 15; and information regarding possibility that Black Panther Party members may be receiving revolutionary training by Arab guerrilla group Al Fatah.

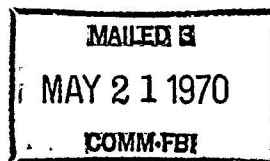

A source has advised that the Students for a Democratic Society (SDS), as presently regarded, came into being at a founding convention held June, 1962, at Port Huron, Michigan. From an initial posture of "participatory democracy" the line of the national leadership has revealed a growing Marxist-Leninist adherence which currently calls for the building of a revolutionary youth movement. Concurrently, the program of SDS has evolved from civil rights struggles to an anti-Vietnam war stance to an advocacy of a militant anti-imperialist position. China, Vietnam and Cuba are regarded as the leaders of worldwide struggles against United States imperialism whereas the Soviet Union is held to be revisionist and also imperialist.

At the June, 1969, SDS National Convention, Progressive Labor Party (PLP) forces in the organization were expelled. As a result, the National Office (NO) group maintained its National Headquarters at 1608 West Madison Street, Chicago, and the PLP faction set up headquarters in Cambridge, Massachusetts. This headquarters subsequently moved to Boston. Each group elected its own national officers, which include three national secretaries and a National Interim Committee of eight. Both the NO forces and the PLP forces claim to be the true SDS. Both groups also print their versions of "New Left Notes" which sets forth the line and the program of the particular faction. The NO version of "New Left Notes" was recently printed under the title "The Fire Next Time" to achieve a broader mass appeal.

Two major factions have developed internally within the NO group, namely, the Weatherman or Revolutionary Youth Movement (RYM) I faction, and the RYM II faction. Weatherman is action-oriented upholding Castro's position that the duty of revolutionaries is to make revolution. Weatherman is regarded by RYM II as an adventurist, elitist faction which denies the historical role of the working class as the base for revolution. RYM II maintains that revolution, although desired, is not possible under

present conditions, hence emphasizes organizing and raising the political consciousness of the working class upon whom they feel successful revolution depends. Although disclaiming control and domination by the Communist Party, USA, leaders in these two factions have in the past proclaimed themselves to be communists and to follow the precepts of a Marxist-Leninist philosophy, along pro-Chinese communist lines.

A second source has advised that the PLP faction which is more commonly known as the Worker Student Alliance is dominated and controlled by members of the PLP, who are required to identify themselves with the pro-Chinese Marxist-Leninist philosophy of the PLP. They advocate that an alliance between workers and students is vital to the bringing about of a revolution in the United States.

SDS regions and university and college chapters, although operating under the outlines of the SDS National Constitution, are autonomous in nature and free to carry out independent policy reflective of local conditions. Because of this autonomy internal struggles reflecting the major factional interests of SDS have occurred at the chapter level since the beginning of the 1969-70 school year.

PROGRESSIVE LABOR PARTY (PLP)

"The New York Times" city edition, Tuesday, April 20, 1965, page 27, reported that a new party of "revolutionary socialism" was formally founded on April 18, 1965, under the name of the PLP which had been known as the Progressive Labor Movement.

According to the article, "The Progressive Labor Movement was founded in 1962, by Milton Rosen and Mortimer Scheer after they were expelled from the Communist Party of the United States for assertedly following the Chinese Communist line."

A source advised on June 3, 1968, that the PLP held its Second National Convention in New York City, May 31 to June 2, 1968, at which time the PLP reasserted its objective of the establishment of a militant working class movement based on Marxism-Leninism. This is to be accomplished through the Party's over-all revolutionary strategy of raising the consciousness of the people and helping to provide ideological leadership in the working class struggle for state power.

The source also advised that at the Second National Convention Milton Rosen was unanimously re-elected National Chairman of the PLP and [REDACTED]

The PLP publishes "Progressive Labor," a bimonthly magazine; "World Revolution," a quarterly periodical; and "Challenge-Desafio," a monthly newspaper.

The April, 1969, issue of "Challenge-Desafio" sets forth that "Challenge is dedicated to the peoples fight for a new way of life--where the working men and women control their own homes and factories; where they themselves make up the entire government on every level and control the schools, courts, police and all institutions which are now used to control them."

Source advised on May 8, 1969, that the PLP utilizes an address of General Post Office Box 808, Brooklyn, New York, and also utilizes an office in Room 617, 1 Union Square West, New York, New York.

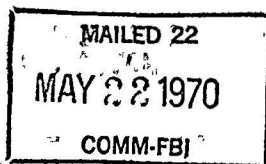

Campus violence hits new high during period May 1-15. The first half of May has witnessed an unprecedented number of student demonstrations, including numerous instances of violence, at colleges and universities throughout the country. Student unrest and destruction during this single period are comparable to or greater than what transpired during the entire eight-month period from September 1, 1969, to April 30, 1970. According to information available to the FBI, there were 844 campus demonstrations from May 1 to 15 as compared with 823 in the prior eight months. More than 3,000 arrests were made, 156 injuries were reported, and six deaths resulted. Property damages are estimated at more than \$4.5 million resulting from 115 separate arson attacks, three bombings, and widespread vandalism. A favorite target of student demonstrators has continued to be ROTC facilities.

Injuries to police outnumber those suffered by demonstrators. FBI figures indicate that since the beginning of the current academic year in September, 1969, 458 persons have been injured during campus disruptions. Of this total, police injuries numbered 295 or nearly two-thirds.

Only small fraction of students involved in violent demonstrations. From information reported to the FBI it is clear that the number of college students involved in violent demonstrations is small. Based on a survey of campus disorders during period September-April which have involved deaths, personal injuries, property damage, or arrests, it has been estimated that less than 3 per cent of student enrollment at the schools involved has taken part in these demonstrations. The number of students who have actually participated in violent activities would, of course, be much less.

Current academic year disruptions outstrip 1968-1969 totals. Statistics compiled for the 1968-1969 academic year set the number of demonstrations at 850 and the total estimated damages at more than \$3 million. In the current academic year to May 15, demonstrations on campuses have totaled 1,667 and damages are estimated to exceed \$7.5 million.

Des Moines police bombing laid to Black Panthers. A dynamite explosion heavily damaged the Des Moines, Iowa, police building on May 13. The day following, three cases of dynamite--part of a 20-case lot stolen in a burglary of a Des Moines supply company on May 5--were found by police in the apartment of a Negro involved with the Black Panthers. This individual admitted several Black Panthers in Des Moines had stolen the dynamite for sabotage purposes. He said this group had planned the bombing of the police building and that one of the group had set the charge. According to this information, a full case of dynamite, 14 sticks, had been used in the bomb. None of the other stolen dynamite has been recovered. Police have received information that seven cases were given to a Black Panther member in Kansas City, Missouri, shortly after the theft.

Black students call for revolution at Yale meeting. With Yale University playing the host and the Black Panther Party (BPP) providing direction, over 300 black students from eastern colleges held a Black Student Revolutionary Conference on the New Haven campus May 16 to 19. Sources report the conference was called to organize support for educating black students to the need for violent revolution in the United States. All whites were excluded from the conference. Workshops were held to discuss revolution on the campus and in the community and speakers told the students to learn about guns and bombs and how to shoot. One black campus leader from Central State College, Wilberforce, Ohio, called for the establishment of a national Black Student Union to control speakers on campus to prevent the presentation of nonmilitant viewpoints. Black Panther leaders at the conference instructed students in the relationship of Marxist-Leninist ideology to the BPP, and encouraged them to study subjects useful to the revolution.

Bookshelves stripped at Seattle campus. While black students at the Yale conference were calling for campus violence, the Black Student Union (BSU) at the University of Washington, (UW), Seattle, carried out a senseless and outrageous attack on the UW library. Fifty to sixty BSU members, angered at the school's refusal to meet their demands to sever scholastic relations with Brigham Young University and to keep police off campus, stormed into the library last Tuesday, spread out through its four floors, and began to pull books from the shelves. Within minutes, an estimated 25,000 volumes had been dumped on the floor of the library. Over 300 volumes were damaged. Two white students in the library were assaulted when they protested these acts. One of the assailants, a UW football player, is being charged with assault.

WCS The second item relates to the Black Student Revolutionary Conference which was held on Yale University campus 5/16-19/70. This conference, which called for teaching of black revolution, was held under the direction of the Black Panther Party.


In the third item, information is set out concerning the senseless violence of a Black Student Union group at the University of Washington, Seattle, which attacked the library of that school on 5/19/70. Approximately 25,000 books were pulled off of the library shelves by these black students and two white students who objected to these acts were assaulted. *U*

Cuban guerrilla warfare manual being mailed into U.S. There have been extensive mailings to American academic circles recently of a Cuban manual on guerrilla warfare tactics. This document, entitled "Minimanual of the Urban Guerrilla," was published in a recent issue of the "Tricontinental," theoretical organ of the Havana-based Organization of Solidarity of the Peoples of Africa, Asia, and Latin America. The booklet, a how-to manual on guerrilla warfare, was authored by Carlos Marighela, guerrilla leader who operated in Brazil prior to his death in November, 1969, in a clash with Brazilian police. Marighela masterminded the kidnapping of U.S. Ambassador to Brazil C. Burke Elbrick in September, 1969. The Minimanual emphasizes the use of terror against police and other officials as a means of maintaining a viable guerrilla force. There is an indication that the Armed Revolutionary Independence Movement of Puerto Rico has been influenced by this document in its terrorist, pro-independence activities.

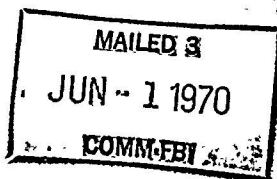

There are attached letters to the President, the Vice President, and the Attorney General enclosing captioned Letter for 5-26-70. The first item of the Intelligence Letter relates to information received from a source that Soviet Premier Kosygin is near retirement and that the change is being made gradually in order that Kosygin may retire gracefully. Party Chief Brezhnev will then be in full control of the Soviet Government.

The second item reports that recent demonstrations at Ohio State University involved many nonstudents. Of 78 persons arrested on 5/21-22/70 at that school, 41 were nonstudents.

The third item states a guerrilla warfare manual is being mailed extensively to academic circles in this country and that this document emphasizes use of terrorist activities.

The fourth item reports that [Redacted] has been charged with killing a Miami police officer [Redacted]. This is the eighth racially motivated police killing nationally since 1-1-70.

RECOMMENDATION:

Additional insight into Kent, Ohio, disorders. In a recent interview with the FBI, [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] and participated in a series of demonstrations which culminated in the shooting of four KSU students on May 4, 1970. Her story provides an insight into the provocative nature of these demonstrations.

Police and fire departments. On May 1, students and others were spoiling for a confrontation with police who had arrested a KSU student for being intoxicated. To "get the pigs to come back," they built a fire in the street, broke windows, and terrorized an elderly couple by demolishing their car as they drove down the street. The police were forced to make additional arrests.

Under the cover of darkness on May 2, demonstrators converged on the ROTC building at KSU and burned it. When firemen attempted to extinguish the blaze, [REDACTED]

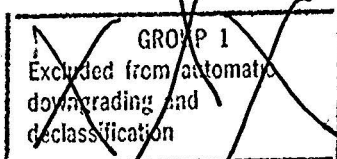
Ohio National Guard. During the next two days, the situation worsened as demonstrators had to be dispersed repeatedly by the Ohio National Guard. Emboldened by the latter's voluntary retreats after restoring order, the demonstrators began to shower the Guardsmen with rocks and stones. Immediately prior to the shooting, the Guardsmen were retreating once again under a hail of rocks when, with the demonstrators in close pursuit, they turned and fired into the crowd.

Internal chaos may topple President Ceausescu of Romania. A source who recently returned to the United States from a visit to Romania has warned that disintegrating political and economic conditions in Romania could result in the removal of President Nicolae Ceausescu by the conservative communist faction in Romania. Romanian nationalism, which reached its peak during the threatened invasion of Romania by Russia, is waning and the popularity of Ceausescu has declined drastically. He has had to resort to the increasing use of police and security elements to control workers and students.

The economic situation in Romania has reached calamitous proportions. The country is bankrupt and heavily in debt, particularly to West German businessmen who have "taken" Romanian bureaucrats. Efforts to improve the situation, such as the negotiation of profitable trade agreements with African countries and the establishment of a Romanian international bank, are lagging.

Recent floods exacerbate situation.

[redacted], confided to the source during the latter part of [redacted] that property losses resulting from recent devastating floods have amounted to billions of dollars. The source predicted that, without assistance from other countries, Romania will not be able to survive the coming winter when the full effect of flood losses will be felt. (S)

Romanians would welcome American assistance.

Although the Soviet Union is capitalizing on the situation by putting economic and political pressures on Romania, the source opined that the United States could assert considerable political influence on Ceausescu and the Romanian people if it were to discard its "hands off" policy toward Romania, take a firm position on issues involving Romania, and help that country to resolve its economic crisis. The source is certain that the Romanian people would respond just as enthusiastically as they did to the visit by President Nixon in 1969. (S)

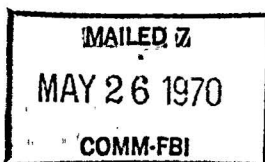

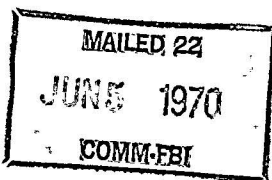
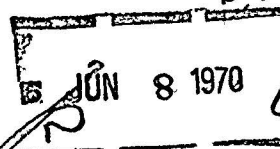

Ohio National Guard. During the next two days, the situation worsened as demonstrators had to be dispersed repeatedly by the Ohio National Guard. Youth International Party (Yippies) planning to develop new image. Yippies' leader Abbie Hoffman has announced that the Yippies will become a more "gutsy" organization in response to the May 9, 1970, demonstration in Washington, D. C., which he described as a fiasco led by a "decaying dinosaur," the New Mobilization Committee to End the War in Vietnam.

A source has advised that the Yippies will adopt a more radical mantle which will enable them to attract a greater following. Hoffman visualizes the new Yippies image as similar to that of the Black Panthers and plans call for the wearing of red berets and taking over a leading role in community-based "radical action." One individual is coming to the capital to help organize Yippies into small "community defense groups" of approximately six people, hoping that this tactic will make mass arrests, raids, and police infiltration more difficult. "Smoke-in" at Washington Monument on July 4 is planned. The Yippies' new militancy will be brandished at an "Insurrection City Smoke-In," which was described as a "mass smoke-in" of marijuana at the Washington Monument on July 4. Yippies' plans hinge on attracting as large a crowd as possible and with this objective in mind, Hoffman is willing to offer the psychedelic group, Jimi Hendrix Experience, up to \$70,000 to appear. In addition, Hoffman is demanding \$500,000 in his negotiations with the Warner Brothers Studio for exclusive rights to films taken of the demonstration.

If there is a large gathering, and Yippies are certain that the appearance of the Hendrix group will insure this, massive destruction and violent confrontations in Washington, D. C., are planned. 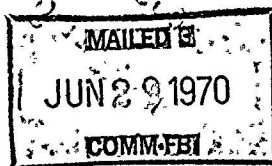

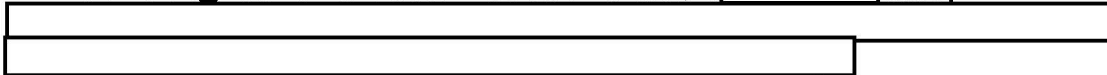

Sale of jets to Israel could trigger Arab national-
ization of United States oil interests. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED], advised in June, 1970, that the Arab Governments will nationalize American oil interests in the Middle East if this country supplies Israel with jet aircraft. According to [REDACTED] the Soviets would then be able to increase their own oil sales and the Japanese could take over the operation of American oil facilities in Arab countries. (S)

Student National Coordinating Committee (SNCC) anti-Vietnam war program, Augusta, Georgia. The militant SNCC, which traditionally has encouraged an antiwar posture among blacks, is increasing its role in this regard. SNCC has leased a night club in Augusta which will be converted into a coffeehouse for use in antiwar agitation among blacks in that area, particularly those assigned at Fort Gordon, Georgia.

This facility, christened "The Third Eye Lounge" will commence operations in the near future. SNCC was assisted in this project by a \$6,000 grant from United Servicemen's, Inc., an organization which promotes antiwar sentiments among military personnel through a chain of coffeehouses. SNCC representatives are also seeking an additional [REDACTED] to be used in funding the coffeehouse from a [REDACTED] currently known only as "[REDACTED]"

Black Panther Party (BPP) is extending its operations into the South. The sudden thrust of BPP operations into the South is a new and alarming development. Undaunted by previous failures to influence southern blacks, the BPP has achieved a great deal of success in recent recruitment and propaganda efforts. Operating under a euphemistic mantle, the National Committee to Combat Fascism, the Panthers have exerted an all-out effort to promote their objectives in Winston-Salem, North Carolina; Tulsa, Oklahoma; and Augusta, Georgia. Organizational activity and the widespread distribution of the BPP newspaper, "The Black Panther," are currently taking place in Dallas and Houston, Texas; New Orleans, Louisiana; Memphis, Tennessee; Charlotte, North Carolina; Greenville and Sunflower, Mississippi; and Richmond, Virginia. (NYtel 6/18/70 captioned "Middle East Situation," 105-53922; ATtel and LHM, 36/70; SVtels and LHMs 3/6 and 25/70; CITels and LHMs 5/26/70 and 6/17/70, all captioned "SNCC Anti-Vietnam War Program.")
