

Apologies for interrupting your Sunday, but I've received a couple of calls from Portland media outlets about a group of 11 protesters who again set up camp at Terry Schrunk Plaza in Portland last night. They have chained themselves to each other and to a large drum filled with concrete. GSA controls the permits and has asked FPS not to enforce the curfew at the park and the prohibition on overnight encampments. Reporters are asking if FPS will be arresting folks as they did last week. Portland PD is telling reporters it's FPS' decision (though the jurisdiction over the park is jointly shared by FPS, the City of Portland and the State of Oregon.)

I've spoken to the FPS CDR on the ground and he says they are standing down and following GSA's request to only intervene if there is a threat to public safety until they here otherwise from DHS.

Looping you in as this seems to be an operational question more that a comms question. Obviously, any decision on posture towards protesters setting up camp in federal parks will have ramifications for Occupy Portland and for protests in other cities. Please advise.

Portland, Ore. - Five protesters remain chained to each other and a 50-gallon drum filled with rocks and concrete at a downtown Portland plaza.

Police said late Saturday that two of the five Occupy Portland protesters are handcuffed to a piece of medal inside the barrel in Terry Schrunk Plaza, which is federal property. At one point during the night, eleven people linked themselves together and to the men in handcuffs by using U-shaped bike locks. Five remained locked up midday Sunday.

Portland police spokesman Pete Simpson told The Oregonian on Sunday morning that the Federal Protective Services had decided to let the protesters occupy Schrunk Plaza, a federal park, for the time being.

KGW: 'Occupy' protesters chain up at Schrunk Plaza

PORTLAND - Some members of the "Occupy Portland" movement moved into Schrunk Plaza Saturday night and chained themselves to a barrel of cement.

So far, federal authorities haven't tried to force out the seven individuals.

They spent the night there with temperatures dipping into the mid 30's - and even set up a couple of tents.

The protesters said it was is in direct repsonse to arrests of "Occupy" protesters around the country.

Schrunk Plaza is policed by the Federal Protective Services.

Last Tuesday, officers they arrested 10 occupy protesters here.

Meanwhile, protesters calling themselves "the Real Occupy Portland" claimed responsibility for vandalism at two banks on Northeast Sandy Boulevard on Saturday.

They claimed that the methods used by the "Occupy Portland" general assembly were ineffective.

They have chained themselves to each other and to a large drum filled with concrete. GSA controls the permits and has asked FPS not to enforce the curfew at the park and the prohibition on overnight encampments. Reporters are asking if FPS will be arresting folks as they did last week. Portland PD is telling reporters it's FPS' decision (though the jurisdiction over the park is jointly shared by FPS, the City of Portland and the State of Oregon.)

I've spoken to the FPS CDR on the ground and he says they are standing down and following GSA's request to only intervene if there is a threat to public safety until they here otherwise from DHS.

Looping you in as this seems to be an operational question more that a comms question. Obviously, any decision on posture towards protesters setting up camp in federal parks will have ramifications for Occupy Portland and for protests in other cities. Please advise.



Portland, Ore. — Five protesters remain chained to each other and a 50-gallon drum filled with rocks and concrete at a downtown Portland plaza.

Police said late Saturday that two of the five Occupy Portland protesters are handcuffed to a piece of medal inside the barrel in Terry Schrunk Plaza, which is federal property. At one point during the night, eleven people linked themselves together and to the men in handcuffs by using U-shaped bike locks. Five remained locked up midday Sunday.

PORTLAND - Some members of the "Occupy Portland" movement moved into Schrunk Plaza Saturday night and chained themselves to a barrel of cement.

So far, federal authorities haven't tried to force out the seven individuals.

They spent the night there with temperatures dipping into the mid 30's - and even set up a couple of tents.

The protesters said it was is in direct repsonse to arrests of "Occupy" protesters around the country.

Schrunk Plaza is policed by the Federal Protective Services.

Last Tuesday, officers they arrested 10 occupy protesters here.

Meanwhile, protesters calling themselves "the Real Occupy Portland" claimed responsibility for vandalism at two banks on Northeast Sandy Boulevard on Saturday.

They claimed that the methods used by the "Occupy Portland" general assembly were ineffective.

Apologies for interrupting your Sunday, but I've received a couple of calls from Portland media outlets about a group of 11 protesters who again set up camp at Terry Schrunk Plaza in Portland last night. They have chained themselves to each other and to a large drum filled with concrete. GSA controls the permits and has asked FPS not to enforce the curfew at the park and the prohibition on overnight encampments. Reporters are asking if FPS will be arresting folks as they did last week. Portland PD is telling reporters it's FPS' decision (though the jurisdiction over the park is jointly shared by FPS, the City of Portland and the State of Oregon.)

I've spoken to the FPS CDR on the ground and he says they are standing down and following GSA's request to only intervene if there is a threat to public safety until they here otherwise from DHS.

Looping you in as this seems to be an operational question more that a comms question. Obviously, any decision on posture towards protesters setting up camp in federal parks will have ramifications for Occupy Portland and for protests in other cities. Please advise.

Don and I just participated in a conference call with Crim Chief Bill Williams and GSA Regional Commissioner Rob Graf. I had a subsequent conversation with Bill Williams. At 10:00 a.m. PST, during his press conference, the Portland Mayor will most likely set a 12:01 a.m., Sunday, November 13th deadline for Occupy Portland to shut down their encampments and vacate the Parks. It is unclear whether the Mayor will also specifically include Schrunk Plaza in his eviction notice. Yet, the Mayor is concerned that upon hearing the news, the protesters will immediately relocate to Schrunk Plaza. Therefore, the Mayor and the Portland PD is soliciting GSA/FPS' assistance in: 1)preventing the protesters to move into Schrunk Plaza; and 2)arresting those who are already encamped there if they won't leave.

Rob Graf stated that he spoke with the Mayor late yesterday afternoon. Rob reiterated GSA's position allowing encampments on Shrunk Plaza, but if the Mayor or PPD had "soundly based" evidence of public health and safety concerns, then GSA would not object to evictions.

**Portland PD has now asked GSA and/or FPS to issue press release announcing GSA's position and FPS' support if PPD decides it is in the public interest to evict protesters from Schrunk Plaza.

We were told the Mayor's press conference (1:00 p.m. EST) will be streamed live on Portland's website.

The GSA is the permitting authority for protests on federal property.

(U//FOUO) Coast Guard personnel at the Dellums federal building have already cleared out. Broadway in downtown Oakland was without traffic, and some police presence, four choppers overhead. Police have escorted protesters to the port of Oakland, including motorbike escort for 100-200 cyclists who passed in front of me at an intersection I just drove through in Oakland an hour ago.



Hundreds Occupy Portland protesters effectively shut down two of the Port of Portland's busiest terminals, preventing about 200 longshore workers from going to work today.

The demonstrations began about 6 a.m. and have been largely peaceful so far.

Port spokesman Josh Thomas said longshore workers at terminals 5 and 6 were told to stay home. They will not be paid for today, he said.

Jennifer Sargent, spokeswoman for the Coast Longshore Division of the ILWU, said about 200 longshore workers are affected.

"Ironically the union does support the overarching goals of the Occupy movement, even though we don't endorse this particular action today," she said.

Said one protester: "We are in solidarity with them even if they don't know it."

Portland police have made a few arrests so far, including a driver who had a suspended license and was traveling with a loaded gun and a sword. A passenger in the car was arrested on an accusation of a parole or probation violation. Both people told officers they were headed to the Occupy Portland demonstration.

Also, officers arrested the driver of a stolen pickup who told police he was headed to the protest.

Protesters in Portland join groups of protesters in a "day of action" aiming to shut down ports along the West Coast, including Longview; Los Angeles; San Diego; Tacoma, Wash.; Seattle; Anchorage, Alaska; and Oakland, Calif.

Port spokesman Josh Thomas said five arriving or departing ships could be disrupted by the demonstrations, along with trains and hundreds of trucks that bring goods to and from the port each day.

As protesters gathered, about a dozen big rigs were lined up at Terminal 6.

Occupy Portland representatives said last week that they're targeting "Wall Street on the Waterfront," and that the ports are an engine of wealth for country's richest I percent.

They pointed out SSA Marine, a cargo handling company with an operation at the Port of Portland. The Wall Street investment bank Goldman Sachs owns a majority share of SSA Marine's parent company, Carrix.

They're also showing solidarity with the International Longshore and Warehouse Union Local 21 in Longview, which is engaged in a bitter labor dispute over staffing of a grain terminal operated by EGT LLC.

The longshore union has publicly distanced itself from the demonstration, saying it would only prevent longshoremen from working that day. Occupy Portland maintains it has been in contact with rank-and-file members who support the action.

The Gladstone-based International Union of Operating Engineers Local 701, whose members staff the EGT terminal, condemned the demonstration, calling it "misguided" and accusing the ILWU of co-opting the Occupy Wall Street message.

The Port of Portland has planned to have extra port police and marine security officers on hand, and it has coordinated with the Portland Police Bureau for backup, Thomas said. Homeland Security regulations prohibit non-credentialed people from entering secured parts of the marine terminal, and the port's security will concentrate on keeping those areas clear, he said.

Several hundred demonstrators reportedly marched from North Portland's Kelly Point Park to the marine terminals, then split into two groups and rallied at the entrances to terminals 5 and 6. The gates to the terminals are currently closed and blocked by police wearing riot gear.

Demonstrators march at Port of Longview; longshoremen sent home

An Occupy protest at the Port of Longview thinned out Monday morning after sparking a longshore walkout earlier in the day.

Shortly before 10 a.m., about 40 demonstrators moved to the intersection of Fibre Way and East Mill Road near the entry to the EGT grain terminal. They were not attempting to block any vehicles, but they were demonstrating with signs supporting union labor and blasting what they perceived as corporate greed and arrogance.

At daybreak, about 100 demonstrators marched in front of one of the main entrances to the port off East Mill Way, just off to the side of the Lewis and Clark Bridge.

Demonstrators were there in part to back the International Longshore and Warehouse Union in its long-running labor dispute with EGT, which has not hired ILWU workers to run its new \$200 million grain terminal at the port.

Despite the pro-labor nature of the rally here and across the West Coast ports, ILWU concerns about how members' "health and safety" would be affected by the demonstration prevented them from working Monday, according to Dan Coffman, president of ILWU Local 21. The union worked out a pay arrangement with the

Pacific Maritime Association, which represents shippers, to send dockworkers home and pay them for four hours, Coffman said.

A longshore labor leader was later seen bringing Starbucks coffee to some demonstrators, who were out on the chilliest morning of the season. Frost had iced over grass and had glazed over most streets in the port area.

Longshore leadership has carefully avoided making official pronouncements of support of the Occupy movement, fearful that they could again be found in violation of a federal court injunction prohibiting the union from impeding commerce at the port.

It was not immediately known how many workers got paid to go home, and the impact of the work stoppage on port activities also was not immediately clear. Two ships were tied up at the port.

About half of the early morning protesters were from out of town, and they left in midmorning to join the Occupy demonstration at the Port of Portland.

At the bigger of Monday's two demonstrations, protesters marched in a clockwise direction in front of the entrance to the port of East Port Way, carrying signs and chanting to a drum beat. No arrests were made. Police presence was light, with a single Longview police vehicle parked across East Port Way

It was uncertain whether the demonstrators intended to block any commercial vehicle attempting to turn into the port at that location. No such vehicle had attempted to turn into the area over the past 90 minutes or so. However, the demonstrators parted to allow two private cars to pass without incident.

Summary:

Occupy Wall Street (OWS) movement began in New York September 2011. The OWS movement has spread to over 100 cities in the U.S. with the intent on fighting back against the role of Wall Street creating an economic collapse. The OWS protesters have a diverse set of demands ranging from equal distribution of income, bank reform, the need for expanded job opportunities to a reduction of corporate influence on politics.

OWS also aims to fight back against the richest 1% of the population they claim are writing the rules of an unfair global economy that is foreclosing on our future. OWS is a non-binding consensus based assembly with no official group of leaders. OWS has also spawned multiple sub affiliated groups calling upon on union members, youth and artists to actively participate. This collaboration with organizations and unions has supported the increased number of protests across the country. The ILWU (International Longshoreman and Warehouse Union) does not publicly support the Port blockades, considers the blockade a third party strike and will not actively participate however, (b) (7)(E)

On Monday, December 12, 2011 a West Coast wide OWS protest has been scheduled as part of its attempt to shutdown West Coast seaports. These demonstrations are planned in the following locations:

- · Anchorage, Alaska
- · Los Angeles, California
- · San Diego, California
- · Oakland, California
- · Portland, Oregon
- · Houston, Texas
- · Seattle, Washington
- · Tacoma, Washington

In preparation for these protests, the Field Offices of Houston, Los Angeles, San Diego, San Francisco and Seattle are actively engaged with local law enforcement and trade partners to establish contingency plans in the event these protests impact any CBP location.

- The OWS protest will begin at the Turning Basin Terminal (City Docks) in Houston, Texas.

Protesters have blocked entrances to two terminals at the Port of Portland this morning, preventing trucks from entering.

Several hundred demonstrators reportedly marched from North Portland's Kelly Point Park to the marine terminals, then split into two groups and rallied at the entrances to terminals 5 and 6. The gates to the terminals are currently closed and blocked by police wearing riot gear.

According to Forbes, Terminal 5 is dedicated to grain and commodities exports, while Terminal 6 is a hub for the state's Asian imports.

A port spokesman said workers at both terminals were told to stay home today. He declined to say how many workers were affected by the closure.
