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

Synopsis:

Subject, as GEORGE CRILE was one of 30 persons arrested by the New Haven PD in connection with a demonstration at the Armed Forces Induction Center, New Haven, on 12/8/67. NH Tl advised subject, a student at Trinity College. Hartford, Conn., participated in a march on the Pentagon and had subsequently written an article in the university paper differentiating between Americanism and Viet Nam. CRILE, in the article, was highly critical of the protest march and felt the demonstration had gone too far. Records Circuit Court #6, New Haven, Conn., reflect that FREDERICK CRILE was arrested 12/8/67, at New Haven, Conn., and charged with disorderly conduct. Case dismissed 12/8/67, in-asmuch as CRILE had satisfied the court that he was a legitimate photographer and not a participant in demonstration.

Details:

Investigation in this matter was predicated upon information received that GEORGE CRILE, P. O. Box 51, Trinity College, born March 5, 1945, was one of 30 persons arrested by the New Haven Police Department in connection with a demonstration at the Armed Forces Induction Center, New Haven, on December 8, 1967.

On March 27, 1968, NH Tl advised that subject is a student at Trinity College, Hartford, Connecticut, NH Tl advised that subject had participated in a march on the Pentagon and had subsequently written an article in the university paper "Tripod" differentiating between Americanism and Viet Nam. CRILE,

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in the article, was highly critical of the protest march and felt the demonstration had gone too far.

On April 19, 1968, Lieutenant JAMES SHELLY, Records Section, New Haven, Connecticut, Police Department, advised that files of that department reflect one GEORGE CRILE was arrested on December 8, 1967, and charged with disorderly conduct. Lieutenant SHELLY advised that the New Haven Police Department records fail to reflect any disposition with regard to the arrest of GEORGE CRILE.

On April 19, 1968, New Haven, Connecticut, Police Department Liaison Officer RAYMOND ALBERINO, Circuit Court number 6, New Haven, Connecticut, advised that court records contain no information concerning one GEORGE CRILE but do reflect record for one FREDERICK CRILE arrested on December 8, 1967, at New Haven, Connecticut, and charged with disorderly conduct. ALBERINO further advised that court records reveal case re FREDERICK CRILE was dismissed on December 8, 1967, inasmuch as CRILE had satisfied the court that he was a legitimate photographer and not a participant in demonstration which had taken place on that date. ALBERINO advised that docket number was CR6÷52880.

On May 15, 1968, MARY D'EFIMA, Records Section, Hartford, Comecticut, Police Department, and SALLY PEARL, Hartford, Connecticut, Credit Bureau, advised that their records failed to reflect any information identifiable with subject.

Re New Haven letter 4-1-68, and report of SA PETER H. DOLAND, 6-7-68, at New Haven.

Records of the Cleveland Police Department and the Cleveland Heights, Ohio Police Department contain no record of the subject or his parents other than a minor traffic citation by the Cleveland Heights Police Department on 11-17-64, for which CRILE received a fine of \$10.00 and \$7.00 court costs.

Records of the Cleveland Retail Credit Men's Company contain no information concerning either the subject or his parents.

Cleveland sources, who are familiar with some phases of CP and New Left activity in the Cleveland area advised during July, 1968, that GEORGE CRILE is unknown to them.

It is noted that subject's father, GEORGE CRILE II, is a noted physician in Cleveland. The CRILE family has been both professionally and socially prominant in the Cleveland area for many years. It is further noted that, during an interview with Mrs. GEORGE CRILE, JR., subject's stepmother, on 7-3-68, she stated that her stepson was then believed to be working for a newspaper in the Washington, D.C., area.

Cleveland noted that subject's father, GEORGE CRILE, II is a noted physician in Cleveland. The CRILE family has been both professionally and socially prominent in the Cleveland area for many years.

A review of this case reflects subject was one of 30 persons arrested by the New Haven Police Department, in connection with a demonstration at the Armed Forces Induction Center, New Haven on 12/8/67. This charge was subsequently dismissed 12/8/67, inasmuch as CRILE had satisfied the court that he was a legitimate photographer and not a participant in the demonstration. It was further ascertained that subject has written an article highly critical of the protest march on the Pentagon.

In view of the above, it appears that subject has no propensity for violence, and does not advocate protest marches, but rather opposes them. The New Haven Office feels that no further investigation is warranted in this matter, and is placing this case in a closed status. Should additional information be received concurring subject, this case will of course be re-evaluated in the light of the additional information.
