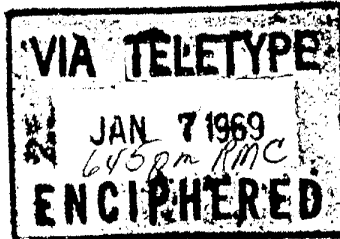

The Nixon Administration has today requested investigation of William Lewis Safire who has been named by the President-elect as a Special Assistant who will be a speech writer. A request has likewise been received for investigation of Safire's [redacted] who apparently will go to the White House with him.

Mr. Jones's memo to Mr. Bishop dated 12/31/68 (tickler attached) indicates Safire, President of his own public relations firm in New York, was previously connected with Tex McCrary, Incorporated. He was Vice President of that firm. While with that firm, the organization was involved in several Registration Act investigations involving the Dominican Republic. He was with McCrary from 1949 to 1961 except for two years' military service.

Background data concerning [redacted] indicates that she was also employed by the McCrary firm from 1955 to 1959.

Tex McCrary has been on the Bureau "no contact" list for many years. It is believed, however, that it will be necessary to contact McCrary and other members of his firm concerning both Safire and [redacted] in order to adequately discharge our responsibilities in these cases.

ACTION: The cases have been ordered separately to the field and New York is being instructed to conduct appropriate investigation regarding their McCrary employment even though McCrary is on the "no contact" list.



Nixon Offers Shriver U.N.

Envoy Ponders Bid, Consults With Kennedys

Negro Is Appointed Special Assistant By President-Elect

NEW YORK — President-elect Richard M. Nixon's search for a Democrat to be U.S. representative to the United Nations in his administration has turned to Sargent Shriver, who is considering taking the position, informed sources said today.

Shriver, a brother-in-law of the late President Kennedy and current U.S. ambassador to France, met with Nixon for nearly two hours here Sunday evening and consulted members of the Kennedy family in Washington and elsewhere yesterday.

A source indicated that Shriver was having difficulty making up his mind whether or not to accept Nixon's offer and that he returned to Paris yesterday without having reached a decision on taking the U.N. post.

On his arrival in Paris, Shriver was asked about the U.N. post. He said that any report on what he and Nixon discussed would have to come from Nixon.

Meanwhile, it was learned that Nixon was preparing to announce one or more major staff appointments today. There was no official indication who would be involved. There was some speculation that the president-elect would accept Shriver's acceptance in time to announce it before the day ended.

Negro Joins Staff

Other speculation centered on Daniel P. Moynihan, director of the Harvard-MIT Center for Urban Studies and a former assistant secretary of labor under President Kennedy, as a possible assistant to the president to coordinate urban affairs in the Nixon administration.

Yesterday, Nixon named the first Negro to his White House staff. Robert J. Brown, head of a North Carolina public relations firm and a leader in the civil rights organizations, was named to be a special assistant to the president with "general duties."

The appointment of William Safire, who has headed his own New York public relations firm since 1960, as another special assistant to the president also was announced last night by Ronald L. Ziegler, Nixon's press assistant.

The U.N. representative job in his administration was first offered by Nixon to Vice President Hubert H. Humphrey, a few days after the Nov. 5 election in which Nixon defeated Humphrey, the Democratic candidate.

Among others, Shriver conferred with Sen. Edward M. Kennedy, D-Mass., in Washington yesterday. The senator was flying to Boston this morning and could not be reached for comment.

Other sources reported, however, that Shriver was consulting Sen. Kennedy and other members of the Kennedy family about the possibility of accepting the Nixon job offer.

Shriver flew back to New York later yesterday and on to resume his post in Paris. He delayed the flight to Paris briefly while making telephone calls.

Ziegler said last night that among Brown's first projects will be to follow through on task force reports and explore ways to implement Nixon's "black capitalism" program.

During his election campaign, Nixon called for promoting new enterprises in city ghettos to help "black employes to become employers."

Brown said he would seek new ideas from black and white people alike. He added that on the White House staff he would not be concerned only with "black problems as such" but with "all the problems of the country."

Brown, 33, once served on the High Point, N.C., police department, and also has been a federal narcotics agent and publisher of a Negro newspaper in Durham, N.C. In 1964, the High Point Junior Chamber of Commerce named him "most outstanding young man of the year." The following year he was on the U.S. Junior Chamber of Commerce list of the "most outstanding young men in America."

He served on Nixon's press staff during the election campaign.

Safire, describing himself as "primarily a writer," said one of his jobs will be "to take a great many ideas in a given subject area and work them into a sensible workable program."

Safire, 38, was a special assistant to Nixon during the election campaign. He is the author of three books, the latest of which, "The New Language of Politics," was published this year.

Moynihan has figured also in Cabinet speculation as a possible secretary of housing and urban development.

After a conference with Nixon yesterday, he told reporters, asking whether he was taking a job in the new administration, that both he and the President-elect still had some decisions to make.

There were some indications that he was more likely to get a White House staff job than a cabinet position.

There still was no comment from Nixon or Ziegler about any individuals who might be among members of the Cabinet the President-elect plans to announce in a 10 p.m. nationally televised press conference in Washington tomorrow night.

In what Ziegler later de-

scribed as a "facetious remark," Nixon said last night he would make the planned Cabinet announcement tomorrow night "unless what I think may be the beginnings of the Hong Kong flu catches up with me by that time."

He made the remark during an off-the-cuff speech at a dinner of the national board of the Boys Clubs of America at the Waldorf-Astoria Hotel.

Ziegler said Nixon told him later that "I have been sneezing a little, but I'm okay. I'll be there."

At the dinner, Nixon stressed the great value of private volunteer efforts in such organizations as the Boys Clubs and said that as president, he intends to find a better way for the federal government to work through volunteer organizations.

Sees Anderson, Martin

Meanwhile, the President-elect conferred yesterday with two men figuring in speculation as possible members of his Cabinet—Robert B. Anderson, former secretary of the treasury in the Eisenhower administration, and William McChesney Martin Jr., chairman of the Federal Reserve Board.

Martin took himself out of such speculation immediately after his conference with Nixon. He told newsmen the President-elect had asked him to serve out the remainder of his term as Federal Reserve chairman that expires on Jan. 31, 1970.

While not completely committing himself to stay on till his term ends, Martin said: "I agreed I wanted to do everything possible to help Mr. Nixon in the difficult days which he has ahead of him."

Anderson Mystery

Anderson, who also has served as secretary of the navy and undersecretary of defense and more recently served President Johnson as a special negotiator about Canal Zone problems with Panama, evaded reporters after his visit with Nixon.

Ziegler would not comment about Anderson's visit, telling newsmen only that it was "private."

The mystery surrounding the

visit stimulated speculation that he might be included in the Nixon Cabinet—possibly as secretary of state.

C. Douglas Dillon, who was undersecretary of state in the Eisenhower administration and secretary of the treasury under President Kennedy, had been prominently mentioned as a likely secretary of state in the Nixon cabinet.

But Dillon seemed to take himself out of the running at a Lincoln Center luncheon yesterday when he said he had had no contact with Nixon since his election and there had been no discussion of a job for him in the Nixon administration, either personally or through intermediaries.

New York Mayor John Lindsay, who conferred with Nixon late yesterday, said they discussed problems of New York and cities generally—but no job offer.

Martin Encouraged

Martin said he called on the President-elect at the latter's request to brief him on the domestic fiscal situation and international monetary problems.

The Federal Reserve Board chairman said he believed budget deficits since 1965 had stimulated an inflationary psychology in the country that is still dominant.

But he indicated he was encouraged by a trend now toward a balanced budget. He said he expected an administrative budget deficit for the current fiscal year of \$5 billion or less, which could have amounted to \$25 billion if the 10 percent income tax and expenditures reduction bill had not been passed by Congress earlier this year.

Official estimates now are in terms of the new "unified" budget, including expenditures and receipts of trust funds such as social security. The latest estimates are that the unified budget deficit for the current fiscal year may be about \$3 billion, possibly less.

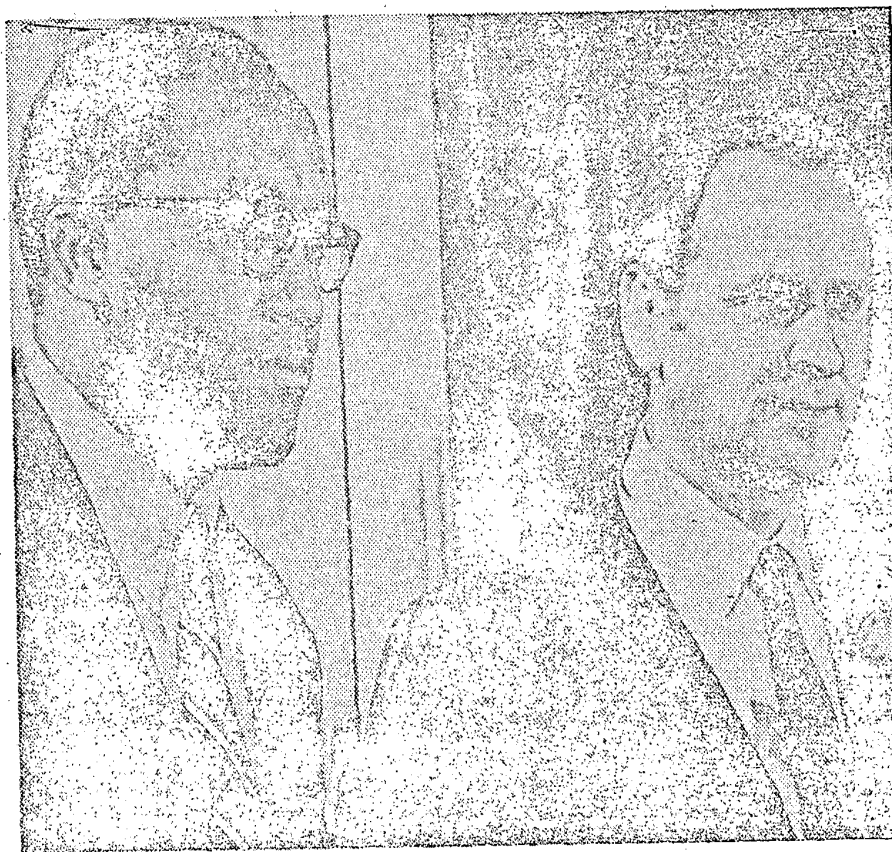
Martin said the only way to bring inflation under control is to restore confidence, that government monetary and fiscal policies will provide the discipline to maintain the purchas-

ing power of the dollar.

President-elect Nixon has named William Safire, aged 38, of New York as a Special Assistant who will be a speech writer and work on "policy and program development." (U. S. News and World Report, 12-23-68)

According to Bureau files, in 1965 William Lewis Safire was president of a public relations organization known as Safire Public Relations, Incorporated, 375 Park Avenue, New York, New York. He was born on December 7, 1929, at New York City. He participated in the 1959 American National Exhibition in Russia as a member of Tex-McCrary, Incorporated, New York City. He was vice president of this public relations firm which was headed by the well-known John Regan ("Tex") McCrary.

While Safire was connected with Tex-McCrary, Incorporated, that organization was involved in several Registration Act investigations involving the Dominican Republic which were conducted by the Bureau. The July 12, 1958, issue of "Editor and Publisher" alleges that Safire, a vice president of McCrary's office, was involved in exposing the use of microphones in a Washington, D. C., hotel by reporter Jack Anderson, [redacted] associate, and others. This was a well-publicized side issue to the appearance of Bernard Goldfine, Boston textile millionaire, before the Special House Subcommittee on Legislative Oversight. According to the above article, Safire's assignment was to track down and catch committee investigators suspected of "bugging" the hotel rooms of Goldfine and those of McCrary's organization. (105-77346-251)

The files of the Identification Division contain no arrest data identifiable with Mr. Safire.

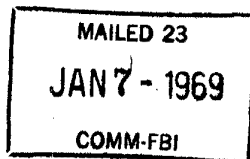

The Book Review Digest for 1964 reveals SAFIRE was co-author of a book entitled "Plunging Into Politics." This book explains how to become or support a candidate on the national, state or local level. It also gives advice on how to build a campaign, staff it with willing hands and finance it with contributions.

II. RESULTS OF INVESTIGATION

Interviews

Jacob K. Javits, United States Senator from New York, advised in Washington, D. C., that he has been personally and professionally acquainted with Mr. Safire since the early 1950s. He said during his 1954 election campaign when he was seeking the position of Attorney General of New York he used the services of Tex McCrary, Incorporated. In connection therewith, Mr. Safire handled the public relations phase of the campaign. Senator Javits said he has

a very high regard for Mr. Safire and he considers him a very intelligent and industrious person. He mentioned he is also acquainted with several of Mr. Safire's close relatives, and he described them as very reputable persons. John Regan (Tex) McCrary, New York City, advised he has been acquainted with Mr. Safire on a close social and professional basis since 1949. He mentioned he initially employed Mr. Safire as a radio and television reporter in his firm, Tex McCrary, Incorporated. He said as a result of Mr. Safire's ability he was promoted to the position of producer and later served as Vice President and a partner in the firm. Mr. McCrary described Mr. Safire as a "remarkable individual" whose character, reputation, loyalty, and associates are above question. He said Mr. Safire is an extremely responsible person who has the ability to work long hours under enormous pressure. He stated Mr. Safire's close relatives are reputable individuals and he knows Mr. Safire enjoys a good family life. Mr. McCrary recommended Mr. Safire without reservation for a position of trust and confidence with the Government.

Safire Public Relations, Incorporated, New York City, advised he has been closely associated with Mr. Safire since 1961. He said he has observed that Mr. Safire possesses outstanding executive and administrative ability and that he has an excellent reputation in the public relations field in the New York area. He stated that since 1961 he has had occasion to work closely with Mr. Safire in conjunction with numerous projects and he noted that at all times Mr. Safire has been diligent in the presentation of his work. He advised he is acquainted with Mr. Safire's

Credit and Arrest Checks

The records of the Registration Section, Department of Justice, Washington, D. C., show the firm of Tex McCrary, Incorporated, New York City, registered with the Department of Justice under the Foreign Agents Registration Act of 1938, as amended, in December, 1958, as an agent of the government of Argentina. This relationship terminated in February, 1959. These records further show that in February, 1959, the aforementioned firm registered as an agent of the government of El Salvador. It ceased operating as an agent of that government in July, 1959. The records also show the aforementioned firm registered with the Department of Justice in October, 1959, as an agent of the Tibetan government-in-exile. This association ceased in November, 1959. Mr. Safire is listed in the records as an official of the firm of Tex McCrary, Incorporated.

The July 12, 1958, issue of "Editor and Publisher," a weekly magazine published in New York City, contains an article concerning the involvement of the public relations firm, Tex McCrary, Incorporated, in behalf of Bernard Goldfine. This article, copy enclosed, mentions Mr. Safire.

Mr. Goldfine, now deceased, was a Boston, Massachusetts, textile manufacturer who in 1961, upon a plea of guilty to income tax evasion, was sentenced to serve a year and a day in custody of the United States Attorney General.

Newsman in PR Melodrama: It's a Gift in Washington

Exit McCrary, Enter Lotto, with Pearson in Wings with a 'Bug'

WASHINGTON The game of investigate the investigators, complete with a "bugged" conference room, screams of horror, a "spontaneous" statement of startled indignation carefully read from a typed paper, pilfered records, — these and many other strange incidents were ingredients of this week's chapter of the Bernard Goldfine-Sherman Adams inquiry.

The Harris Committee investigation of influence in government turned into a multi-ring performance that slipped so far out of control that the probers were forced into an all-day session to pick up the pieces. Washington police and the FBI came into the case. Goldfine was excused from testifying on the appointed day. The Boston millionaire and free-spender pleaded that he was too tired and excited to do so: he had reason to be because he had been up most of the night, expressing his indignation. When last photographed in the early hours of Monday morning he hadn't had time to change from his gold-threaded robe and pajamas into a testifying suit.

Newsman in the Cast

Newsman functioned as "extras" in the production that saw the Capital rivaling Hollywood with all the trappings, the cast, and the scenarios to produce a full season's fare of mystery, intrigue, and comedy. The rapidly shifting panorama picked up a newspaper reporter and a House committee investigator in the act of "bugging" a room occupied by Goldfine's new public relations counsel.

Jack Lotto, former newspaperman employed by Goldfine, succeeded Tex McCrary, New York public relations man who put the show on the road with Goldfine's prepared statement to the committee. Then McCrary retired, explaining he had been performing an act of friendship for Goldfine's attorney, Roger Robb, and was not on the payroll.

The "bugging" incident cost Committee Investigator Baron I. Shacklette his \$16,000-a-year

year job. But the reporter, Jack Anderson, whose room in the Sheraton-Carlton Hotel was being used to eavesdrop on Lotto and his conferees fared better. His employer, Columnist Drew Pearson, pulled the nifty of the week by parroting now-famous lines:

"He has been imprudent. But I need him."

Pearson elaborated in his column: "Anderson was on deck as any good police reporter is at the scene of action. . . . The chief thing Anderson ascertained was that Goldfine's cohorts had done some pretty good sleuthing by getting a copy of the preliminary Harris Subcommittee report on Sherman Adams' wire pulling at the Federal Trade Commission."

The column then went on to relate revelations said to be in the report.

Midnight Call

Lotto began earning his retainer soon after reaching Washington. Sunday night he called newsmen, summoning them for a 12:30 a.m. press conference. Upon arrival they were told by Lotto and Attorney Robb that a former Washington policeman, Lloyd B. Furr, had undertaken to discover whether Lotto's room was "bugged" by hostile interests.

From that point on, the drama unfolded without hitch: Furr solemnly announced that the room was, indeed, "bugged." Then another member of the party noted that the door leading to the next space was raised an inch off the floor, and that a man's shoes could be observed pacing the floor. This was Furr's cue to grab a handy wire coat hanger, sprawl on the floor and begin fishing under the door. With a jerk, he pulled the small microphone into Lotto's room, whereupon Bea Duprey, a model who carries the title of Goldfine's "press receptionist," made her entry, glanced at the microphone, and emitted a dramatic scream.

'Bugging' Mission

The action then moved into the hall with the press relations man banging on his neighbor's door and demanding entrance. With the help of an assistant manager, he gained admission and with the troupe of reporters and camera men taking up the rear he confronted Shacklette and Anderson. Shacklette said his mission was to find who has been tapping the telephones of committee members and had accepted the hospitality of Anderson, registered as "Mr. Brooks." Police eventually arrived, responsive to calls from one of Lotto's entourage. They patiently explained there was no criminal law violation, hence no police action was indicated.

Next Set

The cameras then moved to the next set, which was the corridor in front of Goldfine's door. Goldfine came to the door and, glancing at a piece of paper, proclaimed his indignation, saying: "This is worse than Russia and worse than the Gestapo. I'm shocked beyond words. I intend to move out of the hotel in the morning."

The next installment came when Miss Mildred Paperman, Goldfine's secretary, reported her room had been rifled over the week-end in her absence from Washington and that papers her boss intended to present to the Harris Committee in response to its demand, were missing. An 11:30 a.m. press conference was called to announce this development. Miss Paperman knelt and opened bags and bundles obligingly while camera shutters clicked.

A reporter suggested Goldfine might be happy to get rid of some of the papers and Lotto replied heatedly: "I'm not even going to answer that!"

"Thank you, Mr. Hagerty," the reporter quipped.

The police returned with fingerprint experts and detectives who promptly went into their official routine. Since papers destined to a Congressional committee were said to be involved, the FBI also sent men.

Lotto's 'Credentials'

Jack Lotto, who refers to himself as "a former ace reporter" for INS, thinks he won his job as Bernard Goldfine's publicity agent on the recommendation of

"I guess he knew me mostly from my jobs as an investigative reporter," Lotto, who is 37, reasoned.

Better to acquaint the press with him, Lotto distributed reprints from the Dec. 22, 1956 edition of EDITOR & PUBLISHER in which his exploits, some of them resulting in journalism prizes, were detailed.

One of the incidents in which he expressed pride was participation in "bugging" a room occupied by Richard M. Nixon, then a U. S. Senator. Nixon had brought together for face-to-face confrontation, Whittaker Chambers and Alger Hiss. A hearing aid pressed against the closed door with the instruments volume tuned up, turned that trick, Lotto related.

The activities of Lotto and others in behalf of the Goldfine story prompted the House committee to competitive action. It engaged Raymond William Martin, 25, as an administrative assistant to answer press inquiries. Martin's background consists of studies at the Henry W. Grady School of Journalism and work for small Georgia newspapers and as a staff member in the office of Rep. John J. Flynt of Georgia.

The McCrary Story

John Reagan "Tex" McCrary, chairman of Tex McCrary, Inc., public relations, entered the Goldfine case as "a favor to a friend," he told E&P this week.

After setting strategy he considers successful, Mr. McCrary and Jerry Finkelstein, the PR firm's president, arranged for hiring two men to carry on, and the McCrary organization pulled out to return to the business of handling fee-paying clients. A fee offered by Goldfine's staff was declined.

"I have no regrets," Mr. McCrary said of the episode that put his name on front pages. But he did ask to have emphasized that politics was not involved in his own or firm's entry into the bizarre affairs of the Boston textile man, his gifts to Sherman Adams, assistant to President Eisenhower, and others in politics.

"I am a life-long Republican," he said. "Mr. Finkelstein is a life-long Democrat."

Aims to Tell Whole Truth

"I feel strongly that no American likes a lynching, Mr. Goldfine's or anybody else's. The telling of the whole truth through the press was a restraining influence on a House committee that badly needed public relations counsel and which has finally hired a young man who today has the toughest job in the country."

The last reference was to Raymond William Martin, 25, hired by the Harris Committee.

"You have nothing to fear if you tell the whole truth to the press, because the press is ultimately fair," Mr. McCrary continued. "As professionals, we tried to tell the truth directly to the press, the public, and the committee, and in that order."

Mr. McCrary personally knows Roger Robb, Washington attorney, and member of Mr. Goldfine's legal staff. On June 26, Mr. Robb asked "Tex" for the loan of a man to help him on the case. William Safire, vicepresident of the McCrary office, was sent to Boston to dig up biographical material on Mr. Goldfine. From there he went to Washington to be joined by another staff man, George Britt, formerly of the *New York World-Telegram & Sun*. There, with Mr. McCrary, the strategy was set: (1) to keep the Harris committee off balance by careful timing of releases of filmed statements and testimony to pull the punch out of committee-planned headlines; (2) to stress the immigrant-boy-who-made-good theme by setting up personal interviews between Mr. Goldfine and top newsmen; (3) to track down and catch committee investigators suspected of "bugging" Goldfine and McCrary rooms in hotels.

Counter-Intelligence

On July 2, Mr. Safire and Mr. Britt, with an attorney and news photographer, began the

counter-intelligence drive that involved large crawling, surveying suspected rooms, and standing in hotel corridors. It was the first of several efforts to catch the tappers that finally paid off on Sunday.

On Saturday the McCrary staff men had withdrawn to New York, after arranging for Mr. Robb to engage Jack Lotto, who once had worked for Mr. Finkelstein on the *Civil Service Leader* of New York, and Philip Brennan, an independent Washington PR counsel.

Mr. McCrary, a former newsman and editor, said he liked working with newspaper men. He related how he and Merri-man Smith, United Press International, broke the story on Mr. Goldfine's tax deductible gifts on Wednesday, July 2. Mr. McCrary and Mr. Robb had interviewed Mr. Goldfine. When they came out of his room, Mr. Smith was waiting. From Mr. Robb's notes, Mr. Smith composed a statement while Mr. McCrary typed. As soon as the typing was finished, Mr. Smith took one copy, Mr. McCrary the carbon. At 7:18 P.M. they both reached for telephones. Mr. Smith dictated his copy to UPI, Mr. McCrary to Associated Press.

Mr. McCrary began his career as copy boy for the old *New York World-Telegram*. Prior to World War II he was for six years editorial chief of the *New York Mirror*.

McCrary clients include Continental Baking Co., Cenco Instrument Co., New Haven Railroad, Waterman Pen, Fifth Avenue Coach Co., Continental Industries, U. S. Hoffman Machinery Corp., and the *New York Herald Tribune*. In the past months four new accounts have been added: Food Fair Stores, Hilton Hotels International, Universal Products, and Republic Aviation, Corp.

Since coming to the White House in January, 1969, they are both assigned as speech writers for the President. Their offices are adjacent to each other. They have also accompanied each other on numerous White House trips. BUCHANAN has the highest respect for SAFIRE and considers him a very intelligent, capable, competent person who is completely dedicated to his position and the President. The appointee is an honorable, honest, trustworthy person whose personal habits are above reproach. SAFIRE is a devoted family man. BUCHANAN considers the appointee a loyal American citizen and favorably recommends him.

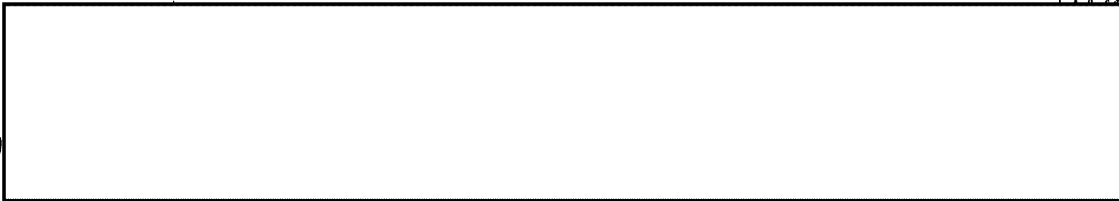
