EXPLANATION OF EXEMPTIONS

SUBSECTIONS OF TITLE 5, UNITED STATES CODE, SECTION 552

A subpoena was obtained from the Southern District of New York for subscriber information as mentioned in captioned FD-71. AT&T Security, advised that they do no have the number of the caller making the numerous harassing phone calls to b7C the National Black Network.

Contact with National Black Network, has determined that since his contact with this office the calls have subsided. AUSA SDNY, was contacted and apprized of the facts of this case. advised that it was her opinion the facts of this case did not merit federal prosecution and stated she would decline prosecution in this matter.

In view of the above and since the calls to the NBA network have subsided, NY is placing this case in a closed status administratively.
