

On January 8, 1985, contact with the HINDS COUNTY SHERIFF's OFFICE (HCSO), Jackson, Mississippi, determined the HCSO had no record identifiable with the name RICHARD ANTHONY BARRETT, date of birth February 18, 1943.

On January 10, 1985, checks were made through the MISSISSIPPI JUSTICE INFORMATION SYSTEM (MJIS) computer and the NATIONAL CRIME INFORMATION CENTER (NCIC) in the name RICHARD ANTHONY BARRETT. It was determined the MJIS does not contain any record of criminal arrests concerning BARRETT; however, a computerized listing of a driver's license was located for BARRETT. This listing reveals that BARRETT was issued Mississippi driver's license number 001772826 on March 25, 1982, and BARRETT is described as a white male, born February 18, 1943, brown hair, brown eyes, six feet tall, 175 pounds. BARRETT's address was recorded as Post Office Box 6700, Jackson, Mississippi, and his driver's license expiration date is February 28, 1986.

The NCIC inquiry determined BARRETT is not entered in NCIC as a wanted person and that the NCIC Interstate Identification Index contains no record identifiable with BARRETT.

On February 25, 1985, contact with Sergeant INTELLIGENCE DIVISION, JACKSON POLICE DEPARTMENT (JPD), Jackson, Mississippi, determined that JPD has a file, number 25191, concerning an arrest of a RICHARD BARRETT, date of birth February 18, 1943, place of birth New York, New York. This file indicates BARRETT was arrested for disturbing the peace on August 15, 1967, and when arrested, BARRETT was described as being a white male, five feet ten inches tall, 153 pounds, dark brown hair, brown eyes, slim build, and his occupation was a sign painter. The final disposition of this arrest was shown as Nolle Prosecution.

Sergeant also advised JPD INTELLIGENCE DIVISION records contain two references to the name RICHARD BARRETT. Review of these JPD INTELLIGENCE DIVISION reports wherein RICHARD BARRETT is mentioned revealed the following:

A report prepared on February 28, 1978, contains information indicating RICHARD BARRETT, a Jackson attorney whose office is located in Suite 506, Barnett Building, Jackson, Mississippi, telephone number 969-5700, and whose home address and telephone number are 154 South Sunset Terrace, 372-1314, is the head of the Anti Jew States Rights Party headquartered in Marietta, Georgia. BARRETT also reportedly has a Post Office Box number 3372. Additional information reveals that on February 27, 1978, the JPD INTELLIGENCE DIVISION obtained information from a confidential source that according to an unidentified source, RICHARD BARRETT and had a residence or a warehouse in Rankin County, Mississippi, where they were indoctrinating people into KU KLUX KLAN type activities. This residence or warehouse was reportedly stocked with Nazi paraphernalia. This information was never confirmed by the JPD INTELLIGENCE DIVISION.

A March, 1978, report on the National States Rights
Party (NSRP) contains information indicating "Unconfirmed sources
state that RICHARD BARRETT, a lawyer in Jackson, Mississippi, is
head of the NSRP in this area." The report also shows BARRETT's
business address as Suite 506, Barnett Building, telephone
number 969-5700, and he lives at 154 South Sunset Terrace,
Jackson, Mississippi. BARRETT's home telephone number is 3721314. The report described the NSRP as an Anti Negro organization headed by
Georgia.

Inasmuch as subject has been identified, Jackson is considering this matter closed, UACB.

RICHARD ANTHONY BARRETT of Jackson, Mississippi, telephone number 373-4400, was telephonically advised of the official identity of the interviewing Agent and of the nature of this inquiry. BARRETT was also advised that any information he furnished could be used in a court of law. BARRETT then furnished the following voluntary oral statement in liew of a written statement.

BARRETT was advised at the initiation of this interview that he was being contacted telephonically in view of his request that he be contacted in an expeditious manner. BARRETT stated that he did not object to discussing this matter telephonically.

BARRETT stated that, by way of background, he participated in a civil rights march in Cummings (Forsyth County), Georgia, on the weekend of January 24, and January 25, of 1987. BARRETT stated that he did not travel to this destination in any official capacity, but stated that he simply wanted, as a white citizen of the United States, to make his opinion heard by his very physical presence at the rally in question.

BARRETT stated that his participation in this rally, which he stated was covered by representatives of the national media, both printed and electronic, was without incident as it might relate to any potential violation of his civil rights as a citizen of the United States.

BARRETT stated that the specific reason for his contacting the Jackson, Mississippi, Office of the FBI upon his return to Jackson was that he turned on his answering machine upon his arrival back in Jackson in order to check for any possible messages received during his absence.

BARRETT stated that he would simply like to report, for the record, the substance of the first recorded message

which he received. Specifically, BARRETT stated that he received three separate messages from one caller whom he would best describe as a black female.

He stated that the first call from this individual relayed a message to him to the effect that this female caller was aware that he traveled to Cummings, Georgia, and that this caller was going to whip his white ass.

BARRETT stated that the second message received from this same caller stated words to the effect that she was going to whip his white M. F. ass.

BARRETT stated that the third message received from this same black female caller were similar expressions of her intentions towards him as indicated in the first two calls above.

BARRETT stated that he received on his answering machine a fourth message from another person whom BARRETT stated he would describe as another black female. BARRETT stated, however, that this second caller was different from the first caller who left the above three messages. BARRETT stated that the second caller left only one message, which stated, "I know who you are. You are going to die. You white M. F."

BARRETT stated that he received no other messages on his answering service. BARRETT stated that he would retain the tape recordings in question should they prove of any future merit in either voice identification of the two callers in question or as documentation for the veracity of this allegation.

BARRETT stated that he had no altercation in Cummings, Georgia, on the weekend in question, and, thus, had no suspect as to the identities of any black females in Cummings, Georgia, who may have had any verbal or other disagreement with him or any reason to call him. Likewise, BARRETT stated that he had no suspects in the Mississippi area which might assist in further pinpointing the identities of the two female callers.

BARRETT stated that there is not any evidence of any action on the part of anyone which he might construe as an attempt to carry out the intentions mentioned in the taped telephone messages.

TEN DAYS OF PROTEST AND RESISTANCE, APRIL 21 - 30, 1968

A "Calendar of April Actions Against the War In Vietnam" published by the Washington Mobilization Committee to and the War in Vietnam (WMC) states that ten days of protest against the war in Vietnam has been called by the Students for a Democratic Society (SDS) for April 20 - 30, 1968. It is stated the object of this protest is to expose and denounce campus complicity with the war in Vietnam.

A confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, has advised that the WMC is the Washington, D. C. (WDC) office of the National Mobilization Committee to End the War in Vietnam (NMC).

The NMC was formerly known as the Spring Mobilization Committee (SMC).

The SMC is described in the publication entitled "Communist Origin and Manipulation of Vietnam Week (April 8-15, 1967)," a report by the Committee on Un-American Activities, House of Representatives. On page 53, the report states in part, "Communists are playing dominant roles in both the Student Mobilization Committee and the Spring Mobilization Committee."

A characterization of the SDS is attached.

A flyer distributed by the Washington Student Mobilization Committee (WSMC), 3 Thomas Circle, WDC, states the Student Mobilization Committee to End the War in Vietnam of New York, New York, is calling for an International Student-Faculty Strike Against the War in Vietnam, Racial Oppression and the Draft on April 26, 1968.

TEN DAYS OF PROTEST AND RESISTANCE, APRIL 21-30, 1968

On April 15, 1968, a second confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, reported that the newly formed Washington Black Anti-War Anti-Draft Union (WBAWADU) has joined the WSMC for the April 26, 1968, student strike in WDC.

According to this source Howard University, WDC, students and "black" high school students will meet at Bannaker Field, a playground near Howard University, at 10 a.m. April 26, 1968, and then march to DuPont Circle, WDC, to join with white college students being organized by WSMC. Following a rally at DuPont Circle the entire group will march to the WDC head-quarters of the Selective Service System, 916 G Street, N.W., for a demonstration.

This source advised that planners for the activity on April 26, 1968, expect 5,000 students to participate.

On April 16, 1968, Captain

Park Police, WDC, reported that on that date the WMC, 3 Thomas Circle, WDC, was issued a permit to hold an International Day of Protest Against the War in Vietnam at Franklin Park, 14th and K Streets, N.W., from 11:30 a.m., until 4:30 p.m., on April 27, 1968.

On April 18, 1968, a third source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, furnished a flyer being distributed by the WMC concerning the proposed activity on April 27, 1968. According to this flyer the participants will march to the WDC headquarters of the Selective Service System, 916 G Street, N.W., after assembling at Franklin Park, and then return to the park at 1 p.m. for a rally. This flyer also lists the individuals scheduled to speak at the rally, and a list of fifteen sponsoring organizations.

TEN DAYS OF PROTEST AND RESISTANCE, APRIL 21-30, 1968

An article appearing in the February 19, 1968, issue of "The Washington Post and Times Herald" nowspaper, WDC, identifies Professor Howard Zinn as a member of the NMC. This article states he travelled to North Vietnam in January and February, 1968, as a representative of the NMC to act as an intermediary in the release of three captive United States pilots held by the North Vietnamese. According to this article Professor Zinn was critical of the United States Government's handling of the prisoners following their release.

A fourth source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, has identified Jan Bailey as a member of the current staff of the WDC office of the Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee (SNCC).

One of the sponsoring organizations shown on the above flyer is "CHOICE," an abbreviation for the Capitol Hill Organized Individuals for a Civilian Environment.

A characterization of the Young Socialist Alliance, also listed as a sponsoring organization, is attached.

On April 18, 1963, the second source reported that while demonstrating at 916 G Street, N.W., on April 27, 1968, the WMC would like to carry and then release balloons labeled "Peace Now," but has no plans for the burning of draft cards at that location. This source also reported that the WMC would like to have 1,500 participants, but does not expect that large a crowd.

On April 18, 1968, the third source mentioned reported that the WMC has approximately 10,000 pieces of literature to distribute during their activity on April 28, 1968. The source also reported that as of that date the WMC had not obtained a permit from the Metropolitan Police Department to march from Franklin Park to 916 G Street, N.W., and return on April 28, 1968.

On April 17, 1968, Inspector A. D. Beye, United States Park Police, WDC, advised that on that date Richard Anthony Barrett,

STUDENTS FOR A DEMOCRATIC SOCIETY

The Students for a Democratic Society (SDS), as it is known today, came into being at a founding convention held at Port Huron, Michigan, in June, 1962. The SDS is an association of young people on the left and has a current program of protesting the draft, promoting a campaign for youth to develop a conscientious objector status, denouncing United States intervention in the war in Vietnam and to "radically transform" the university community, and provide for its complete control by students. Gus Hall, General Secretary, Communist Party, USA, when interviewed by a representative of United Press International in San Francisco, California, on May 14, 1965, described the SDS as a part of the "responsible left" which the Party has "going for us." At the June, 1965, SDS National Convention, an anti-communist proviso was removed from the SDS constitution. In the October 7, 1966, issue of "New Left Notes," the official publication of SDS, an SDS spokesman stated that there are some communists in SDS and they are welcome. The national headquarters of this organization as of April 18, 1967, was located in Room 206, 1608 West Madison Street, Chicago, Illinois.

YOUNG SOCIALIST ALLIANCE

The May, 1960, issue of the "Young Socialist" (YS), page 1, column 3, disclosed that during April 15-17, 1960, a national organization entitled "The Young Socialist Alliance" (YSA) was established at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. This issue stated that this organization was formed by the nationwide supporter clubs of the publication US.

The above issue, page 6, set forth the Founding Declaration of the YSA. This declaration stated that the YSA recognized the Socialist Workers Party (SWP) as the only existing political leadership on class struggle principles, and that the supporters of the YS have come into basic political solidarity with the SWP on the principles of revolutionary socialism.

On March 10, 1967, a source advised that the YSA was formed during 1957, by youth of various left socialist tendencies, particularly members and followers of the SWP. The source further advised that the YSA has recently become more open about admitting that it is the youth group of the SWP and that an SWP representative has publicily stated that the YSA is the SWP's youth group.

The headquarters of the YSA are located in Rooms 532-536, 41 Union Square West, New York City.

The SWP has been designated pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

PIERCE, Chief of Detectives, Jackson, Miss., PD, on 5/22/67, advised that RICHARD BARRETT, along with approximately 68 other individuals, proceeded to parade on Capitol Street in Jackson, Miss., on 5/21/67, the parade culminating at the War Memorial on North State Street in Jackson, Miss. The parade began at approximately 3:00 PM. During the parade, individuals carried placards and signs reading: "Did 10,000 Americans Die In Vain in Viet Nam?"; "Victory in Viet Nam"; "Win the War Now"; "Deport Stinky Stokely"; "Bury Communism"; 'Better Dead Than Red"; and others of similar nature. Upon arrival at the War Memorial, RICHARD BARRETT, along with several other individuals, made comments and short speeches.

The group then burned what they said was a Viet Cong flag and BARRETT made the statement, "We did something in Mississippi they couldn't do in New York; we burned the Viet Cong flag". PIERCE stated that among the group were

RICHARD ANTHONY BARRETT RACIAL MATTERS - KLAN

A confidential source advised on October 27, 1966, that Richard Barrett, a white male.age 23. in the past few months, accompanied by father of went to Natchez, Mississippi, and contacted. The purpose of the contact was for Barrett to ascertain if knew the names of a couple of men in each county in Mississippi whom Barrett could contact in an effort to have them ioin some type of hate-group he was trying to form. Barrett he could not assist him in his request.

Assistant Chief of Police J. L. Ray, Jackson, Mississippi Police Department, on November 23, 1966, advised he had received information that Barrett had two large flags hanging in his room which he claimed were given him by Governor George Wallace of Alabama. Barrett has received mail from "Voice of the People", address unknown, condemning Negro servicemen in Viet Nam.

An article appearing in <u>The Clarion-Ledger</u>, a Jackson, Mississippi, daily newspaper, under date of February 12, 1967, indicates that Barrett graduated from Rutgers University, New Brunswick, New Jersey, in 1964. He later returned his degree to the University because he said they had Communist Party leaders teaching there.

He said the institution also sanctioned the sending of blood, money and supplies by certain groups to the Communists in North Viet Nam. Barrett's statement to the Associated Press at that time was "We can't battle Communists abroad and tolerate them here at home".

An article appearing in The Natchez Democrat, Natchez, Mississippi, under date of April 22, 1967, indicates that Richard Barrett is a former Army infantry enlisted man. The article further indicates that Barrett recently returned from Viet Nam where he was wounded twice in action and received the Purple Heart twice.

On May 15, 1967, M. B. Pierce, Chief of Detectives, Jackson, Mississippi Police Department, advised that Barrett had made application for a permit to hold a parade on May 21, 1967, sponsored by the American Victory Committee of which Barrett is Chairman. The theme of the parade was "Win in Viet Nam" and Barrett was urging veterans, mothers, workers and students to participate in this parade.

Barrett was interviewed by Special Agents of the FBI on March 13, 1967, at which time he advised he is a "racist" and he gives talks frequently concerning segregation and talks concerning Viet Nam. He said he believes in segregation and feels that segregation should some day be the law of the land, and it is his objective to organize an organization with this objective in mind. He related he is a Viet Nam veteran and is firmly convinced that the United States should be involved in the Viet Cong war but it should win the war and not sacrifice American lives for political reasons.

Barrett continued that he is not a member of the Ku Klux Klan or any other organization and would not identify any of his associates nor state whether he was or was not acquainted with any members of the Ku Klux Klan. Barrett refused to discuss in detail any of his activities inasmuch as he felt the FBI was becoming a national police agency similar to the **G**estapo.

Records on file at the Military Personnel Records Center, St. Louis, Missouri, reveal Richard Anthony Barrett, Army Serial Number RA 12701033, served in the U.S. Army from June 4, 1964, to May 27, 1966, receiving an honorable release from active duty as Specialist 4 at Oakland, California, and transferred to U.S. Army Reserve to complete military obligation. Terminal date of military obligation is shown as May 3, 1970. Records indicate that Barrett is currently a member of the Stand-by Reserve, U.S. Army Reserve Control Group. He had foreign service in Viet Nam and received Viet Nam Service Medal, Purple Heart with oak leaf cluster and Combat Infantry Badge. No record of disciplinary action or treatment for mental or nervous disorder is contained in his file. These records indicate Barrett was born on February 18, 1943, at New York, New York.

ORIGINAL KU KLUX KLAN OF AMERICA, INC. (LOUISIANA) (OKA)

Records of the Secretary of State, State of Louisiana, Baton Rouge, Louisiana, reflect that a Louisiana corporate charter was issued to the Original Ku Klux Klan of America, Inc., on January 26, 1965, at Monroe, Louisiana.

A source advised on May 16, 1965, that at a Province meeting in Winnsboro, Louisiana, of the Original Knights of the Ku Klux Klan (OKKKK) held in December, 1964, there was a considerable dissension among the members and as a results a split in the OKKKK occurred.

led the split and formed the Original Ku Klux Klan of America, Inc., according to the source.

A second source advised on October 1, 1965, that formed the Original Ku formed the Original Ku Klux Klan or America, Inc. (UKA) after splitting away from the OKKKK in December, 1964. The second source advised that the OKA has the same general purposes as the OKKKK; that is, the promotion of Americanism, white supremacy and the maintaining of segregation.

The second source also advised that assumed the leadership position of Grand Dragon of the UKA in February, 1965, after left the organization. The second source further advised that the OKA does not have any units chartered outside of the State of Louisiana.

UNITED KLANS OF AMERICA, INC., KNIGHTS OF THE KU KLUX KLAN (UKA)

Records of Superior Court of Fulton County, Georgia, reflect that this Klan organization was granted a corporate charter on February 21, 1961, at Atlanta, Georgia, under the name United Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of America, Inc.

A source advised on February 27, 1961, that United Klans was formed as a result of a slip—in the U. S. Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, Inc. According to the source, the split resulted from a leadership dispute and United Klans has the same aims and objectives as the parent group. These are the promotion of Americanism, white supremacy, and segregation of the races.

The first source and a second source advised in July, 1961, that United Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of America, Inc., merged with Alabama Knights, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan. The merged organization established headquarters in Suite 401, Alston Building, Tuscaloosa, Alabama. (The organization is directed by ROBERT SHELTON, Imperial Wizard, and is the dominant Klan group in the South, with units in several southern states.)

Second source advised that at a meeting in Prattville, Alabama, on October 22, 1961, the U. S. Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, merged with the United Klans of America, Inc., Knights of the Ku Klux Klan.

Third source advised on May 25, 1966, that the UKA is currently an active organization, with Klaverns in several states. This source said that ROBERT M. SHELTON is the Imperial Wizard of this organization and was elected to this position on September 5, 1964, at a National Klonvocation in Birmingham, Alabama. Source stated that during April, 1966, the National office was moved from Suite 401, ! Alston Building, Tuscaloosa, Alabama, to the carport of SHELTON's residence, #18 Lake Sherwood, Star Route, Northport, Alabama, which space he had converted into a room.

APPENDIX

WHITE KNIGHTS OF THE KU KLUX KLAN OF MISSISSIPPI (WKKKKOM)

A source advised that on February 15, 1964, approximately 200 members of the Original Knights of the Ku Klux Klan (OKKKK) from the State of Mississippi met at Brookhaven, Mississippi. Those present decided to defect from the OKKKK and to form their own Klan group in Mississippi to be known as the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of Mississippi.

This source advised that the aims and purposes of the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of Mississippi are to preserve Christian civilization, protect and promote white supremacy, and the segregation of the races, to fight Communism and to extend the dignity, heritage, and rights of the white race of America.

A second source advised on August 10, 1966, that the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klam of Mississippi is an unincorporated secret organization existing in the State of Mississippi and dedicated to the preservation of white supremacy at any cost, including the use of force and violence. The official constitution and other directives of the organization do not show any advocation of force or violence, but it is generally conceded among the members that in the end force and violence will be the only salvation of the white man with regard to his relationships with the Negro race. The White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan is controlled by the Imperial Wizard and other State Officers and the State is divided into districts and provinces. There is an estimated membership, as of August 10, 1966, of 800 to 1000 dues-paying members of this organization. . The aims and purposes of the organization continue to be the same as when the organization was created in February, 1964. Sam H. Bowers, Jr., Laurel, Mississippi, continues to be the Imperial Wizard.

Highway Safety Patrol (MHSP), Jackson, Mississippi, on July 30, 1967 advised that Richard Anthony Barrett, along with five other individuals, arrived at the State Capitol grounds at approximately 2:15 p.m. and requested permission to place a wreath at the foot of the statue of Theodore Bilbo. Barrett was advised that the Capitol was closed on Sunday at which time the group placed the wreath on the steps leading to the Capitol. Barrett then requested permission to read a proclamation at which time this permission was denied. Barrett advised that he was forming a group which is to be called the "Americans' Victory Force" which will consist of a group of young militant segregationists.

stated Barrett and his group wanted to parade on the Capitol grounds carrying flags; however, he, Barrett, was advised that if he paraded, he and his group would be arrested. stated that at this time, Barrett and his group left the Capitol grounds and remained on the sidewalk for approximately thirty-five minutes at which time they departed. There were no incidents and no one was arrested.



Bufiles also indicate that he or others have formed the "American Victory Committee." This group has as its objective segregation and the winning of the war in Vietnam by the U. S.

There is no indication that Barrett is a member or has associated with members of the American Nazi Party.

Jackson should conduct an inquiry concerning the American Victory Committee and Richard Anthony Barrett. The extent of his organization as well as a resume of their activities should be incorporated in form suitable for dissemination.

RICHARD ANTHONY BARRETT RACIAL MATTERS (KLAN)

Richard Barrett was interviewed by Special Agents of the FBI on March 13, 1967, in connection with another official investigation, at which time he advised that he is a "Racist", and he gives talks frequently concerning segregation and Viet Nam. He said he believes in segregation and feels that segregation should be the law of the land some day, and it is his objective to organize an organization with this objective in mind. He related that he is a Vietnam veteran and is firmly convinced that the United States should be involved in the Viet Cong War but should win the war and not sacrifice American lives for political reasons.

Barrett continued that he is not a member of the Ku Klux Klan or any other organization, and he would not identify any of his associates nor state whether he was or was not acquainted with any members of the Ku Klux Klan. Barrett refused to discuss in detail any of his activities, inasmuch as he felt the FBI was becoming a national police agency.

On May 15, 1967, M. B. Pierce, Chief of Detectives, Jackson, Mississippi, Police Department, advised that Barrett had made application for a permit to hold a parade on May 21, 1967, sponsored by the American Victory Committee of which Barrett is National Chairman. The theme of the parade was "Win in Vietnam", and Barrett was encouraging veterans, mothers, workers, and students to participate in this parade.

Chief Pierce stated on May 22, 1967, that Barrett, along with approximately sixty-eight other individuals, held a parade in Jackson, Mississippi. Individuals participating in the parade carried signs reading "Did 10,000 Americans die in Vain in Vietnam"; Victory in Vietnam"; "Win the War Now"; "Deport Stinky Stokely"; and others. Chief Pierce stated that there

were no spectators along the parade route, and no incidents occurred during the parade. He attributed the lack of spectators and no more participants in the parade to very inclement weather.

A fourth confidential source advised on August 14, 1967, that Richard Barrett held a "Victory In Vietnam" Parade in Natchez on the night of August 12, 1967. There were approximately twenty-five automobiles in the parade with two people in each car, making a total of fifty people in the parade.

Source stated that

in the Natchez Campaign Headquarters of
Gubernatorial Candidate, helped organize the parade. United
States Representative John R. Rarick of St. Francisville,
Louisiana, was the main speaker, and the theme of his
talk was Americanism. Barrett made a short talk about
winning the War in Vietnam. Barrett stated in his talk
that while he served in Vietnam, he could not get an American
flag.

Source stated the parade was not organized and was a complete flop.

Source further advised that he had observed several individuals participating in this parade who were members of the Ku Klux Klan.

An article appeared in the "Meridian Star"
Newspaper, Meridian, Mississippi, under date of July 31,
1967, entitled "White Militant Group Planned By Jacksonian."
The article stated that "A Jackson man who has sponsored conservative rallies and at least one parade says he plans to organize a new militantly segregationist group called 'America's Victory Force.'" The article pointed out that Richard Barrett, age 24, the moving force behind another group called "The American Victory Committee", and two youths laid a wreath on the steps of the State Capitol in memory of Senator Theodore G. Bilbo, the segregationist Mississippi Governor and Senator. The

article also pointed out that Highway Patrolmen told the group they could be arrested if they tried to carry flags or read a "proclamation," which Barrett had prepared.

Barrett said in this article that the group's purpose would be "to promote Christianity and patriotism and to further the unity and coordination of white Americans." He said the "main flavor of our militancy will be in racial segregation -- we will promote, however, that the group's militant acts would be within all laws."

The third confidential source advised on August 8, 1967, that he is acquainted with Richard Barrett and has learned that Barrett is attempting to organize an organization entitled "American Victory Committee" and "The American Victory Force" and set himself up as the head of both of these organizations. Source stated that he does not believe Barrett will get a foothold in his attempts to organize this organization, inasmuch as the general consensus of the people he comes in contact with is that he is a "nut."

Records on file at MPRC, St. Louis, Missouri, reveal that Richard Anthony Barrett, Army Serial Number RA 12701033, served in the United States Army from June 4, 1964, to May 27, 1966, receiving honorable release from active duty as Specialist 4, at Oakland, California, and transferred to United States Army Reserve to complete military obligation. Terminal date of military obligation shown as May 3, 1970.

Barrett currently is a member of Standby Reserve, United States Army Reserve Control Group, MPRC, St. Louis, Missouri. He had foreign service in Vietnam and received Vietnam Service Medal, purple heart with oak leaf cluster and combat infantry badge. No record of disciplinary action or treatment for mental or nervous disorder contained in his file.

An article appearing in the "Clarion-Ledger", a Jackson daily newspaper, under date of February 12, 1967, indicates that Barrett graduated from Rutgers University, New Brunswick, New Jersey, in 1964. He later returned his degree to the university because he said they had Communist Party leaders there. He said the institution also sanctioned the sending of blood, money, and supplies by certain groups to the Communists in North Vietnam. Barrett's statement to the Associated Press at that time was 'We can't battle Communism abroad and tolerate it here at home."

Investigation at Rutgers University, Newark,
New Jersey, indicates that Barrett attended this university
from September 15, 1960, to June 3, 1964. He received
an AB Degree in Social Sciences. The record indicates that
in 1965 or 1966 Barrett returned his diploma to Rutgers
University in protest of statements made by Rutgers Professor
made statements protesting

United States intervention in Vietnam. Barrett claimed that he was wounded two or three times in Vietnam.

All sources (except any listed below) whose identities are concealed in referenced communication have furnished reliable information in the past.

UNITED KLANS OF AMERICA, INC., KNIGHTS OF THE KU KLUX KLAN (UKA)

Records of Superior Court of Fulton County, Georgia reflect that this Klan organization was granted a corporate charter on February 21, 1961, at Atlanta, Georgia, under the name United Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of America, Inc.

A source advised on February 27, 1961, that United Klans was formed as a result of a split in the U. S. Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, Inc. According to the source, the split resulted from a leadership dispute and United Klans has the same aims and objectives as the parent group. These are the promotion of Americanism, white supremacy, and segregation of the races.

The first source and a second source advised in July, 1961, that United Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of America, Inc., merged with Alabama Knights, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan. The merged organization established headquarters in Suite 401, Alston Building, Tuscaloosa, Alabama. (The organization is directed by ROBERT SHELTON, Imperial Wizard, and is the dominant Klan group in the South, with Units in several Southern states.)

Second source advised that at a meeting in Prattville, Alabama, on October 22, 1961, the U. S. Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, merged with the United Klans of America, Inc., Knights of the Ku Klux Klan.

Third source advised on May 25, 1966, that the UKA is currently an active organization, with Klaverns in several states. This source said that ROBERT M. SHELTON is the Imperial Wizard of this organization and was elected to this position on September 5, 1964, at a National Klonvocation in Birmingham, Alabama. Source stated that during April, 1966, the National office was moved from Suite 401, Alston Building Tuscaloosa, Alabama, to the carport of SHELTON's residence, #18 Lake Sherwood, Star Route, Northport, Alabama, which space he had converted into a room.

A review of Bufiles pertaining to Barrett fails to indicate that Barrett is of national prominence or of national interest at this time. While his potential for violence is realized through the very fact of his participation in and leading of demonstrations against segregation, nevertheless, there is insufficient information available at this time indicating that violence has occurred through his actions.

You should conduct an investigation of Barrett as well as the "Americans Victory Force." Be guided by Section 122 of the Manual of Instructions concerning these investigations.

If Barrett and his group are not part of the Klan, the reports submitted should be captioned "Racial Matters (Organization)."



He is organizing "American Victory Force" which will be a militantly segregationist group whose purpose will be to promote Christianity and patriotism and to further the unity and coordination of white Americans. He said the "main flavor of our militancy will be in racial segregation - we will promote, however, that the group's militant acts would be within all`laws."

During a Poor Peoples March to the State Capitol, Jackson, Mississippi, on August 14, 1967, sponsored by the NAACP, BARRETT carried a sign "Fight Poverty, Go to Work". He went into the crowd of Negroes, the sign was torn up, and the police arrested BARRETT and charged him with disturbing the peace.

Pierce (NA), Jackson Police Department, Jackson, Mississippi, on October 24, 1967, advised that Richard Barrett had contacted him advising that he, Barrett, would hold a demonstration at the State Capitol in Jackson, Mississippi, beginning at 3:45 p.m., on October 24, 1967. Barrett stated that he was going to drag the United Nations flag around the Capitol and then burn it.

Chief Pierce stated that the City of Jackson has no authority to arrest Richard Barrett based on the burning of the United Nations flag inasmuch as it is not a recognized sovereign nation.

Richard Barrett, with arrived at the State Capitol grounds at 4:00 p.m. on October 24, 1967, Both individuals, dragging a United Nations flag, walked on the sidewalk around the State Capitol. Barrett and then stepped on the United Nations flag and a Viet Cong flag, thereafter squirting lighter fluid on the two flags and setting them afire. As they walked around the State Capitol, they carried two signs entitled, "Victory in Vietnam" and "U. S. Over U. N."

At the conclusion of the flag burning, Barrett made the statement that "We have a future in the United States; the United Nations does not". He also stated, "Get the United Nations out of the United States and we will have victory in Vietnam".

Richard Barrett, when interviewed by Special Agents of the FBI during March of 1967, advised he is a "racist" and he frequently gives talks on segregation. He believes in segregation and feels that segregation should some day be the law of the land. It is his objective to organize an organization with this purpose in mind. Barrett has organized the "American Victory Committee", with himself up as National Chairman, and has organized several parades with the general theme of "Back The Boys in Vietnam". He is attempting to organize the "American Victory Force", which will be a militantly segregationist group whose purpose will be to promote Christianity and patriotism and to further the unity and coordination of Barrett stated, "The main flavor of our white Americans. militancy will be in national segregation -- we will promote, however, that the group's militant acts would be within all laws".

Barrett has been known to associate with known members of the Ku Klux Klan in Mississippi; however, no information has been developed indicating that he is, in fact, a member of any Klan group.

Barrett is a white male, age 24, and served in the United States Army from June 4, 1964 through May 25, 1966, receiving an honorable release from active duty. He had foreign service in Vietnam and received the Vietnam service medal, purple heart with oak leafecluster, and the combat infantry badge.

The Bureau is in possession of much material forwarded by various offices concerning captioned individual who is a "racist." He has made many attempts to form organizations, the main purpose of which is to fight integration and communism, such as the "American Victory Committee," "American Victory Force," and parades with the general theme of "Back the Boys in Vietnam." His organizations have the militantly segregated flavor with the theme of Christianity and patriotism to further coordinate white Americans. recommended for the Rabble Rouser Index.

BARRETT was definitely set straight as to our policy in conducting such investigations that I was certain the SAC of our Columbia, S.C., Office had made no such statement; that if he had such affidavits in his possession they were probably falsified and that we would conduct an investigation concerning anyone when they fell within our jurisdiction to do so.

Upon the conclusion of the foregoing conversation, BARRETT said, "Well, I will have to write that letter to JOHN EDGAR HOOVER complaining about the harassment of the Jackson Office of the FBI." BARRETT was informed that he should feel free to write any letter that he cared to but that he should be very careful that he put in only true facts and not make false accusations concerning anyone.

This office has been making inquiries concerning BARRETT and as to whether he falls within the criteria for the Rabble Rouser Index (see Jackson airtel 8/17/67 captioned "Rabble Rouser Index (Subversive Control)"). He is an unethical racist who will attach himself to any group for publicity purposes.

The purpose of this letter is to alert the Bureau that a complaint concerning the Jackson Office may be forthcoming from BARRETT and to advise that no investigation has been conducted except that necessary and within our rules and regulations.

Special Agent in Charge, Jackson Dīvision, advised that Richard Anthony Barrett, a notorious racist, called the Jackson Office and inquired of the Special Agent in Charge if he would issue a public statement of apology for having conducted an investigation concerning Barrett's background indicating he had information and signed affidavits in his possession from individuals in South Carolina who had been contacted and that the head of the South Carolina Office of the FBI has issued such a statement.

Barrett was set straight by Special Agent in Charge Roy K. Moore and was told that he was certain the Agent in Charge of our South Carolina Office had made no such statement and that the FBI would conduct investigations concerning anyone when it was within the Bureau's jurisdiction to do so

Barrett then told Special Agent in Charge Moore that he would have to write a letter to Director Hoover complaining of the harassment of the Jackson Office of the FBI. Barrett was told that he should be careful in relating only true facts and not to make false accusations concerning anyone.

The Jackson Office has informed us that a complaint concerning the Jackson Division may be forthcoming from Barrett.

Richard Anthony Barrett is a white male, born JAN 12 1968 February 18, 1943, in New York City and is National Chairman for the "American Victory Committee" which is militartly segregationist group whose alleged purpose is to promote Christianity and patriotism. He was arrested in August of 1967 by the Jackson, Mississippi, Police Department for disturbing the peace in connection with a demonstration during a Poor People's March to the State Capitol in Jackson, Mississippi.

A Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation observed Richard Anthony Barrett place a wreath and small placard beside the entrance to the Washington Monument, Washington, D. C. at 2:30 PM on March 9, 1968. He was also observed to pin a Purple Heart medal on the placard, which read as follows:

"Tribute to our brave soldiers-May Washington's will to win be reborn for victory in Vietnam."

The wreath and placard were removed by Barrett within ten minutes. No speech or announcement was made by Barrett, who departed the area shortly thereafter.

Barrett, interviewed under suitable pretext, identified himself as the speaker for America's Victory Force, from Jackson, Mississippi. He advised that he is twenty five years of age, and is a twice-wounded veteran of Vietnam. He stated that his purpose for laying a wreath, placard and Purple Heart medal at the Washington Monument, was to "call on Americans to appreciate the sufferings of our soldiers in Vietnam and to support our boys by calling for prompt victory in Vietnam. So that our sons have not sacrificed in vain."

Barrett related that his future plans for a speaking tour are not formulated or definite at this time; however, he stated that he planned to apply by letter to the local police authorities in Washington, D. C. for a permit to allow him to demonstrate at the Washington Monument on April 22, 1968.

During this investigation, information was developed that RICHARD ANTHONY BARRETT would be leaving Jackson, Miss., on an eleven-state speaking tour under the sponsorship of the American Victory Force, which he, BARRETT, has set himself up as national chairman.

The Bureau, by referenced communication, requested Jackson to attempt to obtain BARRETT's itinerary and identify any group sponsoring this tour.

Investigation has disclosed that BARRETT is a "loner" and individuals interviewed stated that BARRETT has not actually planned his tour; in fact, he will go to a place and if he finds a group which is receptive to him, he will "bilk" this group for everything he can and then move on to another location.

Jackson, Miss., who is on the Board of Directors of the American Victory Force, has advised that even BARRETT did not tell him where he would be going on this speaking tour and has no idea as to how to get in touch with or communicate with BARRETT.

RICHARD ANTHONY BARRETT is on the rabble rouser index of the Jackson Office.

The Bureau also requested, in referenced communication, that if information was developed regarding BARRETT's itinerary, offices covering that particular location should be advised in order that local, as well as pertinent Federal agencies, could be advised of BARRETT's activities.

Inasmuch as information was developed that BARRETT is allegedly going to speak in Alabama, Georgia, North and South Garolina, Virginia, New Jersey, as well as New York, copies of this communication are being sent to those offices who are requested to contact sources and in the event information is received that BARRETT will be







He stated that in conversations with BARRETT, he has the opinion that he is a "kook", meaning that BARRETT does not actually know what he is working for or what he actually stands for. stated BARRETT's main concern is getting publicity for himself. stated he knewthat BARRETT was allegedly going on an eleven-state speaking tour; however, he does not know the states involved or the groups which will sponsor BARRETT's speeches. stated that in his opinion, even BARRETT does not know from one day to the other where he will be speaking next. It is opinion that BARRETT





Richard Barrett was interviewed by Special Agents of the FBI on March 13, 1967, at which time he advised he is a "racist" and he gives talks frequently concerning segregation and talks concerning Vietnam. He said he believes in segregation and feels that segregation should some day be the law of the land. It is his objective to organize an organization with this objective in mind. He related he is a Vietnam veteran and is firmly convinced that

the United States should be involved in the Viet Cong war, but it should win the war and not sacrifice American lives for political reasons.

Barrett continued that he is not a member of the Ku Klux Klan (KKK) or any other organization and would not identify any of his associates nor state whether he was or was not acquainted with any members of the KKK. Barrett refused to discuss in detail any of his activities inasmuch as he felt the FBI was becoming a national police agency similar to the gestapo.

Records on file at the Military Personnel Records Center, St. Louis, Missouri, reveal Richard Anthony Barrett, Army Serial Number, RA12701033, served in the U. S. Army from June 4, 1964, to May 27, 1966, receiving an honorable release from active duty as Specialist 4, at Oakland California, and transferred to U. S. Army Reserve to complete military obligation. Terminal date of military obligation is shown as May 3, 1970. Records indicate that Barrett is currently a member of the Standby Reserve, U. S. Army Reserve control group. He had foreign service in Vietnam and received Vietnam service medal, purple heart with oak leaf cluster and combat infantry badge. No record of disciplinary action, treatment for mental or nervous disorder is contained in his file. These records indicated that Barrett was born February 18, 1943, at New York, New York.

An article appearing in the <u>Clarion-Ledger</u>, a Jackson, Mississippi, daily newspaper, under date of February 12, 1967, indicates that Barrett graduated from Rutgers University, New Brunswick, New Jersey, in 1964. He later returned his degree to the university because he said they had Communist party leaders teaching there. He said the institution also sanctioned the sending of blood, money, and supplies by certain groups to the Communists in North Vietnam. Barrett's statement to the Associated Press was, "We can't battle Communists abroad and tolerate them here at home."

Richard Barrett has organized, and held, several parades and memorial services sponsored by the American Victory Force, of which Barrett has set himself up as chairman. The main theme of the American Victory Force is "Back the Boys in Vietnam", and Win the War in Vietnam."

Barrett has stated that the "American Victory Force" will be a militantly segregationist group whose purpose will be to promote Christianity and patriotism and to further the unity and coordination of white Americans. He stated, "The main flavor of our militancy will be in racial segregation -- we will promote, however, that the groups' militant acts would be within all laws."

No information has been developed that Richard Barrett is a member of the KKK; however, he associates with individuals who have been identified by informants of the Jackson Division as being members of the KKK.

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Purpose is to inform you of allegations of harassment by FBI Agents made by the subject in testimony before an Executive Session of the Senate Internal Security Subcommittee (SISS) on March 26, 1968, and to recommend that a representative of Crime Records Division contact that Committee and furnish them with the true 171 HORSE SHOE facts regarding our interest in the subject.

discharged Vietnam war veteran. Upon his return to the United States, he formed and now leads a small group known as the American Victory Force which he describes as a militant segregationist group, whose purpose is to promote Christianity and patriotism; to back America's Vietnam effort; and to further the "unity and coordination of white America." He has in the past associated with known members of the Ku Klux Klan in Mississippi, but no information has been developed indicating that he has ever joined a klan group.

In August, 1967, he was arrested by the Jackson, Mississippi, Police Department and charged with disturbing the peace while counterdemonstrating a "poor people's march to the State Capitol in Jackson. On October 24, 1967, he burned a United Nations flag on the grounds of the State Capitol in Jackson. In view of his activities and extremist statements, he was placed on the Agitator Index and an investigation initiated to determine whether he or his group are a danger

to the internal security of this country. He is extremely anti-Bureau and has refused to be interviewed by Bureau Agents in the past. In view of statements made by him, he was considered a suspect in the bombing of the Soviet Embassy in Washington, D. C. in February, 1968. Investigation eliminated him as a suspect.

On March 26, 1968, he requested and was granted permission to testify before the SISS. He testified about the "communist threat to the United States;" the need to strengthen the internal security of the United States; communist participation in riot activities; and the need for riot control legislation. He also alleged that he and his neighbors have been questioned and harassed by FBI Agents due to his activities. He then called for legislation "guarding against a national police force." It is noted that in January, 1968, he wrote a letter to the Director alleging the same type harassment and the Director noted "ignore" on this communication.

RECOMMENDATION:

That a representative of Crime Records Division be authorized to contact the SISS and advise them of the subject's background, activities, and our investigative interest in the subject and the fact that our Agents have never engaged in harassing tactics in this or any other investigation.

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

ADMINISTRATIVE:

RICHARD ANTHONY BARRETT is on the Agitators Index of the Jackson office.

BARRETT was considered a suspect in the bombing of the Soviet Embassy, Washington, D. C., on February 21, 1968. Investigation determined he was in Jackson, Miss., during the pertinent periods, which eliminated him as a suspect.

BARRETT's whereabouts was ascertained during the pertinent period in the case of the assassination of Rev. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., on April 4, 1968.

An organizational report concerning the American Victory Committee and/or the American Victory Force, which are synonymous, is not being prepared at this time by the Jackson office, inasmuch as the organization does not have a membership and to date is not incorporated in the State of Mississippi. Reliable sources state that BARRETT would like very much to have a large organization; however, he "can't seem to get it off the ground."

This matter will be followed closely by the Jackson office and in the event the organization begins to grow, an organizational report will be submitted under proper title.

Information copies of this report are being sent to offices listed, as BARRETT has been in the territories covered by those offices or has indicated plans to make speeches or attempt to organize a chapter of the American Victory Committee in those areas.





The file contained another article dated May 23, 1967, by Associated Press, paper not indicated. This article refers to a march staged by BARRETT in Jackson. BARRETT stated he owned a Jackson Sign Company and had been wounded twice with the Army in Viet Nam. He said he was a graduate of Rutgers State University of New Jersey but had turned in his diploma when the school refused to fire a professor who criticized U.S. involvement in Viet Nam. Attendance at his rallies were all white persons.

The file reflected BARRETT has a large savings account with Surety Savings and Loan Association, Burbank, California. He states he owns the Dixie Design Company, 413 Tombigbee, Jackson. He has a satisfactory credit rating in Jackson. The file contained no additional information.



G. Photographs

Photographs have been made and are maintained in the files of the Jackson office.

H. Make and Model of Automobile

On January 24, 1968, Deputy Sheriff, Hinds County, Mississippi, advised that his records indicate that RICHARD BARRETT is in possession of a 1962 Pontiac Tempest, which contains 1968 Mississippi license HB 2052. The automobile contains vehicle identification number 162P78329.

T. Special Abilities, Including Knowledge of Weapons, Explosives, Radios, and Electronics

No information has been developed indicating that subject possesses any special abilities regarding weapons, explosives, radios, or electronics; however, based upon his military service it is assumed that he has knowledge of weapons.

J. Close Associates, Both Business and Social

Investigation has failed to indicate that subject possesses any close associates, business or social. Information is set out elsewhere in this report indicating his contacts with other individuals.

K. Results of Interviews of Subject

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RICHARD BARRETT, 161 Carter Avenue, Jackson, Mississippi, was interviewed at his residence. Prior to commencing the interview, BARRETT was exhibited a Waiver of Rights form which he stated he understood, but did not affix his signature. This form was exhibited to BARRETT by SA

BARRETT was advised of the nature of the investigation after which time he stated that he knew nothing concerning any bombing and that he had never had any possession of any explosives and did not believe in violence.

BARRETT said that he is a "racist" and that he gives talks frequently concerning segregation and talks concerning Viet Nam. He said he believes in segregation and feels that segregation should someday be the law of the land and it is his objective to organize an organization with this object in mind.

BARRETT related he is a Viet Nam veteran and that he is firmly convinced that the United States should be involved in the Viet Cong war but it should win the war and not sacrifice American lives for political reasons.

BARRETT stated that he is not a member of the Klan or any other organization and did not identify any of his associates and would not state whether he was or was not acquainted with any of the members of the Klan, including

BARRETT refused to discuss in detail any of his activities, as he felt the FBI was becoming a National Police Agency similar to the Gestapo. He indicated he felt the Agents were attempting to intimidate him and resented the fact they felt it was necessary to interview him concerning his activities and whereabouts. He also stated that he feels that the FBI questioning

him concerning some of his speaking appearances is infringing upon his freedom of speech and could possibly, at one time, get him involved in a conspiracy by misinterpreting his objectives.

BARRETT refused to furnish any background information concerning himself and stated that he did not know exactly where he was on the night of March 6-7, 1967. He said he has an office at 413 Tombigbee Street where he is engaged in advertising and design work under the name Dixie Design Company, P. O. Box 3372, Jackson, Mississippi. BARRETT said that he is always home before midnight and this can be verified by his landlady

BARRETT advised that he has heard of the Greenfields Protective Association but has never attended any
of their meetings. He said that he was not advised in
advance of any of these meetings and he does not have any
interest in local things. BARRETT stated he was acquainted
with Secretary of the Citizens Council,
who he understood was engaged in the activities of the
Greenfields Protective Association.

BARRETT said he wanted to make Jackson, Mississippi his home and came to Jackson as a result of having met many different individuals throughout the world from Mississippi. BARRETT denied owning or possessing any firearms, but stated he was thinking of obtaining some in the near future. He also stated that he does not believe in any acts of violence and should he have any information concerning such, he would not contact the FBI, and if he felt it should be reported to a police agency, he would advise the local police.

Administrative Assistant, Mississippi Highway Safety Patrol, Jackson, Mississippi, on July 30, 1967, advised that RECHARD BARRETT, along with five other individuals, arrived at the State Capitol grounds at approximately 2:15 PM on July 30. 1967, and requested permission to place a wreath at the foot of the statue of THEODORE BILBO. BARRETT was advised that the Capitol was closed on Sunday, at which time the group placed the wreath on the steps leading to the Capitol. BARRETT then requested permission to read a proclamation,



A characterization of the American Nazi Party is set forth in the appendix of this report.



JN T-5 advised on August 8, 1967, that he is acquainted with RICHARD BARRETT and in recent contact with him determined that BARRETT is attempting to organize an organization entitled "American Victory Committee," with address of 171 Horseshoe Circle, Post Office Box 3372, Jackson, Mississippi. Source stated that BARRETT has set himself up as national chairman of this committee. Source stated he does not believe that BARRETT will get a foothold in his attempts to organize this organization, inasmuch as the general concensus of the people he comes in contact with is that he is a "nut."

An article appearing in the Meridian Star, July 31, 1967, Meridian, Mississippi, indicates that BARRETT plans to organize a new, militantly segregationist group called "America's Victory Force." BARRETT said the group's purpose would be "to promote Christianity and patriotism and to further the unity and cooperation of white Americans." He said the "main flavor of our militancy will be in racial segregation -- we will promote, however, that the group's militant acts would be within all laws."

JN T-5 on August 2, 1967, advised that he has learned that BARRETT is attempting to get a new organization formed; however, he does not believe BARRETT will have any success, inasmuch as BARRETT cannot get along with anyone around him.

Jackson Police Department; advised on August 14, 1967, that during a poor peoples march to the State Capitol, Jackson, on August 14, 1967, RICHARD ANTHONY BARRETT approached the marchers alone, carrying a sign which read, "Fight Poverty -- Work." This sign was taken from BARRETT by unidentified Negroes and torn to pieces, after which BARRETT was immediately arrested by officers of the Jackson Police Department on a charge of



disturbing the peace. BARRETT was removed from the scene without further incident.

JN T-6 advised on August 14, 1967, that RICHARD BARRETT of Jackson, Mississippi, held a "Victory in Vietnam" parade in Natchez, Mississippi, on the night of August 12, 1967. There were approximately 25 automobiles in the parade, two people in each car, making a total of approximately 50 people in the parade.


Source advised that this parade was not organized and it was considered to be a complete "flop." Source stated that he had observed several individuals participating in the parade whom he knows to be members of the Ku Klux Klan.

Chief of Detectives (NA), Jackson Police Department, Jackson, Mississippi, on October 24, 1967, advised that RICHARD BARRETT had contacted him, advising him that he (BARRETT) would hold a demonstration at the State Capitol in Jackson, Mississippi, beginning at 3:45 PM on October 24, 1967. BARRETT stated that he was going to drag the United Nations flag around the Capitol and then burn it. Chief PIERCE stated that the City of Jackson has no authority to arrest BARRETT based on the burning of the United Nations flag, inasmuch as it is not a recognized sovereign nation.



Both individuals, dragging a United Nations flag, walked on the sidewalk around the State Capitol. BARRETT and then stepped on the United Nations flag and a Viet Cong flag, thereafter squirting lighter fluid on the two flags and setting them afire. As they walked around the Capitol they carried two signs entitled "Victory in Vietnam" and "U. S. over U. N."

Prior to the time for the rally, FBI Agent who resides in Crystal Springs, Mississippi, was in the business section of the town, when he was approached by RICHARD BARRETT, who introduced himself. Upon learning the name of the Agent, BARRETT said he had heard of him and that he did not want to talk to anyone who stood for what the Agent stands for.

JN T-10 advised that BARRETT's talk at the rally had to do with his service in Vietnam, integration in the Armed Forces, the murder of a white soldier because he did not want to sleep with a Negro, and the necessity of doing something to keep Negroes from taking over in the United States. BARRETT said that President JOHNSON, HUBERT HUMPHREY, MARTIN LUTHER KING, and the FBI are all in the same category and that he has no respect for any of them.

The above source stated that who is an officer of the WKKKKOM and spoke at some length, devoted much of his time to criticism of the FBI. He said the FBI has deteriorated and that he has no respect for the organization. He said that if the FBI does not like a person, that person may find dynamite planted in his house and that if the FBI cannot win a conviction in a case, they will buy a conviction. He also said the FBI is now harassing widows.

JN T-2 advised on October 23, 1967, that BARRETT is considered a "nut" and one who is not trusted by any Klan organization.

JN T-11 advised on January 2, 1968, that RICHARD ANTHONY BARRETT had presented a petition to the Mississippi Secretary of State on the morning of that date. He said

the petition was signed by twelve individuals from Holmes County Mississippi, and requested that Representative Elect. Negro, State Representative Elect. Holmes County, Mississippi, not be seated in the House of Representatives. The petition challenged election to this position. Source advised that the Secretary of State advised BARRETT that this petition would not be accepted or acted upon, as seating in the Legislature can only be challenged by a member of the Legislature. The Secretary of State advised BARRETT that neither he nor the individuals who signed his petition were members of the Legislature.

JN T-2 advised on December 27, 1967, that subject attends meetings of the Americans for the Preservation of the White Race (APWR), which are held in and around the Jackson, Mississippi, area.

A characterization of the Americans for the Preservation of the White Race is set forth in the appendix of this report.

JN T-8 advised on January 4, 1968, that BARRETT attends meetings of the APWR in Jackson, Mississippi; however, he is not liked by the members and they will not let him join.

JN T-2 advised on February 7, 1968, that it had been voted at the APWR meeting on February 6, 1968, to expel RICHARD BARRETT from future APWR meetings, inasmuch as he could no longer be trusted. The source stated that it is felt that he is cooperating with the FBI. In addition BARRETT at each meeting makes a nuisance of himself and cannot keep his mouth shut.

JN T-12 advised on February 7, 1968, that BARRETT was heard to comment over the weekend that he had recently returned from Mobile, Alabama, where he had spent a week



working for the National Organization for the Victory in Vietnam Committee, of which he is chairman. BARRETT also commented that he is an active campaign worker for GEORGE WALLACE for President; however, he does not get paid, nor has he had any instruction concerning his role.

JN T-2 advised on February 27, 1968, that BARRETT has been busy preparing for an eleven-state speaking tour. BARRETT stated that he plans to leave Jackson on March 3, 1968, on his speaking tour and will be going to Washington, D. C., at the conclusion of the tour. BARRETT did not indicate what states were involved in the speaking tour.

He was promptly advised that he did not have to make a statement, that any statement he did make could be used against him in a court of law, and that he had the right to talk to an attorney or anyone else before saying anything at all. He advised orally as follows:

He is a member of the Board of Governors for the American Victory Force (AVF). He is unaware of the activities of RICHARD FARRETT, who is President or Commander of this organization, nor is he fully aware of the aims and purposes of the organization except that all the members are dedicated to fighting Communism, preserving the white race, and striving against mongrelization of the races.

He recalls being at the residence of RICHARD A. BARRETT, 171 Horseshoe Circle at 7:30 P.M. on February 14, 1968. He had been called by BARRETT and asked to appear at that time for a meeting of the Board of Governors. He continued that only he and BARRETT attended and that the conversation dealt mainly with the fact PARRETT was having considerable difficulty preparing important organizational papers.

On February 21, 1968, he was to again appear at the weekly meeting of the AVF, however, was unable to do so and instead called BARRETT at his residence and excused himself from attending.

He has no information nor can he speculate on what BARRETT might have done between February 14, and February 21, 1968. He believes it is entirely possible

A Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation observed RICHARD ANTHONY BARRETT place a wreath and small placard beside the entrance to the Washington Monument, Washington, D. C., at 2:30 PM on March 9, 1968. He also was observed to pin a Purple-Heart medal on the placard, which read as follows:

"Tribute to our brave soldiers-May Washington's will to win be reborn for victory in Vietnam."

The wreath and placard were removed by BARRETT within ten minutes. No speech or announcement was made by BARRETT, who departed the area shortly thereafter.

BARRETT, interviewed under suitable pretext, identified himself as the speaker for America's Victory Force, from Jackson, Mississippi. He advised that he is twenty-five years of age and is a twice-wounded veteran of Vietnam. He stated that his purpose for laying a wreath, placard, and Purple-Heart medal at the Washington Monument was to "call on Americans to appreciate the sufferings of our soldiers in Vietnam and to support our boys by calling for prompt victory in Vietnam. So that our sons have not sacrificed in yain."

BARRETT related that his future plans for a speaking tour are not formulated or definite at this time; however, he stated that he planned to apply by letter to the local police authorities in Washington, D. C., for a permit to allow him to demonstrate at the Washington Monument on April 22, 1968.

BARRETT indicated that he had previously been interviewed in New York City by on "The Big Lie" program. He stated that within the next week or ten days he planned to be in New York City for a second interview on "The Big Lie" program.

JN T-5 advised on July 24, 1967, that he is acquainted with BARRETT and stated that BARRETT is not a member of any Klan group and, in his opinion, will never be accepted into the Klan, inasmuch as the Klansmen consider BARRETT to be a "complete nut" who cannot be trusted. Source stated that those individuals having come into contact with BARRETT describe him as an individual who cannot keep his mouth shut and that they will not trust him with any information.

The above source advised on January 15, 1968, that to his knowledge BARRETT is still not accepted by the Klan, and he does not feel that BARRETT will ever become a member of the Klan in Mississippi.

III. INFORMATION REGARDING SUBJECT'S PROPENSITY FOR VIOLENCE AND ACTIVITY IN RACIAL SITUATIONS:

Detailed information regarding subject's activity in racial situations is set out elsewhere in this report. Subject has demonstrated by his actions a propensity for creating disorder of a racial nature.

In his book, This Time The World, copyrighted in 1961, George Lincoln Rockwell identified himself as Commander, American Nazi Party of the World Union of Free Enterprise National Socialists (ANP - WUFENS), Arlington, Virginia.

The April 4, 1963, issue of The Richmond News Leader, a Richmond, Virginia, daily newspaper, reported that George Lincoln Rockwell had on the previous day again applied for the American Nazi Party to be chartered in the State of Virginia, but this request was turned down by the Virginia State Corporation Commission. This action was taken pursuant to an act of the 1962 Virginia Assembly which prohibits use of "Nazi" or "National Socialism" in a Virginia charter. This article further pointed out that Rockwell's Party is presently chartered in the State of Virginia as the George Lincoln Rockwell Party.

On August 14, 1964, a source advised that the ANP - WUFENS was organized by George Lincoln Rockwell at his residence in Arlington, Virginia, on February 26, 1959, as an international "National Socialist" movement based on the German Nazi Party headed by Adlof Hitler. He added that Rockwell is the dominant force and personality in this party; that he is espousing a "line" of hatred against the Jews and Negroes; and that he is seeking, through speeches, distribution of literature and picketing, to establish a cohesive and dominant political party in the United States and in foreign countries.

According to the "Stormtrooper's Manual," an official publication of the ANP, the phases of ANP struggle for power are fourfold, namely, first "to make ourselves known to the masses"; second, "the dissemination of our program and truth about the Party"; third, "organizing the people who have been converted to our propaganda"; and fourth, "the attainment of power through the votes of the newly won masses."

On September 16, 1965, the source advised that George Lincoln Rockwell believes he has completed the first three phases in his struggle for power and is now into the fourth stage, to wit, the "attainment of power through the votes of the newly won masses." The source stated Rockwell believes this because of his success in gaining a place on the ticket in the November, 1965, gubernatorial election in the State of Virginia.

APPENDIX

AMERICANS FOR THE PRESERVATION OF THE WHITE RACE (APWR)

The records of the Secretary of State, State of Mississippi, Jackson, Mississippi, reflect that the Americans be for the Preservation of the White Race was granted a charter of incorporation on June 25, 1963, at Jackson, Mississippi. According to the charter of incorporation, this organization was formed for bettering the conditions and improving the welfare of the white race and to insure peaceful coexistence between the races of the South, maintaining law and order at all times and to provide for the general welfare of the physical, mental and moral condition of mankind, and to promote the cultural, social, literary, and mental welfare of its members.

A source advised on August 25, 1967, that the APWR is not dominated, controlled, or directed by any Klan organization and does not advocate or engage in violence. Many of the members of the APWR belong to the various Ku Klux Klan organizations; however, only one of the national officers of the APWR is known to be a member of any Ku Klux Klan organization. No Ku Klux Klan organizational funds are designated or used by the APWR.

This source advised that the APWR is primarily concerned with providing separate educational facilities for the white children of Mississippi and is engaged in various money-raising projects for this purpose, as well as actively attempting to nominate and support candidates for state offices who are sympathetic to their cause. This source also noted that members of the Ku Klux Klan support the APWR by engaging in the money-raising activities.

Natchez, Mississippi, continues as national president for the APWR.

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Records of the Secretary of State, State of Louisiana, Baton Rouge, Louisiana, reflect that a Louisiana corporate charter was issued to the Original Ku Klux Klan of America, Inc., on January 26, 1965, at Monroe, Louisiana.

A source advised on May 16, 1965, that at a Province meeting in Winnsboro, Louisiana, of the Original Knights of the Ku Klux Klan (OKKKK) held in December, 1964, there was a considerable dissension among the members and as a result, a split in the OKKKK occurred.

led the split and formed the Original Ku Klux Klan of America, Inc., according to the source.

A second source advised on October 1, 1965, that formed the Original Ku formed the Original Ku Alux Kian of America, Inc. The merged organization established headquarters in Suite 401, Alston Building, Tuscaloosa, Alabama. (The organization is directed by ROBERT SHELTON, Imperial Wizard, and is the dominant Klan group in the South, with Units in several Southern states.)

Second source advised that at a meeting in Prattville, Alabama, on October 22, 1961, the U. S. Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, merged with the United Klans of America, Inc., Knights of the Ku Klux Klan.

Third source advised on May 25, 1966, that the UKA is currently an active organization, with Klaverns in several states. This source said that ROBERT M. He believes in segregation and feels that segregation should some day be the law of the land and it is his objective to organize an organization with this object in mind. BARRETT is known to associate with members of the Klan in Mississippi.

BARRETT has organized the "American Victory Committee" setting himself up as National Chairman and has organized several parades with general theme of "Back the Boys in Vietnam". He is organizing "American Victory Force" which will be a militantly segregationist group whose purpose will be to promote Christianity and patriotism and to further the unity and coordination of white Americans. 

An article appearing in the January 3, 1970, issue of the "Daily Press", a Utica, New York, daily newspaper, entitled, "Let People Run Schools, Barrett Says", reads as follows:

"Richard Barrett, a former Utican who now is an active conservative in Mississippi, said here last night he thinks state funds ought to be withheld from schools ordered to integrate by the U. S. Supreme Court.

"Barrett is first officer in America's Victory Force, a Vietnam War veterans organization. He is in Utica, visiting his parents, Mr. and Mrs. A.J. Barrett of 2839 Oneida St., until Tuesday.

"If the Mississippi State Legislature fails to support what Barrett calls 'federalized' schools, this Would release more funds for private schools, which are springing up all over the state, he said.

"Thirty-three Mississippi school districts were ordered to begin desegregating Jan. 5 in a U.S. Supreme Court decision last October.

"Barrett called the court-ordered desegregation 'shameful and tragic' because he said, 'this is an erosion of the constitutional rights of the people to control themselves'.

"Barrett, at 26 the owner of an advertising firm in Jackson, Miss., said that 'local control is an issue the north and south hold in common. If the government federalizes schools, let the government pay for them'.

"Barrett made a name for himself in the conservative protest business three years ago when he returned his diploma to Rutgers University to protest 'against' the Communist professors there. 'I'm quite proud of that,' he said. He is a 1964 graduate of Rutgers.

"Barrett will speak at 7 p.m. tomorrow at the People's Christian Church in Cedarville."

On January 6, 1970, a confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that the captioned individual who is understood to have arrived in Utica, New York, from Mississippi on December 31, 1969, to visit his parents, was leaving Utica, New York, on January 6, 1970, to return to Mississippi. According to this source, Barrett's parents enjoy a good reputation in the community and that while Barrett was in the area, he reportedly spoke at some church with the exact topic being unknown to the source, but with the tenor of the speech being entirely peaceful in nature.

The 1969, Utica, New York, City Directory, lists ANTHONY, J. (ELEANOR L.) BARRETT, a salesman for the Peter A. Karl, Inc., as residents of 2839 Oneida Street, Utica, New York.

The above city directory also lists PETER A. KARL as General Agent for the Northwestern Mutual Life Insurance.

II. EMPLOYMENT:

BARRETT does not have full-time employment but claims to be employed as a sign painter and designer. Investigation has failed to disclose anyone doing business with the subject.

III. AUTOMOBILES:

BARRETT owns the following vehicle:

1964 Ford, bearing 1970 Mississippi license 25B-10248, Vehicle Identification Number 6R09G108629.

IV. MEMBERSHIP IN ORGANIZATIONS:

BARRETT was interviewed in 1967, at which time he claimed he was a "racist," and he gives talks frequently concerning Vietnam. He states that the United States should not be involved in the Viet Cong war and should win the war and not sacrifice American lives for political reasons.

V. SUMMARY OF INFORMATION:

Inspector United States Park Police, Washington, D. C., advised on April 17, 1968, that BARRETT, who was identified as speaker of the American Victory Force, Jackson, Mississippi, was issued a permit to hold a prayer meeting and to lay a wreath on the Washington Monument grounds on April 22, 1968, in support of the war in Vietnam.

RICHARD BARRETT has organized "The American Victory Committee," setting himself up as national chairman, and has organized several parades with the general theme of "Back the boys in Vietnam." He has organized the "American Victory Force," which will be a militantly segregationist group whose purpose

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will be to promote Christianity and patriotism and to further the unity and coordination of white Americans. He said the "main flavor of our militancy will be in racial segregation -- we will promote, however, that the groups militant acts would be within all laws."

BARRETT lists the organizational structure that the purpose of the foundation is to award scholarships to students who have achieved excellence in curriculum and/or athletic endeavors, including students and orphans of Vietnam veterans.

The method of obtaining funds for this organization, according to BARRETT, will be direct mail, advertising in newspapers, and having radio programs and television programs.

Investigation has shown that BARRETT continues to travel throughout the state of Mississippi attempting to speak before the high schools and in churches, expressing the theme, "Back the boys in Vietnam," and under the auspices of the American Victory Committee.

IV. MEMBERSHIP IN ORGANIZATIONS:

BARRETT during interview of 1967, claimed he was a "racist" and gave talks frequently concerning Vietnam. He stated that the United States should not be involved in the Vietnam war and should win the war and should not sacrifice American lives for political reasons.

V. SUMMARY OF INFORMATION:

On August 6, 1970, Major EUGENE B. BEALL, United States Marine Corps Reserve Center, Jefferson Street, Jackson, Mississippi, advised that BARRETT identified himself to him as the Chairman of the American Victory Force at Jackson, Mississippi. BARRETT requested literature from the Marine Corps; however, the officer on duty refused to give the literature to him at which time BARRETT directed a letter to the Secretary of Navy, setting forth the fact that he had been refused literature.

RICHARD BARRETT has organized "The American Victory Committee," setting himself up as national chairman, and has organized several parades with the general theme of "Back the boys in Vietnam." He has organized the "American Victory Force," which will be a militantly segregationist group whose purpose will be to promote Christianity and patriotism and to further the unity and coordination of white Americans. He said the "main flavor of our militancy will be in racial segregation -- we will promote, however, that the group's militant acts would be within all laws."

Major BEALL stated that he later met with BARRETT and in his opinion BARRETT was "A guy with a gift of gab".

On October 7, 1970, City Editor, Clarion-Ledger, a Jackson daily newspaper, advised that RICHARD ANTHONY BARRETT, who is National Chairman of American Victory Force, announced that recently he met with the Veterans of Foreign Wars Commanders in Washington, D. C., and that BARRETT was representing his fellow-Mississippi Vietnam War Veterans.

On February 15, 1971, JN T-1 advised that RICHARD BARRETT had been regularly contacting individuals desiring to know what is going on in the Americans for the Preservation of the White Race (APWR) organization in Jackson, Mississippi.

The Americans for the Preservation of the White Race (APWR) was founded by white segregationists in Mississippi in 1963 and continued to advocate segregation of the races and white supremacy until 1970 when it became inactive. Former members of the various Ku Klux Klan organizations used the APWR as a front organization in promoting private schools throughout Mississippi.

On March 17, 1971 Director, Governor's Highway Safety Program, Jackson, Mississippi, advised that BARRETT had advised him that he had been traveling over the State of Mississippi making speeches with the theme "Backing the boys in Vietnam". BARRETT was identified as Chairman of the American Victory Force at Jackson, Mississippi.

An article appearing in the June 2, 1971, issue of the <u>Jackson Daily News</u>, a local daily newspaper entitled "Richard Barrett Candidate for Post in House" reads as follows:

"Richard Barrett of Jackson has formally announced his candidacy for the House of Representatives, Hinds County, Post 4.

"Barrett is president of Barrett & Company, a Jackson advertising and publishing firm. He is a veteran of the Vietnam War and was wounded twice in the army-infantry. 10

"Barrett, who received his BA degree in government in 1964 and has continued his studies at the Jackson School of Law, said he has drafted legislation for use by the U. S. Senate Judiciary Committee, for use by the U. S. Senate Judiciary Committee, chaired by Sen. James O. Eastland and proposed legislation before the U. S. Senate Internal Security Subcommittee to curb campus revolutionaries, which led to the Anti-Riot Law prohibiting interstate travel for the purpose of inciting riots.

"Barrett also stated he has met with representatives of the Vietnamese and Allied Governments seeking release of American POW's and also has supported legal action before the U.S. Supreme Court to preserve local control of local institutions.

"Barrett has coached Little League baseball and received an America's Foundation award for service to youth. He was awarded by the Sertoma Club, a local and national civic club, at its international convention for his contributions to American liberty. Barrett is a member of the Jackson Touchdown Club, the VFW and the First Baptist Church.

"Barrett stated, "I am humbly grateful for the encouragement and confidence given to me by so many friends from throughout Hinds County. I wish to continue to merit your confidence through dedicated and conscientious efforts in your behalf. My procession as a publisher has trained me to express the ideas of people, together with my training in the law. It is my sincere desire to have the privilege of serving you, the citizen, by expressing your will in the clearest, most effective manner. I pledge honesty, integrity and hard work to maintain your trust and the dignity of the high office of your Representative. My motto is: "The Open Door, Open Ears and the Helping Hand" in your behalf.

"My deepest concern is for the people of Hinds County and in the progress of our great State of Mississippi.

"My primary interest is in the over-burdened taxpayer, who deserves dedicated efforts and nononsense legislation to make his living better and his dollar go farther. My goal is to cut wasteful state spending and to reduce the state income tax by bringing dollars into Hinds County through new industrial growth, sound business planning, and development of markets for Mississippimade products.

"The public and private school systems both have my support. I have worked with school people and share the common concern with all parents that the welfare of our children should be uppermost. All areas of tax benefits to parents of school children should be increased through sound legislation.

"I say frankly that drug-pushing in Mississippi must be stopped now. Our law enforcement officers and firemen deserve the highest priority of support.

"I am particularly concerned with veterans' affairs and wish to see increased efforts to make existing benefits fully known and available to those eligible, with stress upon upgrading job rehabilitation programs," he said."

Investigation has shown that BARRETT continues to travel throughout the State of Mississippi attempting to speak before the high schools and churches expressing the theme "Back the boys in Vietnam", under the auspices of the American Victory Committee.

A review of the central files of the FBI reveals the following information which may relate to the subject of your <u>name check</u> request.

Richard Anthony Barrett, born February 18, 1943, at New York, New York, was the subject of a security investigation by this Bureau from 1966 to 1972 relating to racial/extremist matters. You are referred to reports dated April 17, 1968; May 1, 1970; and March 16, 1972, each at Jackson, Mississippi, which were previously furnished to your agency. 167-7486-20,27,29

In February, 1985, during the course of another investigation, a review of the records of the Jackson Police Department (JPD), Intelligence Division (ID), Jackson, Mississippi, revealed that Richard Barrett, according to a report prepared in February, 1978, was allegedly the head of the Anti Jew States Rights Party headquartered in Marietta, Georgia. Barrett was described as an attorney whose office was located in Suite 506, Barnett Building, Jackson, Mississippi, and whose home address was 154 South Sunset Terrace (city and state not shown). In addition, information was received by the JPDID that Barrett and another individual allegedly had a residence or a warehouse in Rankin County, Mississippi, which was stocked with Nazi paraphernalia, and where they indoctrinated people into Ku Klux Klan activities. This information was never confirmed by the

Furthermore, a March, 1978, JPDID report on the National States Rights Party (NSRP) contained information indicating "Unconfirmed sources state that Richard Barrett, a lawyer in Jackson, Mississippi, is head of the NSRP in this area." The NSRP was described in the report as an anti negro organization headed by and headquartered in Marietta, Georgia.

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In January, 1987, the FBI received a complaint from Richard Anthony Barrett of Jackson, Mississippi, who advised that he had received telephonic death threats as a result of his participation in a rally at Cummings, Georgia. Attached is a memorandum dated February 24, 1987, at Jackson, Mississippi, regarding this matter which was closed by the U.S. Department of Justice, Civil Rights Division, on August 19, 1987.

In December, 1988, during the course of another investigation, information was received that the "CBS Evening News" aired a story on December 20, 1988, regarding Skinheads assembling on Whidby Island, Peugeot Sound, Washington, to attend a memorial honoring a former member. During the broadcast, the reporter interviewed an individual identified by CBS News as Richard Barrett, "white supremacist." Barrett advised CBS News that he was providing firearm instructions for Skinheads in Mississippi. In addition, information was received that in the past, an individual identified as Richard Barrett, lawyer, of Learned, Mississippi, and Jackson. Mississippi, had attempted to arrange a meeting with (PROTECT IDENTITY), Vice Mayor, Yonkers, New York, in connection with a long standing dispute regarding a Federal court order to the City of Yonkers to |received a letter from build low income housing. Barrett which stated in part, "Freedom is not free; the price is high. I hope you will continue to pay it - as we will - until the tyranny of unelected Federal judges is defeated - so that the rights of the majority will prevail in a democracy of the American people." also received an unsolicited application for membership in the American Pistol and Rifle Association, Box USA, Benton, Tennessee. 100-487961-6X:

In an effort to further identify the aforementioned Richard Barrett who claimed to have provided firearms training to Skinheads, and to determine if he was identical to the individual who attempted to establish contact with the Vice Mayor of Yonkers, New York, the following information was developed in addition to that which has previously been set forth in this memorandum.

A check with the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms (BATF), Jackson, Mississippi, revealed BATF had received

information from their office in Arkansas that an individual identified as Richard Barrett had been in contact with members of the "Covenant, the Sword, the Arm of the Lord." No further information was known.

An inquiry with the JPDID revealed that Richard Barrett was a known segregationist in the Jackson, Mississippi, area. JPDID characterized Barrett as mainly an instigator and not someone known to be violent in nature. According to the JPDID, Barrett would train individuals, conduct marches and make speeches, but he was not one to commit violent acts.

On December 3, 1988, and December 4, 1988, two articles, copies of which are attached, appeared in the "Clarion-Ledger," a Jackson, Mississippi, newspaper, advising of Richard Barrett training Skinheads on firearms in Learned, Mississippi.

In January, 1990, during the course of another investigation, an individual who had provided unreliable information in the past advised he attended a meeting with other white supremacists on January 10, 1990, in Birmingham, Alabama, where one of the topics was recent letter bombings. According to this individual Richard Barrett of Jackson, Mississippi;

were in attendance at the meeting, the location of which was unknown. You are advised that during a subsequent interview, the aforementioned individual denied attending any meeting on January 10, 1990, in Birmingham, Alabama, with Barrett,

On January 3, 1990, Richard Barrett, Attorney, Jackson, Mississippi, was contacted by the FBI regarding his knowledge of recent bombings and attempted bombings in Alabama, Georgia and Florida. Barrett declined to be interviewed by the FBI regarding this matter.

Information gleaned from the records of the JPDID was obtained during the course of a preliminary inquiry (PI) on Barrett captioned "Richard Anthony Barrett; The PI was initiated in September, 1984, to further identify Barrett and to determine any <u>security risk or asset potential as</u> a result of his contact with (S) Barrett was subsequently identified and the matter regarding Barrett was closed in February, 1985. Information regarding Barrett providing firearms training to Skinheads, as reported on a "CBS Evening News" broadcast, and Barrett's attempt to contact the Vice Mayor of Yonkers, New York, was disclosed during the course of a PI captioned "Unsubs, aka Skinheads; Domestic Security/Terrorism (DS/T)"(100-487961). The PI was initiated by the New York Field Office in August, 1988, to determine the scope and nature of Skinhead activity within the New York division. This matter was closed in October, 1989. b7C

Information regarding Barrett's alleged attendance at a meeting on January 10, 1990, in Birmingham, Alabama, with and the Bureau's attempt to interview Barrett on January 3, 1990, regarding his knowledge of recent bombings and attempted bombings in Alabama, Georgia and Florida, was disclosed during the course of "VANPAC; Major Case 29; AFO-CAFM, a pending investigation. The release of this information was coordinated with SSA Violent Crimes Unit, Violent Crime and Major Offenders Section, Criminal Investigative Division (CID). (U)

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Pa. station to film skinheads in Learned

A crew will film the youths training today near Richard Barrett's home.

A Pennsylvania public broadcasting station plans to film a segment featuring military training by skinheads and other neo-Nazi youth this weekend in Learned.

Officials at Philadelphia station WHYY-TV confirmed they plan to visit Mississippi to shoot a possible spring segment on military training and indoctrination of the skinheads and others.

The skinheads is a right-wing group, composed primarily of youths who shave their heads and don steel-toed boots as a sign of commitment to their cause. Sociologists say they are the fastest growing segment of the racist right.

Self-proclaimed segregationist Richard Barrett said the training session adjacent to his home today and Sunday is in preparation for national demonstrations planned next month in protest of the Jan. 16 holiday honoring slain civil rights leader the Rev. Martin Luther King Jr.

"We're having a training session and target practice," Barrett said.

Today's military training and firing and weapons will show support of the right to bear arms, he said. "The movement will declare that the Second Amendment cannot be weakened." The practice also will help protesters defend themselves if necessary, he said.

After weapons practice Sunday afternoon, a cookout and bonfire is planned.

"We also will be having a perspective on Mississippi Burning," a newly released film that focuses on the 1964 deaths of three civil rights workers in Philadelphia, Barrett said.

"Our position is that it is slander on Mississippi and that we are a God-fearing, hard-working patriotic people that is a model for the nation, not a whipping key for the nation."

The theme for protest of the King holiday is "Liberty, Democracy and Majority," Barrett said.

"We will do for the majority in the '90s what others did for minorities in the '60s. They're going to have the past. We're going to have the future."

The group plans to joi- others in the Nationalist Movement in Raleigh, N.C., Jan. 14 for a "No King Over Us" rally at the Capitol to protest the holiday, Barrett said, A similar national demonstration will take place Jan. 21 in Atlanta.

A protest also will be held Jan. 16 at the Capitol in Jackson, Barrett said.

Three Atlanta youths and three state men joined white supremacist Richard Barrett at a camp on Mississippi 18.

LEARNED — Three militant Atlanta skinheads came here Saturday to help white supremacist Richard Barrett train anybody who's "red, white and blue" how to shoot a gun.

Barrett, who called this weekend The Warrior Weekend, said the paramilitary training is open to all Americans "red, white and blue," "not black or yellow."

Barrett and the youths plan to march in Atlanta next month to protest the holiday celebrating the birthday of the Rev. Martin Luther King Jr., the slain civil rights leader.

Besides Barrett and the youths, three local men attended the training session Saturday. Title: "SKINHEADS TRAIN IN STATE FOR KING DAY PROTEST"

This morning, Barrett and the skinheads, dressed in camouflaged pants and combat boots, plan to continue training with pistols and rifles and to share information about preserving the white race.

Barrett said it's important to arm oneself "from outside elements that want to eat away at America."

When asked who they believed was hurting America, the skinheads — Shay Cannon, 16, Robert Vasura, 17, and Spencer Anderson, 18 — said Communists, "queers" and foreigners.

"I hope to probably better myself and get in some target practice," Anderson said of his trip to Mississippi.

The three Atlanta youths belong to the Old Glory Skinhead movement, an ultra-right wing organization.

Barrett, a New York native who has lived in Jackson for many years, is the attorney and one of the organizers of The Nationalist Movement, which aims to advance and preserve the white race.

On Saturday afternoon, Barrett and the skinheads shot small-caliber pistols and a rifle with a scope in a

dried up creek behind a camp on Mississippi 18. Barrett, a Jackson attorney, owns the camp.

The youths and Barrett spread out white supremact signs and three American flags around their target area which was in a grove of oak and hickory trees.

Some of the placards said: "Our red, white and blue whips your black, black and black," "Abolish King Day," and "Down with Black Power."

One of the targets set up by the skinheads was a white placard bearing the letters "MLK," widely recognized as the initials of Martin Luther King.

The youths joked that they were spelling "milk" and left out the letter "i."

After Barrett saw the target with "MLK," he placed it upside down in the brush without explanation.

Vasura, a native of England who has lived in the United States for four years, said he is a skinhead because he is proud of his white heritage.

A cook, Vasura said, "I would like Europe to be totally white as Africa would like to be totally black."

Based upon these groups propensity for criminal activity and the fact that previous protests, organized by BARRETT, have resulted in violent civil disturbances, Jackson initiated this PI.

On 12/20/2002, RICHARD BARRETT, along with seven unknown individuals, staged a silent rally/protest in downtown

Jackson to condemn Senator Trent Lott for apologizing for remarks made during a birthday celebration for Senator Strom Thurmond. Demonstrators situated themselves at a busy downtown intersection and held signs with phrases such as "Strom was right", "Down with the black caucus", "No affirmative action", "Trent is a traitor", and "Trent is toast".

Members of Jackson Division's JTTF, along with members of the Jackson Police Department and Mississippi State Capital Police, monitored this hour long event and noted no disturbances or counter demonstration.

For information, BARRETT, a former Mississippi qubernatorial and congressional candidate, is a local attorney and author best known for defending white supremacist and segregationist organizations. He is the founder of a white supremacist/ultra-nationalist group called the Nationalist Movement. His website, nationalist.org, has already taken credit for Lott's resignation as majority leader.

Details: On 01/20/2003, Richard Barrett, white supremacist who heads the Nationalist Movement based in Jackson, Mississippi spoke in front of the York City Hall from 9:00 AM until approximately 3:00 PM. Barretts reason for coming to York, Pennsylvania was to commemorate the loss of a white York police officer, Henry Schaad, during race riots in York in 1969. Barretts speech and visit were made on the Martin Luther King holiday to "dishonor" King. Activities also included a short parade which consisted of several white supremacists walking around a one square block area. The event was attended by six supporters/members of the Nationalist Movement. racist activist. Spectators and counter-protesters totaled approximately 50 individuals. Newspaper reports estimated about twenty members of the crowd appeared to be ARA members.

Synopsis: To document contact with captioned subject and close case.

Details: On 03/06/2003, Writer, along with SSA contacted BARRETT at one of his residences, 154 South Sunset Terrace, Jackson, Mississippi, in an attempt to establish a dialogue with respect to several recent white supremacist rallies he has orchestrated. BARRETT initially refused to speak with agents; however, he ultimately spoke with agents for approximately 15 minutes concerning his views on free speech issues as well as his right leaning interpretations of the U.S. Constitution.

Prior to departing, BARRETT asked if agents could help facilitate the issuance of a travel visa he had recently applied for to allow him passage to Iraq. When asked what business he had in Iraq, BARRETT guardedly advised that he felt the American people were not being adequately represented by the present administration.

The next day, 03/07/2003, BARRETT made reference to agents' visit (by name) on the front page of his www.nationalist.org web site with a hyperlink captioned "Feds Target Mission to Iraq". This hyperlink opened an article titled Feds Try to Stymie Iraq Mission, Barrett Persists in Humanitarian Journey, in which BARRETT, mingled among other propagandistic statements, advises that the Bush Administration instructed the FBI to contact BARRETT with regard to his application for an Iraqi visa.

Details: During the course of June 2003, officials in York, Pennsylvania were preparing for a July 4, 2003 demonstration by Richard Barrett, of the Nationalist Movement. Barretts stated reason for returning to York after having come to York on 01/20/2003 was to dispute a local ordinance that required the posting of a fee for speakers to obtain a permit to speak in the city. Planing for the event included the Pennsylvania State Police and the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

On July 1, 2003, York officials were notified by Barrett that he was not coming to York on July 4, 2003. No explanation was provided to York officials regarding this action.
