SAC Dunn advised it had been reported that Stokes would hold a press conference at 10 a.m. in the law office of a business partner. It appeared that the purpose of the press conference was to give comment regarding the alleged obstruction of justice charges. SAC Dunn advised that he had just received a phone call from the current U.S. Attorney William Harper who informed Dunn that he, Harper, who is the Associate Attorney had just been in conversation with General. Harper indicated that had informed him that he. calling for the Attorney General who was concerned with what Stokes may say at the news conference regarding the Department. U.S. Attorney Harper informed Dunn that requested that if it were possible it was desired that a Special Agent attend the press conference if this could be done without identifying himself in order to pay particular attention to statements that Stokes may make regarding the activities of the Justice Department and obstruction of justice. SAC Dunn requested approval to send an Agent to the conference advising that he had an Agent who has just arrived in the office who is totally unknown in the community. SEP 15 1977 I advised SAC Dunn considering the facts presented that he should send an Agent as requested; however, judgment would have to be exercised at the scene depending on the circumstances. For example, if it was a small group the Agent should not attend, however, if it were a large public gathering and the chances of his being recognized or identified negligible then he should participate. at which time he advised that in accordance with prior discussion with FBIHQ an Agent was dispatched to cover the press conference of former U.S. Attorney Stokes, however, the Agent arrived at the press conference quite late. SAC Dunn stated that there was no problem from the standpoint of gaining access to the conference since it was a relatively large public gathering. Based on what the Agent heard during the time he was present at the conference nothing was said regarding the Justice Department or the FBI falling down on the job. Former U.S. Attorney Stokes did indicate that the background investigation of Lance was furnished to the Executive Branch of the Government but not to the Legislature, but made no comment as to how he arrived at this conclusion. SAC Dunn stated he would monitor the noontime newscasts and would submit a teletype concerning this matter to FBIHQ.

indicated that the two jurors had been instructed on how to have some of the counts not considered by the jury, leaving only the counts which were really questionable, so that all counts against Lance could be dismissed. One of the two jurors, a female, had been compromised by unknown methods. The compromised female juror in return then compromised a fellow male juror by having sex with him. The source could furnish no further details.
In regard to the Lance trial, the presiding Federal Judge directed verdicts of acquittal on 14 of 33 counts of the original indictment. The Lance jury returned verdicts of not guilty on 9 of the 12 counts against Lance; not guilty on 3 of the 41 counts against defendants

The Department of Justice advised as follows on December 3, 1976. Early in 1976, bank examiners at the Calhoun First National Bank, Calhoun, Georgia, during a routine examination, discovered what is now described as "sloppy handling" regarding campaign expenses pertaining to Mr. Lance's political activity during his primary race for Governor of Georgia. The examiners in turn passed this information on to the Office of the Comptroller of the Currency, Department of the Treasury, and it was then referred to the Department of Justice for examination no recommendations were made. The Department was looking for possible violations of the following Sections of Title 18, United States Code: Section 610 (Contributions or expenditures by national banks, corporations or labor organizations); Section 656 (Theft, embezzlement, or misapplication by bank officer or employee); Section 1005 (Bank entries, reports, transactions). No violation of Section 610 was revealed and the United States Attorney in Atlanta advised that as of December 2, 1976, no violations pertaining to Sections 656 or 1005 were found. He considered the matter closed.

The information revealed separate bank funds. The bank was apparently paying campaign expenditures with its funds and billing the campaign fund at a later date. At that time the campaign fund was honoring payment. There was some question that at certain points during these procedures the campaign fund was issuing checks without sufficient funds to support same, that is, expenditures were made for more than was in the campaign account. Mr. Lance had, however, given his personal guarantee to the bank he would make good any campaign fund expenditures.







Division of Enforcement and Compliance, Office of the Comptroller of the Currency, advised SAF that in accordance with request of SA upon return to his office from a business trip 1/21/77. he had reviewed reports of bank examinations at the Calhoun First National Bank for the years 1972, 1973. and 1974 concerning overdrafts in the accounts of appointee and his wife. He stated that results of this review disclosed no overdrafts occurring during those years for appointee or his wife with the exception of one in the report dated 8/6/73 in the amount of \$3120 in the name of BERT LANCE, then President of the Calhoun First National Bank. Copy of this report was furnished by and is attached.

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Concerning overdrafts in the account of the BERT LANCE Campaign Committee, he stated this information had been furnished to Department of Justice by memorandum dated 12/24/75 for its determination of possible violations under Section 610 of Title 12 United States Code. We furnished a copy of this memorandum which is attached. He said that because of banking laws of these examinations by the Office of the Comptroller of the Currency could not be made further available without a subpoens. He noted that reports of bank examinations made available to the FBI to date were done with the consent of the appointee.



- 3) Whether, at any time, Mr. Lance declined to cooperate or allow the FBI to review documents in his possession or control? Please provide details if he declined such cooperation.

4) Was there any other factor that delayed initiation of the FBI background investigation or impeded its conduct?

In view of pressing time factors, it is urgently requested that you reply at the earliest possible time.

STOKES CLAIMED THAT THE REPORT WAS NEVER GIVEN TO THE SENATE COMMITTEE AT THE TIME OF LANCE'S CONFIRMATION HEAPINGS. STOZS STATED HE THOUGHT THAT SOMEBODY ON PRESIDENT CARTER'S STAFF KEPT THE REPORT FROM THE SENATE COMMITTEE AFTER THE FBI HAD FURNISHED THE REPORT TO THZ CARTER ADMINISTRATION. HE CLAIMED THAT HE COULD NOT PROVE THIS BECAUSE NO ONE ON THE COMMITTEE HAS TOLD HIM THAT THEY DID

NOT RECFIVE THE REPORT.

STOKES STATED HE CLOSED THE LANCE CASE JUST BEFORE LANCE'S CONFIRMATION BECAUSE IT WAS NOT PROYECUTABLE. STOKES CLAIMED THAT HIS INVESTIGATION SHOWED THAT LANCED USED BAD JUDGEMENT IN HIS BANKING PRACTICES, ESPECIALLY IN THE AREA OF OVERDRAFTS, BUT STOKES STATED HE WAS NEVER ABLE TO PROVE THAT LANCE EVER COMMITTED AND CRIMINAL OFFENSE. STOKES CLAIMED THAT LANCE HAD PAID BACK THE MONEY WITH INTEREST AND THAT THERE WAS NO INTENT TO DEFRAUD ON LANCE'S PART.

Imost from the moment Bert Lance was appointed director of the Office of Management and Budget, troublesome snippets about his previous career have been surfacing. And oddly for the paper millionaire who wants to stroke the Federal budget into balance within four years, Lance himself has emerged. a deficit spender. His expenses exceed his income, and his debts, at .

\$5.3 million, come perilously close to his assets. Last week, reporters unearthed more artifacts from Lance's past one of them a possible sweetener for one of his personal loans. Within hours, the Comptroller of the Currency began an investigation and a Senate committee called the OMB chief on the carpet to testify yet again on his own behalf.

But still more difficulties could be unfolding for Lance over his stewardship of Georgia's tiny (assets: \$50 million) Calhoun First National Bank. Lance ran the Calhoun bank from 1963 to 1974, before moving into the big time as head of the National Bank of Georgia in Atlanta. During the early 1970s, NEWS-WEEK has found, a pattern of corner-cutting and dubious banking practices prevailed at Calhoun First National. Lance's friends maintain that such practices are not at all uncommon to small-town banking, and an investigation by the Justice Department was closed without criminal indictments. But NEWSWEEK learned that the inquiry was ended over the objections of the assistant U.S. attorney who was conducting the case and felt that more time was needed.

'Way of Life': The salient feature of the latter Lance years was persistent overdrafting by officers and relatives, including his wife, LaBelle; Lance and LaBelle's family's shares amount to controlling interest in the bank's stock. In Lance's 1974 campaign for governor, his campaign committee regularly overdrew its account as well. "Overdrafting was a way of life," a Washington official familiar with the bank's affairs told NEWS-WEEK'S Rich Thomas. "Those folks played that bank as their private fief.'

Other problems for Lance center on his subsequent role as head of Atlanta's Newsweek, August 1, 197 National Bank of Georgia. The Washington Post last week disclosed that late last year, NBG formally established a "correspondent" banking relationship with First National Bank of Chicago and deposited \$200,000 in an interest-free account in the Chicago bank. Just one month later, First Chicago granted Lance loans totaling \$3.4 million.

Spokesmen for Lance and First Chicago deny any connection between the deposit and the loan. But the Post also quoted a First Chicago spokesman as saying that on Dec. 2, 1976, six days before the deposit was made, officials of NBG "came to us as a result of the correspondent banking relationship and asked if we would be interested in bidding" on the Lance loan. If this were found to be a sweetheart arrangement, the Atlanta bank's deposit would amount to a "compensating balance" for the personal loan to Lance. Such arrangements sometimes result in Federal charges of misapplication of bank funds. At the weekend, NEWSWEEK learned that Lance had made a similar arrangement with Manufacturers Hanover Trust Co., almost simultaneously taking a personal loan and setting up a correspondent relationship for NBG. This loan was later switched to First Chicago.

Pressed by reporters, the Comptroller of the Currency acknowledged that it would have to investigate the First Chicago loan. More important to Lance's immediate future, Sen. Abraham Ribicoff's Governmental Affairs Committee suspended a decision on Jimmy Carter's request that it give the OMB director more time to sell his NBG stock.

Forced Sale: Lance bought his 200,000 shares in NBG 21 per cent of the bank's stock-for about \$17 a share, and the stock is now part of the collateral for his First Chicago loan. The threat of his forced sale, plus the bank sprecent problems with real-estate loan losses, drove the price as low as \$8.50 before Atlanta businessmen moved in to support it. Earlier, the committee had been sympathetic to Carter's request for an extension of the deadline, since Lance might stand to lose as much as \$1.6 million. But after last week's disclosures the committee decided to duestion Lance on his version of the NBC-First Chicago relationship, with special emphasis on the timing of NBG's deposit.

The committee will also take up another episode in Lance's NBG career: his involvement, if any, in Teamster pension-fund deposits

at the bank. In April 1976, the Teamsters' Central States Pension Fund-still under Labor Department investigation-pumped \$18 million into a trust account to be managed by NBG. According to bank spokesmen, Lance himself, who was then gaining celebrity as front-running Jimmy Carter's friend and adviser, had nothing to do with the arrangement. Last week, however, New York Times columnist William Safire reported that in late November, with Carter elected and Lance an apparent shooin for a top Administration post, the NBG chairman met at the bank with three top Teamster officials. Through a spokes-

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man ance said the meeting was "rou-

Gov. Jimmy Carter's Transportation Chief, Lance opened his own campaign for the Statehouse, and a campaign committee was established. Not surprisingly, it banked at Calhoun First National, which Lance still headed as president and chief executive officer. An account of \$5,000 was opened, and Lance went off to campaign. The problem, his former campaign treasurer recalled last week, was simply that "Bert spent money faster than I could raise it." But that problem had been foreseen: Lance had signed a pledge to make good any overdrafts by his committee.

Easy Come: There was other overdrafting. The Comptroller's accountants examined the bank's books in 1975 and found a persistent pattern at Calhoun. During 1974 and early 1975, for instance, several insiders, including Lance's wife LaBelle and members of her family, overdrew their checking accounts. NEWSWEEK learned that the overdrafts averaged about \$100,000-and on one occasion, jumped to \$300,000. Starting in 1971, a bank officer named Billy Lee Campbell had been permitted overdrafts as high as \$197,000; four years later, Campbell was tried and convicted for embezzling an estimated \$1 million from Calhoun First National.

When investigators discovered the overdrafts by family and friends, the Comptroller's office ordered the practice ended. It wasn't actually illegal, says former Comptroller Robert Bloom; "in fact, we didn't even have a formal rule. But it absolutely violates all sound bank-

ing practice. We have made this and we stop it wherever it occurs. The bank complied, and no further action was taken. But the campaign overdrafts were another matter. By the time the campaign ended in a primary defeat for Lance, the campaign deficit stood at \$400,000. Lance has said he had certificates of deposit in the bank that were effectively collateral for the overdraft, but one source told NEWSWEEK that they may have totaled only \$100,000, and that the overdraft was allowed to stand for more than a year, until the examiners uncovered the situation.

The overdraft could be interpreted as an illegal contribution to Lance's campaign, because Lance didn't have to pay interest for the use of the funds. After discovering the overdraft, the Comptroller's office sent its report to the Justice Department for examination. (NEWS-WEEK requested a copy of the Comptroller's report under the Freedom of Information Act, but the request was denied.) Justice ultimately decided it couldn't make a case, since proof was lacking of "willful intent" to break the law.

A Close Call: Yet on reviewing the facts, NEWSWEEK learned, some Justice lawvers thought a viable case could be made under section 656, a statute that bars "willful misapplication" of bank funds by "any officer, director, agent or employee." Washington bucked the case to the U.S. attorney's office in Atlanta in March 1976. In September, it was assigned to Jeffrey Bogart, a lawyer who had helped prosecute Billy Lee Campbell and was thus familiar with the Calhoun bank. Bogart had just got his probe launched, and he thought it could lead to an indictment. His superiors disagreed. "It just wasn't something that had prosecutable potential," said a top Justice official last week. "There just wasn't a hell of a lot there." In any event, Atlanta U.S. attorney John Stokes took Bogart off the case and declared it closed on Dec. 2. The next day, Carter named Lance direc-

Before Lance's nomination, the FBI looked into the Calhoun case. NEWS-WEEK learned that a report was sent to Carter's staff. Robert Lipshutz, now White House counsel, said he didn't consider it damaging enough to block Lance's appointment. The report was not sent to the Ribicoff committee before its first hearings on the nomination.

Meeting Mike: Once in office, Lance may have used his influence to benefit old banking contacts. In March, said The Washington Post last week, he arranged a meeting between Treasury Secretary Michael Blumenthal and Jake Butcher, chairman of-Knoxville, Tenn.'s United American Bank, which had a \$443,466 loan outstanding to Lance. Lance's press aide said the session was set up to promote an energy exposition planned for Knoxville in 1982. But Jake's brother, C.H. Butcher, offered a different version. "We asked for the meeting," he told the Post; "because we had never met [Blu-

menthal, and he does regulate our business as Treasury Secretary."

In his official role, Lance has also angered some senators with words and deeds that seem to violate his promise to avoid personal participation in banking issues. In early June, for instance, he spoke out against rising interest rates—a conflict, critics argue, since interest payments on his own big loan with First Chicago rise and fall with the prime rate. And later last month, Lance, still a bank owner, signed an Administration letter urging Congress to reject an anti-redlining amendment to the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 that would require banks to tailor their loan policies to the credit needs of their communities. Accused of a conflict, Lance said the legislation concerned housing, not banking; even so, the budget director last week appointed his No. 3 man, Bowman Cutter, to handle all policy issues affecting banking.

Tough Questions: Whether any such moves will satisfy Lance's critics is increasingly in question-and it's safe to say that this week's Congressional questions will be tougher than he has faced in the past. The White House still expresses every confidence in Lance, and while Lance himself was unavailable to the press last week, a statement issued under his name said he "is prepared to answer fully any questions." With no evidence thus far of anything more than dubious behavior, Lance may well survive his newest travails. But his reputation has been tarnished and his finances remain precarious. Given those facts, it's an open question how effectively he can do his government job.
