



FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT SUBSECTIONS OF TITLE 5, UNITED STATES CODE, SECTION 552

Provisions of the Freedom of Information Act do not apply to matter that are:

- (b) (1) (A) specifically authorized under criteria established by an Executive Order to be kept secret in the interest of national defense or foreign policy and (B) are in fact properly classified pursuant to such Executive order;

Massachusetts, on May 8, 1973. At that time he had been observed to depart Eoston en route to Washington, DC on Delta Airlines, Flight 215, which was scheduled to arrive at Washington at 3:16 p.m., on May 8, 1973.

Prior to his departure, subject's luggage consisting of two bags were inspected by security officials at Logan Airport. According to SA the subject was carrying a hammer in one of the bags which upon technical examination reflected the need for a personal inspection of the aforementioned luggage.

Subsequently on 5/8/73, SAIC 6657 reported the aforementioned information . via FTS to ATSAIC 6667 Washington Field Office.

, On 5/9/73, I contacted Spectral Agent by b7c FBI, Boston, by telephone: ... he advised that no additional intelligence had been received by the FBI at Boston relative to this subject and that the reinvestigation on the matter has been terminated.

He advised that FBI Headquarters at Washington had been advised via TWX on Hay 8, 1973, regarding subject's travel to Washington on that date.

On May 9, 1973, I contacted ASAIC **blo brc**, Intelligence Division, via FTS. ASAIC **bloff** advised that the Boston Field Office should retain custody of this file pending request for transmittal to the Washington Field Office in the event it is determined that the subject intends to spend any length of time in that area.

(E) EVALUATION:

Evaluation of this subject remains unchanged as of the date of this report.

Secret Service Form 1639 is being submitted in connection with this closing report.

(F) DISPOSITION:

This case is considered closed at Boston with the submission of this report.
