



Credit and Arrest Checks

His duties were concerned mainly with preparation for and participation in the first Byrd Expedition to Little America, Antarctica. On July 1, 1933, he was placed on indefinite furlough until June 30, 1934, when his services were terminated due to a reduction in force.

From June, 1933, to February, 1951, he was a staff member, Carnegie Institution of Washington, Washington, D. C.

From February, 1951, to December, 1960, he was President, Associated Universities, Incorporated, New York, New York.

Since December, 1960, he has been President of the Graduate Research Center, Incorporated, Dallas, Texas.

He is Chairman, Rockefeller Public Service Awards, Princeton, New Jersey.

Since 1958, he has been a member, Board of Directors, Texas Instruments Corporation, Dallas, Texas.

Since January, 1959, Dr. Berkner has been a consultant, Executive Office of the President, President's Science Advisory Committee.

He has also received numerous excepted appointments as consultant to many governmental agencies, among which are the Department of State; Office of the Secretary of War; Department of Defense; Office of Defense Mobilization; Federal Civil Defense Administration; National Security Resources Board; Department of the Navy; and the Department of the Army.

He has served as a consultant to the Committee on Government Operations, United States House of Representatives, the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, and the University of Alaska.

Dr. Berkner is married to Lillian F. Berkner and they reside at 3632 Northeast 24th Avenue, Fort Lauderdale, Florida.


Military Service



Credit and Arrest Checks

He received a "top secret" clearance from the Office of Naval Research, Department of the Navy, on November 28, 1960, which is active.



V. Berkner Dies at 61 Shaped U.S. Science Policy

Lloyd V. Brekner, 61, a leading figure in American science policy for two decades, died here yesterday after a heart attack.

. He was stricken Saturdaý at a meeting of the Council of the American Academy Sciences and was taken to the George Washington University Hospital where he died.

Mr. Berkner was widely recognized for his work in physics, but he was particularly influential as a scientific administrator and a man who could organize the massive support that modern science requires.

From 1951 to 1960, Mr. Berkner was head of Associated Universities, Inc., formed by nine universities to run the Brookhaven National Laboratories for the Atomic Energy Commission.

After a heart attack several years ago he reduced his activities, but decided to continue as chairman of the board of the Graduate Research Center of the Southwest in Dallas. He was the leading figure in the founding of this new institution, designed to become a counterbalance to the growing scientific pre-eminence of California and the East Coast.

From 1958 to 1962 he was chairman of the Space Science Board of the Academy of Science, a post that made him a ranking official adviser to the space program. Last October he was awarded the National Aeronautics and Space Administration's distinguished public service medal for his "outstanding and pioneering leadership" in organizing the complex network of public and industrial service required to put men into space.

As a scientist, Mr. Berkner worked chiefly in the fields of radio wave propagation, the structure of the upper atmosphere, and solar disturbances. At the time of his death he was working on the history of the Earth's atmosphere.

Mr. Berker was president of the International Council of Scientific Unions from 1955 to 1958, and headed many other scientific organizations.

He is survived by his wife, Lillian, of their home in Fort Lauderdale; two daughters, Mrs. Charles H. Booth of Denver and Mrs. James Chashley of Dubuque, Iowa; his parents, Henry and Alma Berkner of Sleepy Eye, Minn.; two brothers, Cecil, of Sleepy Eye, and Keith, of Sacramento, Calif., and four grandchildren.
