Portals manufactures molded watermarks which are an integral part of the fibrous structure of the paper, unlike a "dandy" watermark which is pressed into the surface of the sheet. Portals also manufactures paper enhanced with security threads which are incorporated into the paper at the time it is produced. Security threads include continuous or patterned, metalized, colored, fluorescent, morse coded or micro-printed legends. Portals also provides additional security features such as silk fibers, planchettes and chemical sensitizing agents which reveal attempts at chemical eradication or alteration.

A type 30 Merigraph system has been acquired and is located in room 3252. This is a system for the manufacture of flexographic printing plates and rubber stamps (now generally termed handstamps). This system uses a liquid photopolymer resin which hardens when exposed to ultraviolet light. Any image that can be photographed can be used to produce a plate or handstamp including half-tones up to a screen size of 133. A handstamp can be manufactured, by the Type 30 system in less than one hour exclusive of preparing the negative, eliminating the use of a heated press, matrix, unvulcanized rubber, etc. SAs [redacted] should be contacted if further information is desired concerning that system.



Result of examination:

The handbills, specimens Q1 through Q4, were printed by means of the offset printing process. This is one of the three principal printing processes, of which letterpress and intaglio are the other two.

Certain characteristics present on specimens Q1 through Q4 suggest that these handbills may have been printed on a small offset press such as a Multilith model 1250 or a similar press. Sample sheets of "Pic-N-Stik" sent to the Director by the Ekco Trading and Sales Company, Box 4, Port Jervis, New York, were received in the Laboratory on 1/7/64. They are described as intended for lifting visible copies of newspaper articles without damaging the printed article. Tests have been made in the Laboratory with the following results:

- A. The sample sheets were found to provide an effective means of obtaining readable copies of newspaper articles provided that the "Pic-N-Stik" sheet is applied to the article to be copied and pressed with firm finger pressure.
- B. Vigorous rubbing with fingernails results in transferring the latex adhesive layer from the transparent plastic sheet to the printed page and failure of process.
- C. Excessive pressure causes some fiber tears in the newspaper.
- D. Inadequate finger pressure results in an incomplete copy.

The samples furnished failed to produce satisfactory copies from magazine pages and from other types of printing including offset printing.

Representative copies obtained by various methods are attached for information.

RECOMMENDATION: That this memorandum and the representative copies attached be retained in the Printing Standards File for future reference.

Schools Here Draft A 'Saturation' Plan For Negro Areas

By FRED M. HECHINGER

Dr. Calvin E. Gross, Superintendent of the city's schools, is evolving plans for a "saturation program" to overcome educational deficiencies in areas of slums and racial imbalance.

The program has been the subject of a series of unpublicized high-level staff meetings since Dr. Gross' appointment to his post almost a year ago. It will incorporate the nation's most successful educational experiments, including the use of team-teaching, team mothers and small-group instruction.

Those who have been discussing the program are fully aware that it may be attacked by some civil rights groups as an attempt to create a Northern version of the "separate but equal" doctrine.

Dr. Gross, however, insists that a saturation approach would offer superior schooling to children in the city's white slums and would be the

PIC-N-STIK EFFECTIVE TIME SAVER

(Editor's note: From time to time, we have passed on information on commercial products which may be of interest to the cemetery industry. The fact that a product or service is mentioned in these issues does not constitute endorsement of that product. We merely make mention of a new product or service which might assist in the operation of a cemetery.)

Fourth, grasp the ungummed edge of the transfer paper and peel slowly from the newspaper and apply to any surface you desire.

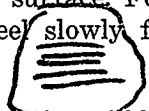

ORTHODOX LEADER HERALDS 'NEW ERA'

Overtures for Conference Begun by Rome, He Says —Greeks Kept Away

Special to The New York Times

ATHENS, Jan. 4—Athenagoras I, Ecumenical Patriarch of the Eastern Orthodox Church, arrived in Rhodes today on his way to meet Pope Paul VI in Jerusalem tomorrow.

The Patriarch, spiritual leader of the Eastern Orthodox Church, declared: "The ice is broken. Soon a new era will begin in the history of Christendom. New shapes and forms will emanate, as well as new methods of Christian Church contributions to world peace."

The Orthodox primate said of his meeting with the Pope: "Our meeting is of great significance. I am engaged in a great endeavor which should not be judged from any one result."

At Rhodes airport he said: "The idea of a meeting originally came from the Pope. All our direct or indirect contacts so far prove that the Pope and the Eastern Church show full understanding."

Greeks Are Kept Away

The tall, black-robed, bearded church leader and his suite of 11 bishops landed from Istanbul at Rhodes Airport in a DC-8 airliner placed at the Patriarch's disposal by Aristotle S. Onassis.

Two invited members of the primate's suite were not there.

The Metropolitan of Salonica and Iannina, Ioannina, had to decline the Patriarch's invitation on the orders of Greece's 43-year-old primate, Archbishop Chrysostomos. The Greek Orthodox Church is autocephalous (with its own head) and has strongly opposed the meetings in Jerusalem.

Athenagoras was spending the night in Rhodes where four

FOR weeks there has been an atmosphere of excitement at the Hay Rubber Stamp Co., 830 13th-st nw.

It is caused by the arrival of cans containing a mysterious substance which looks like tar.

The Hay company is busy using it to make rubber stamps which have a built-in ink supply and don't need to be pressed on an ink pad first.

The substance is called Porelon. It is made under U. S. Patent 2,777,824 by S. C. Johnson & Son (Racine, Wis., makers of Johnson's Wax), which spent five years developing it.

The Hay company is the first in this area to use Porelon, which may create a big name for itself. Johnson's has licensed it to manufacture the stamps here.

SPECIAL LAB

Hay has set up a special lab on its second floor because Porelon must be vulcanized within two degrees temperature. The resulting "Perma Stamp" contains in a small width enough ink for more than 25,000 impressions.

The ink will neither leak nor dry out, the firm said.

During manufacture, the ink is trapped in the tiny interconnected pores of the Porelon, which is described as a micro-porus plastic. After the stamp is pressed down and released, the ink feeds to the surface again thru capillary action, something like a sponge.

In addition to such things as "First Class Mail," "Paid," and "Air Mail," which are the staples of the rubber stamp makers, the Porelon stamp can also reproduce a very faithful photograph for the people who order stamps of their likenesses.

VERSATILE

Porelon, the Johnson company notes, is extremely versatile: It can be molded to almost any shape or size, almost any liquid can be contained in its pores with proper technology, its hardness can be varied, and the release rate of the liquid can be controlled by changing the viscosity.

Thus, it visualizes many uses for Porelon, including all types of automatic marking business machines, which now need ribbons, felt rolls, ink fountains, etc.

- A lipstick made of Porelon would stay the right shape and keep dispensing an even flow of color to the lips.

- The gauze part of a bandage could have a Porelon strip containing an antiseptic to automatically medicate for hours. A hair brush or comb could "brush in" hair oil.

- Other possibilities are self-lubricating bearings, auto windshield wiper blades which exude a grease and dirt-cutting solution.

"Seldom does a single product offer as many areas of possible use in so many varied fields," Johnson's said.

The Hay firm, established in 1918, has for many years had among its many products stamps for the seals of our embassies abroad and foreign embassies here, as well as the signatures of all congressmen.

The checkwriters used in the preparation of Q21 and Q22 are types manufactured by the Paymaster Corporation, Chicago, Illinois.

The typewritten material on Q21 and Q22 is extremely limited, but the typewriting on Q21 somewhat resembles a Remington Elite style of type, spaced twelve letters to the inch. The typewriting on Q22 does not conform to any of the typewriter standards available in the Laboratory for either domestic or foreign typewriters. The numerals on Q22 resemble those used on some models of Royal typewriters as well as on machines of several foreign manufacturers. The typewritten letters, which are entirely upper-case letters, on Q22 do not conform to any standards available in the Laboratory. The questioned typing on Q22 may have been prepared on a machine of foreign manufacture whose standards the Laboratory does not have at this time, or on a machine which has undergone extensive repairs.

It was concluded that the endorsement "James Barasi" on Q21 was written by the person who wrote the endorsements "James Barasi" on two checks previously examined in this case, Q5 and Q7, submitted to the Laboratory by the Newark Office of this Bureau on August 14, 1952, and January 22, 1953.

It was concluded that the signature of the maker "J. E. Sedell" on Q22 was written by the person who wrote the signatures of the maker "J. E. Sedell" on two checks previously examined in this case, Q19 and Q20, submitted to the Laboratory by the Newark Office of this Bureau January 13, 1954.

The endorsement "Leon Goodwin" on Q22 contains some handwriting characteristics in common with the endorsements "Leon Goodman" on Q19 and Q20. However, no conclusion could be reached whether these three endorsements were or were not written by one person, because the characteristics present in these endorsements are not adequate to permit a definite conclusion.

The style of printers type used to print the inserted firm name "ABLE SPORTSWEAR, 463 RIVER DRIVE" on Q21 matches a style of type made and sold by Lanston Monotype Machine Company, Philadelphia 3, Pennsylvania, as "20th Century Bold, No. 604," by Baltimore Type, Baltimore 2, Maryland, as "Airport Semi-Bold, No. 302," by Bauer Type Foundry, 235 East 45th Street, New York, New York, as "Futura Demibold," by Intertype Corporation, 360 Furman Street, Brooklyn, New York, as "Futura Demibold," by Mergenthaler Linotype Company, Brooklyn, New York, as "Sparton Heavy" and by American Type Founders, Elizabeth, New Jersey, as "Sparton Heavy." Two sizes of type appear on Q21. These probably are 14 point all caps and 6 point all caps. Specimen Q21 is the first check examined in this case in which this type face appears in the fraudulent printed insert on the check form. The style of type used in printing the fraudulent additions on all

of the other checks in this case is Engravers Bold, made and sold by American Type Founders, Elizabeth, New Jersey, and by Ludlow Typograph Company, Chicago 14, Illinois. It is pointed out that, according to information available in the Laboratory, American Type Founders, Elizabeth, New Jersey, handles the style of printers type used on Q21 as well as the style used on the other checks in this case. Contact with sources of printers type in the area in which the checks are appearing, in order to determine the identity of recent buyers of these styles of type, may be productive. The fact that the only type faces so far used to print the fraudulent inserts on the checks in this case have been the style used on Q21 and the Engravers Bold style used on the other checks tends to indicate that the printers type may have been purchased for this specific purpose by someone who does not have available the facilities of a professional print shop where a variety of type styles would be at hand.

Specimen Q21 is attached for the Chief of Police at Paterson, New Jersey. Specimen Q22 is attached for the Newark Office of this Bureau. Photographs have been retained.

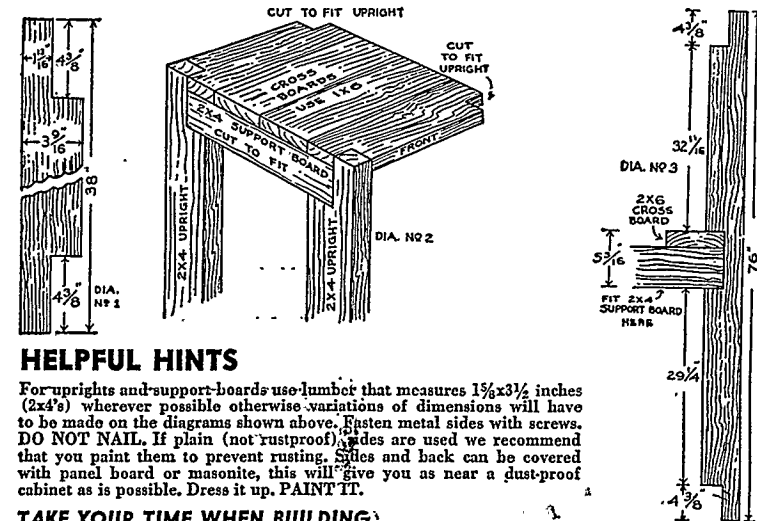
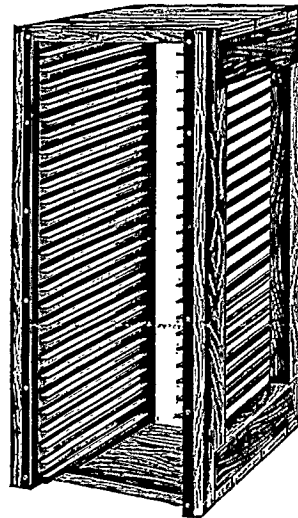
To Make a Frame to Support These ALL METAL SIDES

For a Single Tier Cabinet

Cut 4 2x4's 38 inches long. Notch these at both ends down the center crosswise, the width of a 2x4 plus the thickness of a 1 inch board (about $4\frac{3}{8}$ inches. See diagram No. 1). To these uprights fasten the metal sides using screws. (24 needed for each pair of sides.) 1 in. round head No. 10 wood screws recommended. After metal sides have been securely fastened to these uprights fit a piece of 2x4 across the cut out as described in diagram No. 2. These boards should be nailed to the wood uprights. It is to these boards that the cross pieces can be nailed, on top and bottom to fit the width of galley you want to store.

For Two or More Tier Cabinet

The construction method is the same as outlined above except that you will need only 2 additional uprights instead of 4 for each extra tier, as you can now fasten the metal sides to both sides of the wood uprights.



HELPFUL HINTS

For uprights and support boards use lumber that measures $1\frac{1}{2} \times 3\frac{1}{2}$ inches (2x4's) wherever possible otherwise variations of dimensions will have to be made on the diagrams shown above. Fasten metal sides with screws. **DO NOT NAIL.** If plain (not rustproof) sides are used we recommend that you paint them to prevent rusting. 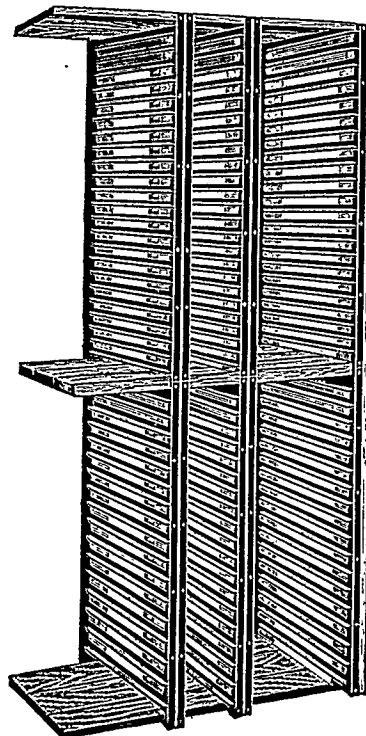

The same plan of construction is followed when building Storage Racks in Decks as is used in making the single height cabinet except that we recommend the use of 2x6's instead of 1x6's for the center cross boards. This gives added strength and will better carry the additional weight required of this type of cabinet.

When building storage racks in decks, I suggest that you follow the dimensions as outlined in Diagram No. 3 for the cutting of uprights. Those dimensions permit the use of 2x6 cross boards, and 2x4 support boards.

The eighth annual Production Yearbook, published by the Colton Press, 468 Fourth Avenue, New York 16, New York, is now available at \$15.00, according to a letter dated March 19, 1948 from Mr. L. H. Joachim of that concern.

The "omnibus" of type faces, which is a part of the Production Yearbook, is valuable in connection with the Rubber Stamp and Printing Reference Collection. There is a copy of the "omnibus" from the seventh annual yearbook now in the Printing Reference Collection. This was furnished to the Bureau free of charge by Mr. Joachim with his letter of April 11, 1947. By referring to the "omnibus" it has been possible to reduce the time required in classifying questioned type faces by as much as 90 per cent.

The "omnibus" issued as part of the eighth annual Production Yearbook will be more up-to-date than the one we now have which was published before the war.

The Cartographic Section of the Bureau is interested in the Production Yearbook for use in layout work, as an art or reproduction reference book, for ideas in connection with the preparation of crime statistics charts and also for decorative themes.

It is proposed that the "omnibus" section will be removed and retained by the Document Section of the Laboratory in its Printing Standards Collection. The remainder of the Yearbook will be retained by the Cartographic Section. This is in accord with oral agreement entered into with that section.

RECOMMENDATIONS: That the attached letter addressed to Mr. Joachim, with a carbon copy designated for the SAC at New York, be dispatched.

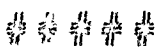

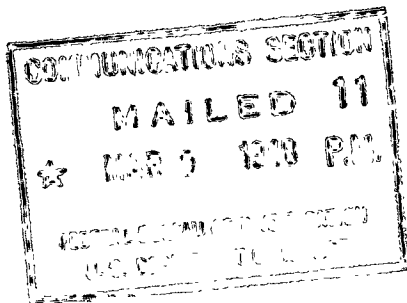

Physical Condition:

File contains catalogs from principal sources of metal and wood type in the United States as well as several copies of the "Omnibus of Type Faces" published by the Colton Press, N. Y. The latter reduces the time required in classification of type faces by approximately 90%.

Instructions in the use of the file are set forth in large letters on a large card placed in the front of the cabinet drawer containing this section of the file.

Justification:

The file is being referred to with what appears to be increasing frequency in both Bureau and police cases.

Cost is negligible. File occupies but one cabinet drawer. Catalogs and "Omnibus" have been acquired without cost other than that of correspondence. Maintenance time: 6 hours per year.

Status:

Up to date

Recommendations:

None, other than the acquisition of additional catalogs as they come to our attention.

RUBBER STAMP SECTION

Physical Condition:

Contains 60 catalogs published by 18 companies manufacturing and/or distributing rubber type and dater stamps. Thomas' Register lists approximately 160 such concerns. The Marking Devices Association informed us in 1937, that there were nine principal manufacturing concerns.

There is also a quantity of actual rubber type and dater stamps which constitute evidence submitted in connection with several kidnaping and extortion cases.

Justification:

Rubber stamp section has not been referred to during the past several years. However, in the Matnap, Lenap and several other important kidnaping cases, notes printed with rubber type were used.

Cost is negligible. This section of the file occupies two file drawers and will be reduced to one if recommendations following are acceptable. Catalogs were obtained free.

Status:

Latest catalogs were obtained in 1945. It is believed that sufficient time has elapsed since that date to warrant our attempting to obtain catalogs printed after 1945.

A great many rubber type faces, including those used in dater stamps, are made from metal type such as that represented in the type faces section. However, it is believed that in the event an extortion letter is found to have been prepared with rubber type, as has happened in several previous important cases referred to above, the latest principal reference material pertaining to rubber stamp manufacturers and distributors (one step nearer the immediate source of questioned impressions than the metal type maker) should be available.

Recommendations:

- (1) That the tangible rubber type and dater stamp material now cluttering the file be replaced as enclosures into the case files in which they were submitted.
- (2) That the Marking Devices Association, ~~431 South Dearborn Street, Chicago, Illinois,~~ (the latest address shown in our files - 1937) be contacted by correspondence for the names of any additional makers of rubber type and dater stamps who may have become principal suppliers since March, 1937 - the date that organization gave an agent of the Chicago office the names of those they identified as the nine principal makers of rubber type at that time.
- (3) That the file be maintained solely as a collection of catalogs from the principal sources of rubber type and dater stamps.



After high school, young Phillips

Book Comment

"Phillips' Old Fashioned Type Book" by Frederick Nelson Phillips (Frederick Nelson Phillips, Inc.) is the first effort ever made to show so many type faces, together with old printers' cuts over a period of five centuries, in one book. STARTED AS HOBBY

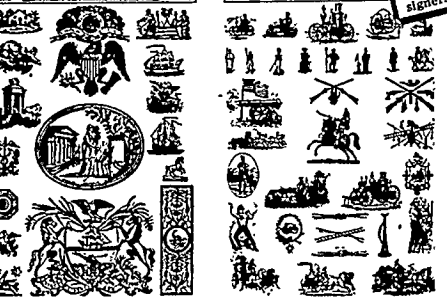

Type Specimens

FREDERIC NELSON PHILLIPS, INC., a printing house which specializes in setting for printers and advertising men small bits of copy in antique and exotic type faces, has issued one of the most curious and most interesting type specimen books ever conceived. The best and the worst that can be said for this remarkable display of nineteenth-century type faces is that it should be placed upon the library shelves alongside Updike's "Printing Types." As nothing else can do so well; the thousands of specimens of types here shown, chiefly of the nineteenth century, explain what Mr. Updike meant when he added as the subtitle of his book the words "A Study in Survival." The book before us, "Phillips' Old-Fashioned Type Book" (Frederic Nelson Phillips, Inc., 305 East forty-fifth Street, New York, 1945, \$5) contains a great number of the type faces which the good taste of man has determined to be unworthy of survival, more specimens of such type faces, indeed, than ever before were

brought together in a single volume.

None of what has just been said is by way of criticism of the entirely laudable and practical intent of the book. Its purpose, in the editor's words, is to give "the preparer of advertisements and other printed pieces a ready reference for as much old material as it has been possible for us to put into it and, perhaps, in addition, offer an inspiration now and then." This has been done in the full realization that "Many of the faces shown are atrocious and will likely never be used." There is a philosophy underlying the wretched effort represented by these "atrocious" and unnecessary types, but they and the parallels to be found in most contemporary art forms will not be understood until some one understands the nineteenth century and writes with comprehension of a period afflicted with growing pains of body, mind and spirit.

The Phillips book comprises 19 pages of historical matter, 83 pages of specimens in possession of the company, 29 pages of speci-

mens available from other sources and 126 pages of border's, type ornaments, head and tail pieces and cuts of every sort and description. The last of these sections is truly rich ground for the printer desirous of giving a slightly archaic flavor to a piece of work. Among the thousands of cuts shown are many of charming design and many more delightfully quaint and well adapted to present-day employment. With the exception of a reprinted essay by Will Ransom, the historical text is composed of excerpts from nineteenth-century writers.

Collectors of works on the history and practice of typography, printers desirous of printing; printers and advertising men gifted with skill in selection will add this book to their shelves with satisfaction.

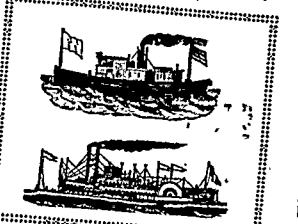
sharp contrast to ever-present war time shortages there has come upon the typographic horizon a veritable bonanza of type faces—old-fashioned type faces packed with potentialities for modern usage. Much dust and printers' bris had to be shaken off the cache where a sizeable collection was found and perhaps the idea will have spread, more dusting ne the idea will take place in many a printery. Of all places to uncover old types, New York City certainly would be least thought of, yet that is the locale of this revival of old-fashioned types. In the collection mentioned above, nearly 1,000 old-fashioned type faces appear. They rear their effulgent and interesting faces, so forcibly upon the eye-starved advertising field as to make the advertising layout artist rub his hands in Midas-like glee in anticipation of printing his advertising verbiage in new typographic dress. These 1,000 faces are a veritable windfall to an industry whose very existence depends largely upon novel layouts of eye-arresting appeal.

THE "ENDLESS QUEST"

The hane of every type house had always been the never-ceasing chase after newer and newer type faces, which, according to the layout men and ladies, would dress up those girrle or bandeaux ads. Whether these "expressive types" (clothed or unclothed) more of the human form or not, the type house had to have them and as a result, even with efficient positioning, the average compositor had to grimly beat his way through myriads fonts, cases, and sorts to set a line or two which would satisfy some layout artist's whim for newer faces.

But at last there came a lull. The foreign type faces no longer were easily obtainable and the local foundries diverted production to essential war materials. Amid the rueful wailing of the layout people over this dearth of new faces, the foremen and mech-

anical superintendents heaved sighs of relief and settled down to the setting of those tired and true Caslons, Bodonis, and Garamonds which had lain dormant these many years or had and so-called modern type designs. But the layout people aren't completely licked yet!

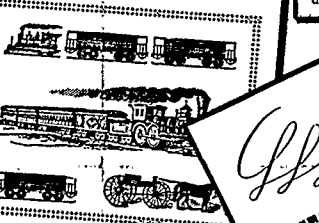

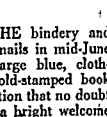

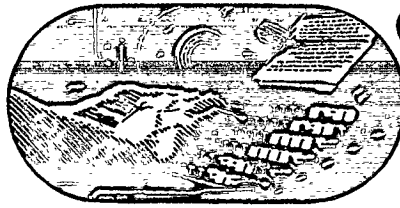
